**CHANDIGARH:** Amit Arya, media advisor to Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar, has resigned from his post. He was appointed as Media Advisor in 2014. He was continuously looking after the work of CM's media advisor for almost 9 years. There is a stir in the Chief Minister's office due to his resignation. According to sources in the CMO, Amit Arya had submitted his resignation to the Chief Minister on August 30.

## Fake recruitment scam busted in Kupwara, 5 held

**KUPWARA:** With the arrest of five people, police claimed to have busted a fake recruitment scam in the military engineering service in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district. As per a statement, the gang duped approximately 8 innocent unemployed youths hailing from North Kashmir to the tune of Rs 25 lakhs "Substantial evidence, including counterfeit appointment letters, gate passes, laptops, desktops, printers, and cell-phones, have been seized from the possession of the accused," read Kupwara Police statement. Police said they are expecting more arrests in connection with the case. "Further investigation is on," added the statement.

## Ukraine lost over 66k military, 7,600 weapons

**KIEV:** Ukrainian troops have lost more than 66,000 military and 7,600 weapons since the beginning of the counteroffensive, Russian Defense Minister Sergei Shoigu said on Tuesday. "Since the beginning of the so-called offensive, enemy losses have exceeded 66,000 people and 7,600 weapons," Shoigu told at a meeting with senior defence officials. Additionally, Russian air defence systems have shot down 159 HIMARS rockets.

# 'Hungama' over India vs Bharat

## Centre likely to bring proposal in special session

The term "President of Bharat" has been used for the first time in an official invite to foreign leaders attending the weekend G20 summit, replacing the traditional "President of India". This marks a significant shift in nomenclature on the international stage as the country hosts the mega event featuring US President Joe Biden and UK Prime Minister Rishi Sunak among others.

President Droupadi Murmu's invite to G20 foreign leaders and Chief Ministers for a dinner on September 9, says: "President of Bharat" instead of "President of India".

Officials say this is the first change of India's nomenclature for any official event.

The term "Bharat" is also in the Constitution, officials point out. "India, that is Bharat, shall be a Union of States," it says in Article 1 of the Constitution.

President Droupadi Murmu's invite to G20 foreign leaders and Chief Ministers for a dinner on September 9. "Bharat" has also been used in a G20 booklet handed to foreign delegates, titled "Bharat, The Mother Of Democracy", to highlight, in India's G20 presidency, its rich democratic ethos for thousands of years.

"In Bharat that is India, tak-



ing the consent of the people in governance has been part of life since earliest recorded history," are the opening words of the booklet. It goes on to say: "Bharat is the official name of the country. It is mentioned in the Constitution as also in the discussions of 1946-

48". Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma was among the first to cheer the big change. "REPUBLIC OF BHARAT - happy and proud that our civilisation is marching ahead boldly towards AMRIT KAAL,"

## Cong says 'Union of States' is under assault

**NEW DELHI:** Congress on Tuesday launched a scathing attack against the BJP-led Central government over the invitation to a G20 summit dinner hosted at the Rashtrapati Bhavan, which the party claimed that the invitations had 'President of Bharat' inscribed on them, instead of 'President of India'. Senior Congress leader Jairam Ramesh shared the invitation letter on the social media post X which claimed that invitations at the Rashtrapati Bhavan had 'President of Bharat' inscribed on them instead of 'President of India'. "So the news is indeed true. Rashtrapati Bhavan has sent out an invite for a G20 dinner on September 9 in the name of 'President of Bharat' instead of the usual 'President of India,'" he said in a post on X.

## Fostering good values among youth is important: Manohar

## Auto retail grows 9 pc in August, two-wheelers up 6 pc YoY

NEW DELHI, SEP 5

Domestic auto sales logged 9% year-on-year growth in August 2023 on the back of robust demand across multiple segments, including two-wheelers and tractors, showed the vehicle retail data released by the Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA) on Tuesday.

Total sales across various

segments such as passenger vehicles (PV), two-wheelers (2W), three-wheelers (3W), and commercial vehicles (CV) stood at 18,18,647 in August 2023 as against 16,74,162 in August 2022. In August, comprehensive year-on-year growth was observed across multiple segments: 2W at 6%, 3W at 66%, PV at 6.5%, Tractor at 14%, and CV at 3%. Commenting on August data, FADA President Manish

Raj Singhania said, "Auto retail in August witnessed a promising 9% YoY growth, maintaining momentum similar to the preceding month. Concurrently, a 3% month-on-month uptick suggests a reversal in short-term trends." The FADA data shows Maruti Suzuki remained the undisputed leader with a 42.37% market share in the domestic market, followed by Korean auto major Hyundai Motor India.

The Supreme Court today reserved its verdict on a batch of pleas challenging the abrogation of Article 370 of the Constitution which bestowed special status on the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir.

A five-judge bench headed by Chief Justice DY Chandrachud reserved the verdict after a marathon 16-day hearing.

The bench, also comprising Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul, Sanjiv Khanna, BR Gavai and Surya Kant, heard the rejoinder arguments of senior advocates Kapil Sibal, Gopal Subramaniam, Rajeev Dhavan, Zaffar Shah, Dushyant Dave and others on the concluding day of the hearing.

The top court said if any lawyer appearing for the petitioners or respondents wishes to file a written submission can do so in the next three days. The submission should not extend beyond two pages, it said.

In the course of the hearing over

the past 16 days, the top court heard Attorney General R Venkataramani, Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, senior advocates Harish Salve, Rakesh Dwivedi, V Giri and others on behalf of the Centre and the intervenors defending the abrogation of Article 370.

The lawyers dwelt on various issues including the constitutional validity of the Centre's August 5, 2019



decision to abrogate the provision, the validity of Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, which split the erstwhile state into two Union Territories, challenges to imposition of Governor's rule in Jammu and Kashmir on June 20, 2018 and imposition of President's rule in the erstwhile state on December 19, 2018 and its extension on July 3, 2019.

# Govt registers 28.2 pc growth in GST: Cheema

**SHASHI PAL JAIN CHANDIGARH, SEPT 5**

Punjab Finance, Planning, Excise and Taxation Minister Advocate Harpal Singh Cheema on Tuesday said that breaking its own records in the Goods and Services Tax (GST) collection set by bringing the revolutionary changes during financial year (FY) 2022-23, the Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government has recorded a growth of 28.2 percent in GST revenue during the first 5 months of the current fiscal year 2023-24 as compared to the last fiscal year.

Disclosing this, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that as against the total revenue of Rs 6648.89 crore collected from GST during the first 5 months of the financial year 2022-23, a total of Rs 8524.17 crore has been collected during the same period in the current fiscal year. He said that additional revenue of Rs 1875.28 crore has been collected from GST up to the month of August this fiscal year.

Revealing the details of the revenue collected by the Taxation department from various sources, Harpal Singh Cheema said that the total revenue collected from GST, Excise, VAT, CST and PSDT during the FY 2023-24 has registered



an increase of 17.49 percent as compared to last fiscal year. He said that a total revenue of Rs. 13116.36 crore was collected from the above said sources during the first 5 months of the FY 2022-23, whereas, an increase of Rs. 2293.67 crore has been observed with the collection of

Rs. 15410.03 crore during the same period in current fiscal year.

Finance Minister Cheema said that despite recording an increase of more than 41 percent in excise revenue during the FY 2022-23 as compared to FY 2021-22 after the implementation of the new excise policy by Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann's government, this growth graph is still touching the heights.

He said that during the first 5 months of the FY 2023-24, the revenue received from Excise has reflected an increase of 7.69 percent compared to the same period of the FY 2022-23. He said that total revenue of Rs 3800.23 crore has been collected in the current fiscal year whereas Excise collection for the same period in FY 2022-23 was Rs 3528.92 crore, thereby, registering an increase of Rs 271.31 crore. The Finance Minister said that this increase in revenue has been possible due to the sincere efforts of the Excise and Taxation department and the support extended by the people of the state.

He said that mobile apps like 'Mera Bill' by the Tax Department and 'Excise QR Label Citizen' by the Excise Department have been launched to give an opportunity to the general public to effectively participate in the campaign of strengthening the state's financial health.

the cornea (pupil of the eye) is a major public health problem in India, it is an estimated that 2 lakh 70 thousand donor eyes are needed to perform 1 lakh corneal transplants in India per year, which is almost 4 times more than the availability of donor eyes. The huge gap in demand and supply of human eyes is a challenge that can only be overcome with the cooperation of the general public.

Dr. said that the cornea is the transparent outermost glass-like layer of the eye. It

is through the cornea that light enters our eye, due to which we see, due to injury, corneal trauma, any kind of viral, bacterial or fungal infection /infection due to some type of malnutrition such as vitamin A deficiency. But when this disease is by birth, the transparent cornea becomes opaque, the eye cannot focus outside light and the person cannot see anything and when this opaque cornea is transplanted with a new transparent cornea, the person is able to see again.

Project Director Atma presents annual report of Natural Farming Khushhal Kisan Scheme to DC

**UNA:** Project Director, Atma Agriculture Department, Dr. Virender Kumar Bagga presented the annual report of 2022-2023 of Natural Farming Khushal Kisan Scheme to Deputy Commissioner Raghav Sharma. The report covers various activities carried out under natural farming in the entire state of Himachal Pradesh. From time to time, the report includes an overview of the efforts made by the farmers in the fields and by the State Project Implementation Unit Shimla and the review work done by the government under Atma Krishi. Project Director, Atma Agriculture Department, Dr. Virender Bagga said that under natural farming in the district, various indigenous cow breeds like Red Sindhi, Sahiwal, Gir, Tharparkar, Rath, Ongole and Desi Pahari cows are used to extract various components from the dung and cow urine. Natural farming is done by Dr. Vagga said that in Una, 12, 100 farmers are doing farming in natural way on an area of about 1,471 hectares. Dr. Bagga told that from the year 2018 till today, farmers are bringing more and more area under natural farming and are growing different types of Rabi and Kharif season vegetables like cucumber, ghee, black zucchini, brinjal, bitter gourd, lady's finger, pumpkin, Pandol, peas, cabbage, potato, radish, fenugreek, spinach, pulses and oilseed crops and fruits like mango, apple, strawberry and pomegranate etc. are being produced through natural farming.



Tubewell made available at cost of lakhs in Bharmad Panchayat closed for one year



**DAULAT CHAUHAN JAWALI:** The tubewell built in Kamotra Mohalla of Gram Panchayat Bharmad, which comes under Jwali Vidhansabha, has been closed for a year, so the tubewell has become a white elephant for the people, till date the Jal Shakti Department has not tried to repair it and start it. 271 corona warriors in Tanda Medical College have not been paid for 5 months

In Dr. Rajendra Prasad Government Medical College, Tanda, 271 Corona warrior employees have to face a lot of problems due to non-payment of salaries for the last five months. Even after placing their demands before the government, these corona warrior employees have not been able to get their due. The situation has become such that these employees living in rented rooms are passing through a period of severe financial crisis. Out of these warrior outsourced employees, there are also 95 bard boys from 135 nurses, who are rendering their

services day and night in the medical college, but their salaries are not being released. Some of these are such employees who were kept during the Corona period. All these outsourced employees are also afraid of losing their jobs because the contract of these outsourced employees hired on contract is ending on 30th September. These outsourced employees say that during the Corona period, when people did not even like to see each other, they saved people's lives without caring for their lives. The leaders deployed them as outsourced employees to grab the vote bank. But today neither the government nor anyone wants to see their

problems. The outsourced nurses have to say that before coming to power, the Congress government had talked about regularizing them, but now they are being shown the way out. Monika Koundal, District President of Real Corona Warrior Association, said that the government should make a concrete policy for outsourced employees and they should be regularized so that they can get justice. Monica said that the outsourced employees started working with Rs 10,000 per month, but they are not being paid salaries for the last five months, due to which it has become difficult for them to survive.

The summons happened after a group of senior citizens lodged a complaint with the Enforcement Directorate (ED) accusing the real estate firm, Seven Sense Infrastructure Pvt. Ltd., of cheating by promising



them flats in the New Town area, in the northeastern part of the city.

The ED, on its part, filed an enforcement case information report (ECIR) on the issue after getting complaints from the

alleged deprived home buyers.

As per the complaints received by the central agency, the firm allegedly collected several crores of rupees from the investors, promising them residential flats within four

years. But those promises have not been fulfilled yet.

Tollywood actor Nusrat Jahan, who represented the Basirhat Lok Sabha seat in North 24 Parganas, told a media conference on August 2 at the Press Club, Kolkata, that "I am not involved in any wrongdoing or any form of fraudulent practice. I resigned as its director long ago, in March 2017. I don't know why I am being falsely blamed."

Before addressing the media person, Nusrat Jahan said, "I have not come here to give any clarification as I have not committed any wrong. A media trial is going on, and I have to make my stand clear," she added.

A few days later, on August 6, she, along with actor Yash Dasgupta, told media persons that the ED would not summon any more.

Editorial

Himalayan apocalypse

If we want to save the country from a Himalayan disaster and prevent the desertification of the Ganges valley and, yet, progress, the only remedy is to limit construction activities. The devastating floods and landslides in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand and the drowning of large tracts in Delhi are unprecedented. Experts say these are natural outcomes of the climate crisis and mindless infrastructure projects on a young mountain range.

This year's devastation has been precipitated by intense construction activities like road-widening and dam construction that weakened the hill slopes and triggered major landslides. Crucial road links between Kalka and Shimla, Kullu and Manali, Chandigarh and Manali, Manali and Leh, Dehradun and Haridwar, were disrupted as roads caved in or on account of landslides. A total of 170 routes had to be closed in Uttarakhand alone. Officially, 108 people died in Himachal and 90 in Uttarakhand; meanwhile Joshimath's woes continue.

In both Himachal and Uttarakhand, the blasting of hills has changed the hyd-ro-flow pattern. Earlier, rain-water used to replenish the aquifers and flowed through hundreds of natural paths. Now, it flows down pucca, often concretised, roads that turn into massive artificial drains with logs and boulders rolling down. This calls for an immediate stop to 'developmental' infra projects for at least a year. The physicist, Vikram Soni, who has closely studied the river systems of North India, told a researcher that he repeatedly emphasised the need to ban construction on the flood plains.

But the government was unwilling to consider this view.

According to the Land-slide Atlas of India prepared by the National Remote Sensing Centre, Isro, all 12 districts of Himachal are susceptible to landslides. These also bear the brunt of the maximum construction activities. Landslide exposure analysis carried out in the mountainous areas covering 147 districts in 17 states ranked Himachal's Mandi district at the 16th place, followed by Hamirpur (25), Bilaspur (30), Chamba (32), Solan (37), Kinnaur (46), Kullu (57) Shimla (61), Kangra (62), Una (70), Sirmour (88) and La-haul and Spiti (126) in the socio-economic parameter risk exposure map. Scientists at the Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology have repeatedly warned that 51% of Uttarakhand has crossed the 'very high susceptibility zone'. Therefore, landslides will increase; and so will flooding. These scientists documented Uttarakhand's 300-plus landslides in 2023. Nobody can estimate how much is or will be lost. In-nu-merable bridges and culverts, resorts, townships and vehicles are now threatened. In Uttarakhand, the railway tunnel to Karnaprayag is a disaster.

China agitates neighbors as it maps out territorial claims

On August 28, China's Ministry of Natural Resources published a "standard map" of China, which amounted to a unilateral assertion of whatever territory it wants to claim. Beijing said the new version was introduced to "eliminate problem maps", but China has succeeded only in upsetting numerous neighbours.

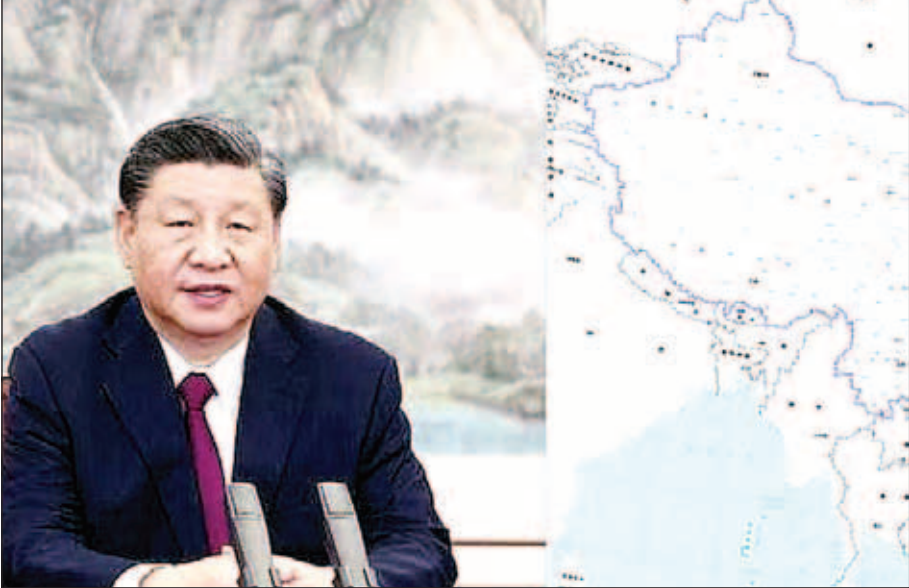
So far, five ASEAN countries have issued public statements denouncing China's creative cartography. In the following order, Malaysia, the Philippines, Indonesia, Vietnam and Brunei have complained. These five Southeast Asian states are all in dispute over China's excessive territorial claims in the South China Sea.

Interestingly, China's controversial – and legally baseless – Nine-Dash Line that is vaguely emblazoned on maps over the South China Sea is now a thing of the past. Instead, it has grown into ten dashes! The Natuna Islands of Indonesia appear within the dashed line, for example, while the new tenth dash runs to the east of Taiwan, supposedly cementing the democratic nation as "belonging" to China. One might even interpret that Chinese claims extend up to and including part of Japan's Ryuku Islands.

Manila angrily retorted, "The Philippines rejects the 2023 version of China's standard map ... This latest attempt to legitimize China's purported sovereignty and jurisdiction over Philippine features and maritime zones has no basis under international law, particularly the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS)."

Likewise, Taiwan Foreign Ministry spokesman Jeff Liu said, "No matter how the Chinese government twists its position on Taiwan's sovereignty, it cannot change the objective fact of our country's existence." The Permanent Court of Arbitration ruled in 2016 that China's ambiguous Nine-Dash Line is inconsistent with international law. This new map thus represents a slap in the face for the international community; the Hague had already decreed the Nine-Dash Line was meaningless, but it has brazenly taken it a step further by adding an extra dash.

More than that, China seems to be claiming the new dashes as its legitimate "international border". This is hegemonic behaviour in the extreme. It stands in stark contradiction to Chairman Xi Jinping's claim last week at the BRICS Summit in Johannesburg that "hegemonism is not in China's DNA". This is yet further evidence that the Chinese Communist Party's (CCP) and Xi's words are utterly devoid of integrity, if not bald-faced lies. Chinese Defense Minister Li Shangfu told the world at June's Shangri-La Dialogue, "Mind your own business", when quizzed as to why China's military engages in unprofessional behaviour when other nations' militaries pass by in international waters. The release of this map smacks of the same hubris – "Mind your own business. We don't need to consult you. We can do whatever we want. We claim what we wish." The decision to publish the map further asserts and advances Chinese sovereignty, and significantly it came shortly before the ASEAN Summit in Jakarta from 5-7 September, and the G20 Leaders' Summit in Delhi from 9-10 September. China is busily stirring the pot, keeping the issue of territorial claims on the boil. This is China's modus operandi, as it pushes its own agenda in the full knowledge that it will naturally upset others. It just does not care, since each time it acts like this it is



marking a new and more advanced line in the sand to lodge outrageous claims.

Such tactics are part of Xi's irredentist view of regaining lost territories, rejuvenating the nation and restoring the Chinese empire to its former glory. Except, the thing is, China has never owned these areas. It is hegemony and bullying, pure and simple. Southeast Asia was not the only victim of the 2023 standard map. It also shows Arunachal Pradesh and the Doklam Plateau as wholly Chinese territory, as well as Aksai Chin, which China controls but India lays claims to. The two sides have feuded over Eastern Ladakh and the Doklam Plateau in recent years, so this is particularly insulting to India, as thousands of soldiers on both sides face off along the mountainous border. Delhi lodged a protest to Beijing, and Indian External Affairs Minister Subramanyam Jaishankar noted, "Making absurd claims on India's territory does not make it China's territory." This map also mocks Xi's and Modi's recent meeting at the BRICS Summit, where they agreed to de-escalate tensions along the disputed border.

The Chinese Foreign Ministry could only mouth empty rhetoric that it has no intention of upholding: "The two sides should bear in mind the overall interests of their bilateral relations and handle properly the border issue so as to jointly safeguard peace and tranquility in the border region." Foreign Ministry spokesperson Wang Wenbin said the map was "a routine practice in China's exercise of sovereignty in accordance with the law". With his CCP blinkers on, he crowed, "We hope relevant sides can stay objective and calm, and refrain from over-interpreting the issue." In other words, this map reflects our sovereign territory, it is legal and you should just shut up and accept it. Unfortunately, this high-handed manner and bullying are increasingly China's only lingua frakas.

India to be invited to join trilateral summit of Israel, Greece, Cyprus

India can be invited to the next trilateral-- Israel, Greece and Cyprus summit expected to be held next year, The Times of Israel reported.

In the 9th Trilateral Summit between Israel, Greece and Cyprus, Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis said that the country is especially interested in natural gas exports partnership with countries such as India, which may even be invited to the next trilateral summit, expected next year, as per The Times of Israel.

In the joint press conference, Cyprus President Nikos Christodoulides, with Greek Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis and Israeli Premier Benjamin Netanyahu in Nicosia said, "We reaffirmed our strong commitment to the 3+1 format with the United States and agreed on the value of intensifying 3+1 cooperation, with concrete deliverables also with other countries and we talked specifically about India," according to an official statement issued by Cyprus government.

At the Summit, the leaders said that they reaffirmed their commitment to continue strengthening the dynamic cooperation of the trilateral partnership platform. The engagement reflects shared values and ever-increasing common interests, aiming to contribute to peace, stability, security and prosperity in the Eastern Mediterranean and the wider region. "As underlined on previous occasions, our three countries remain committed to welcoming other like-minded parties in our resolute effort to create and advance synergies, to the benefit of our countries and peoples, as well as of our region," the statement read.

"We agreed that the energy sector, and in particular, natural gas, electricity and renewable energy, is a solid foundation for cooperation in the region, based on international law including the law of the sea and the respect of all states to exercise their rights in their respective EEZ/Continental Shelf," it added.

In light of the growing need for energy diversification and interconnectivity, due to the geopolitical developments, the leaders reaffirmed the common interest to advance prospects for a reliable energy corridor from the Eastern Mediterranean basin to Europe.



Do you know stress, insomnia associated with irregular heart rhythms

According to recent research, one in every four women may develop abnormal heart rhythms – known as atrial fibrillation – after menopause, with stressful life events and insomnia">insomnia being important contributors.

The findings of the research published in the Journal of the American Heart Association, an open access, peer-reviewed journal of the American Heart Association.

Blood clots, stroke, heart failure, and other cardiovascular problems can result from atrial fibrillation. According to the American Heart Association, more than 12 million people in the United States are predicted to develop atrial fibrillation by 2030.

"In my general cardiology practice, I see many postmenopausal women with picture perfect physical health who struggle with poor sleep and negative psychological emotional feelings or experience, which we now know may put them at risk for developing atrial fibrillation," said lead study author Susan X. Zhao, M.D., a cardiologist at Santa Clara Valley Medical Center in San Jose, California. "I strongly believe that in addition to age, genetic and other heart-health related risk factors, psychosocial factors are the missing piece to the puzzle of the genesis of atrial fibrillation."

Researchers reviewed data from more than 83,000 questionnaires by women ages 50-79 from the Women's Health Initiative, a major U.S. study. Participants were asked a series of questions in key categories: stressful life events, their sense of optimism, social support and insomnia">insomnia. Questions about stressful life events addressed topics such as loss of a loved one; illness; divorce; financial pressure; and domestic, verbal, physical or sexual abuse. Questions about sleeping habits focused on if participants had trouble falling asleep, wake up several times during the night and overall sleep quality, for example. Questions about participants' outlook on life and social supports addressed having friends to talk with during and about difficult or stressful situations; a sense of optimism such as believing good things are on the horizon; and having help with daily chores.

"The heart and brain connection has been long established in many conditions," Zhao said. "Atrial fibrillation is a disease of the electrical conduction system and is prone to hormonal changes stemming from stress and poor sleep. These common pathways likely underpin the association between stress and insomnia">insomnia with atrial fibrillation."

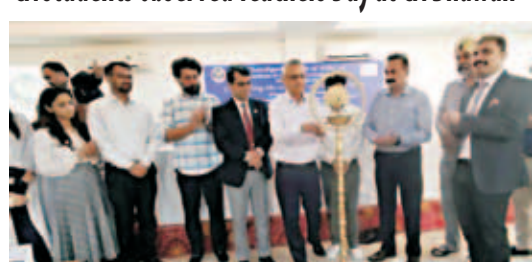

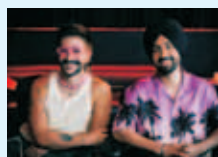
