Bomb threat at UP’s Ram Janaki Temple, case filed

KANPUR: Ram Janaki Temple in Uttar Pradesh’s Kanpur received a bomb threat on Sunday, six days after the Pran Prathishtha ceremony of Ram Lalla in Ayodhya. Several posters mentioning bomb threats were pasted on the walls and scattered on the floor of the ancient temple. BJP leader Rohit Sahu, who is also a trustee of Ram Janaki Temple in Kanpur also received a threat letter. Notably, a bhava programme was held in the Ram Janaki Temple on the day of the Pran Pratishtha ceremony in Ayodhya. Rahul Sahu, the younger brother of Rohit Sahu, said, “I got information about threat letters pasted on the temple’s walls and scattered on the floor in the morning. When I came here, I too saw threat letters scattered everywhere.”

Earthquake of 4.0 magnitude hits Kutch; no casualties

AHMEDABAD: An earthquake of 4.0 magnitude hit Gujarat’s Kutch district on Sunday evening but there is no report of damage to property and life, officials said. The epicentre of the earthquake was located near Bhachau in Kutch district, as per the Institute of Seismological Research (ISR). The tremor was recorded at 4:45 pm on Sunday with its epicentre around 21 km north, northwest (NNW) from Bhachau, the ISR said in its latest update.

Five of a family charred to death in Bareilly

BAREILLY : Five members of a family, including a couple and their three children, were charred to death after a house caught fire under mysterious circumstances in Faridpur area of Bareilly district here in Uttar Pradesh on Sunday, a senior police officer said here. Expressing grief over the incident, Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has announced an ex-gratia of Rs 5 lakh each. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Ghule Sushil Chandrabhan said that the incident took place when the house of Ajay Gupta, a resident of Farakhpur locality, caught fire.

Nitish takes oath as Bihar CM for record ninth time

Samrat Chaudhary and Vijay Sinha are Dy CMs

AGENCY PATNA, JAN 28

Janata Dal-United chief Nitish Kumar took oath as Bihar Chief Minister for the ninth time at Raj Bhavan on Sunday after snapping ties with “Mahagathbandhan”.

Alongside Samrat Chaudhary and Vijay Kumar Sinha took the oath as Deputy Chief Ministers

Upon arrival of BJP chief JP Nadda, the people were heard chanting Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s name and slogans.

After days of speculation, JD(U) chief Nitish Kumar resigned as the Chief Minister of Bihar on Sunday, his second volte face in less than 18 months. Snapping ties with the RJD and Congress, Nitish will now be forming a government with BJP’s support, the oath-taking of which is going to take place shortly.

Nitish Kumar cited the state of affairs being “not right” under the Mahagathbandhan alliance as his reason for quitting. He said that he has been receiving suggestions from everywhere, including his party workers, and he listened to all of them to come to this decision.



“I have resigned as the CM today and have asked the Governor to put an end to this government. Party leaders were giving me advice. I heard what they said and have resigned. The situation was not good. So, we have broken ties,” Nitish Kumar told reporters outside the Raj Bhavan.

Despite turbulence in state politics, Nitish, whether with the Mahagathbandhan or the BJP-led National Democratic Alliance (NDA), has managed to retain the CM’s chair and ensured that his party has not split over his repeated flip-flops. In the Bihar Assembly of 243, the RJD has 79 MLAs; followed by the BJP’s

NEW DELHI: The Congress on Sunday called Bihar Chief Minister and JD(U) president Nitish Kumar a “chameleon” and said the people of the state will never forgive this “expert” of betrayal and those making him dance to their tunes. The party was reacting to Kumar’s decision to resign as the chief minister of Bihar and leaving the ‘Mahagathbandhan (grand alliance)’ in the state while also dealing a body blow to the opposition bloc INDIA.

Hry CM inaugurates Electric City Bus Service in Panipat

The historic city of Panipat witnessed another significant milestone for sustainable and convenient Transport today, after the Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal inaugurated the Electric City Bus Service from the new bus stand in Siwah, Panipat. The objective of this initiative is not only to provide convenient transportation to the people of the state but also to reduce environmental pollution. On this occasion, the Chief Minister announced that the first seven days of traveling in these Electric buses will be free, encouraging people to opt for public transportation over private vehicles. The routes of the City Bus Service will be carefully planned, taking into consideration the demands and needs of the city residents.

Presently, three electric city buses have been introduced in Panipat, and soon, five more buses will be added to the fleet. The fare for the City Bus Service will range from Rs. 10 to Rs. 50, and the route will cover a distance of



28 to 30 kilometers. The City Bus Service will be systematically expanded to the villages surrounding the city, informed the Chief Minister after launching the bus service.

The Chief Minister extended best wishes to the people of Panipat on the commencement of the City Bus Service and personally travelled on the bus.

He was accompanied by Rajya Sabha MP, Sh. Krishan Lal Panwar, MP, Sh. Sanjay Bhatia, Panipat City MLA, Sh. Pramod Vij, and the Principal Secretary, Transport Department, Sh. Navdeep Virk.

The Chief Minister shared that the Siwah bus stand is closely connected to him, as he had inaugurated it on July 18, 2023. Today, the Panipat City Bus Service commences from this very location, promising significant benefits to both city and rural residents, he said.

The Chief Minister said that after the launch of electric city bus service in Panipat and Jagadhri, the government aims to start electric city bus services in seven cities, including Panchkula, Ambala, Sonapat, Rewari, Karnal, Rohtak, and Hisar, by June 2024.

BRO successfully bores 700-meter Naushera tunnel connecting Akhnoor-Rajouri-Poonch

With the successful boring of the 700-meter Naushera Tunnel connecting Akhnoor to Rajouri and Poonch, the Border Roads Organisation (BRO) on Sunday achieved a major milestone in the big-ticket Akhnoor-Rajouri-Poonch Breakthrough of 700-meter Naushera tunnel highway Project.

The construction of the major infrastructure project-National Highway 144A, connecting Akhnoor to Poonch, crossed a major milestone with the successful tunnel boring. A breakthrough ceremony was organised at the Naushera Tunnel, with the workers erupting in celebrations.

The tunnel spans an impressive 700 metres and will

serve as a crucial link between Akhnoor and Poonch once the project opens to the public. Director General of Border Roads (DGBR), Lieutenant General Raghu Srinivasan, who led the breakthrough ceremony, underscored the importance of this project, saying that it marks a major step in enhancing regional connectivity and facilitating smoother transportation along the National Highway. Lt. Gen. Raghu Srinivasan said, “Last year, on November 20, 2023, a similar breakthrough was achieved at the Kandi tunnel, in a triumph of the ongoing efforts of the BRO towards providing better connectivity across the areas of Rajouri and Poonch. The progress of the NH project is going at a great pace and the project is expected to be completed by 2026, before time.”

UGC suggests de-reserving SC,ST, OBC posts if enough reserved candidates not available

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JAN 28

A vacancy reserved for SC or ST or OBC candidates can be declared unreserved if enough candidates from these categories are not available, according to new draft guidelines by University Grants Commission (UGC).

The ‘Guidelines for Implementation of the Reservation Policy of the Government of India in Higher Education Institutes (HEIs)’ are in public domain for feedback from stakeholders. The guidelines have been receiving backlash from several quarters. The JNU Students’ Union (JNUSU)



has announced a protest against it and will be burning an effigy of UGC Chairman M Jagadesh Kumar.

No reaction could be had from Kumar on the criticism for the guidelines. “A vacancy reserved for SC or ST or OBC cannot be filled by a candi-

date other than an SC or ST or OBC candidate, as the case may be. “However, a reserved vacancy may be declared unreserved by following the procedure of de-reservation where after, it can be filled as an unreserved vacancy,” the draft guidelines read.

“There is a general ban on de-reservation of reserved vacancies in case of direct recruitment. “However, in rare and exceptional cases when a vacancy in a Group A’ service cannot be allowed to remain vacant in public interest, the University concerned may prepare a proposal for de-reservation of the vacancy giving following information: The proposal will be required to list – efforts made to fill up

the post; reasons why it cannot be allowed to remain vacant and justification for de-reservation. “The proposal for de-reservation in case of Group C or D should go to the Executive Council of the University and in case of Group A or B should be submitted to the Ministry of Education, giving full details, for necessary approval. After receiving the approval, the post may be filled and reservation may be carried forward,” the draft guidelines read. In case of promotion, if sufficient numbers of SC and ST’ candidates fit for promotion against reserved vacancies are not available, such vacancies may be de-reserved .

Strong judicial system is cornerstone of a developed India: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday said that a strong judicial system is the cornerstone of a developed India.

Participating in the Diamond Jubilee celebrations of the Supreme Court, the Prime Minister said that due to the replacement of three colonial-era criminal laws country’s legal, policing, and investigating system entered a new era.

“By repealing the colonial-era criminal laws, the government has introduced the system of Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita, Bharatiya Nyay Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam. Due to these changes, our legal, policing, and investigating system has entered a new era. This is a huge change. It is very important that there should be a smooth transition

from hundreds of years old laws to new laws. For this, training and capacity-building work of government employees has already been started. I would request the Supreme Court to also come forward for such capacity building of all stakeholders,” PM Modi said, adding that a strong judicial system is the main foundation of developed India.

The Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhinyam replaced the centuries-old Indian Penal Code (IPC), the Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC) and Indian Evidence Act respectively. The three laws were passed by the Parliament in the recently concluded Winter Session and received President Droupadi Murmu’s assent on December 25, last year.

The Prime Minister said that today the eyes of the whole world are on India and the world’s trust in India is



increasing. “Today it is important for India to take advantage of every opportunity,” he said at an event celebrating 75 years of the Supreme Court here in the national capital.

“Today India’s priority is ease of living, ease of doing business, ease of travel, ease of communication and ease of justice,” he said.

Child death: Anil Vij instructs Panipat SP to investigate matter

Haryana Home and Health Minister, Sh. Anil Vij directed the Ambala SP to investigate allegations of cutting fingers instead of treating them in the case of a youth whose fingers were trapped in a machine.

Today in Ambala, Sh. Vij redressed the grievances to the people of the state at his residence in Ambala.

A family residing in Ambala Cantonment B.D. Flour Mill area complained that their son works in a factory. A few days ago, three fingers of their son got trapped in the machine while working in the factory. Due to the fingers being stuck in the machine, the factory owner took their son to a private doctor. Their allegation was that the doctor cut off three fingers of their



son. The family claimed that neither was their son taken to a civil hospital nor to any other major hospital before the fingers were amputated. The factory owner did not provide any information before cutting the fingers. They filed a complaint with the police, but no action has been taken so

far. Similarly, a family from Panipat informed Home Minister Anil Vij that some accused set their house on fire, resulting in the death of their child and injuries to five other family members. Although a murder case was registered, the accused were not arrest-

ed. Home Minister directed the Panipat SP to ensure the arrest of the accused.

Additionally, Home Minister Vij directed the Palwal SP to take action in a case where a soldier and his family alleged that some individuals had encroached upon their land in Palwal.

He also issued instructions for action in cases related to immigration fraud where individuals reported being deceived by agents in Kaithal and Kurukshetra. Moreover, Minister Vij directed the authorities to take action in various other cases, including assault on a woman in Bhiwani, online fraud in Defense Colony, a theft case in Mahendragarh, a suicide case in Bilaspur, and a missing child complaint in Kurukshetra.

CM announces development Initiatives at 'Sarkar Gaon Ke Dwar' Program in Una

300 crore budget allocated for educational reforms

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu presided over the 'Sarkar Gaon Ke Dwar' programme at Ladoli in Chintpurni assembly constituency of Una district today. On the occasion 62 public complaints were received, 24 certificates issued, and 13 mutation cases were resolved. During the event, the Chief Minister made several announcements, including a two-day Chintpurni Mahotsav in Amb, construction of a Mini Secretariat in Amb, Rs. 10 crore for Swan river Channelization, opening of PHC in Panjoa, and construction of an indoor stadium. He said that to provide better employment opportunities



to the youth the new edge courses would be started at Naiharian ITI. He also announces to allocate Rs 3. crore for science classes in Government Sen. Sec School Saloe and Diara, and repairing of 50 old tube wells. The Chief

Minister said that the State Government is woking to provide quality education to all the children in Himachal by spending Rs. 300 crore. Under this Scheme Rajiv Gandhi Day-Boarding Schools will be

established in every assembly constituency, so that the overall development of these children could be ensured. He said that the land has been identified to open Rajiv Gandhi Day-Boarding Schools in Chintpurni assembly constituency and the construction work would be started within a year. The Government has decided to commence English medium from class one from the next session along with a decision to set an age limit of six for class one so as to reducing stress among students. In the health sector, improvements include a Health Information Management System (HIMS) in 56 health institutions, enabling doctors to access patient details through a cloud-based server, saving the time and unnecessary formalities of the citizens.

Nitish after resigning as CM

In his first reaction to the political turmoil after handing over his resignation letter to the Governor, Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar said the state of affairs in the 'Mahagathbandhan' (grand alliance) formed one and a half years ago was 'not good'.

"I resigned as chief minister and requested the Governor to dissolve the government. The situation came to this pass as the state of affairs within the ruling alliance in Bihar wasn't good. I sought the advice and opinions of everyone before coming to this decision. I took all opinions and suggestions to heart. The government is being dissolved today," Nitish told reporters on Sunday. "The alliance, which was formed one and a half years ago, was sailing through choppy waters. Though we came together on the



basis of a common minimum programme and promises to the people, we failed to live up to expectations and discharge our salient duties. Eventually, we fell out and even stopped being on speaking terms. I was left with no option but to sever all ties with the alliance," the JD(U) supreme said, targeting RJD. The official handle of Raj Bhavan of Bihar on X posted that the Governor asked Nitish to discharge his administrative duties

as the acting chief minister till a new government takes shape. "Governor Rajendra Vishwanath Arlekar accepted the resignation of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar and asked him to act as acting Chief Minister until alternative arrangements are made," the Governor's office at Raj Bhawan posted on X. Responding to the political quake in the state, Congress leader Jairam Ramesh posted from his official X handle,

Lala Lajpat Rai at Inquilab Mandir

The birthday of the great revolutionary Lala Lajpat Rai was celebrated at Inquilab Mandir Gumthala Rao. Temple founder Advocate Waryam Singh along with the society members paid tribute to Lala Lajpat Rai by offering flowers on his statue. Waryam Singh said that Lala Lajpat Rai, born on 28 January 1865 in Moga district of Punjab, played the role of a major freedom fighter of India. He practiced law for some time in Rohtak and Hisar cities of Haryana state. This trinity along with Balgangadhar Tilak and Vipin Chandra Pal was known as Lal-Bal-Pal. These great revolutionaries were the first to demand complete independence in India. Along with Swami Dayanand Saraswati, Arya Samaj was popularized in Punjab. Along with Lala Hansraj, Dayanand also promoted Anglo Vedic schools. Lala ji had served the people by setting up camps during famine at many places. Took part in a huge



demonstration organized against the Simon Commission in Lahore. During this time, Lala Lajpat Rai was badly injured in the lathi charge by the British government. After being injured, he said that every stick that falls on my body will act as a nail in the coffin of the British Government and that is what happened. The British government had to leave India. Gaza and genocide

The order of the International Court of Justice on South Africa's request for provisional measures to prevent genocide in the Gaza Strip is, in the words of The Economist, a "stinging rebuke" to Israel. It's more than that; it is a root-and-branch rejection of the Western consensus that Israel has no case to answer for the devastation it has caused in Gaza.

In response to South Africa's case, Israel had argued that the war in Gaza did not fall within the jurisdiction of the ICJ, that the ICJ should "remove the case from the General List" and also reject South Africa's request for provisional measures. Israel's friends in the West agreed. The favoured description of the South African case by government spokespersons of Western nations was "meritless" or "unhelpful". The most enthusiastic media advocate of Israel's continuing war in Gaza, The Economist, led with a headline that read "Charging Israel with genocide makes a mockery of the ICJ".

The ICJ didn't agree. It rejected every one of Israel's contentions. It ruled that the ICJ had jurisdiction over the case under the Genocide Convention. It further ruled that South Africa had the standing to bring the case. These two rulings prepared the ground for its most trenchant conclusions. It ruled that "... at least some of the rights claimed by South Africa and for which it is seeking protection are plausible. This is the case with respect to the right of the Palestinians in Gaza to be protected from acts of genocide..."

The reasoning behind this finding of the ICJ, that some of the rights of Palestinians in Gaza under the Genocide Convention were plausibly threatened, was a rehearsal of South Africa's arguments. When the president of the Court, Justice Joan Donoghue, presented its findings, she cited the same allegations of genocidal incitement by Israel's political and military leaders that South Africa's legal team had set before the Court. To have the prosecution's arguments and evidence recited as valid reasons for finding the threat to the Palestinians under the Genocide Convention plausible dismissed Israel's claim (and that of its Western enablers) that there was nothing remotely genocidal to see in Gaza.

For the Court to pass provisional orders, it needed to be persuaded that the measures South Africa had requested were linked to the Palestinian rights that were plausibly threatened. In other words, the interim measures South Africa had requested had to be relevant in warding off the plausible risk of genocide for Palestinians in Gaza. Israel had argued that the measures requested by South Africa were irrelevant because it was already abiding by the provisions of the Genocide Convention through its efforts to relocate civilians before its bombardments.

US approves sale of F-16 fighter jets to Turkey

After the Turkish parliament's approval to ratify Sweden's NATO membership, the United States nodded for the sale of F-16 fighter jets to Turkey, Al Jazeera reported on Saturday.

The US Department of State notified Congress of the USD 23 billion agreement to sell the warplanes to NATO ally Turkey on Friday night, along with a companion USD 8.6 billion sale of advanced F-35 fighter jets to Greece, also an ally in the Western military bloc.

The department's notification came hours after Turkey deposited its "instrument of ratification" for Sweden's accession to NATO with Washington, which is the repository for alliance documents and after several key members of Congress lifted their objections.

The sale to Turkey includes 40 Lockheed Martin F-16s and equipment to modernise 79 of its existing F-16 fleet. Greece will get 40 F-35 Lightning II Joint Strike Fighters and related equipment, Al Jazeera reported.

Turkey has long sought to upgrade its F-16 fleet and requested the jets in October 2021, but its delay in approving Sweden's NATO bid became an obstacle to winning congressional approval.

Ankara had made its ratification of Sweden's membership contingent on the approval of the sale of the new planes.

Al Jazeera reported that President Joe Biden's administration had supported the sale, but several lawmakers had expressed objections due to Turkey's human rights record. "My approval of Turkey's request to purchase F-16 aircraft has been contingent on Turkish approval of Sweden's NATO membership. But make no mistake: This was not a decision I came to lightly," said



Democratic Senator Ben Cardin, chair of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, one of four key committees that needs to approve arms transfers.

"I look forward to beginning this new chapter in our relationship with Turkey, expanding the NATO alliance, and working with our global allies in standing up to ongoing Russian aggression against its peaceful neighbours," he said.

Congress has 15 days to object to the

sale, after which it is considered final.

Ankara had delayed its approval of Sweden's NATO membership for more than a year, ostensibly because it believed Stockholm did not take Turkey's national security concerns seriously enough, including its fight against Kurdish fighters and other groups it considers to be security threats.

The delays had frustrated the US and other NATO allies, almost all of which had been swift to accept Sweden and Finland

into the alliance after the Nordic states dropped their longstanding military neutrality following Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022.

Finland became the alliance's 31st member in April.

All eyes are now on Hungary, which is the only NATO member holding up Sweden's bid. US and NATO officials have said they expect Hungary to act quickly, especially after Turkey's decision.

Rahat Fateh Ali Khan apologises

Iconic Pakistani playback and Qawwali singer Rahat Fateh Ali Khan, apologised on Saturday and owned a video circulating online of him beating his student after it sparked on-line furore at his behaviour.

On Saturday, a video surfacing on social media showed the artist resorting to physical aggression, using shoes and slapping the employee over a missing "bottle".

Netizens reacted strongly to the singer's video.

As per Dawn, an apologetic video was published later, in which the singer justified it as a "personal matter between a teacher and his student" and also identified him as Naveed Hasnain as the person being punished in the video.

In the same video, Hasnain, who is seen standing next to his master said, the "bottle" is responsible for the controversy in the original video and it "contained water sanctified by a pir," adding, "he had misplaced the bottle and forgotten about it."

"He is my father and my teacher. He loves us a lot too. Whoever has done this act [of leaking the video] is black-mailing to defame my teacher," he added.

Rahat also added that he had asked forgiveness from Hasnain the next instant, Dawn reported.

The singer is Ustad Nusrat Fateh Ali



Khan's nephew and grandson. He also received the Sitara-i-Imtiaz.

In 2019, Oxford University gave him an honorary degree. North Korea fires several cruise missiles from east coast

North Korea fired several cruise missiles from its east coast on Sunday, days after Pyongyang test-fired new strategic cruise missiles from the west coast, Yonhap news agency reported, citing the South Korean military.

The Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) said North Korea's launch took place around 8 am (local time) in waters off Shinpo Port but did not elaborate further, citing an 'on-going analysis'.

"While strengthening our monitoring and vigilance, our military has been closely coordinating with the United States to monitor additional signs of North Korea's provocations," the JCS said in a text message sent to reporters.

It marks Pyongyang's second cruise missile launch this year after it test-fired strategic cruise missiles, named Pulhwasal-3-31, towards the Yellow Sea on January 24. Yonhap news agency reported, citing experts, that the Pulhwasal-3-31 appears to be a nuclear-capable cruise missile, considering that the number in its name is identical to that of the Hwasan-31, a tactical nuclear warhead that North Korea first unveiled in March 2023.

North Korea first test-fired the Hawsal-1 cruise missile in September 2021 and launched several Hawsal-1 and Hawsal-2 cruise missiles presumed to be capable of carrying tactical nuclear weapons last year.

In the Korean language, Hwasal means an 'arrow' and Pulhwasal means a 'fire arrow'. Cruise missiles fly low and manoeuvre, making them better at evading missile defences.



The launch of a cruise missile is not a direct violation of multiple United Nations Security Council resolutions banning the North's use of ballistic missile technology. But it could pose a serious threat to South Korea's security as nuclear warheads can be mounted on such missiles.

North Korea has dialled up tensions on the Korean Peninsula with weapons tests and harsh rhetoric in an election year for South Korea and the United States, according to Yonhap news agency.

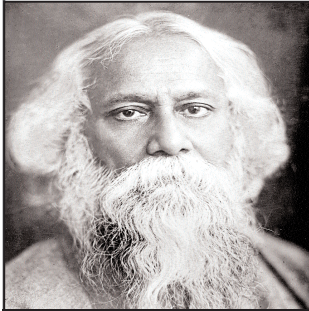
It launched a solid-fuel hypersonic missile into the East Sea on January 14 in its first missile firing this year.

Pyongyang also claimed it had tested an underwater nuclear attack drone in protest of the latest joint military drills among South Korea, the US and Japan earlier this month.

Research shows furry fruit improves mental health

Kiwifruit has proven to be a powerful mood booster, and new research from the University of Otago demonstrates how quickly its effects can occur.

In a study, published in The British Journal of Nutrition, researchers found the furry fruit improved vitality and mood in as little as four days.

Co-author Professor Tamlin Conner, of the Department of Psychology, says the findings provide a tangible and accessible way for people to support their mental well-being.

"It's great for people to know that small changes in their diet, like adding kiwifruit, could make a difference in how they feel every day."

Vitamin C intake has been asso-



ciated with improved mood, vitality, well-being, and lower depression,

while vitamin C deficiency is associated with higher depression and cog-

nitive impairment.

However, Professor Conner says limited research has assessed how quickly mood improvements occur after introducing vitamin C supplements or whole food sources.

The researchers aimed to fill that gap with an 8-week dietary intervention of 155 adults with low vitamin C.

Participants took daily either a vitamin C supplement, placebo, or two kiwifruit. They then reported their vitality, mood, flourishing, sleep quality, sleep quantity, and physical activity using smartphone surveys.

The researchers found kiwifruit supplementation improved vitality and mood within four days, peaking

around 14-16 days, and improved flourishing from day 14. Vitamin C, on the other hand, marginally improved mood until day 12.

Lead author Dr Ben Fletcher, who conducted the research as part of his PhD at Otago, says understanding the nuances of when and how these effects occur day-to-day contributes to our knowledge of the potential benefits of vitamin C-rich foods and supplements on mental health.

"This helps us see that what we eat can have a relatively fast impact on how we feel.

"Our participants had relatively good mental health to begin with so had little room for improvement, but still reported the benefits of kiwifruit

or vitamin C interventions," he says.

He adds that, while vitamin C tablets showed some improvements, the study underscores the potential synergistic effects of consuming whole foods like kiwifruit.

"We encourage a holistic approach to nutrition and well-being, incorporating various nutrient-rich foods into your diet."

In addition to the direct implications for individuals seeking to improve their mental well-being, Professor Conner says the study introduces a novel methodology in nutritional research.

"The use of intensive smartphone surveys offers a real-time understanding of the day-to-day changes in mood-related outcomes."

Consumer Commission reprimands washing machine manufacturing company

KAITHAL: The District Consumer Grievance Redressal Commission has directed IFB Industries, a washing machine manufacturer and distributor, to replace the faulty washing machine within 45 days. In this regard, consumer Jaiprakash had filed a complaint in the Commission alleging that he had purchased the washing machine manufactured by the said company for Rs 33,000 in November 2021. This machine was bad from the beginning. He complained about this to the company and the local distributor and sent messages on his mobile. The defendant party said in its reply that there is no defect in the company's machine. Both the parties filed documents and statements to prove their respective cases. The Commission wrote in its decision that at the time of purchase, the company had given a 4-year guarantee to the consumer and 10-year guarantee on spare parts and motor. Keeping all the evidence and documents in mind, Commission Chairperson Neelam Kashyap, members Suman Rana and Sunil Mohan Tripathi, in their decision, directed to return the amount of Rs 33,000 to the consumer within 45 days for replacing the machine and making it new. The consumer will have to return the old machine to the local distributor.

first Test here on Sunday.

India's chase of 231 went horribly south once Hartley (7/62) spun into India's top-order, igniting a rot that saw India getting bowled out for 202 in the final over of the day.

England now lead the five-match series 1-0.

This is India's fourth defeat in home Tests since 2013 and India's approach during chase was in complete contrast to how Pope tackled Ravichandran Ashwin and Ravindra Jadeja with a lot of intent.
