Chandrayaan-3 lands on moon's South pole

CREATES HISTORY

Dawn of new India: PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who is South Africa for the BRICS summit, virtually witnessed the landing attempt of India's moon mission - Chandrayaan-3. "This moment is precious and unprecedented. This moment is the jaishosh of new India. This moment is the strength of 1.4 billion heartbeats. Success of amrit varsha in this phase of amrit kaal," said the PM, in an online address to the nation from South Africa. India also joins a select club of Russia, the United States and China - who have previously achieved a controlled landing on the lunar surface. The landing comes days after a Russian probe crashed in the same region and after India's own failed attempt in 2019. The mission was launched nearly six weeks ago in front of thousands of cheering spectators, but took much longer to reach the Moon than those of the Apollo missions in the 1960s and 1970s, which arrived in a matter of days.

NATION ERUPTS IN CELEBRATIONS

It was a giant leap for India on Wednesday evening as the Chandrayaan-3 lander module successfully landed on the moon's South Pole, making it the first country to have achieved the historic feat and bringing to an end the disappointment over the crash landing of the Chandrayaan-2, four years ago.

Officials at India's space agency ISRO headquarters in Bengaluru broke into applause after the Vikram began its powered vertical descent towards its landing site.

"India is on the moon!" Prime Minister Narendra Modi who is currently attending the 15th BRICS Summit in Johannesburg said. He watched the live telecast and as soon as the touchdown happened he sported a big smile and waved the tricolour.

The countdown of the Vikram hovered at 150 metres, then 130 metres, 50 metres and decelerated as approached the moon's service before finally touching down on the lunar surface. As the Vikram lander carrying the Pragyaan rover in its belly touched down on the lunar surface, it marked a giant leap in India's spacefaring journey providing a well-deserved finale to ISRO's long years of toil.

This makes India becomes the fourth country - after US, China, and Russia - to have successfully landed on the moon's surface, it has earned a place in record books as the first to

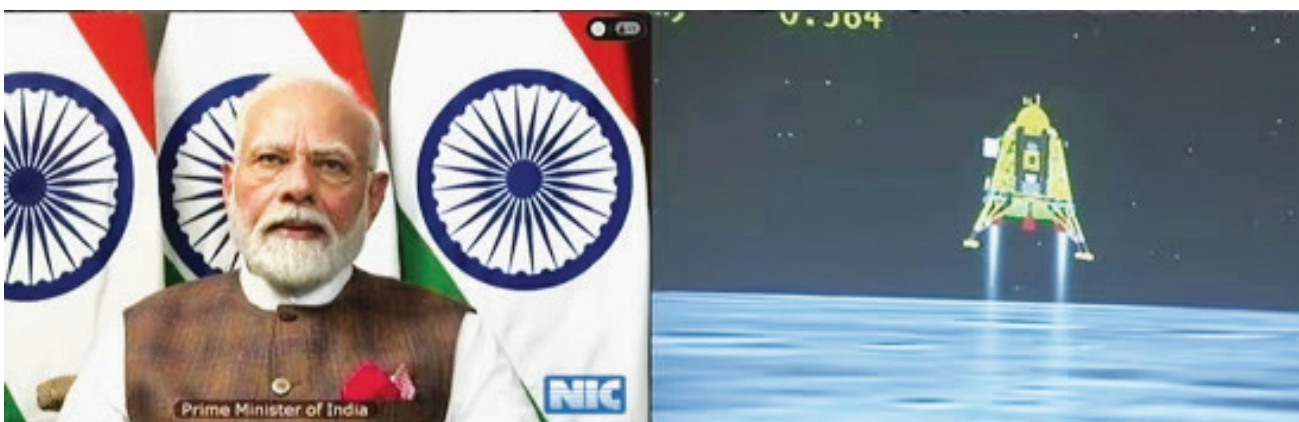
"The last leg of its operation and everybody is anxiously looking forward to this great event. As far as the Indian space program is concerned, this is going to be the most significant milestone for planetary exploration. Of course, in the past, we have made an attempt to land on the lunar surface, but unfortunately, it did not succeed at the time. Since then, ISRO has done considerable studies and simulations and strengthened the designs and provided redundancies so that the mission success probability can be improved," he said.

Billions of people across India and globally closely monitoring the much-awaited event. More so after Russia's Luna-25 spacecraft crashed on Sunday after spinning out of control. In the run-up to the scheduled soft landing of Chandrayaan-3, people across the country prayed to God in all denominations of places of worship for a successful mission. Special screenings of the

soft landing were organized across the country, including schools and science centers, and public institutions. ISRO made the live actions available on the ISRO website, its YouTube channel, Facebook, and public broadcaster DD National TV. The scheduled timing for the soft landing of Chandrayaan-3 on the moon's south pole on August 23, 2023 (Wednesday), was 18:04 IST, with the powered descent of Vikram lander at 1745 IST.

17 killed as under-construction Railway bridge collapses in Mizoram

NEW DELHI: At least 17 workers were killed after an under-construction Railway bridge collapsed in Mizoram today. Officials said many more are feared trapped at the site and efforts are on to rescue them. "There were about 35 to 40 construction workers when the bridge collapsed," they said. The incident was reported from Sairang area, about 21 km from Aizawl. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his anguish over the incident and announced a compensation of ₹ 2 lakh each for those who died in the accident, and ₹ 50,000 each for the injured. Mizoram Chief Minister Zoramthanga said rescue operation is underway at the accident site. "Under construction railway over bridge at Sairang, near Aizawl collapsed today; at least 17 workers died; Rescue under progress. Deeply saddened and affected by this tragedy. I extend my deepest condolences to all the bereaved families and wishing a speedy recovery to the injured. Sending gratitude to the people who have come out in large numbers to help with rescue operations," he said on social platform X, previously known as Twitter.

Tragedy averted, alert woman pilot saves over 300 lives in Delhi

Tragedy was narrowly averted at Delhi airport this afternoon after a Vistara flight from Ahmedabad and another plane of the same airline - the two carrying around 300 people in total - thanks to an alert pilot on the former plane.

The Ahmedabad-Delhi flight had just landed and had been instructed by Air Traffic Control to cross an active runway to reach the parking bay. Meanwhile, a Vistara Airlines Delhi-Bagdogra flight had been given permission to take off on that same runway and a collision was only avoided thanks to 45-year-old Captain Sonu Gill on the Ahmedabad-Delhi flight. The planes were 1.8 km, or 1,800 metres, apart, sources said, stressing



that if the pilot had not warned ATC of the presence of the other plane, the outcome could have been disastrous.

According to the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA), Vistara flight VTI926 had landed on Runway 29L and told by ATC to cross Runway 29R en route to its parking bay. However, the ATC official 'momentarily forgot' instructions given to VTI926 and told flight VTI725

to take-off from Runway 29R. The regulator's statement said the ATC 'on realisation of the error, based on input from VTI926, tower controller instructed VTI725 to cancel take-off'.

The aviation regulator said an 'alert pilot in the aircraft crossing the runway (VTI926) alerted Air Traffic Control and the aircraft on its take-off run (VTI725) was ordered to abort take-off'.

Vehicular movement closed on National Highway 5

SOLAN: The Parwanoo-Solan part of National Highway No. 5 has been closed for vehicular movement due to a landslide near Chaki Mod after heavy rainfall overnight.

A spokeswoman for the District Solan Administration said that after a mild landslide, the administration has restricted the movement of vehicles on National Highway No. 5.

Vehicular traffic has been temporarily banned. The spokesman said that since last night it has been raining heavily in the area, due to which many roads in the district have come to a standstill after landslides.

Some vehicles got buried. And the movement of vehicles has also come to a standstill.

Similar information is also being received from other areas of the district. Meanwhile, the Solan Police have appealed to the general public because the National Highway near Chaki Mod has been closed after landslides, and other alternate routes in the district are also closed due to mild landslides at many places. The police have appealed to bring vehicles on the roads only when it is urgent.

Punjab: Schools closed till Aug 26 due to heavy rains

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab government on Wednesday ordered closure of all schools till August 26 in the wake of heavy rains in different parts of the state. Education Minister Harjot Singh Bains said the state government has ordered holidays with immediate effect in all schools -- government, aided, recognised and private -- due to the heavy rains, which have caused flooding in different districts of the state. Several parts of Punjab witnessed heavy rains on Wednesday, which led to flood-like situation on many roads and low-lying areas.

Board exams to be conducted twice a year, students can retain best score: MoE

NEW DELHI: Board examinations will be conducted twice a year and students will get an option to retain their best score, according to the New Curriculum Framework prepared by the Ministry of Education. Aiming to make the exams "easier" rather than "high stakes", the boards have also been asked to develop capacities to be able to conduct "on-demand" examinations in due course of time. The New Curriculum Framework (NCF) document accessed by PTI also noted that there should be no hard separations between Arts and Sciences, curricular and extra-curricular activities, and vocational and academic streams. "Board examinations should be offered at least twice a year to ensure that students have enough time and opportunity to perform well. Students can then appear for a board examination in subjects they have completed and feel ready for.

Brahma Kumaris Raksha Bandhan program starts

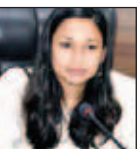

DC orders magisterial probe into school roof collapse

Hydro Met Division of IMD
sound FFR & SR/I alert to
many areas of HP, U'khand
and Punjab

SHIMLA: The Monsoon & Western disturbances rains continue in the North Western Himalayan states of India for last four months and more severe currently forced the Hydro Met Division of Indian Meteorological Department to sound alert of Flash Flood Risk and Surface Runoff and Inundation at many fully saturated watersheds and low lying areas due to expected persistent rain in next 24 hrs. The Flash Flood National Flashflood guidelines bulletin for state of Himachal Pradesh indicating FFR outlook till 1000hrs on August 24, 2023 give two warning to Himachal Pradesh along with some parts of Uttarakhand and most part of Punjab. The alert says "Moderate to high flash flood risk over few watersheds and neighborhood of Shimla Sirmour, Kangra, Chamba, Mandi, Hamirpur, Solan , Bialspur and Kullu district of Himachal Pradesh . The alert also said Surface ran off or inundation may occur at some fully saturated watershed and low lying areas due to expected persistent rainfall in next 24 hrs. Situation of severe rain disasters and saturation of water in the land or soil is so precarious that air, rail and land transport are virtually paralysed in the hills state. Keeping red alert in the mind Shimla capital Region and district closed down all educational institutions from Aganwari to University for two days. Report arrived from the state disaster management authority said National Highway 21 from Chandigarh to Kirthpur is disrupted after two pillars of the Main Baddi Bridge in the industrial area BBN crippled vehicular traffic forcing the administration to divert traffic on the alternate route. The old Hindustan Tibet National highway from Ambala to Korick of Kinnuar district disrupted at Chaki Mod since Wednesday morning , Shimla Bypass road and Shimla -Chhota Shimla are also disrupted for vehicular traffic.

New recruitment commission to be set up soon: CM

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu has said that the notification of the new Recruitment Commission will be issued shortly, to replace the disbanded Himachal Pradesh State Staff Selection Commission. The Chief Minister said that the present State Government was committed to ensure a transparent recruitment process that prioritizes the interests of the state's youth. He said that the new commission would focus



solely on merit-based selection, eradicating concerns about leaks and other irregularities. The new system is designed to minimize human interference during exams, employing foolproof methods to maintain integrity. Modern tools, practices, and techniques will be employed in crafting exam papers, streamlining the recruitment process and combating corruption. The Chief Minister said that recruitment would commence once the new Selection

Commission was set up. He said that the state government was intolerant for any manipulation that affects the welfare of the youth of the state. The decision to dissolve the Himachal Pradesh State Staff Selection Commission was motivated by the need to address rampant corruption, he said. Chairman of the Committee, Deepak Shanan said that a second report would be submitted shortly, further detailing the Commission's functionality more

Road communication in Baddi snaps, main bridge damaged

Incassant rainfall continues since last night, aggravating the impact on this hill state, as a main bridge connecting Panjore of Haryana to the industrial area of Baddi has been damaged this morning beside the state capital Shimla, and the industrial area of Solan district is cut off from the rest of the state and country once again. According to a post tweeted by HP Traffic, the Tourist and Railways Police warned that a pillar on the Baddi Main Bridge collapsed around 0700 hrs on Wednesday and the bridge is bent in the middle. District Traffic Police informed commuters and industrial houses that this portion of highway has been permanently closed for traffic at the Baddi Main barrier bridge. There would be no foot movement as well. Administration advised people to follow an alternate route via Maranwala Barotiwala for entry into BBN (Baddi, Browtiwal, and Nalagarh industrial areas). The district administration, Solan, also issued instructions that NH 05 from



Shimla to Chandigarh is now closed for all types of vehicles at Chaki Mod. Alternative routes have also been closed due to landslides in many places. It has been raining intermittently since last night, and many Road in Shimla district has been closed. According to the district administration, NH-5 is blocked between Parwanoo and Solan; NH 205 is opened at the Ghamndal valley bridge for light motor vehicles having less than 20 tonnes of weight; and Narkanda-Nankhari and Nankhari-Nirath roads are blocked. Other roads blocked in Shimla district are Sunni-Rampur, Bioleuganj-Summerhill, Tutikandi-Phagli and Khalini, Bemoli to Tallland, Mehli-Junga, Mehli-Badagoan- Shoghi, Chhota Shimla-Oakover (nr Rahat hotel), Kasumpti and Perimahal, Kasumpti- SDO complex-Vikasnagar, and police line Kaithu.

Due to the landslide, debris suddenly entered people's houses and people left their homes and fled to safer places. Some people fled leaving their houses open. People are quite scared, there are about 1000 houses in the panchayat, in which the people living have come to the Kotla market to save their lives. SDM Mahendra Pratap Singh said that information has been received



about cracking of the hill in Kotla and it will be reviewed. He has appealed to the people to leave their homes and come out to a safe place so that there is no loss of life. Sub-Divisional Officer Jawali Mahendra Pratap Singh also visited Kotla Panchayat along with the team and took stock of



the damage. He said that four houses have been damaged due to rockfall and about 18-20 houses have been evacuated. Community Hall Kotla and Mandir Kotla have been made relief camps for the people to stay and food and drink arrangements will be made.

Due to its anti-people decision, the government has become a cause of ridicule among the common people. The system has been made in the name of change, the government is not able to fulfill its guarantees.

SC grants bail to ex-Mumbai cop in Antilia bomb scare case

Supreme Court, in its order on Wednesday, granted bail to former Mumbai Police officer and former encounter specialist Pradeep Sharma, who was arrested in connection with the Antilia bomb scare case and the killing of businessman Mansukh Hiran. "We have allowed the appeal and granted the accused (Pradeep Sharma) bail," the bench of the Supreme Court, headed by Justice A S Bopanna, said in its order on Wednesday. The accused, Sharma, was arrested in June 2021 for his alleged involvement in the Antilia bomb scare and the killing of businessman Mansukh Hiran.



Senior advocate and former Attorney General (AG) of India Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for Sharma, told the Apex Court that the only allegation against him was that he had helped his former colleague Sachin Waze eliminate Hiran. Rohatgi submitted that Sharma was a decorated police officer who retired after 37 years of service. On February 25, 2021, an explosives-laden SUV was

found near industrialist Mukesh Ambani's residence, 'Antilia, in south Mumbai.

On June 5, this year, Sharma was given interim bail to meet his ailing wife for three weeks, and he surrendered after that.

Businessman Hiran, who was in possession of the SUV, was found dead in a creek in neighbouring Thane on March 5, 2021.

The Supreme Court on Wednesday allowed Sharma's appeal against a Bombay High Court order denying him bail.

Sharma, along with other accused, including dismissed Mumbai cop Sachin Waze, are accused of conspiring to place an explosive-laden SUV near the residence of industrialist Mukesh Ambani.

Complete ban on the sale of Pregabalin medicine: District Magistrate

District Magistrate Barnala Mrs. Poonamdeep Kaur in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure 1973 (Act No. 2 of 1974) issued an order to completely ban the sale of Pregabalin 300mg (Signature) Capsules in Barnala District. He instructed that the chemist would put his stamp on the prescription slip while giving the medicine and record the date of giving the medicine. He said that this order has been issued regarding the action taken on the letter of Civil Surgeon Barnala. The civil surgeon has stated in his report that the capsules are being consumed as medical drugs by



the common people. They demanded a complete ban on the sale of capsules under Section 144 CrPC. This order will remain in force in Barnala district till 28 September 2023.

Court orders for the election process of MGN Trust

The ongoing dispute in the Montgomery Guru Nanak (MGN) Educational Trust is set to get settled with a local court allowing the conduct of elections to it. The court of Justice Renuka Kalra, Civil Judge (Junior Division), had on Saturday "allowed an application for the appointment of receiver or for giving directions to the Deputy Commissioner Jalandhar to hold elections". The MGN Trust had been restrained by the court from conducting the elections on May 17, 2021 following a dispute between the members. The matter pertained to the Trust which runs Montgomery Guru Nanak schools and colleges in the region. The court has deemed it necessary to provide congenial atmosphere to both parties for conducting fair and impartial election of trust. A petition had been filed in 2020 in the Punjab and Haryana High Court but it was disposed of with the direction to Deputy Commissioner Jalandhar to consider and decide it. The DC had then passed orders, "Taking cognisance of a situation where half of the trustees are showing no confidence in the incumbent office-bearers of the trust, it will be appropriate that an impartial court-appointed functionary takes charge of the trust and gets financial audit conducted under his supervision to fix responsibility of any misappropriation." There are two groups of trustees in Mgn trust in which Major Charanjit Singh rai who is the present chairman of the trusts had support of two life trustees on the other hand Jamail Singh Pasricha who are the founders of Mgn trust had the support of four members as life trustees.

The science of alienation

Science reinforces in us a sense of intellectual aura as well as adventurism to unravel the intriguing secrets of nature. The pursuit of science has led to groundbreaking discoveries and technological advances. But the process of cultivating scientific curiosity has been left unprotected from the clutches of instrumentalism. It is quite alarming that several surveys have confirmed widespread dissatisfaction and anxiety among scientists, especially those on fixed contracts or are early-career researchers, that are resulting in intellectual calcification and, subsequently, alienation. Scientific inventions are organic, cumulative, and cooperative processes. The scientific revolution in Europe was based on the principle of the freedom of the mind. But now, with governments exonerating their role in supporting research and development and conceding those spaces to private enterprises, freedom in science is getting compromised, impeding the intellectual labour of scientists for the greater good.

The unease among young scientists is the result of structural conditions, such as low wages, insecure contracts, and the pressure of publication that are stifling intellectual curiosity. But the real problem concerns the alienation of labour. Significantly, intellectual calcification-induced alienation in the sciences is yet to find space in the public discourse.

Companies extracting intellectual labour from scientists are alienating them from their creations. Imagine that you have been part of a life-saving drug discovery that your neighbour is unable to afford owing to the surrender of your intellectual labour to private corporations. For instance, insulin is still unaffordable for millions of people despite not being patented by its discoverers (Banting and Best), exemplifying the alienation of scientific labour from its creation. This surrender of intellectual labour in exchange for wages is a form of submission that undermines freedom, which is indispensable to creativity and discoveries.

The second stage of the alienation process is alienation from labour activity. The scientific enterprise is not immune to this. Reduced freedom in science transforms scientists into a constituency of experimentalists testing the ideas and hypotheses of supervisors or merely responding to the demands of the market, leading to monotonous labour activity. Funding agencies determine research activity of scientists by allocating funds for a specific research area, thereby suppressing intrinsic scientific curiosity further.

The alienation of scientific labour is also exacerbated by the imposition of the need to acquire marketable skills. For example, in academia, evaluation of job applicants is often based on publication history.

Bhutan’s journey towards organic sustainability

Bhutan made a brave decision in 2019 to start an ambitious project to become the first totally organic country in the world by 2020. The goal was to strengthen robust organic farming techniques, promote a sustainable agricultural system, and protect the environment for future generations. The Bhutan Live reported.

As a result of the complexity of this transformative transition, the pledge, which was originally announced through the National Organic Flagship Programme (NOFP) under the umbrella of the National Organic Programme (NOP), was postponed to 2035.

After more than four years, concerns about the accomplishment of this objective have surfaced. The projected growth in organic production, employment opportunities, business development, and the goal of import substitution are all surrounded by uncertainty. Some people have even suggested that the NOFP might be shut down. The Bhutan Live reported. The Bhutan Live covers Bhutan news, politics, Bhutan culture, Bhutanese Buddhism and more, for a unique understanding of the Himalayan region. However, Yeshey Penjor, Agriculture and Livestock Minister, insists that both programmes have undergone strategic development. The government revised its funding allocation in response to the pandemic’s demands, allocating Nu 650 million for the NOFP instead of the Nu 1 billion that was originally anticipated. According to a programme official, the NOP’s financial information remains undisclosed.



The objectives of this strategic realignment are to boost organic production, its marketing, the development of organic regulatory frameworks, and the encouragement of sustainable livelihoods.

According to Kesang Tshomo, advisor at the Organic Sector Development, NOFP, the 100 per cent organic target encompassed food crops, livestock, and forest produce, all of which were integrated under a thorough plan and investment strategy. Unfortunately, the required investments didn’t come through until 2020. According to Tshomo, the

first phase was primarily focused on developing educational and advocacy materials, creating a favourable environment, training personnel and farmers, and developing rules, specifications, and certification criteria for both farmers and the business sector, according to The Bhutan Live. Bhutan invested Nu 97 million between 2019 and 2020, which led to the manufacture and sale of 1,418 metric tonnes of commodities worth Nu 167 million inside its boundaries. With a budget of Nu 377 million set aside, the number of organic goods was reduced from 12 to just three—buckwheat, ginger, and turmeric—in light of the pandemic. Currently, it involves 696

farmer organisations and 110 agricultural cooperatives in organic marketing and production around the nation. According to the Department of Marketing Cooperatives, these comprise 23 agricultural cooperatives and 415 agricultural farmer organisations.

Looking ahead, the ministry plans to, among other strategic efforts, strengthen technical support through research and technology development, improve the capability for organic regulation and certification to match international criteria, and accredit the Bhutan Organic Guarantee system. Notably, Bhutan has just joined the Geographical Indication programme,

which aims to protect the products’ unique characteristics, place of origin, and organic certification, as reported by The Bhutan Live. The path to organic sustainability is not without obstacles. The inability to obtain certification still prevents access to export markets. In comparison to organic milestones, Kesang Tshomo emphasises the importance placed on food security, highlighting the necessity for help from the public and the government to meet national goals.

Only four products in Bhutan currently have international certification: blue pine essential oil, edible flowers, ginger, and lemon grass oil.

In addition, 65 products have the Bhutan Organic Standard certification. However, Singapore is the only country that accepts these certifications from the Bhutan Food and Drug Authority for current exports. Farmers have yet to gain from organic certification and premiums, according to Tshomo. They bear the full financial responsibility for certification. Bhutan wants to gradually phase out the use of dangerous chemicals in agriculture in line with its organic agenda. Even though fertilisers and pesticides are being imported to assure food security and revenue production for essential crops, allegations of chemical abuse loom large. The Bhutan Food and Drug Authority, the National Plant Protection Centre, and the National Soil Services Centre are in charge of overseeing the distribution and supply of chemicals. The Bhutan Live reported.

Stay active to prevent stroke and heart rhythm disorders

Physical activity is associated with a lower risk of atrial fibrillation and stroke, according to a study involving more than 15,000 people. The research is presented at ESC Congress 2023.

The most prevalent heart rhythm disorder, atrial fibrillation, affects more than 40 million people globally. According to estimates, one in three Europeans will experience atrial fibrillation at some point in their lives.

In comparison to their peers, patients with the syndrome have a five-fold increased risk of stroke. This study investigated the relationship between fitness and the risk of atrial fibrillation. The study included 15,450 individuals without atrial fibrillation who were referred for a treadmill test between 2003 and 2012. The average age was 55 years and 59 per cent were men.

Fitness was assessed using the Bruce protocol, where participants are asked to walk faster and at a steeper grade in successive three-minute stages.



Fitness was calculated according to the rate of energy expenditure the participants achieved, which was expressed in metabolic equivalents (METs).

Participants were followed for new-onset atrial fibrillation, stroke, myocardial infarction and death.

The researchers analysed the associations between fitness and atrial fibrillation, stroke and major adverse cardiovascular events (MACE); a composite of stroke, myocardial infarction and death) after adjusting for factors that could influence the relationships including age,

sex, cholesterol level, kidney function, prior stroke, hypertension and medications.

During a median of 137 months, 515 participants (3.3 per cent) developed atrial fibrillation. Each one MET increase on the treadmill test was associated with an 8 per cent lower risk of atrial fibrillation, 12 per cent lower risk of stroke and 14 per cent lower risk of MACE.

Participants were divided into three fitness levels according to METs achieved during the treadmill test: low (less than 8.57 METs), medium (8.57 to 10.72) and high (more than 10.72).

Israel breaks ground on new environmentally friendly energy plant

The environmental flagship project “Otef (all around) Israel” has been launched. In the Eshkol Regional Council, a cornerstone laying ceremony was held for the establishment of the “Dia” site for the treatment of household waste and agricultural trimmings, which will generate electricity and sell it to the electric company

The Otef Israel project for the treatment of household waste and agricultural trimmings for the production of electricity has a budget of 300 million Shekels (USD 80 million).

The innovative facility will be built between Kibbutz Tze’elim and Kibbutz Gvulot in the Negev on an area of about ten acres. The facility is designed to handle approximately 200 thousand tons per year of urban organic matter and agricultural trimmings per year.

The facility will include advanced technologies for anaerobic digestion in a closed facility with no odour nuisances that will produce clean electricity using the biogas technology of the German STRABAG company and high-quality manure (compost).

This step will result in a significant reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and the amount of landfilled waste. The product of the process will be methane gas that will be used to generate electricity in a power plant with a capacity of 6.3 megawatts.

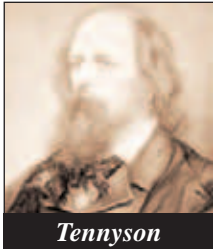
The facility will include advanced technologies for anaerobic digestion in a closed facility with no odour nuisances that will produce clean electricity using the biogas technology of the German STRABAG company and high-quality manure (compost). This step will result in a significant reduction in greenhouse gas emissions.

The facility is being established as part of a special government program to strengthen the Gaza Strip. Beyond the environmental advantages, the facility will be an important economic anchor for the council and a source of dozens of new jobs for the residents of the area.

Kids resiliency can be improved by encouraging creativity

According to new research, teaching creativity to primary school pupils may boost their resistance to issues in real life. In a short study, researchers taught third, fourth, and fifth graders how to employ literary devices like viewpoint shifting, hypothetical (what if) reasoning, and causal (why) thinking to increase their creativity when solving problems.

As per Angus Fletcher, the study’s principal author and an English professor at The Ohio State University who is also a part of the university’s Project Narrative, the methods helped youngsters come up with fresh, imaginative, and useful solutions to challenges.

“There are concerns about the resiliency of American children in the wake of COVID-19 and this sense that many kids are having a hard time in school and in life,” Fletcher said.

“Creativity training can help kids come up with a second plan when things aren’t working



out for them.” The study was published recently in the Journal of Creativity. Fletcher said the program used to help kids in this study was similar to one he and his colleagues used successfully with the U.S. Army – and which resulted in Fletcher receiving the Public Service Com-

mendation Medal, the fourth-highest public service decoration that the Army can bestow upon a civilian. The researchers did two separate studies involving students attending a summer camp in a Columbus suburb.

In one study, 32 students were split into two groups. In the control condition, the children were told to identify a special quality about themselves. They were told this was a special power that could help them solve any problem.

In the creative condition, the students were told to think of a friend who did something special and think of them as their “creative friend” who could help them solve any problem. This type of creativity training is called perspective-shifting, in which the kids look at a problem through the eyes of someone else. “When you ask people to shift their perspective and imagine receiving advice from a friend, you get a lot more creative and effective solutions to problems than just trying to solve the problem your-

self,” Fletcher said. And that’s what the study found. In one part of the study, teachers identified a problem that was challenging for their students – for example, not being able to go to a friend’s birthday party because you’re going to be out of town with your parents.

Students also thought about a challenging problem in their own lives. Some problems that were mentioned included “my brother has a communication disorder,” “my dad has to be away for two months” and “my sister bullies me.” Results showed that without the perspective-shift training, fewer than half of the students were able to provide a solution to the age-typical problems and almost none were able to provide a solution to their own problems.

But 94 per cent of those who were trained in perspective-shifting provided a solution to both.

Judges (who were trained teachers) also rated the children’s solutions on creativity, as assessed by how surprising or unique the solu-

tions were. With the intervention, the average creativity score was 6.44 out of 10 (moderate creativity) compared to 3.05 (low creativity) for those who did not receive the perspective-shifting intervention. These results showed how creativity training could boost children’s sense of self-efficacy – the belief that they had some control and power over their own lives, Fletcher said. When considering their own problems, most of the children who received the intervention came up with a potential solution. But 15 of 16 children in the control group essentially gave up, Fletcher said. They either said they didn’t know how to fix their problem, or displayed some version of magical thinking, such as saying they could become a superhero. A second longitudinal study involving 28 students in the same camp was designed to test the effects of a five-day, 10-hour narrative creativity curriculum on creativity, self-efficacy and resilience.

NSS wing of PGGC-46 celebrates Meri Maati, Mera Desh campaign

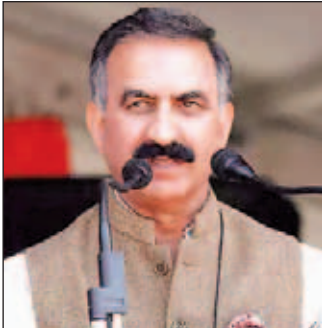

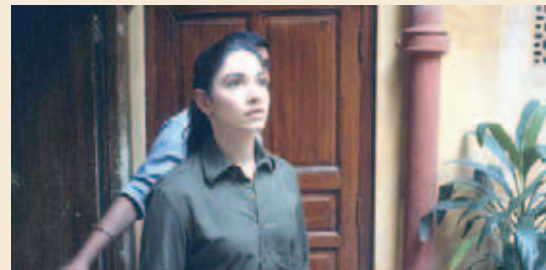

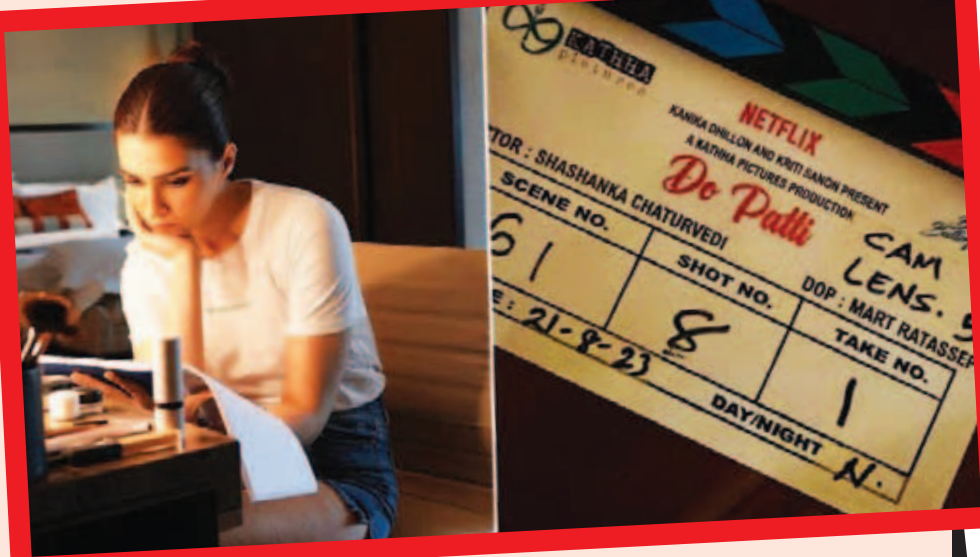
Kriti Sanon shares pictures from first-day shoot of 'Do Patti'
