

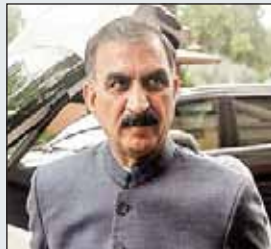

**Court extends judicial
custody of Manish
Sisodia till Dec 11**

NEW DELHI: The Rouse Avenue court on Tuesday extended till December 11, the judicial custody of former Delhi Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia in connection with an alleged excise policy scam. Hearing the matter at length the court noted that several documents are yet to be filed by the Enforcement Directorate for the accused persons. Meanwhile, the court expressed displeasure with the lawyers to complete the Section 207 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) compliance as soon as possible so that the trial could start of the matter. In February 2023, Sisodia was arrested by CBI for alleged irregularities in the framing and implementation of Delhi's new excise policy. The policy was withdrawn amid allegations of foul play by the Opposition. Sisodia is currently in judicial custody. According to the CBI, Sisodia had played the most important and vital role in the criminal conspiracy, and he had been deeply involved in the formulation as well as the implementation of the said policy to ensure the achievement of the objectives of the said conspiracy.

Tunnel collapse: First photo of trapped workers released

Their heads covered with hard hats, faces glistening with hope, 41 workers trapped in an Uttarakhand tunnel were seen this morning for the first time in 10 days after a landslide shut their exit route. A camera pushed through a six-inch pipe and walkie-talkies connected them to the scores of rescuers working overtime to bring them back.

Between the rescue teams and the trapped workers is debris about 40 metres thick. Drilling through this and bringing the workers home has been a tall challenge owing to a combination of factors, including the topography and the nature of soil in the Himalayan region.

Around 3.45 am today, when the workers' faces appeared on camera, there were some moments of excitement among the rescue teams. The mood soon turned serious as the rescuers planned the next steps in their daunting task. They assured the workers that they will reach them soon and shot off several instructions.

"Are you alright? If all of you are okay, please show yourself before the camera.



Please raise your hands and smile," the workers were told over the walkie-talkie. They responded by lining up before the camera. Their faces showed a week's stubble. They waved to the camera, signalling that they are doing well.

"We will reach you very soon, please do not worry. Please come in front of the camera one by one. We want to show your relatives that you are okay," a rescuer said. The workers were then asked to take the camera from inside the pipe and focus it on each of them.

PM takes stock of progress of ongoing rescue work

Manohar Lal empowers District Grievances Committees for early resolutions of public grievances

"Will take major steps on Deepfake issue, wait till 24th November": Chandrasekhar

Union Minister for Electronics & Technology Rajeev Chandrasekhar has echoed Prime Minister Narendra Modi's statement on deepfakes and misuse of AI.

On November 17, speaking at the Diwali Milan programme held at BJP Headquarters here in New Delhi, PM Modi urged people to exercise caution over the rising threats of artificial intelligence in generating 'deepfakes'. Sharing a personal experience, he said he was surprised to see a fake video in which he was performing Garba.

"He (PM Modi) has absolutely flagged an issue that he has already flagged and repeatedly brought to the attention of the people of India that while the internet is a tool of empowerment, while AI is a tool of empowerment, growth and innovation, we must not forget that there are people on the internet that use AI and other forms of misinformation to cause harm, chaos in society, disorder and incite violence," said Rajeev Chandrasekhar.

"Deepfakes that are misinformation powered by AI, is a very important, clear and pres-

ent danger to the safety and trust of Indians who are using the internet and we have already worked very hard and created the IT Rules in April 2023," he added.

The Union Minister further



promised to continue to create a framework including considering a new legislation to ensure that deepfakes or misinformation at large do not pose a threat to the safety and trust of the 1.2 billion Indians who will be on the Indian internet. "We continue to engage with all the platforms. I have always said that the platforms and the government are partners in ensuring that the internet in India is open, safe, trusted and accountable for our digital citizens. We will continue to engage with them" Rajeev Chandrasekhar said. Rajeev Chandrasekhar further added that the government would engage with the industry to make sure that they do not allow deepfakes to create chaos, harm or toxicity in the Indian internet for Indian citizens.

Valley grips in cold as Srinagar experiences season's first coldest night

Highlighting the recent successes of the campaign, Director General Kapur disclosed that during the specified period, the police team recovered an impressive 11368 country bottles, 1,449 English bottles, 774 beer bottles, 2,352 liters of liquor, and 354 liters of raw liquor. He issued a stern warning to liquor vendors, urging them to refrain from succumbing to greed and engaging in the illegal sale of liquor. The police department will take decisive action against violators, ensuring that no individual is above

the law. Director General Kapur further appealed to the public to promptly report individuals involved in the illegal production and sale of spurious liquor.

PARI BAJAJ KARNAL: Senior Area Manager of IFFCO Kamal, Dr. Niranjn Singh said that IFFCO organized a farmers' meeting under the Nano Fertilizer Awareness Campaign in village Chand Samand Pax on Tuesday. 45 farmers including manager Ajaib Singh and sales center in-charge Ranbir Singh, Chand Samand Pax participated in the program. Dr. Niranjn Singh discussed in detail with farmers about importance of Nano Urea and Nano DAP, which were prepared for the first time in the world by IFFCO. He told that a 500 ml bottle of Nano Urea is equivalent to a 45 kg bag of granular urea and it is used as a spray on crops, hence its usability is more than conventional urea. Plants absorb it through leaves and stems. Like urea, nano urea does not pollute underground water, soil and environment. He told that Nano Urea is an alternative to Urea but it increases the yield. Discussing about Nano DAP, he said that Nano DAP is also an alternative to traditional DAP and it is also effective in increasing the productivity of crops. It is cheaper than traditional DAP. (The price of one bag of DAP is Rs 1350 whereas the price of one bottle of Nano DAP (Liquid) 500 ml is only Rs 600. Nano DAP 500 ml is used in one acre, which is 250 ml quantity of seed (5 ml per kg it will be used in seeds) or tubers, seedlings, seedlings (5 ml per liter of water) and the remaining 250 ml is to be mixed in 100 liters of water and sprayed on the crop of 30-35 days. He told that in the coming time, IFFCO will start production of nano fertilizers. Soon the facility of drones will be made available to the farmers for spraying, which will be a revolutionary step for agriculture in coming time.

Health Minister urges centre to release
Ayushman funds accumulated to Rs 621-cr

Terming the international recognition to the Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government's healthcare model 'Aam Aadmi Clinics' as a proud moment for India, Punjab Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr Balbir Singh on Tuesday once again appealed the Central Government to release the Ayushman Funds, which has been accumulated to the tune of Rs 621 crores. Notably, the Central Government has stopped releasing grants to the Punjab state under the Ayushman Scheme since December 2022.

Pertinently, the Department of Health and Family Welfare Punjab has received first prize for its submission titled "Strengthening last mile delivery of drugs: A case study from Punjab" in the Global Health Supply Chain Summit held in Nairobi from November 14-16. Of total 85 countries that participated in the summit, at least 40 countries have evinced keen interest in visiting Punjab to see the Aam Aadmi Clinics and understand how 84 essential drugs and 40 plus diagnostics are being made available closer to households and without any cost to the patients.

"If delegates from 40 countries want to come here to see our healthcare model to replicate in their countries, the Centre Government should also support us and should release the funds for



the welfare of the people," said Dr Balbir Singh, while adding that the Punjab Government has even written a letter to the Central Government to consider the Aam Aadmi Clinics as a state scheme and won't use Ayushman funds for this scheme. The Health Minister, however, said that there is no dearth of funds from Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann to upgrade the healthcare facilities in the state. "Our CM Saab has always asked me not to worry about funds and just focus on the upgradation of healthcare infrastructure and ensure that nobody should face any kind of hassle in availing any treatment at government hospitals," he said. He said that 100 more Aam Aadmi Clinics are ready to be thrown open to the public, while the Chief Minister has also given the go-ahead to set up 70 additional Aam Aadmi

Clinics at underserved Kandi areas including Hoshiarpur, Pathankot and Gurdaspur. To ensure the availability of medicines at Government Health Facilities, the Chief Minister has also given approval to purchase medicines, he said, while adding that nobody will have to purchase medicines from private pharmacies. Dr Balbir Singh said that an amount of Rs 550 crores is being spent for the upgradation of around 40 secondary care health facilities including district, sub-divisional hospitals and Community Health Centres (CHCs). The upgraded buildings of all the hospitals will be equipped with ultra-modern medical facilities including Intensive Care Units (ICUs), Ventilators, X-rays, Ultrasound, etc and people no more have to visit private hospitals to avail world-class healthcare facilities, he added.

He further said that some street vendors were caught selling cigarettes without any pictorial warning on them whereas some were selling imported cigarettes in violation of the Act. During the raids, it was found that some food vendors were selling tobacco products, which is prohibited under the law. Similarly, some street vendors were selling loose cigarettes. Instructions were given to the violators to put out warnings on the health hazards due to tobacco use and about the anti-tobacco act. They were also asked to put out advertisements saying that they do not sell tobacco items to those below 18 years of age. Section 4 of the Act prohibits smoking in public places and section 6 prohibits the selling of tobacco products to minors.

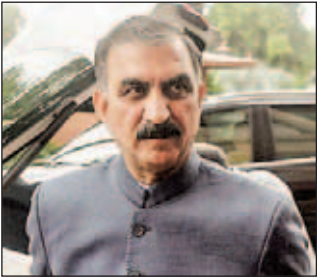

Govt opens self-employment avenues for the youth

Initiating measures towards providing self-employment opportunities to the youth of the state as promised in the election manifesto, the state government has launched the e-taxi scheme under the Rajiv Gandhi Self-Employment Start-up Yojna. To avail the benefits of this scheme, the applicant should be a minimum 23 years of age and possessing valid driving permit and will have to apply on the website <http://etaxihpdt.org/home>. It is also mandatory for him to have a bonafide Himachali certificate and will have to drive the e-taxi himself and not sublet it to others. It is further clarified that only one



person from a family can avail the benefits of this scheme. After completing all the formalities, the applicant will have to apply for permission through the online portal of the Transport Department. The RTO level committee will scrutinize the applications and select the beneficiaries. In the first phase,

500 permits will be issued for e-taxi and the number of permits can be increased in future depending upon the demand. To provide a fixed source of income to the unemployed youth, e-taxi will be made available to government departments, local authorities, autonomous bodies, boards, corporations and government undertakings in a phased manner. The monthly fare rates have been divided into four categories, Along with guaranteeing employment and start-ups to the youth, this scheme will realise the dream of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu for making Himachal Pradesh a 'Green Energy State' by 31 March 2026 besides creating self-employment

avenues for the youth. Government departments requiring e-taxi will be given a user ID and password to upload their demand on the portal. The 50 percent subsidy for the purchase of e-taxi will be provided through the Labour and Employment Department. Along with this, the conditions for taking loan under this scheme will also be relaxed. "In the assembly elections, the Congress Party had promised to bring a start-up scheme for the youth, which has been completed. This is the first phase of the Rs 680 crore Rajiv Gandhi Self-Employment Start-up Scheme and soon the second and third phase of this scheme will also be started, stated the Chief Minister.

24 medicines made in 19 industries of Himachal found substandard

BADDI: In CDSCO's October drug alert, 61 medicines across country were found to be substandard. In investigation of Central Drugs Standard Control Organization (CDSCO), 24 medicines, syrups and injections manufactured in 19 pharmaceutical industries of Himachal have been found to be substandard. Medicines that have not met quality standards include fungal infections, cancer, type 2 diabetes, serious bacterial infections, cardiac arrest, antibiotics, respiratory diseases, anti-inflammatory drugs, angina, Alzheimer's, antiparasitic, stomach ulcers, fever. Includes medications used to treat pain. These medicines are manufactured in pharmaceutical industries located at Baddi, Barotiwala, Wagnaghat, Paonta Sahib. Five samples from Baddi-based Effie Pharma industry have failed. The State Drug Control Authority has already taken action against this industry and banned production of drug. In the drug alert for the month of October issued by CDSCO, 37 medicines manufactured in New Delhi, Jammu, Rajasthan, Bihar, Uttarakhand, Bangalore, Kolkata, Uttar Pradesh, Punjab, Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Chennai have also been found to be substandard. State Drug Controller Navneet Marwah immediately took action and issued a notice to all the pharmaceutical companies included in the drug alert and issued instructions to immediately recall the entire batch of the concerned medicine from the market. Along with this, assistant drug controllers have been instructed to jointly inspect all the pharmaceutical industries and submit a detailed investigation report.

Revenue officers should settle pending land allotment cases by Jan 20: DC

Government has decided to end cases related to land allotment of common people under a special campaign so that time and money of common man can be saved for these works. In this campaign, daily courts will be organized in various revenue offices of district for cases related to taxim. It was given by Deputy Commissioner Raghav Sharma during meeting organized by the Revenue Department at the district headquarters. Raghav Sharma directed all the Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildars present in the meeting to execute this work with immediate effect by organizing courts on daily basis to hear cases related to Taksim and till the next 20th January (except the court related cases). He said that the work progress report of the taxed cases done on daily basis must be sent to district



headquarters and ensure to update it on RMS (Revenue Management System). He said that this is top priority of state government and all revenue officers should take it very seriously.

Deputy Commissioner said that as per instructions of State Government, work done during this campaign will also be reflected in the annual confidential report of the concerned Revenue Officer. He directed the officials of the Revenue Department to organize Revenue Lok Adalats at the Tehsildar and Naib Tehsildar level on the 1st and 2nd of every coming month, in which along with the death

penalty, tax and other revenue related matters should also be settled. He said that it should be ensured that no case related to Khanagi Taksim is pending. He said that a total of 3973 cases related to Taksim are pending in the district, this target will be accomplished during the next 2 months with the mutual cooperation and coordination of the entire team of the Revenue Department. In the meeting, there was a detailed discussion about the Public Service Guarantee Act 2011 (Revenue related) as well as work progress of other services of Revenue Department including minimum average period for issuing certificates.

Constable Tarsem Kumar posted in the Crime Branch, Kaithal, was rushed to Fortis Hospital Mohali with immense bleeding from the oral cavity. The bullet had travelled through his oral cavity and was lodged in the base of the skull. The impact of the bullet was such that the tongue was split into two parts. Upon arrival, the Patient exhibited a weak pulse, breathlessness, acute swelling on the face and tongue along with massive bleeding from the wound. Dr



Ashok Gupta, Director, ENT and Head & Neck Surgery, Fortis Hospital Mohali, first determined the bullet’s trajectory and planned the meticulous surgery to prevent more blood loss. As the bullet was stuck in the base of the skull, extreme precision was required. The team of doctors led by Dr Ashok Gupta and including Dr Anuragini Gupta, Associate Consultant; and Dr Neha Sharma from the ENT Department, conducted the surgery and carefully extracted the bullet lodged in the pa-

tient’s skull during the surgery which lasted three hours . The Patient made a swift recovery and was able to walk 48 hours after the surgery. He was discharged on the third day of the surgery and has recovered fully. Discussing the case, Dr Ashok Gupta, said, “We were able to remove the bullet from the patient’s jaw with extreme caution. Accuracy and precision were required to conduct the surgery. After 48 hours of the procedure, the patient was able to walk and communicate with ease.

Him Shikha School wins overall trophy



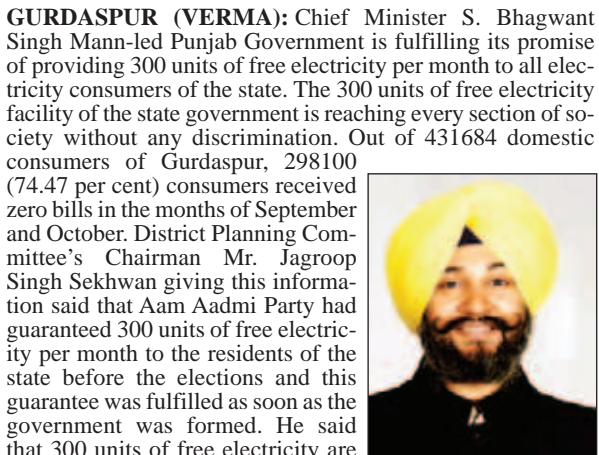

363 eligible families excluded from benefits of

SC slams Delhi govt over not releasing funds for Regional Rapid Transport System

AGENCY NEW DELHI, NOV 21

The Supreme Court on Tuesday slammed the Delhi government for a breach of undertaking given to it to provide funds for the Regional Rapid Transport System (RRTS) project and directed it to transfer the funds meant for advertising to the project.

A bench of Justices Sanjay Kishan Kaul and Sudhanshu Dhulia however put the order in abeyance for a week and said that the order would come into force if the Delhi government did not provide the required funds for the project. While hearing an application filed by NCRTC against not releasing the funds for the project despite the court's order, the bench pulled up Delhi's AAP government and warned it of attaching its advertisement budget. "Why you (Delhi government) have not complied with (court's) order? We will stay your (Delhi government's) advertising budget. We will attach it and take it here," said Justice Kaul said.



Expressing disappointment with the stand of the Delhi government, the apex court observed that there was a "gross breach" of the assurances given by the Delhi government.

It said in April, the apex court had specifically mentioned that the balance amount payable by the Delhi government was to be paid promptly for the timely implementation of the Delhi-Meerut RRTS corridor, the Delhi-Alwar corridor and the Delhi-Panipat corridor. During the hearing, the bench noted that the

budgetary allocation for advertisements for the last three years was almost Rs 1100 crores and for this financial year is Rs 550 crore. "Gross breach of directions by this court of assurance given on behalf of state government... In April, we had specifically mentioned the balance amount payable by the Delhi government and directed them to pay the amount promptly. Amount is not paid... Details show that the three-year budgetary provision was almost Rs 1100 crores, while for this

financial year was Rs 550 crores... If such national projects are affected, and if money is being spent on advertisement, we would be inclined to ask the money to be directed to the infrastructure," said the bench.

As senior advocate Meenakshi Arora, representing the Delhi government, sought one week's time, the bench listed after a week, and said if the fund allocation is not made in the meantime, then the order will come into operation. "We are thus constrained to direct the funds allocated for advertisement purposes to be transferred to the project in question. At the request of the counsel's request, we will keep this order in abeyance for a period of one week. If the funds are not transferred, the order will come into operation," ordered the bench. In its application, National Capital Regional Transport Corporation (NCRTC) the apex court had directed the Delhi government to contribute to the Delhi-Meerut RRTS Project Rs 500 crores within ten days.

GM reviews performance of Northern Railway, stresses upon punctuality of trains

NEW DELHI: Shobhan Chaudhuri, General Manager Northern Railway held a performance review meeting with the departmental heads of Northern Railway & DRMs through. The GM emphasized that Safety is the main concern over Railways, for which all out efforts should be directed towards maintaining the tracks, rolling stock, signaling and electric overhead wires are working in top order. During the review he concerned about the safety of passengers and directed the official to keep tab on illegally transportation of the inflammable articles in trains to stop the fire incidents. He advised the departments to regularly conduct training and refresher courses for the staff to keep them motivated and informed of the working of the system to minimize human error. He advised all divisions to take all nassaccary remedial actions to proper & efficient working of signaling system. He shows his concern on rail fractures and instructed that monitoring of signals, rail



fractures and rail welds should be done extensively and no error should be left. Sh.Chaudhuri instructed to expedite approvals for tree cutting wherever needed from the Forest Department so that these do not pose a threat to the tracks or OHE wires.He also emphasized on focusing on electrical safety on tracks as well as safety in relay and panel rooms for error free movement of trains. He stressed upon the minimizing the human failure in train operation. He also instructed the department heads and DRMs, to maintain the punctuality at keep pace for freight loading with safety as priority.
