People can visit temples, Hry CM after govt denies permission for Yatra

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar Sunday said that people who want to attend the scheduled 'Sobha Yatra' in Nuh can visit temples in their areas for Jalabhishek. The chief minister's statement comes after the Sarv Jatiya Hindu Mahapanchayat's call for a 'shobha yatra' on Monday, despite the authorities denying permission for the procession.

"Instead of the 'yatra', people can visit temples in their areas for 'jalabhishek'," he said and asserted that it is the state government's responsibility to



maintain law and order. August 28 is the last Monday of the holy month of Shravan. Haryana Director General of Police Shatrueet Kapur on Saturday said the administration had denied permission for the yatra due to a meeting of the G20 Sherpa Group, scheduled to be held in Nuh from September 3 to 7, and to maintain law and order in the aftermath of the July 31 violence. Security arrangements have been stepped up in Haryana's Nuh and other areas following the Sarv Jatiya Hindu Mahapanchayat's call for a 'shobha yatra' on Monday, despite the authorities denying permission for the procession.

Haryana safe, nobody should worry about it: Khattar on Punjab CM's remark on Nuh clashes

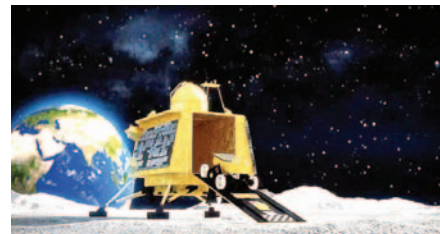

Vikram lander relays data on Moon's temperature

The Chandrayaan-3 lander module which landed on the Moon's surface successfully has begun doing its set experiments and subsequently relaying them back to ISRO headquarters. In its latest update, ISRO on Sunday put out the first observations recorded by the 'ChaSTE' payload onboard Vikram Lander.

Chandra's Surface Thermophysical Experiment (ChaSTE) payload was attached to measure the thermal conductivity and temperature on the moon. The payload was developed by a team led by the Space Physics Laboratory (SPL), VSSC in collaboration with Physical Research Laboratory, Ahmedabad. The payload attached to the lander recorded the variation of temperature



on the lunar surface with an increase in depth. ISRO shared a graph on X, formerly Twitter, which showed the change in temperature on the moon's surface and underneath. At a depth of 8 cm, the payload recorded temperature as low as (-) 10 degrees centigrade. With the gradual rise towards the surface, the temperature too could be seen rising.

Seven killed in Bengal firecracker factory blast

KOLKATA: At least seven people were burnt to death and some others sustained burn wounds at an explosion in an illegal firecracker factory in West Bengal on Sunday, official sources said. The blast occurred at Duttapukur in North 24 Parganas district. The injured have been taken to the Barasat hospital. Unconfirmed sources put the toll at 8, with five others injured.

The blast happened around 10-30 AM in the residential area of Nilgunj-Moshpole under Duttapukur police station, and the immediate impact was the two-storied house was flattened and some other residences in the vicinity were damaged. The owner of the illegal factory, identified as Azuibur Rahman, immediately fled from the scene to avoid arrest and escape the wrath of the locals, who accused the administration of not paying any heed to their allegation regarding the existence of the firecracker factory in the thickly populated locality. Scores of sacks stacked with firecrackers - chocolate bomb, a banned item - were found in another godown, which fortunately was not affected in the massive explosion, sources added.

PM urges industry to go beyond profits, focus on supply chain

NEW DELHI: Urging global business captains to focus on resilient supply chain and sustainability, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said that time has now come for the industry to go beyond profits and brain-storm the emerging challenges facing the world. Speaking at B20, a part of G20, the prime minister said that India has prepared a framework of green credit which emphasises on planet-positive actions. "I urge global businesses to be associated with this and make it a global movement," he said. PM Modi noted that sustainability is both an opportunity as well as a business model stating that sustainability should not just be limited to rules and laws but should be a part of daily life. "When we are discussing global challenges at the G20 forum, sustainability is one of the very important topics. We need to keep in mind that discussion around sustainability should not just be limited to rules and laws but should be a part of daily life," he said. Modi stated that today when the world is grappling with supply chain issues, India offers the solution.



6.75 lakh potted foliage, flowering plants to adorn Delhi streets during G-20 Summit

NEW DELHI: Six months down the line when greening efforts along roads and avenues associated with the G-20 Summit started in the national capital, with Delhi LG, VK Saxena taking the initiative of greening the Sardar Patel Marg, 6.75 Lakh pots of flowering and foliage plants will adorn the 61 roads and venues associated with the Summit, an official statement said. According to the statement, after a preparatory meeting headed by the LG, directions were issued identifying agencies who would undertake this drive and they were tasked with procuring specific number of plants/pots, preferably from their own nurseries. This resulted in seamless coordination between 05 departments or agencies undertaking the procurement and placement of these potted plants.

Moon and Man

Poor Prakash Raj got brutally trolled for what? For repeating an oft-repeated joke the point of which basically is this --- here's who you might find upon landing on the moon. Humans have been taken with the moon for centuries. One of the earliest works of science fiction, a 17th-century novel by Johannes Kepler, is Somnium or The Dream. A chunk of the dreaming has to do with the journeying to the moon or Levania. But the dream template, it has been suggested, is a clever narrative tool used by Kepler to duck critics. Mr Raj please note: in 1633 Galileo was condemned for his support of heliocentrism and Somnium, which was written in 1608 and published in 1634, also supported the same theory.

Around the same time, the Church of England Bishop, Francis Godwin, wrote The Man in the Moone. In this book, borne on wild swans or gansas, the Spanish Domingo Gonsales flies to the moon accidentally. The inhabitants of the moon or the Lunars are, as he discovers, a tall people leading a vice-less, crime-free life. They were also all blessed with good health and healed naturally. And yes, Godwin's Lunars practised a religion "similar to Christianity"! The scientists at Isro will have their own views, but in the French satire by Cyrano de Bergerac, published in 1657, the protagonist takes off for the moon from Paris with the help of bottles of dew strapped to his body.

After an abortive attempt or two, Bergerac's protagonist from The Other World: Comical History of the States and Empires of the Moon, Cyrano finally makes it to the moon. The locals turn out to have four legs and musical voices. On Vikram and Pragyan's landing last week, Prime Minister Narendra Modi gave a congratulatory speech. Among other things he quoted a Hindi children's rhyme about the moon. He spoke about how the concept of "Chandamama door ke" would be replaced soon by "Chandamama tour ke", basically to say that one day, travel to the moon would become a commonplace affair. Talking about near and far and space travel, in 1898 American astronomer Garrett P. Serviss wrote a novel about a journey by some Earthlings to Mars. And when they landed on the strange planet, who did they find? A woman whose ancestors had been captured from Kashmir in a Martian raid years ago. Serviss calls her Aina.

Heatwaves are getting more deadly and frequent

The old, the ill, and the poor are especially vulnerable to the devastating effects of heatwaves like the one we are presently experiencing. One of the deadliest natural disasters in recent memory, the 2003 heatwave that saw temperatures in Europe exceed 47.5 degrees Celsius claimed between 45,000 and 70,000 lives in a few weeks.

The emergency rooms in the cities were overflowing, the forests burnt, and the harvests in the fields perished. Around 13 billion dollars worth of costs were incurred globally. However, compared to other climate-related events, the public continues to be less informed about the dangers of heat waves. According to a study that was written in the journal Nature Communications, this is an issue. Heatwaves similar to the one we experienced in 2003 might become the new standard in the coming years.

Epidemiology and climate modelling combined: Researchers from the Institute for Environmental Decisions at ETH Zurich collaborated with an international group of epidemiologists on the study. Since 2013, they have been systematically collecting data on daily heat-related excess mortality for 748 cities and communities in 47 countries in Europe, Southeast Asia, Latin America, the U.S. and Canada. The researchers used this dataset to calculate the relationship between the average daily temperature and mortality for all 748 locations. From this,



they were able to establish each location's ideal temperature, where excess mortality is at its lowest. In Bangkok, for example, this value is 30 degrees Celsius, in São Paulo 23, in Paris 21 and in Zurich 18 degrees Celsius. Physically plausible weather extremes modelled: Every tenth of a degree above this ideal value increases excess mortality. "Not all heat is the same," explains Samuel Lüthi, lead author of the study and doctoral student under David Bresch, Professor for Weather and Climate Risks. "The same temperature has a completely different impact on heat-related excess mortality in the populations of Athens and Zurich." This depends not only on the temperature, but also on physiology (acclimatisation), behaviour (long siestas in the middle of the day), urban planning (green spaces

versus concrete), the demographic structure of the population, and the local healthcare system.

Using this ideal value, the researchers calculated how excess mortality would develop with an average global temperature increase of 0.7 degrees (the value in 2000), 1.2 degrees (the value in 2020), 1.5 and 2 degrees. They used five particularly powerful climate models, known as SMILEs (single-model initial-condition large ensembles). "We ran the same model up to 84 times, with slightly different weather conditions each round. That gave us a multitude of possible weather systems that are likely to occur if there is a certain amount of CO2 in the atmosphere," explains Lüthi. The researchers then coupled this data with an epidemiological model to calculate the corresponding heat mortality. Previous

projections of heat-related mortality were mostly based on calculations that used one climate model over a specific period of time. "Our method allows us to quantify extremes in the climate system much more effectively and reduce uncertainties that arise from the idiosyncrasies of certain models." Using supercomputers, Lüthi has calculated the impact of over 7,000 years of physically possible weather phenomena on heat-related mortality. The corresponding dataset is more than 1 terabyte in size.

Up to 15 per cent of deaths are heat-related: The results show that the risk of heatwaves with high excess mortality has already increased dramatically over the past 20 years. "The excess mortality of a hot summer like 2003 used to be considered an extreme, once-in-a-century event. We now expect it to occur once every 10 to 20 years," says Lüthi, "or, in a world that is 2 degrees warmer, every two to five years in many places." Heat mortality figures that were considered highly improbable in 2000 (once every 500 years), will occur 14 times every 100 years in a 2-degree scenario. Assuming no adaptation to the heat, the probability of mortality during such extreme heatwaves will increase by a factor of 69.

Regions that are particularly at risk of escalating heatwaves include the Gulf and Atlantic coasts of the U.S., the Pacific coast of Latin America, the Middle East, Southeast Asia and the Mediterranean region.

Even in moderate climate scenarios, a hot summer in these regions can result in ten per cent of all deaths in a country being heat-related. Paris was particularly affected by the heatwave in 2003. The figure at that time was five to seven per cent; that means in the French metropolis alone, the heatwave led to the premature deaths – from dehydration, heatstroke and heart attack – of around 2,700 people. "According to our calculations, up to 15 per cent of deaths in Paris could be heat-related in future," says Lüthi. Europe is among the hotspots – particularly southern Europe. There are two factors that come into play here: temperatures here are rising twice as fast as the global mean, and the population is disproportionately older.

A worrying outlook: "The results frightened me," says the 30-year-old climate scientist. "While I was working on the study, I always tried to look behind the figures and see the real lives of people who are affected by the changes. It's worrying."

Particularly, as he points out, because the assumptions underlying the modelling are actually on the conservative side. The study assumes that the global average temperature is on track to increase by a maximum of 1.5 to 2 degrees Celsius, but with greenhouse gas emissions at their current levels, the more likely figure is 2.6 degrees. Future scenarios do not take into account the projected population growth, migration to cities.

Recating on the post, Musk on his micro-blogging account said, "Impressive".

"As I shift my responsibilities to support this transition, I want to thank the talented, passionate, and hard-working employees at Tesla, who have accomplished things many thought were not possible. I also want to thank Elon for his leadership and optimism, which has inspired so many people," he added.

Singapore's National University appoints British professor Jasjit Singh for Sikh Studies

In an effort to foster an understanding of Sikh beliefs and practices, the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences (FASS) of the National University of Singapore (NUS) and the Central Sikh Gurdwara Board (CSGB) have appointed Associate Professor Jasjit Singh as the inaugural CSGB visiting professor, according to the statement released by NUS.

His appointment was announced at the official launch of the CSGB Visiting Professorship in Sikh Studies, which Minister for Education, Chan Chun Sing, attended as Guest of Honour.

Associate Professor Singh is an expert in Sikh studies from the School of Philosophy, Religion and the History of Science at the University of Leeds, UK.

He began his term with FASS on August 7 2023 and will be serving for one semester (or five months) in the new academic year 2023/2024.

The official launch event today follows the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding in April last year between NUS FASS and CSGB to set up this Visiting Professorship.

Administered by the NUS FASS South Asian Studies Programme, with a Singapore Dollar1.06 million endowment fund raised by the local Sikh community (with donations receiving government dollar-to-dollar matching), this is the first Sikh studies visiting professorship to be established in Asia, outside the Indian subcontinent, as per the release. FASS Dean, Lionel Wee, said, "Assoc Prof Jasjit Singh is a leading authority in



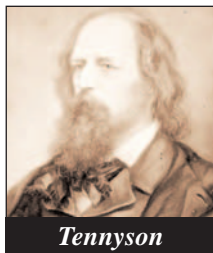

Reduction in cholesterol linked to age-related hearing loss: Study

Age-related hearing loss is connected to a decline in cholesterol in the inner ear, according to a new study.

The research was led by Mara Eugenia Gomez-Casati from the Institute of Pharmacology, School of Medicine, University of Buenos Aires-CONICET, Mauricio Martin from the Institute of Medical Research Mercedes, and Martin Ferreyra from the National University of Córdoba in Argentina. Experiments published in the open-access journal PLOS Biology reveal that phytosterol supplements can act in place of missing cholesterol and prevent sensory impairment in mice. Outer hair cells (OHCs), a type of sensory cell in the inner ear, lengthen sound waves to increase their volume. Age-related hearing loss is



caused by the decrease of these cells' capacity to stretch in response to sound as we get older. This prevents

sound amplification. Researchers made the hypothesis that hearing loss might be connected to a loss of cho-

lesterol in OHCs since cholesterol is a crucial component of the stretch response and because brain cholesterol has recently been demonstrated to decline with ageing. On mice, this theory was tested.

First, the researchers measured the amount of CYP46A1 in inner ear OHCs because this enzyme helps break down and recycle cholesterol. As expected, they found more CYP46A1 in the inner ears of older mice than in younger mice, and consequently less cholesterol.

Next, they showed cause and effect by inducing hearing loss in Outer hair cells (OHCs), a type of sensory cell in the inner ear, lengthen sound waves to increase their volume. Age-related hearing loss is caused by the decrease of these cells' capacity to stretch in re-

sponse to sound as we get older. This prevents sound amplification.oss in young mice, as indicated by abnormal inner ear-cell output, by over-activating CYP46A1 with a drug. Finally, they tested whether increasing cholesterol in the brain could counter the drug.

Since cholesterol itself cannot actually enter the brain from the blood, the researchers used plant-based cholesterol-like compounds called phytosterols which can.

The young mice who got both the CYP46A1-activating drug and 3 weeks of dietary phytosterols displayed improved OHC function. As phytosterols can be found in many over-the-counter supplements, they could be a convenient way to combat age-related hearing loss. However, di-

rectly testing their effects on hearing loss in older mouse models as well as in humans will be necessary before more definite conclusions can be made.

The authors add, "In the present work we show that: 1) aging triggers cholesterol loss from sensory cells of the inner ear, 2) a retroviral treatment widely employed for HIV/AIDS patients reproduces the cholesterol loss observed in aged individuals and leads to impaired outer hair cells' function and 3) we found that these defects can be partly reversed by phytosterols supplementation. Our findings are very promising because they provide the first proof-of-principle supporting phytosterols supplementation as a possible approach for prevention or treatment of hearing loss."

CM announces halt on formal felicitation ceremonies until 31st October this year

SHIMLA: In a significant move under 'Yavastha Parivartan', the state government has decided to halt the practice of honouring dignitaries by presenting shawls, caps, and bouquets during official events. Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu announced this decision, attributing it to the ongoing natural calamity concerns. As per these directives, no formal honouring or felicitation

ceremonies will take place in government functions until the 31st October, 2023. Earlier, the state government has also suspended the customary guard of honour traditionally accorded to VVIPs during field visits until 15th September this year. Beekeeping doing good business

New SOPs define 30 days timeline for final disposal of salvage trees

DINESH AGARWAL SHIMLA, AUG 27

In a bid to streamline unattended salvage tree management from the forest land and prevent revenue losses due to timber corrosion and thievery, the State Government has introduced Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) focusing on expediting the entire process to ensure accountability among forest department officers and strict adherence to fixed timelines.

"It has been observed that due to delay in the disposal of salvage trees, the State has to suffer huge financial loss. With new SOPs in place, the availability of timber at local level, reduction in transportation cost, boost in revenue, conversion in raw forms and enhanced efficiency of field staff will be ensured," said Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder



Singh Sukhu. The rollout of these SOPs will be carried out in phases. Initially, the procedures will be enforced in seven Forest Ranges across five divisions within four circles, including Hamirpur, Dharamshala, Solan and Shimla, on a pilot basis starting from 1st September, 2023. In the subsequent phase, these SOPs will extend to 70 forest ranges within six circles across the State, with full implementation scheduled

from 1st July, 2024.

Under the new SOPs, the disposal of less than 25 salvage trees will follow a structured schedule, which will have timeline spans from the initial marking to the final disposal within 30 days. The forest guards and Forest Corporation staff will collaborate on the details during the first seven days of the month. Over the subsequent three days, Deputy Rangers will mark the trees, with a list of designated lots submitted to Range Officers in the following three days. The Range Officer, within seven days, will handle all necessary formalities for felling, conversion and transportation of the produce to specified depots. This will be done at predetermined rates, with communication to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) and completion of work within the stipulated timeframe.

For effective disposal, the Range Officer will intimate the DFO and the Forest Corporation counterpart about the same, along with extraction costs and transportation expenses, between the 22nd and 23rd days of the month. Subsequently, the DFO will generate a bill based on extraction, transportation costs and royalty, which will be forwarded to the Divisional Manager of the Forest Corporation. Harvested materials can then be transferred to the Corporation upon payment of the bill, within the period of the 24th to the 26th day of the month. If the Corporation declines to take the lot, the Range Officer will conduct a departmental auction between the 27th and 28th days of the month, adhering to the reserve price provided by the Himachal Pradesh Forest Department's management wing.

This wood is obtained from trees indigenous to the Indian continent like the mango, neem, banyan and peepal which can live up to 400 years but to fulfill our needs, these trees are cut at a tender age of 15-20 years.

However, it is not necessary that all the problems related to the eyes are due to diabetes. But having diabetes for a long time definitely damages the eyes. Diabetes damages and weakens the small blood vessels of our body. Due to which there is a blockage in the blood supply.

Now, someone from India or me can make any claim, but those are just words. Anybody can say anything and that doesn't change or affect anything. When we will have the match, then we might see what goes on."

The remarks Shadab was referring to was actually said during India's squad announcement for the upcoming Asia Cup 2023. Various videos of the press conference surfaced on social media in bits and pieces. Among those videos, there was a clip on X, formerly known as Twitter, of Agarkar saying "Virat Kohli will handle them". However, according to various media reports, Agarkar was never questioned about how India plans to deal with Pakistan's pace attack. Since 2019, Kohli has faced Pakistan only in the T20I format in which he amassed 158 runs against the pacers which comprise of Naseem Shah, Shaheen Afridi and Haris Rauf.

Ahead of Asia Cup, Pakistan go top of ODI rankings

KARACHI: Ahead of Asia Cup 2023 and the crucial ICC ODI World Cup, which is to be hosted in India, Pakistan on Sunday topped the ODI rankings, overtaking Australia. Following their 3-0 ODI series sweep over Afghanistan on Saturday, Pakistan sealed the top spot in the ODI rankings. Prior to the Afghanistan series, Australia were at the top of the rankings, with Pakistan placed second at 115.8 rating points. However, the series win over Afghanistan saw the Babar Azam-led team leapfrog Australia at the top with 118.48 rating points. The Baggy Greens dropped to the second spot with the same ranking points. Zaka Ashraf, chairman of the PCB Management Committee, voiced his delight over Pakistan taking the top spot in the ODI rankings. "This achievement reflects the hard work, dedication, and unity exhibited by our talented players and their unwavering focus on excellence. It is a proud moment for all of us as the Pakistan cricket team reclaim the top spot in the ODI rankings," Ashraf said. "I also want to congratulate and laud the efforts of the entire squad, coaching staff, and support personnel for their collective commitment to raising the flag of Pakistan high in the world of cricket," Ashraf added.

"Historic and inspiring performance": President congratulates Indian women's blind cricket team for clinching gold in IBSA World Games

NEW DELHI: President Droupadi Murmu on Sunday extended heartfelt wishes to India's Blind Women's cricket team, which defeated Australia to clinch the gold medal in the IBSA World Games in Birmingham. Taking to her official handle on X, formerly Twitter, the President congratulated the visually impaired cricketers for their exceptional display in the tournament. "Heartiest congratulations to Indian women's team for clinching the gold medal by beating Australia in blind cricket tournament! The nation is proud of you for historic and inspiring performance in the first ever edition of blind cricket in IBSA World Games," President Murmu posted on X. India restricted Australia at 114/8 in the allotted 20 overs and then chased down the revised target of 42, following a weather-induced intervention, in just four overs. Blind cricket marked its debut in IBSA World Games last week, with traditional rivals England and Australia going against each other in the opening match. In what was the inaugural women's cricket final for the visually impaired, India prevailed in the title showdown with Australia by 9 wickets. Owing to bat first, Australia did not get off to a strong start, with their first wicket going down in the 4th over. Perhaps overawed and overcome by the pressure of a final in a multi-discipline global sporting event, Australia struggled to keep the scoreboard ticking over, scoring just 29 runs in the powerplay overs.

Bumrah's return will add depth to Indian attack: Curtly Ambrose

NEW DELHI : West Indies legend Curtly Ambrose was one of the best fast bowlers of his time. Running in at a height of 6 feet and 7 inches and delivering thunderbolts from over a height of 9 feet, Ambrose was one of the most difficult bowlers to encounter for any batter. Now commentator and coach, Ambrose spoke about the forthcoming ICC Cricket World Cup in India this year and on the return of Indian pacer Jasprit Bumrah, saying that his presence will make India favourites in the tournament at home and advised him to increase his pace gradually. ICC CWC 2023 will start in India from October 5 onwards and India will kickstart their campaign against Australia in Chennai on October 8. "Jasprit Bumrah is a fine bowler and as he returns to the Indian team it will add a lot of depth and variety to the Indian attack. And his presence in the World Cup will make India favourites. He will bowl at the death and that's what you need. Having said that, a comeback is never easy. Jasprit should go a little slow in the early stages. My advice to him will be to go gradually. If he starts to bowl full steam in every match it is not the best way to go about it."

They broke the Asian record of 2:59.51, set by Japan at the world championships in Oregon last year.

The Indian team finished behind the USA in a nine-team heat 1. The USA clocked a time of 2:58.47 and finished first while Great Britain finished third with 2:59.42 to take the final qualifying spot in heat 1. The first three finishers from each of the two heats and two other teams with the fastest times made the cut for the final.

Men's Hockey team departs for Asian Hockey 5s World Cup Qualifier

BENGALURU: The Indian Men's hockey team on Sunday flew to Salalah, Oman for the Men's Asian Hockey 5s World Cup Qualifier, set to take place from August 29 to September 2. India Team has been placed in the Elite Pool along with Malaysia, Pakistan, Japan, Oman, and Bangladesh. The Indian Team will open their campaign on Tuesday, 29th August, against Bangladesh. Meanwhile, the Challengers Pool consists of Hong Kong, China, Indonesia, Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, and Iran. After their opening contest against Bangladesh, India will take on Oman and Pakistan on Wednesday, August 30 and then follow it up with matches against Malaysia and Japan on Thursday, August 31. To earn one of the 16 available berths at the 2024 FIH Hockey 5s World Cup, India would have to earn at least a top-three finish in the upcoming tournament. Oman have already booked one of the berths from Asia, being the host nation. Mandeep Mor will Captain the Indian team, with Mohammed Raheel Mousen serving as Vice-Captain. Suraj Karkera has been named as the goalkeeper, and the defenders are Jugraj Singh, Dipsan Tirkey, and Mandeep Mor. Sukhvinder has been added to India's defence line as a late replacement for Manjeet, who suffered an injury during a training session at the SAI Centre Bengaluru. Maninder Singh and Mohd. and Raheel Mousen have been named as midfielders, while Pawan Rajbhar and Gurjot Singh will lead the attack.



It was horrendous back then...had excruciating pain: Shreyas Iyer

BENGALURU: Indian middle-order batter Shreyas Iyer on Sunday detailed his rehabilitation process from a tough injury that kept him out of action for a large part of this year, saying that he is happy to return from the injury and did not expect to recover this fast from it. In an interview with the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), ahead of the Asia Cup starting from August 30, Iyer talked about his mental state during the injury/rehab phase, support system, the practice camp in Bengaluru ahead of the continental event etc.

"I am feeling happy to have rejoined the team and seeing happy faces all around. The compassion shown by all the players was fantastic and I am thrilled to be back," said Iyer in the video.

Iyer said that he was down due to nerve compression and a slipped disk was



compressing his nerve and causing extreme pain right down to his tiny toe.

"I had this nerve compression, basically slip disk which was compressing my nerve and the pain was going right down to my tiny toe. It was horrendous, to be honest at that point in time and I was in excruciating pain. I was not able to express myself properly what I was going through. This was the feeling I had back then, it was hard to communicate it to players. I was having it (this injury) way back and was taking injections, taking other routes to see through it and play more matches. But it reached a saturation point when I realized that I had to get surgery done. Physios and bag experts said that it is important that you go under the knife," he added.

Iyer said after the injury, he went back home, got hospitalised and took a lot of

rest before he decided to go ahead with the surgery.

"Straight after the injury, I went back home and was hospitalized for two days. I gave myself rest for ten days at home. During that period, one of the doctors checked my toe strength. He said that you can manage, but surgery would be required. I decided to get the surgery done because I have long years ahead to play. Even the doctors said that it was a great decision," said Iyer. Iyer said that after the surgery, he was in London for three weeks.

"Post-surgery, I was in London for three weeks. The doctor had to check my progress over a period of time. After three weeks, he asked me to come back then NCA (National Cricket Academy) physios took over. It was a roller coaster ride, to be honest. The pain was there for three months and then it started to subside.
