4 dead, 1 injured after car collides with truck in Udhampur

UDHAMPUR : Four members of a family died and one was injured after their car collided with a truck in the Udhampur district, said police on Sunday. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Udhampur, Joginder Singh, confirmed the accident and said that the tragic accident occurred near Tikri along the Jammu-Srinagar national highway while the family was on its way from Jammu to Udhampur. "The car was on its way from Jammu to Udhampur when the tragic accident occurred. The car collided with a truck, resulting in critical injuries to all five occupants," said the SSP. The family members were then rushed to the hospital, where four of them were declared dead .

Use of Technology in Judiciary will bring simplicity to system: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday said that the use of technology in the judicial system will bring simplicity to the whole system. Addressing the Valedictory Ceremony of CLEA-Commonwealth Attorneys and Solicitors General Conference (CAGSC-24) in the national capital on Sunday, the Union Home Minister also exhorted to make the entire justice system on three A's which he explained as-- Accessible, Affordable and Accountable. "In today's time, it is very important to make the entire justice system on three A's i.e. accessible, affordable and accountable and for all these three we should make maximum use of technology. I believe this will bring a lot of simplicity," Shah said.

# MLA poaching claim: Another notice served to Kejriwal

## Police asks him to respond today

Delhi Police Crime Branch on Sunday served a fresh notice on Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal, asking him to respond to his charges of poaching attempts by the BJP with evidence by Monday. The Crime Branch also served a notice on AAP leader and minister Atishi in the poaching claim case, asking her to respond within three days. "An inquiry is being conducted by the Crime Branch of Delhi police, on a complaint received in respect of the allegations made by you that the BJP has offered Rs 25 crore each to the sitting MLAs of AAP for leaving the party and joining the BJP. These allegations were posted by you on X on January 27, 2024," a letter undersigned by Pankaj Arora, ACP of Central Range Crime said. "The Crime Branch has written in the notice that from your tweet it appears that you have evidence and information related to a cog-

nizable crime, please submit the information and answers to the Crime Branch by February 5," it added. Earlier in the day, a Crime Branch team arrived at the door of AAP leader Atishi to serve a notice in connection with her claim that the BJP was trying to prise away the party's MLAs through cash inducements and topple the government as part of 'Operation Lotus 2.0'. Meanwhile, weighing in on the notices to the AAP convenor and Atishi, fellow party leader Jasmine Shah told that they have no mention of the FIR filed by the BJP in connection with the poaching claim but are merely some letters on a piece of white paper. "Yesterday, a team of Delhi Police Crime Branch was at the residence of CM Arvind Kejriwal. They wanted to serve a notice on him. They waited five hours before handing the notice to an official from the CM's office. The notice does not have a word on the FIR and neither is it a summons. It doesn't even say anything about a preliminary inquiry. There is also no

The Delhi Police's Crime Branch has served notice to Mr Kejriwal and Delhi minister Atishi, asking them to give information on the allegations, given that the statements suggested they were "privity to certain information regarding commission of a cognisable offence".

mention of any section of the IPC or CrPC. All it has are words inscribed on a piece of white paper," he said. However, hitting back at the AAP, BJP leader Shehzad Poonawalla said Kejriwal and his 'henchmen' are not just the 'un-crowned kings of corruption' but have also become 'fugitives'. "When allegations are made against them, they are on the run; when they make allegations against others, they hit and run. If your allegations are not baseless and you have proof, provide the evidence to the police, cooperate with the investigation

and tell everyone how and which MLA was being lured. Is this the same kind of allegation that you had levelled against late Arun Jaitley and Nitin Gadkari, only to apologise later? Earlier, they used to say they'd resign if a single finger was raised against them and an investigation was called for. Today, forget resigning, they are not even ready to co-operate with the investigation," he said. BJP MP Pravesh Verma said the AAP is in the habit of making such allegations to divert public attention from allegations or cases against them.

## Crucial Jharkhand floor test today

Some 40 MLAs of the ruling Jharkhand Mukti Morcha (JMM) and its alliance partners are returning to the state today from Hyderabad to attend the floor test tomorrow. The MLAs were kept in a resort near Hyderabad after JMM leader Champai Soren was appointed Chief Minister. His predecessor Hemant Soren, the son of JMM co-founder Shibu Soren, is in jail in an alleged corruption case. The ruling JMM took the 'resort politics' route to prevent its MLAs from being 'approached' by rival parties

for switching sides. The ruling alliance in Jharkhand has five more MLAs from the majority mark of 41 in the 81-member assembly. One of the 81 seats is vacant, hence the majority mark of 41 when counted for 80 seats. The JMM, Congress, Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD), and Communist Party of India (ML) have a total of 46 MLAs. These are JMM (28), Congress (16), RJD (1), and CPI(ML) 1. The BJP and allies have 29 MLAs. Unless something drastic or a

big twist happens, the JMM government will sail through the floor test, political analysts said. This is not the first time the JMM is facing a floor test. In September 2022, Hemant Soren's government won a majority test with 48 votes in its favour. Then too, Hemant Soren faced a threat of disqualification from the assembly over allegations of corruption. The current Chief Minister, Champai Soren, has actively participated in the Jharkhand movement in the late 90s along with Shibu Soren. He was a Transport Minister in the Hemant Soren government.

## Uttarakhand Cabinet approves UCC report, bill likely to be tabled in Assembly on 6th

The Uttarakhand Cabinet on Sunday approved the Uniform Civil Code (UCC) report in a meeting held at the Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami's residence. The bill is likely to be tabled in the Uttarakhand Assembly on February 6. A meeting under the chairmanship of Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami was held at his residence. The UCC drafting committee, led by retired Supreme



Court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai, submitted the draft to Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Friday.

The UCC proposes uniform civil laws for all communities in the state. The draft was handed over to the Chief Minister by the five-member committee headed by retired Justice Ranjana Prakash Desai. Once implemented, Uttarakhand will become the first Indian state after independence to adopt the UCC. At an event organised at the Mukhya Sevak Sadan at the Chief Minister's Camp Office, Dhami on Friday said, "We promised our people to bring the UCC in Uttarakhand

before the Assembly goes into session. The rollout of the UCC will be in line with a resolution adopted by the BJP." Earlier on Friday, CM Dhami said it was an important day for the people of the state as the UCC will help realise the vision of 'Ek Bharat, Shreshtha Bharat'. The UCC drafting panel also comprised retired justice Pramod Kohli, social activist Manu Gaur, former Uttarakhand Chief Secretary Shatrughan Singh and Vice Chancellor of Doon University, Surekha Dangwal. The drafting panel was given a

total of four extensions, the latest being 15 days in January this year. The UCC will provide a legal framework for uniform marriage, divorce, land, property and inheritance laws for all citizens, irrespective of their religion. The passage of the UCC Bill will mark the fulfillment of a major promise made by the BJP to the people of the state in the run-up to the 2022 Assembly polls. Earlier, Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami informed that the draft report consists of 740 pages and has four volumes.

## Indian embassy employee, posted in Moscow, arrested for spying for Pak

The Uttar Pradesh Anti-Terrorism Squad (ATS) has arrested an employee of the Indian Embassy in Moscow, Russia, on charges of spying for Pakistan's intelligence agency, ISI. The arrested individual, identified as Satendra Siwal, was working as a Multi

Tasking Staff (MTS) in the Ministry of External Affairs. The operation unfolded as ATS received intelligence from confidential sources suggesting that ISI handlers were enticing Indian Ministry of External Affairs employees, offering financial incentives in exchange for sensitive information related to the Indian Army. The infor-

mation being obtained posed a grave threat to India's internal and external security. Satendra Siwal, a resident of Shahmahiuddinpur village in Hapur, was identified as a key player in this espionage network. He was allegedly extracting confidential documents by exploiting his position within the Indian Embassy in Moscow.

## Thousands line streets as PM Modi holds roadshow in Guwahati

Prime Minister Narendra Modi held a roadshow here on Sunday, waving and smiling from an open-topped vehicle as locals, lining both sides of the streets in their thousands, chanted his name and raised loud cheers. People flocked to the streets through which the convoy passed and were heard chanting 'Modi, Modi'. Prime Minister Modi waved back at them, acknowledging their rousing reception. He arrived in the North-east state earlier to inaugurate and lay the foundation stone of projects worth Rs 11,000 crore. He will address a mega public rally at Veterinary College Field, Khanapara, on Sunday. Among the key projects for which foundation stone will be laid by the Prime Minister shortly includes Maa Kamakhya Divya Pariyojana (Maa Kamakhya Access Corridor), which has been sanctioned un-



der the Prime Minister's Development Initiative for North Eastern Region (PM-DevINE) scheme. It will provide world class amenities to pilgrims visiting the Kamakhya temple. "Prime Minister will lay the foundation stone of multiple road upgradation projects worth over Rs. 3400 crore, under which 43 roads including 38 bridges will be upgraded as part of the South Asia Subregional Economic Cooperation (SA-SEC) Corridor Connectivity. Prime Minister will inaugurate two 4-laning projects, namely Dolabari to Jamuguri and Biswanath Chariali to Gohpur. These projects will help improve the connectivity to Itanagar and boost the overall economic development of the region," read an official release by the Assam government earlier.

Compensation to be given to farmers for damage caused by hail : Dushyant

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Deputy Chief Minister, Sh. Dushyant Chautala, stated that the general girdawari of crops has commenced from February 1 and will continue across the state until March 1, 2024. During this period, district administrations have been directed to report the damage caused by the hail-storm. Farmers can also upload reports of losses on the Revenue Department's e-kshatipurti portal. The Deputy CM addressed a press conference today at the Chandigarh Press Club, where he revealed that the state government has been providing assistance to affected farmers whenever natural disasters have struck their crops. From 2019 to 2024, approximately Rs. 16,000 crores have been disbursed directly into the bank accounts of farmers as compensation for crop losses. Over the past year, compensation has been provided to farmers through direct bank transfers (DBT).

## Amid snow, all flights cancelled at Srinagar airport

Kashmir valley, including Srinagar, received the biggest snowfall of the season, resulting in the cancellation of all flights at Srinagar Airport on Sunday, officials said. All the flights to and fro at the Srinagar International Airport have been cancelled due to bad weather, officials said. It was still snowing in Srinagar and other parts of the valley. A railway official said the railway operation in Kashmir

was also hit as trains were running late due to the snowfall. The traffic on the Srinagar Jammu Highway was plying despite the bad weather. "People are advised to follow lane discipline and drive cautiously, as part of the road between Nashri and NAVYUG Tunnel is single-lane with slippery conditions at several places," traffic police posted on X. The Srinagar-Sonamarg-Gumri-Sonamarg-Gumrig Ladakh was also closed due to the snowfall on the road. Srinagar and its adjoining



areas were decked with a thick layer of snow, the major one this season. Authorities in Srinagar have pressed into service men and machines to clear the snow from the roads to make them traffic-worthy. Meteorological Centre Srinagar said that the plains of the

Kashmir valley received 3-6 inches of snowfall, while the middle and higher reaches experienced 8-12 inches during the past 24 hours. Jammu Division also experienced light to moderate rain with thunder over plains and light to moderate snow over the middle and higher during the period. The weather will generally remain cloudy in a few places, with light to moderate snow likely to continue over many places till today afternoon or late afternoon and gradual improvement after that, the MeT office

said. On February 5, the weather will remain partly to generally cloudy with the possibility of light snow over isolated higher reaches, while the weather will remain dry from February 6-13, it said. The MeT office said that Srinagar received 5.3mm of snowfall and 6.3mm of rainfall, Qazigund 10.0cm of snowfall and 13.0mm of rainfall, Pahalgam 12.0cm of snowfall and 14.2mm of rainfall, Kupwara 21.0cm of snowfall and 10.9mm of rainfall, Kokernag 11.0cm of snowfall and 12.2mm of rainfall.

## Vij hands over investigation of teacher's death to State Crime Bureau

Haryana Home and Health Minister, Sh. Anil Vij has directed the State Crime Bureau to investigate the case of the burning of a primary school teacher in a Creta car in the village Durjanpur of Bhiwani. These instructions were given to the DGP of Haryana.

On Sunday, Sh. Vij was redressing to the grievances to people of the state at his residence in Ambala Cantonment today.

In the case of no action being taken in the case of the burning of the Creta car in Bhiwani and the death of the primary school teacher in it, the wife of the teacher appealed to Home Minister Anil Vij for justice. Family members said they felt a conspiracy in this incident, and the



police have not taken concrete action in the case so far. They alleged that her husband could be trapped in the car and accused a deep conspiracy in the incident. The family did not trust the previous police investigation, on which Minister Anil Vij directed the State Crime Bureau to investigate the case.

Similarly, a woman from Karnal complained to the Home Minister Anil Vij about the non-arrest of the culprits in the case of her husband's

murder. The woman alleged that her husband was murdered a few months ago. In the case, the police registered a case, but so far, none of the accused has been arrested. Only one accused has been caught by the police so far, while the rest are still at large. The Home Minister directed the SP of Karnal to take action in the case.

Home Minister Anil Vij also gave instructions to the concerned officials to take action in other cases. An elderly woman from Safidon complained to Home Minister Anil Vij that her daughter-in-law has been harassing her since the death of her son. The daughter-in-law physically abuses her and threatens her. Even family members trouble her. Home Minister Anil Vij directed the concerned SP for action in the case. A woman from Karnal complained about

# Snow, wet weather increase cold wave in the State

**SHIMLA, FEB 4 (UNI)** The continue snowfall on the high reaches and insistent rainfall in the state intensified the cold wave condition in the state.

The Met office recorded 5.6, cm snowfall at Kalpa in Kinnaur, Bharmaur 5 cm, Gondla 4.2 cm, Keylong three cm, Khadralla, Kufri (Shimla), Khadralla and Shilaroo, Kufri in Shimla, Kukumseri 1.6 mm and Sangla and Pooh one cm each.

Tourists Resort Shimla and its nearby areas were are mainly overcast since early morning and intermittent rain and snowfall are receiving. Snowfall are thawing due to frequent spell of rain along with snow. According to Met Office Jogindernagar in Mandi had 13 mm rain, Slapper 12.5 mm, Rohru in Shimla 10 mm, Gohar in Mandi nine mm, Jubberhati 8.4 mm, Sarahan in Shimla



6.6 mm Sujanpur Tira in Hamirpur 6.5 mm Berthin & Naina Devi (Bilaspur) Palampur (Kangra) and Seobagh in Kullu 6.2 mm and Shimla five.

According to Lahaul Spiti administration, in view the road and weather conditions in the district,

and the Black Ice Phenomenon and slippery road conditions on NH -3 advisory was issued for the commuters.

According to spokesperson four by four wheel driving vehicles with chain (Sumo and Bolero) could allowed to enter the

district via ATR from 10:00 AM to 03:00 PM till further orders.

This Dance Competition will be conducted by A K Entertainment and Him Kala and Sanskriti Utthan Samiti NGO jointly. And the children of other schools of

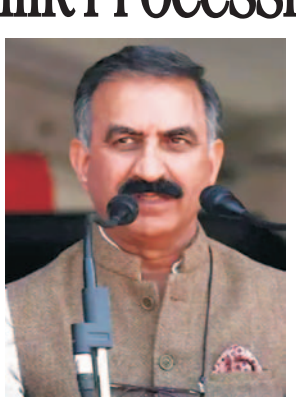

## NDDB to provide consultancy services to set up 25 crore Milk Processing Plant Dhagwar: CM

**SHIMLA:** Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said here today that the State Government has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) to provide consultancy services for the establishment of a state-of-the-art automated milk processing plant in Dhagwar, Kangra.

He said that the Dhagwar plant, with an initial capacity of 1.50 Lakh Litres Per Day (LLPD), would be a fully automatic facility. This ambitious project, set to be constructed with an investment of Rs. 225



crore in the first phase, aims to produce a diverse range of dairy products, including curd, lassi, butter, ghee, paneer, flavoured milk, khoya and mozzarella cheese. Sh.

Sukhu stated that as the project unfolds, it would bring prosperity to the dairy farming communities and contribute significantly to the overall growth of the State. The plant would play a crucial role in bolstering the rural economy by directly purchasing milk from the farmers in Chamba, Hamirpur, Kangra and Una districts, remarked the Chief Minister. He further emphasized the importance of transparency in milk procurement to ensure that the farmers get good value for their hard work.

He added that an additional investment of Rs. 43 crore was earmarked for

strengthening the milk procurement network with a target to purchase 2.74 LLPD for sustaining the plant's operations.

The initiative, aligned with the government's commitment to farmer welfare, also includes plans for the second phase, which would see the production of milk powder, ice cream and various types of cheese at the Dhagwar Plant. Sukhu said that the government was committed to the welfare of the dairy farming community of the state and has recently announced an increase of Rs. 6 per litre in milk procurement rate.

Kataria further said that on one hand, new BBA BCA college would pay Rs 20,000/- approval/ affiliation fee for each course on other hand, existing AICTE approved Institutions would pay Rs 3.5 Lacs each for additional course resulting into increase in financial burden on students.

### Sex racket of foreign girls busted in Kapurthala

Kapurthala police have busted a sex racket of foreign girls in Phagwara and arrested 26 accused including 9 foreign and 4 Indian girls. At the same time, 2 separate FIRs have been registered against everyone in Satnampura police station.

In both the FIRs, persons resident in Jalandhar and Amritsar have been described as kingpins. Police have also recovered 9 foreign passports, 29 mobile phones and cash worth about Rs 45 thousand from the possession of the accused.

According to SSP Kapurthala Vatsala Gupta, SP Phagwara Rupinder Kaur Bhatti had received secret information that a large-scale sex racket was going on near the Law Gate near LPU University on Jalandhar-Phagwara Highway. Immediately



after the information, various teams of Phagwara Police reached the said area and when the information was confirmed to be correct, the police teams conducted a raid. More than 30 police personnel arrived together in the raid team. Preliminary investigation revealed that the number of people running the sex racket was more than 20. All accused bought to satnampura police station and two separate FIRs were registered. According to the SSP, a sex racket was being run

under the guise of PG, in which foreign girls played an important role. PGs were easily available to foreign nationals as they paid good money. Some have come to India only as students.

During interrogation of most of the people, it has come to light that everyone was doing this work just to earn more money. Apart from this, section 14 of Foreigners Act has also been added against those foreign citizens. Who were violating their visa norms.

Editorial

Party with difference

What is the difference between the Bharatiya Janata Party and other Indian ruling parties, past and present? Nearly every political sin that the party's critics accuse it of has been routinely committed by other governing parties, past and present.

Suppressing free speech, limiting the right to assembly, passing preventive detention laws that allow the State to void a citizen's rights, using tax authorities like the Enforcement Directorate to target Opposition leaders, buying legislators to form governments, deregulating protected lands to oblige friendly, extractive tycoons, working the levers of office to squeeze money out of the business community, ordering murderous paramilitary violence in border states, deploying the police to enable pogroms, pandering to majoritarian sentiment to curb a religious minority's freedom to worship or profess its faith — this menu of political wickedness isn't new: it has been served up by the Congress and others during their terms in office. So what, if anything, makes the BJP different or more dangerous?

The first reason is simple. The BJP does all this more systematically than the others. This is important. The BJP uses the sinews of the State not just more effectively than, say, the Congress; it uses them more systematically. For instance, unlike other political parties that milked donors for unaccounted money for politicking, the BJP created a system of electoral bonds that made collecting these monies both legitimate and anonymous. Similarly, the BJP doesn't merely harass and intimidate minorities by attacking minority livelihoods in the meat trade, or demolishing mosques, or making examples out of hijab-wearing girls; it designs a citizenship law that stealthily introduces a religious qualification for citizenship and twins it with a form of inquisitorial documentation, the National Register of Citizens, that places the burden of proving their citizenship on Indian Muslims.

The reason the BJP uses its policy imagination to design frameworks that will, so to speak, automate its agenda is because its agenda is transformational, not incremental. The BJP wants to re-establish the republic, to create, in effect, a second republic, while working within the institutional constraints of the first. Unlike other parties that tinker with institutional restraints to achieve room for political manoeuvre, the BJP has more ambitious plans to redesign the house that the Constituent Assembly built and, therefore, thinks like an architect, not a mason.

IMF predicts China to witness economic decline over next four years

The International Monetary Fund predicted China's economic decline to continue over the next four years as Beijing continues to tackle a range of challenges, including a rapidly aging population, higher unemployment and a property crisis, VOA News reported.

In a report released on Friday, the IMF projected that China's economic growth will reduce to 4.6 per cent this year, down from its 5.2 per cent growth in 2023, and drop further to 3.4 per cent by 2028.

The property market has been a particular area of trouble for the Chinese economy lately, with a Hong Kong court on Monday directing Chinese property giant Evergrande to liquidate.

According to IMF analysis released on Friday, the real estate investment is likely to see a drop from 30 per cent to 60 per cent in the next 10 years relative to 2022 levels, VOA News reported.

The IMF report reads, "Absent a comprehensive restructuring policy package for the troubled property sector, real estate investment could drop more than expected, and for longer, with negative implications for domestic growth and trading partners."

Christopher Tang, Senior Associate Dean of Global Initiatives at the University of California Los Angeles Anderson School and Faculty Director of the UCLA Center for Global Management, stressed that the real estate crisis is closely related to Chinese consumers' spending habits.

In an email statement to VOA, Christopher Tang stated, "As they see their equity in their home investment declining, they spend less on everything - lower consumer spending, the demand falls which reduces production and hence slower economic growth."

Tang added, "There is a domino effect when the real estate market is so huge and intertwined with decades of aggressive



housing development and easy lending from banks." Tang stressed that China needs to promote new demand-side economic policies and ease market regulations.

The IMF suggested the Chinese government to encourage its citizens to find new means of investment and make market-oriented reforms to boost the economy of China, VOA News reported citing the report.

Ali Wyne, the senior research and advocacy adviser for US-China at the think tank International Crisis Group, suggested that local government debt and tensions between China and Western nations are also reasons behind the predictions of the Chinese economic downturn, according to VOA News

report. In an email statement to VOA, Wyne stated, "The evidence thus far does not suggest that a hard landing is in the offing, but it does suggest that China's growth headwinds are more intractable than they were a decade ago or even at the outset of the 2020s."

Meanwhile, Chinese stocks experienced a tumultuous week, marking their worst performance in years despite efforts by Beijing to restore confidence in the economy and address the prolonged stock market decline that has seen a staggering USD 6 trillion in value disappear over three years, CNN reported.

The Shanghai Composite Index witnessed a significant 6.2 per cent drop, the most substantial weekly loss since October 2018, while the Shenzhen Component Index recorded an 8.1 per cent decline, marking its largest drop in three years.

Year-to-date, both indexes have lost more than 8 per cent and 15 per cent, respectively.

The CSI 300 index, composed of 300 major stocks listed in Shanghai and Shenzhen, also suffered a 4.6 per cent decline, marking its worst week since October 2022, according to CNN report. The index is down 7 per cent since the beginning of the year.

Research suggests up to three meals of kimchi per day may lower men's obesity risk

According to research published in the open access journal BMJ Open, eating up to three servings of traditional Korean kimchi per day may lower men's overall risk of obesity, while radish kimchi is related with a lower incidence of belly bulge in both sexes.

Kimchi is made by salting and fermenting vegetables with various flavourings and seasonings, such as onion, garlic, and fish sauce.

Cabbage and radish are usually the main vegetables used in kimchi, which contains few calories and is rich in dietary fibre, microbiome-enhancing lactic acid bacteria, vitamins, and polyphenols.

Previously published experimental studies have shown that *Lactobacillus brevis* and *L. plantarum* isolated from kimchi had an anti-obesity effect. And the researchers wanted to know if regular consumption might be associated with a reduction in the risk of overall and/or abdominal obesity, which is considered to be particularly harmful to health.

They drew on data from 115,726 participants (36,756 men; 78,970 women; average age 51) taking part in the Health Examinees (HEXA) study.

HEXA is a large, community-based long term study of the larger Korean Genome and Epidemiology Study, designed to examine environmental and genetic risk factors for common long term conditions among Korean adults



over the age of 40.

Dietary intake for the previous year was assessed using a validated 106-item food frequency questionnaire for which participants were asked to state how often they ate a serving of each foodstuff, from never or seldom, up to 3 times a day.

Total kimchi included baechu (cabbage kimchi); kkakdugi (radish kimchi); nabak and dongchimi (watery kimchi); and others, such as mustard greens kimchi. A portion of baechu or kkahdugi kimchi is 50 g, while a portion of nabak or dongchimi kimchi is 95 g.

Height and weight, for BMI, and waist circumference were measured for each participant.

A BMI of 18.5 was defined as underweight; normal weight 18.5 to 25; and obesity as above 25.

The organisation was established 48 years ago and the 2023 results represent a record in new commitments.

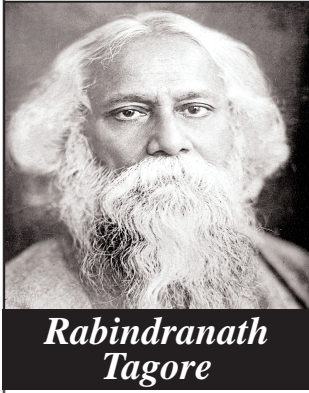

This oil can be natural treatment for dry eye conditions

Following a successful pilot study, researchers at the University of Auckland are conducting a clinical trial of castor oil as a potentially safe and natural treatment for dry eye conditions.

It is estimated that dry-eye illness affects approximately 58 per cent of the population aged 50 and up in Australia. Some risk factors for developing dry eye disease include advanced age, menopause, increased screen time, and contact lens wear.

Blepharitis is the leading cause of dry eye illness, accounting for more than 80 per cent of cases. It is a chronic disease with no known cure.



"Currently, patients are left grappling with symptoms of dryness, grittiness and, in some cases, watery eyes that feel uncomfortable impacting on their quality of life and work productivity," says doctoral candidate and lead clinical investigator Catherine Jennings. Current treatments, such as antibacterials and anti-inflammatories, are generally unsuitable for long-term use, due to significant side effects and the potential for antimicrobial resistance. "Often patients are left feeling helpless when attempting to manage a chronic condition," Jennings said.

The current trial is of a product containing cold-pressed castor oil en-

hanced with manuka and kanuka oils applied using a rollerball attached to a small glass bottle.

"The previous pilot study, conducted by our research team, was unique in its use of castor oil in such an application on the eyelids, with the product not known to be used anywhere else in the world for treating blepharitis," said Jennings.

Castor oil comes from a flowering tropical or subtropical shrub from the species *Ricinus communis*. It has been used therapeutically for millennia, including more recently in eye cosmetics and eye makeup removers. In the pilot study, 26 patients with ble-

pharitis were treated with cold-pressed castor oil over four weeks. They had measurable improvements in symptoms, such as reduced redness of the lid margin, decreased thickening of the eyelid, and a decline in bacterial profusion, as well as reduced eyelash crusting.

Building on the success of the pilot study, the research team is now engaged in a more extensive double-blinded, randomised and placebo-controlled study. They are aiming to recruit 92 participants and generate robust scientific evidence for clinicians.

The ultimate goal is to sustainably improve the quality of life for this

large group of patients using a natural, safe and effective product, principal investigator Professor Jennifer Craig said.

"Castor oil has been proposed as a natural product that could offer a safe, effective and easy-to-use alternative to existing therapies," Craig said.

"My hope is this study will produce evidence-based guidance for clinicians about offering castor oil as a possible management option for patients suffering from blepharitis, so they continue to enjoy a great quality of life, read the books they love, be productive in their work environment and enjoy other visual hobbies."

- Slice an aloe vera leaf into half and extract the pulp.
- Apply the gel on your face and leave it for an hour. Wash your face with cold water and repeat twice a day.
- You can also add the gel to a cup of boiling water and consume the mix on a regular basis to help cleanse your body from inside.

**Fuller's earth :** Fuller's earth, commonly known as multani mitti, helps cure cystic acne due to its absorbent, exfoliating as well

as and astringent properties. Besides, it helps clean the pores, drawing out toxins and impurities. 

- Mix 2 tablespoons of multani mitti with one tablespoon each of milk and honey.
- Apply this paste on your face and after the mask has dried, wash with cold water.
- Do this once a week.

 Steaming helps open your pores and eliminates all the dirt, grime and oil under the skin's surface. However, it's important to cleanse your face so as to remove any makeup or dirt before you start. 

- Boil a cup of water, add three drops of tea tree oil to it, and transfer the water into a bowl.
- Carefully place the bowl on a flat surface and lean towards the bowl. Use a towel to create a tent over your face to prevent the steam from escaping. After 10 minutes, wipe your face with a clean cloth. Repeat this once every week.

The focus should remain on supporting the Indian cricket team as they embark on the upcoming challenges in the Test series," the statement concluded. Right-handed batter Rajat Patidar was called up to replace Virat Kohli in India's first two Test matches against England. Patidar made his international debut on December 21 last year against South Africa in the 3rd ODI match, where he opened for the 'Men in Blue' and scored 22 runs from 16 balls with a strike rate of 137.50. Without Kohli, India conceded a 28-run loss against England in the first Test match in Hyderabad. Virat was last in action during the T20I series against Afghanistan last month.

Gill took the onus of scoring the majority of the runs while Patel played the anchor role, steering the flow of the game and rotating strike on every available

opportunity. The 24-year-old made Rehan Ahmed his target, scoring runs from time to time. Shubman with simplicity in his approach used his feet and raised his bat for his third Test ton.

Both batters managed to avoid traps laid by England Test skipper Ben Stokes with constant tinkering in the field.

Gill tried to pull off a reverse sweep but gloved it straight to Ben Foakes in Shoaib Bashir's over. Initially, the on-field umpire deemed Gill not out, pushing Stokes to go for the DRS. The replay showed the ball glancing off Gill's gloves and handed England their first successful review in the series.

Laced with 11 bound-

aries and two maximums Gill's time at the crease came to an end with a score of 104.

Axar got trapped in front of the stumps by Tom Hartley which led to the arrival of Ravichandran Ashwin.

KS Bharat and Ashwin slowed down the flow of runs with England bowling five maiden overs. The two runs that were scored during those five overs came from legbies.

Earlier in the day, India started the session at 28/0, with skipper Rohit Sharma (13\*) and Yashasvi Jaiswal (15\*) unbeaten.

James Anderson struck early for England in the session, cleaning up Rohit's stumps for 13, continuing the Indian veteran's long-format struggles. India was

29/1. Jaiswal, the double centurion in the first innings, was also caught by Joe Root at slips for just 17, giving Anderson his second wicket. India was 30/2.

Shreyas Iyer and Shubman Gill, two batters struggling for runs and form, were the fresh pair at the crease and had the responsibility to build a partnership.

Gill dispatched Shoaib Bashir for a six at the end of the 17th over to bring India's lead to 200 runs.

vation on a full-length delivery and skipper Ben Stokes came running from mid-off to take a diving catch. Iyer was out for 29 in 52 balls, with two fours.
