Setting at rest all speculations around Chinese President Xi Jinping's participation at the G20 Summit in New Delhi, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of China has announced that Li Qiang will attend the 18th G20 Summit to be held in New Delhi, India on September 9 and 10.

Quoting foreign ministry spokesperson, Mao Ning, the statement read, "At the invitation of the government of the Republic of India, Premier of the State Council Li Qiang will attend the 18th G20 Summit to be held in New Delhi, India, on September 9 and 10."

However, no reason was given in the statement about Xi's absence from the summit. Earlier, Reuters had reported that Chinese President Xi Jinping is likely to skip the G20 Summit to be held in India.

Sources in China, two of whom said they were informed by Chinese officials, added they were not aware of the reason for Xi's expected absence, according to Reuters. The Chinese President has made



few overseas trips since China abruptly dropped its Covid restrictions. He, however, attended the BRICS Summit in South Africa last week. Several G20 ministerial meetings in India ahead of the summit have been contentious as Russia and China together opposed joint statements which included paragraphs condemning Moscow for its invasion of Ukraine last year, according to Reuters. Prime Minister Narendra Modi met Xi on the sidelines of the BRICS Summit during which he highlighted India's concerns over the unresolved issues along the Line of Actual Control (LAC), in Ladakh.

India giving voice to 'voiceless' Global South at G20: Lekhi

NEW DELHI: India has emerged as the voice of the almost "voiceless group" of countries of the Global South and at the G20 forum and it is highlighting problems faced by the 'not-so-prosperous' countries, External Affairs Minister of State Meenakashi Lekhi said. Lekhi emphasised that India, which represents the Global South, is in the right position to engage in conversation with G20 nations and talk about the needs of the underdeveloped nations which are "very rich in resources." India has since the start of its current Presidency of the G20 focussed on putting forward concerns of the Global South- which is a term used to refer to the developing or least developed countries. Global South includes countries in Africa, Asia etc.

Haryana registers 20 percent rise in tax revenue collection

**BUREAU
CHANDIGARH:** Due to the strenuous efforts of the Haryana Government, the Excise and Taxation Department is continuously increasing the tax collection. There has been a remarkable 20% increase in Haryana's tax collection in the first five months of this year. From April to August of the financial year 2023-24, revenue of Rs. 27,438 crore has been collected in Haryana.

Giving this information, an official spokesperson said that under the dynamic leadership of Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal, the Haryana Government is constantly working towards strengthening and modernizing the infrastructure of the Excise and Taxation Department. The department is digitising its tax collecting processes as a result of which tax revenue is



continuously rising. All efforts are being made by the department to maximize revenue and minimize leakages. As a result of this, the Excise and Taxation Department has collected tax of Rs. 27,438 crore in the first five months of this financial year (April-August 2023), which is 20 percent more than the previous year, whereas in the same period last year the state had collected revenue of Rs. 22,880 crore.

In the first five months of this financial year, the Excise

and Taxation Department collected VAT of Rs. 4,686 crore, while the SGST collection including IGST settlement, SGST compensation stood at Rs. 17,062 crore, which is 30.2 percent higher than the previous year.

With this, an excise collection of Rs. 4,792 crores was done with an increase of 15.15%.

These state government data clearly shows that Haryana Government efforts are boosting revenue, which is positive news for the state's growth. Besides, it also reflects the economic progress of the state.

He further informed that the state had collected a total GST of Rs. 33,527.42 crore in the financial year 2022-23. Haryana stood at the fourth position in total per capita GST collection for the financial year 2022-23.

112 roads including
National Highway
blocked due to rainfall
in Himachal Pradesh



AGENCY SHIMLA: As many as 112 roads, including National Highway 305, were blocked in Himachal Pradesh due to rainfall on Sunday, according to the State Emergency Operation Centre. Besides this, 12 water supply schemes have also been disrupted. One fire incident has been reported in the past 24 hours, according to government data. According to official data, an average of about seven individuals have been losing their lives daily in rain-linked occurrences within the hilly state since the monsoon's commencement on June 24. Himachal Pradesh has been battered by heavy rainfall for the past several weeks and the state has suffered great loss of life as well as property in various rain-related incidents, such as landslides, cloudbursts, flash floods, etc. Meanwhile, a total of 397 people lost their lives in rain-related incidents, out of which 143 people have lost their lives due to landslides, flash floods and cloudbursts. As per information, 370 people have been injured while 39 people are still missing, informed the government on Saturday.

Policy to develop electric charging stations for e-vehicles soon: CM

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that the state government would bring an effective policy to develop electric charging stations for e-vehicles in the state. While presiding over a high-level meeting on Sunday evening at Shimla, he said that the policy would focus on various aspects including accessibility, convenience and opening employment avenues. He said that private operators would also be roped in with 50 percent subsidy for setting up e-charging stations.

The Chief Minister was also detailed about the charging stations already established and those which were currently being set up in the state.

He said that the state was being developed as a Model State for Electric Vehicles. With the objective of reducing carbon emissions, electric vehicles are being encouraged with the



collaboration of private and public sectors. Apart from this, six green corridors were being developed in the first phase, he said and added that the length of these corridors, comprising National and State Highways is 2137 kms. The Chief Minister said that Himachal Road Transport Corporation was also adding more electric buses to its fleet in a phased manner and asked HRTC to identify routes for the operation of new electric buses. He said that the

dependence on fossil fuels would be substantially reduced by transforming public transport to electric transport. Speaking on the land use for construction activities and developing infrastructure, he said that it should be made sure that the land was scientifically suitable for the construction works. Construction works should be started only after a scientific study of the land on the spot. In this process, the study of practical aspects is absolutely

necessary, he added.

The Chief Minister also reviewed the physical status of the construction of solar power projects. He directed to speed up the process of transfer of land for the construction of these projects. He also directed to explore the possibility of setting up Green Ammonia and Bio Gas plants to promote green energy. He also asked to prepare a detailed project report by 31st October, 2023 for setting up the plant on a pilot basis. He said that green hydrogen was the source of clean energy for the future. He said that Hydropower projects of 1,000 MW capacity would be completed in the year 2023-24. Rural Development and Panchayati Raj Minister, Anirudh Singh, Principal Advisor to the Chief Minister, Ram Subhag Singh, Chief Secretary Prabodh Saxena, Principal Secretaries Bharat Khara and RD Nazem, Maneesh Garg, secretaries and senior officers attended the meeting.

The fire department team reached the spot and stopped the fire from reaching other houses. A total of 21 families lived in these nine houses. The fire was so fierce that, within a short time, all the houses were burned. In the preliminary



investigation, a short circuit is believed to be the cause of the fire. Property worth two crores reduced to ashes. An immediate relief of Rs 10 thousand each has been disbursed to the affected families. SDM Rohru Sunny Sharma said that the police and administration teams reached the spot and took stock of the relief work. The Revenue Department will assess the loss and prepare a report. Most houses in the hills are made of Kath-kuni earthquake-resistant structures, but Deodar wooden cravings are highly inflammable, catch fire easily, and shortly render heavy losses. People who had already faced heavy losses due to the rainfury again made the shift to safer places.

committee, apart from former President Kovind, include Union Home Minister Amit Shah; Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, Adhir Ranjan Chowdhury; former Leader of Opposition in the Rajya Sabha, Ghulam Nabi Azad; former Finance Commission chairman NK Singh, former Lok Sabha secretary general Subhash C Kashyap, senior advocate Harish Salve and former chief vigilance commissioner Sanjay Kothari.

The Monsoon Session of Parliament, which concluded last month, was held in the old Parliament building.

The announcement of the Special Session came as a surprise in political circles with the parties gearing up for assembly polls in five states later this year.

Civil Surgeon Fatehgarh Sahib called the meeting of District Level Maternal Mortality Review Committee on Monday to provide better health facilities to high-risk pregnant women and reduce maternal mortality. During the meeting of the District Level Maternal Mortality Review Committee, Dr. Davinderjit Kaur directed to take important steps to reduce the maternal mortality rate and said that the delivery of every pregnant woman should be made safe. A plan should be made regarding the delivery of a pregnant woman from the seventh month and the pregnant woman and her family members should be informed about this. High-

risk pregnant women should be encouraged to deliver in appropriate health institutions well in advance so that there was no emergency. She said that there were many reasons for maternal death such as complicated delivery and hospitalization of pregnant mothers. Women not going to the hospital after being referred, pregnant women not providing information about any chronic disease,

excessive bleeding after delivery, infection, high blood pressure, unsafe abortion. But their main goal was to reduce the maternal mortality rate. District Family Welfare Officer Dr. Daljit Kaur, Dr. Niru Syal, Dr. Shikha Gynaecologist, Senior Medical Officer Dr. Surinder Singh, Dr. Gurminder Singh Child Specialist, Dr. Parveen Kaur, DPM Kashitij Seema were present on the occasion.

Power Ministry's linkage rationalization initiative holds
promise of billions in savings for Punjab customers

In a significant turn of events, the Ministry of Power has initiated the third round of linkage rationalization, opening up avenues for substantial cost reductions in power generation. The Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) now finds itself at a crossroads, with an opportunity to harness these benefits for the betterment of its customers. The Ministry of Power's recent call for Expression of Interest from Independent Power Producers (IPPs) for the third round of linkage rationalization has triggered a wave of anticipation in the power sector. This process allows power producers to reconsider their existing coal linkages and potentially make a switch to more favorable sources. The prominent beneficiaries of this move are Private IPP's in the State Viz Talwandi Sabo Power Plant and Nabha Power Plant. The shift to a better coal source

holds the promise of considerable reductions in energy charges for these power producers. Since the entire generation is directly supplied to PSPCL by these IPPs, the corporation could emerge as the ultimate winner should this proposition be embraced. Projections indicate that for Talwandi Plant alone, this move could lead to an annual cost reduction of over Rs 350 crores i.e. a cumulative benefit of more than Rs. 6000 Crore over the remaining lifespan of the power plant. This massive sum is not intended to line the corporation's coffers, but rather to be funneled directly into the pockets of power consumers in the form of reduced electricity charges. All eyes are now on PSPCL as they hold the key to unlock this potential windfall for their consumers. Charged with the responsibility of delivering consistent and affordable electricity to the homes and businesses across Punjab, the onus is on PSPCL to seize this opportunity.

Editorial

Living with nature

August 2023 saw another historic event besides the Chandrayaan landing. It happened half a world away from India. The people of Ecuador voted to halt an oil drilling project that would have decimated a crucial biodiversity area, the home of two tribes. Never before in the world has the extraction of oil been halted by organized popular pressure. In another referendum, inhabitants of the capital Quito outlawed mining in a biosphere reserve adjoining the city. The campaigns were not restricted to tribal peoples. They were steered nationally by youthful environment activists.

The referendums were held alongside Ecuador's national elections. In India, the Supreme Court has opined that our constitutional channel for the people's voice is elections, not referendums. The example of Ecuador suggests the two are not incompatible. The environmentalists won 59% and 69% votes respectively in the two referendums. Virtually no candidate in the national elections polled half these numbers.

India has seen broad-based environmental campaigns across regions and communities. The iconic example is the Narmada Bachao Andolan. The Chipko movement was largely a local initiative, like the protracted struggles of the denizens of Niyamgiri in Odisha and Hasdeo in Chhattisgarh. An urban equivalent would be the outcry against the expansion of a copper smelting plant in Tuticorin.

These protests come at a price. Even when the campaigners win, they pay dearly. Thirteen people died in police firing in Tuticorin. The Niyamgiri movement has been punctuated with arrests all through. Why then do the protesters persist? As corporates and governments would convince them, 'developing' their home terrain would promise a better livelihood in mining and industry. Our indigenous peoples are not fools. Living as close to the margin as they do, they can clearly assess the threats to their survival. They know only a handful of them would benefit from the industrial order replacing their rugged but supportive ecosystem. It would spell the end of their viable community life. The people of Bengal's Deocha Pachami lead a hard life as it is, racked by silicosis from the local quarries they work. But they fear a deeper upheaval from the projected open-cast collieries in the area. There is another level of resistance that we might call spiritual for want of a better word. At Niyamgiri, a major issue was the significance of the hills in tribal religion. Beyond such explicitly religious beliefs is a far deeper sense of life values and powers organic to the environment. It is not only a spiritual but a visceral perception. This, primordial environmentalism is engaging radically with modern environmental science to postulate a total life of the earth where every element, living and non-living, sustains every other.

Political stability under Modi

India — with huge potential of demographic dividend and digital prowess — was flummoxed by fractious politics, has undergone great political stability under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, which has allowed for legal reforms, improvements to basic welfare systems and a vast upgrading of the country's infrastructure, Ben Wright stated in a report by United Kingdom-based The Telegraph.

As per the author, India holds potential but also some problems, but under the leadership of PM Modi, India definitely holds the bold targets, it aims to achieve.

The author has pointed out that with the success of Chandrayaan-3, India became only the fourth (and third extant) country to achieve a "soft" landing on the Moon — following the US, the Soviet Union and China.

The fact that Russia's attempt to land in the same previously unexplored region had ended in ignominious failure a few days earlier further accentuated the achievement, which, rather deliciously, coincided with the BRICS international relations summit in Johannesburg.

India's successful lunar mission was met by wild celebrations across the subcontinent and was hailed as "another one of the many straws in the wind" illustrating the country's ascendancy, according to Ray Dalio, a billionaire News Sport Business Opinion Ukraine Money Royals Life Style Travel Culture Puzzles 11 1 hedge fund manager, The Telegraph reported.

Notably, India's population recently overtook that of China's: the International Monetary Fund's forecast that it will be one of the fastest-growing large economies in 2023 and for the next five years; the sheer acreage of red carpet rolled out in foreign capitals around the world to welcome Narendra Modi, the prime minister; and Air India's recent world record order of 470 planes from Airbus and Boeing. Opening his company's first retail outlets in Mumbai and Delhi in May, Tim Cook, the Apple boss, declared India was "at a tipping point". Over the summer, a unit of Foxconn,



the Taiwanese electronics giant that makes iPhones, started drawing up plans to build a USD 1 billion factory in the southern state of Karnataka; the US-based Micron Technology announced it will start building a new semiconductor facility in Gujarat later this year, and Goldman Sachs held its first board meeting in India in more than a decade, The Telegraph reported.

The author further points out that the country's rising influence can be seen in other spheres, too.

Cricket's Indian Premier League is now the second most valuable sports league in the world behind just American football's National Football League with offshoots in an increasing number of countries.

The newly-released Spider-Man: Across the Spider-Verse is the first US blockbuster to feature an Indian superhero. In the film, which played to packed cinemas across India over the summer, Pavitr Prabhakar (whose name is a play on Peter Parker), admonishes another character when he asks for "chai tea": "'Chai' means tea, bro! You're saying 'tea tea'!" Call it cultural reappropriation perhaps, The Telegraph reported.

According to the author, India also appears to be benefiting from the convergence of several economic mega-trends. On current estimates, it will be the world's third largest economy in four years' time; its working-age population will exceed China's by an astounding 235 million (roughly the population of Pakistan) in seven years; and its gross domestic product will more than double to USD 8.5 trillion (2.78 trillion Euros) in 10.

As globalisation has seemingly gone into reverse following the Covid pandemic and as international frictions intensify, India should be well-positioned to profit from a boom in "friend-shoring", The Telegraph reported.

US Treasury Secretary, Janet Yellen was in India earlier this year talking up the idea. Western companies want access to India's burgeoning middle class, and Western politicians have a vested interest in helping boost a second centre of economic gravity to compete with China in the region. The author further

pointed out that the world's biggest democracy with over 600 parties has historically been bedevilled by fractious politics. However, under PM Modi, the Bharatiya Janata Party has won consecutive parliamentary majorities and looks on course to make it a hat trick next May.

Coupled with the marked decline of the Congress Party, this has provided a measure of political stability that has allowed for legal reforms, improvements to basic welfare systems and a vast upgrading of the country's infrastructure, according to the Telegraph report.

However, the report also points out that the clock is ticking. Economists say the demographic stars align just once in the lifetime of any given nation. India currently accounts for one in every four people of working age in the entire world but its elderly population is forecast to increase by 40 per cent in the coming decade.

The economy must maximise growth while its demographic boom is peaking or it will, in the words of Samiran Chakraborty, chief India economist at Citigroup investment bank, "get old before it gets rich". The economy's heavy reliance on the services industry means the country is struggling to generate enough jobs to employ India's youth. Education standards are well below par and malnutrition is stubbornly high. The top 1 per cent and top 10 per cent in India capture 22 per cent and 57 per cent of income (the 3rd and 4th highest share across major countries). And there are signs that economic anxiety appears to be breeding a generation of angry youngsters and creating toxic identity politics, The Telegraph reported.

Unsurprisingly, PM Modi has been emphasising on the positive aspect when he ruffled at length on the theme of India's "demographic dividend" during his Independence Day speech last month. The prime minister noted that, while other countries are ageing fast, the average India is just 28, adding: "My country has crores [tens of millions] of hands, crores of brains, crores of dreams, crores of resolutions!"

India has emerged as voice of Global South

India's G20 Sherpa Amitabh Kant has underscored the "unique Indian narrative," India has set during its presidency of the G20 Summit, saying India "truly emerged as the voice of the Global South".

In a short video message, shared on X, by the official handle of India's G20 Presidency, Kant said, "So India has built a unique Indian narrative during its G20 presidency." "India has truly emerged as the voice of the Global South during its G20 presidency and this is the first time that four emerging markets, one after another Indonesia, India, Brazil, and South Africa will hold the G20 presidency and therefore it gives a very massive opportunity to bring all the critical issues of developing countries centre stage, as India has done, and carry them vigorously forward for implementation," said Kant in the short video message.

In the video, India's G20 Sherpa highlighted the issues India focused on during its presidency of the summit like digital public infrastructure, principles of lifestyle for sustainability, traditional medicine, millets, global biofuel and many more.

He also mentioned how India, in contrast to other countries, has organised different meetings of the G20 Summit in different states and cities. However, according to Kant, one of the biggest achievements of India's presidency was its focus on women empowerment and gender equality. Kant said that among India's most critical ones was its focus on digital public infrastructure. "Then there's been a lot of focus on traditional medicine. The Health Ministry and the G20 relating to

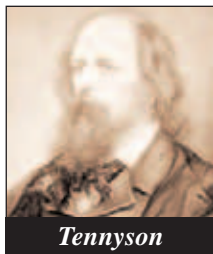


health have focused on the traditional medicine sector in a big way," he said. India's G20 Sherpa also said that during the summit, there was a focus on new Group Startup 20, the Disaster Risks Resilience, which "opened the door for discussion on all aspects relating to disasters and how to handle them". The Indian narrative also "revolved around Millets," which was a part of every single meal that was served, said Kant adding, "There was a huge emphasis on focus on One district-One product, which formed a part of our gifts which were given to the visitors who came to India". He also said that India's G20 has been "very different from other countries". "In most G20 countries, when they take over the presidency, the events are held in either one city or two cities. In sharp contrast to this, the Prime Minister's emphasis has been that the G20 should be held in every state of India.

Immune cells carve their own route: Research

When combating disease, our immune cells must reach their target as rapidly as possible. Immune cells actively build their own navigation system to traverse across diverse settings, according to researchers at the Institute of Science and Technology Austria (ISTA). This challenges earlier notions about these movements.

The findings, which were published in the journal Science Immunology, expand our understanding of the immune system and suggest prospective new techniques for improving human immunological response. Immunologic threats like germs or toxins can arise everywhere inside the human body. Luckily, the immune system—our very own protective shield—has its intricate ways of coping with these threats. For example, a crucial aspect of our immune response involves the coordinated collective movement of immune cells during infection and inflammation. But how do our immune cells know which way to go? A group of scientists from the Sixt group and the Hannezo group at the Institute of Science and Technology Austria (ISTA) addressed this question. In their study, published today in Science Immunology, the researchers shed light on the immune cells' ability to collectively migrate



through complex environments. Dendritic cells — The Messengers: Dendritic cells (DCs) are one of the key players in our immune response. They function as a messenger between the innate response—the body's first reaction to an invader, and the adaptive response—a delayed reaction that targets very specific germs and creates memories to fight off future infections. Like detectives, DCs scan tissues for intruders.

Once they locate an infection site, they are activated and immediately migrate to the lymph nodes, where they hand over the battle plan and initiate the next steps in the cascade.

Their migration towards the lymph nodes is guided by chemokines—small signalling proteins released from lymph nodes—that establish a gradient. In the past, it was believed that DCs and other immune cells react to this external gradient, moving along towards a higher concentration. However, novel research conducted at ISTA now challenges this notion.

One receptor — two functions: The scientists took a close look at a receptor—a surface structure found on activated DCs called "CCR7". CCR7's essential function is to bind to a lymph node-specific molecule (CCL19), which triggers the next steps of the immune response. "We found that CCR7 not only senses CCL19 but also actively contributes to shaping the distribution of chemokine concentrations," Jonna Alanko, a former postdoc from the lab of Michael Sixt, explains.

Using different experimental techniques, they demonstrated that as DCs migrate, they take up and internalize chemokines via the CCR7 receptor, resulting in local depletion of chemokine concentration. With less signalling mole-

cules around, they move further into higher chemokine concentrations. This dual function allows immune cells to generate their own guidance cues to orchestrate their collective migration more effectively.

Movement depends on cell population: To understand this mechanism quantitatively at the multicellular scale, Alanko and colleagues teamed up with theoretical physicists Edouard Hannezo and Mehmet Can Ucar, also at ISTA. With their expertise in cell movement and dynamics, they established computer simulations that were able to reproduce Alanko's experiments. With these simulations, the scientists predicted that the dendritic cells' movement not only depends on their individual responses to the chemokine but also on the density of the cell population. "This was a simple but nontrivial prediction; the more cells there are the sharper the gradient they generate—it really highlights the collective nature of this phenomenon!" says Can Ucar.

Additionally, the researchers found that T-cells—specific immune cells that destroy harmful germs—also benefit from this dynamic interplay to enhance their own directional movement.

Farmers protest before DC office against improper girdawari of damaged crops inn flood

instead of rushing it and probably putting myself a week or two behind, being able to give myself extra time and make sure we get through the whole tournament," Maxwell said.

A veteran of Australia's two most recent World Cup campaigns in 2015 and 2019, Maxwell is a vital cog for the five-time champions given his ability to score quickly and

contribute with the bat, ball and in the field.

Maxwell has not played for his country since he featured in an ODI against India in Wankhede in March and hasn't taken the field at any level since making a one-off appearance in an English County Championship match for Warwickshire at the start of July.

He was set to play in the T20I component of Australia's ongoing tour of South Africa, but

soreness around his ankles saw him return home.

"I don't think I could have predicted how sore I was going to be once I got to South Africa. But it was one of those things. Even when I went to train that day, I still felt fine. There was nothing wrong. Something just got impinged. I think one of the tendons around my ankle was a little bit inflamed, there's a bit of swelling, so it kept on catching which meant it just gave me a bit of pain," Maxwell said.

"Hopefully, the cortisone takes care of that and I can get back up and running to where I was just before I went to South Africa. We've probably just got to be a bit smarter going forward. Making sure that my preparation is a bit more managed, I think leading into a flight like that. I'm already back in the gym, so I'll probably get back into full training probably this week, so it won't be a long turnaround. It's just knowing that I'm not over the hurdle of the original injury yet."
