Rescuers launch 360 degree op to save trapped tunnel workers

The operation to rescue 41 workers trapped inside an Uttarakhand tunnel for more than two weeks now has been a story of new challenges at every corner and rescue teams tweaking their plans to meet them. The past 16 days have seen government authorities constantly fine-tune their strategies and find new approaches to bring out the men at the earliest. At this point, rescue teams are drilling from multiple directions to reach the workers. They are simultaneously focusing on ensuring their physical and mental well-being as the operation drags on.

Manual drilling at the Uttarkashi site is set to begin today after an auger drill machine manufactured in the US got stuck in the debris. The drill -- a corkscrew like-device with a rotary blade at the front-end -- had drilled through more than 46 metres of debris. As the machine drilled through, pipes were pushed in to create an escape passage. A couple of days back, it appeared that the operation would be completed soon, but snags in the drill dashed hopes. About 14-odd metres of drilling was left when the machine's blade got stuck in the debris and the drill broke down. International tunnel expert Arnold Dix, who is at the site, said the auger machine was "busted". "Augering is finished... the auger is broken, destructed," he told the media. Thereafter, a specialised gas cutter was



flown in from Hyderabad to cut and remove the parts of the auger drill stuck in the debris so that manual drilling could begin. The plasma cutter completed its task this morning.

With the 25-tonne auger machine breaking down, rescue teams decided to pursue multiple strategies simultaneously. Manual drilling is aimed at completing the task the auger drill started. A team of 11 has been flown in from Delhi for this task. These include six specialists and five more in reserve. Rescue teams said they will go inside the 800 mm pipe to remove the debris manually. This method involves two-three drillers entering the pipe and using hand-held tools to clear the debris blocking the pipe's way. The

waste generated during the digging is sent out through wheeled vessels. One of the specialists told news agency a news agency. "A shovel and other specialist tools will be used. For oxygen, we will take along a blower with us."

Manual drilling is a tiring task and the diggers take turns. These professionals are also called rat miners for their rat-like skill in boring. According to rescue teams, these professionals are skilled in cutting through metal barriers too. Manual drilling method is set to begin today. Rescue teams at the site said this morning that the gas cutters used to remove parts of the auger drill from the debris had generated heat inside the pipe and they were waiting for it to cool down before manual drilling starts.

Haryana: Cancer patients to get a monthly assistance of Rs. 3000

In a bid to alleviate the financial burden faced by eligible cancer patients by providing them with monthly financial help, the Haryana Cabinet which met under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal today approved a scheme for giving financial assistance for stage III and IV cancer patients. With this decision, around 22,808 patients will get the benefit.

The monthly financial assistance of Rs.3000 provided under this scheme will be in addition to the benefit being availed under any other social security pension scheme by the applicant. The financial assistance to eligible patients shall be given @ equal to old Age Samman Allowance. Initially, from now onwards, the patients will receive monthly assistance of Rs. 2750, while from January 2024 the amount will be Rs. 3000.

Notably, during the inauguration of the Atal Cancer Care Centre (ACCC), Ambala Cantt, the Chief Minister had announced pension for can-



cer patients of stage III and IV.

A person eligible for Financial Assistance under the scheme shall be, a citizen of India and a resident of Haryana and should be residing in Haryana since the last 15 years on the date of submission of the application,

should have Parivar Pehchan Patra (PPP), all age Group stage III & IV patients will be eligible under the scheme, and patients whose family income is less than Rs. 3 lakh per annum, except the amount of other Social Security Pension Schemes will be eligible.

Winter session to begin from December 15

CHANDIGARH: The winter session of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha will begin from December 15, 2023. A decision to this effect was taken in the meeting of the state cabinet which met under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal here today. With this, the Council of Ministers has also authorized the Chief Minister for the legislative business of the House.

Gujarat: 24 people killed in lightning strikes amid unseasonal rainfall

GANDHINAGAR: At least 24 people have died so far in rainfall-unseasonal rainfall that hit several parts of Gujarat over the weekend, which has also claimed the lives of 71 animals, an official from the State Emergency Operation Centre (SEOC) said on Monday. According to information, one person died in each of the districts of Ahmedabad, Amreli, Anand, Kheda, Devbhoomi Dwaraka, Panchmahal, Patan, Botad, Mehsana, Sabarkantha, Surat and Surendranagar. In Tapi district two people lost their lives due to a lightning strike. Three people each were killed due to lightning.

India, US looking at finalising MQ-9B Predator drone deal by early next year

NEW DELHI: India is looking at sealing a landmark deal to procure 31 MQ-9B Predator armed drones from the US under a government-to-government framework by March with the US Congress expected to clear the supplies in the next few weeks, people familiar with the matter said. American and Indian government officials will hold the final series of negotiations after Washington responds to India's Letter of Request (LoR) for the acquisition of drones from US defence major General Atomics (GA), they said. India is procuring the long-endurance 'hunter-killer' drones to crank up the surveillance apparatus of the armed forces, especially along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) with China.

Delhi Police arrests two sharpshooters after encounter

NEW DELHI: The Special Cell of Delhi police arrested two sharpshooters from East Delhi's Mayur Vihar after an encounter in which one accused sustained gunshot injury on his right leg, police said on Monday. Both the accused were tasked to assassinate a singer for which they made an attempt in October this year at Bhatinda but could not be successful as the singer was not found at home, claimed police. The duo, identified as Rajpreet Singh (25) alias Raja and Virender Singh (22) aka Vimmy, are sharpshooters of international gangster Arshdeep Singh alias Dalla. They were arrested on the main road towards Akshardham Mandir opposite Samachar Apartment in Mayur Vihar area after a brief exchange of fire.

Khalistani protesters heckle Indian envoy visiting US Gurdwara

A group of Khalistani protesters heckled Taranjit Singh Sandhu, Indian Ambassador to the US, at a New York gurdwara yesterday. Mr Sandhu was visited Hicksville Gurdwara in Long Island on the occasion of Gurburab when the protesters surrounded him and started shouting.

They accused him of plotting the assassination of Khalistani terrorist Hardeep Singh Nijjar and also conspiring to get another terrorist Gurburab Singh Pannun murdered.

A video of the exchange between Mr Sandhu and the Khalistani protesters has now gone viral. The video starts with the envoy telling the protesters that he is visiting the gurdwara for seva (service).

A protester is heard shouting in Punjabi, "You are responsible for the assassination of Hardeep Singh Nijjar. You plotted to kill Pannun."



Others in the video are seen trying to defuse the situation. The protesters follow Mr Sandhu and are heard asking, "Why don't you answer?"

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann accompanied by the Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Monday launched the Mukh Mantri Teerth Yatra Scheme to facilitate the people to pay obeisance at the sacred places across the country.

Addressing the gathering after launching Mukh Mantri Teerth Yatra Scheme on the auspicious Parkash Purb of Sri Guru Nanak Dev ji here today, the Chief Minister said that this scheme is in line with the teachings and philosophy of the great Guru who had gave the

message of universal love brotherhood and peace to the people. He said that a large section of society was not able to visit these sacred places across the country due to one reason or another. However, Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the state government has started this scheme to facilitate the pilgrims to visit the various holy places across the country and state.

The Chief Minister said that today 300 pilgrims from Amritsar, 220 from Jalandhar and more than 500 from Dhuri will be travelling to Sri Hazur Sahib



through this train. He said that more than 50000 pilgrims will be availing this facility over three months adding that 13000 of them will travel via trains, with 13 trains carrying 1000 passengers each leaving every eight days.

Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the remaining will be travelling via Buses, with 10 buses leaving every day, carrying 43 people each. The Chief Minister said that a team of Doctors, Volunteers and Officials will be travelling with yatris to take care of any emergency. He said that an advanced team of officials have been sent to take care of all the amenities before the yatris arrive. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that old people above the age of 75 will also be allowed to have young attendants to travel with them.

Centre convenes all-party meeting on Dec 2 ahead of Parliament Winter session

The government has convened an all-party meeting on December 2 ahead of the Winter Session of Parliament that is scheduled to begin on December 4.

The Winter session of Parliament 2023 will conclude on December 22. On behalf of the government, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Prahlad Joshi has called an all-party meeting on December 2. The all-party meeting is usually convened a day before the session begins, this time it has been preponed by

a day due to the counting of votes for five states on December 3 where polls are underway. The Winter session will be held a day after the declaration of results of assembly polls in five states - Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Mizoram and Telangana. The outcome of the polls is expected to have resonance in the Session. Three important bills which seek to replace the IPC, CrPC and the Evidence Act may be taken up for consideration during the session. The session is also likely to discuss the report of the Ethics committee on the "cash for query" allegations against Trinamool Congress MP Mahua Moitra.

Small artisans to be provided a loan of Rs 3 lakh and modern training under PM Vishwakarma Yojana: DC

RANVIR PARASHAR KURUKSHETRA: Deputy Commissioner Prashant Pawar informed that the Indian government's PM Vishwakarma Yojana is providing incentives to small artisans. The scheme includes low-interest loans, free tools, encouragement for digital transactions, certification, and identification documents. DC shared that the Central Government has allocated Rs 13000 crore for the PM Vishwakarma Yojana. Under this initiative run by the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME), financial upliftment will be provided to artisans and workers in 18 categories who work with small tools. He mentioned that artisans in our society, such as blacksmiths, goldsmiths, potters, carpenters, cobblers, barbers, tailors, laundry workers, toy makers for children, basket makers, mat makers, broom makers, sculptors, and construction workers, will receive low-interest loans and business training from banks. Under this scheme, these artisans are provided with collateral-free loans of up to Rs 3 lakh with an initial Rs 1 lakh and the remaining Rs 2 lakh after repayment. Apart from this, during their advanced training, they receive a daily allowance of Rs 500, tool kits up to Rs 15000, digital transaction education, certification, and identification documents. DC said that to benefit from the PM Vishwakarma Yojana, the applicant should be 18 years or older.

This announcement will be applicable to all private and government colleges. Whatever college fees will be borne by the government. Along with this, the government will also pay half the fees for college education of daughters from families with annual income between Rs 1.80 lakh to Rs 3 lakh. Mayor Madan Chauhan said that it has often been seen that education of daughters of economically weak families becomes difficult due to lack of money. She drops out of her studies after high school. This problem was mostly faced by backward class girls. But now money



will not become a hindrance in the education of daughters. For this, Chief Minister Manohar Lal has announced free college education to girl students with annual family income less than Rs 1.80.

Announcing this, Chief Minister Manohar Lal also said that the government will pay half the fees for college education to girl students whose family income is between Rs 1.80 lakh to Rs 3 lakh. Mayor Chauhan said that the Haryana

Government has started many schemes for daughters. Various schemes were started from birth to marriage. Under the Balika Samridhi Yojana, a gift of Rs 500 is given at the birth of a girl child. Besides, an annual scholarship for the education of the girl child is also given under this scheme. Under Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, after the girl turns 18 years of age, 50 percent of the money can be withdrawn for her higher education. This scheme reduces the financial burden on parents for daughters' education and marriage. Under Sukanya Samridhi Yojana, an account can be opened with a minimum amount of just Rs 250. Apart from this, now to reduce the financial burden, the Chief Minister has started a scheme to provide free education to daughters of families with annual income of Rs 1.80 lakh.

Malerkotla police bust inter-state drug smuggling gang

In a significant stride against cross-border narcotics trade, aligning with Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann's vision and under the direction of DGP Punjab Gaurav Yadav IPS, Malerkotla Police has successfully dismantled a smuggling racket today. Malerkotla Police led the operation, arresting three individuals and seizing a considerable amount of opium, coupled with a substantial sum of drug money. This strategic move marks a robust step in the ongoing war on drugs. The apprehended individuals have been identified as Javed alias Jaidi, Anwar Khan, and a juvenile, Salman Khan, representing a father-son duo and a youth residing in different localities of Malerkotla. Providing insights into the operation, Senior Superintendent



of Police Malerkotla, Harkamal Preet Singh Khakh, said that acting on credible intelligence, a meticulously planned operation was conducted by the CIA Malerkotla team, led by Inspector Harjinder Singh under the supervision of DSP Detective Amarjit Singh. Through meticulous investigation, it was revealed that a trio from West Bengal (Calcutta) was attempting

to smuggle a substantial quantity of opium into Malerkotla. With swift action, the police intercepted the accused individuals near the Malerkotla bus stand. Upon thorough search, the police recovered 2.56 kg of opium concealed within a black bag, along with Rs. 16,000 in drug money. The preliminary investigations revealed that the accused individuals had procured

the opium from West Bengal (Calcutta) and were intending to distribute and sell it in Malerkotla.

The arrested individuals have been booked under the Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act at Police Station City Malerkotla.

The arrested individuals will be produced in the local court, and their remand will be sought for further investigation. Ongoing efforts are underway to identify and apprehend other members associated with the trafficking network. SSP Khakh commended the team's exceptional vigilance and swift action in dismantling this inter-state narcotics trafficking network emphasizing that this seizure deals a significant blow to the drug trade in the region. Malerkotla Police is committed to safeguarding the community from the detrimental effects of drug trafficking, particularly those involving inter-state networks.

Excellent performance of SD College in Punjabi University Inter Regional Youth and Folk Fair



The complainant has approached the VB and reported that the said accused police official was demanding to pay bribe of Rs. 10,000 more for not including his name in a police complaint pertaining to a quarrel. The complainant alleged to the VB that the said ASI has already took Rs. 20,000 in advance in this regard. Now he has asked to pay an additional bribe of Rs. 10,000. The complainant has recorded the conversation while the police official was demanding the bribe money and handed over to the VB as an evidence in this case. The spokesperson further added that following a preliminary investigation into the complaint, a VB team from the Ferozepur range laid a trap and ASI Baldev Singh was apprehended red-handed in the presence of two official witnesses while receiving a bribe of Rs. 10,000 from complainant. He informed that a case under the Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered against the accused ASI at the VB Police Station, Ferozepur Range. Further investigation in this case was under progress.

205 piezometers will be installed across the state to check ground water level

205 piezometers will be installed across the state to check ground water level. These piezometers will be installed through outsource by Central Ground Water Board (CGWB), Dharamshala. Piezometer works to measure ground water pressure. At present, CGWB monitors the ground water level of the entire state through rigs in Kangra and Kala Amb. Along with the installation of 205 piezometers, the same number of Digital Ground Water Level Recorders (DWLR) will also be installed. Piezometers are geotechnical sensors used to measure pore water pressure (piezometric level) in the ground. It is designed to measure pore water pressure in soil, soil/rock fill, foundations and concrete structures. Digital Ground Water Level Recorder (DWLR) is an automatic water level recorder, after its installation, experts do not need to go to the field to check the ground water level. Experts can monitor the ground water level by meeting in the office. Through DWLR, water monitoring can be done twice a day without going to the spot and readings can be taken through computer in the morning and evening. Earlier, experts from Central Ground Water Board (CGWB) Dharamshala had to personally go to the identified places and check the ground water level, which resulted in wastage of time. CGWB has installed more than 400 tube wells across the state to check the ground water level. To know the level of ground water, CGWB installs tube wells and pumps tests on the places where water is found. After obtaining information about ground water through tube wells, the tube wells are handed over to the Jal Shakti Department for the use of the general public. So far, CGWB has built around 400 tube wells and handed them over to the Jal Shakti Department. In Himachal Pradesh, 205 piezometers will be installed across the state, this is also a type of tube well, these piezometers will be outsourced.

Business of drugs continues unabated

NALAGARG: In the industrial area of Barotiwala, Nalagarh, the business of drugs is seen increasing day by day. Drug traffickers roam fearlessly on bikes without number plates, and not only is the police unable to catch them, but they also seem incapable of issuing fines. A recent incident occurred near Vardhman Birla Marg in Barotiwala, where a victim, Santosh, lured a drug trafficker under the pretext of providing drugs and then took him into custody. The victim woman revealed that she has two sons, one of whom died due to drugs, while the other has fallen into the habit of drugs. She stated that last night, this man called her to buy drugs, and the youth did not even know who he was speaking to. Later, the woman called him in the morning to deliver the drugs and, upon arrival, she, along with others, captured him. The youth was beaten by the woman and her husband, and when he tried to escape, he was tied with ropes. Surprisingly, the drug trafficker was captured nearly two hours ago, and this information was reported to the Baddi police station. However, when officials from the Baddi police arrived, it was discovered that this area falls under the Barotiwala police jurisdiction. Subsequently, they awaited the Barotiwala officers, and the suspect was handed over to the police. Five pouches of drugs were seized from the youth. People claim that this is a gang that has been supplying drugs and engaging in thefts and snatchings in the Vardhman and Bhatolikala areas for several years.

Resurgence of terror

The spurt in terror attacks in Jammu & Kashmir is a grim reminder of Pakistan-sponsored nefarious elements spreading their tentacles in the region and exposes the hollowness of the government's claims on restoration of normalcy. In the latest encounter in Rajouri district, five Army personnel, including two officers, were killed. The incident fits into a pattern of all major terror strikes in the region in the last two years: A majority of them occurring in the Rajouri-Poonch-Reasi belt situated to the south of the Pir Panjal mountain range that separates Jammu from the Kashmir Valley. It is a matter of big concern that terrorists have managed to strike at will in the area, with the Army losing 14 of its personnel so far this year. This includes two back-to-back ambushes on April 20 and May 5 that claimed the lives of 10 soldiers. The Rajouri-Poonch belt accounted for 46 deaths, including those of civilians, since January this year. It means that the terrorist threat goes much beyond the Kashmir Valley, posing a new security challenge. The Rajouri-Poonch axis is contiguous with South Kashmir, a major hub for militancy, and the Line of Control (LoC) with Pakistan. With an effective counter-terrorist security grid in place in Kashmir, terrorist outfits, notably Lashkar and Jaish, which have foreigners in their ranks, seem to have shifted to the Jammu side of the vast and sparsely populated forested terrain, with limited road connectivity. Going by the recurring instances of the LoC ceasefire violations, it is clear that Pakistani handlers are making concerted efforts to make the communally sensitive Jammu region a new ground for their proxies. There is an urgent need to take a relook at the security system to check the militancy and, simultaneously, create conditions conducive to resuming the electoral process. The focus of the security forces and the J&K administration should not only be on neutralising terrorists but also on cracking down on their sympathisers. Four government employees, including a doctor and a policeman, were sacked by the authorities recently for their alleged terror links. They were accused of helping Pakistan-based terror outfits, providing logistical and financial support to terrorists and propagating their ideology, and indulging in secessionist propaganda. A strong message should go to the secessionists that their activities will not be tolerated. While it is a fact that the overall number of terror-related incidents has come down significantly over the last few years, the sudden spurt in violent attacks must prompt the Centre to introspect about its Kashmir policy. There can be no two opinions about the need for tough security measures to crush militancy and thwart the designs of its sponsors from across the border but a genuine empowerment of people alone can help restoration of peace and normalcy in the Valley. It is a long and arduous task that involves handling the situation with sensitivity and fairness.

Hosabale said, "Swami Vivekananda had told Hindus to conquer the world with their spirituality, and I think that material progress and spiritual progress will make us realise the great motto of the World Hindu Congress, which is 'Jayasya Aayatanam Dharmah.'" Miilind Parande, International General Secretary of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad (VHP), said that the power of Hindus is not intended to frighten anyone but to ensure welfare of

humanity. Around 50 sessions were organised in parallel throughout the conference, with a focus on seven sections, including the economy, education, academic, media and political sectors, as well as youth and women. Irish author Paul Lynch wins 2023 Booker Prize for dystopian novel 'Prophet Song'

Irish author Paul Lynch won the 2023 Booker Prize for his dystopian novel 'Prophet Song', which presents an imaginary near-future of Ireland descending into totalitarianism, followed by a civil war, the New York Times reported. 'Prophet Song' is set in the near future centres on Eilish Stack, a scientist and mother of four, whose




trade unionist husband is taken by the security forces, an early sign of growing authoritarian rule that eventually sees Ireland in the midst of a civil war, according to New York Times. Esi Edugyan, a novelist and the chair of this year's judging panel, said that "Prophet Song" resonated with contemporary crises including the Israel-Hamas war, but that the novel had won solely on its literary merits.

"This is a triumph of emotional storytelling, bracing and brave," Edugyan said in a news conference before the announcement. However, the judges weren't unanimous in their decision, even after six hours of debate, Edugyan said. Still, she added, the panel felt that "Prophet Song" was a worthy winner that "captures the social and political anxieties of our current moment." "There was a different way that things could have gone," Edugyan said. Ultimately, she added, the judges all "felt that this was the book that we wanted to present to the world -- that this was truly a masterful work of fiction." "Prophet Song", which Grove Atlantic will publish in North America on December 5, beat five other shortlisted titles including Paul Murray's 'The Bee Sting', Chelina Maroo's 'Western Lane' and Paul Harding's 'This Other Eden', New York Times reported. The other shortlisted novels were Jonathan Escoffery's 'If I Survive You', and Sarah Bernstein's 'Study for Obedience'. Meanwhile, the novel has received mixed reviews in Britain and Ireland, the New York Times reported. Lucy Popescu in The Financial Times said it was "a compassionate, propulsive and timely novel that forces the reader to imagine -- what if this was me?" While Aimee Walsh, in The Observer, called it "a crucial book for our current times," and Laura Hackett, in The Times of London, labeled it "an exercise in totalitarianism-by-numbers."

People who have addiction to work feel sick even while working

Workaholics' moods are often worse than others, even while they are engaged in what they are most enthusiastic about: their work. Workaholism is similar to other types of addictions such as gambling and alcoholism. This is what emerges from a study published in the Journal of Occupational Health Psychology, conducted by Cristian Balducci, a professor at the Department for Life Quality Studies at the University of Bologna (Rimini Campus), in collaboration with Dr. Luca Menghini from the University of Trento and Prof. Paola Spagnoli from the University of Campania 'Luigi Vanvitelli'. Professor Balducci explains: "The negative mood observed in workaholics may indicate elevated daily stress levels and that could be the cause of the higher risk for these individuals to develop burnout and cardiovascular problems. Furthermore, considering that workaholics often hold positions of responsibility, their negative mood could readily influence that of colleagues and co-workers. This poses a risk that organizations should seriously consider, intervening to discourage behaviors that contribute to workaholism." Work addiction has been a well-known

phenomenon for a long time: people suffering from it tend to work excessively and compulsively. This is a true obsession that negatively affects health, psychological well-being, and relations with family and friends. Several studies indicate that workaholics commonly experience a sense of unwellness, often during the workday, yet other research indicates that these positive emotions quickly transition to a prevailing dysphoric state characterized by irritation and depression. To shed light on this aspect, scholars involved 139 full-time workers in the study, mostly employed in back-office activities. A psychological test was first used to assess the participants' level of work dependency. Afterward, the scholars analyzed the mood of the workers and their perception of workload using a technique known as "experience sampling method". This was done using an app installed on the participants' phones, which allowed them to send short questionnaires, approximately every 90 minutes, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., over the course of three working days (Monday, Wednesday and Friday). "The collected data show that the most workaholic workers have on average a worse mood than the others", says Prof. Balducci. "So, it does not appear to be true that people who are addicted to work derive more pleasure from their work activity; quite the opposite, the results seem to confirm that, as in other forms of behavioural and substance addiction, the initial euphoria gives way to a negative emotional state that pervades



Study reveals effect of climate change on human brain

The latest manifestation of the effects of climate change and global warming is its effect on the human brain. In a report published in Nature Climate Change, an international team of academics explores how research has demonstrated that a changing environment affects how our brains work, and how climate change may impact our brain function in the future. The work is led by the University of Vienna, with contributions from Geneva, New York, Chicago, Washington, Stanford, Exeter in the United Kingdom, and the Max Planck Institute in Berlin. It also looks at how neuroscientists might help to better understand and treat these issues. Lead author Dr Kimberly C.

Doell, of the University of Vienna, said: "We've long known that factors in our environment can lead to changes in the brain. Yet we're only just beginning to look at how climate change, the greatest global threat of our time, might change our brains. Given the increasingly frequent extreme weather events we're already experiencing, alongside factors such as air pollution, the way we access nature and the stress and anxiety people experience around climate change, it's crucial that we understand the impact this could all have on our brains. Only then can we start to find ways to mitigate these changes." Since the 1940s, scientists have known from mouse studies that changing environmental factors can profoundly change the



development and plasticity of the brain. This effect has also been seen in humans in research looking at the effects of growing up in poverty, which found disturbances to brain systems, including lack of cognitive

stimulation, exposure to toxins, poor nutrition, and heightened childhood stress. While not entirely surprising, this research highlights the profound impact that one's environment can have on their brain. Now, the authors are calling for research to explore the impact on the human brain of being exposed to more extreme weather events, such as heatwaves, droughts, and hurricanes, and associated forest fires and floods. They believe such events may change brain structure, function, and overall health, and also call for more research to evaluate how this may explain changes in well-being and behaviour. The paper also explores the role that neuroscience can play in influencing the way we think

about climate change, our judgments and how we respond. Dr Mathew White, of the Universities of Exeter and Vienna, is a co-author on the study. He said: "Understanding neural activity that is relevant to motivations, emotions and temporal horizons may help predict behaviour, and improve our understanding of, underlying barriers preventing people from behaving as pro-environmentally as they might wish. Both brain function and climate change are highly complex areas. We need to start seeing them as interlinked, and to take action to protect our brains against the future realities of climate change, and start using our brains better to cope with what is already happening and prevent the worse-case scenarios."



"That's the biggest learning curve I've had since I've been a part of the team," he said.
