All 41 trapped workers rescued successfully from Silkyara tunnel

After tireless efforts of rescuers which continued for 16 days, all 41 trapped workers were evacuated successfully from the Silkyara tunnel in Uttarakhand. Meanwhile, locals distributed sweets outside the Silkyara tunnel as trapped workers were being rescued from the tunnel.

Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhama met the workers who have been rescued along with Union Minister of State General (Retd) VK Singh.

"Initial health checkup of all the workers is being done in the temporary medical camp built in the tunnel," Uttarakhand CM Pushkar Singh Dhama tweeted. Moreover, Union Minister Nitin Gadkari said that he is relieved and happy as 41 trapped labourers in the Silkyara Tunnel Collapse have been successfully rescued.

"I am completely relieved and happy as 41 trapped labourers in the Silkyara Tunnel Collapse have been successfully rescued. This was a well-coordinated effort by multiple agencies, marking one of the most significant rescue operations in recent years. Various departments and agencies complemented each other despite facing numerous challenges. The dedicated endeavours of the rescue teams have yielded favourable results," Gadkari posted on X (Formerly Twitter).

He further expressed gratitude to each agency and individual involved in this rescue operation.

"Deep appreciation for the international rescue experts, administrative officers, and the Uttarakhand government for their swift and effective response. I take this opportunity to thank the PM @narendramodi Ji, who has been constantly

monitoring the entire operation and providing guidance and support whenever required. CM Uttarakhand @pushkardhama Ji and my colleague @Gen_VKSingh Ji almost camped there during the operation. As workers were rescued, Kin of Anil Bedia, a worker from Ranchi, who was trapped in the Silkyara tunnel said, "We're feeling very good...we hope he comes out soon..."

"The exact time of breakthrough was 7:05 pm. Uttarakhand CM, Minister of State for Road Transport and Highways and Civil Aviation Gen VK Singh are present there," said Harpal Singh, Project Head, Zoji-la Tunnel.

Women wrestlers file written submissions against Brij Bhushan in sexual harassment case

The complainant women wrestlers have filed a written submission on framing of charges against MP Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh in the Sexual Harassment case.

The Rouse Avenue court is hearing arguments on charges over a sexual harassment case against former WFI Chief Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh.

The matter pertains to complaints filed by six women wrestlers alleging sexual harassment.

Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate (ACMM) Harjeet Singh Jaspal listed the matter on December 6 for filing written submissions by the Prosecution.

The court said that the parties can file additional written submissions in rebuttal. Accused Singh has already filed his written submissions on the last date.

On October 30, the court pulled up the counsel appearing to repeat the arguments on charges. ACMM Jaspal



had asked the counsels for all the parties to file written submissions. On a lighter side, the judge had referred to an old English saying, "When not able to clarify, just confuse." "You are confusing me, Mr Counsel," he pointed out towards the defence counsel.

ACMM Jaspal had said in the order that after hearing the arguments for a while this court encourages the three counsels for parties to file a written compilation of arguments so that the arguments can be concluded in a systematic manner.

The court noted that it was argued by the defence counsel Rajiv Mohan that this court has no jurisdiction to try any offence allegedly committed outside.

CM Mann slams Centre for step motherly treatment to Punjab

Asserting that BJP government at centre was suffering from anti-Punjab mindset, Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Tuesday slammed the Union government for meting out step motherly treatment to the state.

Taking part in the debate on floor of Punjab Vidhan Sabha, the Chief Minister said that it is surprising to note that though Punjab leads the country in contribution to the food pool besides giving maximum representation in the Indian Army but it is sad to note that the centre



has always ignored the state. He said that Punjab is not getting its legitimate

share of RDF despite of fulfilling all the conditions. Likewise, Bhagwant Singh Mann said that though the state collects the GST and gives it to the centre but then it has to beg for its share from the Union government. The Chief Minister said that the Modi government is suffering from anti-Punjab syndrome due to which they are hell bent on ruining the state. He said that if the will of BJP led NDA government prevails then they will omit the name of Punjab from the national anthem also. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that it is surprising that despite of this step motherly treatment the state BJP chief along with the former

Chief Minister of state are mum on the entire issue. The Chief Minister said that not only this the Union government is adopting hostile attitude towards the state and its farmers. He said that already due to the apathy of Union government the agriculture is no longer a profitable venture but now the centre is trying to abolish the MSP on the food grains. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that apart from it the Union government is putting the entire onus of environmental pollution in national capital on the farmers of the state by asserting that they are burning the paddy straw.

Hry CM orders termination of principal who misbehaved with students

Taking strict cognizance of the incident where the principal of Government Senior Secondary School for Girls, Uchana, Jind district had misbehaved with the students, the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal today issued termination orders of the said principal, Kartar Singh. The decision has been taken following the investigation report submitted by the department.

Divulging more details in this regard, an official spokesperson said that the state gov-

ernment in the exercise of powers conferred upon by virtue of Article 311 (b) of the Constitution had taken this action.

The spokesperson shared that the report sent by SDM (C) Uchana highlighted statements from several students against the principal's misconduct. Subsequently, considering the seriousness of the case and the allegations against the principal, this action has been taken. Notably, the accused had already been arrested by the police, and a female principal had been appointed at the respective school, along with the appointment of 16 new staff members.

Campaigning for Telangana polls ends, voting on November 30

Microphones fell silent and rallies ended as the longest campaigning period for the assembly elections among the five states going to polls came to a close in Telangana at 5 pm on Tuesday.

Addressing a press conference, Chief Electoral Officer Vikas Raj said, "It is 5 pm and the silent period has started. There are various restrictions that are put in place by the Election Commission of India. In the last 48 hours, basically tranquil period given to the voters to mull over things and come to a conclusion." The model code of conduct came into force in the

state after the Elections Commission announced the schedule on October 9. There are 3.26 crore eligible voters in the state. According to CEO, prohibitory orders under section 144 of CrPC have been promulgated across the state. BRS has fielded candidates in all 119 seats. As per the seat sharing agreement, BJP and Jana Sena are contesting in 111 and 8 seats respectively while Congress gave one seat to its ally CPI(M). Asaduddin Owaisi-led AIMM has put up candidates in nine segments in the city. The BRS is trying to retain power for a third consecutive term, while the Congress has been fighting tooth and nail to wrest power from it.

Pakistani girl killed by family for dancing in viral video with boys

LAHORE: A suspected honour killing tragically claimed the life of an 18-year-old girl in Pakistan's Kohistan region, orchestrated by her family. The incident stemmed from a viral social media video depicting the girl dancing with a few boys. The girl's companion, also seen in the video, narrowly escaped a similar fate due to timely police intervention.

The girl's family reportedly carried out the killing on the orders of a local jirga, a traditional council of elders. Another girl who appeared in the same video was also sentenced to death by the jirga but was rescued by police before the sentence could be carried out.

The girl's murder has sparked outrage in Pakistan, with many calling for an end to honour killings. Speaking to ARY News, District Police Officer (DPO) Mukhtiar Tanoli said that the police are investigating the incident and that the girl's family members have been arrested.

CJI Chandrachud welcomes judges from overseas to Supreme Court

NEW DELHI: Judges from different countries on Tuesday joined the Supreme Court bench headed by Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud. Judges from overseas including Ivory Coast, South Sudan, Cameroon, Botswana and Ghana, among others, were present at the apex court on Tuesday and attended court proceedings. CJI Chandrachud welcomed the judges from overseas to the Supreme Court saying, "I have very great pleasure in welcoming all of you to our court."

The judges from the offices of justice overseas are in the national capital to attend the first regional conference on Access to Legal Aid. The National Legal Services Authority, India (NALSA), together with the International Legal Foundation (ILF), the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), is hosting the first regional conference on Access to Legal Aid in Delhi.

The order stipulates that the Link Officers will perform the duties of the Secretary, Lokayukta during his leave, training, tour, election duty, or absence for more than two days due to any other reason, or in the event of a vacancy arising from the retirement or transfer of the Secretary.

Govt approves 14 new project under Rural Water Supply-State Plan

In an effort to bring a transforming change in lives of the state's rural population, the Haryana Government has decided to implement 14 new projects worth more than Rs. 32.69 crore under Augmentation Rural Water Supply-State Plan in 2 districts namely Fatehabad and Hisar.

Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal accorded administrative approval for these projects to be implemented by the Public Health Engineering Department here today.

Giving more information in this regard, an official spokesperson said that new works under Augmentation Rural Water Supply-State Plan include Laying of balance sewer lines in MC area of Narnaund Town of District Hisar with an estimated cost of Rs. 4.23 crore, Construction of Canal Based Water Works Baliyala for Group of 2 no. Fatehabad with an estimated cost of Rs. 23.32 lakh, Construction of Independent Canal Based Water Works at Village Madh, Block Nagpur Tehsil Ratia District Fatehabad with an estimated cost of Rs. 3.93 crore, Augmentation of Water Supply Scheme at Village Nangal, Tehsil Ratia District Fatehabad with an estimated cost of Rs. 1.04 crore, Providing and Laying of DI Water Supply pipeline in various streets of village Dulat Tehsil Tohana Distt. There will be no restriction on selling donated land. The letter has also asked all the Deputy Commissioners to make all the registration officers of the district well aware to further register the sale deeds after the approval of mutation in their favor by the respective Dhaulidars. Tourists resort Kufri, Manali, Dalhousie and Narkanda are

mainly dry but Mercury showed sudden decline in past 24 hrs. According to Meteorological Department Western Disturbances responsible for rain and snowfall in the winter season failed to make major impact as WDs are advanced towards Coastal areas of Gujarat and Western region of Rajasthan. India prepared, see no threat from China
respiratory infections: Expert

Stating that the latest respiratory illness outbreak in China is no threat to India, Dr Neeraj Kumar Gupta, Pulmonary Department Head at Safadarjung Hospital said, "we are well prepared." "I don't personally see any threat to India because we are well prepared. Even if it is a novel virus, we are well prepared because we have our past experience with us. Even the health ministry has issued guidelines so remain vigilant on this," Dr Gupta told ANI. China is reporting a large number of respiratory infections, particularly among children, and hospital wards are reportedly running full. "It is just one of the common viruses that exists and why it is happening in China is probably attributable to the fact



that there have been very severe lockdown situations for the last three years, which somehow led to the fall in herd immunity or the immune levels of the children and the vulnerable population, especially in the children in the last three years," said Dr Gupta. The likelihood that a section of

the Chinese population was not vaccinated could have also led to infectivity, the pulmonary specialist said. "Now it has been believed that it is maybe respiratory syncytial virus or maybe mycoplasma pneumoniae is a normal virus which exists normal bacteria which is why

they are sort of raising their head is probably because the immune level the children are gone down," he added. Further, the Safdarjung Hospital doctor also said the infection outbreak could also be linked to the winter season, where allergic tendencies are much higher. He urged people not to become complacent and should remain vigilant, especially by wearing masks and avoiding too much of social gatherings. Meanwhile, the central government reiterated that it was closely monitoring the surge in respiratory illness in children in parts of China. In its latest update, the Union Health Ministry said that there was no need for any alarm. The Union Health Ministry has been proactively reviewing the states' preparedness measures against respiratory illnesses as a matter of abundant caution.

Editorial

A broken pact

Last month, Donald Trump and several other Republican presidential candidates called for the deportation of international students in the United States of America who have expressed support for Palestine or criticised Israel's military response in Gaza. Donors, including Jewish philanthropic organisations, severed financial ties with major private universities in response to what they have described as the institutions' lack of explicit support for Israel. The Florida governor, Ron DeSantis, called on all affiliated institutions to deactivate their Students for Justice in Palestine chapters and investigate whether chapters of the SJP were supported by a foreign terrorist organisation.

The fatal blitz of violence that has flared in the Middle East since October 7 has sharpened political polarisation in American campuses to threatening levels. But the mercury of this threat has been high for a while, as anyone following the attacks on Critical Race Theory in US schools and colleges knows well. A total of 44 states have taken measures or are considering ways of restricting the teaching of CRT in schools and colleges. And it's not merely a post-Trump phenomenon. I recall the fevered atmosphere from my own student days on a US university campus in the years following 9/11 when the conservative writer and activist, David Horowitz, came out with his incendiary book, *The Professors: the 101 Most Dangerous Academics in America*, a hall of shame/fame (depending on your perspective) of the most radical-Left professors in American universities, who, according to the author, were destroying the nation's fabric. Praising the book as revealing the story of "almost any campus in America", the former Congressman, Jack Kingston, the sponsor of the congressional resolution for an Academic Bill of Rights, wrote: "Parents know college professors 'tend to be liberal' but they don't realize how truly anti-middle class and anti-American they can be."

Educationists such as Clark Kerr and David Larabee have variously pointed to the humble, local origins of the American institutions of higher education which have nourished its deep community connections and the popular support behind it, enhanced through the bonding of alumni-outreach and the festivity of collegiate and intramural athletics. Legislative measures such as the Land-Grant Acts and the GI. Bill supporting free college for returning soldiers also deepened the mass-appeal of college in the US. But those were 19th and 20th century phenomena and, now, in the second decade of the 21st century, that pact of faith between the general American populace and its institutions of higher education seems to be broken.

Indian women break the gender pay barrier in Ireland

Indian women in Ireland have broken a major glass ceiling to emerge as the highest median weekly earners in the country. Indian women are also the only female nationality grouping in Ireland to earn more than their male counterparts. Analysis of recently published data by the Irish Central Statistics Office shows that the median weekly earning of Indian women in 2022 was Euro 886.93 compared to Euro 670.90 in respect of all nationalities, male and female, resident in Ireland.

Indian women earned 45 per cent more than women Irish citizens (Euro 611.60) and about 50 per cent more than overall female median weekly earnings (Euro 592.92).

Indian females earned 4 per cent more than India males (Euro 852.98). With the exception of Indian nationals, median earnings for males were higher than for females across all nationality groupings.

In terms of median weekly earnings, Indian nationals ranked first in Ireland at Euro 873.38, followed by the UK nationals at Euro 710.32 (Euro 820.24 among males and Euro 582.34 for females).

Applauding the outstanding performance of Indian women in Ireland, Akhilesh Mishra, Ambassador of India to Ireland said, "It echoes the aspirational change in the people of India. The Indian diaspora in Ireland, now about 80,000 including 45,000 Indian citizens, is unique as it comprises mainly first generation, young, high-value professionals who are deeply connected with and influenced by the women-led, inclusive economic development ushered in by Prime Minister Modi." "What is happening in the Indian community here is a result of the paradigm change under PM Modi, shift from rhetorical pro-women slogans of the past to the comprehensive, life-cycle-based action in mission-mode for women empowerment."

Mishra added, "PM's personal initiatives like Swachhha Bharat, Beti Bachao Beti Padhao, Selfie with Daughter, support for women entrepreneurship and recognition of inspiring women role models in space, STEM research and other unconventional areas--all have reverberations in the Indian diaspora and have influenced



the dynamics of India-Ireland people-to-people ties as well. In a significant change, women from even tier 2, 3 cities are also coming to Ireland to pursue higher education and take up cutting-edge and challenging professional responsibilities. In the past couple of years, we also see a heartening trend of Indian women-led start-ups in Ire-

Newborn babies can detect beat in music: Study

According to new research, newborn babies can detect beats in music. The research, conducted by a team of scientists from the University of Amsterdam and the HUN-REN Research Centre for Natural Sciences (TTK) in Hungary, demonstrates that this ability to recognise a beat is not simply due to newborns' statistical learning ability, but that beat perception is a separate cognitive mechanism that is already active at birth.

The findings were published in the scholarly journal *Cognition*.

"There is still a lot we don't know about how newborn babies perceive, remember and process music," said author Henkjan Honing, professor of Music Cognition at the UvA.

"But, in 2009, we found clear indications that babies of just a few days old have the ability to hear a regular pulse in music - the beat - a characteristic that is considered essential for making and appreciating music."

Because the previous research from Honing and his colleagues had so far remained unreplicated and they still had many questions, the UvA and TTK joined forces once again - this time using a new paradigm.

In an experiment with 27 newborn babies, researchers manipulated the timing of drum rhythms to see whether babies make a distinction between learning the order of sounds in a drum rhythm (statistical learning) and being able to



recognise a beat (beat-induction).

The babies were presented with two versions of one drum rhythm through headphones. In the first version, the timing was isochronous: the distance between the sounds was always the same. This allows you to hear a pulse or beat in the rhythm.

In the other version, the same drum pattern was presented, but with random timing (jittered). As a result, beat perception was not possible, but the sequence of sounds could be learned. This allowed the researchers to distinguish between beat perception and statistical learning.

Because behavioural responses in newborn babies cannot be observed, the research was done with brain wave measurements (EEG) while the babies were sleeping.

Scientists uncover promising treatment target for heart arrhythmias



A new signalling mechanism associated with the development of ventricular fibrillation, a kind of arrhythmia or irregular heartbeat, has been uncovered in a study headed by Guadalupe Sabio and Jose Jalife at the Centro Nacional de Investigaciones Cardiovasculares (CNIC) in Madrid.

The findings of the study, which were published in the journal *Nature Cardiovascular Research*, offer hope for future therapy possibilities for this potentially fatal illness.

The most common cause of sudden cardiac mortality is ventricular fibrillation. Although ageing is a known risk factor for the development of cardiac arrhythmia, the mechanisms behind this link have been difficult to pinpoint, impeding

progress towards the development of specific treatments.

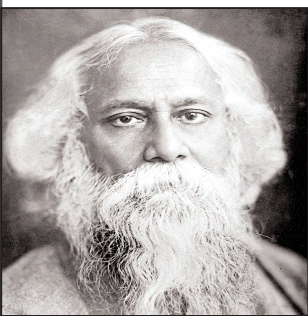
The heartbeat is a series of regular contractions of the cardiac muscle that efficiently pumps blood throughout the body. A highly coordinated contraction of the heart muscle cells in a painstakingly choreographed pattern is required to achieve this. When an arrhythmia develops, the heart cycle accelerates and becomes erratic, potentially resulting in death.

The CNIC researchers established a link between the development of ventricular fibrillation and the activation of two critical signalling proteins, the stress kinases p38 and p38, using animal models. The relationship with these enzymes was irrespective of the animals' gender.

Mine waste can threaten sensitive ecosystems



According to a University of Queensland study, about one-third of the world's mine tailings are deposited within or near protected conservation areas.

According to a study led by UQ's Bora Aska from the Sustainable Minerals Institute and School of the Environment, these waste facilities pose a significant risk to some of the world's most valuable species and environments.

The research has been published in *Nature Sustainability*. "Mine tailings contain the waste and residue that remains after mineral processing, and the storage facilities built to contain it

are some of the world's largest engineered structures," Ms Aska said.

"We found of the 1,721 disclosed tailings facilities, 9 per cent were within declared protected areas and 20 per cent were within five kilometres. "Our findings suggest that mine wastes threaten biodiversity within protected areas all over the world, including eight active tailings storage dams in Australian protected areas, recognised by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature." The 2015 Samarco dam failure in Brazil killed 19 people when a giant wave of mining waste washed across vil-

lages, farmland, and waterways. Four years later, 270 people were killed in another dam collapse near the town of Brumadinho in Brazil, destroying 133 hectares of Atlantic Forest and 70 hectares of Protected Areas downstream.

"Given the size of tailings facilities, we're concerned about the future risks of failures on areas important to biodiversity and conservation of species," Ms Aska said. "To assess the risks, we analysed a database of global tailings facilities and compared it with spatial data on protected areas." Information was drawn from the disclosures of pub-

licly listed companies as part of the Mining and Tailings Safety Initiative, set up after the Brumadinho disaster. UQ's Associate Professor Laura Sonter said managing mine waste will become an increasingly complicated sustainability challenge.

"Total tailings production is predicted to increase significantly in the next 30 years due to the growing demand for energy transition metals and declining ore grades," Dr Sonter said.

"Considering the current global distribution of tailings storage facilities and their failure rate, the consequences for biodiversity could be devastating."

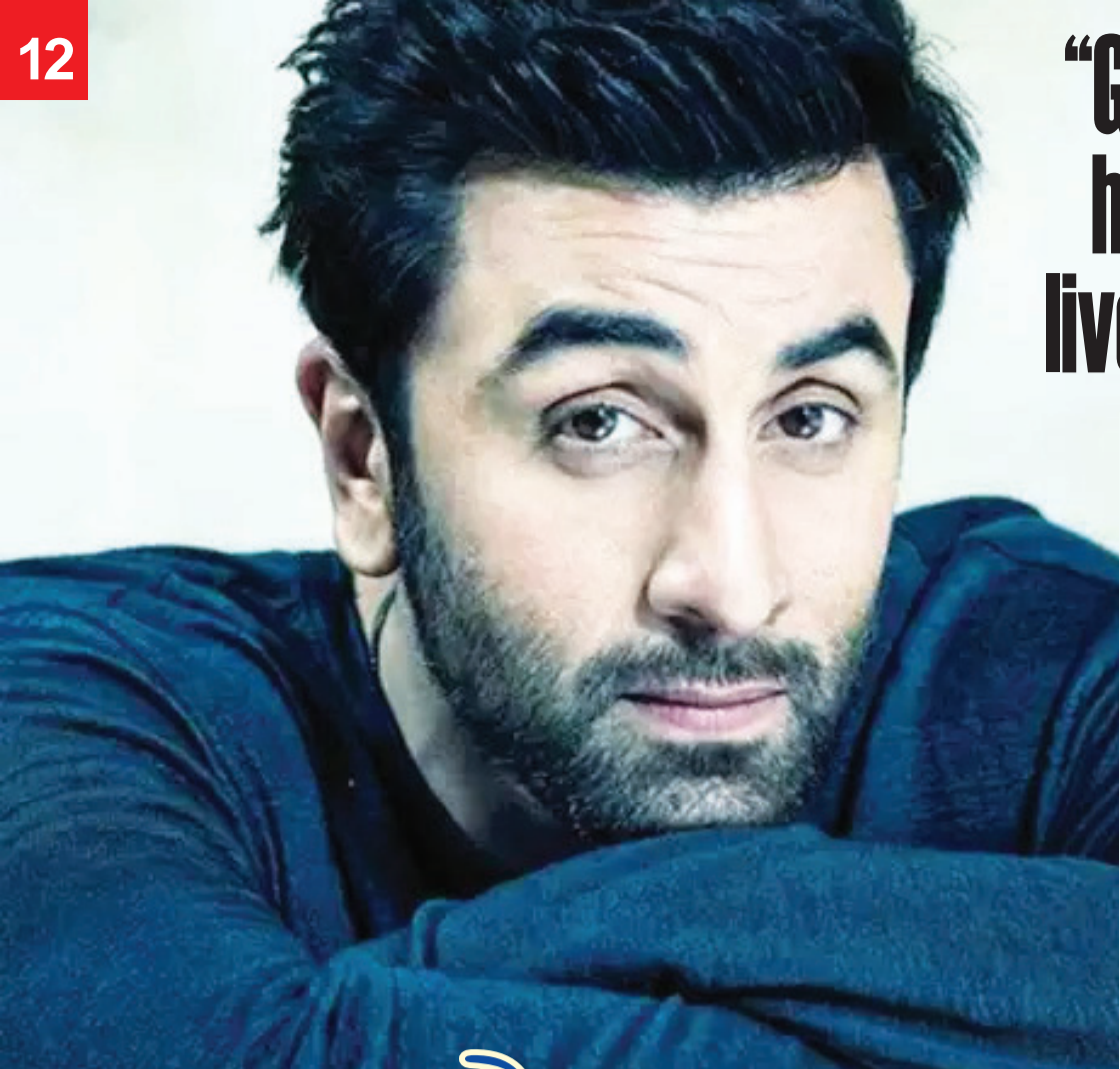
