### Two terrorists eliminated in Shopian encounter

**SHOPIAN:** : Shopian Senior Superintendent of Police Tanushree said on Tuesday that the killing of two terrorists in the latest encounter here is a big win for the security forces as the terrorists were planning attacks in the area. She said that the security forces received the information about the presence of the terrorists in the area Monday night and that the operation continued the entire night. "At around 7 am (on Tuesday), the two terrorists were neutralised...This is a big win for the security forces as they were planning attacks and recruiting people," SSP Tanushree said. "Security forces got information at night that two terrorists have been seen...On receiving this information, Jammu and Kashmir Police, 44 RR and 178 CRPF joint forces cordoned off the area," the officer added.

On Saturday, expressing solidarity with Israel in the wake of the deadly rocket strikes by Hamas, Prime Minister Modi said his

rorist attacks in Israel. Our thoughts and prayers are with the innocent victims and their families. We stand in solidarity with Israel at this difficult hour," PM Modi posted on X.

Thanking PM Modi for his support, Israel's Ambassador to India, Naor Gilon posted on X, "Thank you again PM @narendramodi-ji. Since we get SO MUCH support from our Indian brothers and sisters, I'm unfortunately unable to thank each and every one of you personally. Please accept this as my gratitude to all our friends."

## HP Govt to withdraw cases registered for violation of Covid-19 norms: CM

Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Monday said that the state government would withdraw the cases registered against the people who violated COVID-19 norms during the pandemic and adopt a humanitarian approach.

CM Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said, "The present state government would withdraw the cases registered against the people who violated COVID-19 norms during the pandemic."

The Chief Minister said that instructions had been issued to the concerned officials in this regard during the Deputy Commissioner/Superintendent of Police conference held here today. He said that the Covid-19 phase was difficult for everyone and to prevent and contain this pan-



demic, various measures had been taken and restrictions were imposed on the common people. He further said, "During this period, hundreds of cases were registered for violation of such norms, but the present state government, adopting a humanitarian approach, will now withdraw such cases."

Himachal Pradesh had reported above 4000 deaths due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

## Old age pension will be increased to Rs. 3000 in Haryana: CM

The Chief Minister stated that Haryana is the state that provides the highest pension to senior citizens. The pension for senior citizens will soon be increased to Rs. 3000, he said. The Chief Minister said that senior citizens do not have to go through the hassle of applying for a pension when they turn 60; pensions are automatically generated through the PPP. During the Samavd, the Chief Minister also distributed pension certificates to 22 individuals on the spot.

During the Samvad, differently-abled citizens presented complaints about irregularities in some ration depots in the district. The Chief Minister ordered the Anti-Corruption Bureau to investigate complaints related to fake ration cards and other ration-related issues. The Chief Minister announced the construction of two roads in Hisar. These include the construction of the Khanak-Balsamand Road at a cost of Rs. 37 crores and the construction of the Hisar-Balsamand Road at a cost of Rs. 8 crores.



## Raghav Chadha approaches SC over RS suspension

Aam Aadmi Party leader Raghav Chadha has approached the Supreme Court today challenging his suspension from the Rajya Sabha. He was suspended from the Upper House of the Parliament on August 1 for "breach of privilege" after four MPs alleged that he had violated rules by naming them in a House panel without their consent. "People from the BJP are saying I submitted some MPs' signatures. I want to tell you the truth. Any parliamentarian has the right to nominate names for a committee. This means that I can propose names for a select committee. I don't need an MP's written consent or signature to do so. You just have to give the names. If any MP has an objection, they can withdraw their name. We have not sub-



mitted any signatures," the AAP leader said after his suspension. The Rajya Sabha passed a resolution moved by leader of the House Piyush Goyal to suspend Mr Chadha till the privileges committee submits its findings. Mr Goyal had sought action against the AAP leader for including names of some members of the Upper House without their consent in a proposed select committee for the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi (Amendment) Bill, 2023.

## ED raids premise of AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan

The Enforcement Directorate (ED) on Tuesday conducted searches at the premises of Amanatullah Khan, who is Aam Aadmi Party MLA from Okhla, in an on-going investigation of money laundering probe, sources said. The sources said the ED conducted a search related to an alleged money laundering case. In September last year, Amanatullah Khan (ACB) of Delhi Police in a case related to alleged irregularities in appointments. This action came days after the ED arrested AAP leader and MP Sanjay Singh after raids at his residence and questioned him over 10 hours in a case linked to the Delhi liquor policy.

# 'Bill Liyao Inaam Pao': 227 win prizes worth Rs 13 lakh for September

Punjab Finance, Planning, Excise and Taxation Minister Advocate Harpal Singh Cheema on Tuesday said that 227 winners won prizes worth Rs 13,39,425 for uploading bills on "Mera Bill App" in the month of September under "Bill Liyao Inaam Pao" scheme. He said the online lucky draw was conducted on Monday by the committee appointed by the Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann led Punjab government.

Disclosing this in a press communiqué issued here, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that among the winners, the highest number of 38 winners were from Taxation district of Ludhiana; while in the second place 21 winners were from Taxation district of Jalandhar.

He said that the enthusiasm received by this scheme from different parts of the state is evident from the fact that 14 winners were from Taxation district of Amritsar, 10 each from Taxation districts of Barnala, Gurdaspur and Faridkot, 9 each from taxation districts of Sri Muktsar Sahib, Bathinda and Moga, 8 each from taxation districts of Fatehgarh Sahib, Sahibzada Ajit Singh Nagar, Patiala, Kapurthala, Pathankot, Ferozepur, Fazilka, Hoshiarpur and



Tarn Taran, 7 each from taxation districts of Shahid Bhagat Singh Nagar and Rupnagar, 6 from taxation district of Mansa, and 5 from taxation district of Sangrur.

Revealing further, the Finance Minister said that 81 people won prize money of Rs 10,000 each. He said that the reward under this scheme is equivalent to the five times of the taxable value of goods/services declared in the bill with maximum capping of Rs. 10,000/- each reward.

He said that the list of winners has been published on the website of the Taxation Department. Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that a total of 227 persons were entitled to the prize during the online lucky draw while the names of 63 other persons were rejected after verification of the bills uploaded by them. He said that the bills uploaded by some of these persons were of month of August and not of September, in some cases bills of petrol were uploaded, some of the bills were related to purchases made outside Punjab and in one case the bill uploaded was related to business to business transaction.

The Finance minister said the sale bills of petroleum products (crude oil, petrol, diesel, aviation turbine fuel and natural gas) and liquor as well as B2B (business to business) transactions are not eligible for participation in this scheme.

Appealing the people to get the bills of their purchases, Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema said that the people of Punjab should participate in this scheme as much as possible so that the message of tax compliance can be conveyed from house to house so that the state revenue can be further strengthened to run the various welfare schemes in a more effective manner.

Food product traders must follow rules laid by FSSAI: DHO



**SARDULGARH (KULWINDER KARWAL):** Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) launched a nationwide campaign to raise awareness and collect samples of milk and milk products in 766 districts by the Food and Drug Administration of Punjab. Traders and people involved in this business are being made aware of FSSAI standards so that consumers can get quality and adulterant free products. District Health Officer Dr. Ranjit Singh Rai said that there is a huge gap between the demand and supply of milk in the state, taking advantage of which some profit-seeking individuals do adulteration. The department is fully prepared to prevent this.

Under this campaign, the health department is sensitising dairy owners, sweet traders and milk processing units regarding the norms and standards of FSSAI. He said the milk should be free from starch, neutralizer, sucrose, maltodextrin, ammonium fertilizer, salt, nitrate fertilizer, hydrogen peroxide, formalin and the amount of urea should not exceed 700 ppm. District Health Officer said that concerned are being informed about the scale indicated by FSSAI for standard milk products cream, desi ghee, curd, cheese and khoa etc. Apart from this, norms have also been prescribed for dairy products, cereals and sweets made from pulses.

Firing incident repoted at scrap shop in Zirakpur

Following an old grudge, a dozen youths opened fire at a scrap shop in Har Milap Nagar at around half past one on Monday night. It is being told that three shots were fired by the attacking youths. EDITORIAL

Southern Discomfort

The population-based delimitation of Lok Sabha constituencies, slated for 2026, is hanging like a Sword of Damocles over the heads of the southern States as they face the prospect of losing their strength in Parliament. The key question that needs to be asked is why the South should be penalised for controlling population growth and concentrating on development. The Centre must come up with a suitable mechanism to address their concerns and ensure regional balance in representation in Parliament.

It is also time for all political parties in the South, cutting across party affiliations, to raise their voice against the injustice being done through the present method of delimitation which takes population into account while redrawing the borders of the constituencies. The irony is that the progressive policies of the southern States are harming them while those States that have been unable to control their population over decades stand to gain from the delimitation. Post-delimitation, the total seats in the South are projected to come down to 103 from the existing 129, a prospect that could trigger mass protests and severe public resentment. In contrast, Bihar and Uttar Pradesh together will have a total of 222 MPs. Another study had projected that four northern States —Bihar, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan and Uttar Pradesh — would collectively gain 22 seats while four southern States of Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala and Tamil Nadu would lose 17 seats. The delimitation is back in focus now with the NDA government linking the implementation of the women's reservation with it.

It must be pointed out that southern States account for just 18% of the country's population but contribute 35% to the gross domestic product (GDP). It would be a travesty of justice if such progressive States were put at a disadvantage in the delimitation exercise. The northern States have consistently ignored the central government's population control measures but now stand to benefit in terms of representation in Parliament. In the present circumstances, the delimitation, along with a smaller share of central funds to States on the basis of population, can be unfair to southern States where the economic situation has improved dramatically since the turn of the 21st century. It will also affect the division of seats reserved for SCs and STs in each State. With the total number of Lok Sabha seats frozen for almost 50 years, there are now wide discrepancies between States on the average number of electors represented by each MP. The delimitation exercise in 2026 would presumably seek to redraw the boundaries so that each parliamentary constituency has roughly the same population. This would mean an increase in seats in States with high populations. Given the political motives of the current dispensation at the Centre, there are genuine apprehensions that the delimitation could lead to unequal representation in Parliament.

White House illuminated in Israel colours

The White House on Monday night was illuminated with the blue and white light to show support for Israel following the attacks by Hamas on Israel that left as many as 800 people dead, The Hill reported on Sunday.

The action came after a call by Sen. Lindsey Graham (R-S.C.) as a

President Joe Biden also posted the image of the White House illuminated in the colours of Israel with his message of support to the people of Israel. House coordinator for the Middle East and North Africa, Brett McGurk, posted with a photograph of the lights. President Joe Biden also posted the image of the White House illuminated in the colours of Israel with his message of support to the people of Israel.

"Tonight, America says clearly to the Israeli people, to the world, and to terrorists everywhere that we stand with Israel. That will never change" the American president posted on X.

Additionally, the notable landmarks in US and other cities of

the world have been lit up in the colours of the Israeli in a show of solidarity. These include the Eiffel Tower in Paris, the Empire State building in New York City and a giant screen that was put up in the Ukrainian capital of Kyiv.

The Sydney Opera House, 10 Downing St. in London and the Brandenburg Gate have also been lit up in the blue and white colours as a mark of support.

As the Israel-Hamas conflict enters its fourth day, over 900 people have been killed, and 2400 wounded

by the Hamas terror groups in Israel, reported The Times of Israel.

Meanwhile, Israel has hit 1707 targets in Gaza since Saturday, including 475 rocket systems, 73 command centres, 23 strategic infrastructure sites and 22 underground targets. In retaliation, it has killed over 400 people in the besieged Gaza Strip.

As part of its retaliation against Hamas, Israel has mobilised 3,00,000 troops in the last 48 hours. Rear Admiral Daniel Hagari informed about the mobilisation and said the IDF "has

never mobilized so many reservists so quickly -- 300,000 reservists in 48 hours."

This is the largest mobilisation since the 1973 Yom Kippur War when Israel called up 400,000 reservists, Times of Israel reported.

In another development, the Israeli military has also deployed troops against a suspected infiltration from Lebanon. Meanwhile, the IDF continued to carry out airstrikes, with the military saying it was hitting targets belonging to the Hamas terror group

Study finds how bats evolved to avoid cancer

A new research published by Oxford University Press in Genome Biology and Evolution suggests that rapid evolution in bats may explain the animals' unique capacity to host and survive infections as well as avoid cancer.

Bats are unique among mammals not just for their ability to fly, but also for their long



lifespans, low cancer rates, and robust immune systems. Bats are also suspected to have had a role in the spread of SARS-CoV2. The ability of bats to tolerate viral infections may be due to peculiar aspects of their innate immune response.

These characteristics make bats an interesting animal to investigate, because they may have implications for human health. For

example, by better understanding the mechanisms of the bat immune system that allow bats to tolerate viral infections, researchers may be better able to prevent disease outbreaks from animals to people. Comparative genomic analyses of bats and cancer-susceptible mammals may eventually provide new information on the causes of cancer and the links between cancer and immunity. Studies of bats and other organisms complement studies based on mouse models; mice are more amenable than bats to experimental manipulation but exhibit fewer characteristics with implications for human disease.

Here researchers using the Oxford Nanopore Technologies long-read platform, and bat samples collected with help from the American Museum of Natural History in Belize, sequenced the genomes of two bat species, the Jamaican fruit bat and the Mesoamerican mustached bat, and carried out a comprehensive comparative genomic analysis with a diverse collection of bats and other mammals.

London: Pro-Israeli, pro-Palestinian protestors clash amid conflict in Israel

Amid protest rallies over the Israel-Hamas conflict, groups of pro-Palestinian and pro-Israeli protesters clashed at High Street Kensington Tube Station in London on Monday evening.

Police officers were dispatched to restrain tensions between sympathisers on opposing sides of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Their priority was keeping the peace and avoiding violence between pro-Palestinian and pro-Israeli protesters as events overseas triggered heated demonstrations in London.

Videos on various social media platforms showed dozens of police officers attempting to separate demonstrators at High Street Kensington Tube Station as a pro-Palestine rally taking place outside the Israeli embassy started to escalate.

In a major escalation on October 7, Hamas launched a "surprise attack" on Israel, firing a barrage of rockets into the southern and central parts of the country, killing over 700 people.

Meanwhile, UK PM Rishi Sunak has branded the people supporting Hamas for the "appalling attack" as "terrorists".

"The people who support Hamas are fully responsible for this appalling attack. They are not militants. They are not freedom fighters. They are terrorists," posted Sunak on X.

Thousands gathered for the pro-Palestinian



protest in front of the Israeli Embassy on Monday evening at around 6 pm (GMT). Some protestors were seen climbing lampposts with flags and flares. Protesters chanted "Israel is a terrorist state" and "Allahu Akhbar." Stalls were set up selling "Free Palestine" merchandise. Some launched fireworks towards the embassy building.

"Events in central London this evening - following the attack in Israel and the escalation of conflict along the border with Gaza in recent days - have now concluded, with three arrests and further

live arrest enquiries underway," said Metropolitan Police in a statement.

In contrast, weeping Israelis held a vigil outside Downing Street in the evening to honour victims and hostages taken by Hamas during an assault over the Gaza border on Saturday. UK PM Rishi Sunak also visited a London synagogue in a show of support for Israel.

On the other hand, Suella Braverman, Member of Parliament of the UK called for zero tolerance of terrorism on the streets of Britain.

Electrons from Earth may be producing water on Moon

Scientists determined that high energy electrons in Earth's plasma sheet are contributing to weathering processes on the Moon's surface and may have contributed to the development of water on the lunar surface.

Nature Astronomy reported the research findings.

Understanding the distribution and concentrations of water on the Moon is crucial for understanding its genesis and evolution, as well as providing water resources for future human exploration.

The new discovery could also help explain the creation of previously observed water ice in the Moon's permanently shadowed regions.

Because of Earth's magnetic, a force field known as the magnetosphere surrounds the planet, protecting it from space weathering and harmful solar

radiation.

The solar wind pushes and reshapes the magnetosphere, resulting in a lengthy tail on the night side.

This magnetotail's plasma sheet is an area made up of high-energy electrons and ions that could come from Earth or the solar wind.

Scientists previously focused on the role of high-energy ions in the weathering of the Moon and other airless surfaces in space. The solar wind, which is composed of high-energy particles such as protons, bombards the lunar surface and is regarded to be one of the primary sources of water on the Moon.

Shuai Li, the assistant researcher at the UH Manoa School of Ocean and Earth Science and Technology (SOEST), was interested in investigating the



changes in surface weathering as the Moon passes through Earth's magnetotail, an area that almost completely shields the Moon from the solar wind but not the Sun's light photons, based on his previous work that showed oxygen in Earth's magnetotail is rusting iron in the Moon's polar regions.

"This provides a natural laboratory for studying the formation processes of lunar surface water," said Li.

"When the Moon is outside of the magnetotail, the lunar surface is bombarded with solar wind. Inside he magnetotail, there are almost no solar wind protons and water formation was expected to drop to nearly zero."

Li and colleagues examined remote sensing data collected by India's Chandrayaan 1 mission's Moon Mineralogy Mapper instrument between 2008 and 2009. They looked at how water

formation changed as the Moon passed through Earth's magnetotail, which includes the plasma sheet.

"To my surprise, the remote sensing observations showed that the water formation in Earth's magnetotail is almost identical to the time when the Moon was outside of the Earth's magnetotail," said Li.

"This indicates that, in the magnetotail, there may be additional formation processes or new sources of water not directly associated with the implantation of solar wind protons. In particular, radiation by high energy electrons exhibits similar effects as the solar wind protons."

"Altogether, this finding and my previous findings of rusty lunar poles indicate that Mother Earth is strongly tied with its Moon in many unrecognized aspects," said Li.

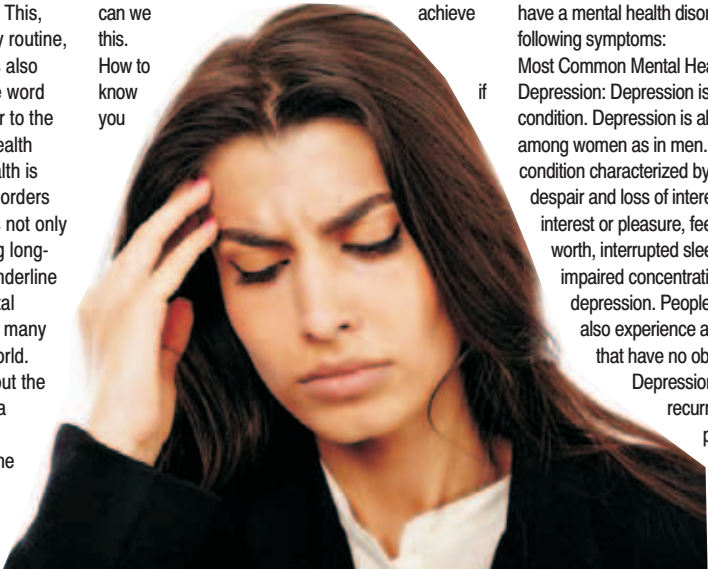

Patient with systemic lupus erythematosus gets successful aortic valve replacement



MOHALI: A 57-year-old female patient with systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE), which is a challenging autoimmune condition, was treated successfully at Ivy Hospital recently. Giving information, Dr. Virender Sarwal, director cardiothoracic and vascular surgery said that the patient underwent aortic valve replacement (AVR) with a mechanical valve for severe aortic stenosis. SLE is an autoimmune disease where the immune system mistakenly attacks the body's own tissues, leading to extensive damage. Cardiac surgery in such cases is exceedingly rare and carries a high risk of mortality and morbidity, said Dr Sarwal. According to the Society of Thoracic Surgeons' data, only 329 cases of cardiac surgery have been performed in SLE patients over the last 27 years in the USA, with just 164 of them involving

valve surgeries. Dr. Jagpal Pandher consultant internal medicine at IVY also played a crucial role in the successful outcome of the surgery. He meticulously investigated the patient preoperatively and provided valuable assistance during the postoperative period, considering the patient's steroid and HCQ medication, which suppress the immune system. Dr. Suresh K Goel pulmonologist assessed the patient's lung reserves, as SLE can adversely affect lung function. Their expertise ensured a comprehensive preoperative evaluation to minimize risks. The surgery was performed with utmost precision, addressing the complexity of SLE patients, including the involvement of the pericardium, which often leads to dense adhesions that require meticulous dissection during surgery, said Dr Sarwal.

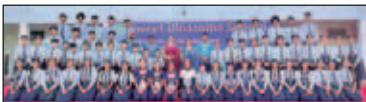
