J-K: Mughal Road closed for traffic after fresh snowfall

POONCH: Vehicular movement on the Mughal road, connecting Kashmir Valley's Shopian district with the twin districts of Rajouri and Poonch, has been restricted after a fresh spell of snowfall in the region on Sunday. A thick layer of snow can be seen at the Mughal Road following the snowfall on Sunday and the route is still closed for traffic movement. Earlier in the month, fresh snowfall in the high-altitude areas of Zojila Pass in Ganderbal district, Central Kashmir, resulted in the temporary suspension of traffic on the Son-amarg-Zojila highway, leaving commuters stranded for about an hour.

Indian Army to hold Chanakya Defence Dialogue

NEW DELHI: In an effort to foster open discussions on critical security issues, the Indian Army will organise a discussion series named the 'Chanakya Defence Dialogue' on November 3-4, army officials said on Monday. According to the Indian Army, the dialogue will carry out a comprehensive analysis of security challenges in South Asia and the Indo-Pacific and will focus on crafting a roadmap for collaborative security measures in the region. "This will fortify India's position as a ready, resurgent, and relevant player among the nations of this region," the Indian Army said.

HP CM distributes Rs 31 crore financial assistance to disaster affected people

BUREAU SHIMLA: Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu today distributed Rs 31 crore financial assistance as the first installment in the first phase to 3800 disaster affected families of district Mandi under the 'Rehabilitation' scheme. Under the special relief package, he provided Rs 3 lakh each as the first installment for reconstruction of completely damaged houses and the entire amount of compensation to other affected people. Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that Himachal Pradesh had suffered huge losses due to torrential rains, landslides and floods during Monsoon season this year. He said that he had never seen such a disaster in his life. He said that every section of the society had come for-



ward to tackle this challenge and all his cabinet colleagues, MLAs and all public representatives showed solidarity to work in unison to overcome this disastrous situation. He said that 75 thousand tourists stranded in the state were evacuated as a mission. Electricity, water and other essential facilities were temporarily restored within 48 hours. He said that the State had suffered over a loss of Rs 12000 crore due to the disaster. The Chief Minister said that the present state government is the government of the common man and poor and recognizes their pain and sufferings very well. He said that the state government does not work on political considerations, but takes decisions on humanitarian grounds.

AGENCY JERUSALEM/GAZA, OCT 23

Israel's military said on Monday its ground forces mounted limited raids into Gaza and airstrikes targeted Palestinian militants assembling to repulse any wider Israeli invasion, as each side prepares for the next stage of the escalating war.

Palestinian group Hamas said on Sunday its fighters had engaged an armoured force infiltrating a southern area of Gaza and destroyed some Israeli military equipment before returning to base. There was no Israeli comment on such losses. How soon Israel might

launch a full-scale invasion is not clear, and neither side can know exactly what to expect when it does. The Middle East's most powerful military faces a group that has built up a powerful arsenal with Iran's help, fighting in a crowded urban setting and using a vast tunnel network it has built that Israeli troops have dubbed the "Gaza Metro".

In a televised briefing describing Israel's latest moves on the ground, Israel's chief military spokesperson Rear Admiral Daniel Hagari also said 222 people had now been confirmed as taken hostage during the Oct. 7 cross-border onslaught by Hamas.

Haryana sees significant drop in stubble burning cases

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Chief Minister Sh Manohar Lal is dedicated to completely eliminating the issue of stubble burning in the state through collaborative efforts with the government and farmer awareness initiatives. The state government is actively pursuing concrete measures for stubble management, which are yielding positive results. Notably, there has been a significant reduction in stubble burning incidents in the state this year compared to the previous year. As of now, only 714 cases of stubble burning have been reported, whereas during the same period in 2022, there were 893 cases of stubble burning. In 2021, the number was significantly higher at 1508. In contrast, the neighboring state of Punjab has reported 1794 incidents of stubble burning this year. The Haryana Government has taken the issue of stubble burning seriously and in collaboration with farmers, has made substantial progress in reducing such incidents. The government is actively conducting awareness campaigns to discourage stubble burning and is also incentivizing farmers with an amount of Rs 1000 per acre for practicing proper stubble management and refraining from burning crop residue.



Cricket great Bishan Singh Bedi dies at 77



NEW DELHI: Indian cricket great Bishan Singh Bedi breathed his last at the age of 77 after a prolonged illness. Bishan Singh Bedi was a left-arm spinner who also captained the Indian team in 22 matches. Bedi was an active cricketer from 1967 to 1979, featuring for India in 67 Tests, taking 266 wickets. He also played for India in 10 ODIs, bagging a total of 7 wickets. Widely considered as one of the finest spinners India have had, Bedi was among the architects of India's spin bowling revolution. He, along with Erapalli Prasanna, BS Chandrasekhar, and S. Venkataraghavan, played an important role in India's first-ever ODI victory. Bedi's figures of 12-8-6-1 held East Africa to 120 runs in 1975 World Cup. In domestic cricket, Bedi primarily played for the Delhi team.

Third humanitarian aid convoy enters Gaza

GAZA BORDER : A third fleet of vehicles carrying essential aid made its way into Gaza through the Rafah crossing with Egypt, as reported by CNN. Gaza, home to over 2 million civilians, faces the ongoing threat of severe dehydration and starvation due to Israel's persistent bombardment and complete blockade. Over the weekend, on Saturday and Sunday, a total of 34 trucks transported much-needed supplies, including food, water, medications, and medical equipment from Egypt to Gaza via the same crossing. The convoy on Sunday underwent additional security inspections, as confirmed by a security official speaking to CNN. Despite these efforts, human rights organisations have expressed concerns that insufficient aid has reached the Palestinian enclave.

Punjab police bust international drug smuggling racket; 12-kg heroin seized

In a big blow to trans-border narcotic network amidst the ongoing war against drugs waged on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Punjab Police have busted a cross-border drug smuggling racket being operated by USA-based smuggler Sarwan Singh with the arrest of one person after recovering 12Kg heroin from his possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav here on Monday.

Notably, Sarwan Singh, who is carrying Rs 2 lakh reward on his arrest, is a brother of infamous drug smuggler Ranjeet alias Cheeta and is wanted in a 532-kg Heroin haul case, in which the latter was arrested in May 2020. Ranjit Cheeta was the mastermind behind the smuggling of 532 packets of heroin which were seized by Customs department at ICP Attari in July 2019 and is being investigated by the NIA.

The arrested drug smuggler has been identified as Rahul of Naraingarh in Amritsar. Apart from seizing heroin, Police teams have also impounded his Honda Amaze car, in which he was travelling.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that following intel inputs that associates of Sarwan



Singh have retrieved the heroin consignment dropped via drone and they are going to deliver it to someone, State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) Amritsar conducted a special police checking in the city area of Amritsar, and arrested the accused Rahul after recovering 12 packets of heroin, weighing 1kg each, from his Honda Amaze car.

The DGP said that as per preliminary investigations, the accused person was directly in touch with USA-based smuggler Sarwan Singh and was supplying heroin across the state after importing it from Pakistan. Sharing more details, AIG SSOC Amritsar Sukhminder Singh Mann said that further investigations are being conducted to probe the backward and forward linkages and unearth the whole network of drug suppliers, dealers and their buyers.

Anil Vij issues instructions to suspend 372 investigating officers

Haryana Home Minister Sh. Anil Vij today again took a tough stance in public interest and issued instructions to suspend 372 Investigating Officers (IOs). Sh. Vij has written a letter to the Director General of Police in this regard today. He said that in this context, information was also sought by writing a letter to the Additional Chief Secretary of the Home Department on May 11, 2023. He informed that 372 investigating officers (IOs) have been suspended in various districts of the state. Among them, there are 60 IOs in Gurugram, Faridabad 32, Panchkula 10, Ambala 30, Yamunanagar 57, Karnal 31, Panipat 3, Hisar 14, Sirsa 66, Jind 24, Rewari 5, Rohtak 31 and 9 in Sonapat. According to the letter written to the Director General of Police, Sh. Vij has



said that "I asked many times for early disposal of the FIRs registered in the state. Last month, I ordered that explanation be sought from all IOs who have not finalized/dispensed of the FIRs in a year. The number of cases were very high which is almost above 3229. He said in the letter

addressed to DGP, that "I am pained to know that despite my instruction, still 372 IOs are those who have not finally disposed of the cases and reason quoted by them are not satisfactory. They are making people to move from one pillar to another for getting action on their complaints. This is a very

serious matter and cannot be ignored". Home said in the letter that "I would like that all these Investigating Officers be put under suspension immediately and their cases be transferred to respective DSPs for final disposal in a month, otherwise action will be taken against those officers also.

Free ambulance service for women in Ladwa

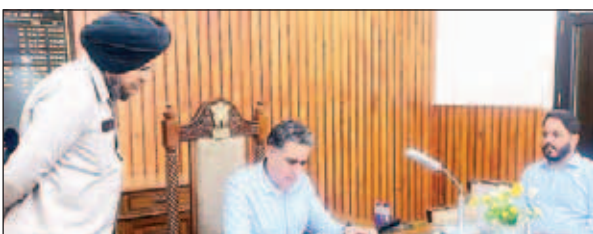

for appointment letters

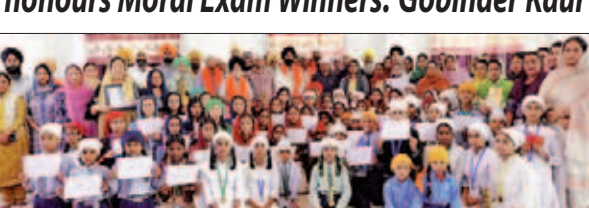

Old’s still gold

My grandfather’s favourite story was the ‘Old man and the marriage procession’. In this tale, a marriage ceremony was to take place, but the condition imposed by the bride’s family was that no old person should accompany the procession to the bride’s home. However, an old man accompanies the procession to the bridal home. He helps the members of the procession meet the challenging conditions laid down by the bride’s family — each member, for instance, was to eat a hundred melons — and the marriage is eventually solemnised with the old man being given all the honours. The moral of the story is that one cannot discount experience over youth.

This holds true for the workplace too. We have a statutory age for retirement in the government and the public sector and a cooling-off period for some services prior to taking up commercial employment after retirement. However, post retirement, most people sit at home. According to a report by the Seventh Central Pay Commission, there were 8.67 lakh personnel (26%) in the age bracket of 40-50 years and 9.48 lakh personnel (29%) in the age bracket of 50-60 years as on January 1, 2014, of which approximately 3% are in Group A. Therefore, around 26,000 Grade A officers will be retiring by 2024-25. As per the Public Enterprises Survey 2020-2021 report, there are 2.31 lakh executives in public sector enterprises and assuming the direction of CPC data, it can be estimated — conservatively — that 25%-26% of them will be retiring in the next 10 years.

We, therefore, have a pool of experienced scientists, engineers, geophysicists, statisticians, business analysts, project managers, administrators and others available year on year, each having an average of 35 years of experience and a residual working life of 15 years, for the taking with only marginal adaptation investment. There are elderly people who want to contribute to society. They rely on friends and associates to look for employment after their retirement. A few manage the transition successfully, but most are left unemployed.

The defence services have a Directorate General Resettlement for the purpose of registering for re-employment with an age bar. There is also the employment exchange to connect job-seekers with employers, but these are largely limited to government jobs.

A portal named SACRED — Senior Able Citizens for Re-Employment in Dignity — was launched by the ministry of social justice and empowerment on October 1, 2021, but has low footfall.

Nawaz Sharif’s return to Pakistan ignites hope for his party

Three-time former Pakistan Prime Minister and Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supremo Nawaz Sharif’s return to his home country after four years of exile has boosted the political fortunes of his party, The Geo News reported on Monday.

The Pakistan-based media outlet reported quoting a snap poll conducted by Gallup Pakistan, in which the organisation used a phone survey methodology on the next day of the Nawaz speech at Minar-e-Pakistan.

The snap poll included eight key findings: Firstly, as many as 75% of the country’s adults said they had heard or read about Nawaz Sharif’s return to Pakistan.

Secondly, one in three adults said they listened to the speech given by Nawaz Sharif, which totals almost 40 million men and women from across the country who heard the speech, The Geo News reported.

Thirdly, 80% of those who heard Nawaz’s speech said they liked the speech, while 12% said they did not like the speech, and only 7% said they had mixed feelings.

Fourth, 50% of respondents said Nawaz’s return to Pakistan would bode well for the country and countrymen, while 14% said it would bode ill for Pakistan, and 18% showed indifference and said his return would have no impact on the common man’s life, while 18 refrained from commenting on this.

Fifth, 51% believed Nawaz’s return to Pakistan would help PML-N win the next elections, while 22% said it was premature to comment on this and, therefore, they did not respond to the question. In addition, 26% believed that it would harm the PML-N or make no difference.



Sixth, reconciliation and avoidance of confrontation received resounding approval from respondents, as 70% agreed that Nawaz should work together with all political leaders, including Imran Khan, to take the country forward and should avoid confrontation with the PTI chief. Seventh, almost four in 10 respondents believed that Nawaz Sharif’s return to Pakistan was part of a certain deal. A high of 34% believed that they did not know if there was a deal or not, while 27% disagreed that his arrival was part of some sort of a deal. Lastly, when asked which leader had the ability to steer the country out of current economic

crisis, 30% named Nawaz Sharif, while 22% believed Imran Khan had the ability to rid the country of the incumbent crisis.

It is significant to note that 30% believe that no political leader has the ability to pull the country out of the current economic crisis.

Notably, PPP Chairman Bilawal Bhutto was the third choice, with 4% saying he could get Pakistan out of the economic crisis. The question was asked open-ended, and the results obtained were then compiled.

Electric hair styling appliances can cause burns

Electronic hair styling products, such as curling irons, are a common cause of burn injuries in the US homes, particularly among young children, according to research presented at the 2023 AAP National Conference & Exhibition at the Walter E Washington Convention Centre.

The authors of the abstract, 'Burn Injuries in Children from Hair Styling Tools Presenting to United States Emergency Departments, 2013-2022: Beauty is More Than Skin Deep,' looked at data from the National Electronic Injury Surveillance System database on emergency department visits involving hair styling equipment for patients aged 24 and younger. Between 2013 and 2022, there are expected to be 30,839 burn injuries from hair styling equipment and 1,050 emergency room visits, according to the study. Curling irons and hair curlers were responsible for 97.4 per cent of reported burn injuries.

"Hair styling tools are a timeless piece of our everyday routine, helping to create the picture-perfect look. Yet they have the greatest propensity to create a not-so-picture-perfect accident when not handled with care," said CPT Brandon L Rozanski, MD, lead author and pediatric resident at Tripler Army Medical Center.

"Electric hair styling tools can reach temperatures as high as 450 degrees Fahrenheit in a matter of minutes, creating potential situations of unintentional burn injury for both the device user and



surrounding bystanders." Of those hospital emergency department encounters studied, 68 per cent of the injured subjects were age 10 or younger and 65.1 per cent were female. Almost three-quarters of these injuries occurred within the home, and 98.6 per cent did not require hospital stays or require any other escalation of care. "This study demonstrated that children have the greatest propensity to present to the emergency department with burn injuries sustained from hair styling tools," CPT Rozanski said. "Using this information, clinicians have a unique opportunity to provide targeted anticipatory guidance to educate families on the hazard surrounding everyday use of electric hair styling tools in addition to stressing age-appropriate use with and without parental supervision."

Philippines summons Chinese envoy over "provocative actions" in South China Sea



The Philippines summoned the Chinese ambassador on Monday after two near collisions between Chinese and Filipino ships over the weekend in the disputed South China Sea, local media reported. The Philippine Daily Inquirer reported today that the country’s Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) had summoned Chinese envoy after Chinese vessels hit a resupply boat contracted by the Philippines armed forces and a Philippine coast guard ship in the Spratly Islands chain in the West Philippine Sea on October 22 morning.

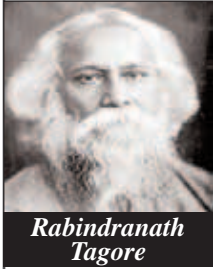
The incidents took place near Second Thomas Shoal, which lies within Manila’s Exclusive Economic Zone (EEZ), as the Philippines tried to resupply sailors on the Sierra Madre, the navy transport ship that Manila grounded on the Second Thomas Shoal in 1999 and manned it with Filipino

marines to enforce the Philippines claims to the area. Jonathan Malaya, a spokesperson for the Philippines National Security Council, told a press conference on Monday that one of the Philippines’s boats was damaged in the incident. China’s move was "provocative, irresponsible and illegal" and "imperiled the safety of the crew" of the Philippine boats, the National Task Force for the West Philippine Sea said as reported by CNN. President Ferdinand Marcos Jr has directed the Philippine Coast Guard to investigate the collision between Chinese and Philippine vessels in Second Thomas Shoal also known as the Ayungin Shoal, the Inquirer reported. The newspaper cited a statement from Marcos’s office that said the Philippine president led a Command Conference to address "the new wave of Chinese aggression in the West Philippine Sea."

Researchers evaluate biological risk posed by dirt on external surfaces of sea freight

Invasive alien species, which are often mistakenly introduced by human activities, can outcompete and overwhelm native flora and fauna, driving species to extinction and disrupting ecosystem balance.

Understanding why they settle in new regions and how they got there in the first place is crucial if we are to lessen the harmful effects of their presence. Unfortunately, not enough research has been conducted on this topic, and the answers may not always be evident.

Research and Better Border Biosecurity (B3) research team evaluated the biological risk posed by dirt on the external surfaces of sea freight such as shipping containers or used machinery at New Zealand seaports.

The researchers expected that their study would make it easier to analyse the relative biosecurity hazards of alternative introduction paths and contribute to the creation of more effective countermeasures. The study discovered dirt on most forms of sea freight, regardless of origin, with all soil potentially carrying bacteria, including plant diseases. The



amount of dirt recovered from a single marine container was 5.3 kg, while the overall mean weight of sea freight collected was 417g, with the majority of the soil located on the underside of sea freight.

"While the presence of soil is perhaps not surprising, the presence of live bacteria, fungi, worms, seeds and insects associated with the soil was of greater concern. Various regulated biosecurity organisms were recovered from the samples, including plant-parasitic worms, seeds, insects and spiders that were not recorded as being present in New Zealand," says Mark McNeill of AgResearch, who led the study. "Not only does the spread of exotic species through these networks represent significant environmental, economic and social costs to natural and agricultural environments if invasive alien species were to establish, a loss of biodiversity is also an expected consequence of invasive alien species establishment. For islands, the implications can be significant, as they have high levels of endemism and invasive alien species establishment can lead to the extinction of

species as well as biodiversity declines," the researchers write in their paper, which was published in the open-access journal NeoBiota.

Compared to a previous study on contaminated footwear carried in luggage by international airline passengers, the number and diversity in soil on sea freight was smaller than soil transported in more protected environments (e.g., footwear in luggage). This showed that biosecurity risk can vary with pathway.

However, prioritising one soil pathway over another according to the risks they present, and differentially allocating resources is problematic, because the relative risk is dynamic, dictated by factors such as new pests or diseases entering the respective pathways.

Even so, the researchers suggest that contaminated sea freight is an important introduction pathway for exotic species. The establishment of such species can be prevented by cleaning containers prior to departure, inspection at the border, and further cleaning where required.

Drone from Pakistan

Mayor Renu Bala Gupta on Monday inaugurated two development works in Chand Sarai and Mangal Colony of Ward No. 6 of the city. Councillor representative Rajendra Sirsi, junior engineer Deepak and colony residents were present on this occasion. Giving information about the development works, the Mayor said that special repairs will be done to about 17 small streets in Chand Sarai. As per need, new interlocking paver block tiles will also be installed at some places. He said that work will also be done to pave another small lane adjacent to it. He said that about 700 feet long drains will also be constructed in these streets so that rainwater can be drained. An estimated Rs 9.5 lakh will be spent on this work. A target has been set to complete the construction work in the next 3 months.
