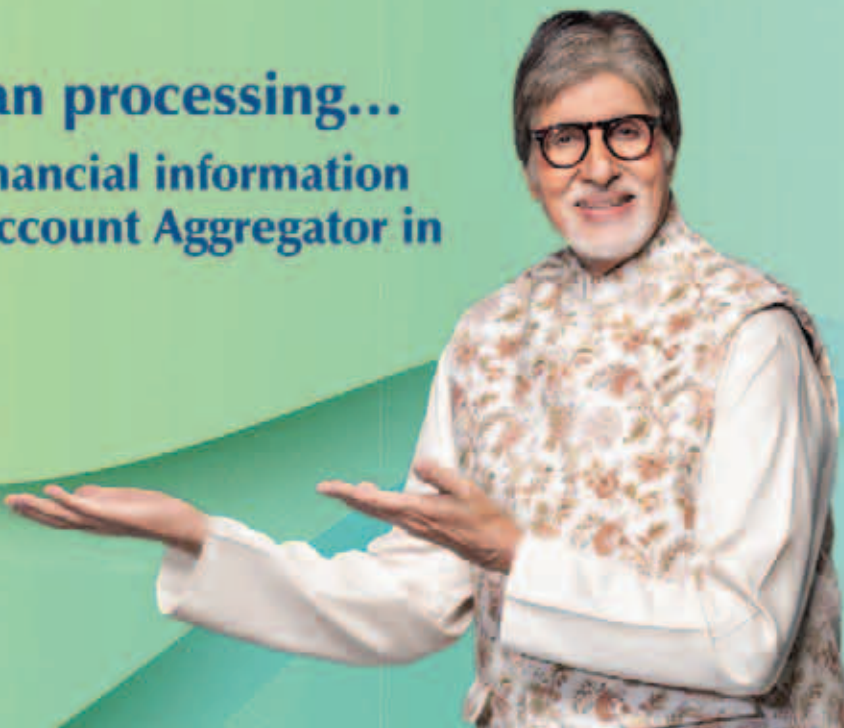

Amit Shah launches five Antyodaya Upliftment schemes in Haryana

In the ongoing efforts of the Haryana Government for the upliftment of Antyodaya (the most vulnerable) families, a new chapter was added today when Union Home and Cooperation Minister, Sh. Amit Shah inaugurated new schemes initiated by the Haryana Government for Antyodaya upliftment in the presence of Chief Minister Shri Manohar Lal.

During the Antyodaya Mahasammelan organized in Karnal district today, the Union Home Minister inaugurated 5 key new welfare schemes. The Haryana government, under the leadership of the Double Engine government, is making relentless efforts to provide health facilities to the citizens. Under the Central Government's Ayushman Bharat - Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana, 15 lakh families in Haryana receive free annual treatment of up to 5 lakh rupees.

Additionally, the Haryana government's Chirayu Scheme has already benefited approximately 11 lakh families. Today, the Union Home Minister after inaugurating this scheme has included 14 lakh new families in this scheme. Combining the schemes of the central and state governments, nearly 40 lakh Antyodaya families in Haryana can avail the benefits of the Ayushman Bharat - Chirayu Scheme. Furthermore, this scheme also includes around 38,000 families with an annual income ranging from Rs. 1.80 lakh to Rs. 3 lakh. The Haryana



Income Growth Board has been constituted to increase the income of Antyodaya families in Haryana. This Board will oversee and review the schemes run by the state government for Antyodaya families. Moreover, the board will also create new schemes to increase income and ensure their effective implementation.

The Union Home Minister also inaugurated the Haryana Antyodaya Parivar Parivahan Yojana (HAPPY). Under this scheme, families with an annual income of less than Rs. 1 lakh and with three or more members will receive the benefit of free travel on Haryana Roadways buses for up to 1000 kilometres per year.

Social security pension hiked to Rs 3000

KARNAL: Making a key announcement during this grand event symbolising the government's dedication to uplifting the underprivileged, Chief Minister, Manohar Lal said that from January 1, 2024, beneficiaries of social pensions in the state will receive a monthly pension of Rs.3,000, a significant increase from the current Rs. 2,750. On this occasion, the Chief Minister also expressed gratitude and welcomed the Union Home and Cooperation Minister, Sh. Amit Shah for attending the function as the Chief Guest. Addressing the gathering, Sh. Manohar Lal also stressed on the nine years of the Haryana government's governance, emphasizing the pivotal role played in shaping the state's progress. With a resolute spirit, he shared the pivotal schemes tailored for the down-trodden - the marginalized, the labourers, the farmers, and small-scale traders, whose annual income barely sustains their livelihoods.

Kejriwal skips ED summons, tells probe agency to take back notice

Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal will not go to the Enforcement Directorate's office today for giving his statement on the Delhi liquor policy case, sources said. Mr Kejriwal was scheduled to appear before the central probe agency's Delhi office at 11 am, but he wrote a letter to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) asking to take back the summons to him, calling it "illegal and politically motivated".

The ED is likely to issue fresh summons to Mr Kejriwal, who is going to Madhya Pradesh to campaign for the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) ahead of the state election.

A person can skip ED summons a maximum of three times, after which the ED can get a non-bailable warrant. The ED can also issue summons under the stringent Prevention of Money Laundering Act, or PMLA.

Mr Kejriwal, meantime, has the option to request for a pre-arrest bail and challenge the summons in court.

The ED's notice is "illegal and politically motivated, sent at the behest of the BJP," Mr Kejriwal said in the letter, asking the same central probe agency that arrested his former deputy Manish



Sisodia to "take back the notice immediately".

"The said summons does not specify whether I am being summoned as an individual or in my official capacity as Chief Minister of Delhi or as National Convenor of AAP and appears to be in the nature of a fishing and roving inquiry," Mr Kejriwal said in the two-page letter to the ED.

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has also alleged the centre wants to arrest Mr Kejriwal in a politically motivated case.

The ED's case against the AAP leaders got more wind in the sails after the Supreme Court rejected Mr Sisodia's bail request over a money trail of ₹ 338 crore, which the court said has been tentatively established.

This money is said to be the earnings of private parties who got liquor licence under the now-scraped policy.

Delhi court sends Prabir Purkayastha, Chakravarty to 30 days of judicial custody

NEW DELHI: The Patiala House Court of Delhi on Thursday sent NewsClick's Founder and Editor-in-Chief, Prabir Purkayastha, and HR head, Amit Chakravarty, to judicial custody for 30 days.

They were arrested last month by Delhi Police in a case filed under the anti-terror law, the Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) following allegations that news portal NewsClick received huge money for pro-China propaganda.

The Additional Sessions Judge Dr Hardeep Kaur allowed the Delhi Police application and sent Prabir and Amit Chakravarty to Judicial custody till December 1, 2023.

Prabir and Amit Chakravarty were on Thursday produced after the end of their police custody period. They were earlier sent to 9 days of police custody by the same court.

On the last date of the hearing, Delhi Police said that their custodial interrogation was required to confront them with some protected witnesses and also some devices were examined and the data extracted. Prabir's Lawyer Arshdeep Singh Khurana while opposing Delhi Police's plea for custodial remand stated, "They have to show what have they unearthed, and what have they found! They should at least tell the court."

Congress busy with state polls not keen on INDIA bloc : Nitish's dig at party

Taking a dig at INDIA ally, Congress, Janata Dal-United (JDU) leader and Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Thursday said that the Congress was "busy with the state assembly elections" in five states and not very keen on taking the INDIA bloc forward.

While addressing the Communist Party of India's (CPI) 'BJP Hatao, Desh Bachao' rally in Patna, CM Nitish Kumar said, "Yes, we constituted an Alliance but

the work to strengthen it are not actively happening right now. Elections are about to happen in five states and the Congress party is more interested in that it seems. We all were working together to help strengthen the Congress party and take it forward but they don't seem to be as keen. Congress is busy with the assembly polls in five states now."

Nitish Kumar asserted that the bloc won't stop the fight for the country and added that the meetings of the coalition will resume once the elections in five states are over.



"Life has truly come full circle": Tendulkar after unveiling of his statue at Wankhede

Legendary Indian cricketer Sachin Tendulkar on Thursday expressed happiness at his statue being unveiled at Wankhede Stadium, saying that life has come full circle for him, recalling the days as a child when he sneaked into the stadium.

Sachin took to X to express his happiness. He dedicated the statue to everyone who was a part of his journey as a cricketer.

"This photo has a very special place in my heart. From being a 10-year-old boy who was sneaked into the North Stand with only 24 tickets for 25 eager fans, to having my statue unveiled at the iconic Wankhede, life has truly come full circle. I still remember our joyous chants, the camaraderie of that group, and the over-



whelming support of the @NorthStandGang over the years. To think that I first stepped foot in Wankhede as a fan, then went on to be the ball boy in the '87 World Cup, lifted the 2011 World Cup, and played my last international game here - it is a journey words can't capture. This statue isn't just mine. It is a dedication to every non-striker, my cricket heroes, every teammate, every colleague, who stood by my side, for without them, this journey wouldn't have been possible. Wankhede, and cricket, you've been very kind," tweeted Sachin on X. Sachin Tendulkar's life-sized statue was unveiled at the Wankhede Stadium on the eve of India's World Cup clash against Sri Lanka on Wednesday. Filthy Questions, says Mahua Moitra on panel meet

NEW DELHI: Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra and Opposition MPs walked out of the parliamentary ethics committee meeting on the cash-for-query matter, questioning the way the meeting was conducted. The Opposition MPs said the committee asked "personal and unethical questions" to Ms Moitra, and one of the MPs leaked details of the meeting to the media while it was going on.

"What kind of meeting was this? They are asking all kinds of filthy questions," Ms Moitra, visibly upset, told reporters as she and the Opposition MPs stormed out of the room. "They are picking on anything. Talking any rubbish. 'You have tears in your eyes', they said. Do I have tears in my eyes, you see tears?" Ms Moitra said as she put her hands on her cheeks.

Another Opposition MP said "it was too much" when a reporter asked why they left the meeting.

Earlier, in her statement to the committee, Ms Moitra said a "sour personal relationship" motivated the filing of the complaint over alleged cash-for-query against her. The flare-up apparently happened during her cross-examination after lunch. Ms Moitra has called Supreme Court



lawyer Jai Anant Dehadrai, who filed the complaint with the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), her "jilted ex".

A large part of her deposition before the committee was about her relationship with Mr Dehadrai as she appeared to blame him for leaks and the allegations, sources said.

BJP MP VD Sharma told her to respond to the substantive part of the allegations and not make it all about personal relationship going bad.

Though Ms Moitra has refuted the cash-for-query allegations, she admitted to giving her parliamentary login ID to businessman Darshan Hiranandani.

The ethics committee summoned her on the basis of reports received from three ministries along with documents and evidences. The BJP had raised national security concerns over the sharing of her official login credentials.

Financial assistance being given for rented accommodation to disaster-affected families

A spokesperson of the State Government said here today that the government was providing all possible assistance to the disaster-affected families in the state. An amount of Rs. 74.25 lakh was being provided as house rent to around 246 families till now, who were rendered completely homeless due to the disaster which shook many parts of the State during the monsoons. He said that 55 affected families were being provided house rent in both urban and rural areas in district Bilaspur which includes 44 families in Ghumarwin, nine families in Jhandutta and two in Bilaspur. Nirmala Devi, a resident of Jhandutta, said that her house was damaged by the disaster rendering her family homeless and she had no place to live. In the hour of distress the state government made arrangements for her family to



stay in a relief camp and now she has been shifted to a rented house. She apprised that the state government was providing her family a financial assistance of Rs. 5000 per month to pay the house rent. Along with this, free LPG connection and ration was also being provided free of cost by the State Government, she added. The same tale is told by Suresh Kumar of Bilaspur, who has admitted that a sum of Rs. 5000 was being given to him. He said that 73 families who were

staying in relief camps in Kangra district has shifted to rented accommodation, out of which 7 families are from Kangra sub-division, 13 from Jawali, 24 Nurpur, 11 from Dheera and 18 families are from Jwalamukhi sub-division. The state government was going to provide assistance of Rs. 21.90 lakh to these families as house rent, he added. In Mandi district, house rent worth Rs 35.40 was being provided to 118 families. This includes 13 families in

Thunag sub-division, 75 in Sarkaghat 10 in Dharampur, eight in Balichowki, nine in Jogindernagar and three families in Gohar sub-division. Similarly, the families who have been completely rendered homeless in other districts and were staying in rented accommodation were also being provided financial assistance as per the fixed norms of Rs. 5,000 per month in rural areas and Rs. 10,000 in urban areas, stated the spokesperson. Revenue Minister Jagat Singh Negi said that those families, whose houses have been completely destroyed in the rain fury during the monsoons, and those who have not applied for or opted for shifting to rented accommodation can also apply for the same. He said that the State Government under the leadership of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu had declared a special relief package of Rs 4500 crore to provide all possible assistance to the disaster-affected families.

Body of Polish pilot who went missing ten-days ago recovered

The body of 74-year-old Polish pilot Andre Kulawik Solo, who went missing in the hills of Dhauladhar 10 days ago after taking off from Bir Billing, was taken out from a deep ditch on Thursday and brought to Dharamshala after much effort. For the past several days, rescue teams were busy searching for pilot Andre Kulavik. Although the body of pilot Andre Kulavik was discovered, there were many difficulties in removing his body as it had fallen into a deep ditch. On Thursday, the body of pilot Andre Kulavik was finally taken out. Let us tell you that the Polish pilot had taken off from Billing last Monday and while going to Dharamshala, lost his way and fell on the upper hills of Triund. These hills above Triund have minus degree temperature due to snow and it was very difficult to reach this place. The dead body was lying 600 meters below Kundali Jhot, which was recovered with the help of two units of the Indian Army, NDRF and some mountaineers. Giving information, Kangra district SP Shalini Agnihotri said that late on Wednesday evening, a team of Indian Army and NDRF had set up a base camp four kilometers away from the accident site and the body of the Polish pilot was taken out. This operation went on for a long time in which the rescue team also had to face a lot of problems. The rescue team had been carrying out an operation in Kareeri, Shahpur for a long time, in which two helicopters were also used, but it was not successful.

As per this facility, the identity of a person is established through face authentication techniqueand DLC gets generated. This breakthrough technology, launched in November 2021, reduced the dependence of pensioners on external bio-metric devices and made the process more accessible and affordable to masses by leveraging

smartphone-based technology. With a view to spread awareness amongst all the Central Government pensioners as well as the Pension Disbursing Authorities for use of DLC/Face Authentication technology to submit Digital Life Certificate, DoPPW launched a nation-wide campaign in the month of November 2022 in 37 cities through-out the country. The Campaign was a huge success with more than 35 lakh DLCs of Central Government Pensioner issued. A Nation-wide Campaign is being held from 1st to 30th November, 2023 in 500 locations in 100 cities across the country, targeting 50 lakh pensioners in collaboration of 17 Pension disbursing banks, Ministries/ Departments, Pensioners' Welfare Association, UIDAI, MeitY. With a view to ensure that the benefit of digital modes of Life Certificate submission reaches pensioners in the remotest corners of the country and

Taming the AI genie

A heated debate concerning the regulation of Artificial Intelligence has been ignited in the midst of the ongoing evolution of AI technology. While the United States of America and European nations are moving towards implementing stringent AI regulations, the Indian government has adopted a different stance. India has chosen not to enforce AI laws at this juncture with the intention of positioning itself as a global leader in AI and capitalising on AI's potential for effective governance.

The rationale behind avoiding strict regulations stems from the concern that such regulations could stifle innovation in India's rapidly growing AI sector. While critics argue that regulations are necessary to mitigate the potential threats posed by AI technologies, proponents of the non-regulatory approach underline the importance of fostering innovation and embracing market mechanisms to drive AI development.

Mechanisms responsible for AI development are already in progress in India. Ethical concerns surrounding AI are being addressed through the National Strategy for Artificial Intelligence. AI raises three major ethical concerns: first, privacy and surveillance; second, bias and discrimination; third, and perhaps the most difficult, is the role of human judgment. The NSAI emphasises the crucial importance of safeguarding the privacy and security of data, especially personal information. It also draws attention to the existing lack of formal regulations concerning privacy and security, advocating for their development. On 'bias and discrimination', the NSAI has identified various cognitive biases in AI that tend to be prejudicial towards certain groups across religion, race, caste, gender, and genetic diversity. As for the 'role of human judgment', the NSAI proposes that since AI systems are created and trained by humans using real-world data, there's a possibility that human biases might be incorporated into the decision-making process. Public sentiment regarding AI is largely positive in India. The nation has high contribution rates to AI projects. This underscores the enthusiasm and the potential for AI-driven growth in the country. However, the need for caution is apparent due to the inherent risks associated with AI technologies. As AI technology continues to advance, it is imperative to adopt a proactive but balanced regulatory approach.

India's approach to AI regulation is a reflection of the delicate balance between encouraging innovation and addressing potential risks. While the absence of strict regulations has sparked concerns about unchecked development, it also reflects the Indian government's confidence in the potential benefits of AI for its citizens and the economy.

Canada plans to maintain immigration levels at 500,000 per year



Canadian government has announced that it is aiming to maintain its target of welcoming 5,00,000 new permanent residents in 2026, reported CBC News.

Canadian Immigration Minister Marc Miller said that the target is meant to support the labour supply while easing pressures on housing and health care. "What Canadians are telling us, what economists are telling us, is that we have to dive into the micro-economic impacts of immigration," Miller said in a press conference.

According to CBC News, the Canadian government has steadily increased its immigration targets in recent years to boost the workforce and support an ageing popu-

lation. Last year, Canada released a plan to grant permanent residency to 465,000 people in 2023, and it was set to rise to 500,000 by 2025. However, the immigration target for 2015 was under 300,000, reported CBC News.

Miller further emphasized that Canada is now levelling off its planned immigration intake to see what all sorts of adjustments can be made to Canada's immigration programs.

"Those numbers were needed but now we have to take a look at them, where we feel they're reasonable and plateauing in a space where we think it makes sense," he said. "We have a lot of complex calculations that we need to make and measures

we need to adjust. I think it's sometimes politically convenient to come out with a hammer-type approach... It's more on the level of finer surgery that we need to adjust," he added.

Reportedly, Canada's population grew by a record one million people in 2022, and surpassed the 40 million mark earlier this year, according to CBC News. The population growth has come at the same time when the country is also facing a housing shortage. Notably, almost 5.8 million new units will have to be built by the end of the decade in order to fix the housing supply, the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation said in a report released in September. However, Miller ad-

mitted the housing shortage was a factor in the decision to level off immigration targets, adding that, although it was not the main factor, CBC News reported.

"If that were the sole reason, it would totally be misunderstanding the challenges I think we're facing as a country," he said.

Miller further stressed that Canada will need to maintain immigration levels, to provide the workers who can build houses.

Earlier this year, the government announced changes to the express entry system that would prioritize tradespeople for permanent residency.

Miller noted that those changes have attracted roughly 1,500 tradespeople from abroad, CBC News reported.

Meanwhile, a political science professor, Phil Triadafilopoulos, who has a specialization at the University of Toronto, said that high levels of immigration will still put pressure on the housing market.

"I don't know whether pausing at a historically high level of immigration is really going to do much to ease affordability issues around housing," he said.

"Those pressures are going to persist, I think."

Moreover, according to the new plan, Canada's target for economic immigrants is holding steady at 60 per cent of total immigration. Goldy Hyder, president and CEO of the Business Council of Canada, said the government should boost that portion to 65 per cent.

"Unfilled job openings for highly skilled and educated professionals remain stubbornly high. If not addressed with urgency and ambition, this shortage of leading talent will have a large and lasting impact on Canadian technological innovation, labour productivity and capital investment," he said.

Research reveals positive messages can mitigate harm from objectified fitness posts



According to a Washington State University study, a few words of body appreciation can help overcome the detrimental impact of viewing objectified photographs of female fitness influencers.

While fitness influencers say they want to inspire good physical health, research has found that their social media posts often inspire negative mental health, especially among younger women. The WSU experimental study, published in the journal Health Communication, revealed that the negative impact of idealized Instagram images may be offset with something as simple as a caption with a body appreciation message, like "Love your body. See what it can do." This type of message appeared to boost viewers' self-compassion and appreciation of their own bodies - at

least in the short term. "These captions could serve as a protective factor," said Jessica Willoughby, the study's senior author and associate professor in WSU's Murrow College of Communication. "This is something that's really small, just a couple of comments, that influencers could be putting on their posts."

The findings also point to other possible interventions, Willoughby said. For instance, health communicators could make sure that young women who regularly view this type of content also see other posts reminding them to think about their bodies in positive ways.

For this study, Willoughby and first author WSU Ph.D. candidate Leticia Couto had 200 college-age women view different sets of manipulated Instagram posts from real fitness influencers who have millions of followers.

Specific gut bacteria raise risk of severe malaria: Research

Researchers at Indiana University School of Medicine have found many types of bacteria that, when present in the stomach, are associated with an elevated risk of getting severe malaria in humans and mice. Their findings, which were recently published in Nature Communications, could pave the way for the development of novel methods aimed at gut bacteria in order to prevent severe malaria and

its related mortality. Malaria is a life-threatening infectious disease caused by parasites transmitted through the bite of infected mosquitoes. According to the World Health Organization's latest World Malaria Report, an estimated 619,000 people died from malaria globally in 2021, with 76% of those deaths occurring in children age 5 or younger.

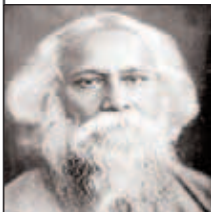


IU School of Medicine's Nathan Schmidt, PhD, an associate professor of pediatrics with the Ryan White Center for Pediatric Infectious Disease and Global Health and the Herman B Wells Center for Pediatric Research, said previous efforts to combat the disease have led to several advancements in malaria treatment and prevention, including new vaccines and antimalarial drugs, insecticides to manage mosquito populations and improved health care processes. However, he said new developments are desperately needed because the gains made in decreasing malaria-related deaths between the early 2000s and late 2010s have plateaued over the last five years. "This plateau highlights the need for novel approaches to prevent malaria-related fatalities," said Schmidt, whose research lab is focused on investigating this global health crisis and its critical impact on children.

Research reveals how adults understand what kids are saying

When babies first start talking, their vocabulary is extremely limited. One of the first sounds babies make is "da," which could mean dad, a dog, a dot, or nothing at all.

How does an adult listener make sense of this limited verbal repertoire? A new study from MIT and Harvard University researchers has found that adults' understanding of conversational context and knowledge of mispronunciations that children commonly make are critical to the ability to understand children's early linguistic efforts.

Using thousands of hours of transcribed audio recordings of children and adults interacting, the research team created computational models that let them start to reverse engineer how adults interpret what small children are saying. Models based on only the actual sounds children produced in their speech did a relatively poor job predicting what adults thought children said. The most successful models made their predictions based on large swaths of preceding conversations that provided context for what the children were saying. The models also performed better when they were retrained on large datasets of adults and children interacting. The findings suggest that adults are highly skilled at making these context-based interpretations, which may provide crucial feedback that helps babies acquire language, the



researchers say. "An adult with lots of listening experience is bringing to bear extremely sophisticated mechanisms of language understanding, and that is clearly what underlies the ability to understand what young children say," says Roger Levy, a professor of brain and cognitive sciences at MIT. "At this point, we don't have direct evidence that those

mechanisms are directly facilitating the bootstrapping of language acquisition in young children, but I think it's plausible to hypothesize that they are making the bootstrapping more effective and smoothing the path to successful language acquisition by children."

Levy and Erika Bergelson, an associate professor of psychology at Harvard, are the senior authors of the study, which appears today in Nature Human Behavior. MIT post-doc Stephan Meylan is the lead author of the paper.

Adult listening skills are critical

While many studies have investigated how children learn to speak, in this project, the researchers wanted to flip the question and study how adults interpret what children say. "While people have looked historically at a number of features of the learner, and what is it about the child that allows them to learn things from the world, very little has been done to look at how they are understood and how that might influence the process of language acquisition," Meylan says. Previous research has shown that when adults speak to each other, they use their beliefs about how other people are likely to talk, and what they're likely to talk about, to help them understand what their conversational partner is saying. This strategy, known as "noisy channel listening," makes it easier for adults to handle the complex task

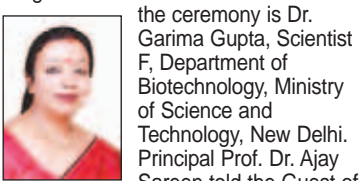
of deciphering the acoustic sounds they're hearing, especially in environments where voices are muffled or there is a lot of background noise, or when speakers have different accents. In this study, the researchers explored whether adults can also apply this technique to parsing the often seemingly nonsensical utterances produced by children who are learning to talk. "This problem of interpreting what we hear is even harder for child language than ordinary adult language understanding, which is actually not that easy either, even though we're very good at it," Levy says.

For this study, the researchers made use of datasets originally generated at Brown University in the early 2000s, which contain hundreds of hours of transcribed conversations between children ages 1 to 3 and their caregivers. The data include both phonetic transcriptions of the sounds produced by the children and the text of what the transcriber believed the child was trying to say. The researchers used other datasets of child language (which included about 18 million spoken words) to train computational language models to predict what words the children were saying in the original dataset, based on the phonetic transcription. Using neural networks, they created many different models, which varied in the sophistication of their knowledge of conversational topics, grammar, and children's mispronunciations.

Under PMAY benefits given to 791 beneficiaries in Karnal urban area: Gaurav Kumar

Municipal Corporation has been providing grant money for construction of houses to the eligible persons under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (PMAY) and is succeeded in it. Municipal Corporation's Additional Commissioner Gaurav Kumar said that under the scheme, 2134 applicants in Karnal urban area had filled the forms to receive the said amount. After investigation, 791 applicants were found eligible and were issued letters of intent. He informed that the first installment of grant of Rs 1 lakh (per person) was released and of these 737 persons started construction of houses. After this, the second installment of Rs 1 lakh was released to 629 persons while the construction was progressing and after this, the third installment of Rs 50,000 was also released to 476 persons on completion of the house construction. He told that under this scheme, the government gave a grant of Rs 2.5 lakh for construction of a new house and Rs 1.5 lakh for the addition in the house. Giving



information about the eligibility to receive the grant, he said that the applicant should have his own kutcha house or plot. No loan of any kind has been previously taken for house construction in the whole of India. The place where the house is proposed to be built should be an authorized area of the Municipal Corporation. The age of the beneficiary should be above 18 years and the applicant should be from economically weaker section in terms of income eligibility.

Body of young man from Siyana village found hanging in suspicious circumstances

MUMBAI: India dished out yet another ruthless show and demolished Sri Lanka by 302 runs at the Wankhede Stadium in Mumbai on Thursday. With this outcome, which is their seventh win in as many matches, India became the first nation to qualify for the semifinals. Half-centuries from Virat Kohli, Shubman Gill and Shreyas Iyer took India to a daunting total of 357/8 after being invited to bat first. After Rohit Sharma was dismissed



cheaply in the first over by Dilshan Madushanka, who went on to pick a five-wicket-haul, Kohli and Gill registered their respective half-centuries enroute to a brilliant partnership of 189 runs.

Madushanka broke the stand and denied both set batters their century after which Sri Lanka clawed back with the wickets of KL Rahul and Suryakumar Yadav. However, Iyer found some scintillating form and blasted a 56-ball 82 to ensure India crossed 300 before a couple of lusty blows from

Ravindra Jadeja in the end took the total over 350. Jasprit Bumrah then gave India a perfect start, striking in the first ball. Mohammed Siraj, who had picked 6/21 in the Asia Cup 2023 finals, then crashed the party and quickly added two scalps in the same over to reduce Sri Lanka to 3-4. Mohammed Shami, who is in terrific form, completed a five-wicket haul as the Lankan innings was wrapped in 19.4 overs.

South Africa make more history at Cricket World Cup

PUNE, NOV 2 (UNI) A rampant South Africa continue to shatter records with their big-hitting and huge totals, but the Proteas' attack has also set new benchmarks during an imperious run at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup. South Africa have looked like the strongest challengers to hosts India so far with six victories from seven matches to all but lock in their spot in the semi-finals at the Cricket World Cup. Much of this success has been powered by an explosive batting unit led by opener Quinton de Kock and a destructive middle-order that have combined for record-breaking totals, while pacer Marco Jansen has often ensured the opposition are on the ropes early in their chase. South Africa now hold the record for the most sixes clubbed by a team in one edition of a Men's Cricket World Cup, even with at least two - and as many as four - matches still to play, an ICC report said. The Proteas smashed 15 sixes in their comprehensive victory over New Zealand to now have 82 at the tournament from seven matches. South Africa have already passed the previous record of 76 that England hit in 11 matches on the way to their breakthrough Cricket World Cup title in 2019. West Indies held the record before that with 68 team sixes in 2015, while the all-conquering Australia outfit struck 67 in 2007. The five-time champions are on track to finish higher in this list during the current Cricket World Cup, after hitting 61 sixes in six matches so far and with at least

three more to play. All-rounder Marco Jansen made his mark early in the tournament with a quickfire 75* against England, but has done just as much damage with the ball while powering South Africa's fast starts. The left-arm quick has claimed 12 scalps during the Powerplay to ensure South Africa take command early in the opposition innings, to have more than double the next best bowler. Pace has proven to be the key weapon in the opening 10 overs with Sri Lanka's Dilshan Madushanka taking six wickets during the Powerplay, while Australia's Josh Hazlewood (five) is just ahead of India's Jasprit Bumrah, Pakistan's Shaheen Afridi and injured England quick Reece Topley (all four). Jansen struck twice in the Powerplay against New Zealand and finished with 3/31, to now have the equal-most wickets at the Cricket World Cup with Australia spinner Adam Zampa and Afridi also on 16. De Kock started the tournament with back-to-back tons against Sri Lanka and Australia, and has since added two more including 114 against New Zealand in another dominant display. The South Africa opener also has the highest individual score at this Cricket World Cup so far with 174 against Bangladesh. De Kock's four centuries are now equal-second for the most hundreds scored in a single edition of the showpiece event, alongside Sri Lanka's Kumar Sangakkara in 2015.

2. As an actor, what drew you to the role of Avinash, and what do you hope viewers will take away from this complex character when they watch the show?
