## India logs 116 Covid-19 cases in 24 hrs

**NEW DELHI:** India has recorded 116 fresh cases of Covid-19 in the last 24 hours as per health Ministry data on Tuesday. With this, the total tally of active Covid-19 cases has reached 4170, which is 0.01 percent of the total active cases in the country. Three deaths have been reported in the state of Karnataka in the last 24 hours, taking the total tally to 5,33,337. The case fatality rate stands at 1.18 per cent.

## Bomb scare near Israel Embassy in Delhi

**NEW DELHI :** Delhi Police was alerted about an alleged blast behind the Israeli Embassy located in the Chanakyaपुरी area, which is the diplomatic neighbourhood in the national capital. The alleged blast was reported to the authorities on a call by an unidentified caller to the Delhi Fire Service at around 6 pm earlier today. The caller claimed that an explosion took place on an empty plot behind the Israeli Embassy.

## 3 suspects arrested in Pulwama, arms recovered

**SRINAGAR:** Security forces have arrested three suspects and recovered arms from them in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district, Army said on Tuesday. The recovery of two pistols was made during a cordon and search operation which was jointly launched by Army and J&K police in Pulwama village. "Based on specific intelligence inputs, a Joint Cordon & Search Operation (CASO) was launched by #IndianArmy & @JmuKmrPolice at Panzu & Gamiraj in Pulwama on December 25, 2023. Three suspected individuals have been apprehended with recovery of 02xPistol and other war-like stores," Army Srinagar based Chinara Corps said in a post on X.

# Dense fog, cold wave continue to rule North for few more days

**AGENCY NEW DELHI, DEC 26**

Dense fog is likely to continue over north and parts of adjoining central India during the next three to four days, the India Meteorological Department said in a statement on Tuesday. "Dense to very dense fog likely to continue over Northwest & parts of adjoining Central India during next 3-4 days," the IMD said in a post on X.

As per the IMD data, the minimum temperatures over most parts of Punjab, Haryana-Chandigarh-Delhi, and West Uttar Pradesh stand in the range of 6-10 degrees while most parts of Rajasthan, East UP, Madhya Pradesh and some parts of north Chhattisgarh and Jharkhand stands in the range of 11-12 degrees.

Minimum temperatures are normal or above normal over most parts of the country, according to the IMD data. The IMD on Tuesday morning released satellite images showing a layer



of fog spreading over Punjab, Haryana, Delhi, Uttar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh.

Delhi-NCR region woke up to dense fog on Tuesday with the temperature as

low as 7 degrees. Visuals from Delhi's India Gate, Sarai Kale Khan, AIIMS, Safdarjung, and Anand Vihar area showed thick fog hovering over the region with visibility almost zero. The visibility due to the dense layered fog was so low that tourists faced difficulties in capturing the Taj Mahal from the Royal gate as well as the Lady Diana Bench. Other parts of North India too experienced winter chills on Tuesday morning, as cities such as Prayagraj, Ghaziabad and Meerut in Uttar Pradesh and Moga in Punjab faced cold waves, engulfed in dense fog. The temperature in Prayagraj on Tuesday at 8:30 am was recorded at 12.4 degrees Celsius, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD).

## Donkey flight held in France, lands in Mumbai with 276 on board

**AGENCY NEW DELHI, DEC 26**

An Airbus A340 carrying 276 passengers, mostly Indians, landed in Mumbai early this morning, following a four-day detention in France over suspected human trafficking allegations. The aircraft landed in Mumbai shortly after 4 am. It had taken off from Vatry airport near Paris around 2.30 pm local time.

French authorities confirmed that 276 passengers had boarded the plane for the flight, while 27 individuals, including five minors, remained on French soil seeking asylum.

Upon landing in Vatry on Friday, it was found that there were 11 unaccompanied minors among 303 passengers. The stranded passengers were provided with make-shift beds, access to toilets and showers, and meals,



along with hot drinks, in the halls of Vatry airport during the four-day ordeal. The flight's connection to Nicaragua raised eyebrows, as the central American nation has seen a surge in individuals seeking asylum in the United States. According to data from the US Customs and Border Patrol (CBP), there has been a significant increase in Indians attempting to enter the US illegally, with 96,917 recorded in the fiscal

year 2023, representing a 51.61 percent jump from the previous year. Of particular concern is the method employed by some migrants, known as 'donkey flights', where individuals transit through third countries with lenient travel document requirements to reach their final destinations. The flight - a charter service from Dubai - had landed at the airport, which is around 160 km from Paris, to refuel.

## Uttarakhand: 6 dead, 2 injured after brick wall collapses in Lahboli village

**HARIDWAR:** Six workers died after a brick wall collapsed at Lahboli village of Mangalore police station area in Haridwar district on Tuesday, officials said. The accident took place while bricks were being transferred to a furnace in which they were to be hardened in the fire. Labourers were toiling away at the brick kiln at the time of the accident. After receiving word of the wall collapse, a rescue team reached the spot. The rescue team, including the DM, SSP and medics, were at the spot at the time of filing this report. "Eight people were buried under the collapsed bricks. Six of them succumbed to their injuries. Two people are currently admitted to the hospital and undergoing treatment. We are at the spot and will take further action," Haridwar District Police Captain Parmendra Dobal said. The work of removing debris with the help of an earthmover was underway at the time of filing this report.

## New nursery rules to promote horticulture in state: Jauramajra

Punjab Horticulture Minister S. Chetan Singh Jauramajra, on Tuesday, released new nursery rules (amended) to promote horticulture in the state. Following the issuance of these rules at the Punjab Civil Secretariat, the Cabinet Minister highlighted that the nurseries now have a two-year timeline to produce true-to-type seedlings, and are mandated to plant these saplings in mother plant and bud stick nurseries. Apart from this, nursery owners are obligated to ensure traceability of these plants.

S. Chetan Singh Jauramajra emphasized that the Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann led government have taken a pioneering step in the country by amending the Punjab Fruit Nursery Act,



1961, ahead of other states. Highlighting other points, the Cabinet Minister said that under this new nursery act (amended), nursery owners are required to cultivate virus-free seedlings. In case of vegetable nursery production, the licence is mandatory, but the source and quality of produce shall be governed under the Seed Act 1966 (central act 54 of 1966), said the Minister, adding that all the registered horticulture nurseries shall be given a period of two years to fulfil the conditions or requirements

laid under the Act from the date of commencement of these rules. In the said rules, after rule 6, the following shall be substituted, namely: Provided further that in case the licence is cancelled or suspended, the plants shall be destroyed by the competent authority or any other person authorized by him but not below the rank of the Horticulture Development Officer. The competent authority shall order the licensee to uproot the rootstock seedlings and the grafted plants or cultivars and on his refusal to do so,

## Hot liquids should be consumed in cold: Dr. Kulwinder Mann

**NAWANSHAHR (JATINDER PAL SINGH KALER):** According to the instructions of Civil Surgeon Dr Jaspreet Kaur, Nawanshahr and under the leadership of Dr Kulwinder Mann Senior Medical officer Lt.General Bikram Singh Sub Divisional Hospital Balachaur, the health department issued a health advisory for the common people regarding protection against cold in view of the thick fog weather and said that neglecting the health in the continuously decreasing temperature in the winter season can prove to be dangerous.

In this regard, Senior Medical Officer of Lt.General Bikram Singh Sub Divisional Hospital Balachaur Dr. Kulwinder Mann said that for the common people, especially the elderly and children, staying in dense fog for a long time can cause conditions like hypothermia, frostbite and chilblains. A drop in body temperature can cause slurred speech, sleepiness, muscle stiffness and difficulty breathing. He suggested not to ignore shivering, as it is one of the early signs of hypothermia. Avoid alcohol, as it lowers the human body temperature and increases the risk of hypothermia.

Dr. Mann said that proper arrangements are very important to protect against cold and warm clothes should be worn to protect against cold.

The Chief Minister said that wine, vinegar and juice will be produced in this plant ensuring that the local growers get fair prices for their produce. He added that the plant would also speed up the production of the processed products. Addressing the people at the occasion, Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that this year the disaster caused by heavy rains had wreaked havoc and the link roads, especially in the apple belts of the state, were damaged badly. He stated: "Our government restored these roads on a priority basis, making sure



that the produce is delivered to the market on time, thereby protecting horticulturists from financial loss." He added that the State Government had announced a historic increase of Rs 1.50 in the support price of apples, which now stood at rupees 12 per kg. This time the procurement of apples has been done on kilo basis and the universal carton system is being implemented so that the

orchardists get fair prices for their produce, remarked the CM. The relief provided aims at the rehabilitation of the families affected by the disaster caused due to heavy rains, landslides and floods earlier this year. The compensation includes three lakh each given to 395 affected families whose houses were completely damaged. This adds up to rupees 11.85 crore. Separately, 10.96 crore were released to other 1,840 affected families. The districts suffered huge brunt of the disaster as 395 houses were completely damaged,



while 458 kutchra houses suffered partial damaged and 354 farmers lost their livestock. While addressing a huge public meeting on the occasion, the Chief Minister also announced the upgrading of Theog fire post and said that administration would explore the possibilities of building a district level hospital in Theog. "The state government will conduct a survey in this regard," said

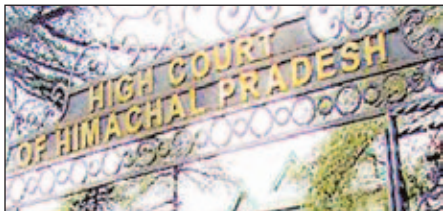
the Chief Minister. He assured the local residents of filling the vacant posts of doctors and other staff in Theog Hospital at the earliest and stated that the government would also install modern machines at the hospital. HP HC directs Govt to shift  
DGP and SP Kangra

Himachal Pradesh High court, in the high-profile case of influencing the probe of a criminal intimidation of a businessman, on Tuesday directed the state government to shift the Director General of Police Sanjay Kundu and Kangra Superintendent of police Shalini Agnihotri to other posts in the interest of justice. In a significant order passed by the division bench of Chief Justice MS Ramachandran Rao and Justice Jyotsna Rewal Dua today directed the state secretary home or the respondent No.1 to take steps at the earliest to move the present incumbents holding posts of both the Director General of Police, HP and respondent no.2 (SP Kangra) to other posts. The Court posting the matter to January 4, 2024 said in a 17 paged detailed order that duo should be posted where they would not have any opportunity to influence the investigation in the FIRs referred to in this order. The High Court after going through the submission made by the counsel for the petitioner cum complaint amicus Currie Neeraj Gupta expressed the opinion that in the



light of the material available to us in this case till date, it is satisfied that exceptional circumstances do exist for intervening in the matter more particularly when the respondent no.1 had chosen to turn a blind eye to the said material for reasons best known to it. Court also made observation on the handling of case by the concerned government officer that in the interest of justice and to ensure fairness of investigation and also keeping in mind the principle the "justice must not only be done but must be seen to be done." "we are of the opinion that it would be desirable that present incumbents holding posts of both the Director General of Police, HP and respondent no.2 be moved to other posts to ensure that fair investigation happens in the FIRs registered," the Judges said.

Srinagar and other parts of the Kashmir valley were engulfed with a thick layer of fog that reduced visibility, causing inconvenience to commuters. Vehicles had to keep on their head lights while moving on the roads in Srinagar. Amid dense fog, the traffic department issued an advisory urging vehicle drivers to "stick to your lane, which reduces the risks of going off the road or crashing into another vehicle.". Meteorological Centre Srinagar forecasts dry weather with no significant activity until December. Outlook During January 1-3, 2024, the weather



will remain generally cloudy, with light rain and snow in scattered places. The mercury dipped in Srinagar on Tuesday and recorded a low of -3.0°C against the -2.3°C recorded on Monday. It was 1.0°C below normal for the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir during this

period of the season. The maximum temperature recorded was 1.0°C above the normal of 8.6°C, against 9.6°C in Srinagar on Monday. The minimum temperature at Qazigund on the Srinagar-Jammu national highway plummeted to -3.0°C against the -2.6°C recorded the

previous night, while Kokernag had a low of -2.0°C against the -1.6°C recorded on Monday. Pahalgam remained the coldest place in Kashmir Valley, with minimum temperatures plummeting to -4.7°C on Tuesday against -4.3°C recorded on Monday night.

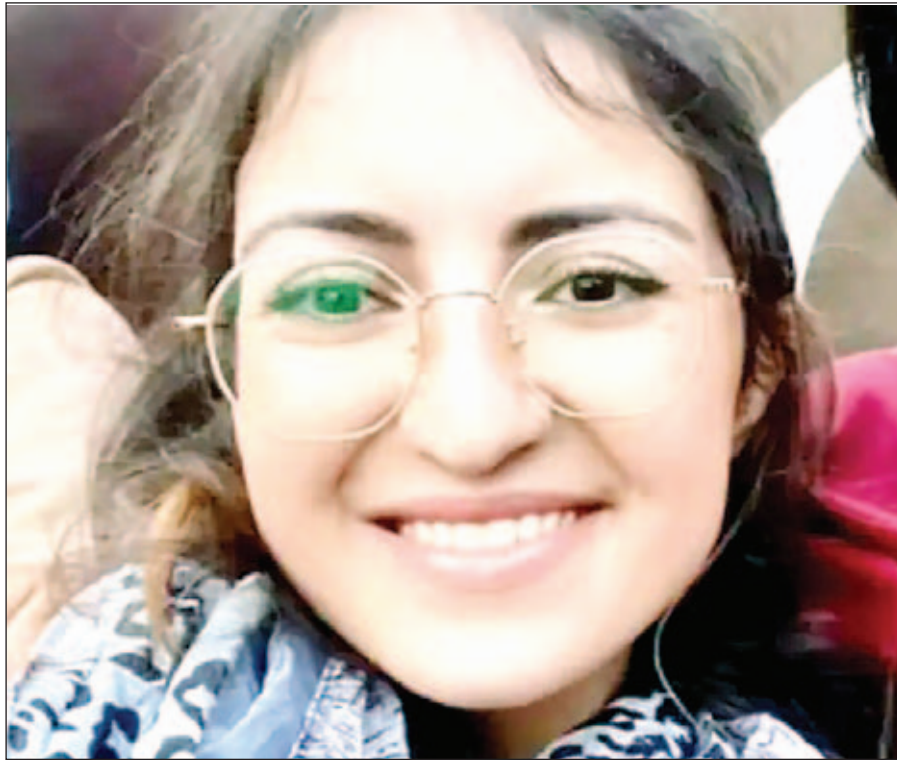

## Study shows sleep deprivation makes us less happy, more anxious



"In our largely sleep-deprived society, quantifying the effects of sleep loss on emotion is critical for promoting psychological health," said study lead author Cara Palmer, PhD, of Montana State University. "This study represents the most comprehensive synthesis of experimental sleep and emotion research to date, and provides strong evidence that periods of extended wakefulness, shortened sleep duration, and nighttime

In others, they were allowed a shorter-than-typical amount of sleep, and in others, they were periodically awakened throughout the night. Each study also measured at least one emotion-related variable after the sleep manipulation, such as participants' self-reported mood, their response to emotional stimuli.

## ***AI creates proteins with high binding strengths***


The team, led by Baker Lab members Susana Vazquez-Torres, Preetham Venkatesh, and Phil Leung, set out to create proteins that could bind to glucagon, neuropeptide Y, parathyroid hormone, and other helical peptide targets. Such molecules, crucial in biological systems, are especially difficult for drugs and diagnostic tools to recognize because they often lack stable molecular structures. Antibodies can be used to detect some of these medically relevant targets but are often costly to produce and have limited shelf



The study introduces a novel protein design approach that uses advanced deep-learning methods. The researchers present a new way of using RFdiffusion, a generative model for creating new protein shapes, in conjunction with the sequence-design tool ProteinMPNN. Developed in the Baker Lab, these programs allow scientists to create functional proteins more efficiently than ever before. By combining these tools in new ways, the team generated binding proteins by using limited target information, such as a peptide's amino acid sequence alone.

The Xiaomi 14 models were the first phones from the company to ship with Xiaomi's new HyperOS user interface. Now, the base Xiaomi 14 model is tipped to launch in India, as well as globally, in the coming months. A 91Mobiles report citing tipster Yogesh Brar (@bheityyogesh) suggests that the base Xiaomi 14 model is expected to be introduced globally at the Mobile World Congress 2024 which is scheduled to take place between February 26 and February 29. The report suggests that the phone may be unveiled on February 25, and the handset may launch in India on the same day. Previously, the standard Xiaomi 14 model was spotted on India's Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) website with the model number 23127PNOCG. The 'G' is speculated to represent the global variant of the Chinese counterpart. Although usually, the Indian variants carry an 'n' at the end, since the model was spotted on BIS, an India launch of the phone appears imminent. The phone was also spotted on the IMDA certification site as a 5G Mobile Phone with Bluetooth Wi-Fi and NFC connectivity.

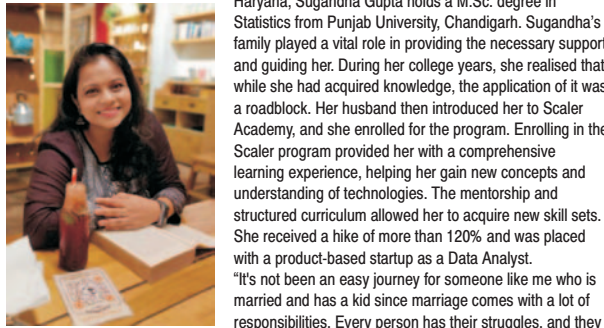
8th Usha Divyang Cricket League 2023 Commences in Chandigarh Today

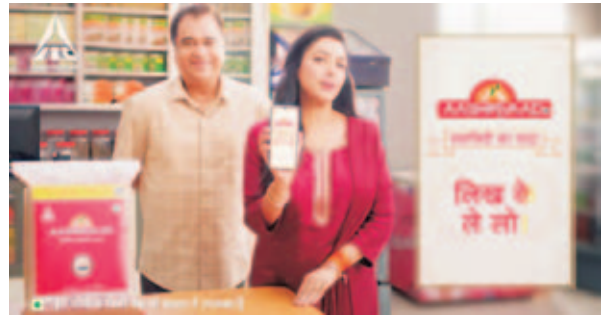

Intel to Receive \$3.2 Billion Government Grant to Set Up \$25 Billion Israel Chip Plant

Israel's government agreed to give Intel a \$3.2 billion (roughly Rs. 26,600 crore) grant for new \$25 billion (roughly Rs. 2,91,100 crore) chip plant it plans to build in southern Israel, both sides said on Tuesday. The news comes as Israel remains locked in a war with Palestinian militant group Hamas in the wake of the October 7 Hamas attack on Israel. The expansion plan for its Kiryat Gat site is an "important part of Intel's efforts to foster a more resilient global supply chain, alongside the company's ongoing and planned manufacturing investments in Europe and the United States," Intel said in a statement. In addition to the grant that amounts to 12.8 percent of the total investment, the chipmaker also committed to buy 60 billion shekels (roughly Rs. 1,37,500 crore) worth of goods and services from Israeli suppliers over the next decade, while the new facility is expected to create several thousand jobs. Intel operates four development and production sites in Israel, including a manufacturing plant in Kiryat Gat, and employs nearly 12,000 people in the country.

Another person from Kharkhadi village in Gurugram district mentioned that the investigating officer in a land dispute case had filed a false case against him in collusion with the opposing party, who even threatened his pregnant wife. He appealed to the Home Minister for

justice. A person from Kurukshetra complained that when he and his family were away, their house was robbed, resulting in significant losses. Although a theft complaint was lodged with the police, they couldn't track the thieves. Someone from Nagla Nanaku village complained that their neighbor had installed windows facing their house, and despite filing a complaint with the police, the issue remained unresolved. **Blood Donation camp organized at JP Hospital in memory of Sohan Lal**



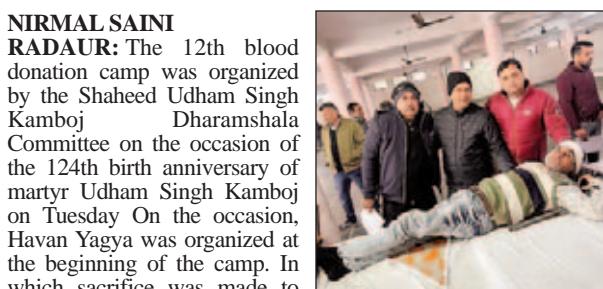

# SA speedster Rabada puts India on backfoot in 1st Test

**CENTURION** : South Africa pacer Kagiso Rabada's five-wicket haul has put India on the backfoot on Day 1 of the first Test of the two-match series at the Centurion on Tuesday.

At the end of the second session, India posted a total of 176/7 with KL Rahul and Jasprit Bumrah unbeaten with scores of 39(71)\* and 0(9)\* respectively.

Four wickets fell in the second session and all of them belonged to Rabada. His pace left India's batters without any answers as the pacer thrived on a surface that provided extra bounce.

He shifted the tides in the favour of the Proteas by dismissing set batter Shreyas Iyer for 31 after lunch.

Three overs later he dismissed Virat Kohli for 38 with a lovely outswinging delivery. Ravichandran Ashwin lost his wicket with a fierce yet accurate bouncer.

He struck Shardul Thakur on



his arm and on the next ball removed him from the crease for a score of 24.

KL Rahul on the other hand, showed aggression in his shots but kept his temperament as well. Before the session was called off,

he got struck below his chin and received on-field treatment for it as well.

Earlier in the session, after winning the toss, the hosts sent India to bat first. However, the Proteas won't regret their decision,

as they successfully dominated the first session in Centurion.

Yashasvi Jaiswal (17 runs from 37 balls) and Rohit Sharma (5 runs from 14) opened for the visitors but both of them failed to make a mark and collapsed in front of the Proteas pacers.

One of the main disappointments in the first session was Shubman Gill's (2 runs from 12 balls) sloppy performance. After early upsets, the visitors rely on Kohli (33 runs from 47 balls) and Iyer (31 runs from 46 balls) to make a solid partnership and sit in the driver's seat after the end of day one.

On the other hand, Nandre Burger led the South African bowling attack after he picked up two wickets in his five-over spell and gave away 23 runs. Meanwhile, Kagiso Rabada scalped one wicket and gifted 15 runs.
