DSP arrested in Kashmir on corruption charges

SRINAGAR: A J&K Police DSP-rank officer has been arrested on corruption charges on Thursday. Official sources said Deputy Superintendent of Police, Sheikh Adil Mushtaq was arrested during investigation of a case which was registered in police station Nowgam Srinagar. The officer's house was also searched on Tuesday. They said a Special Investigation Team (SIT) headed by a Superintendent of Police, south Srinagar has been formed to probe the high profile case. In early March, DSP Adil was attached to the office of Special DG Crime amid allegations of professional misconduct. Adil was presently posted as DSP Indian Reserve Police (IRP)-17 battalion.

Rupee rises 5 paise to close at 83.06

MUMBAI: The rupee consolidated in a narrow range and settled 5 paise higher at 83.06 (provisional) against the US dollar on Thursday as crude oil price receded from its elevated level. The rupee was also weighed down by a rising dollar index, following hawkish comments from US Federal Reserve officials, forex traders said. Moreover, investors remained cautious ahead of the Bank of England and Bank of Japan policy decisions, they added.

Bomb threat at Delhi school, turns out to be hoax

NEW DELHI: The Lal Bahadur Shastri School in RK Puram received an email about a bomb on the premises that later turned out to be a hoax, police said on Thursday. Information was received regarding the bomb threat email from Lal Bahadur Shastri School, Sector-3, RK Puram on Thursday. Police reached the school where an inquiry revealed that the LBS school administration on Wednesday received an email regarding a bomb alert, which they might have checked today, the officer said.

Prez Murmu says investment opportunities created in UP in last 6-7 years

NOIDA: President Droupadi Murmu on Thursday said that investment opportunities have been created and infrastructure has improved in Uttar Pradesh in the last six to seven years. India suspends visa services in Canada amid diplomatic row

India on Thursday suspended issue of visas to citizens of Canada "till further notice". A notice by BLS International - a private agency hired for initial scrutiny of visa applications of Canadian nationals - said "Due to operational reasons... Indian visa services have been suspended till further notice".

This comes as India and Canada are locked in an international row over Ottawa's claim it has "credible allegations" linking agents of New Delhi to the murder of Hardeep Singh Nijjar, a pro-Khalistan Sikh terrorist. The Indian government has firmly rejected the allegation as "absurd" and "motivated".

It is not yet clear if the suspension of visas is linked to that row.

On Monday, months after Nijjar was

killed, Mr Trudeau said his country's security agencies had information indicating "agents of the Indian government" had assassinated the Canadian citizen.

India "completely rejected" the allegations regarding its involvement in Nijjar's death and underlined its concerns over their (Canada's) political figures openly expressing sympathy for "such elements".

"Such unsubstantiated allegations seek to shift focus from Khalistani terrorists and extremists, who have been provided shelter in Canada and continue to threaten India's sovereignty and territorial integrity. The Canadian government's inaction has been a long-standing and continuing concern."

As the row escalated, the two countries each expelled a senior official.

Ottawa ordered a senior official of the Research and Analysis Wing to leave the country

Pb police raid 1159 suspected places

CHANDIGARH: Amidst the ongoing drive to break the gangster-terrorist nexus in the state as per the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Punjab Police on Thursday launched a state-wide crackdown against various gangsters and raided over 1159 suspected places/hideouts of their associates across the state. The simultaneous raids were carried out from 7am to 2pm on the directives of Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav, wherein, all the residential and other premises of associates, relatives and friends linked with various gangsters, were thoroughly searched in all the 28 police districts in the state. Special DGP Law and Order Arpit Shukla said that all the CPs/SSPs were directed to depute adequate number of police parties to conduct these raids and meticulously check the whereabouts of these associates to make this operation successful.

The Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) on Thursday announced that general elections would be held in the last week of January 2024.

The electoral body said a preliminary list of delimitations, which are being carried out in line with the new census, will be published on Sep-

tember 27.

The ECP said it reviewed the progress on the delimitation process today and decided that the final list of constituencies will be published on November 30 after hearing the objections and suggestions related to the delimitations.

Subsequently, the polls will be held in the last week of January 2024 following the

completion of the 54-day election schedule, the ECP statement added. The ECP's statement finally ended the uncertainty surrounding the elections as the previous Pakistan Democratic Movement (PDM)-led government's move to approve a new census mandated the electoral body to carry out new delimitation before holding polls, sparking fears of an undue delay in polls.

Making some brief remarks in the Lok Sabha at the start of day four of the special session of Parliament, The Prime Minister thanked all members of the House for backing the Bill, saying they were all parties to the "golden moment".

"Members of all parties and their leaders, both inside and outside the House, are all deserving partners in this".

He said the development will in-



still a new energy in India's "matri Shakti".

"Yesterday's decision and today

when we cross the last mile after Rajya Sabha passes the Bill today, will raise matri Shakti (power of women)

in the country. It will create a level of confidence that will lead to the emergence of an unimaginable and unprecedented power that will take the country to new heights. I can feel this."

Calling it a "historic legislation" that will enable greater participation of women in the political process, the Prime Minister earlier took to X to thank the Lok Sabha members.

"The Nari Shakti Vandan Adhiniyam is a historic legislation which will further boost women empowerment and will enable even greater participation of women in our political process" he tweeted on Wednesday.

The Lok Sabha overwhelmingly passed the bill on Wednesday to reserve one-third of seats for women in the Lok Sabha and state assemblies.

As per official data, 92 percent teachers got the district of first choice, 7 percent teachers got second choice and 1 percent teachers got third choice of district.

The department had issued a schedule of Inter district Transfers for the PRTs belonging to 2004, 2008 and 2011 batch, permanent district allocation for 2017 batch PRTs and schedule for General Transfers of all categories of teachers on September 13, 2023. To make this exercise error free, the department worked upon data updation exercise by giving sufficient time to teachers to update their data on the departmental portal.

If someone is caught doing or getting an ultrasound done illegally, then the doctor of that center, the lab staff and the couple doing the ultrasound will be punished with a jail term of three to five years and a fine of up to Rs 10,000.

He instructed the group of radiologists and sonologists that if anyone gives information about such a case to the health department to prevent foeticide, then he will be given a reward by the Deputy Commissioner Gurdaspur. He said

that the name and address of the person giving the information will be kept confidential. Health Department Gurdaspur has made IEC material available in all ultrasound scan centers so that people can be made aware.

District Family Welfare Officer Gurdaspur Dr. Tejinder Kaur said that Deputy Commissioner Gurdaspur has installed cots outside Bal Bhawan Gurdaspur and Civil Hospital Batala. Rijiju rebuts allegation of Rahul Gandhi
over Women's Reservation Bill

Union Minister Kiren Rijiju on Thursday rebutted the allegations of Congress MP Rahul Gandhi that the Women's Reservation Bill lacked quota for Other Backward Classes (OBC) and stressed to focus on the facts. Taking to 'X' Union Minister Kiren Rijiju wrote, "This is for Rahul Gandhi and I hope he can read and understand it. Rahul Gandhi and Congress have raised questions regarding OBC representation in Parliament. Whereas history presents a different story. Consider this: In 1992, the batch of secretaries currently serving in the Government of India began their journey. During that period the Congress Party remained in power for most of the time. Then why did they not pay attention to OBC representation?"

Union Minister Rijiju asserted to focus on the facts.



"Official records do not include anyone's OBC status. It is logical to ask for evidence, especially in light of the OBC background of our Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The history and work of Congress says a lot," he wrote on X. Rijiju wrote that India had an OBC Prime Minister leading a government with a record-

breaking 35 per cent OBC representation among ministers. He further wrote, "In contrast, the Congress has no OBC prime minister in its history and has opposed OBC leaders like Charan Singh and Deve Gowda. Rajiv Gandhi opposed the Mandal Commission, highlighting the gap between rhetoric and action.

As actions matter more than speeches in Indian politics, Rahul's questions should prompt Congress to reflect on its history and real contribution to OBC empowerment."

Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday extended his support to the Women's Reservation Bill adding that the measure was "incomplete" as it lacks quota for Other Backward Classes (OBC).

"The moment the opposition raises the issue of caste census and Adani, the BJP tries to raise a new event so that the OBC community and the people of India look the other way. In my research for the speech, I took a look at the different institutions that define how our country moves forward. There are many - Lok Sabha, Rajya Sabha, Vidhan Sabha, bureaucracy, the press. And I look with an eye to understand what is the participation of the OBC community in these institutions," Rahul Gandhi said in Lok Sabha.

Celebrate world heart day with a handful of almonds!

Ludhiana : Every year, World Heart Day is observed on 29th September across the world to raise awareness about cardiovascular disease (CVD) and its impact.

A study published in the Journal of the American Heart Association found that eating 42 gram of almonds as a daily snack while maintaining a healthy diet lowers the risk of developing heart disease. Almond snacking also lowers waist circumference and belly fat, two main established risk factors for heart disease. With cardiovascular diseases becoming a serious health concern amongst many Indian households, dietary and lifestyle modifications can play an important role in reducing risk factors associated with heart disease. The first step in achieving better heart health is by making better food choices. Adding a handful of almonds to your family and your daily diet is a good habit to form, as they contain a host of nutrients, make for a healthy snacking option, and help with heart health. Consuming almonds may lower LDL cholesterol and significantly improve HDL cholesterol when included in a healthy diet and reduce levels of heart damaging inflammation.

A review article published recently says that India has a higher age-standardized death rate for CVD (282 deaths/100,000 (264-293)) than the rest of the world (233 deaths/100,000 (229-236)). The age-standardized DALY (disability-adjusted life year) rate associated with CVD has also been reported to be 1.3 times the global average. CVDs strike Indians a decade earlier than the western population. This year, as a reminder to everyone around the world to take care of their hearts the theme of World Heart Day is 'Use Heart Know Heart', the heart used in the form of



an emoji. The campaign focuses on the essential step of knowing our hearts first.

A survey report from India some years ago recommended ideal cardiovascular health indicators which included not smoking, 5 or more servings of fruits and vegetables, high physical activity, body mass index (BMI) less than 25 Kg/m2, blood pressure (BP) less than 120/80 mm Hg, fasting plasma glucose (FPG) less than 100 mg/dl, and total cholesterol (TC) less than 200 mg/dl.

Speaking about the importance of leading a heart-healthy lifestyle, Popular Bollywood actress, Soha Ali Khan, said, "I believe firmly that lifestyle changes play a very crucial role in one's heart health. Keeping this in mind, I always make sure I consume a balanced,

nutritious diet and limit ultra-processed foods.

Eating heart-healthy foods is also something that is a priority for me. I consume a handful of almonds everyday as a pre/ post workout snack. I also carry a box of almonds with me when I am on the move as they are portable and provide essential nutrients like vitamin E, magnesium, protein, riboflavin, zinc, and more. I also incorporate moderate to intense physical activity daily for at least 30 min. I've noticed that my daughter Inaaya also shows interest when I workout at home and she tags along to do the exercises!"

dding to the importance of heart health and why this day should be marked, Dr. Rohini Patil, MBBS, and nutritionist said "There is a myth that heart diseases affect men predominantly, however heart disease is the leading cause of death among women in India, accounting for almost 18% of all female deaths Heart disease is most frequently brought on by factors like high blood pressure, high cholesterol, diabetes, obesity, heavy alcohol use, and smoking. Eating a heart-healthy diet, exercising frequently, giving up smoking, maintaining a healthy weight, managing stress, controlling diabetes, etc. are some of the preventive measures for heart disease. In several well-conducted clinical trials, almonds have been found to lower LDL-C, a known risk factor for coronary heart disease. A review by a panel of Indian nutritionists and physicians, published in the journal Nutrients, suggests that daily inclusion of almonds as part of a healthy diet may help reduce dyslipidemia.

As Punjab's groundwater crisis deepens, a tree plantation project is helping to raise Moga's water table



MOGA : A study conducted by the Independent Evaluation Group (IEG) of the World Bank Group reveals that India is facing a significant groundwater crisis, with approximately 17 percent of groundwater blocks being overexploited, 5 percent at critical stages, and 14 percent at semi-critical stages. This situation necessitates urgent, scientifically guided action to preserve groundwater resources without harming the environment. To address this challenge, the social enterprise Grow-Trees.com has initiated a project to plant 65,000 trees in the Moga district of Punjab, India. These trees will be planted on community lands around Gurudwaras (Sikh Temples) and schools in various villages within the district. Around 57,562 trees have been planted so far, and more trees will be planted this year. Moga was chosen for this project due to its heavy reliance on green fodder, rice, and wheat cultivation, which significantly contributes to external crop water use. According to a study by Researchgate, rice and wheat production in Moga has a substantial impact on its external crop water use (CWU). "To achieve long-term sustainable agriculture, reducing internal groundwater use is essential in Moga. Our initiative underscores the importance of collective efforts to combat environmental degradation, safeguard forested areas, and plant forest tree species on available lands," says Pradip Shah, environmental expert and co-founder of Grow-Trees.com. As part of the project, trees that are being planted in Ghal Kalan, Dhalle Ke, Khosa Pandu, Raliyan, Manawan, Khosa Jalal Singh Wala, Khosa Kotla, Ghaloti, Daroli Bhai, Kot Isre Khan, Dhune Ke, and Rajena villages in Moga.

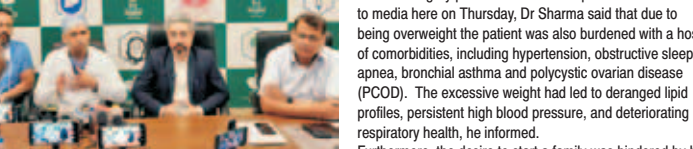

135-kg obese female undergoes successful bariatric surgery at IVV

The excessive weight had led to deranged lipid profiles, persistent high blood pressure, and deteriorating respiratory health, he informed. Furthermore, the desire to start a family was hindered by her PCOD diagnosis, a common issue among obese females. To ensure a safe pregnancy in the near future, she was advised to shed approximately 60kg of excess weight, said Dr Sharma adding the patient had also struggled with bilateral knee pain due to her morbid obesity, requiring multiple medications to manage her condition. Remarkably, she was up and walking on the same day of the procedure.

SATISH SETH KAITHAL/ KALAYAT: As per the directions of DC Prashant Panwar and Deputy Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department, Dr Mahavir Singh, crop residue management awareness program camps were organized by the teams formed at the block level in villages like Malkhedhi, Dilowali, Manas, Sirta, Atela, Manjhala, Pyoda, Pisaul, Farsh Majra, Bhanpura, Sampan Khedi etc. SDO Dr. Satish Nara said that many farmers destroy friendly insects by burning crop residues in the field. If one ton of paddy crop residue is mixed in the soil, it supplies us with about 5.5 kg nitrogen, 2.3 kg phosphorus, 2.5 kg potash, 1.2 kg sulfur and 50-70 percent micronutrients. Satbir Singh, Assistant Technical Management in village Jaswanti, said that from time to time the department provides modern agricultural equipment like SMS system to the farmers for the management of crop residues. Super Seeder, Happy Seeder, MB, 50 percent subsidy on plough, straw baler machine, straw chopper etc. is given to individuals and up to 80 percent subsidy is given to farmer groups.

He returned to the field in the second innings, scoring 10 runs with the bat while batting at No. 10 during the run chase. His back injury subsequently ruled him out for the remainder of the series. While Magala, who is down with a knee injury, made his sole appearance in the third ODI against Australia, in which he bowled just four overs.

The attack is still heavily packed with five pacers led by Kagiso Rabada. Marco Jansen, Lungi Ngidi and Gerald Coetzee are the other quicks in the squad.

Experienced left-arm quick Wayne Parnell, whose omission from the initial 15 was categorised as a tough one by head coach Rob Walter, is nursing an elbow injury and a shoulder niggle.
