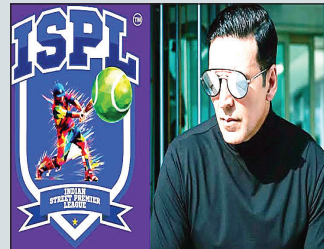

**Sanjay Raut booked for sedition over objectionable article on PM Modi**

**NAGPUR:** Shiv Sena MP Sanjay Raut in big trouble as an FIR was filed against him on charges of sedition and other offences on Tuesday for allegedly writing an objectionable article on Prime Minister Modi in the party's publication, 'Saamana'. Sanjay Raut, while commenting on the Prime Minister in his article in the 'Saamana' newspaper on December 10, said that the Prime Minister and his government are taking shortcuts from Pakistan and even attacking the country to win the elections. 'Saamana,' a newspaper in Marathi, is circulated in the state of Maharashtra, India. It was first published on January 23, 1988. The founder of Shiv Sena, Bal Thackeray, launched the paper.

**India rejects OIC's comments on SC verdict on J-K**

**NEW DELHI:** India on Wednesday strongly rejected the comments by the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) expressing concern over the Supreme Court's verdict upholding the 2019 revocation of Article 370 of the Constitution that gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir. External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said the OIC's action at the behest of a "serial violator of human rights and an unrepentant promoter of cross border terrorism" makes its action even more questionable. Though Bagchi did not name any country, it was clear that the reference was towards Pakistan.

**Former Hry Cong chief Ram Prakash passes away**

**KURUKSHETRA:** Former Haryana Congress president Dr Ram Prakash passed away at the age of 84 at his residence here on Wednesday, family sources said. Prakash, who was also a former Haryana minister and a Rajya Sabha MP, was ailing for some time. The last rites will be performed later today, family sources said.

**Gujarat AAP MLA Bhayani resigns, says will join BJP**

**AHMEDABAD:** In a jolt to the Aam Aadmi Party in Gujarat, its MLA Bhupendra Bhayani resigned as member of the state legislative assembly and primary membership of the party on Wednesday, claiming AAP was not the right platform to serve people.

## Security breach in LS, two persons enter House, open gas canisters

### Two another held with colour smoke outside Parliament

There was a major security breach during Zero Hour in Parliament at 1.02 pm on Wednesday after two men, both carrying smoke canisters emitting an as yet unidentified yellow smoke, jumped from the visitors' gallery and ran into the Lok Sabha chamber. Incredible footage from the House's CCTV system showed one man, wearing a dark blue shirt, leaping across desks to evade capture, while the second was in the visitors' gallery spraying smoke. Both men were overpowered by MPs and security staff.

Meanwhile Delhi Police has arrested two people protesting with 'colour smoke' outside the Parliament, as two others, who jumped from Lok Sabha gallery, were also nabbed.

The two arrested from outside Parliament were protesting in front of Transport Bhawan and were taken to Parliament Street Police Station.

Lok Sabha resumed at 2 pm, with Speaker Om Birla making a brief statement. "We are investigating the matter and have asked Delhi Police to join the inquiry," he told understandably agitated MPs.

"Both have been caught and the materials with them have also been seized. The two people (they have been identified as Sagar Sharma and D Manoranjan) outside

Parliament have also been arrested."

Earlier, shocking visuals shared by news agency showed a Lok Sabha official

reading to the House seconds before the chaos. Suddenly, shouts of "catch him, catch him" can be heard. Congress MP Rahul Gandhi and union ministers Hardeep Singh Puri and Anupriya Patel were present at the time. The two Lok Sabha intruders have been identified as Sagar Sharma and D Manoranjan. A visitor's pass was recovered after the two intruders were caught and it indicates they were issued by the office of Pratap Simha, the BJP MP from Mysuru in Karnataka. Any visitor must clear five levels of security before being allowed inside Parliament.



## Accused Neelam belongs to Hisar

**HISAR:** The two persons protesting outside Parliament were identified as Neelam, 42, of Haryana's Hisar, and Amol Shinde, 25, of Maharashtra's Latur area. After opening the gas canisters that emitted smoke outside the Parliament building, the two shouted "Tanashahi Nahi Chalegi" (dictatorship will not be allowed), "Bharat Mata Ki Jai" and "Jai Bheem, Jai Bharat," said officials. Neelam, one of the four suspects arrested in connection with the security breach at the Parliament, is a resident of Haryana's Jind district. "She was in Hisar for her studies, and was highly qualified. She used to participate in farmer protests earlier," said a local at the village, where Neelam hails from.

## CM clears his intentions to develop Himachal as Tourism Capital of India

He said that restoration work was done on war footing after the destruction caused by the natural calamity and Himachal Pradesh was ready for welcoming the tourists during this winter and all seasons to come. He extended invitation to the domestic and foreign tourists through India Today platform to visit Himachal Pradesh to enjoy the immense treasured natural scenic beauty of the State relax in solitude.

While speaking in the ses-



sion 'Ek Saal Kitna Asardar', the Chief Minister detailed his commitment to the people of the state and focus areas of his government besides major decisions and policies framed by the state government. He said that the foremost priority, after taking over the reins of Himachal Pradesh as the Chief Minister was to improve the de-railed financial health of the state and added that he envisaged making Himachal Pradesh as the most prosperous state of the country within next ten years. Efforts were being undertaken to ensure proper management of funds and a shift towards improvement of financial condition of the state will be witnessed soon, he added.

Three guarantees have been fulfilled in the first one year of the government and the rest will be fulfilled in the coming four years in a phased manner.

## No government school will be deprived of any facilities: CM Mann

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Wednesday conducted a surprise inspection to several government schools in the district to take first hand information about the ongoing revolutionary changes in the state's education sector.

The Chief Minister visited School of Eminence in Sukho Majra and Government Senior Secondary School in Lutheri, Rupnagar and others to inspect the existing facilities. During the visit, he emphasized that his intention was

not to instill panic but to personally inspect the working of the government schools, aiming to guarantee quality education for children as well as address any shortcomings.

To address the transportation shortage for students commuting from remote areas, the Chief Minister said that the state government is providing buses to all government schools, aiming to ensure that no student is denied education due to resource constraints. He said that earlier insufficient resources led to the mid-way dropout of children, particularly girls due to which the scheme



was introduced. However, Bhagwant Singh Mann now, every student will receive the essential facilities needed

## Three killed, 20 seriously hurt as water tank collapses at Burdwan railway station

At least three people were killed and 20 others injured when the large overhead water tank fell on them when they were waiting on the platform at Burdwan Railway station in West Bengal on Wednesday.

Eyewitnesses said nearly 54,000 gallon capacity water tank suddenly fell on the waiting 23 passengers on the combined platforms 2 and 3. They are waiting to catch local trains.

Those injured were immediately evacuated to the Burdwam Medical College and Hos-



pital where three persons succumbed to their injuries.

## Parliament passes bill to set up central tribal university in Telangana

The Parliament on Wednesday passed the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2023 with Rajya Sabha clearing the legislation.

The bill paves way for setting up a central tribal uni-



versity by the name of "Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal University" in the state of Telangana.

The Upper House passed the bill by voice vote after discussion. Lok Sabha has already cleared the bill.

As many as 12 members in the House participated in the discussion on the bill and supported it.

Replying to the discussion on the Central Universities (Amendment) Bill, 2023,

Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan said that establishment of tribal university would focus on tribal education.

During the reply, Pradhan rejected the charge of one of the members that the government was trying to re-write history books under new education policy. He said that TMC member Dola Sen alleged that the government was re-writing history text-books but the fact was that the West Bengal government attempted to come up with its own education policy but has ended up copying 99% of the content of the Centre's education policy. The Minister further said that some other state governments are also trying to bring their own education policy but are going to take cue from the National Education Policy eventually. Pradhan also dismissed the contention by some members that dropout rate in higher education institutions in case of SC, ST and OBC students had increased. "It was said during discussion that dropout rate among students from SC, ST and OBC in higher education institutions had increased. But the fact is that in the last five years, 2,66,433 general category students took admission in IIT.

## Parts of Dallake freeze as min temp dips in Kashmir

Parts of Dal Lake and other water bodies froze as temperature plummeted in Srinagar and other major parts of Kashmir Valley Tuesday night.

Srinagar recorded a season's lowest at minus 5.3 degree Celsius.

A thick layer of frozen surface emerged at several interior parts of the famous Dal Lake, including Chunti Khul, a rivulet connecting it to Srinagar, and other water bodies due to a further fall in the minimum temperature all across the Kashmir valley on Wednesday.

The boatmen were rowing their boats by breaking the icy surface of the lake to move forward in the cold



weather conditions coupled with fog. Some people were holding the

icy sheets in their hands while expressing joy. Small rivulets, nallas,

and streams connecting the interior parts of Dal Lake were covered with a thick layer of frozen ice sheets as cold conditions prevailed in Srinagar, with temperatures plummeting to minus 5.3 °C on Wednesday, which was 4.3° below normal during this period of the season for the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir.

Srinagar is facing intensely cold weather conditions and has experienced the coldest night temperature of the season so far.

Reports of frozen water taps were received at many places in Srinagar with the falling temperature. Many water bodies were also frozen at Pahalgam, Gulmarg, and Kupwara following a dip in temperature.

Despite warnings, if people continue to display advertisements, the enforcement team will take action under the Municipal Corporation Act and Advertisement Policy, imposing penalties and filing FIRs. She emphasized that illegally placed advertisement boards not only distract drivers but also deteriorate the city's aesthetics.

# Litchi growers' concerns to be addressed on priority: Jauramajra

In reaffirming Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann's commitment to enhancing horticulture in Punjab and improving farmers' income, Horticulture Minister S. Chetan Singh Jauramajra, on Wednesday, directed concerned department officials to promptly address the issues of the litchi growers of Gurdaspur and Pathankot.

During the meeting at Punjab Bhawan, Cabinet Minister S. Chetan Singh Jauramajra asked the PSPCL about farmers' demand for 10 hours of uninterrupted power supply at night in the peak season of April and May for litchi growers, directing Chief Engineer PSPCL Mr. Satinder Sharma to prioritize fulfilling this demand. The Minister instructed Mr. Chander Gaind, Secretary, Water Resources Department to ensure timely repair of canals and minors for ensuring uninterrupted canal water supply for litchi orchards during the summer season. He said that the delay in cleaning and repairing of canals in March and



April, disrupts water supply to litchi orchards, impacting the fruit yield. The Horticulture Minister instructed Mr. Ranbir Singh, General Manager, Punjab Agro to explore litchi export possibilities, ensuring the marketing of litchi within the state and abroad, aiming to increase profits for growers. Likewise, the Cabinet Minister asked the scientists from Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana to develop new litchi varieties and create specific packaging suitable for export. In re-

sponse to farmers' demand for installing solar systems in orchards, the Cabinet Minister directed Mr. Rajesh Bansal, Joint Director of PEDDA to take action and provide solar pumps for these orchards, emphasizing that based on the Horticulture Department's recommendation, a range of 500 to 1000 solar pumps should be allocated for the growers. The Cabinet Minister asked Mrs. Shailender Kaur, Director of Horticulture Department to ensure that recommended insecti-

cides / fungicides are provided to the farmers through a special outlet at Litchi Estate. The minister said that he will hold a meeting with the Finance Minister in the next few days to provide additional funds to Litchi Estate. He also asked Director to hold a meeting with insurance companies to create an insurance scheme for litchi growers. The Minister asked the officials of the forest department to prepare a plan for installing fencing wire around the litchi orchards.

## Banks distribute loans worth 1362.05 crores by September 2023

At the district-level bank advisory and review meeting held at the District Council Hall under the chairmanship of Additional Deputy Commissioner Mahendra Pal Gurjar, the banks' achievements in lieu of goals were reviewed for the second quarter. The Additional Deputy Commissioner informed that instead of the annual target of loans worth 2401.56 crores set by the banks till September 2023, they have disbursed loans amounting to 1362.05 crores. He stated that the total deposit amount in the banks has reached 13422.88 crores, marking a 13.29% annual increase, whereas the loans have increased to 4027.78



crores at a rate of 9.58%. The loan deposit ratio of the district has reached 30.01% annually, which is lower than the national target of 60%. The ADC emphasized the need for collaborative efforts between banks and government departments to improve the loan deposit ratio. ADC mentioned that banks in the district have distributed agricultural cards to 64,896 farmers by September 30, 2023, and in the September quarter,

917 agricultural cards were distributed. He highlighted that the agricultural loan of the banks amounts to 765.66 crores, constituting 19.01% of the total loans. The banks were directed to assist in enhancing the standard of living for the district's populace and to provide necessary loans to increase the income of farmers. Furthermore, the ADC instructed banks to achieve the determined goals under the annual loan scheme on time to

fulfill the economic needs of the people. He encouraged them to distribute more agricultural cards, provide loans for agricultural equipment, and promote small industries. The participation of all banks and governmental/ non-governmental officers was sought for the successful implementation of the Prime Minister's Social Security Insurance Scheme to include more farmers in the crop insurance program. Additional Deputy Commissioner expressed contentment over the banks' achievements under the annual loan scheme but mentioned that their performance in the primary sector is relatively low, urging all banks to improve their positions and increase the loan deposit ratio.

Editorial

Permanent solution

At the time of Independence, the Indian population was about 340 million, around a billion less than what it is now. In 2011, at the time of the last census, population density was 382 people per square kilometre, about 3.25 times more than 1951. India's geographical area in the interim has only increased by about 10,810 sq km because Sikkim, Goa and Daman and Diu joined the Indian Union. While the country is not growing geographically, the population and population density are. To most people, it is obvious that this is not sustainable because we will run out of space to produce food and to meet other human requirements. We will need more of everything — housing, consumer products, transportation, food and water, infrastructure, energy, waste assimilation space and capacity — when, in reality, we have a limited supply of resources. It is a sustainability problematique — the inevitability of more and the reality of less.

Sustainable development in the extant political economy is an oxymoron owing to the combination of 'sustainability' and 'development'. Sustainability, itself, is a portmanteau, combining the words, 'sustain' and 'ability'. However, questions about what needs to be sustained, over what time frame, for whom and by whom remain unanswered. Therefore, sustainable development is often taken to mean the ability to sustain development for times to come. The term, development, is more difficult to comprehend than it appears. Development could be a desirable state, a process, or deliberate action to change things for the better, such as overcoming ills that undermine human well-being like poverty, population growth, corruption, greed and intolerance. But development is often construed as increased human well-being over time and, thus, simplified into more of everything, for more and more people. With a global population of over eight billion, planetary boundaries are being breached in a way that could change the environment from a conducive to a hostile state.

Around this time every year, since 1995, the world comes together for about two weeks under the aegis of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change to find ways to collectively deal with the challenge of climate change. Another sustainability problematique. The world is releasing more carbon dioxide into the atmosphere at an increasing rate while there is less space to do so without far-reaching consequences for global temperature rise. Having disrupted biogeochemical cycles — the carbon cycle in particular — with the large-scale use of fossil fuels, the primary aim should be to reduce the transfer of carbon from the geosphere to the atmosphere in absolute terms.

Anarchy in Gaza

As Hamas's ability to rule the Gaza Strip crumbles, Palestinian fear of the terror group is disappearing and leading towards anarchy. The Tazpit Press Service has learned that residents who who openly criticise Hamas in front of TV cameras -- once unthinkable -- can call the Iran-backed Hamas "betrayers of the Palestinian people."

In one notable incident, a resident of Gaza told Radio Hebron, which also broadcasts from the Strip, that "Mohammed Deif and Yahya Sinwar are sons of dogs."

One Palestinian official told TPS, "Hamas's central government has completely collapsed and the interior and police systems are also not fully functioning."

There are no more rescue and civil defence teams and residents are busy clearing the rubble from their homes.

Residents report widespread looting of food rations and medicines delivered from Arab countries through the Rafah border crossing. In particular, trucks are hijacked by armed Hamas operatives or criminals, who then sell the aid themselves.

One resident was filmed pointing to a bag of food clearly labelled with the words "not for sale" and was required to pay 40 shekels (USD 10) for it.

There are also reports of black markets in the hundreds of shelters where Palestinians are staying, where food and medicine are sold.

TPS has also learned from Israeli sources that morale among Hamas's fighting units in the northern areas of Gaza is severely damaged and there have been significant desertions following the killing of Northern Brigade commanders in Israeli air strikes.

Around 200 of these deserters were the Palestinians seen in photos on social media in their underwear surrendering to Israeli forces.

In southern Gaza, dozens of kitchens have opened on the sidewalks where volunteers distribute hot food to displaced Palestinians. Gas cylinders for cooking are in short supply after large numbers were stolen by Hamas operatives, sources told TPS.

Khan Yunis is Gaza's second-largest city and is considered the capital of the Strip's southern district. It is also regarded as a personal stronghold of Hamas leader Yahya Sinwar, whose family lives there.

Before the war, Hamas oversaw a civilian administration of around 50,000 employees.



At least 1,200 people were killed in Hamas's attacks on Israeli communities near the Gaza border on October 7. Hamas currently holds 137 men, women, children, soldiers and foreigners captive in Gaza. Some people remain unaccounted for as Israeli authorities continue to identify bodies and search for human remains.

Scientists discover rare Dolphin with 'thumbs' off Greece's coast



Scientists from the Pelagos Cetacean Research Institute are intrigued by the discovery of a rare dolphin in Greece with a pair of "thumbs," according to the New York Post.

They spotted a dolphin with hook-shaped "thumbs" carved out of its flippers in the Gulf of Corinth, Greece. The dolphin was spotted twice during boat surveys this summer.

Despite being one of 1,300 striped dolphins in the gulf, it was the only one who consistently gave researchers the thumbs up.

"It was the very first time we saw this surprising flipper morphology in 30

years of surveys in the open sea and also in studies while monitoring all the stranded dolphins along the coasts of Greece for 30 years," Alexandros Frantzis, the scientific coordinator and president of the Pelagos Cetacean Research Institute, told LiveScience in an email, according to New York Post.

According to Frantzis, who photographed the aquatic anomaly, the cetacean was "swimming, leaping, bow-riding, and playing" with other dolphins.

While the thumbs of the dolphin are certainly strange, scientists believe they are the result of a genetic aberration caused by constant inbreeding, New York Post reported.

Russia lost 87 per cent of active-duty troops since Ukraine war



Russia lost 87 per cent of the total number of active duty ground troops it had before launching its invasion of Ukraine and two-thirds of its pre-invasion tanks, CNN reported quoting a source familiar with a declassified US intelligence assessment provided to Congress.

It reported that Russia entered the war with 360,000 troops, including contract and conscript personnel, of which the country lost 315,000 on the battlefield. 2,200 tanks out of 3,500 have been lost and 4,400 of the 13,600 infantry fighting vehicles and armoured personnel carriers have also been destroyed, for a loss rate of 32 percent.

"As of late November, Russia lost over a quarter of its pre-invasion stockpiles of ground forces equipment," the assessment reads. "This has reduced the complexity and scale of Russian offensive operations, which have failed to make major gains in Ukraine since early 2022."

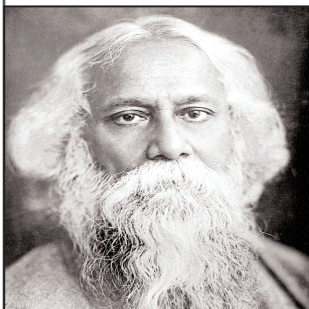
Despite heavy losses, Russia has been able to keep its war efforts going by relaxing recruitment standards and dipping into Soviet-era stockpiles of older equipment. The assessment found that the war has "sharply set back 15 years of Russian effort to modernise its ground force."

Other newly declassified intelligence previously said that "Russia seems to believe that a military deadlock through the winter will drain Western support for Ukraine and ultimately give Russia the advantage despite Russian losses and persistent shortages of trained personnel, munitions, and equipment," according to a National Security Council spokesman, CNN reported. Before the invasion, Russia had a total standing military of approximately 900,000 active-duty troops, including ground troops, airborne troops, special operations and other uniformed personnel, according to the CIA.

Protein keeps cell membranes in balance



Lipids are the primary components of our cell membranes, which are made up of lipid bilayers. The lipid distribution is not uniform; it is asymmetric, having differing lipid contents in the outer and inner layers.

P4-ATPases, also known as flippases, serve an important role in establishing and maintaining lipid asymmetry.

These enzymes actively transport lipids from the outer (exoplasmic) leaflet to the interior (cytosolic) leaflet while also ensuring correct lipid distribution. The present study focused on the ATP8B1-CDC50A flippase complex, which resulted in numerous novel and revolutionary discoveries.

The function of ATP8B1 lipid flippase is critical for the regulation of bile production, a vital substance in our digestive system, but the direct link within bile producing liver cells remains unknown.

Additionally, recent studies have spotlighted the relevance of genetic variants in the regulatory segment of the ATP8B1 gene as a strong genetic marker for Alzheimer's resilience. Interestingly, mutations that impair function of the closely related ATP8B4 lipid flippase are oppositely important risk factors of Alzheimer's. It is therefore of strong interest to understand how ATP8B1 is linked to these processes and pathologies.

In the new study, the research team employed state-of-the-art cryo-electron microscopy techniques to capture nine different states associated with the lipid transport and determine structures at 2.4 to 3.1 Å resolution for these states. These structural insights, combined with functional and computational studies, reveal the inner workings of the human flippase ATP8B1-CDC50A complex and its fine regulation

# Sukhbir Badal accuses CM of escalating tactics against SAD leaders

**YAMUNANAGAR:** The road on the Shadipur side from Hamida Head to Panjpur bridge built over the Western Yamuna Canal was uprooted by the canal department two years ago. Now the other side has also been closed to widen the road, due to which the local villagers have been complaining about their problem to Coordinator District Congress and former Chairman District Council Shyam Sundar Batra. The villagers say that due to the closure of the road, people of Shadipur and many other villages are facing problems. The Road Canal Department of Shadipur side has started an alternative unpaved road which is difficult to pass through. Dust keeps flying. On the other side, the work of increasing the width of the road from Hamida Bridge to Panjpur Bridge has to be done. On that side also the Canal has to be widened. Either the canal should be widened first or the road should be built leaving aside the width of the canal and the width of the pavement and till then, alternative paved roads should be provided to the villagers or water should be sprinkled on the unpaved roads daily.

### Divyang Medical camp run by Samagra Shiksha in civil hospital

**KARNAL:** On the second day of the Divyang Medical Camp being run by Samagra Shiksha in the Civil Hospital, Dr. Jayawardene, Dr. Nikita Bhatnagar, Dr. Manan Gupta and Dr. Hawa Singh conducted medical examination of 39 disabled children of Nissing section and identified their obstacles and needs on Wednesday.

Necessary instructions were given to their parents after identification by Dr. Santosh. District Education Officer Rajpal Chaudhary and District Elementary Education Officer Sudesh Thukral, District Project Coordinator Urvashi Vij, while highlighting the relevance of the medical camp, said that about four per cent of the country's population was disabled and they could be identified only through medical camps. He said that through the camp, the task of providing helping devices to the identified children became simple. Urvashi Vij said that through the medical certificate made in the camp, it became easier for the children to get government facilities. Roadways Department's sub-inspector Gopal Krishna and pass clerk Jagpal Singh told the parents of disabled children that those children whose 100per cent disability medical certificate was made. They were given free bus travel passes, along with one assistant also got free travel.



### Police team faces resistance over action against illicit liquor sale

A police team arrived to take action against the illegal sale of alcohol but encountered resistance. Those involved in the illicit liquor trade even began quarreling and threatening violence against the police team. The incident occurred in Nachraun village where the police team went to take action against the illegal sale of alcohol, and the mafia involved in this trade started a dispute with the police team. They called their associates to the scene and engaged in verbal abuse and physical altercations with the team. The government's work was hindered. Following a complaint, the police have filed cases against Bhola, Rahul, and Lala under various sections. Constable Vijay Kumar, who received the information, explained that he is a security agent at Jathlana Police Station. He received information that Bhola from Nachraun village was involved in selling illegal alcohol with a minor. He reported this to the Jathlana Police Station in-charge. A team was formed for a raid. When they arrived, Bhola was standing with a bottle of alcohol in hand, presumably for sale. Upon seeing the team, he rushed inside his house. When the team requested a search of the house, Bhola began verbally abusing the team. He called his friends Rahul and Lala to the scene, and a physical altercation ensued with the team. They threatened to kill if their house was searched. The police have filed a case based on the complaint and have initiated further action.

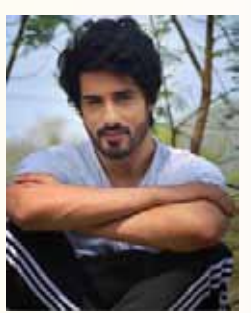
## Twin sisters Alina and Aline Jaiswal make their acting debut in &TV's 'Atal'

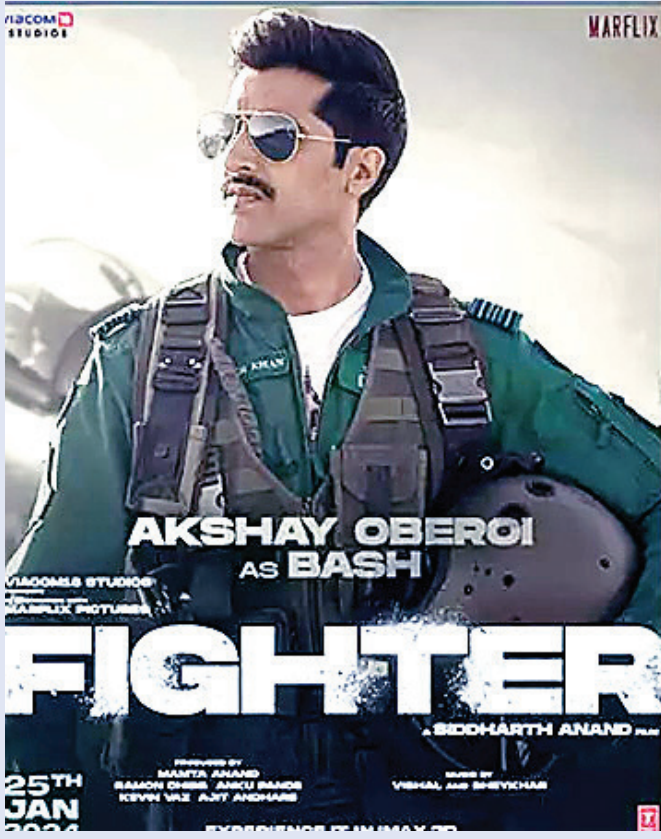
