**Stock markets extend gains for fifth day; Sensex revisits 66K**

**MUMBAI:** Equity benchmark Sensex climbed over 385 points to reclaim the 66,000 mark on Thursday, propelled by robust buying in index majors HDFC Bank, L&T and SBI amid a weak trend in global equities. A decline in crude oil prices in the international market also supported the domestic equities, traders said. Rising for the fifth straight day, the BSE Sensex recovered all the early lost ground and finally closed with a gain of 385.04 points or 0.58 per cent at 66,265.56. During the day, it hit a low of 65,672.34 and a high of 66,296.90.

**Air India enters into interline partnership with Bangkok Airways**

**MUMBAI:** Air India has entered into an interline partnership with Bangkok Airways that will allow the Tata group airline's customers seamless connections to 10 Southeast Asian destinations beyond the Thailand capital. The two carriers have also entered a Special Prorate Agreement that allows them to file 'through fares' on routes covering each other's networks. This arrangement means that a passenger can have a single fare for a single ticket covering all destinations in an itinerary. The partnership enables Air India passengers to take convenient connections via the airline's Bangkok, Hong Kong, and Singapore gateways to and from 10 destinations in Thailand, Laos, and Cambodia on Bangkok Airways' route network, a release said on Thursday.

**Mumbai: 35 'Govindas' injured during formation of human pyramids**

**MUMBAI:** At least 35 'Govindas' involved in the formation of human pyramids as part of the Dahi Handi celebrations were injured in parts of Mumbai on Thursday, an official said. The Dahi Handi festival is being celebrated with traditional fervour to mark Krishna Janmashtami, the birth anniversary of Lord Krishna. As part of the celebrations, Govindas or Dahi Handi participants form multi-tiered human pyramids to break 'dahi handis' (earthen pots filled with curd) suspended in the air. The celebrations, which began in the morning, will continue till night. Competitions are organised at various locations across the city, offering cash prizes for the Govinda groups that succeed in breaking dahi handis.

## Aditya-L1 takes selfie, images of Earth and Moon

Aditya-L1 spacecraft, India's first solar mission, that is destined for the Sun-Earth L1 point has taken images of the earth and the moon.

India's space agency- Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has released the selfie and images taken by the Aditya-L1 that has successfully performed the second earth-bound manoeuvre on Tuesday.

Sharing a video on social media platform on 'X', the ISRO said, "The earth and the moon as seen by the camera on-board Aditya-L1 on September 4."

The ISRO, on September 2 launched the country's maiden solar mission -- Aditya-L1 from the Satish Dhawan Space Centre in Sriharikota on Saturday.

It carried seven different payloads to have a detailed study of the sun, four of which will observe the light from the sun and the other three will measure in-situ parameters of the plasma and magnetic fields.

Aditya-L1 will be placed in a halo orbit around Lagrangian Point 1 (or L1), which is 1.5 million km away from the Earth in the direction of the sun. It is expected to cover the distance in four months' time. Aditya-L1 will stay approximately 1.5 million km away from Earth, directed towards the Sun, which is about 1 per cent of the Earth-Sun distance. The Sun is a giant sphere of gas and Aditya-L1 would study the outer atmosphere of the Sun.

ISRO said Aditya-L1 will neither land on the sun nor approach the sun any closer.

## 'Ghamandiya' alliance are selling 'Nafrat ka samaan': Anurag Thakur

Union Minister Anurag Thakur on Thursday took a jibe at the INDIA alliance and said that the members of 'Ghamandiya' alliance are selling 'Nafrat ka samaan'.

"In this 'Nafrat ki dukaan' of Rahul Gandhi the members of 'Ghamandiya' alliance are selling 'Nafrat ka samaan'," Anurag Thakur said.

This comes after Tamil Nadu Minister Udhayanidhi Stalin equates 'Sanatana Dharma' with "mosquitoes,

dengue, malaria, fever and corona". He further said that the alliance is demeaning 'Sanatana Dharma' and asked where is Rahul Gandhi sleeping. "They are demeaning 'Sanatana Dharma'...Where is Rahul Gandhi sleeping? Wake up...Do you agree with these statements? Isn't it a violation of law and constitution? Isn't this hate speech? Shouldn't they apologise to the people of the country?" he added.

He further said "I should make one thing clear 'Sanatana Dharma' ka apmaan nahi sahega Hindustan"

Udhayanidhi Stalin's remarks on 'Sanatana Dharma' sparked massive controversy across the nation.

Earlier in the day, Udhayanidhi released a statement clarifying his statements on 'Sanatana Dharma' and questioned the BJP leaders for twisting his speech as 'inciting genocide' and said that they are using it as a weapon to protect themselves.

And it is necessary to have 60 percent marks for girl students and 65 percent marks for urban students. He said that backward class and general caste students and students must have 60 percent marks in 10th class BC (A) for rural candidates and 70 percent for urban candidates. For BC (B) and general category, 75 percent marks are required for rural candidates and 80 percent marks for urban candidates in class 10th. Under this scheme, scholarships ranging from eight to 12 thousand rupees are given.

# Drug trafficker Malkiat Kali arrested, 9 kg heroin recovered

The war against drugs waged on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann got a major breakthrough after Jalandhar Rural Police arrested a big fish drug trafficker identified as Malkiat Singh alias Kali, who sent three swimmers to fetch a consignment of 50kg heroin from Pakistan, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Thursday. "Police teams have also seized 9 Kg heroin—a portion of the 50kg heroin consignment, from his possession," he said while adding that 22.5 kg of the heroin had already been recovered by the Punjab Police taking the total recovery to 31.5 kg. The development came in less than a month after the Jalandhar Rural Police had arrested drug smuggler Joga Singh, who swam into the Pakistan jurisdiction to retrieve the heroin consignment and 8kg heroin was recovered from him. Earlier, the SSOC Amritsar had arrested drug smuggler identified as Shinder Singh after recovering 10kg heroin and Rs 1.5 lakhs drug money from his possession. A woman drug smuggler identified as Amandeep Kaur alias Deep Bhai linked to this module was also arrested with 1kg heroin, while, another drug smuggler Shinderpal



alias Pappu was arrested with 500 grams heroin from Mehatpur. DGP Gaurav Yadav, while terming recovery of this big haul of heroin as the result of vigorous follow-up investigations by the Punjab Police, said that following forward and backwards linkages in this case, Jalandhar Rural Police have arrested the accused drug trafficker Malkiat Kali, who is resident of village Tendi Wala in Ferozepur, from near Boparai Canal Bridge near Goraya and recovered the heroin kept in his shoulder bag. Divulging details, SSP Jalandhar Rural Mukhwinder Singh Bhullar said that accused Malkiat Kali revealed that he was in regular

touch with a Pak-based drug smuggler identified as Haider Ali, who helped him in smuggle the heroin consignments to India in lieu of hawala operator. "Malkiat Kali also revealed that he had sent Joga Singh along with two more persons to Pakistan using a riverine route to fetch the 50Kg heroin consignment, which was equally distributed between his party and Joga Singh's party," he said, while adding that further investigations are on, and Police teams are on manhunt to arrest remaining drug smugglers involved in this module. A fresh case FIR no. 123 dated 07/09/2023 has been registered under section 21C of the NDPS Act at Police Station Goraya.

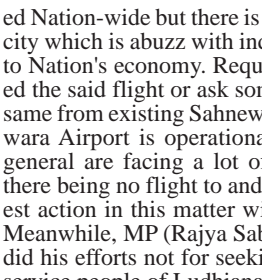

Affected apple and vegetable  
growers seek loan waiver

The Fruit, Vegetable, and Flower Growers Association demanded the Union government waive off all farm loans, which would be a major relief for 4.50 lakh Kissan Credit Card (KCC) holders in Himachal Pradesh as their crops have been damaged in the heavy rainfall.

In a letter written to Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday, the state convener of FV&FGA, Harish Chauhan, said that due to inhospitable weather and extremely heavy rainfall, their crops have been severely damaged.

He said that growers likely expect only a 20 to 25 percent yield this year, which is likely to plunge them into a debt trap due to crop failure.

All fruit, vegetables, and flowers Growers are victims of excessive rain, cloud bursts, and the washing away of crops in the



field or orchard. They have suffered a lot of damage to crops, uprooting of fruit-laden trees, and cloudburst and flash flood flooding.

The prolonged wet weather also damaged the apple crop,

and vegetables and orchards are infested by rot and early leaf fall disease.

The failure of the crop left most growers having to bear expensive labour, pesticides, fertilisers, and transportation

costs and therefore couldn't recoup the annual installment of KCC limit and interest.

There are around 4.50 lakh KCC holders in the state, and they have borrowed around five to six lakh.

All the farmers are facing huge financial losses, and many have been rendered homeless due to the washing down of houses in the state.

He said that the government should waive off all crop and land-based loans in the wake of a natural disaster.

Due to the failure of crops, it is becoming difficult to fulfil their day-to-day needs, like shopping and paying children's fees. He said that in such a situation, now all the banks are pressuring them for the recovery of KCC debt in the month of September.

He said that a waiver would save the apple and off-season vegetable economies if the Union government announced this important decision.

CM's leadership secures  
significant expansion of  
IDS: Industries Minister

Industries Minister Harshwardhan Chauhan today here informed that after persistent efforts of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu at the national level the Central Government has approved a substantial increase in the outlay for the Industrial Development Scheme (IDS) for the Himachal Pradesh.

He said that the IDS, originally notified in 2017, was previously approved for an outlay of Rs. 131 crore, which was insufficient to clear pending liabilities. This resulted in the delay of subsidy disbursement for eligible industrial units. However, following rigorous efforts of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu, the matter was brought to the Central Cabinet's attention, and the Central Government has now sanctioned an increased outlay of Rs. 1164.53 crore for the IDS scheme for Himachal and Uttarakhand. He said that under the revised IDS scheme, industrial units in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand engaged in manufacturing, bio-technology and hydel power generation (up to 10MW) will be benefit from various incentives. These incentives



include the Central Capital Investment Incentive for Access to credit (CCIIAC) at 30 percent of the investment in Plant and Machinery with an upper limit of Rs. 5.00 crore, said the Minister. Additionally, units will be eligible for the Central Comprehensive Insurance Incentive (CCI), which provides a 100 percent reimbursement of insurance premiums on building and Plant and Machinery for a period of Five years from the date of commencement of commercial production/operation, said the Minister. He further said that this increased outlay is a welcome development for the industrial sector in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand and the State Government will actively pursue the pre-registration of pending cases with the Government of India and ensure the prompt release of funds to deserving units.

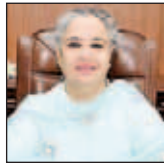
The parliamentary affairs minister said that it was important to differentiate

## Editorial Reverse gear

An excess of imports over exports — in goods that a country is capable of producing — creates unemployment, through what is generically called ‘deindustrialization’. It also entails increased external debt; and if this greater debt is covered by larger financial inflows (officially called foreign portfolio investment) which are extremely volatile, then the country can be reduced to a ‘basket case’ in a jiffy if finance suddenly decides to leave en masse. Why, then, do countries maintain an excess of domestically-producible imports over exports, instead of proscribing such imports, if it imposes a triple burden: greater unemployment, greater indebtedness and greater vulnerability? The simple answer is that many persons in the country prefer foreign goods to the domestically-produced ones and they are against any import restrictions.

There may be good reasons for this preference: foreign goods may be cheaper, or of better quality than domestically-produced ones. Tagore in Ghare Baire, for instance, was sympathetic to the import of foreign cloth, despite its unemployment-generating effect, because it improved the living standards of the peasantry. Gandhi, in contrast, was more concerned with the adverse employment effect of such import and wanted a voluntary renunciation of foreign cloth (which destroyed, as he put it, the livelihood of “my brother, the weaver”).

A point not touched upon by either Gandhi or Tagore is that this apparent conflict of interest between two social groups may tend to disappear over time: the import-induced ‘deindustrialisation’ in colonial India threw the unemployed weavers and artisans back on to land, causing, in real terms, a rise in rents and a fall in wages in the latter half of the nineteenth century; this worsened the conditions of the very peasantry that had gained initially from cheaper imports.

The long-run congruence in interests of the gainers and losers from importing unemployment may not be as strong in the present context, since the gainers are mostly from the middle class, which enjoys access to foreign goods, and losers are from the working people who have reduced employment opportunities, and the latter’s unemployment does not much hurt the former as they belong to disjointed labour markets. Government policy, therefore, has to prioritise the interests of one group over another, and there would be general agreement that increasing employment must have priority (as Gandhi had suggested). Even the middle class, surely, would not like living in a society afflicted by mass unemployment as it promotes lumpy behaviour, crime and fascism. Restricting imports to generate domestic employment must thus be a priority for any Indian government.

# Leaving no one behind is G20 legacy

Ahead of the G20 Summit in New Delhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that India’s presidency strives to bridge divides, break barriers, and sow seeds of collaboration in a world where unity prevails over discord.

In an editorial that has been published across newspapers, said that the Summit under Indian presidency will reach the last mile and would leave no one behind

“Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam — these two words capture a deep philosophy. The phrase means “the world is one family”. This is an all-embracing outlook that encourages us to progress as one universal family, transcending borders, languages, and ideologies. During India’s G20 Presidency, this has translated into a call for human-centric progress,” PM Modi said. As One Earth, we are coming together to nurture our planet. As One Family, we support each other in the pursuit of growth. And we move together towards a shared future - One Future - which is an undeniable truth in these interconnected times, he said.

First, there is a growing realisation that a shift away from a GDP-centric view of the world to a human-centric view is needed. Just as individuals make daily decisions based on their long-term health, they can make lifestyle decisions based on the impact on the planet’s long-term health. Just like Yoga became a global mass movement for wellness, we have also nudged the world with Lifestyles for Sustainable Environment (LiFE). Due to the impact of climate change, ensuring food and nutritional security will be crucial. Millets,

or Shree Anna, can help with this while also boosting climate-smart agriculture. In the International Year of Millets, we have taken millets to global palates.

The Deccan High Level Principles on Food Security and Nutrition is also helpful in this direction. Technology is transformative but it also needs to be made inclusive. In the past, the benefits of technological advancements have not benefited all sections of society equally. India, over the last few years, has shown how technology can be leveraged to narrow inequalities, rather than widen them.

For instance, the billions across the world that remain unbanked, or lack digital identities, can be financially included through digital public infrastructure (DPI). The solutions we have built using our DPI have now been recognised globally. Now, through the G20, we will help developing countries adapt, build, and scale DPI to unlock the power of inclusive growth.

That India is the fastest-growing large economy is no accident. Our simple, scalable and sustainable solutions have empowered the vulnerable and the marginalised to lead our development story. From space to sports, economy to entrepreneurship, Indian women have taken the lead in various sectors. They have shifted the narrative from the development of women to women-led development. Our G20 Presidency is working on bridging the gender digital divide, reducing labour force participation gaps and enabling a larger role for women in leadership and decision-making. ## New additions to Indian Poroid and Non-poroid mushrooms by Dr. Gurpaul his team



Contributions made by Dr. Gurpaul S. Dhingra Professor of Botany (Retired), Botany Department, Punjabi University, Patiala, and his research team to The Indian Cotricoid And Poroid Agaricomycetous Mushrooms are enormous and valuable. His journey began in the year 1978 as Research Fellow in the DST Project in the Department of Botany, Panjab University, Chandigarh under the supervision of Late Prof. K. S. Thind. During the surveys conducted in the Eastern Himalaya and adjoining hills (W. Bengal, Assam, Meghalaya, Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Tripura, Mizoram, Nagaland, and The Royal Kingdom of Bhutan) more than 500 collections were made, which belonged to 136 taxa. Of these, 132 were new reports for the study area and included 5 genera, 2 subgenera and 40 species new to science, 42 first reports from India, which have been published in reputed International/National journals.



Dr. Dhingra joined the Department of Botany, P.U., Patiala as Assistant Professor in September 1987, promoted to Associate Professor in 1998 and Professor in 2006. He and his research team (Dr. Kuldeep, Dr. Avneet, Dr. Priyanka, Dr. Jaspreet, Dr. Sanjeev, Dr. Harpreet, Dr. Samita, Dr. Ranjeet, Dr. Gurpreet, Dr. Ritu, Dr. Uzma, Dr. Navpreet, Dr. Jyoti, Dr. Maninder, Dr. Poonam, Dr. Ramandeep, Dr. Brij Bala, Dr. Nina and Dr. Ellu, Mrs. Nishi, Mrs. Shruti, Mrs. Malika, Mr. Rajnish, Mrs. Navneet, Mrs. Sureecha, Miss Harminder, Mrs. Hardeep, Mrs. Mukta and Mrs. Rupinder) explored the localities of Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Jammu & Kashmir, Punjab, Union Territory of Chandigarh and parts of Haryana and collected more than 7000 samples which belonged to more than 850 taxa, including 2 genera and 60 taxa new to science, and 350 First reports from India, which have been published in International and National journals.

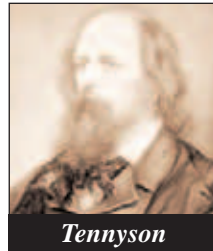

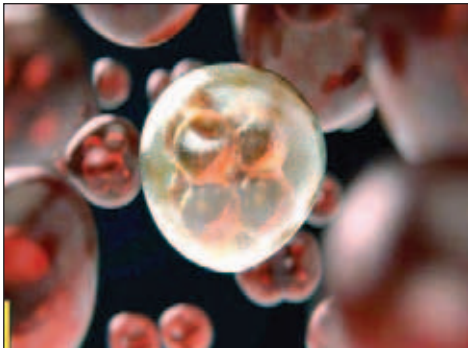


# 79 pc rise in cancer cases among those under 50

According to research published today in the open-access journal BMJ Oncology, there has been a startling 79 per cent rise in the number of new cases of cancer among those under 50 worldwide over the previous three decades (1990-2019).

Breast cancer accounted for the highest number of ‘early onset’ cases in this age group in 2019. But cancers of the windpipe (nasopharynx) and prostate have risen the fastest since 1990, the analysis reveals. Cancers exacting the heaviest death toll and compromising health the most among younger adults in 2019 were those of the breast, windpipe, lung, bowel, and stomach.

According to a related editorial, the findings challenge conventional understanding regarding the types of cancer that typically affect those under 50. While cancer tends to be more common in older people, the evidence suggests that cases among the under 50s have been rising in many parts of the world since the 1990s. But most of these studies have focused on regional and national differences; and few have looked at the is-



sue from a global perspective or the risk factors for younger adults, say the researchers.

In a bid to plug these knowledge gaps, they drew on data from the Global Burden of Disease 2019 Study for 29 cancers in 204 countries and regions. They looked at the incidence (new cases), deaths, health consequences (disability-adjusted life years or DALYs) and contributory risk

factors for all those aged 14 to 49 to estimate annual percentage change between 1990 and 2019.

In 2019, new cancer diagnoses among the under 50s totalled 1.82 million, an increase of 79% on the 1990 figure. Overall, breast cancer accounted for the largest number of these cases and associated deaths at 13.7 and 3.5/100,000 of the global population, respectively.

But new cases of early-onset windpipe and prostate cancers rose the fastest between 1990 and 2019, with estimated annual percentage changes of 2.28 per cent and 2.23 per cent, respectively. At the other end of the spectrum, early onset liver cancer fell by an estimated 2.88% every year. More than 1 million (1.06) under 50s died of cancer in 2019, an increase of just under 28% on the 1990 figure. After cancer of the breast, cancers exacting the highest death toll and subsequent poor health were those of the windpipe, lung, stomach, and bowel, with the steepest increases in deaths among people with kidney or ovarian cancer. The highest rates of early onset cancers in 2019 were in North Amer-

ica, Australasia, and Western Europe. But low to middle-income countries were also affected, with the highest death rates among the under 50s in Oceania, Eastern Europe, and Central Asia.

And in low to middle-income countries, early-onset cancer had a much greater impact on women than on men, in terms of both deaths and subsequent poor health.

Based on the observed trends for the past three decades, the researchers estimate that the global number of new early onset cancer cases and associated deaths will rise by a further 31 per cent and 21 per cent, respectively, in 2030, with those in their 40s the most at risk.

Genetic factors are likely to have a role, say the researchers. But diets high in red meat and salt, and low in fruit and milk; alcohol consumption; and tobacco use are the main risk factors underlying the most common cancers among the under 50s, with physical inactivity, excess weight, and high blood sugar contributory factors, the data indicate. The researchers acknowledge various limitations to their findings: princi-

pally, the variable quality of cancer registry data in different countries may have led to under-reporting and under-diagnosis, they suggest. And it’s still not clear to what extent screening and early life exposure to environmental factors may be influencing the observed trends, they add.

But, point out doctors from the Centre for Public Health, Queen’s University Belfast, in a linked editorial: “The findings...challenge perceptions of the type of cancer diagnosed in younger age groups.” They emphasise, “Full understanding of the reasons driving the observed trends remains elusive, although lifestyle factors are likely contributing, and novel areas of research such as antibiotic usage, the gut microbiome, outdoor air pollution and early life exposures are being explored.”

They conclude, “Prevention and early detection measures are urgently required, along with identifying optimal treatment strategies for early-onset cancers, which should include a holistic approach addressing the unique supportive care needs of younger patients.”

Beneficial yoga asanas for a good night's sleep

According to several studies, more than a third of Indians suffer insomnia, which is characterized as trouble falling asleep. If you're amongst this number, then this article on yoga asanas for sleep is for you. Yoga has multiple health benefits, and doing the different asanas will help you solve different health – physical and mental – problems. When it comes to sleep there are various reasons for not being able to get a proper one, at the proper time; stress, electronic devices, afternoon naps, depression, caffeine and alcohol is the most common causes. Doing yoga asanas for sleep will counter these problems and ensure you get a good night's rest. Try these sleep-inducing yoga asanas to get into a proper sleep routine and help you relax and rejuvenate before a new day. Uttanasana (Standing Forward Bend) Start with arms raised overhead and come into a forward fold by gliding your arms down. This is commonly referred to as a Swan Dive. Next, ensure your fingers clasp your heels. Bend the knees without locking them or injuring yourself. The more you contract and draw up your quadriceps muscles, the more your hamstrings will open. Inhale and raise your hands to your hips to release. Gradually lift by pressing your tailbone down and contracting your abdominal muscles. Halasana (Plow Pose) Start by lying flat on your back and stretching your feet in the opposite direction until they reach the floor. Use a pillow or rolled-up towel for support if you're a newbie. Resting your hands on your lower back is a fine decision. Hold the position for 45-60 seconds. Roll your spine back to the surface and elevate your legs to a 90-degree angle to release. Return your legs to the mat in a systematic manner. Kneel on your hands and knees on the floor. Spread your knees out, keeping the tops of your toes on the floor and your big toes touching. Rest your forehead on the mat and lay your undersurface between your thighs. Relax every muscle in your body. Stretch your arms out

in front of you, palms down on the floor, or bring them back alongside your thighs. Stay in this position for two minutes,



focusing on regular inhalation and exhalation to reconnect with your breath.

Salabhasana (Locust Pose) Inhale to get into a plank position, then lower your body to the ground. Clasp your hands together behind your back. Exhale and lower your feet to the ground while you take in a deep breath and raise your chest and arms as high as you can while gazing forward. Allow your hands to slide down and exhale as you return to the downward-facing dog from the locust pose. Siddhasana (Adept's Pose) Sit with your legs wide open. Insert the heel of the right leg under the perineum by bending the leg. Lay the right sole flat against the inner left thigh with the navel seated on top of the right heel. Bend your left leg and cross your left ankle over your right. Right toes should be placed between the left calf and thigh, and left toes should be placed between the right calf and thigh. Make sure your knees are on the ground. In Chin Mudra or Jnana Mudra, place the hands on the knees. Close your eyes a bit and concentrate on your breathing.

As Pakistan continue their preparations ahead of the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup in India, skipper Babar Azam enjoyed a fine spell with the bat in August, scoring valuable runs as his side claimed a whitewash series victory over Afghanistan, and posting a three-figure score in their opening Asia Cup fixture, according to ICC media release. At the other end of the crease, Shadab Khan was also prolific, demonstrating his bowling threat with wicket-taking spells in the same fixtures. Completing the lineup is West Indies' short format hero Nicholas Pooran, who was named the star man for spearheading his side's 3-2 T20I series victory against India on home soil. The shortlist for the ICC Women's Player of the Month Award features three first-time nominees; a dynamic Malaysian all-rounder, a skilful Irish seamer and a firing Dutch opener.

"If I were part of management...": Harbhajan laments  
Chahal's absence from India's ODI World Cup squad

AGENCY NEW DELHI : Former India spinner Harbhajan Singh weighed in on the World Cup squad, saying that "proven match-winner" Yuzvendra Chahal should have been a part of the team in the 50-over showpiece event.

Chahal, who was recently signed up by Kent Cricket for the remainder of the County Championship season, is one of the most successful Indian spinners in the limited overs formats with 121 wickets in ODIs at an economy of 5.26.

Chahal also missed out on a spot in the India squad for the ongoing Asia Cup, with chief selector Ajit Agarkar saying, "Kuldeep (Yadav) is currently a little

ahead of him."

Voicing his dismay over the leg-spinner's non-selection in India's World Cup squad, Harbhajan, who was nicknamed the 'Turbanator' during his playing days, said Chahal would have been one of his preferred picks if he was part of the selection committee.

Speaking at a virtual press conference ahead of the 'Greatest Rivalry' on Star Sports, Harbhajan said, "Yuzvendra Chahal is a proven match-winner, someone who has taken more wickets than any other spinner. If he was playing for any other country, he would always be in the



playing XI. He has shown himself to be a proven match-winner on a number of occasions and I feel he should have been

in the team. If I were part of the management, I would definitely play him in the team. We are all stakeholders of Indian cricket and want our team to do well. Against left-handers, we need someone who can spin the ball away from them. So, in my opinion, Yuzvendra Chahal and Arshdeep should have been in the team. I feel their non-selection would be hotly debated."

While lamenting Chahal's absence, Harbhajan said left-arm paceman Arshdeep could have made a major impact for the Indians by prizing out early wickets.

"He could have got us early wickets. I am not saying right-armers can't bring the ball back and effect early dismissals but a left-armer, with his natural angle, is better placed at making early breakthroughs. You can see how Shaheen Shah Afridi or Mitchell Starc brings the ball back into the batters with such telling effects. Both are bowling mainstays for their respective teams (Pakistan and Australia). Starc played a big role in Australia winning the 2015 World Cup. He sent back Brendan McCullum off the very first ball. An incoming delivery at that speed is tough for right-handers to handle," Harbhajan added.
