Markets fall as investors turn cautious ahead of RBI policy review

MUMBAI: Benchmark equity indices fell on Tuesday as investors turned cautious ahead of the key events -- RBI's monetary policy and the US inflation data -- due to be announced later this week. Continuous foreign fund outflows and weak trend in Asian and European markets also played spoilsport for the domestic markets. The 30-share BSE Sensex fell 106.98 points or 0.16 per cent to settle at 65,846.50. During the day, it declined 200.85 points or 0.30 per cent to 65,752.63.

Traffic restored for light vehicles on Chd-Shimla highway



SHIMLA: The vehicular traffic was restored for light vehicles on Chandigarh-Shimla National Highway-5 at Chakimod in Solan district on Tuesday, after remaining closed for one week. The district administration said in a media communication that NH-5 was closed for traffic at Chakimod since August 2, which was opened for light motor vehicles, including pick-ups, this afternoon. Congress MP Rahul Gandhi has been re-allotted the government bungalow in Delhi a day after he was reinstated as a parliamentarian after the Supreme Court put a stay on his conviction in the 2019 "Modi surname" defamation case.

The Lok Sabha House Committee has allotted Mr Gandhi his old bungalow at 12, Tughlaq Lane.

"The whole of India is my home," the Congress MP said after getting his old house back.

In April, Rahul Gandhi vacated his official residence in central Delhi, in line with protocol, after he was disqualified as an MP in March following a Surat court's conviction in the

criminal defamation case. A disqualified MP is not entitled to a government accommodation and gets a month's time to vacate the official residence.

The Lok Sabha Housing Committee had asked him to vacate his official bungalow, where he was staying since 2005.

Moving out of his official residence, Rahul Gandhi said he was being "punished" for speaking the truth and said he didn't want to live in the house anymore since the bungalow, given to him by the people of India, was "snatched away". The Supreme Court on Friday ordered a stay on Rahul Gandhi's conviction and said that while his remarks were not in good taste, his disqualification from parliament would affect his constituents.

Karnataka HC dismisses case against JP Nadda

Karnataka High Court has dismissed an election code violation case against BJP National President JP Nadda over a speech allegedly made to woo voters during a campaign in Vijayanagar district ahead of the 2023 assembly election in the state.

The Election Officer had filed a complaint with the Harapanahalli Police Station over these remarks, leading to the registration of a case for alleged violation of the Model Code of Conduct (MCC). Nadda's counsel contended that there was no evidence in the complaint to substantiate the allegation that the BJP leader had enticed or intimidated voters through his alleged speeches.

Allahabad HC dismisses PIL to ban entry of non-Hindus in Gyanvapi complex

The bench observed that the litigant had already filed a civil suit in the Varanasi court.

The HC stated that whatever order the petitioner wants to get from the High Court, she can demand the same by filing an application in the lower court in Varanasi.

On the submission of the petitioner that she would present her case in the Varanasi lower court, the bench dismissed the PIL as withdrawn.

Meet Hayer directs to complete all operations of starting commercial mining sites by Sep 20

Following the directives given by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to provide sufficient sand to the people of the state at reasonable prices and to completely full stop illegal mining activities, Mining Minister Gurmeet Singh Meet Hayer on Tuesday has asked the department to find other new places for public mining sites and commercial sites by September 20.

In a meeting with the officials of the department at Punjab Bhawan here today, the Mining Minister said that the State Government is committed to providing sufficient sand to the people at affordable prices. All necessary actions for approvals to start 40 clusters with 67 commercial sites should be completed by monsoon season so that they can be started from September 20. Out of the 40 clusters auctioned, technical bidding has been done so far for 32 clusters and financial bidding is still on. The government is giving sand to people from both public and commercial sites at Rs. 5.50 per cubic foot.

Meet Hayer further said that so far 60 public sites have been dedicated by the Chief Minister to the residents of the state and 13 more public sites are being prepared to start operations soon. He directed the department to search for new



places for the opening of more public sites so that the needs of the people can be met. The approvals in this regard should be expedited. Pending environmental clearances should be taken up immediately. Meet Hayer asked the officials of the department to intensify the campaign to completely stop the illegal mining activities. Negligence in this matter will not be tolerated. He said that drone services should be taken to make the checking work more efficient and should be start-

ed from the Rupnagar district as a pilot project. He said that 716 FIRs related to illegal mining have been registered from 15 April 2022 to 4 August 2023. The Minister further said that Hi-tech cameras are being installed by HDFC at check posts from the Bank's CSR funds.

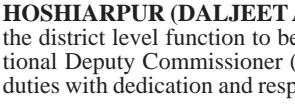

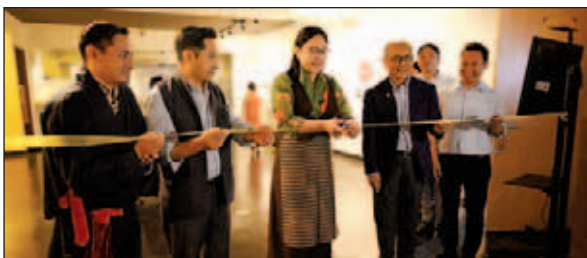

Museum focuses on cartographic history of Tibet

A temporary exhibitio0n titled Mapping Tibet was inaugurated at the Tibet Museum by Kalon Norzin Dolma of the Department of Information and International Relations (DIIR) of the Central Tibetan Administration. The opening ceremony of the exhibition was attended by guest speaker Tsering Wangyal Shawa as well as Home Department Secretary Palden Dhondup, DIIR Secretary Karma Choying and DIIR Additional Secretaries Tenzin Lakshay and Namgyel Tsewang. Tenzin Topden, director of the Tibet Museum, presented a brief overview of the history of the Tibet Museum and, in particular, introduced



the objectives behind the ongoing temporary exhibition. He explained the four sections of the exhibition Map of Tibet from 17th-19th century, Map of Tibet from 1904 to 1918, Map of Tibet after 1950s and Map of Tibet's capital Lhasa. The special guest of the event, Tsering Wangyal Shawa, addressed the gathering and shared his knowledge on the cartographic history of Tibet starting with the maps of

Tibet published by western countries in the 17th and 18th centuries based on the information gleaned from the accounts of Jesuit missionaries and travelers Did. He then explained the mapping of Tibet according to the modern cartographic system, published mostly by Westerners (including the British Raj) or Chinese until the Simla Conference of 1914, during which the Gaden Phodrang government first made an

attempt. To participate in the demarcation of Tibetan territories. However, after the establishment of the Tibetan Exile Administration, various institutions and individuals made several attempts to standardize the Tibetan map. He stressed the need to focus more on collecting, standardizing and understanding cultural and geographical feature names in the Tibetan language in order to maintain the identity of places. He said the names of places and geographical features are an important part of our cultural milieu. If you look at a map these days, many places in Tibet are hard to recognize because they have Chinese-sounding names... I see the danger of losing original Tibetan place names over time.

CM's comment on outsourced employees

City Mayor Anup Gupta flagged off two water sprinkler vehicles from MCC office premises, sector 17 here today in the presence of Ms. Anindita Mitra, IAS, Commissioner, Kanwarjeet Singh, Senior Deputy Mayor, other councilors and officers of MCC. While sharing about the new facility provided in the city, the Mayor said that the MCC has purchased two water sprinkler vehicles costing Rs. 119 lacs under NCAP funds. These will be used in different areas to combat dust pollution. He said that spray-



ing of water on the trees/plants and streets are one of the important measures to reduce the suspended particulate matter (SPM) and dust in the city. He said that these vehicles will be operated on the roads/areas which are most polluted.

He further said that the vehicle has more than 9,000 litres of water tank capacity fitted with adequate nozzles for spraying. The machine

throws mist to a minimum of 30 M distance in the air which will reduce air pollution less than 2.5 PM dust. A GPS tracker will also be fitted to these water sprinkler vehicles which will be integrated with Command Centre.

He thanked the Chandigarh Pollution Control Committee for providing the funds to Municipal Corporation.

Rainfall is also expected in Bageshwar, Pithoragarh and Udham Singh Nagar, added the IMD.

Earlier today, a portion of Shri Tapkeshwar Mahadev Temple near River Tamsa collapsed following heavy rains since Monday night in the Dehradun district.

"Amidst heavy downpours since the previous night, a part of the Tapkeshwar Mahadev temple near River Tamsa collapsed and



caused a lot of damage to the temple property," said the founder of the temple, Acharya Bipin Joshi on Tuesday.

He added that as soon as the Tamsa River started taking a formidable shape due to the rains, the temple premises were completely vacated.

"All the deities of Lord

Ganesha Maharaj, Mata Vaishno Devi, Ram Darbar, Hanuman Ji Maharaj, Lakshmi Narayan Bhagwan were also put to sleep," he added.

Damage has been caused to the structure of the temple. However, no human loss or injuries have been reported, he said.

Uttarakhand police on Sunday said that three people have died and the search operation for the missing persons is still underway after a landslide at Gaurikund.

Uttarakhand Director General of Police Ashok Kumar told ANI that 3 people have died and 20 people are still missing in a massive landslide that occurred on the Kedarnath Yatra route in Gaurikund.

He further said that 17 of the missing people are of Nepali origin."17 of the missing people are of Nepali origin. Search operation of the police and SDRF is underway", DGP said.

Uttarakhand Secretary Disaster Ranjit Sinha and Commissioner Garhwal Mandal Vinay Shankar Pandey along with DM and SP Rudraprayag reviewed the search and rescue operation for the missing persons.

Spreading tentacles

The structural significance of a diaspora manifests in several ways, often informing the cultural and political landscapes of the home country. The transnational network between the home and the host countries relies heavily on the way political ideologies are propagated across borders. The appropriation of cultural narratives by the political extreme within a diaspora thus takes place through various media.

This piece rests on two concerns: how is digital media exacerbating diasporic Hindutva through the intervention of long-distance nationalism? And how is transnational Hindu nationalism catalysed by Facebook and WhatsApp groups?

The transnational Hindu nationalist framework had, so far, relied on physical and onsite interfaces like the overseas wing of the Ra-s-h-t-riya Swayamsevak Sangh, Hindu temples in the host country and philanthropic organisations run by Hindu communities abroad. Scholars like Benedict Anderson, Christopher Jaffrelot and Arvind Rajgopal have captured this phenomenon through the intervention of "imagined communities" or "long-distance nationalism" as conceptual frameworks.

However, diasporic political interactions among transnational Hindu nationalists have witnessed a shift since the arrival of the internet. Digital media and social media have revolutionised that interaction. From that standpoint, long-distance nationalism serves as a more suitable framework today, especially for examining the relevance of digital media in the exacerbation of Hindu nationalism beyond India.

Most of the academic attention on Hindu nationalism as a diasporic project articulates through the transnational Hindu networks operating in the United States of America. While the US is a crucial reference point for drawing attention to such networks in other countries, the presence of certain conditions makes the proliferation of the Hindu nationalist network in the diaspora possible. Racism and Islamophobia in the host country are quintessential preconditions for the Hindus to defend the establishment of networks protecting their minority status there. Islamophobia in the host country also serves as the common factor between the Hindu-dominated organisations and the local political climate. While the first wing of the Hindu Swayamsevak Sangh, the diasporic unit of the RSS, was formed in 1947, what started as a nationalist longing in the Indian diaspora on a boat to Kenya has now expanded in scale and in form — drawing our attention to the established Hindu nationalist frameworks across the world with onsite and an increasing online presence.

China faces international criticism

China is facing international backlash after one of its coast guard vessels used a water cannon against a Philippine boat in the South China Sea on Saturday, CNN reported.

Analysts say the incident escalated an already tense situation and could lead the United States and its allies to accelerate plans for joint patrols in the waterway.

A smaller Philippine boat was cannon sprayed by a large Chinese Coast Guard ship as it attempted to deliver supplies to a garrison of Philippine marines at Second Thomas Shoal, a South China Sea feature in Manila's exclusive economic zone that China calls Ren'ai Reef and also claims as its sovereign territory.

Photos from the Philippine Coast Guard also showed the Chinese ship moving dangerously close in front of the Philippine Coast Guard vessels as they escorted the resupply boats, according to CNN.

"The Philippine Coast Guard (PCG) strongly condemns the China Coast Guard's (CCG) dangerous manoeuvres and illegal use of water cannons against PCG vessels," the PCG wrote in a statement shared on its official Facebook account Saturday.

By Sunday, Washington, Manila's principal ally, had denounced China's actions and reaffirmed that it will uphold its end of the mutual defence pact with the Philippines.

"The United States reaffirms an armed attack on Philippine public vessels, aircraft, and armed forces — including those of its Coast Guard in the South China Sea — would invoke US mutual defence commitments under Article IV of the 1951 US Philippines Mutual Defense Treaty," US State Department



speaksperson Matthew Miller said in a statement.

Allies of the US formed a unified front with Manila and Washington.

Australian, Japanese, and German officials referred to China's moves as "dangerous" and "destabilising." The Canadian Embassy in Manila also stated that Ottawa "unreservedly condemns the dangerous and provocative actions taken by the Chinese Coast Guard."

The Chinese ambassador in Manila, according to Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr, was presented with a diplomatic note of complaint "along with images and

videos on what had happened" on Monday, as per CNN.

While this was going on, the Philippine Foreign Ministry and Armed Forces held a joint press conference to denounce China's use of water cannons, which they called a "dangerous and illegal practice" that put "the lives of the Filipino crew at risk in violation of humanitarian and international law."

The tension between Manila and Beijing has always been centred on the South China Sea.

Beijing asserts "indisputable sovereignty" over the majority of the islands in the 1.3 million square miles South China Sea, even those

hundreds of miles from the Chinese mainland. This includes the Spratlys, also known as the Nanshas in Beijing, a group of 100 tiny islands and reefs that are also fully or partially claimed by the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, and Taiwan.

However, Manila refers to the region as the West Philippine Sea. It purposefully grounded the BRP Sierra Madre, a navy transport ship manned by Filipino troops, on Second Thomas Shoal in 1999 to bolster its territorial claims.

The International Permanent Court of Arbitration in the Hague, which determined in 2016 that China lacks a legal foundation to assert

historic rights to the majority of the South China Sea, supports Manila's claims. Beijing has disregarded the decision. According to reports, Australia and Japan may join the US, Philippines, and other nations on patrol. Jonathan Malaya, assistant director general of the National Security Council, stated at the Monday press conference of the Philippine government that Manila would continue to file diplomatic protests regardless of the response from the Chinese side because failing to do so might be interpreted by China and the international community as an abandonment of its position to assert sovereignty, CNN reported.

New blood pressure related method that predict health outcomes in patients

Critically ill patients in circulatory shock, which occurs when the heart is unable to pump enough blood and oxygen to the rest of the body, often as a result of heart failure, sepsis, or haemorrhage, require close monitoring and treatment, particularly to maintain adequate blood pressure to avoid injury to vital organs.

A team led by researchers at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH) and MIT recently developed a method for monitoring such patients, which may help clinicians control their blood pressure and heart function to reduce the risk of death and other negative health outcomes. The findings of the study were published in Nature Medicine.

The work entailed developing a method for measuring a circulation feature known as critical closure pressure, which is the blood pressure at which small blood capillaries collapse and blood flow ceases. Although crit-



ical closing pressure can provide an indicator of blood vessel tone in response to disease and therapy, it has not been frequently measured in clinical care.

Development of the new approach utilized high resolution waveform data from blood pressure monitoring of 5,532 patients in the cardiac intensive care unit at MGH. Researchers developed an analysis based on measured parameters (including arterial pressure, pulse pressure, and heart rate) to define the critical closing pressure.

They then defined a value called tissue perfusion pressure—calculated as the difference between average arterial blood pressure and critical closing pressure—and found that it predicted a patient's risk of death, length of hospital stay, and peak blood lactate level (an indicator of tissue oxygenation).

"When treating patients with circulatory shock, it is essential to maintain adequate blood pressure targets, yet standard goals are not personalized to individual patients.

Overweight people's brains have different 'appetite control centre': Study

Researchers have shown that the hypothalamus, a crucial part of the brain that regulates appetite, differs in the brains of obese and overweight individuals from those of people who are of a healthy weight. The findings provide additional support for the connection between brain structure and eating habits and body weight.

According to recent estimates, there are over 1.9 billion overweight or obese people in the world. Nearly two-thirds of adults in the UK are overweight or obese, according to the Office for Health Improvement & Disparities. This raises a person's risk of contracting a variety of illnesses, such as type 2 diabetes, heart disease, stroke, cancer, and worsened mental health.

Our genetic make-up, the way our hormones are regulated, and the environment in which we live are just a few of the many variables that affect how much and what kinds of food we eat. It is not entirely clear what happens in our brains to signal when we are hungry or full, but studies have shown that the hypothalamus, a tiny area of the brain the size of an almond, plays a crucial role.

Dr Stephanie Brown from the Department of Psychiatry and Lucy Cavendish College, University of Cambridge, said: "Although we know the hypothalamus is important for determining how much we eat, we actually have very little direct information about this brain region in living humans. That's because it is very small and hard to make out on traditional MRI brain



scans." Animal studies provide the bulk of the evidence for the hypothalamus' function in controlling appetite. These demonstrate the existence of intricately interconnected pathways in the hypothalamus, where various cell populations work in concert to signal when we are hungry or full.

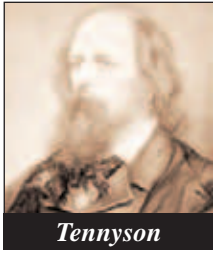
To circumvent this, Dr Brown and colleagues used a machine learning-based algorithm to analyse MRI brain scans from 1,351 young adults with a range of BMI scores. They were looking for variations in the hypothalamus when comparing people who are underweight, healthy weight, overweight, and obese.

In a study that was just published in Neuroimage: Clinical, the team discovered that young adults who were overweight or obese had significantly larger hypothalamus overall volumes. In fact, the team discovered a strong correlation between the hypothalamus' volume and body mass index (BMI).

Physical activity fosters learning and wellbeing

Teenagers who engage in physical activity during their free time and while travelling to and from school perform better academically than their inactive peers in secondary school, finds a study.

A lower risk of school burnout was also associated with regular leisure-time physical activity, even in small amounts.

The results of the study were released in the European Journal of Public Health. Academic success and physical activity have a complicated relationship. Prior research has discovered that, however, particularly school-based physical activity, such as physical education, can enhance academic performance, especially in mathematics.

Despite this, only a small number of studies have looked at the connection between active school transport and academic results. The majority of the prior research on physical activity and academic well-being has been conducted with university-level students.



Researchers found that active school transport was linked to higher odds of high perceived

academic performance and self-reported competency in academic skills in a recently published

study of more than 34,000 teenagers.

For moderate to vigorous physical activity during leisure time, the association was even stronger. The link between recreational physical activity and mathematical abilities stood out, as in earlier studies. "The results regarding active school transport were particularly intriguing as researchers are increasingly interested in the health benefits of travel-related walking and cycling. Being physically active before school could, for example, enhance concentration in the classroom, explaining our observations. However, due to the cross-sectional design, our study cannot establish causality," says Juuso Jussila, a Doctoral Researcher at the University of Eastern Finland. "There were no surprises regarding the strong association between leisure-time physical activity and perceived academic achievement due to support from prospective and intervention studies. Although we do not know all the explanatory mechanisms, improved coordination and perceptual-motor skills, required in various

team sports, for example, can at least partially explain these observations. Leisure-time physical activity is also typically more intense than active school transport, leading to increases in brain-derived neurotrophic factor in our circulation and, thus, improvements in cognitive performance."

Leisure-time physical activity was also inversely associated with school burnout. Both leisure-time physical activity and active school transport were also positively associated with school enjoyment.

"To the best of my knowledge, this was the first large-scale study to examine the association between physical activity and school burnout among adolescents. Leisure-time physical activity can be an effective way to disconnect from schoolwork and the potential stress related to it. If we can increase the amount leisure-time physical activity among youth, both learning and wellbeing benefits can be significant," Jussila summarises.

Threats to kill, Dhakoli's family appeals to Punjab Govt for security

Narrating her woes at the Chandigarh Press Club today, she said that the accused, who fraudulently got her house registered in his name eight years ago, was threatening to kill her and her family. She had registered a case (No. 305/2015) under sections 354 and 420 at Zirakpur (now Dhakoli) police station on December 10, 2015, against Sukhdev Chowdhary, s/o Joginder Singh of Zirakpur, and his accomplices, on which the police did not act for 8-years. When the police presented the challan on July 31, 2023, following the Punjab and Haryana High Court order, the accused started pressurizing the family to withdraw the case. Earlier also he has been threatening the family.
Anita Rani said that Sukhdev Chowdhary calls himself the leader of the Aam Aadmi Party and publicly threatens to kill her. He says that the Punjab Police cannot harm him and he has high connections in the Punjab government. The accused also acquired a pistol based on forged documents. He extorts money from common people and thus has made wealth worth crores of rupees.

Blunt trauma chest causing tear in windpipe & foodpipe – rare case treated at Paras Health Panchkula

Panchkula, August 8: Doctors at Paras Health, Panchkula, a leading health care provider of the region, gave a new lease of life to a 16 years old boy who got a blunt injury to his chest in a road accident. The boy was initially admitted in other hospitals but injuries could not be picked up. Then he was rushed to Paras Health, Panchkula in a very serious condition. On investigation, he was found to have fracture in breast bone (Sternum) injury to large vessel in chest. Small emboli from this blood vessel reached the brain causing weakness of the upper limb with life threatening injuries there. Giving information, Dr Rajan Sahu, Associate Director, Surgical Oncology said , "This was a rare case with only few cases been reported in medical literature so far. No other hospital was willing to take it up but we understood the problem and a special panel of doctors discussed and went ahead to help the family,"



The panel included Dr Sahu, Dr. Veenu Kaul, Associate Director CTVS, Dr Anurag Lamba, Associate Director Neurology, Dr SK Gupta, Associate Director, Pulmonology, Dr Ashish Arora, Associate Director, Critical Care and Anaesthesia team led by Dr Ashwini. It was a six hour long surgery and in a difficult situation during surgery, separate tubes were put in both lungs to give him anesthesia. There were life threatening injuries as large tears in food pipes (Esophagus) and wind pipes trachea caused severe infection in the chest, said Dr Sahu. Dr Ashwini added, "Not only surgery, even giving anaesthesia to this patient was a challenge. He needed separate ventilation for both lungs with small sized tubes, so that repair on windpipe did not get disturbed by these tubes." A team of doctors decided to treat the patient further; it was a technically challenging case.

completely should be considered afresh and funds be released accordingly. The Union Minister assured to take up the issue with the Ministry of Finance and will take it to the Union Cabinet so that requisite assistance could be provided.Sh. Agnihotri stated that though rain damages have been wide spread, but maximum devastation has been observed along the banks of river Beas. There has been a history of such occurrences in this river and Jal Shakti Vibhag has prepared a detailed project report for Rs.1669

crores for channelization of this River after getting study conducted from the Central Water and Power Research Station (CWPRS), Pune. Presently this proposal is under review with Central water Commission (CWC). The Deputy Chief Minister requested the Union Minister to approve the same at the earliest as a measure in advance to safeguard life and property of people particularly in Kullu-Manali area. Sh. Agnihotri emphasized the importance of channelization of Beas River in view of its strategic importance, as Kullu-Manali Airport and the Chandigarh Leh National Highway lies on the bank of this river. He further added that channelization of this river would ensure safe movement of tourists, besides transportation of Horticulture produce from the Kullu and Lahaul valley.Sh. Mukesh Agnihotri thanked the Union Minister for granting investment clearance to Phina Singh Irrigation Project of Rs. 643 crore in District Kangra and Channelization of Swan River

amounting to Rs. 339 crores in District Una, which had been pending for long. He also urged the Union Government to release the funds so that these works could be started and raised the issue for release of Central Assistance to ongoing irrigation projects under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchai Yojna (PMKSY) and for sanctioning of new irrigation projects for Beet area and Kutehar in Una District. When news is published by the mining department, a few vehicles are seized and made to visit secretly. But even after that the business of illegal mining is in full swing. Illegal mining is done day and night by earthmoving machines at many places like Nanowali, Bhud Kala, Taje, Mandewala, Koli Wala, Deodhar, Majehdwala, Kanya Wala etc. adjacent to Pratap Nagar area. While the National Green Authority has banned any kind of mining till September 15 in view of the rainy season. The same site has also been identified by the district administration for mining and its rules and regulations have also been set. Despite this, the miners are carrying out illegal mining activities bypassing all these rules. When several attempts were made to talk to District Mining Officer Gurjit Singh about this, but he did not receive the call even after calling several times.
