16-year-old NEET aspirant hangs self in Kota

KOTA: A medical aspirant preparing for the NEET (National Eligibility and Entrance Test) allegedly hanged herself, an officer of the nearby Vigyan Nagar police station informed on Wednesday. The incident took place on Tuesday night, Devesh Bhardwaj, an officer from the Vigyan Nagar police station, informed further, adding that the victim was identified as 16-year-old Richa Singh. She had been staying at a hostel at the Electronic Complex in Kota where she was preparing for the all-India medical entrance exam, the officer said, adding that she hailed from Ranchi, Jharkhand. Earlier, in August, Rajasthan Minister Pratap Singh Khachariyawas had voiced concern over rising suicide cases among students at coaching institutes in Kota, saying that the tutorials are run with the sole purpose of making money. Khachariyawas termed these coaching centres as 'Mafia', urging the Congress government to act strictly against them. In a similar incident, a 16-year-old student, who was preparing for the NEET for admission to undergraduate medical courses, allegedly died by suicide at his coaching institute in Kota on August 27, police said. The deceased, identified as Avishkar from Maharashtra, jumped to his death from the 6th floor of the building housing the coaching centre. It was the 23rd such incident reported this year, according to sources.

CBI arrests senior railway official in a bribery case, Rs 2.61 cr recovered

NEW DELHI: The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has arrested a Principal Chief Material Manager of North Eastern Railway (NER) in Gorakhpur for demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs 3 lakh from the complainant. Later, searches were conducted at the official and residential premises of the accused at Gorakhpur and Noida (Uttar Pradesh) led to the recovery of cash of Rs 2.61 crore (approx) and incriminating documents.

Firing claims 5 lives in MP village

DATIA (MP) : Five persons were killed and three injured in firing between a couple of families on Wednesday at Renda village in this district of Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior division, police confirmed. The deceased were identified as Surendra, Ramnaresh, Prakash Dangi, Rajendra and Raghvendra Pal. Those hurt have been admitted at the district hospital.

Centre calls all party meet day before Special Session

The government will hold an all-party meeting Monday evening - hours before the start of a five-day special session of Parliament that was called for by Union Minister Pralhad Joshi earlier this month.

Mr Joshi posted on X (formerly Twitter), writing: "Ahead of the Parliament session from the 18th of this month, an all-party floor leaders meeting has been convened on the 17th at 4.30 PM. The invitation for the same has been sent to concerned leaders through email. Letter to follow." The post also included a Kannada translation of the statement.

Monday's all-party meeting may discuss the agenda for next week's session, a lack of clarity over which has led to furious speculation, including buzz the government will move a resolution to change the country's official name from India to Bharat.

Last week formal invitations to G20 leaders from President Droupadi Murmu's office described her as the "President of Bharat", triggering an outcry from the opposition. The government pointed to the relevant line in the Constitution, which says "India, that is, Bharat, shall be a Union of States..."

There is also talk the special session has been called to formally move the Parliament from the old building to the new; sources had said

Cabinet approves additional 75 lakh LPG connections under PM Ujjwala scheme

People can avail 10 percent discount by depositing property tax by 30th Sept: DC

Eye equipment missing, post of X-ray technician vacant

JAWALI: The government has provided experts in Civil Hospital Jawali, but due to lack of machinery and equipment, the team of experts is failing to provide better health facilities to people. Ophthalmologist has been appointed in Civil Hospital Jawali but due to lack of equipment to check eyes, the patients are not getting medical facilities, there is no X-ray facility. Patients have to get X-rays done in private hospitals. Civil Hospital Jawali does not have adequate seating facilities for specialists. The specialists are being accommodated in an old building and the rooms do not even have their name plates on them due to which the patients keep searching here and there for the specialists. Names and room numbers of experts have also not been mentioned on the information board. People are demanding that specialists should be given seating facilities in the new building so that patients do not wander here and there. There is also shortage of water in toilets in Civil Hospital Jawali. There is no water for patients to wash their hands after going to the toilets. Even for drinking water



one has to bring water from home in bottles. Bad smell is spreading due to lack of water in toilets. Patients said that if this is the condition of medical facilities in the home area of the only minister of Kangra district, Chandra Kumar, then the condition of other health institutions can be judged for yourself. Patient Welfare Committee meeting has not been held in the hospital for the last 4 years due to which development plans of hospital are not being made. CMO Dr. Aman Dua said that requirement of equipment for specialist doctors will soon be sent to higher officials. Chief Medical Officer Dr. Sushil Sharma said that when experts have been found, instruments will also be made available.

First issue which was discussed was regarding the construction of the causeway so that connectivity of Baddi with mainland is maintained. Already a temporary

another causeway with a better structure and durability is also under construction, which should be complete by 25 September. But the temporary one is allowing small vehicles to pass. The

2024. Two lanes will be sufficient for the traffic. In the Haryana territory, there are two points. One point is called Chernia. The causeway is working very fine and a new bridge will also be constructed by March

2024. At another point at Maranawala, the bridge will be constructed by July 2024 and for this Point the causeway is already working. The CEO directed the NHAI to immediately expedite the work and also to ensure that necessary patchwork on Baddi-Nalagarh Road is done because that is the lifeline for the industrial area. India’s moment of pride

It was India’s moment of glory on the global stage. Overcoming the initial scepticism, it has pulled off a big diplomatic victory at the just-concluded G20 summit at a time when the international order is undergoing a churning process with rapidly shifting geopolitics. Hosting the mega event, attended by leaders from 29 countries representing the world’s most powerful economies and heads of 14 international organisations, New Delhi has delivered a major victory in areas that were thought to be intractable. The key takeaway has been the successful finalisation of the consensus communiqué — Delhi Declaration — which had eluded the previous summits because of the bitter division among the members over the Ukraine war. The final statement, mirroring a nuanced position without hurting the nations on either side of the divide, reflected the triumph of India’s stewardship and a crowning moment for its diplomacy. This is significant because the grouping was divided on the Ukraine war, with Russia and China on one side wanting to avoid even a discussion on the issue while the western nations were rooting for a strong language to condemn Russia. Eventually, a compromise was brokered that significantly toned down criticism of Russia. Prior to the summit, it was widely believed that India would not be able to forge a consensus on the contentious Ukraine crisis. The Declaration also addressed key global issues — without ruffling any feathers — including climate change, gender equality, financial inclusion, terrorism and money laundering. Admitting the African Union, a regional block of 55 member states, into the G20 has added another feather to India’s crown and strengthened its standing as a voice of the Global South. The African Union’s entry was proposed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in June and it was befitting that he welcomed AU chairperson Azali Assoumani to take the seat as a full member at the start of the New Delhi summit. India, over the past few years, has actively established itself as a prominent advocate of the Global South, highlighting its difficulties and aspirations. India’s strong support for AU’s entry adds momentum to the push for a more inclusive and representative G20. It aligns with India’s vision to foster a multipolar world and a more equitable international order. India and Africa have long-standing trade and economic linkages. The ties have been on the upswing amid China’s efforts to expand its influence. The initiative to back the AU’s G20 bid is not just symbolic but also strategic. The G20 elevation marks a significant stride for Africa’s global presence. The G20, which currently represents 65% of the world’s population, would now speak for about 80% of the global citizens. Within the continent itself, there are concerns over the AU’s lack of political cohesiveness and the multiplicity of regional economic committees. However, these could turn out to be only minor irritants in the long run.

Plant-based food alternatives

According to new research, replacing 50 per cent of meat and milk products with plant-based alternatives by 2050 can reduce agriculture and land use-related greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions by 31 per cent while also halting the deterioration of forest and natural land. According to the study just published in Nature Communications, additional climate and biodiversity benefits could accrue from reforesting land spared from livestock production when meat and milk products are substituted by plant-based alternatives, more than doubling the climate benefits and halving future declines of ecosystem integrity by 2050. The restored area could contribute up to 25 per cent of the estimated global land restoration needs under Target 2 of the Kunming Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework by 2030. The study is the first to look at the global food security and environmental impacts of plant-based meat and milk consumption at large scales that consider the complexity of food systems. The research was conducted independently by IIASA in partnership with the Alliance of Bioversity and CIAT, as well as USAID, and solicited input from Impossible Foods — a company that develops plant-based substitutes for meat products — as a potential user of the data to ensure relevance. The company also provided generic recipes for the plant-based meat substitute products used in the analysis. The data are, however, not specific to Impossible Foods and the science team had complete control over decision-making. “Understanding the impacts of dietary shifts expands our options for reducing GHG emissions. Shifting diets could also yield huge improvements for biodiversity,” notes study lead author Marta Kozicka, a researcher in the IIASA Biodiversity and Natural Resources Program. “Plant-based meats are not just a novel food product, but a critical opportunity for achieving food security and climate goals



while also achieving health and biodiversity objectives worldwide. Yet, such transitions are challenging and require a range of technological innovations and policy interventions,” adds study coauthor Eva Wollenberg from Alliance of Bioversity International and CIAT and the Gund Institute, University of Vermont. The authors developed scenarios of dietary changes based on plant-based recipes for beef, pork, chicken, and milk. The recipes were designed to be nutritionally equivalent to the original animal-derived protein products and realistic for the existing food manufacturing capabilities and globally available production ingredients. The authors found that a 50 per cent substitution scenario would substantially reduce the mounting impacts of food systems on the natural environment by 2050 compared to the reference scenario. The impacts as compared to 2020 include: - Global agricultural area declines by 12 per cent instead of expanding. - The decline in areas of forest and

other natural land is almost completely halted. - Nitrogen inputs to cropland are nearly half of the projections. - Water use declines by 10 per cent instead of increasing. - Without accounting for any carbon sequestration on spared land, GHG emissions could decline by 2.1 Gt CO2eq year-1 (31 per cent) in 2050 (1.6 Gt CO2eq year-1 on average in 2020–2050). - Undernourishment globally declines to 3.6 per cent, as compared to 3.8 per cent in the reference scenario (reducing the number of undernourished people by 31 million). The full environmental benefit of diet shifts can be achieved if the agricultural land spared from livestock and feed production is restored through biodiversity-minded afforestation. In the 50 per cent scenario, the benefits from reduced land-use emissions could double as compared to a scenario without afforestation — a total reduction of 6.3 Gt CO2eq year-1. At 90 per cent substitution, the

reduction of all agriculture and land-use emissions would increase to 11.1 Gt CO2eq year-1 in 2050. The restoration of forest ecosystems would also improve biodiversity. The 50 per cent scenario would reduce predicted declines in ecosystem integrity by more than half, while the 90 per cent scenario could reverse biodiversity loss between 2030 and 2040. “While the analyzed dietary shifts serve as a powerful enabler for reaching climate and biodiversity goals, they must be accompanied by targeted production side policies to deliver their full potential. Otherwise, these benefits will be partly lost due to production extensification and resulting GHG and land-use efficiency losses,” explains IIASA Biodiversity and Natural Resources Program Director Petr Havlik, who coordinated the study. The study points out that impacts across regions could differ due to differences in population size and diets, unequal agricultural productivity, and participation in

international trade of agricultural commodities. The main impacts on agricultural input use are in China and on environmental outcomes in Sub-Saharan Africa and South America. These regional differences could also be used to design better interventions. “A global introduction of all novel alternatives has additional benefits compared to the scenarios with limited product or geographical scope, but regional substitution of specific products may be highly effective, especially if combined with regional strategies and purposeful selection of recipes,” Kozicka explains. While the results support the increased use of plant-based meat substitutes, the authors recognize that livestock are a valuable source of income and nourishment for smallholders in low- and middle-income countries, and have significant cultural roles, reduce risk, and diversify smallholder income. Simultaneously, climate change threatens the livelihoods of smallholder farmers.

US health agency recommends updated COVID boosters

The US health agency Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on Tuesday authorized, approved, and recommended everyone 6 months and older get an updated COVID-19 booster. Following the decision taken by the CDC as well as the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), President Joe Biden called it a historic progress and said that it is an “important” milestone. According to an official White House release, Biden said, “Since entering office, my Administration has made historic progress in our ability to manage COVID-19 so that it no longer meaningfully disrupts our lives.” “Today marks another important milestone. Following an independent scientific review, the Food and Drug Administration and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention have now authorized, approved, and recommended everyone 6 months and older get an updated COVID-19



vaccine to protect against serious illness this fall and winter,” he added. The White House release stated that now have vaccines for all three primary seasonal respiratory viruses - COVID-19, flu, and RSV. “As we enter the autumn and winter seasons, we are in the best possible position, with more tools and systems than ever before, including safe and effective immunisations, widely available at-home testing, and effective treatments,” White House release said. Vaccination against COVID-19 is still the most effective way to avert hospitalisation, long-term health consequences, and death. “I urge all Americans to keep their immunisations up to date,” the US President said. Apparently, new Covid-19 variant EG.5 is on the rise in the US. The variant is causing about 17 per cent of the new Covid-19 cases in the country compared to 16 per cent for the next most common.

Children who live in cities are more likely to have respiratory infections

Young children who grow up in towns and cities experience higher respiratory illnesses than those who grow up in the country. According to a study presented at the European Respiratory Society International

of chest infections in young children, while breastfeeding reduces the risk. It’s critical to comprehend why some otherwise healthy youngsters experience repeated illnesses and explore solutions,



Congress in Milan, Italy. A second study, presented at the Congress and published in Pediatric Pulmonology, shows that factors such as attending daycare, living in a damp home or near dense traffic increase the risk

according to researchers. The first study was presented by Dr Nicklas Brustad, a researcher and physician on the Copenhagen Prospective Studies on Asthma in Childhood (COPSAC) based at Gentofte Hospital

and the University of Copenhagen, Denmark. It included 663 children and their mothers who took part in the research from pregnancy until the children were three years old. Researchers found that before the age of three, children who lived in urban regions had an average of 17 respiratory illnesses, such as coughs and colds, as opposed to an average of 15 infections in children who lived in rural areas. In-depth blood tests were also performed on pregnant women and their newborn babies by the researchers, who also examined the immune systems of the kids four weeks after birth. Children in urban settings had immune systems that were different from those in rural areas, they discovered. Along with the disparities in living conditions and the frequency of respiratory illnesses, blood samples from mothers and neonates also differed. Dr Brustad said, “Our findings suggest that urban living is an independent risk factor for developing infections in early life when taking account of several related factors such as exposure to air pollution and starting daycare. Interestingly, changes in the blood of pregnant mothers and newborn babies, as well as changes in the newborn immune system, seem to partly explain this relationship.

India elevated G20 as ‘premier forum’ for economic coop

India that is Bharat’s one in 20 years presidency under PM Modi’s stewardship will be considered historic and leave an indelible mark that even the cynics within Bharat and abroad would find difficult to contest. India’s physical, cultural, civilisational grandeur, its economic, scientific and technological progress and dynamism was in full display. Its diplomatic and consensus building skills, its most populous and youth-rich country and oldest, largest

and most diverse democracy status, gave its presidency a special gravitas in this ‘people’s G20’. A never before commitment by the government of PM Modi put Bharat on world stage as both Vishwaguru and Vishvamitra, was witnessed in the highest level participation and a meaningful Delhi Declaration. It represented the coming of age of Bharat from the periphery to the centre of global economic decision-making. India signaled it would play a key role to promote and interlocute North-South cooperation. Its mammoth social justice projects benchmarks for replication and scaling up in the global south. PM Modi’s inclusive and human-centric approach to the tasks of driving this most powerful grouping of developed and developing countries for delivering the global public goods of rapid economic growth, sustainable development, climate action and humanitarian response for all became the hallmark of Bharat’s G20 presidency success.

The G20 — an elitist plurilateral forum — was born in the midst of a global crisis of 2008 and helped to ameliorate it considerably while facing criticism of hijacking global economic and financial governance agenda away from truly universal multilateral forum. Over the years, the G20 has proven its utility but now it has to address the gravest polycrisis ever — simultaneous, overlapping and interlinked, from climate change and environmental degradation, cascading socioeconomic ravages of Covid-19, Russia-Ukraine war, rising geopolitical tensions, food, fertiliser, fuel and financial crisis, supply chain insecurity — severely affecting the global south. This at a time when the multilaterals institutions — the UN, the World Bank, IMF and the WTO, among others — are, as UN secretary general Gutierrez admitted, “gridlocked in colossal dysfunction”. The 18th G20 has lived up to PM Modi’s promise to the global south — “Your voice is India’s voice, your priorities are India’s priorities” — in

impactful and substantive ways. India marked a milestone in inclusivity and democratisation of global governance by admitting into the G20, the 54-country African Union — second largest, resource-rich continent, with 1.466 billion people struggling to achieve the sustainable development goals (SDGs). On all of Bharat’s seven thematic priorities for its G20 presidency, it has indeed delivered “inclusive, ambitious, action oriented and decisive” outcomes for the global south. They include accelerating progress in SDG achievement and implementing G20 Action Plan and High level Principles; mobilising affordable, adequate and accessible financing from all sources to close the financing gap and supporting UNSG’s SDG stimulus; scaling up sustainable finance in line with G20 roadmap; enhancing global food security according to the Deccan High Level principles on Food Security and Nutrition, addressing food and fertiliser price volatility and enhancing IFAD resources. Taking a ‘one health’

approach, the G20 adopted a comprehensive package of cooperation, including to enhance WHO-led pandemic preparedness and surveillance systems and finance health collaboration. Most significant was the robust Green Development Pact with strengthened resolve to implement the Paris commitments. PM Modi’s LIFE mission has been turned into G20 High Level Principles on Lifestyles for Sustainable Development. It called for an ambitious second replenishment of Green Climate Fund and along with private finance and strong commitment on developing, sharing, deployment and financing of climate friendly technologies and the Multiyear Technical Assistance Plan (TAAP) implementation; need for USD 5.9 trillion for Global South before 2030 to implement their NDCs, USD 4 trillion for clean energy technologies alone, call on parties to implement 100 billion Paris commitment and set an ambitious, traceable, transparent New Collective Quantifiable Goal — NCQG. On just

energy transitions, the Green Hydrogen Innovation Centre steered by the International Solar Alliance (ISA) High-Level Principles for Collaboration on Critical Minerals for Energy Transitions” was launched. The G20 also provided the setting for the launch a Global Biofuels Alliance. On technology and digital public infrastructure, it endorsed the G20 2023 Financial Inclusion Action Plan, G20 Framework for Systems of Digital Public Infrastructure and India’s plan to build and maintain a Global Digital Public Infrastructure Repository. India’s proposal of One Future Alliance (OFA) to build capacity, provide technical assistance and funding support for DPI in low income countries was welcomed. A shared FSB and SSBs work plan for crypto assets and a roadmap for a comprehensive and coordinated policies and regulatory framework was set. G20 vowed to reinvigorate and reform the UN and International Financial Institutions, to deliver bigger, better and more effective multilateral

development banks, to make a quantum jump from billions to trillions in development finance including an ambitious IDA 21 replenishment and IMF governance quota reform were affirmed to be concluded by December 2023. Addressing the unprecedented \$9 trillion developing country debt the G20 called for more effective implementation of the debt suspension initiative of G20 and agreed to go beyond it. Progress was made on international taxation system — globally fair, sustainable and modern for the 21st century — and on international terrorism and money laundering. That the G20 summit represented a consensus on the Ukraine-Russia conflict, and stressed that this must not be an era of war, was a triumph in building trust. It enabled India to reinstate G20 as a ‘premier forum’ for much-needed global economic cooperation in the best and worst of times. Almonds voted as the top snacking choice as a part of a healthy diet in India

Chandigarh, 13th September 2023: In a recent YouGov survey conducted by the Almond Board of California between 24th January - 6th February 2023, it was found that most urban cities in India reported a rise in lifestyle-related health issues such as obesity, diabetes, cardiovascular disease. While the survey highlighted the growing health concerns in India, it also revealed some of the key strategies followed by them to fight these health problems like eating a well-balanced diet, exercising, and eating healthy snacks. A noteworthy mention in the healthy snacking category was almonds. In the survey, almonds were found to be the most preferred healthy snacking option owing to its strong nutritional profile, especially high presence of protein and fiber, and its various health benefits. A fair section of the respondents associated almonds with being good for heart health, Type 2 diabetes, PCOS amongst other health conditions.

Intensity of consuming snacks was found to be stronger in the North (41%), West (42%) and East (42%), in comparison to the South (36%), where fewer people say that they consume snacks multiple times a day. When it comes to healthy snacks, 25% urban Indians spontaneously recall nuts/dry fruits. This awareness was significantly higher in the South (32%) vs cities like Delhi NCR, Lucknow, Ludhiana (21%), West (18%) and East (20%). West and South are more likely to demand for a snack that has no artificial preservatives. When focusing on eating patterns, it was noted that more than half of the respondents consume Almonds every day; this was seen to be higher among those from the North and West. Additionally, more respondents from West (82%) consume almonds regularly as compared to cities like Delhi NCR, Lucknow, Ludhiana (76%) and East (74%).

Robotics systems offer high-definition 3D visualization, allowing surgeons to see the surgical site in greater detail," added Dr. Jindal. Dr. Jindal further said that the robotic approach allows for better control of blood vessels due to the improved dexterity of the robotic instruments.

For proper management of crop residue, two lakh tonnes of stubble from the district will go to the ethanol plant

KARNAL: For proper management of stubble, this time the stubble of the farmers of the district will be sent to the 2G ethanol plant of Panipat Refinery. For this, 11 collection centers will soon be set up. Its rate will also be decided soon. Deputy Director of Agriculture Department, Dr. Aditya Dabas said that two lakh metric tons of stubble would be sent to 2G ethanol Plant in Panipat and 1.25 lakh metric tonnes of straw were consumed in the liquor factory of Jundla. The straw will be sent there also. There are ten big factories in the district and stubble will be sent there also. The stubble will be managed properly. For this, 204 balers will make bales of straw. Eleven collection centers will soon be opened in the district. Places for collection centers in Bal Jatan and Bhambrehari have also been finalized. The balers will collect the stubble there and then send it to Panipat Refinery. The rate at which the stubble will be sold to the Baler Refinery will also be decided soon. He said that farmers doing stubble management will get Rs 1,000 per acre. For this, farmers will have to register on the portal. Farmers managing stubble can apply on the portal. Last year, the farmers who managed the stubble were deposited Rs 1,000 per acre stubble into their accounts. Last year, Rs 11 crore 50 lakh has been deposited in the accounts of the farmers who managed the stubble. Officials will keep their respective areas in mind. In the year 2021, there were 957 incidents of fire in Karnal. There were 309 incidents in the year 2022.

Encroachments removed in Sadhaura

After HC order, case of compensation of Rs. 2 crores filed against 2 cops

AMBALA: The troubles of former police station incharge of Baldev Nagar police station Rajneesh Yadav and former incharge of Panjokhra police station Sub Inspector Gurdarshan Singh are sure to increase in the coming days because Punjab and Haryana High Court has awarded a compensation of Rs 2 crore to Veeresh Shandilya against Rajneesh Yadav, Gurdarshan and others. Orders to pay court fees were given on 17 August 2023. High Court Justice Anil Khetrapal had ordered the local court to re-run Shandilya's compensation case by imposing a court fee of Rs 2 crore on Veeresh Shandilya till 17 September 2023. Veeresh Shandilya, before the last date set by the High Court on September 17, on September 13, in the court of JMJC Vandana, through his advocates Mohit Sehgal and Vasu Ranjan Shandilya, filed a petition for restoration by paying a fee of Rs 4 lakh 37 thousand 600, amounting to Rs 2 crore. Viresh Shandilya was also present in the court of JMJC Vandana along with his lawyers. The court has postponed the hearing on this till tomorrow and this case will now be heard again in the court on 14 September 2023. Shandilya's advocates Mohit Sehgal and Vasu Ranjan, implementing the High Court's decision of 17 August 2023, have deposited a court fee of Rs 4 lakh 37 thousand 600 for a compensation of Rs 2 crore. Mohit Sehgal told the journalists that there is full hope that the hearing will start tomorrow after the case of Veeresh Shandilya is restored in the court. Sehgal said that the order of High Court Justice Anil Khetrapal has been implemented from our side. Veeresh Shandilya came out of the court and told the journalists that in 2011, Rajneesh Yadav, when he was the in-charge of Baldev Nagar police station, had filed a case against him on a year-old, false, baseless fabricated charge of rape, whereas former ASP Devendra Yadav had filed a case against him against Rajneesh Yadav in 2011. Written orders were given to investigate before registering the case, but Rajneesh Yadav Sub Inspector Gurdarshan Singh ignored the written orders of higher officials with the intention of getting Veeresh Shandilya punished by taking huge amounts of money and ruining Shandilya's social and political future.

Govt will give compensation of Rs 7000 per acre to farmers who have re-sown paddy due to heavy rains and floods

Giving a big relief to the farmers, Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that the state government will give compensation at the rate of Rs 7000 per acre to the farmers who have to re-sow paddy again due to heavy rains and floods during July 2023. The Chief Minister was addressing a press conference here today. Mines and Geology Minister, Sh. Mool Chand Sharma and Urban Local Bodies Minister, Dr. Kamal Gupta were present on this occasion. He said that the government has launched the e-Kshatipoorti portal to compensate for the loss of property, livestock or human loss due to rains, floods and riots. Applications have been invited from people for details of the loss. After verification by

the regional officers of the Revenue Department, compensation will be paid through DBT as per the prescribed norms. He said that the government has also run the Mera Paani – Meri Virasat Scheme, under which an incentive amount of Rs 7000 per acre is given to the farmers who grow other crops instead of paddy. Therefore, those farmers whose paddy has been affected due to rain and flood and who have resown any other crop in place of paddy will be given money under this scheme. Sh. Manohar Lal said that under the Mera Pani-Meri Virasat scheme, the government has appealed to the farmers to cultivate other crops instead of paddy so that water can be conserved. This scheme is voluntary and the government has set a target of 1 lakh acres of area every year. Central government gives permission to

purchase 2.5 lakh metric tonnes of millet at MSP Answering another question, Sh. Manohar Lal said that the government closely monitoring the situation on the price of millet and accordingly the state government will give money to the farmers under the Bhavantar Bharpayee Scheme. Earlier too, the government has given Rs 600 and Rs 450 Bhavantar to the farmers under the Bhavantar Bharpai. However, now the Central Government has given permission to purchase 2.5 lakh metric tonnes of millet at MSP. Chief Principal Secretary to Chief Minister, Sh.
