Safe corridor deadline ends in Gaza, Lord Ram's grand temple in Kharar initiated Israeli forces await signal

AGENCY **NEW DELHI, OCT 15**

The three-hour deadline set by the Israeli military for a safe corridor in northern Gaza to allow residents to go to

the "safer" southern part of the seaside territory ended at 3.30 pm. The Israeli forces are now waiting for the political leadership to take a call on the all-out ground offensive, though the forces have been conducting localised raids on Gaza strip.

In a post on X, the Israel Defence Forces (IDF) earlier said they will not launch any operation on this corridor from 10 am

"Residents of Gaza City and northern Gaza, in the past days, we've urged you to relocate to the southern area for your safety. We want to inform you that the IDF will not carry out any operations along this route from 10 pm to 1 pm," the Israeli military said.
"During this window, please take the

opportunity to move southward from northern Gaza," it said. The IDF said the safety of Gaza residents and that of their families matters, "Please follow our instructions and head southward. Be assured, Hamas lead-



ers have already ensured their safety and that of their families," it said. Earlier today, the Israeli military has released photos that claim to show the Hamas group stopping people from going to southern Gaza. The Hamas group has been accused of using human shields.

NEW DELHI: A top Hamas commander, responsible for the Kibbutz Nirim massacre in Israel, was killed in an Israeli airstrike today, the Israel Air Force (IAF) said in a statement. Four more commanders were reportedly killed in attacks. Israeli intelligence pinned Billal Al Kedra's location in Khan Yunis, a city in the south of Gaza Strip. Al Kedra was a commander of the Nukhba force, a naval commando unit under Hamas' special forces unit of the Izz ad-Din al-Qassam Brigades. 12 killed in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar road accident

CHHATRAPATI SAMBHAIJNAGAR: In yet another gruesome accident on Maharashtra's high-speed Samruddhi Expressway, 12 devotees of Sailani Baba were killed and 18 others injured when a tempo carrying them hit a stationary truck in Chhatrapati Sambhaijnagar district, official sources said on Sunday.

The accident happened near the Jambargaon toll booth in Vaijapur taluka, about 80 kms from this city, late Saturday night. Maharashtra Chief Minister Eknaht Shinde has announced Rs five lakh assistance for the nearest kin of the deceased and ordered a

According to the reports reaching here, all the deceased including six women and a four-month-old child, perished on the spot. The injured have been admitted to the Government Medical College and Hospital (GMCH) in Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar. The

"What we had feared, happened": Raghav Chadha after Agniveer jawan not laid to rest with full military honours

NEW DELHI: Strongly objecting to a deceased Agniveer jawan, who died of a self-inflicted gunshot wound, not being accorded a funeral with full military honours, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader Raghav Chadha on Sunday hit out at the Centre saying that it only lays bare its 'Agniveer' recruitment scheme. The Agniveer jawan was on sentry duty in Jammu discharge from his service weapon Addressing a press conference in the national capital,

the suspended AAP Rajya Sabha MP said, "What we had feared, happened." The AAP MP said his party had strongly criticised the

Agniveer scheme and raised strong apprehensions about it when it was introduced by the central government "When the BJP government brought the Agniveer

around this recruitment scheme that had been left unaddressed. The Aam Aadmi Party, too, criticised the scheme and had raised several questions on it, Chadha said. He added that while he was not accorded a funeral in

line with the time-honoured military tradition, the AAP government in Punjab decided to lay Agniveer Amritpal Singh with full state honours. "When Agniveer Amritpal was not given military honours by the BJP government, the Punjab Police decided to lay him to rest with full state honours. This country is what it is because of our soldiers and not because of (political) leaders," he said.

MP polls: Cong issues 1st list of 144 names

BHOPAL, OCT 15 (UNI): As election-bound Madhya Pradesh continues to move from 'simmer' to 'boil' vis-à-vis the political temperature, the principal-opposition Congress announced its massive maiden list of 144 candidates on Sunday. Among the prominent names is erstwhile chief minister Kamal Nath who will be trying his fortune from his traditional bastion Chhindwara. Most of the outgoing legislators have been retained. Leader of the Opposition Govind Singh has entered the fray from Lahar, former minister Jitu Patwari (Rau), ex-Union minister Arjun Singh's son Ajay Singh (Churhat) Mr Lakhan Singh Yadav (Bhitarwar), ex-chief minister Digvijaya Singh's son Jaivardhan Singh (Raghogarh) and Mr Kamleshwar Patel (Sihawal). Television actor Vikram Mastal has been pitted against Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan in Budhni. The issuance of notification is scheduled for October 21. Voting is to be conducted on November 17 and counting is slated for December 3. The state has a 230-strong Assembly.



Fresh snowfall, light rain in Himachal

SHIMLA, OCT 15 (UNI): The cold wave intensified in the midhills of Himachal Pradesh after fresh snowfall on the high reaches of Lahaul Spiti and a few places of Kangra, Chamba, Kullu and Kinnaur districts on Sunday.Reports arriving here said high passes of Lahaul Spiti including Baralach, Kunzum and Rohtang pass received major spells of snowfall and three main roads are snowbound in Lahaul Spiti district.Indian Meteorological Department has issued alert of moderate rainfall and isolated heavy spell with thunderstorm and gusty wind (speed 30-40kmph) likely to continue in Sirmaur district at Ponta Sahib, Kamaru, Shalai and Renuka.It said



there is a possibility of light to moderate rain at many places with thunder and lightning in Kangra, Una, Hamirpur, Bilaspur, Mandi and Kul districts.Light to moderate

rainfall could also occur at some places in Solan, Shimla, Kinnaur, Chamba, Lahaul and Sapiti districts.Light drizzling, windstorm and clouds are hovering in the sky.

Air & Road transport is hit partly in the hill.According to a statement issued by Lahaul Spiti police, vehicular traffic has been disrupted on National Highway -3, which is Open from Koksar to Darcha, but closed between Darcha and Sarchu due to snowfall, Similarly Darcha -Shinkula road and NH-505 Samdo-Kaza-Gramphu are open from Sumdo to Losser but it is closed between Losser to Chota Darra road.The inclement weather attributed to Western disturbances would continue to effect the state for the next two days. According to an agriculture expert, early rain and snowfall would be beneficial for early sowing of Rabi crops and offseasonal vegetables



technology," he said. Full Depth Reclamation is a rehabilitation pavement technique in which the full flexible pavement section and a predetermined portion of the underlying materials uniformly pulverized and blended together to produce a

homogeneous stabilized base course. FDR uses the materials from the deteriorated asphalt pavement, and, with the addition of cement, creates a new stabilized base.

The roads constructed by using this technology become more durable and better for plying the vehicles. Besides, it's a cost effective and eco-friendly technology as well, he added.

A website containing details about Tamils living abroad is going to be published soon," the Health Minister said while speaking to reporters at Chennai airport. Earlier today, the District Collector of Madurai on behalf of the Tamil Nadu Government welcomed the eight persons who arrived at Madurai Airport from Israel Meanwhile, under 'Operation Ajay',

the fourth flight with 274 Indians onboard departed from Israel for India in the early hours of Sunday, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said. Taking to social media platform X, Jaishankar said that it was the second flight in a day to depart from Israel for India."#OperationAjay 2nd flight of the day departs from Tel Aviv carrying 274 passengers," Jaishankar posted on X. 'Operation Ajay' was launched by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to bring back around 18,000 Indians in Israel. Registration of Indians began on Thursday.

It has been more than a week after the attack that saw more than 1,300 Israelis killed, most of them civilians, as waves of Hamas terrorists breached the border.

Army court-martial awards five-year jail term to Army officer in child abuse case

FEROZEPUR: An Indian Army General Court Marital has recommended a five-year jail term and cashiering from service as punishment to a Major who was found guilty on charges of sexual harassment involving an 11-year-old girl.

The General Court Martial found the allegations levelled by the mother of the victim to be correct and awarded a fiveyear jail term along with cashiering from service to the Major who was posted in the Delhi Cantonment at the time of the incident, sources said.

The victim is the daughter of the house help who was living in the servant quarters of the officer's official accommodation. The court martial was convened by the 7 Infantry Division Commander Maj Gen Y Sheoran earlier this year.

The punishment has been awarded to the officer under sec-

tions 10 and 12 of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO), the sources further said. Defending his client, Advocate Anand Kumar alleged that the disciplinary proceedings against the officer in the court of

the disciplinary proceedings against the officer in the court of inquiry and summary of evidence were tampered with and it had been brought to the notice of the court martial authorities in the trial.

The counsel claimed that they had requested to summon

The counsel claimed that they had requested to summon the officer recording the summary of evidence but it was declined by the court. The defence counsel also claimed that their plea to examine the mobile phones of the parents of the victim was also not granted.

Indian Army officials said that the force has a zero-tolerance policy against such activities and the Army headquarters has instructed the formations to take strictest possible action against personnel found guilty in such cases.

And go back when things pan out in a better manner," Singh told . He further urged people not to panic and follow the instructions, adding that another flight will be coming on Monday. "There is another flight coming in tomorrow. We will keep running

the flights till all the people who have registered are taken out. This operation is going very well. It is seamless, well organised... My message would be to stay where you are and follow the instructions. There is no need to panic," he added. The Indian passengers said that the situation in Israel remains tense and thanked the Modi government for carrying out 'Operation Ajay' and evacuating the Indian citizens.

An Indian student coming from Israel told ANI, "In the beginning it was horrific. Everything was uncontrollable. But now the situation is under control. The government and military are taking very strict action...Thank you, it was the best initiative (Operation Ajay) taken by the government of India..." "In Tel Aviv the situation is normal. But in the south and north Israel, there are chances of war. That's returned...The government did a very good job. They responded very fast within 2-3 days," another Indian national named Sumit said. The Indian nationals applauded the operation and said that there was support from the Indian embassy and the evacuation process was nice and quick. EDITORIAL

New diplomatic challenge

he victory of pro-China candidate Mohamed Muizzu in the recent presidential elections in Maldives, a strategically important archipelago, poses a big diplomatic challenge for India. Located just 70 nautical miles away from India's Minicoy Island, Maldives, a tourist hub famous for its pristine tropical beaches, is traditionally seen to be part of India's sphere of influence. New Delhi has financed several infrastructure projects in the country which holds high strategic value because of its location at the crossroads of vital maritime routes in the Indian Ocean. Ensuring maritime security and safeguarding the free movement of ships through these waters is of vital importance to India. Muizzu's surprise win comes as a wake-up call for India and is bound to have an impact on its 'Neighbourhood First' policy. His poll campaign plank had not only focused on strengthening ties with Beijing, it was also about aiming to undermine India by calling for an end to any Indian military presence in his country of half a million people scattered across more than 1,000 islands. With the change of guard, the road ahead may not be easy for New Delhi. Given the new government's pro-China outlook, the future of Indian influence and development projects hangs in the balance. India enjoyed cosy ties with Muizzu's predecessor Ibrahim Solih who took office following a landslide victory in 2018 against Muizzu's mentor and former President Abdulla Yameen. On its part, Beijing has been relentlessly trying to undermine Indian influence in Maldives and Sri Lanka, apart from driving a wedge between India and its close Himalayan neighbours — Nepal and Bhutan. China's arm-twisting strategy through money and muscle power to subjugate the nations in the region is a real threat to India. Beijing is all out to encircle India in its neighbourhood through its infamous 'String of Pearls' policy. For years, the Maldives has remained under the strong influence of India. But Xi Jinping's aggressive plan for the expansion of China's influence through the Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) has finally reached the Maldives, which crisscrosses key trade routes wherein both India and China vie for control and influence. Unlike his predecessor who had adopted the 'India First' policy, Muizzu ran a fierce 'India Out' campaign, politicising India's defence and development assistance and fanning nationalist sentiments. The tiny island nation is at the heart of the Indian Ocean and the evolving Indo-Pacific world order. effect was accompanied by a shift in the composition of the gut bacteria.

The findings, derived from advanced neuroimaging, next-generation sequencing of gut bacteria, and combined analyses of potential metabolic pathways, suggested that functional microbial changes may underlie the altered brain response towards high-caloric food cues. Fasting blood samples from the participants underwent analysis for gastrointestinal hormones, glucose, lipids, and inflammatory markers.

In addition, gut microbiota and their metabolites, namely short-chain

fatty acids, were measured in stool samples. The research was conducted within the Collaborative Research

Centre 1052, Obesity Mechanisms.

"Further studies are needed to investigate whether treatments that alter the microbiome could open up new avenues for less invasive approaches to the prevention and treatment of obesity. A better understanding of the underlying mechanisms between the microbiome gut, and brain could help to develop new strategies that promote healthier eating habits in people at risk" said Dr

Mental health conditions are linked to changing autism traits: Study

long-term study conducted by UC Davis Health researchers gives fresh light on the association between autistic features and middle childhood mental health.

According to the study, changes in core autistic traits are associated with whether children develop additional mental health difficulties over their primary school years.

The study was published in Autism.

"Our findings suggest that different aspects of a child's development may affect each other over time," explained Einat Waizbard-Bartov, a doctoral researcher in developmental psychology at the UC Davis MIND Institute and the lead author of the paper. "Core autism traits and mental health challenges likely interact throughout development."

A key finding was that a reduction in restrictive and repetitive behaviours during elementary school was linked to the emergence of mental health challenges, lending support to the idea that these behaviours may benefit autistic individuals. An increase in social-communication difficulties during this time was also linked to anxiety and other mental health challenges.

other mental health challenges.
Waizbard-Bartov has published
previous research showing autism
characteristics can change
significantly from ages 3 to 11.

The current study included 75 autistic children ages 6 to 11, including 15 girls. All were part of the MIND Institute's Autism Phenome Project, a large, long-term study aimed at identifying different subtypes of autism.

Through parental interviews and



questionnaires, the research team evaluated the children for mental health symptoms and restricted and repetitive behaviours, which can include seeking sensory stimulation, hand-flapping or sticking to set routines. They tracked changes in autism characteristics using the **Autism Diagnostic Observation** Schedule Calibrated Severity Score.r. About a third of the participants had both decreasing restricted and repetitive behaviours and increased social-communication difficulties. "We were pleased to see that our results confirmed what has been suspected by other autism researchers and clinicians as well as autistic individuals, that some forms of restricted and repetitive behaviours can potentially help to self-soothe," said David Amaral, distinguished professor in the Department of Psychiatry and

Behavioral Sciences, MIND Institute faculty member and senior author on the paper. Waizbard-Bartov notes that the findings question the wisdom of therapies that try to eliminate these behaviours.

"In light of this, when thinking about interventions, it might be that trying to eliminate repetitive behaviours without providing alternative self-soothing tools is not the ideal way to go," she said.

The study is the first, to the authors' knowledge, to demonstrate an association between mental health challenges and increases in the severity of social-communication difficulties for autistic children.

"This occurred in children who showed decreases in core autism traits during early childhood and whose cognitive functioning was in the typical range.




UP govt to prepare annual action plan to address needs of girls, women

Embattled Australia take on Sri Lanka in battle to re-discover winning touch

LUCKNOW; Their house in complete disarray after consecutive defeats, Australia will look to wake up from their slumber and return to winning ways against an equally stuttering Sri Lanka in the World Cup here on Monday. Both teams are in search of their maiden win in the tournament. While Australia suffered humiliating losses against India and South Africa, Sri Lanka faltered against the Proteas and Pakistan.

Australia have looked like a pale shadow of their dominant selves in this tournament.

The five-time champions sit ninth in the 10-team league table owing to their horrendous Net Run Rate (-1.846), while the Lankans are 7th on the table with a NRR of -1.161.

The Aussies desperately need to get their act together if they want to keep their fate in their own hands.

But it is easier said than done. Australia have lost seven of their last eight ODIs comprehensively. During this tournament, they have

performed poorly in all three departments of the game. The Men from Down Under have been uncharacteristically sloppy in the field.

The Australians have dropped a whopping six catches in two games -- the most by any team so far in this edition of the World Cup.

Their bowling attack has also looked toothless. They have failed miserably with the bat, suffering mini-collapses, and are yet to cross 200 runs. They were rocked by India's spin bowling in the opener and



then by the South African pacers. But facing the battered and bruised Sri Lankan bowling attack could be the perfect opportunity for the Australian batters to find some form. The Australians are also familiar with the Ekana pitch having trained in the city for close to a week and played against South Africa here.

Skipper Pat Cummins had insisted earlier this week that they won't be rotating their bowlers which means Australia will stick to their threepronged pace attack of Cummins, Josh Hazlewood and Mitchell Starc with Adam Zampa and Glenn Maxwell sharing spin duties.

Sri Lanka too have underperformed at the mega event so far. They occupy the seventh spot on the points table.

While their batting line-up has done reasonably well, putting up scores in excess of 320 in both the previous

games, their bowling is an area of concern. In the absence of several frontline bowlers, Sri Lanka's relatively inexperienced bowling attack has conceded a whopping 775 runs in their first two matches.

The Lankans looked on course to register their first win against Pakistan, but the inexperience of youngsters like 20-year-old Matheesha Pathirana came to the fore as the former champions.

"They can't be termed as 'chokers' against India because that's not a great tag to have. Somehow it's a mental block, it's a skill block as well. Credit to India for maintaining their presence in World Cup competitions against Pakistan, it's not an easy match for India also because there are emotions involved, there are expectations involved", said Ramiz

"Then you're supposed to win because it has been happening for so many years that this can get you under a little bit of extra pressure. But they've handled it so well. It's going to hurt them. It's a scarring, it's a pasting, it's a battering
