Ayodhya railway station renamed as Ayodhya Dham Junction

NEW DELHI: Ahead of the inauguration of Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, the city's Ayodhya Railway Station has been renamed to "Ayodhya Dham" Junction, according to the latest post of Lallu Singh Ayodhya Member of Parliament on X. "Ayodhya Junction became 'Ayodhya Dham' Junction Under the guidance of Honorable Prime Minister of India Shri @narendramodi ji, the name of Ayodhya Junction of the newly constructed grand Ayodhya Railway Station has been changed to as per the expectation of public sentiments," he wrote on X.

Vijoy Kumar Singh repatriated to Punjab; set to take over as PS to CM

Kashmiri separatist group Muslim League banned

SRINAGAR: A Kashmiri separatist group Muslim League- headed by Masarat Alam, who is currently in jail, has been banned by the Government of India for five years. The announcement of banning the group was made by Union Home Minister Amit Shah in a post on X. "The 'Muslim League Jammu Kashmir (Masarat Alam faction)' (MLJK-MA is declared as an 'Unlawful Association' under UAPA. This organization and its members are involved in anti-national and secessionist activities in J&K supporting terrorist activities and inciting people to establish Islamic rule in J&K," Shah said.

After “No Mistakes” message to Army, Rajnath meets injured civilians in J-K

Defence Minister Rajnath Singh - in Jammu and Kashmir Wednesday to firefight protests over the death of three civilians after they were detained by the Army for questioning - also met others allegedly injured while in military custody. Eight civilians had been detained after an ambush on two Army vehicles in J&K's Poonch district, in which four soldiers were killed.

Earlier today Mr Singh met the families of those killed and called for caution when dealing with civilians. He said the Army could not "make any mistake" that hurts an Indian citizen.

"You are the country's protectors. But I want to request you that besides ensuring the country's security, you also have the responsibility to win the hearts of the people. There should be no mistake that hurts an Indian," he said.

"We have to win battles... eliminate terrorists... but a bigger objective is to win the hearts of the people. We will win wars but we need to win hearts too. And I know you try your best..."

The Defence Minister's visit followed that of Chief of Army Staff General Manoj Pande, who was in the union territory on Monday to review the in-progress anti-terror op in Surankote and Rajouri district's Thanamandi forest belt.

Rajnath Singh said that the Indian Army has become quite well equipped as compared to earlier.

Speaking about the Indian Army, Rajnath Singh said, "The Indian Army has now

become much more powerful than it was before. The Indian Army has become quite well equipped as compared to earlier. You all are the protectors of this country. Along with protecting the country, I want to make a special request to you.

The responsibility of protecting the country rests on you, but along with protecting the country, winning the hearts of your countrymen is also a big responsibility on your shoulders. Stay closely connected with the people of the country you are serving."

"I believe that we aim to win the war. While we aim to eliminate the terrorists, our aim should be bigger; we have to win

the hearts of our countrymen. We will win the war, we will win any kind of war, and we will eliminate the terrorists but at the same time, we have to win the hearts of the countrymen and a huge responsibility rests on the shoulders of all of you and I know very well that you will fulfil it completely. We try our best to fulfil it with dedication. May you continue to serve with courage, honour, and unwavering adherence to your values," added Rajnath Singh.

Earlier, four Army personnel were killed and three others were injured after heavily armed terrorists ambushed two Army vehicles near Thanamandi in the Rajouri sector on Thursday last week.

IOA forms ad-hoc committee to run wrestling body

The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) announced Bhupinder Singh Bajwa as chairman of the newly created ad-hoc committee to run the day-to-day matters of the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) with immediate effect on Wednesday.

IOA issued a letter regarding the same. This comes after the Union Sports Ministry suspended the entire Wrestling Federation of India (WFI)'s governing council.

Earlier on Sunday, Union Sports Ministry instructed the IOA to form an ad-hoc committee to manage and control the affairs of the WFI.

"Elections to the Wrestling Federation of India (WFI) were held on 21 December 2023, in which Sanjay Kumar Singh was elected as President and Prem Chand Lochab as Secretary General amongst other office bearers of the Executive Committee of Wrestling Federation of India (WFI)," an official letter from IOA read.

"The Indian Olympic Association (IOA) has recently become aware that the recently appointed President and officials of WFI have made arbitrary decisions in violation of their own constitutional provisions and against the principles of good governance espoused by IOC and further without following due process overturned the rulings of the IOA- appointed Ad hoc Committee. This not only highlights a governance gap within the Federation but also signifies a noticeable departure from established norms," it further

read. In a major decision, coming in light of fresh protests by star wrestlers Sakshi Malik and Bajrang Punia over the election of an aide of deposed WFI president Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh as the new president of the wrestling federation, the Union Sports Ministry on Sunday suspended the sport's premier governing

body in the country along with all its office-bearers. "The IOA considers adherence to governance norms as vital for ensuring fair play, transparency, and accountability and to safeguard the interests of the sports persons as espoused by IOC and to ensure continuity, it has been decided to appoint an Ad hoc committee comprising of following with immediate effect," the letter further read.

The IOA formed the ad hoc committee at the ministry's request on Wednesday. Bajwa will be assisted in running the WFI by MM Somaya and Manjusha Kanwar in the newly constituted ad hoc committee.

Rahul Gandhi to undertake 'Bharat Nyay Yatra' from January 14

Congress leader and former Party president Rahul Gandhi will once again go on a Yatra -this time from East to West. The Congress Party on Wednesday announced the Nyay Yatra that will start on the January 14 in Imphal Manipur and is expected to conclude on March 20 in Mumbai, Maharashtra.

Rahul Gandhi is expected to interact with youth, women and marginalised people in this Yatra. The Congress party said that the Nyay Yatra will cover 6,200 kms. It will traverse a route through the states of Manipur, Nagaland, Assam, Meghalaya, West Bengal, Bihar, Jharkhand, Odisha, Chattisgarh, Uttar Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh, Rajasthan, Gujarat and finally Maharashtra.

The Yatra will cover 14 states and 85 districts.

Speaking at a news conference in Delhi, Organisation Secretary KC Venugopal said " Bharat Nyay Yatra

to start from January 14 to March 20 from Manipur to Mumbai. Now Rahul Gandhi is doing a yatra with great experience from first Bharat Jodo Yatra. He is going to interact with youth, women and marginalised people. Yatra will cover 6,200 kms. This time the Yatra will be carried out by

Bus with leaders expected to walk certain sections of the route." "On December 21, Congress workers gave opinion that Rahul Gandhi should start Yatra from East to West. Rahul Gandhi also agreed to fulfil the wishes of CWC" Venugopal added.

NIA launches probe into Israel Embassy 'blast' call case

NEW DELHI: A day after Delhi Police received a call about a 'blast' being heard near the Israel Embassy, the National Investigation Agency (NIA) has been roped in to investigate the incident.

A team of NIA officials, along with the Delhi Special Cell and Dog Squad, reached the Israeli Embassy on Wednesday morning and initiated a probe into the alleged 'blast' call incident.

Meanwhile, Delhi police have zeroed in on two 'suspects' after examining the CCTV footage of the area.

Officials have however not confirmed the duo's involvement in the same, sources said on Wednesday. According to sources, two persons roaming near the Israel embassy on Tuesday evening have emerged as suspects in the alleged 'blast' incident. "Two persons are seen roaming in the area in CCTV footage. Their role in the 'blast' call incident is not yet clear. We are trying to ascertain their identity and what were they doing in the area at the time of the call. Things will become clear only after their questioning," they said. Now the police are examining CCTV's of nearby areas to find out as to how the two suspects reached there and which route they took. They are also trying to ascertain the identity of the two suspects.

PM Modi thanks people for making the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra a success

Prime Minister Narendra Modi interacted with the beneficiaries of the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra via video conferencing on Wednesday.

Thousands of beneficiaries of Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra from across the country joined the event. The programme was also graced by Union Ministers, MPs, MLAs and local-level representatives.

Addressing the gathering on the occasion, PM Modi said that the campaign, launched to attain saturation of flagship schemes of the Centre, has reached lakhs of villages.

"Viksit Bharat Yatra is reaching in far-off places and connecting people. I want to thank the people of the country, especially women for making this program a huge

success. Viksit Bharat Yatra started around 50 days ago, but it has already reached lakhs of villages," he said.

The Prime Minister said that after the Viksit Bharat Yatra was started, 4.5 lakh

new applications have been received for the Ujjwala Gas connection. "Over one crore Aayushman cards have been distributed to the people of the country. Health check-ups of around 1.25 crore people have been done," he added.

On the Ayushman

Bharat Health Account cards, a unique identifier for a citizen in the health ecosystem, PM Modi said, "ABHA cards are also being made at a rapid pace. People are not aware of the ABHA cards. This card will keep a record of medical reports, medicine prescriptions, blood group information and other details."

Since its launch on November 15, the Prime Minister has regularly interacted with the beneficiaries of the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra all across the country.

The interaction has happened thrice -- November 30, December 9 and 16 -- through video conferencing.

Also, the Prime Minister has interacted with Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra beneficiaries physically on two consecutive days, December 17-18, during his recent visit to Varanasi.

CM Mann lashes out at centre for rejecting tableau of Punjab for R-Day parade

Slamming the BJP led Union government for rejecting the tableau of state for the Republic Day parade, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Wednesday said that the 'power mad' centre government is demeaning and humiliating the enormous sacrifices made by Punjabis in the national freedom struggle.

"This is not for the first time but last year also the BJP led Union government had done the same mischief and by rejecting the tableau this year too, centre has rubbed salt into wounds of the state" said the Chief Minister.

Interacting with the media persons here today at Punjab Bhawan, the Chief Minister said that it is unfortunate that on one hand the devotees from across the globe are paying obeisance at Sri Fatehgarh to pay homage to chhota Sahibzadas Baba Zorawar Singh and Baba Fateh Singh along with Mata Gujri ji whereas on the other hand BJP government is playing such dirty

tactics to humiliate Punjab. He said that martyrdom and sacrifices is part of the glorious heritage of the state which was to be duly highlighted in the tableaux of state. However, Bhagwant Singh Mann said that by rejecting these nationalistic and progressive ideas of tableaux, the Union government has insulted the sacrifice made by great patriots and national leaders.

The Chief Minister categorically said that this step motherly treatment with the state is totally unacceptable and unwarranted. He said that the unfortunate thing is that this decision has been taken during the days when the entire globe is bowing before the supreme and unprecedented sacrifice made by the chhota Sahibzadas and Mata Gujri ji for humanity. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the tyrant Modi government has forgotten that Punjabis had made unprecedented sacrifices both for attaining and preserving freedom besides safeguarding the borders of the country.

The Chief Minister said that had these tableaux from state been included in the Republic

Day then it would have enhanced the prestige of this parade in which the French President will be the chief guest this year. He said that every state highlights its legacy in this parade but for the last two years, the Modi government has deliberately kept Punjab out of this mega national event. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that this year also more than 90% states that have been

selected for tableaux are being ruled by the BJP, which indicates the ongoing saffronisation of Republic Day and Independence Day by the Modi government. The Chief Minister said that this year too, the state government had duly submitted three ideas viz. Punjab-history of sacrifice and martyrdom, Mai Bhago- the First Lady warrior of Sikhism (women empowerment) and Rich heritage of Punjab. He said that these ideas were duly submitted on time with the Union government for their approval. However, Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the union government had ignored the immense contribution of the state by rejecting these ideas. The Chief Minister said that it is unfortunate that the Union government is making mockery of the state and its immense contribution in nation building. He reminded the Union government that even if Andaman and Nicobar have to present something in their tableau, then also Punjab will be there because India's freedom struggle is replete with contributions of Punjab and Punjabis.

Russia supports many positions in our international relations : S Jaishankar

NEW DELHI: External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar today said Russia "supports a multipolar world and supports many positions we take in our international relations". Ahead of a meeting with his Russian counterpart Sergei Lavrov in Moscow, he underscored the importance of an international north-south corridor.

"International North South Corridor is a big priority... politics and the world order will need to change," Mr Jaishankar told the media.

Ahead of the meeting with Mr Lavrov, Mr Jaishankar said they would focus on bilateral cooperation in different spheres, adjusting it to changing circumstances and demands. "We will discuss the international strategic situation, conflicts and tensions where they are. Also, focus on development challenges that the

Global South faces. And of course, the state of multilateralism and the building of a multi-polar world order," he added.

Mr Lavrov praised India's role

in the G-20 and backed New Delhi for a permanent seat at the UN Security Council. Mr Jaishankar, who is on a five-day visit to Russia, held a "comprehensive and productive" meeting with Russian Deputy Prime Minister Manturov on the bilateral economic cooperation yesterday.

CM grants approval for contracts and purchases worth Rs 264 crore

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, DEC 27

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal while chairing the meeting of the High-Powered Purchase Committee (HPPC) held here today approved the purchase of textbooks and workbooks for classes I to VIII in government schools of the state before the start of the academic session 2024-25. The printing cost for this is estimated to be around Rs. 55 crores.

In addition, in the meeting of HPPC and the High Powered Works Purchase Committee (HPWPC), approvals were given for contracts and purchases worth Rs. 264 crores. After negotiations with various bidders, approximately Rs. 5 crores have been saved by setting competitive rates.

School Education Minister, Sh. Kanwar Pal, Higher Education Minister, Sh. Mool Chand Sharma, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister, Sh. J.P. Dalal, Cooperation Minister,



Dr. Banwari Lal, Urban Local Bodies Minister, Dr. Kamal Gupta, and Minister of State for Labour, Sh. Anoop Dhanak also remained present during the meeting.

In the meeting of HPPC and HPWPC, 13 agendas, including the School Shiksha Pariyojana Parishad, Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Department, Irrigation and Water Resources Department, GMDA and FMDA were approved.

The Haryana government is ac-

tively implementing micro-irrigation projects with a focus on water conservation and higher productivity with less water. In this regard, approval was given to a project for the use of treated water from the 15 MLD capacity STP plant established in Jind for the micro-irrigation project. The installation of a community-based solar/grid-operated integrated micro-irrigation basic infrastructure on the STP is estimated to cost around Rs. 30 crores. In the meeting, under the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority, approval was given for upgrading and special maintenance work to be carried out for Master Roads Dividing in Sector-103/106, Sector-102A/103, Sector 102/102A, and Sector-106/109, as well as Sector 75/75A. Additionally, approval was given for the development work of roads, footpaths, cycle tracks, drainage, gardening, and other works on the master road dividing Sectors 27/28 and 28/43.

DC issues guidelines for security arrangements for New Year fair in Mata Chintpurni

Mukesh Agnihotri urged upon the Union Minister to extend a generous hand towards Himachal in view of the huge natural calamity the State has faced in the recent past. He stated that the losses suffered by the State were unprecedented and its heavy brunt has been faced by the Jal Shakti Vibhag. Jal Shakti Vibhag's 11863 schemes suffered extensive damages amounting to Rs. 2132 crore and out of these 671 schemes were constructed under Jal Jeevan Mission (JJM) also suffered losses amounting to Rs. 614 crore. He informed the Union Minister that out of the allocation of Rs. 376 crore under JJM 25 percent i.e. approximately Rs. 96 crores would have to be spent for



restoration of damaged schemes. This would result into shortfall of funds for ongoing works on JJM. Deputy Chief Minister further elaborated that as per approved Annual Action Plan 2023-24 (AAP) allocations under JJM is Rs.1274 crore, which stands curtailed to Rs. 376 crores by center government. He urged the Union Minister that keeping in view the grave situation being faced by Himachal, its Annual Action Plan be restored to Rs.

1274 crore. The Union Minister assured that he would look in the matter and consider the request of Himachal sympathetically. He further requested the Union Minister that an extension of 6 months for completion of spillover JJM schemes should be allowed to Himachal as during the last 3 months the entire focus of the Jal Shakti Vihag was towards restoration of the damaged schemes resulting in hampering the progress of ongoing works. Mukesh Agnihotri reminded the Union Minister that during his visit of Himachal, he had directed the State Government of frame Anti Freeze Water supply schemes for snowbound area of Himachal on the pattern of Leh and Ladakh. Accordingly the State Government has forwarded 27 Anti freeze proposals to the Centre for approval under JJM. Though 4 pilot proposals for Bharmour, Lahaul, Kaza and Chango (Kinnaur) have been approved, he requested the Union Minister to approve remaining 23 proposals expeditiously.

Punjab police recover highest ever 1161-kg heroin in 2023

CHANDIGARH (GAGAN JAIN): Intensifying the ongoing war against drugs waged on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann to root out the menace of drugs from the border state, Punjab Police led by Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav has set a new benchmark by seizing highest-ever 1161 kilograms of heroin in the year 2023, said Inspector General of Police (IGP) Headquarters Dr Sukhchain Singh Gill here on Wednesday. Pertinently, the state government has enforced a three-pronged strategy— Enforcement, Prevention and Rehabilitation—to eradicate drugs from the state. As part of the strategy, the Punjab Police has been promoting and creating awareness about section 64-A of the NDPS act, which provides an opportunity to a drug consumer—caught with a few grams of heroin or narcotic powder—for rehabilitation. “This is for the first time that 65 drug consumers, caught with little quantity of drugs, availed provision of section 64-A of the NDPS by pledging to undergo the rehabilitation treatment,” said the IGP. Dr Sukhchain Singh Gill, who was addressing a ‘Year Ender’ Press Conference, said that from January 1 to December 26, 2023, Punjab Police have arrested 14951 drug smugglers/suppliers, including 2424 big fish after registering 10786 first information reports (FIRs), including 1385 commercials. Apart from seizing big haul of 1161-kg heroin, Police teams have also recovered 795-Kg opium, 403 quintals of poppy husk, and 83.17 lakh tablets/capsules/injections/vials of Pharma opioids from across the state, he said, while adding that drug money worth Rs 13.67 crores was recovered from drug smugglers arrested this year.

A total of 109 JN.1 COVID variant cases have been reported in the country as of December 26, Health Ministry sources said on Wednesday. As many as 36 cases were reported from Gujarat, 34 from Karnataka, 14 from Goa, 9 from Maharashtra, six from Kerala, four from Rajasthan, four from Tamil Nadu and two from Telangana, the sources said. Amid rising concerns over the emergence of the new variant of the coronavirus, Dr Bobby Bhalotra, Vice Chairman in the Department of Chest Medicine, Gangaram Hospital, said, "The new variants are so far mild; they are from the family of the Omicron virus. So, the cases are not too much to be worried about; there is no panic as such but yes, it is a sign that it has come back



again. It may flourish because it is more infectious than the normal COVID virus so we have to start taking precautions. Precaution and prevention are better than cures. Take precautions so that doesn't spread for them." "There is an increase in cases of respiratory illness in OPD of 20-30 per cent due to weather changes, viral

illness and an increase in pollution in the national capital," he added. He further said that patients who already have Asthma, interstitial lung disease, or COPD are getting exacerbations mostly from various viruses, including the H1N1 virus or swine flu. "Despite having a vaccine against these viruses, especially H1N1, people

Earlier this month, Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared that India would become the world's third-largest economy in his third term in office. There was no reference to the small matter of the election he needs to win in 2024 to stay in power.

His supporters will call it confidence, his critics arrogance. What is clear is that the prime minister's parameters for the country's economic health didn't resonate with the 303 Indians who boarded a plane that authorities believe was taking them to Nicaragua from where they would presumably try to enter the United States of America illegally. So desperate were these Indians that when France, acting on a tip-off, forced the plane down, 27 among them pleaded for asylum in the European nation.

France sent the remaining 276 Indians back to Mumbai, where they landed on Tuesday morning — as living examples of the mismatch between the government's rhetoric on the economy and the reality that millions of people around the country deal with every day. Such stories dent the narrative of an increasingly prosperous India that the Modi government is determined to try and convince the world about.

For those who look at the GDP, India's economy is definitely growing. The stock market is certainly up. But there are other indicators that raise questions about the state of the economy and India's place in the world.

Earlier this year, the London-based wealth manager, Henley & Partners, reported that an estimated 6,500 Indian millionaires are expected to leave the country in 2023, a number that is second only to China. This follows a growing trend of high-net-worth Indians leaving the country. Those who stay are increasingly investing abroad: the share of Indian investments in other countries has been growing so fast that the government has imposed limits on how much wealth Indians can park abroad. Meanwhile, more than 85,000 Indians — rich and poor — gave up their passports in the first half of 2023. That number, too, is increasing: more than 220,000 Indians quit their citizenship last year compared to 129,000 in 2014.

Just like those men, women and children sent back by France this week, desperation defines the desire of tens of thousands of Indians keen to move to the West — whatever the risks.

Stories of Indian-American success are commonplace, but here's another fact: between October 2022 and September 2023, nearly 97,000 Indians tried to enter the US illegally and were stopped. That's a five-fold increase from the figure in 2019-2020.

Electronic 'soil' enhances crop growth

When barley seedlings' root systems are electrically stimulated using a new cultivation substrate, they grow 50pc faster on average. Linköping University researchers developed an electrically conductive 'soil' for soilless growing, known as hydroponics, in a paper published in the journal PNAS.

"The world population is increasing, and we also have climate change. So it's clear that we won't be able to cover the food demands of the planet with only the already existing agricultural methods. But with hydroponics we can grow food also in urban environments in very controlled settings," says Eleni Stavrinidou, associate professor at the Laboratory of Organic Electronics at Linköping University, and leader of the Electronic Plants group.

Her research group has now developed an electrically conductive cultivation substrate tailored to hydroponic cultivation which they call eSoil. The Linköping University researchers have shown that barley seedlings grown in the conductive "soil" grew up to 50% more in 15 days when their roots were stimulated electrically.

Hydroponic cultivation means that plants grow without soil, needing only water, nutrients and something their roots can attach to - a substrate. It is a closed system that enables water recirculation so that each seedling gets exactly the nutrients it needs. Therefore, very little water is required and all nutrients remain in the system, which is not possible in traditional cultivation.

Hydroponics also enables vertical cultivation in large towers to maximise space efficiency. Crops already being cultivated in this manner include lettuce, herbs and some vegetables. Grains are not typically grown in hydroponics apart for their use as fodder. In this study the researchers show that barley seedlings can be cultivated using hydroponics and that they have a better growth rate thanks to electrical stimulation.



"In this way, we can get seedlings to grow faster with less resources. We don't yet know how it actually works, which biological mechanisms that are involved. What we have found is that seedlings process nitrogen more effectively, but it's not clear yet how the electrical stimulation impacts this process," says Eleni Stavrinidou.

Mineral wool is often used as cultivation substrate in hydroponics. Not only is

this non-biodegradable, it is also produced with a very energy intensive process. The electronic cultivation substrate eSoil is made of cellulose, the most abundant biopolymer, mixed with a conductive polymer called PEDOT. This combination as such is not new, but this is the first time it has been used for plant cultivation and for creating an interface for plants in this manner. Previous research has used high voltage to stimulate the roots. The advantage of

the Linköping researchers' "soil" is that it has very low energy consumption and no high voltage danger. Eleni Stavrinidou believes that the new study will open the pathway for new research areas to develop further hydroponic cultivation.

"We can't say that hydroponics will solve the problem of food security. But it can definitely help particularly in areas with little arable land and with harsh environmental conditions."

Beijing records longest cold wave since 1951

China's Beijing recorded the longest cold wave since records began in 1951 as the freezing temperature and snowfall experienced in the Chinese capital and elsewhere began to ease, CNN reported.

The temperature recorded at Beijing's Nanjiao weather station rose to above zero degrees Celsius (32 degrees Fahrenheit) on Sunday afternoon for the first time in days, Chinese local media, Beijing Daily stated. "Since the temperature first dropped to below zero degrees on December 11, the temperature had remained below that line for more than 300 hours," Beijing Daily wrote.

This month, a strong cold wave swept through most of China and pushed the heat capacity of some cities in northern China to its limit, reported CNN.

Following this severe coldwave, China's central province of Henan has seen multiple system failures.

In Jiaozuo City, heating was partially halted after a malfunction at the Wanfang power plant on Friday.

However, the problem was solved on Saturday and heating is expected to resume Sunday night, according to the official newspaper of the city, Jiaozuo Daily. Moreover, two other cities in the province, Puyang and Pingdingshan, have cut heating to most government buildings and state-owned enterprises since Friday to "prioritise limited heating resources for hospitals, schools and residential buildings," the two cities' governments said in a statement.



The biting weather in the capital, Beijing, started days ago and has also caused issues with the city's metro system, according to CNN.

Hundreds of commuters and dozens of people with fractured bones were sent to the hospital in Beijing earlier this month after two trains collided on a busy metro line during snowy conditions, the city's transportation authority stated.

Additionally, the freezing temperatures also hampered rescue efforts as a deadly earthquake occurred this month in northwest Gansu province of China.

Regularization of Extension Lecturers in Government Colleges in Haryana - A Perfect Panacea: A Reappraisal

Apart from 97 private-aided colleges and 182 government colleges in Haryana, there are also self-finance colleges. In 182 government colleges, out of 8137 sanction posts 4738 posts are vacant. Even after 2194 lecturers serving on a contract basis, at present 1535 posts have been stuck for more than a year.

It is clear that the appointment of Extension Lecturers is done according to the government norms-advertisement in the national newspapers and required qualification-M.A., M. Phil., Ph. D, etc. To fulfill the dream of the chief minister, Manohar Lal, the selections of these posts should be free from political pressures to make the process more transparent.

The question of regularization of extension lecturers in Haryana is not being digested by the permanent lecturers in colleges. They are against this regularization of extension lecturer as they consider it as a 'back door entry'. It is ironic that like the regular lecturers, the service records of the extension lecturers is maintained by the colleges and - their seniority and annual confidential reports send to the Director, General Higher Education, Panchkula, but they are discriminated against as they are not regular lecturers.

Consequently, the future of these extension lecturers is not safe and secure. There is also a big disparity between the pay that the extension lecturers are drawing and the pay drawn by the regular college lecturers. The salary of the extension lecturers is Rs. 57700 per month whereas in the private aided colleges, they are at the mercy of management and are being paid Rs 10000 to 21000 per month and can be shown the

door at any time. On the other hand, if the recent decision of the Punjab and Haryana High Court is implemented (CWP No. 1887 of 2019), the salary of these guest lecturers will hike from Rs. 57700 per month to Rs. 85000.

Among the diverse problems in the field of Higher Education in India, lack of quality is the biggest. Teaching is a professional to enhance a teacher's intellectual level, but the universities have become factories for producing degrees, says the former governor of Gujarat. The main reason is that they are not engaged in this work rather it is done by their research scholars and students which is the main reason of the degradation in the quality of research and education.

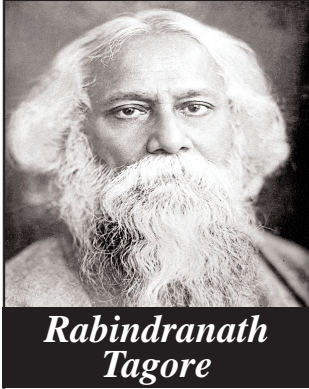
The steep decline in the quality of education is also the direct result of policies adopted by various private universities that are charging different amounts for giving fake degrees to the candidates registered. According to an RTI report of 2020, there are more than 500 college lecturers from private-aided colleges, self-finance, and government colleges who obtained fake degrees from these universities. Most of them received degrees as 'non-attending candidates' of 'research courses' as they remained present in the colleges and without taking leave. In many colleges, even after the strictness of DGHE, Panchkula, and no biometric attendance is followed by the principals of some government-aided colleges as well as government colleges which also results in degradation of quality education.

A Quest for Justice: The story of an old man

The year was 1991. I was posted at a station near Indo Pak border in District Amritsar. Terrorism was at its peak in the State in those days. Our Sessions Division was gearing up for the annual inspection. As part of the preparations, officers were directed to prepare history sheets of the oldest pending matters before them. Little did I know that sifting through the proceedings of such cases would uncover a tale of injustice that had persisted for far too long.

As I leafed through the history sheets, one case stood out. It told the story of an old man who after a long drawn battle during seventies had finally secured a decree for the possession of certain agricultural land the possession of which thereof was delivered to him. But within a few days thereafter, the influential opposite party cruelly snatched the possession of land again. The plea goes that it was done at the mid of the cold night leaving the old man, desperate to reclaim what was rightfully his. He had filed an application seeking the restoration of his land. What was truly heart-

breaking was that this case had been consistently adjourned, relegated to the status of a mere "miscellaneous application." The old man, without a word of protest, had endured countless delays, leaving the courtroom each time with nothing but another date to return.

Even more disheartening was the fact that his own advocate had never apprised me about the issue involved. It was a vicious cycle of adjournments, and the old man's hope was fading day by day. However, thanks to an impending inspection by a High Court Judge, the truth behind this long-forgotten case came to the fore.

I held onto the file, determined to make a difference. The day of reckoning arrived, and the case was called. The old man dot came inside the court room. Thinking that another date shall be given. Like so many times before. But not this time. This time, fate had a different plan.

The advocate for the old man, who had initially sent a request for adjournment, eventually made an appearance. He pleaded unpre-

paredness, but I decided it was time to reveal my preparedness. I told him that I was prepared and disclosed the facts that after decree for possession was passed and upheld in the end of 70s, possession was delivered to the applicant old man only to be taken back forcibly within a short time thereafter pushing him to file the application which was pending for over a decade. The counsel was further told that the older applicant in return was only getting "tareekh pe tareekh. The bench and the bar should share the shame for this ongoing injustice.

The advocate for the old man, finally speaking the unspeakable, revealed that the opposing party was immensely influential, with close ties with all the influential figures in the area. Even the police were reluctant to intervene, painting a dire picture.

I knew it was time for action. I dictated an order that detailed the entire history and commanded the issuance of bailable warrants to secure the presence of the respondents. To no one's surprise, they did not show up. The Ilaqa

SHO was instructed to produce them, but it too yielded no results. It was then that the Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) for the district was taken into picture. After a month long effort, three imposing figures draped in white kurta pyjamas, finally appeared before the court represented by a senior advocate of the station. The advocate sought yet another date for filing a response but I remained resolute. There would be no more delays. No further date was to be given. In a bold move, I ordered the Naib Court to take them into custody. The courtroom fell silent in disbelief. When Naib Court asked the three to sit on the bench meant for accused persons in custody, their advocate, understandably concerned about his clients, inquired about the reason for their impending custody. When the facts were laid bare, he swiftly confided with his clients and provided an undertaking to ensure that the possession shall be restored within a week, on the condition that they be spared immediate custody. This is what I wanted. Seizing the opportunity, I granted two-days time for doing

the needful. I never intended to take them in custody nor was there any legal provisions for such action at that stage of the case. It was only to get delivered justice to the old man who was waiting to see his land back before closing his eyes.

Two days later, the three men returned, humbled, to admit their wrongdoing. They had undone the wrong committed by them which brought a radiant smile on the old man's face, and a sense of satisfaction to me. Justice had prevailed, and the old man was finally seeing his beloved land returned to him after years of waiting.

It was not just a case; it was a story of resilience and determination in the face of injustice. It was a reminder that the pursuit of justice, even when it seems distant, is a noble endeavor that can transform lives. And, most importantly, it taught us all that no matter how influential the wrongdoers may be, justice will always find a way to prevail.

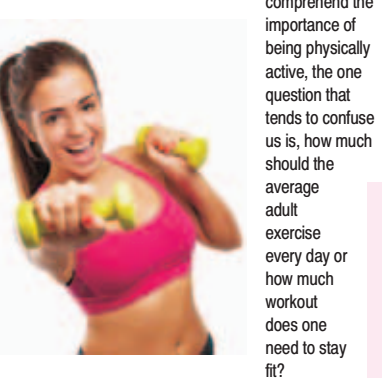

Fitness Guidance: How Much Exercise Do You Need, Really?

In these times of a pandemic and lockdown, exercise might certainly not be on the top of your to-do list. It has been researched that around 1 out of 4 adults and 4 out of 5 adolescents fail to receive plentiful aerobic workouts. It is important to note that the absence of physical activity can have undesirable impacts on one's health. On the flip side, workouts can be a powerful prevention tool to guard one against diabetes, cardio-vascular ailments, bouts of depression and anxiety, and also to regularise sleep patterns. Alongside, physical activity recovers one's capacity to think, learn and judge. While most of us



comprehend the importance of being physically active, the one question that tends to confuse us is, how much should the average adult exercise every day or how much workout does one need to stay fit? It has been recommended that a healthy adult needs a minimum of 150 to 300 minutes of moderate physical activity per week or about 75 to 150 minutes of vigorous activity, or a mixture of both. That's anywhere from an hour and 15 minutes to 5 hours! Although that might sound a bit exhausting, if you break it down to how much work out an day your body requires, it works out to less than an hour. Indulging in 150 to 300 minutes activity per week averages to about 21 to 43 minutes per day. Rather than being focused on a suggested regular exercise, one must prioritise a weekly total. Working out around 300

minutes a week may also offer extra advantages to those wanting to lose weight. Types Of Exercise: Aerobic Activity: One must get at least 150 minutes of moderate aerobic activity or about 75 minutes of energetic aerobic activity a week, or a mix of both. The guidelines recommend that this exercise must be spread out during a week for best results. Being active for brief time intervals, but all through the day, can add up to offering health benefits. • Strength Training: This training must be done to target all major muscle groups at least twice a week. Aim to perform a single set of each workout, making use of a weight or resistance level that is heavy enough to stimulate your muscles. Exercise For All Here are some guidelines on how much activity is recommended for particular age groups. • Children And Adolescents (Ages 5-17): A minimum of

sixty minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity a day. At least three days a week should comprise forceful aerobic activities that will help in building robust muscles and bones. • Adults (Ages 18-64): An average healthy adult will require a minimum of 150 to 300 minutes of moderately-paced workout (or 75 to 150 minutes of vigorous) aerobic activity once a week. Three times per week of muscle strengthening exercises can offer extra benefits. • Older Adults (Over 65 Years Of Age): The workout regime for seniors should include strength and balance training sessions about 2-3 times a week to guard one against falls. • Expecting Mothers And Postpartum Women: Pregnant ladies and women who have just delivered should opt for about 150 minutes of moderate-intensity aerobic activity per week that can include muscle-strengthening workouts after consulting the doctor.

Exercise, balanced diet & keeping tab on BP can help prevent stroke in winters, advises Dr Vivek Gupta

Mohali: Stroke is the second leading cause of death and long-term disability in the world. A surge in stroke cases during the winter months points towards a potentially dangerous link between the cold weather and cardiovascular health. Dr Vivek Gupta, Additional Director, Interventional Neuro-radiology, Fortis Hospital Mohali, through an advisory sheds light on how to safeguard oneself from stroke in winter. • What is a stroke?

A stroke occurs when blood circulation to a part of the brain stops. Brain cells can die from decreased blood flow and due to the resulting lack of oxygen. Stroke is of two types – Haemorrhagic (bleeding in brain) and Ischemic (clot in brain's blood vessel). • Risk factors Discussing the factors associated with stroke, Dr Gupta, added, "While strokes can occur at any time, the winter season seems to exacerbate certain risk factors. This is because the freezing temperatures constrict blood vessels and this increases blood pressure, thus posing a risk for a stroke. Limited outdoor activity and decreased exposure to sunlight can also contribute to vitamin D deficiency, another factor linked to cardiovascular issues." • Causes Stating that studies had shown a consistent rise in hospital admissions for stroke-related cases during winter, Dr Gupta, added, "Intertwining lifestyle

changes, physiological responses to cold, and the impact of seasonal infections on one's overall health. It's crucial to recognize these trends to proactively address and mitigate the risks associated with winter strokes. Diabetes, hypertension, smoking, obesity, high cholesterol level and heart diseases also increased the risk for a stroke." • Prevention is better than cure: Dr Gupta said it was important to sensitize people on ways to prevent stroke during the cold weather.

"Regular exercise or adequate physical activity helps maintain good cardiovascular health. A balanced diet rich in essential nutrients can combat the winter blues and fortify the body against potential health threats. Abstinence from smoking and limiting alcohol, a balanced diet rich in fruits, vegetables and low-fat dairy products, keeping a tab on cholesterol and blood pressure can go a long way in preventing strokes," he added.

Always monitor your blood pressure and stay connected with healthcare providers for regular check-ups.
