Canada wants talk with India to resolve diplomatic dispute: Foreign Minister

OTTAWA: Canadian Foreign Minister Melanie Joly on Tuesday said that the country wants "private talks with India to resolve a diplomatic dispute" over the killing of Khalistan terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar, Reuters reported.

"We are in contact with the government of India. We take Canadian diplomats' safety very seriously and we will continue to engage privately because we think diplomatic conversations are best when they remain private," Reuters quoted Joly as saying to reporters.

The statement by Joly comes after a report said India had asked Canada to withdraw 41 diplomats. India has told Canada that it must repatriate the diplomats by October 10. Neither Joly nor Prime Minister Justin Trudeau responded when asked if the report was accurate, as per Reuters.

There is a strain in India-Canada relations following Prime Minister Justin Trudeau's allegations regarding the Indian government's 'potential role' in the fatal shooting of Khalistan terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar.

Ranbir Kapoor summoned by ED in gaming App case

NEW DELHI: Actor Ranbir Kapoor has been asked to appear before the Enforcement Directorate on Friday in connection with a case involving a gaming app.

The actor has featured in several commercials promoting the app. The probe agency has claimed that he was given a large amount of money in exchange, which was from the proceeds of a crime. Mahadev Online Book App, the app at the centre of the controversy, is an umbrella syndicate arranging online platforms for enabling illegal betting websites to enrol new users, create user IDs and laundering of money through a layered web of benami bank accounts, the probe agency has alleged.

In the new rules for online gaming, the government has prohibited any game that involves betting and wagering.

Surajkund Diwali fair will be held from 3rd to 10th Nov

Neeraj Chopra bags Gold, Kishore Jena wins silver in javelin throw

India's star javelin throw Neeraj Chopra defended his Asian Games gold medal with a best throw of 88.88m in the final at Hangzhou on Wednesday. Neeraj Chopra beat his compatriot Kishore Jena for the top honour. Jena overtook Neeraj at one point in the final with his personal best throw of 86.77m but he ended with a silver medal as Neeraj registered his season best throw. Earlier, Neeraj Chopra made a brilliant first attempt to throw the javelin to a great distance but the distance could not be put on record due to technical malfunction.

Asian Games: Archers Jyothi Surekha, Pravin Ojas clinch gold

HANGZHOU : India's Jyothi Vennam Surekha and Pravin Ojas Deotale clinched gold in the archery mixed team compound archery after winning a final match against South Korea's Chaewon So and Jaehoon Joo at the Hangzhou Asian Games on Wednesday. Jyothi-Pravin defeated the South Korean pair in a close encounter by one point 159-158. This is the first gold for Archery in the ongoing Asian Games. With this medal, India has improved its previous best in Jakarta 2018 (70). India now has 71 medals. "#KholoIndiaAthletes Ojas and @VJSurekha have hit the bullseye and clinched India's FIRST GOLD in archery, defeating Korea by a scoreline of 159 - 158! Their impeccable skill and teamwork have earned them the ultimate victory Proud of you, champs," Sports Authority of India (SAI) wrote on X (formerly known as Twitter).

Men's hockey team storms into final

HANGZHOU : Continuing its dominating performance, India men's hockey team defeated South Korea 5-3 in the semi-final to set up a summit clash at the Asian Games. Hardik Singh (5'), Mandeep Singh (11'), Lalit Kumar Upadhyay (15'), Amit Rohidas (24') and Abhishek (54') scored to guide the Indian men's hockey team to the final. Jung Manjae (17', 20', 42') scored a hat-trick for South Korea, as per Olympics.com. The Indian men's hockey team will face the winner of the other semi-final match between China and Japan in the gold medal match on Friday.



Flash flood in Sikkim: 3 dead, 23 army personnel missing

Three persons died and 23 army personnel were washed away on Wednesday after a cloudburst over Lhonak Lake in north Sikkim resulted in a flash flood in the Teesta River basin, which was aggravated by the release of water from a dam, officials said.

The flood started around 1.30 am, they said. "Some army establishments along the valley have been affected and efforts are on to confirm details," sources added.

"Due to a sudden cloud burst over Lhonak Lake in North Sikkim, a flash flood occurred in the Teesta River in Lachen valley.

"Some army establishments along the valley have been affected and efforts are on to confirm details", it said.

Release of water from the Chungthang dam led to a sudden increase in water level upto 15-20 feet high downstream, sources said.

This has led to Army vehicles parked at Bardang near Singtam getting affected. Twenty-three personnel have been reported missing and 41 vehicles are reported submerged under the slush. Search operations are underway.

Darjeeling Lok Sabha Member Raju Bista informed Prime minister Narendra Modi describing the details about the ravaged condition of the Eastern Himalayan belt, including Sikkim, Darjeeling hills, Terai, Dooars and Sikkim which is braving the massive natural disaster the region is currently facing.

"I have reached out to Hon'ble Prime Minister and Hon'ble Home Minister, inform-



ing them about the current situation, and I have requested them to constitute a High Level Disaster Monitoring and Response Team for the entire Sikkim, Darjeeling, Kalimpong, Jalpaiguri belt," he said.

Darjeeling, Kalimpong, Sikkim region has faced massive damages due to the glacial Lhonak Lake burst in North Sikkim. Across Sikkim, Darjeeling, Kalimpong where Teesta river flows, this has resulted in massive damages to infrastructure, properties, and human lives too.

"I request the people to stay away from the river if possible, and to lend a helping hand and space for those who are in need."

He said he has been in constant touch with

DM Kalimpong, NHPC officials and also NDRF teams. NH 10, which is the lifeline of the border regions of Kalimpong, parts of Darjeeling and Sikkim has been washed away in multiple places.

"I have been informed that one NDRF team is stuck on the way as the road has been completely washed out. Three NDRF teams are currently waiting in Siliguri for the weather to be cleared, so that they can attempt deployment in necessary areas using helicopters" Bista said.

"We will work together to coordinate rescue and relief efforts, and together, we will overcome this disaster. I will personally visit all the places and reach help where necessary."

SC directs Centre to look into mediation process over SYL canal dispute

The Supreme Court on Wednesday directed the Centre to look into the mediation process over the Sutlej-Yamuna link (SYL) canal dispute. Meanwhile, the top court also came down heavily on the Punjab government over their approach to the issue.

A bench of justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul CT Ravikumar and Sudhanshu Dhulia remarks came while hearing a matter relating to the Sutlej-Yamuna link (SYL) canal dispute.

The court came down heavily on the Punjab government for not taking steps for construction of the canal. The court remarked that Punjab has to co-operate in the process.

The court directed the Centre to survey the portion of the land allocated to Punjab. The court also directed the Centre to look into the mediation process. The court listed the matter for further in January 2024. The apex court was hearing SYL Canal dispute between Haryana and Punjab.

On July 28, 2020, the top court had asked the Chief Ministers of Punjab and Haryana to make attempt to resolve the issue amicably.

The problem stems from the controversial 1981 water-sharing agreement after Haryana was formed out of Punjab in 1966. For effective allocation of water, the SYL canal was to be constructed and the two states were required to construct their portions within their territories.

While Haryana constructed its



portion of the canal, after the initial phase, Punjab stopped the work, leading to multiple cases.

In 2004, Punjab government had passed a law unilaterally cancelled the SYL agreement and other such pacts, however, in 2016, the apex court had struck down this law. Later, Punjab went ahead and returned the acquired land--on which the canal was to be constructed--to the land-owners.

Govt hikes subsidy for Ujjwala beneficiaries to Rs 300 per LPG cylinder

NEW DELHI: Ahead of key state polls and festive season, the Union Cabinet on Wednesday raised the subsidy amount for Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana beneficiaries from Rs 200 to Rs 300 per LPG cylinder.

"Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana has played a significant role in the lives of women of our country and Today's decision will benefit them," Information and Broadcasting Minister Anurag Singh Thakur said while briefing media on Cabinet decisions. Union Cabinet also approved Terms of Reference to Krishna Water Dispute Tribunal-II under the Inter-State River Water Disputes Act, 1956 for its adjudication between Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Anurag Thakur said the resolution of dispute will open new avenues of growth in both the States. In another decision, the government has also approved an amendment to the Central Universities Act, 2009 for setting up of Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal University in Telangana.

Bhagwant Mann unveils new picture of Sri Harmandir Sahib installed at secretariat

With a total of 19 medals, Haryana players shine at Asian games

Haryana has emerged as a powerhouse in the world of sports during Chief Minister Sh. Manohar Lal's leadership, flying the country's flag high at the ongoing Asian Games in China. Haryana's athletes have been delivering a spectacular performance, securing a total of 19 medals out of the 71 won by Indian athletes so far.

With a robust sports policy crafted under the guidance of Chief Minister Sh. Manohar Lal, Haryana has carved its niche in the field of sports, setting an example for other states to follow. Out of the 655 athletes representing India in various disciplines, 85 hail from Haryana. These athletes have brought home an impressive tally



ly of 19 medals, including 6 gold, 3 silver, and 10 bronze medals, placing Haryana prominently on the national medal chart.

Haryana athletes have particularly excelled in shooting, with Faridabad's Shiva Narwal clinching a gold medal in the 10-meter air pistol team event, and Ambala's Sarabjot Singh

securing a gold in the 10-meter pistol team event and a silver in the mixed event. Anish Bhanwala from Karnal and Adarsh Singh from Faridabad both claimed bronze medals in the 25-meter rapid-fire pistol team event.

In addition to shooting, athletes from Haryana have achieved remarkable success in various other

sports. Rohtak's Shafali Verma, a member of the Indian women's cricket team, helped secure a gold medal. Yamunanagar's Parminder Singh won a bronze medal in rowing quadruple sculls. Aryan Pal Singh Ghuman from Panchkula claimed a bronze medal in men's 3000-meter speed skating relay. Sonipat's Seema Punia secured a bronze medal in the discus throw, while Faridabad's Priti Lamba won silver in the 3000-meter steeplechase for women.

In the boxing arena, Rohtak's Preeti Pawar clinched a bronze in the 54kg weight category, and Jhajjar's Parveen Hooda secured a bronze in the 57kg category. Hisar's Narender Berwal also brought home a bronze in the 92-plus kg weight category.

Sanjay Singh arrested in Delhi Liquor policy case

In yet another blow for the Aam Aadmi Party, the Enforcement Directorate has arrested its Rajya Sabha MP, Sanjay Singh, in a money laundering case linked to the investigation into the Delhi liquor policy. Searches were being conducted at the Delhi residence of the MP since early on Wednesday morning.

This is the third major arrest from the party. Delhi Health Minister Satyendra Jain was arrested in May last year on charges of laundering money through four companies that were allegedly linked to him.

The biggest setback for the party, however, came in February this year, when then Delhi Deputy Chief Minister and close Arvind Kejriwal aide Manish Sisodia was arrested by the CBI in the alleged liquor policy scam.

The raids against Mr Singh took place after he was named by businessman Dinesh Arora, an accused in the case, who later turned 'approver'.

Mr Arora claimed that



the AAP leader had introduced him to Mr Sisodia, who was the excise minister.

Search operations began at the Rajya Sabha MP's residence early on Wednesday morning and went on for a few hours. Mr Singh will be taken to the Enforcement Directorate office, where his statement will be recorded. He is likely to be produced in court on Thursday afternoon and the agency is expected to seek his custody.

Delhi Chief Minister and AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal came out in support of his colleague while the raids were being conducted and, without naming the BJP, accused the party of engaging in desperate attempts to derail rivals ahead of next year's general election.

While presiding over the initiation meeting for the implementation of road safety interventions here today, the Chief Secretary said that Haryana has been selected for this project among the seven states of Gujarat, Jharkhand, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, and Tamil Nadu for the evaluation of the effectiveness of road safety interventions. The comprehensive set of interventions to be implemented in these states encompasses a variety of road safety measures, including: Effective speed calming measures, Comprehensive road safety surveys, Behavioral monitoring, Shoulder width evaluation, Structured crash investigations, Innovative enforcement, Awareness programs and Trauma center enhancement.

Mr. Kaushal said that Haryana is embarking on a series of transformative projects aimed at saving lives on its roads and bolstering healthcare services. Key stakeholders, including road agencies and relevant departments, have engaged in comprehensive appraisals.

The Chief Secretary highlighted the state government's integration of ambulances with the 112 immediate response helpline to provide timely medical assistance to road accident victims. A fleet of 670 ambulances has been integrated with the 112 helpline to facilitate the swift transport of trauma patients to medical facilities. Automatic registration procedures in certain hospitals further expedite the process, ensuring that no time is wasted in critical situations.

Mr. Kaushal said that the state is actively working to enhance healthcare accessibility, particularly for trauma patients. The state has established Ayushman Bharat hospitals, medical colleges, and tertiary-level medical care centers in districts in accordance with Government of India guidelines. The objective is to ensure that trauma patients do not need to travel more than 50 kilometers to receive essential medical treatment.

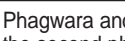

Vigilance Bureau Nabs ASI for taking Rs 5,000 bribe

CHANDIGARH (RAJIV JAIN): In the relentless pursuit of eradicating corruption from the state, the Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) achieved another success on Wednesday by apprehending Assistant Sub Inspector (ASI) Harjinder Singh (310/Sangrur), posted at Sandour police station in Malerkotla district, red-handed while accepting a bribe of Rs 5,000.

Disclosing this here today a spokesperson of the state VB said the arrest of ASI Harjinder Singh was made following a complaint lodged by Sandeep Singh Sonu, a resident of Jhuner village in Malerkotla. The complainant detailed his encounter with the accused police officer, stating that ASI Harjinder Singh had conducted a search of his residence under suspicion of narcotics possession. However, no illicit substances were discovered during the search. Despite this, the ASI insisted on a payment of Rs 7,000 to avoid implicating the complainant under the NDPS Act. Feeling coerced and threatened, the complainant reluctantly agreed to pay a bribe of Rs 5,000 to resolve the matter. Upon receiving this complaint, the Economic Offences Wing (EOW) of VB Range Ludhiana conducted a preliminary investigation and subsequently set up a trap operation in which ASI Harjinder Singh was arrested red-handed while accepting bribe of Rs 5,000 from the complainant, in the presence of two official witnesses. In this regard, a case has been registered under FIR 14, dated October 4, 2023, under Section 7 of the Prevention of Corruption Act at VB Police Station Ludhiana Range.

State Taxes and Excise seizes silver jewellery worth Rs. 4 crore and 250 bulk liters of illicit liquor

SHIMLA: Commissioner State Taxes and Excise, Dr. Yunus informed here today that on the basis of tip off received, the enforcement team Una has succeeded in seizing jewellery worth Rs. 4,64,42,227 from the house of a silver jewellery merchant. The jewellery was without bills or documents and the department has collected a penalty of Rs. 15,32,594 under the GST Act, he added. The Commissioner said that in another case, the Dehra team of the department has also collected rupees one lakh under the GST Act in the shape of fine on goods without bill during late night checking. Apart from this, under the Excise Act, various teams in the state have seized and destroyed about 250 bulk liters of liquor. The team of Revenue District BBN conducted raids in Barotiwala, Kalu Jhanda, Kullhariwala and Kunjhal areas and seized 115 bulk liters of liquor from the house and grocery shop. This liquor was for sale in Chandigarh. Apart from this, the excise team of district Sirmaur trapped about 90 liters of illegal liquor packed in bottles and cans near village Jamni Ghat, which was destroyed on the spot. Similarly, Team Shimla raided suspected grocery shops and dhabas and seized 22 bulk liters of illicit liquor. The Commissioner informed that in the recent past, the department has seized and destroyed 77,000 bulk liters of illicit liquor and has also registered about 230 cases under the Excise Act. He said that 26 teams of the department were working day and night to carry out this work. Dr. Yunus said that a 24x7 control room has also been established.

The disaster caused huge human and economic losses: Dhaniram Shandil

CM is concerned about every section: Dr. Pushpendra Verma

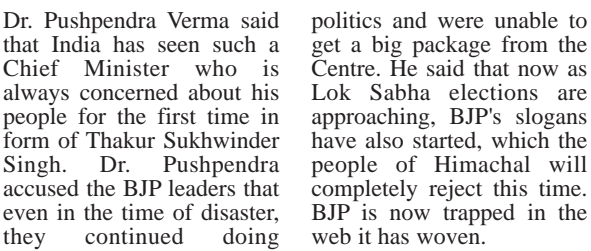

Use of combines for paddy prohibited from 7 pm to 8 am in Barnala: DC

District Magistrate Barnala Mrs. Poonamdeep Kaur has issued orders to impose a complete ban on paddy cutting with combines from 7 pm to 8 am within the limits of Barnala district. These orders have been made by them using the powers under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973. In the order issued by the District Magistrate, it has been said that there is a fear of loss of life and property due to the running of combines at night. Apart from this, combine harvesters cut the green paddy which is not yet fully ripe, only raw grain at night, due to which the green cut paddy turns black on drying. Apart from this, paddy is also harvested with outdated combines, which degrades the quality of paddy. Similarly, due to mechanical defects in the combines, the quality of paddy is also affected, due to which purchasing agencies hesitate to purchase paddy. Therefore, keeping the above in mind, a



complete ban is imposed on paddy harvesting with combines from 7 p.m. to 8 a.m. within the limits of Barnala district. .Apart from this, instructions are given to the owners of combines harvesting paddy in Barnala district. Before using the harvester combine, it should be inspected for operation worthiness through the Department of Agriculture and no combine should be used without installing 'Harvester Super SMS'. These orders will remain in force in the district till November 30, 2023.

Editorial

Man of the House

Between a majority and majoritarianism lies the membrane between democracy and despotism. A majority of one, no more, grants you authority over all hundred; it does not, however, hand you authoritarian hold over 49. To use numerical advantage as license for unilateral indulgence, or to bully and bludgeon, is to distort the idea of democracy in a perverse fashion.

The context for this, most immediately, is the unspeakable outburst that smudged the special session of the newly-unwrapped edifice of Parliament; it was the sort of defilement whose stench will not easily go. What appears likelier, alas, is that the aberrant — and abhorrent — enactment of Ramesh Bidhuri, BJP member of the Lok Sabha from South Delhi, will trigger imitation. The unembarrassed hilarity Bidhuri's coarse turn on the floor caused in at least two former cabinet colleagues of Prime Minister Narendra Modi — Ravi Shankar Prasad and Harsh Vardhan — should underline to the discerning among us a few unfortunate truths about the essential nature of those we have put in charge of governing us. It should also make us mull the possibility that we may be accomplices to accrediting a loutish governing order.

The treasury benches have turned into a vaudeville of low mimicry, high-decibel sectarianism — the 'Jai Shri Ram' cry is routinely employed for both greeting and heckling. It is no more a thing of shock that a minister hollers and hectors an Opposition member and blithely threatens a home visit by the Central Bureau of Investigation or the Enforcement Directorate if they don't 'behave'. More than just a few have wondered aloud why Bidhuri has not been rapped by the Chair for his gross violations on the floor, or even by the prime minister or the party. Such questioning has lost all meaning; it is best abrogated from our thought processes for there is nobody who feels obliged to respond, much less explain. It has become the prime minister's patented style to approve misdemeanour by silence.

But in Bidhuri's case, silence has been supplemented with reward — he got charge of overseeing the party's campaign in Rajasthan's Tonk region. But of course! Bidhuri belongs to the Gujar community — the same as the Congress's Sachin Pilot — and Gujjars can tilt the scales in and around Tonk. Ramesh Bidhuri, like Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh of the Wrestling Federation of India fame, has his uses. On second thoughts, Bidhuri's transgression in Parliament was actually no transgression, it was behaviour that the ruling manual approves and encourages, it is just how majoritarian intimidation signals itself.

Mushrooms for mental illnesses

A new study from the University of Southern Denmark suggests that psilocybin, the main ingredient in mushrooms with psychedelic characteristics, could be used as a therapeutic aid through microdosing.

Psilocybin has long been recognized as a classic psychedelic substance and has recently been investigated for its potential to assist in the treatment of various psychiatric disorders, primarily depression and addiction, through therapy supplemented with a high dose of psilocybin.

In such therapeutic treatment, the patient takes psilocybin after thorough therapeutic preparation and undergoes a psychedelic experience in a supportive environment with a trained therapist. Subsequently, the experience is integrated over several therapy sessions. Experiments are being conducted with patients at hospitals, including Bispebjerg Hospital and Rigshospitalet.

Microdosing in Rats

In the recent study published in Nature - Molecular Psychiatry, Associate Professor Mikael Palner and PhD student Kat Kiillerich from the Research Unit for Clinical Physiology and Nuclear Medicine at the University of Southern Denmark examined the effects of small doses of psilocybin on rats.

Their focus was on repeated low doses of psilocybin, which are significantly lower than the doses typically used in therapeutic settings and are commonly referred to as 'microdosing.'

- Microdosing is a phenomenon popularized within performance culture, notably in areas like Silicon Valley, California, and has subsequently spread through stories and anecdotes on the internet as a form of self-medication for various challenges, explains Mikael Palner, the last author of the study.

Effective for Stress and Compulsive Behaviors

The study conducted on rats showed that animals tolerated the repeated low doses of psilocybin well and did not exhibit signs of reduced pleasure (anhedonia), anxiety, or altered locomotor activity.



Most notably, repeated low doses of psilocybin increased the rats' resilience to stress, and they displayed fewer compulsive behaviors. Additionally, an increase in the number of connections to the thalamus region of the brain, which serves as a kind of filter for our decisions and concerns, was observed.

- The change in connectivity to the thalamus may contribute to our enhanced resilience to stress factors and could explain why so many people report positive effects on their well-being from small doses of psychedelic mushrooms.

A Promising New Approach

Through the new study, the researchers have established a valid method that can be utilized for further research into the effects of repeated low doses of psilocybin. The study also lends support to the numerous anecdotal

reports of the benefits of microdosing as a therapeutic intervention.

This paves the way for additional research and potentially entirely new approaches to treating various mental disorders.

- The increased anxiety and stress in society currently have placed a strong focus on microdosing, leading to a surge in the trade of mushrooms. Countries such as the Netherlands, Australia, the USA, and Canada have either legalized or are in the process of legalizing psilocybin for therapeutic treatment, says Mikael Palner.

- It is, therefore, crucial that we understand the effects and side effects of these substances, which are already widely used by people around the world.

Enhanced Understanding with Potential Mikael Palner developed an interest in re-

searching psychedelic substances and psilocybin when he lived in Silicon Valley, California, eleven years ago and witnessed the surge of self-improvement practices that garnered significant media attention and prompted more people to experiment with microdosing.

- Some books were published that popularized the concept of using small doses of psychedelics to address both mental issues and enhance performance.

This motivated me to launch the project I've been devoted to for the past six years, says Mikael Palner.

- Now, we can determine the appropriate dosage in rats, enabling us to investigate the effects of microdosing, which could significantly advance our understanding of the brain and mental challenges. This benefits both the field of science and society at large.

Drinking dark tea may regulate blood sugar

According to new research, drinking black tea every day may help to reduce the risk and progression of type 2 diabetes in people by improving blood sugar control.

Researchers from the University of Adelaide in Australia and Southeast University in China discovered that daily dark tea drinkers had a 53 per cent lower risk of prediabetes and a 47 per cent lower risk of Type 2 diabetes, even after controlling for established risk factors such as age, gender, ethnicity, body mass index (BMI), average arterial blood pressure, fasting plasma glucose, and cholesterol.

"The substantial health benefits of tea, including a reduced risk of cardiovascular disease and type 2 diabetes, have been reported in several studies over recent years, but the mechanisms underlying these benefits have been unclear", notes the study's co-lead author



Associate Professor Tongzhi Wu from the University of Adelaide and The Hospital Research Foundation Group Mid-Career Fellow.

"Our findings hint at the protective effects of habitual tea drinking on blood sugar management via increased glucose excretion in urine, improved insulin resistance and thus better control of blood sugar. These benefits were most pronounced among daily dark tea drinkers."

These beneficial effects on metabolic control may lie in the unique way dark tea is produced, which involves

microbial fermentation, a process that may yield unique bioactive compounds (including alkaloids, free amino acids, polyphenols, polysaccharides, and their derivatives) to exhibit potent antioxidant and anti-inflammatory effects, improve both insulin sensitivity and the performance of beta cells in the pancreas, and change the composition of the bacteria in the gut.

The latest cross-sectional study included 1,923 adults (562 men, 1,361 women aged 20-80 years) living in the community across 8 provinces in China.

US House removes McCarthy as Speaker



The US House of Representatives on Tuesday (US local time) voted to oust Republican Kevin McCarthy as Speaker, a never-before-seen historic vote that leaves the lower chamber of Congress in chaos, The Hill reported.

The mutiny, led by Rep. Matt Gaetz (R-Fla.), came days after McCarthy averted a government shutdown by putting a stop-gap measure on the floor that garnered Democratic support — a move that infuriated hardline Republicans, it reported.

In the final 216-210 vote, seven Republicans joined Gaetz to unseat McCarthy.

The following Republicans voted to oust McCarthy- Andy Biggs, Ken Buck, Tim Burchett, Eli Crane, Matt Gaetz, Bob Good, Nancy Mace and Matt Rosendale.

Every Democrat in the chamber also voted to boot McCarthy, refusing to help protect him from his unruly conference. McCarthy said he would give Democrats

nothing if they were to vote to help him.

As per CNN, the House now needs to elect a new Speaker, but there is no clear alternative who would have the support needed to win the gavel.

McCarthy served as House Speaker for 269 days before being removed.

His tenure began on January 7, 2023, and lasted until Tuesday (US local time)—the second-shortest for a speaker in the country's history.

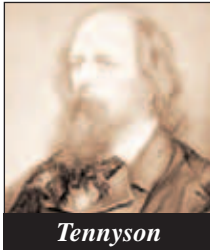
The record for the shortest term is held by Rep. Michael C. Kerr of Indiana, who served as speaker for 257 days. Kerr died in office of consumption on August 19, 1876, as per CNN. Republican Representative Patrick McHenry of North Carolina will now temporarily lead the House of Representatives after the Speaker's position was vacated on Tuesday.

Capital punishment - A deterrent measure or barbaric act

If 'Do Ankhe Barah Haath' a 1957 classic hindi movie produced, directed and starred by V. Shan-taram, a legendary bollywood veteran, is practically true, the capital punishment should be abolished. This movie and another hindi movie 'Dushman' starring Rajesh Khanna has the same theme and was an attempt to exhibit that the hardened criminal or accused under adverse circumstances or by default can be tamed and reformed but not reconcile the society or the affected families do not come with the deep injuries caused by the loss of their own and thus don't accept them. More surprisingly and ironically jails in earlier times considered as Reform Houses and helpless prisoners while undergoing punishment repent for their folies and inclined to reform themselves whereas the present scenario of jails has entirely changed and the prisons are mostly dens of criminal activities as all the illegal and immoral activities like supply of narcotics and weapons, extortions, even murders are being operated from the gaol premises with or without the

connivance of the authorities. Rather to be in jail is a status symbol and draws huge 'respect' from the society in general

Since the inception of the civilization, capital punishment has been the most discussed and debated issue - whether it should be retained or abolished having very strong and logical arguments for and against it coupled with the modes of execution which are very barbaric and inhuman like burning to death, forced drowning, throwing to hungry beasts, cutting of legs and arms for bleeding to death, stoning, sewing alive into the dead bodies of oxen etc. Humans being selfish by nature, have their own interest and conveniences resulting into the conflict and enmity and that is why crime can never be ruled out from the living society, the degree of which may vary from time to time. It is first and foremost duty of the State to ensure the safety of their subjects. For this purpose, the State from time to time, enact the laws to be complied with and violators are subjected to prosecution

and punishment in proportion to the gravity of their crime. Capital punishment has been a global phenomenon and India is amongst the 55 countries where capital punishment is still practiced whereas 109 countries in the world have abolished it completely. Rest of the countries does not practice it but have legal provisions for it.

Before we discuss the arguments for and against it, the main issue is it's constitutionally validity which has been challenged many times on the ground that it is violative of the Article 14, 19 and 21 of Constitution of India but honorable Supreme Court of India has ruled in different cases mainly in Bachan Singh vs State of Punjab that capital punishment is not violative of any article of Constitution of India but laid down a new doctrine of "Rare or Rarest Case" meaning thereby that it should be rarely used and that too in the exceptional circumstances to be recorded in writing. The main argument against its continuation is that death penalty can't be undone if the person

came out to be an innocent for reason like the false confessions, error in judgement or inadequate legal defense. The contention is very much logical but there is nothing wrong in the capital punishment in itself. This is only a result of procedural lapses or human error. It is most regrettable that issue has been lingering on for decades but the chanceless prosecution could not be ascertained. It is suggested that an independent, impartial, objective inquiry should be conducted through forensic experts and experienced police officers and the judiciary should also have fast tracked courts for trial of such cases where capital punishment is warranted.

The second issue often raised against capital punishment is that this being too harsh a punishment has no deterrence impact. This argument is partially true but I must say that it is delay and uncertainty of punishment that has eroded its deterrence. The severity of punishment coupled with certainty of punishment deters the person from committing the crime. It is an ac-

knowledge fact that every person has a psycho-fear haunting him from wrongdoings and if capital punishment is abolished, the crime rate would spurt manifold.

We have seen in our daily life, common men on the wheels wear seatbelt and generally don't jump the lights in Chandigarh but the mthey cross the barriers towards punchkulla or mohali, they remove the seatbelts and start jumping lights and there are hundreds of such instances.

Moreover, in Singapore, the crime rate is zero reason being there is a zero tolerance and wrongdoers cant escape clutches of law which are severe and strict. From the above discussion and abreast with ground level hard realities of ever-increasing crime rate, indulging of youth in drugs and organized crime by the transnational gangsters, I am of the firm opinion that capital punishment should be retained.

2,12,961 MT of paddy purchased at MHP: DC

KAITHAL:** DC Prashant Panwar said that till last day, 2 lakh 12 thousand 961 metric tonnes of paddy has been purchased at the minimum support price by the procurement agencies in various markets of the district. Out of the total arrival, 1 lakh 19 thousand 67 metric tons have been purchased by the Food and Supplies Department, 59 thousand 466 metric tons by HAFED and 34 thousand 428 metric tons by Haryana Warehousing Corporation. Appealing to the farmers, the DC said that after harvesting the paddy crop, they should not burn the crop residues, but make fodder for animals from these residues or mix them in the land. The government has also made a provision to give incentive amount of one thousand rupees per acre to the farmers doing Fana management.

'When will the world be free from curse of child labour?'

Many child labourers work for the greed of wages even though their family conditions are favourable for education. Governments should find who are doing child labour at the age of education and play and the reasons for child labour should be found out and resolved and till the time they are educated.

Hry surpasses milestone with 63,733 solar pumps installed under PMKUSUM scheme: CS

CHANDIGARH, OCT 4**

Haryana Chief Secretary, Sanjeev Kaushal disclosed that the state has achieved significant milestones in the installation of 63,733 off-grid solar pumps under the PMKUSUM scheme. To date, farmers have received a subsidy of Rs. 1,602.84 crore. This initiative has led to an additional 445 MW of solar capacity, expected to save 441 million units of electricity annually, result in financial savings of Rs. 294 crore yearly in renewable energy subsidies for agriculture pumps, and reduce CO2 emissions by 3.5 lakh tonnes annually. Haryana ranks second in off-grid solar pump installations after Maharashtra. During a meeting to review the progress of renewable energy initiatives within the state, Mr. Kaushal said that the state has received a state subsidy of Rs. 1,012.62 crore and central assistance of Rs. 590.22 crore for off-grid solar pumps under Component B of the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Urja Suraksha Evam



Utthaan Mahabhiyan (PM-KUSUM) scheme. Mr. Kaushal said that about 7,700 domestic consumers with 500 square yard roofs have been connected to the DISCOMS grid under the domestic solar rooftop scheme. Additionally, 1,651 consumers of domestic rooftop solar have been connected in UHBVN. In recognition of this outstanding performance, UHBVN Haryana has been awarded an incentive of Rs. 9.77 crore by the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy. Expanding Solar Power

Generation Mr. Kaushal further said that Haryana is making progress in the development of MW-scale ground-mounted solar power generation projects, guided by the Haryana Solar Policy 2016 and HERC Regulations. The state's power utilities employ a competitive bidding process to procure solar and renewable energy (RE) power, with a substantial portion sourced from projects located beyond its borders. Boosting Renewable Energy Procurement The Haryana Power Purchase Center (HPPC) recently initiated a tender to secure an additional 500 MW of solar power, garnering bids totaling 77 MW, which are currently undergoing evaluation. SECI Collaboration for Solar Power In a significant move, HPPC has granted consent to the Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) for the procurement of 800 MW of uninterrupted RE power, subject to the condition of installing 1200 MW of solar capacity within Haryana. SECI has initiated the tendering process, setting a ceiling

tariff of Rs. 4.6 per unit, with submissions due by October 5, 2023. SJVNL Partnership for Renewable Energy HPPC has also inked an agreement with Suttel Jal Vidyut Nigam Limited (SJVNL) to secure an additional 800 MW of round-the-clock RE power, featuring a ceiling price of Rs. 4.5 per unit. Mr. Kaushal also revealed the state's ambitious plan to harness the abundant potential of paddy straw and organic waste resources for sustainable energy production. Haryana, known as India's agricultural heartland, annually boasts an excess of over 84 lakh metric tonnes (MT) of biomass, with paddy straw contributing approximately 70 lakh MT. In a comprehensive review of the progress of renewable energy initiatives implemented within the state, Mr. Kaushal emphasized the versatility of this valuable resource, highlighting its applications in power generation, ethanol production, compressed biogas (CBG) generation and the utilization of the eco-friendly briquette in manufacturing process.

Actor Gayatri Joshi, husband involved in car accident in Italy

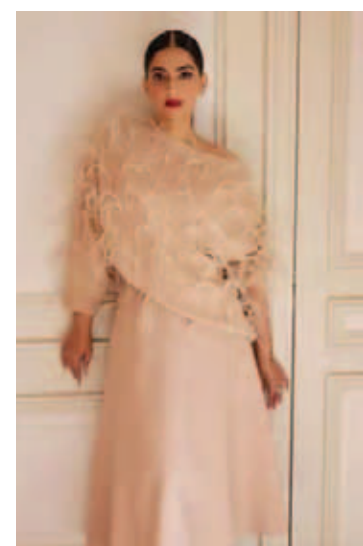
