Centre urges states to stay alert over China pneumonia spike

Amid a spike in respiratory illnesses among children in northern China, the government has initiated a review of the preparedness measures to combat such illnesses. The Centre said it is closely monitoring the situation and stressed that there is no need for any alarm.

The Health Ministry has urged States and Union Territories (UTs) to conduct an immediate assessment of their public health and hospital preparedness measures. The directive emphasised the need to ensure adequate availability of human resources,



hospital beds, essential medications, medical oxygen, antibiotics, personal protective equipment (PPE), testing kits, and reagents at hospitals.

Additionally, healthcare facilities must ensure the proper functioning of

their oxygen plants and ventilators, and meticulously review infection control protocols to prevent the spread of infections, the Health minister said in its directive.

The Health Ministry has advised the implementation of the “Operational Guidelines for Revised Surveillance Strategy in the context of COVID-19”. These guidelines, issued earlier this year, establish a framework for integrated surveillance of respiratory pathogens, including influenza-like illness (ILI) and severe acute respiratory illness (SARI).

It also emphasised monitoring ILI-SARI trends, particularly among children and adolescents, by district and

state surveillance units of the Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme (IDSP). The timely uploading of ILI-SARI data to the IDSP portal, especially from public health institutions, including medical college hospitals, is essential for effective monitoring and outbreak response, it said. China, still bearing the scars of the COVID-19 pandemic, now confronts a fresh challenge: an enigmatic pneumonia outbreak that is rapidly spreading through its educational institutions. Evoking memories of the harrowing scenes witnessed during the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, this new development has overwhelmed hospitals across the country.

Girls from families with income of Rs 1.80 lakh to get free education in all colleges: Hry CM

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal made a significant announcement declaring free education in both government and private colleges for girls from families with an annual income of Rs 1.80 lakh in the state. In addition, he also announced that the government would cover half of the college fees for girls from families with incomes ranging from Rs 1.80 lakh to Rs 3 lakh. The fees for private colleges, where applicable, will be borne by the Haryana Government. The Chief Minister also announced the conversion of Samalkha from a municipality to a Municipal Council. He made these announcements during the Jan Ashirwad rally organized at Samalkha in Panipat district on Sunday. In a grand gesture, Chief Minister



Manohar Lal unveiled a substantial development plan for the residents of Samalkha. He disclosed plans to establish two sectors, each spanning 100 acres, wherever land is available in Samalkha. Furthermore, he announced that the existing 50-bed CHC in Samalkha would be converted into a 100-bed hospital. Addressing infrastructural concerns, the Chief Minister announced the construction of a straight 1-kilometer road connecting the mini secretariat to the hospital provided people provide land for this purpose.

26/11 Mumbai Attacks' Youngest eyewitness shares her journey on WION



CHANDIGARH- In a poignant and exclusive interview with WION, Devika Natwarlal Rotawan, the youngest eyewitness and survivor of the 26/11 Mumbai Attacks, shared her harrowing ordeal. The interview, conducted by Nikita Jain, sheds light on the terror that unfolded on November 26, 2008, when 10 Lashkar-E-Taiba terrorists from Pakistan unleashed a 60-hour-long siege on the city. Devika vividly recounted the tragic events that unfolded at the CST station, where she, at the tender age of 9 years and 11 months, witnessed the horrors orchestrated by Ajmal Kasab. As chaos ensued with bomb explosions and gunfire, Devika's innocence was shattered as she saw people bleeding and a short-statured man, Kasab, displaying a chilling sense of joy while causing carnage. The young survivor, who was shot during the attack, underwent six leg surgeries and spent one and a half months in JJ Hospital. Despite the trauma, Devika, along with her father, bravely identified Kasab in court on June 10, 2009. During the interview with WION, she also emphasized the transformation of her initial fear into strength over the years. Devika's resilience is further exemplified by her academic achievements despite facing teasing at school with the derogatory name 'Kasab,' she successfully cleared her 10th exams. Her story is a testament to the indomitable human spirit and the power of inner strength. The interview not only provides a first-hand account of the tragedy from the youngest survivor's perspective but also highlights the aftermath of the attacks on individual lives.

The entry of these fraudulent people into the GST system results into huge loss to state exchequer. In order to check the entry of fraudsters in the system, the department has set a target of hundred per cent approval of GST registrations in the manual mode after proper verification of documents attached with the registration application. It has also been coordinating with Central tax authorities for timely action against tax evaders under their jurisdiction. Taking action, the department is in the process of establishing systems at the state headquarter for earliest detection of fraudulent taxpayers and is taking all necessary measures to identify fraudulent taxpayers upon the first indication of evasion so that loss to revenue could be minimized.

BJP MPs and leaders are not able to muster
courage to go to PM, Home Minister: CM

Fixed prices of essential food
items, DM issues notification

UNA: In view of the availability of essential commodities in the market at quality and reasonable prices to the common people and consumers, District Magistrate Raghav Sharma has issued a notification under the Prevention of Hoarding and Profiteering Order 1977, setting the maximum selling price of essential commodities so that No seller or shopkeeper in the district could charge more than the prescribed price. According to the notification, in district Una, goat and sheep meat is priced at Rs 500 per kg, pig meat at Rs 250 per kg, chicken broiler at Rs 220 per kg, live chicken at Rs 150 per kg, broiler meat at Rs 210 per kg, while fish at the rate fixed by the Fisheries Department. Can be sold at maximum price. District Magistrate said that the food cooked at dhabas in the district is full diet rice, chapatti with dal, vegetable and curry for Rs 80, half diet one plate of rice with dal and vegetable for Rs 50, chapatti tawa 7 and tandoori 8 rupees, special vegetable, Rs 70 per plate, Stuffed Parantha with pickle Rs 30, Special dal Rs 70, Rice full plate Rs 50, Raita Rs 50 per plate, Meat 5 pieces 200 grams per plate Rs 130, Chicken 5 pieces 200 grams Rs 110 per plate were determined. Apart from this, two Bhatore with gram or vegetable can be sold for Rs 55, Samosa gram for Rs 30 and two Samosa gram for Rs 50 per plate.



Chief Minister is giving political color
to stone crushers: Sanjay Sharma

BJP state spokesperson Sanjay Sharma has condemned the statement of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, in which he has said that during the tenure of BJP, the state has suffered a loss of Rs 100 crore due to stone crushers. The committee was formed to

investigate the illegal mining done in an unscientific manner by the crushers located on the banks of river Vyas, which led to flood-like situation, but the purpose of the report presented by the Chief Minister is to give it a political colour. It also seems ridiculous for the Chief Minister to say that the crushers were being run by generators while the Chief Minister did not take the name of any crusher owner or unit. What action did the committee take against the officials who gave permission to run the crusher through generators or under whose protection it continued to run? The public wants to know that if the committee has found this then the names and facts of the stone crushers which

were being operated by the generators should be revealed. If this was happening then the disaster occurred in the month of August, what was the government doing for 8 months before that. The Chief Minister should put before the public the facts of each crusher as to which crusher and where due to irregularities the government has suffered a loss of Rs 100 crore. Making statements for the sake of quantitative statements is wrong. Chief Minister should present the list of 129 stone crushers as to which crushers had shortcomings and which crushers had merits by the inquiry committee so that the public can also know the truth.

Police bust drug smuggling racket being operated by USA-based Jasmit Lucky

Commissioner of Police (CP) Amritsar Gurpreet Singh Bhullar has identified the arrested drug smugglers Mohinderpal Singh of Model Town, Hoshiarpur and Sourav Sharma of Panj Pipli Chand Nagar, Hoshiarpur. Apart from seizing heroin, Police teams have also impounded his Hyundai i20 car (PB91J5186), in which they were going to supply the heroin consignment. CP Gurpreet Singh Bhullar said that following reliable inputs that associates of Jasmit Lucky have retrieved the heroin consignment sent by Pak-based smugglers from across the border,



and they are going to deliver it to someone, Police teams from CIA Staff-3 under supervision of ADCP CITY-3 Abhimanyu Rana IPS conducted a special police checking in the area of village Burj at Attari Road and arrested both the accused persons when they were waiting after receiving consignment from someone in their i20 car. He said that as per preliminary investigations, the accused persons were directly in touch with USA-based smuggler Jasmit Lucky and were supplying heroin across the state after smuggling from Pakistan. CP Bhullar said that further investigations are being conducted to probe the backward and forward linkages and unearth the whole network of drug suppliers, dealers and their buyers.

Out of sight...

August 5 of 2010. Copper mine in Chile caves in, 33 miners get trapped 700 metres underground. At first, a local squad attempts rescue. That fails. A second cave-in happens. Maps of the mine structure are outdated, which delays rescue work. Two weeks later, a note is discovered; attached to one of the many probes used to detect signs of life, it reads: "Es-tamos bien en el refugio los 33... All 33 of us are all right in the shelter."

To the rescue

What follows are rescue efforts and frenetic planning. Machines are brought in, the government calls in Nasa Engineering and Safety Center to help. All the while, the world media is tracking every move. Drilling experts from at least a dozen countries on consult. Experts consulted on possible psychological impact on the miners. The clock ticks away. Alongside, food and medicines, letters from loved ones sent through tubes. Arrangements made so they can watch movies and live soccer matches. More days underground. There is an expert teaching them how to communicate with journalists when it is time. A psychologist holds counselling sessions with the miners underground. At some point cigarettes are sent down. A New York Times report from 2010 reads: "Some here at the mine have compared the rescue effort to the Apollo 13 space mission, for the emotional tension it has caused..."

Phoenix

After 69 days, the rescue. The miners emerge in a capsule called the Phoenix and painted in the colours of the Chilean flag. The makeshift tent, where their families have waited all this while, erupts with celebration. It is called Camp Hope. Later, the miners said a 34th miner --- God --- was always with them, keeping them safe. For a while, all is lights, camera and largesse. The miners go on all-expenses-paid trips to Crete, to Disney World. Manchester United invites them, gives them box seats to watch a match. They travel to Jerusalem. Of course, many of them had persistent health issues. Most were deemed unemployable for mining jobs. The mining company was deemed not guilty. Did they benefit from the Hollywood film on them? Were they suitably compensated for risky service? Were they suitably comforted for their trauma? Were adulation, free trips, book contracts what they needed? As the clock ticks on the Char Dham tunnel rescue operations, we could spare a thought for these things and do the needful when required, instead of wringing hands and hearts over a lost cricket match and baleful influences. There is always the 34th one, or the 12th to thank or blame.

22 temples of Prambanan complex restored in heart of Yogyakarta city

Yogyakarta city in Indonesia, is a remarkable example of pluralism with temples of different cultures and beliefs co-existing and also being flocked by a large number of tourists. Several people from the Hindu community went to Indonesia and that laid the roots of the deep India-Indonesia ties. The Prambanan temple in Yogyakarta is a complex of 240 temples that were completely destroyed in earthquakes. The restoration work is under progress due to which, 22 temples have been restored till now.

It is also a UNESCO heritage site, hence, the restoration work is being done as per UNESCO norms.

The experts said this is also the reason why restoration work is taking time because the norms don't allow more than 25 per cent of new stones to be used for restoration.

This site holds immense historical value and priests offer regular puja every day outside the Shiv Temple in the complex. The temple priest said, "I perform this puja three times a day. At 8 in the morning, then 12 at noon and then around 4 in the evening...In the morning it is 'Surya Puja', the second one is 'Raina Puja' and third one and the third one is around sunset. The prayers are offered in one place but for three Gods, Lord Brahma, Lord Vishnu and Lord Shiva".

The authorised tourist guide at the temple complex opened up on the unique construction style of the complex and also spoke about the roots of India-Indonesia ties.

"Parmanand Temple was built in the 9th century. 22 temples have been restored till now, most of them were destroyed due to earthquakes and volcano eruptions. The restoration work was difficult because there were no pictures, but the system of the building is interlocking. Every stone has a key and we join them by trial and error. India and Indonesia share a strong connection as many Hindus here came from India only," the tourist guide said. There is another famous



Borobudur Buddhist temple in Yogyakarta city, which is considered the largest Buddhist Temple in the world. The tourist guide at the temple spoke about the unique construction, specialities of the temple and its

historical significance. "It is the largest temple, made with 2 million blocks of stone, interlocking stones, depicting 10 stages to perfection, decorated with 3 km storeys, 500 statues sitting in six different positions.


In the India leg, Nelson will visit several locations, including the Bengaluru-based fa-

As the first satellite mission between NASA and ISRO, NISAR is a revolutionary Earth-observing instrument, the first in the Earth System Observatory, that will measure Earth's changing ecosystems, dynamic surfaces, and ice masses, providing information about biomass, natural hazards, sea level rise, and groundwater, key information to guide efforts related to climate change, hazard mitigation, agriculture, and more.

The three of them sat on a platform just outside the temple premises. As per their daily routine, the priests were offering food to Jagannath Ji, but that day it was not accepted. The priests got worried. With folded hands, they said, "Oh Thakur Ji! What mistake have we committed that you are not accepting our offerings?" Jagannath Ji himself replied by means of a loud voice from the sky, "You have disobeyed me by not allowing my beloved Nanak Nirankari to enter the temple premises. Bring him in; only then will I accept your offerings."

Hearing these words of Jagannath Ji, the priests came to Shri Guru Nanak Dev, and draped a cloth around Guruji's neck as a mark of respect. They fell on Guruji's feet, chanting "Trahimaam Trahimaam" (Protect us). They asked for for-

giveness for their behaviour, and requested him to come inside the temple. Guruji said, "You did not let me in, now I have placed Thakur Ji in my heart itself." The priests and others Respectable members of the society kept on pleading for apology. Kind hearted Guruji forgave them and stepped inside the temple. He placed his hands on the food and said, "Don't place any restrictions on the entry of my disciples here."
