India approves procurement of 97 Tejas jets

NEW DELHI: India on Thursday accorded an initial approval to procure an additional batch of 97 Tejas light combat aircraft and around 150 Prachand helicopters to boost the overall combat capability of the armed forces, official sources said. The Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) headed by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh also cleared a proposal of the Indian Air Force to upgrade its Su-30 fighter fleet, the sources said. It is learnt that mega procurement projects and the Su-30 upgrade programme are expected to cost the exchequer Rs 1.3 lakh crore.

Pb aims to increase share of renewable energy up to 43 per cent

CHANDIGARH: Punjab New and Renewable Energy Sources Minister Mr Aman Arora on Thursday said that the Punjab Government led by Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann has aimed to increase the share of renewable energy up to 43 per cent by 2030. While addressing the 2nd edition of Monaco Hydrogen Forum at Monaco, Mr. Aman Arora said that Punjab is a power surplus state having installed capacity of 15000 MW, out of which 20% (3000 MW) is being generated by renewable energy projects. He said that Punjab is eager to set up a 5 TPD Pilot Technology Demonstration project for producing green hydrogen from paddy straw. He said that the state is committed to lead the nation in producing green fuel to meet the future challenges, which will not only bring prosperity but will also ensure energy security for the country.

Hry DGP inaugurates State-of-the-Art Police E-Library

CHANDIGARH : Marking a significant step towards providing advanced learning resources for students, Director General of Police Shatruijeet Kapur inaugurated the first-ever police e-library in Sonapat district. During the inauguration, DGP Kapur highlighted the state-of-the-art facilities in the e-library, emphasizing its substantial benefits for students preparing for competitive examinations. The event witnessed a large participation of students from various government and degree colleges, along with students from DAV Police Public School. DGP took the opportunity to inspect the e-library premises and familiarize himself with the facilities available for the students.

Telangana Polls: 63.94 pc voter turnout recorded

HYDERABAD: Telangana recorded a voter turnout of 63.94 per cent till 5 pm in the assembly polls for 119 seats, according to the Election Commission of India. According to the Election Commission, Medak recorded a voter turnout of 80.28 per cent, Mahabubabad at 77.50 per cent, Adilabad at 73.58 per cent, Hanamankonda at 62.46 per cent and Hyderabad at 31.17 per cent till 5 pm. Jangaon recorded 80.23 percent of voter turnout, while Kamareddy recorded 71%.

Rain lashes parts of Punjab, Haryana; snow in Kashmir

Rain lashed Chandigarh and many parts of Punjab on Thursday, bringing down the temperature by a few notches.

In Punjab, Pathankot, Gurdaspur, Amritsar, Mohali, Rupnagar, Rajpura were among the places that received rains, according to the MeT Department here. In neighbouring Haryana, Ambala and Panchkula received showers. Chandigarh, the common capital of the two states, was also lashed by heavy rains.

Meanwhile Upper reaches of Kashmir valley received fresh snowfall while plains were lashed by rains resulting in

closure of many roads as a precautionary measure, disrupting normal activities on Thursday.

Ski resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir received a fresh snowfall much to the delight of the tourists staying there. Doodpathri, Sonamarg, Mughal road, Pir Panjal range of mountains in south Kashmir and upper reaches of Kupwara and Bandipora also received fresh snowfall today.

Historical Mughal road connecting south Kashmir's Shopian district with the twin districts of Poonch and Rajouri in Jammu division has been closed as a precautionary measure due to accumulation of fresh snow on the road, a traffic official said. Traffic on strategic Srinagar-Sonam-



arg-Gumri road connection Zojila pass in Ladakh was also suspended due to the fresh snowfall. However, traffic officials said "snow clearance operation is in progress and after getting green signal, the road would be put through for vehicular traffic". Sadhna Top, Chowkibal Tangdhar, and Keran roads in the north Kashmir were also closed for traffic movement after fresh snowfall. Kashmir valley plains including Srinagar, the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir, were lashed by rains disrupting normal activities on Thursday. Meteorological department forecast said to moderate rain at many places with thunderstorm/lightning and light snow over middle & higher reaches of Jammu and Kashmir today.

Exit polls give BJP edge in Raj, close fight in MP, Telangana

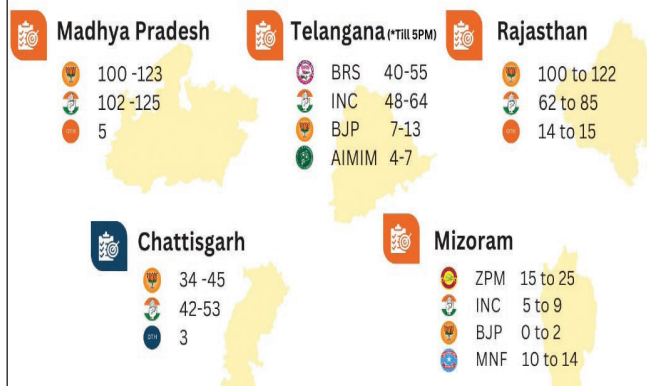
Exit polls are predicting two strikes out of three in the heartland states for the BJP and one for the Congress. While Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel gets to retain his job, his counterpart in Rajasthan, Ashok Gehlot, might just lose his, they indicate. There also seems little doubt that In Madhya Pradesh will go to the BJP -- again.

The biggest upset, though, could be reserved for Telangana, where K Chandrasekhar Rao's Bharat Rashtra Samithi has been in power since the inception of the state since 2014. Three exit polls seem to be in no doubt that the BRS will be replaced by the Congress in this election. A fourth is also giving the Congress an edge.

For Mizoram, two exit polls feel a hung house could be in the cards.

Six exit polls on Chhattis-

Congress likely to retain Chhattisgarh



garh by and large, predict a second term for Bhupesh Baghel, with the number of seats allotted to the party staying within the margin of early 40s to mid-50s. The majority mark in the 90-seat state is 46.

India Today- Axis My India is predicting that Congress could win 40-50 of the state's 90 seats. Jan Ki Baat is predicting 34-45 seats for the BJP and 42-53 seats for the Congress.

The seventh -- News 24-To-

day's Chanakya, is predicting 33 seats for the BJP and 57 for the Congress.

Madhya Pradesh, where the Congress won in 2018 but had its government collapse in 2018, is apparently proving tricky to predict. Only one of the three exit polls indicate that the Congress -- in an outer margin -- could hit the halfway mark in the 230-seat state.

Jan ki Baat is predicting 100-123 seats for the BJP, Republic TV- Matriz is giving it 118 to 16 seat and TV 9 Bharatvarsh- Polstrat is saying the party could win 106-116 seats.

Rajasthan, which routinely votes out the incumbent since early '90s, is apparently sticking to the trend. Two of three exit polls have predicted a clear victory for the BJP -- a third predicts the margin could be slim.

In Mizoram, neither Congress, nor the BJP and its allies may reach majority mark, indicate two exit polls.

Case against individual in US and linking with Indian official matter of concern: MEA

The Ministry of External Affairs has responded to the US Justice Department indictment of an Indian national in an alleged foiled assassination plot in the US. In a news briefing the MEA on Thursday said that a case filed against an individual in a US court and allegedly linking him to an Indian official is a "matter of concern" and is contrary to government policy.

"We cannot share any further information on such security matters. As regards the case against an individual that has been filed in a US court allegedly linking him to an Indian official, this is a matter of concern. We have said and let me reiterate that this is contrary to government policy. The nexus between organised crime, trafficking and gun running and extremists at an international level is a serious issue for law enforcement agencies and organisations to consider and it is precisely for that reason that a high-level committee has been constituted and we will obviously be guided by its results" MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said.

The MEA spokesperson said that the US side shared some inputs related to nex-



us between organised crimes, gun runners, terrorists and extremists and India takes these inputs "very seriously." "During the course of discussions with US on bilateral security cooperation, the US side shared some inputs pertaining to nexus between organised crimes, gun runners, terrorists and extremists. We take such inputs very seriously and high-level inquiry committee has been constituted to look into all the relevant aspects of the matter, and necessary follow-up action will be taken based on the findings of the inquiry committee. You would have seen this in our statements that we have issued" MEA spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said. The MEAs statement comes after the Justice Department unsealed an indictment against an Indian national for his alleged involvement in a foiled plot to assassinate a US-based leader of the Sikh Separatist Movement and a citizen in New York.

Punjab police avert target killings; Gangster Jassa Happowal held

Amidst the ongoing campaign to make Punjab a safe and secure state as per the vision of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Punjab Police have got major breakthrough with the arrest of notorious Gangster Karanjit Singh alias Jassa Hapowal— an operative of a foreign-based Gangster Rajesh Kumar alias Sonu Khatri and Jaspreet Singh alias Jassa Mohanwalia, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Thursday.

"Gangster Jassa Hapowal was wanted in at least six murder cases including the sensational double-murder of a mother and daughter, which took place in village Bhojwal in Jalandhar Rural last month, and other heinous crimes," he said. The accused had also put Kerosene oil on the bodies and faces of both deceased women before setting them ablaze.



Police teams have also recovered two pistols— including .30 bore and .32 bore— along with two magazines and 10 live cartridges from their possession, besides, impounding his black-coloured Splendour Motorcycle sans registration number plate. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that following reliable inputs that Jassa Hapowal on directions of his foreign-based handlers hatching a conspiracy to execute 3-4 target killings and is on the way to conduct recee one of his next targets, teams from Counter Intelligence Jalandhar devised a meticulous plan and successfully arrested him after intercepting his motorcycle at outskirts of Jalandhar.

AAP to seek public opinion on whether Kejriwal should resign as CM if arrested

The AAP will run a signature campaign from December 1 to 20 to get people's feedback on whether Arvind Kejriwal should resign as Delhi chief minister if he is arrested under a "conspiracy by the BJP", the party's city convener Gopal Rai said Thursday.

Addressing a press conference along with party MP Raghav Chadha, Rai alleged the BJP has hatched a conspiracy to get Kejriwal arrested under the "fake" liquor scam case with the hope of finishing the Aam Aadmi Party.

Under the "Mai Bhi Kejriwal" campaign from Friday, AAP volunteers will carry pamphlets to get the signatures of the people at all the 2,600 polling stations across the city, asking for their opinion on whether Kejriwal should step down as Delhi chief minister if he is arrested, he said. Rai said Kejriwal had met with AAP MLAs and councillors seeking their opinion on the issue and there was consensus that he should not resign and run the government from jail. He said from December 21 to December 24, the AAP will hold 'Jan Samvad' in every ward of the city to discuss the alleged liquor scam with people as well as "the BJP's conspiracy to get Kejriwal arrested."

Four months after leaving for Pakistan to marry her love, Anju returns to India

Anju, alias Fatima, who had travelled to a remote village in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) province of Pakistan to marry her Facebook love Nasrullah, has disclosed to intelligence agencies that after taking a divorce from her Indian husband she will try to take her children to Pakistan.

Anju, a resident of Alwar district in Rajasthan, has returned to India from Pakistan on Wednesday through Integrated Check Post (ICP) Attari Road. She was questioned by officials of Intelligence agencies including the



Intelligence Bureau and Research and Analysis Wing the moment she entered India after completing formalities.

In interaction with intelligence

agencies, she disclosed that she had gone to Pakistan on July 21.

She claimed that she married Pakistani national Nasrullah after converting to Islam from Christianity. Nasrullah lives in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (KPK) area of Pakistan. Although she failed to produce any document related to her marriage with Nasrullah when officials asked about it. As per her disclosure to intelligence agencies, she fell in love with Nasrullah through Facebook. Nasrullah is in the pharmaceutical business. She was active on social media and was popular in Indian and Pakistani Media.

On being specifically asked about

her connection with Pakistani Defence personnel, she denied of any such connection. Lastly, she said that after taking a divorce from her Indian husband she will try to take her children to Pak.

After being questioned for around an hour, she left for Amritsar airport from where she travelled to Delhi.

Originally from Bhiwadi in Rajasthan, Anju was married has a 15-year-old son and a four-year-old daughter. In June, she left for Pakistan to meet her Facebook love Nasrullah. In Pakistan, Anju converted to Islam to marry Nasrullah and changed her name to Fatima.

commodities determined,
DC issues notification

UNA: Under the Prevention of Hoarding and Profiteering Act, District Magistrate Raghav Sharma of Una has issued a notification determining the maximum sale rates of essential items in Una district. According to the notification, the maximum sale rates in Una district for goat and sheep meat have been set at Rs. 500 per kilogram, pork at Rs. 250, broiler chicken at Rs. 220, live chicken at Rs. 150, and dressed chicken at Rs. 210 per kilogram. However, the price of fish will remain as per the rates determined by the Fisheries Department. Additionally, new rates have been set for milk at Rs. 60 per liter, paneer at Rs. 320 per kilogram, and yogurt at Rs. 70 per kilogram. As per the notification, the rates for full diets available at hotels and dhabas have been set at Rs. 80 for rice, chapati, lentils, vegetables, and curry, while the half diet is priced at Rs. 50. Tawa chapati will be sold for Rs. 7 and tandoori for Rs. 8 each. The maximum price for a special vegetable plate is Rs. 70, rice plate at Rs. 50, raita at Rs. 50, meat plate with 5 pieces at Rs. 130, chicken plate with 5 pieces at Rs. 110, chana bhatura with 2 bhaturas and chana at Rs. 55, and chana plate with two samosas at Rs. 50. The notification mandates issuing cash memos for all shopkeepers, and it's mandatory for the shopkeeper to have a duplicate copy for inspection.

SC quashes re-appointment of Dr Gopinath as Kannur University VC

Supreme Court on Thursday quashed the re-appointment of Dr Gopinath Raveendran as the Vice Chancellor of Kannur University. A three-judge bench of the Top Court, headed by CJI Dr Dhananjaya Yeshwant Chandrachud, and also comprising Justices J B Pardiwala and Manoj Misra, pronounced the verdict. The Apex Court pronounced the verdict after it reviewed petitions challenging Gopinath Ravindran's re-appointment as VC. Premachandran Keezhoth, member of the Kannur University senate, and Shino P Jose, member of the Academic Council had knocked the doors of the SC against the re-appointment process. While setting aside the Kerala High Court's order of upholding the re-



appointment of Gopinath Ravindran as Vice Chancellor of Kannur University, the Top Court noted in its judgement that the appointment was vitiated by the undue interference from the Government of Kerala. Justice Pardiwala, who pronounced the judgment on behalf of the bench, said that this court pronounced the verdict after considering four



questions -- Whether re-appointment is permissible in a tenure post, Whether the upper age limit of 60 years as stipulated in Section 10(9) of the Kannur University Act is applicable even in the case of reappointment for four years, Whether re-appointment has to follow the same process as the appointment of VC by setting up a selection

The Hindi Lancet

The Lancet, the highest-ranking international general medical journal originally published from London since 1823, has decided, on its two hundredth year, to publish bimonthly versions in Hindi, translating original texts in English. Two questions spring to mind immediately: is this part of a larger programme of vernacularisation of Western medical education in India? Who will benefit from such an endeavour?

The wisdom and the practicality of the former, distinct from teaching traditional Indian medicine in native languages, had been variously tested since the introduction of Western medical education in India. The need to teach Western medicine to Indians arose from the East India Company's requirement to populate newly-built hospitals, especially military ones, with skilled assistants to English surgeons. Between the Charter Act of 1813 for spreading basic education amongst the native youth and Lord Macaulay's famous Minutes of 1935, which specified English as the only medium in higher education, several models were tried to select the curriculum of medical teaching and the medium of instruction. The first models were designed by orientalist impressed by ancient Indian scriptures guiding native medical practices; consequently, they tried some hybrid models keeping room for classical Indian texts along with texts in English to deal with the evolving Western knowledge about human anatomy and physiology. Medicine was taught through the Native Medical Institution, a specialised college set up in 1822, and also through special courses for ayurveda and unani at Sanskrit College and the Calcutta Madrasa. These got abolished in 1935 with the foundation of the Bengal Medical College that taught medicine solely through English. Surprisingly, the native youth could take instructions quite profitably through the new system.

Necessities of the army and the expanding public health infrastructure however prompted the gradual introduction of supplementary courses like a military class that was taught in Urdu as well as in Bengali and hybrid classes to grant licentiate medical diplomas. These courses brought to the fore the raging controversy regarding the selection of the ideal recipient Indian language — Sanskrit or Arabic or Hindi, Urdu, Bengali — for foreign texts. Throughout the 19th century, scholars grappled with the problem of translating medical terms, many of which were in Greek or Latin, into native vernacular texts. On the imperial government's bidding, Rajendra Lal Mitra, the noted historian.

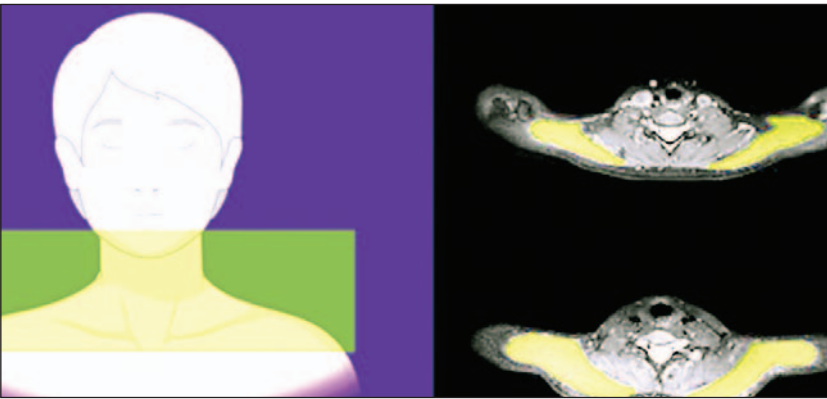

Common headaches linked to neck inflammation



According to a study presented at the annual conference of the Radiological Society of North America (RSNA), researchers discovered empirical evidence of how the neck muscles are implicated in primary headaches. The discoveries may lead to better treatments.

The distinct underlying causes of primary headaches are still not fully understood. The most common primary headaches are tension-type headaches and migraines.

"Our imaging approach provides first objective evidence for the very frequent involvement of the neck muscles in primary headaches, such as neck pain in migraine or tension-type headache, using the ability to quantify subtle inflammation within muscles," said Nico Sollmann, M.D., Ph.D., resident in the Department of Diagnostic and Interventional Radiology at University Hospital Ulm, and the Department of Diagnostic and Interventional Neuroradiology at University Hospital Rechts der Isar in Munich, Germany.

Tension-type headaches affect two out of every three adults in the U.S. People with tension-type headaches often feel a tightening in the head and mild to moderate dull pain on both sides of the head. While these headaches are typically associated with stress and muscle tension, their exact origin is not fully understood. Migraines are characterized by a severe throbbing pain. Migraines generally occur on one side of the head, or the pain is worse on one side. Migraines may also cause nausea, weakness.

One in seven male gym goers consider impact on fertility



According to a new study, young male gym goers are mostly unaware of the implications of their lifestyle on their fertility.

New results from a survey of 152 gym enthusiasts, published in Reproductive Bio-Medicine Online found that men were largely unaware of the risks to their fertility from aspects of gym lifestyle including protein supplements, which can contain high levels of estrogen, used by 79% of male respondents.

When questioned about their concern about fertility, more than half (52%) of male participants said that they had thought about their fertility before. However, only 14% of men who took part had considered how gym routines or supplement use might impact on fertility. Further data shows that there was a significant difference in responses about whether the benefits of gym

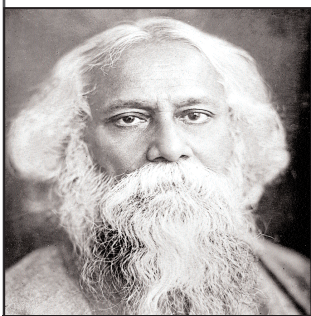
routines and supplements were more important to them than fertility, with 38% disagreeing and 28% agreeing. Female participants meanwhile were more aware of the impact of gym lifestyle on male fertility.

Dr Meurig Gallagher from the University of Birmingham and lead author of the study said: "Being healthy and having a healthy lifestyle is a good thing. In the context of male fertility, the concern is over the increasing use of protein supplements. The main concern is the high levels of the female hormone estrogen that comes from both whey and soy protein supplements. Too much female hormone can cause problems with the amount and quality of sperm that a man can produce. Many protein supplements that can be bought have been found to be contaminated by anabolic steroids, which can cause reduced sperm count, shrunken testicles.

Study finds how to evaluate quality of global water models



Researchers from IIASA contributed to a new multinational study that examined how well global water models agree with one another and with observational data. The researchers can show where the models agree and where they disagree using a new evaluation method.

Global water models are essential tools for understanding the water cycle, including to help understand the impacts of climate change.

Many of these impacts are felt in society as a result of changes in water extremes such as increased droughts and floods, which represent significant hazards to people and ecosystems.

However, there are changes in general water availability, such as soil moisture, which is vital for agriculture, or groundwater recharge, which is crucial for the sustainable use of ground-

water. However, differences between the results of several global water models make such model-based conclusions dubious. These discrepancies have not yet been thoroughly quantified, and past evaluation methodologies have provided limited information on how the models could be improved. The new study, published in Nature Water, is the first to explore large-scale correlations between climatic and hydrological variables to uncover disparities within models and in contrast to observational data.

"In observational data, for example, we see a strong correlation between precipitation and groundwater recharge over the African continent. Not all models represent this relationship accurately and we need to understand how realistic the different model results are," explained study lead author Sebastian Gnam, who worked on the study while associated with the University of Potsdam.

Peter Burek and Yoshihide Wada, both associated with the Water Security Research Group in the IIASA Biodiversity and Natural Resources Programme, contributed to the water cycle representation of global models in the study using the IIASA Community Water Model (CWatM) - an open-source model developed for the assessment of water supply and human and environmental water demands at both global and regional levels. "The Inter-Sectoral Impact Model Intercomparison Project (ISI-MIP) is not only a great way to compare and frame the uncertainties associated with global water models but also to bring all our models a step further by looking at the functional relationships," noted Burek.

Lie on your back with your knees bent and your feet on the floor. Lift your legs towards the ceiling, rolling your hips off the floor. Lower your legs back down without letting them touch the ground.
3. Bicycle Crunch

including the lower abs, through a twisting motion. Steps To Perform (Bicycle Crunch)
Lie on your back with knees behind your head. Lift your legs off the ground and bring one knee towards the opposite elbow. Simultaneously, straighten the other leg. Repeat in a cycling motion.

4. Alligator Walk
Why Does It Work? Alligator Walk targets the entire core, promoting stability and strength, with a particular focus on the lower abs. Steps To Perform (Alligator Walk)
Start in a plank position. Walk hands and feet laterally, maintaining a plank. Move for a set distance or time.
5. Body Saw

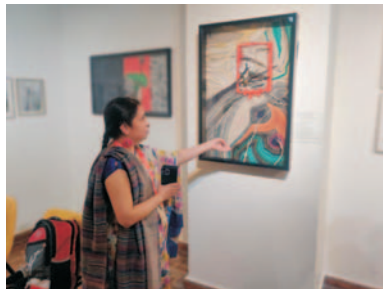

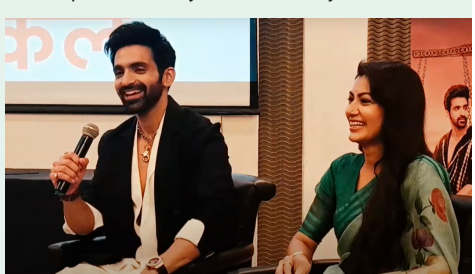

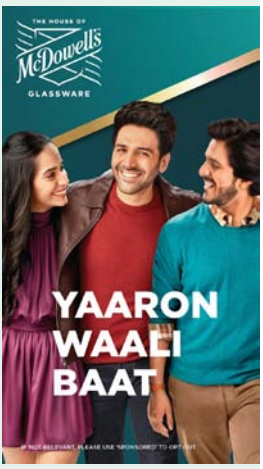

1) Tell us about your character in the show. I am playing the role of Heer Kaur Virk, she is a beautiful young woman born into a Jatt family in Punjab. This vivacious Sikhni is an aspiring lawyer. A benevolent soul who prays for everyone's well-being, she is dearly loved by her family and her father, and their happiness is her top priority. However, her life takes an unexpected turn when she marries into the Atwal Family, making everyone wonder - Jisne maangi sabki khair ... Waqt ne kiya hai.... kyun us se bair?

2) Have you made any specific preparations for the character of Heer? Heer is a very strong girl, and I am very excited that I am getting the opportunity to portray this character on screen. Being a Gujarati, playing the role of a Punjabi girl was an interesting challenge. I had to put in a lot of work and effort to get into the skin of the character. As the show is based in Punjab, we do pepper the Hindi with a bit of Punjabi, so it is important for me to get my diction right. I must say that my co-star Avinash has been a blessing for me as he has helped me work on my pronunciation. Honestly, the entire learning process has been fun, and he has made one of the most difficult aspects of my preparation, easy!

3) You visited Amritsar and Chandigarh recently for the show, tell us about your experience of shooting in the city. We shot the promo and a couple of scenes in Amritsar and completed a more elaborate schedule in Chandigarh. It has been a fascinating experience running through the by-lanes of Punjab, shooting beautiful as well as dramatic sequences for the show. It is a gripping tale of love, resilience, and the unbreakable bond of a unique friendship.
