Bhagwant Mann to meet Kejriwal in Tihar on April 15

NEW DELHI: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann will meet the AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal in Tihar Jail on April 15, officials said on Friday.

The meeting will be held in the afternoon inside the 'Mulakat Jangla' under tight security, as Mann is provided with Z+ security cover, the jail officials said. The 'mulakat jangla' is an iron mesh which separates the inmate from the visitor in a room inside the jail. A visitor and an inmate can talk to each other by sitting on different sides of the mesh.

Delhi Court sends K Kavitha to 3-day CBI custody

NEW DELHI: Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) Leader and MLC K Kavitha has been sent to three-day CBI custody by a Delhi Court in the Excise Policy case on Friday. Special Judge Kaweri Baweja after hearing arguments on behalf of CBI and Defence Counsel passed the order remanding Kavitha to CBI custody till April 15. K Kavitha, an MLC in Telangana and daughter of former Chief Minister K Chandrasekhar Rao, had been arrested by ED in a money laundering case linked to the alleged Delhi excise policy scam on March 15. Kavitha is in the judicial custody at Tihar jail after her arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED).

NC announces Omar Abdullah as party candidate from Baramulla seat

SRINAGAR: National Conference (NC) on Friday announced candidates from two constituencies from Kashmir, with party vice president Omar Abdullah contesting from Baramulla Lok Sabha seat. The party also announced influential Shia leader Aga Ruhullah as the party candidate from Srinagar. The announcement of candidates was made by party president Farooq Abdullah in Srinagar. Congress and NC announced their alliance for the Lok Sabha polls in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh, with each candidate fielding three seats. As per the seat sharing arrangement, the Congress would contest in Udhampur, Jammu, and Ladakh Lok Sabha seats, and the National Conference would field candidates in Anantnag, Srinagar, and Baramulla. The NC has already announced popular Gujar leader Mian Altaf as the party candidate for the Anantnag-Rajouri parliamentary seat.

J&K will get assembly polls, statehood soon: PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday assured that the Centre is committed to restoring statehood to Jammu and Kashmir adding that assembly elections will also be held soon.

"The time is not far when assembly elections will be held in Jammu and Kashmir also. Jammu and Kashmir will get back its state status. You will be able to share your dreams with your MLAs, and your ministers," PM Modi said while addressing a public rally in Udhampur.

The Prime Minister said that whatever he has done so far is only serves as a trailer of the work that he is yet to do in the region.

He pointed out that now after decades, elections were taking place in Jammu and Kashmir without fear of terrorism and cross border firing.

"Vikas bhi ho raha hai, vishvaas bhi badh raha hai" (there is progress and confidence), the Prime Minister said.

The state of Jammu and Kashmir was

reorganized into a union territory in October 2019. The Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act 2019 was passed in 2019, and Article 370 of the Constitution of India, which gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, was abrogated.



The central government had in August 2019 abrogated Article 370 in Jammu and Kashmir and bifurcated it into two Union Territories (UTs), Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh.

The upcoming general election, said the Prime Minister is "not just to elect a

member of Parliament but to form a strong government in the country. When the government is strong, it completes by challenging the challenges..."

Underscoring the latest development witness in Jammu and Kashmir, PM Modi said, "Now schools are not burnt here, but schools are decorated. Now AIIMS, IITs and IIMs are being built here. Now modern tunnels, modern wide roads, and wonderful rail journeys are becoming the destiny of Jammu and Kashmir."

"Be it Jammu or Kashmir, now tourists and devotees have started coming here in record numbers," PM Modi said. The Prime Minister said that in the last decade, Jammu and Kashmir have completely changed as roads, electricity, water, travel, and migration, all are available.

"In the 10 years, we have tightened the noose around terrorists and corrupt people. Now in the coming five years, this area has to be taken to new heights of development. Within 10 years, Jammu and Kashmir has completely changed. Roads, electricity, water, travel, migration, all these are there.

Committee set up to probe Mahendragarh school bus accident

CHANDIGARH: A committee has been set up to probe the factors leading to Thursday's accident involving a school bus in which six children were killed and around 20 injured in Haryana's Mahendragarh, officials said. Police arrested three people, including the principal of the private school as well as the driver of the bus who was allegedly drunk and driving rashly. According to an official statement, the committee has been set up by Mahendragarh deputy commissioner Monika Gupta for a thorough investigation to ascertain the causes and circumstances leading to the accident. "In the light of the tragic incident where a school bus of G L Public School, Kanina carrying students met with an accident near Unhani resulting in the loss of lives of six students and injuries to several students, it is imperative that a thorough investigation be conducted to ascertain the causes and circumstances leading to this unfortunate event," according to an order issued by Gupta on Thursday.

Rameshwaram cafe blast: NIA arrests mastermind, bomber from Kolkata

NEW DELHI: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Friday said that it has arrested the perpetrator and the architect behind the explosion at Rameshwaram cafe in Bengaluru.

The two key absconders in the Rameshwaram Cafe blast case, identified as Abdul Matheen Taha and Mussavir Hussain Shazeb, were traced out to their hide out near Kolkata and were apprehended by the NIA team, officials said.

Mussavir Hussain Shazib is the accused who placed the Improvised Explosive Device (IED) at the cafe and Abdul Matheen Taha is the mastermind behind the planning, execution of blast and subsequent evasion from the clutches of law.

On early morning hours on Friday, NIA said, its teams were successful in tracing the absconding accused near Kolkata, where they were hiding under false identities.

"This pursuit, successfully accomplished by NIA was ably supported by energetic coordinated action and co-operation between NIA, Central Intelligence agencies and State Police agencies of West Bengal, Telangana, Karnataka, and Kerala police," the NIA said in a statement.



India among 12 nations responsible for 60 pc of world's mismanaged plastic waste

India is among the twelve countries responsible for 60 percent of the planet's mismanaged plastic waste though the fast-developing South Asian nation's per capita plastic waste production is among the lowest in the world, according to a new report. The Plastic Overshoot Day report by Swiss non-profit EA Earth Action also said global plastic waste generation has risen by 7.11 per cent since 2021. The world is estimated to have generated 220 million tons of plastic waste this year, 70 million tons of which will end up polluting the environment. The report comes ahead of the fourth meeting of the United Nations' Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee (INC) in Ottawa, Canada, as the world leaders attempt to develop a legally binding instrument to end plastic pollution.

17044 metric tons of wheat arrived in mandis: DC

PARI BAJAJ KARNAL: Deputy Commissioner Uttam Singh said that the arrival of wheat has started in the mandis of the district. Till last day, about 17 thousand 44 metric tons of wheat arrived in various purchase centers and markets in the district, which was purchased by government procurement agencies. He said that till last day, about 17 thousand 44 metric tons of wheat had arrived in various mandis of the district, out of which 7086 metric tons of wheat was purchased by the Food Supply Department, 8495 metric tons by HAFED and 1463 metric tons of wheat was purchased by Haryana VVarehousing Corporation. Appealing to the farmers, he said that whoever comes to the market, should come as per their order so that their crops can be purchased on time.

Only voters registered in electoral roll can exercise right to vote

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, APRIL 12

Rewari Deputy Commissioner and District Election Officer Sh. Rahul Hooda stated that voters have an essential role in upholding democracy. He urged citizens to make their voter IDs at the earliest, so everyone can participate in the upcoming elections. The deadline for voter registration is April 26, 2024.

The District Election Officer said that eligible individuals can register their vote by filling out Form-6 with the concerned BLO, Election Registration Officer, and Assistant Election Registration Officer. This form is also available on the website of the Chief Electoral Officer's office, <https://www.ceoharyana.gov.in>, and can be downloaded. To

register a vote, individuals can apply offline or online with two passport-size coloured photographs, along with proof of residence and age certificate. For information related to voter registration, citizens can contact the toll-free number -1950.

He said that in the festival of democracy, every voter must exercise their voting rights and contribute their share. For this, every voter should ensure that their name is listed in the voter list. Only the voter whose name is on the voter list can exercise their voting rights. If a voter's name is on the voter list but they do not have an EPIC, they can still cast their vote by showing one of the 11 alternative documents specified by the Election Commission.

District Election Officer informed that even if a voter

has an old EPIC card, they can still vote, provided their name is listed in that area's voter list. If a voter's name is not on the voter list and they show their Aadhar card, Voter ID card, or any other identity document at the polling center to vote, they will not be allowed to vote. Any voter can only vote when their name is registered in the voter list.

The District Election Officer informed that besides EPIC, voters can also cast their votes using alternative photo identity documents specified by the Election Commission. These documents include passport, driving license, Service identity card issued to employees by Central, State governments, Public Sector Undertakings or Public Limited Companies, Passbook issued by bank or post office with photo, PAN card, Smart Card issued under

the scheme of Ministry of Labour, MNREGA Job card, Health Insurance Smart Card issued under the scheme of Ministry of Labour, Pension document with photo, Official Identity Card issued to MPs, MLAs, MLAs and Aadhar card.

He said that voters in Haryana can quickly and easily obtain information about their vote on the website of the Chief Electoral Officer of Haryana <https://ceoharyana.gov.in/>. With the help of this, voters can easily check their vote by entering their EPIC number. If someone has forgotten their EPIC number, they can still check their vote by filling in their name and father/husband's name, etc, he said. In addition, voters can check their vote by calling the Voter Helpline number - 1950.

Three arrested including two women in theft case

cash. Apart from cash, they stole Rs 6 lakh along with other important documents like check book, pass book, savings A/C, books, lehenga

dupattas and refundable cash securities of other customers etc. and fled from the spot. He told that the said incident has been captured in the CCTV camera installed in his shop.

Keeping in mind the sensitivity of the matter, a special team was formed under the supervision of SSP Kanwardeep Kaur, Mrirdul SP City, Abhinandan P.SDPO/North East and under the leadership of Inspector Police Station Manimajra. On the basis of CCTV footage, photographs of the thieves were sent to the informers and on the basis of secret information, the three accused were arrested. Rs 15,000 in cash, a passbook of PNB Bank in the name of Puneet Kumar and Rs 21,000 and Rs 27,500 from Krishna were recovered from the possession of accused Akash.

Police arrest terror operative Prabhpreet Singh from Delhi airport

Amidst the ongoing drive against terrorism, State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) Amritsar has busted a terrorist recruitment, funding and aiding module with the arrest of Germany-based operative Prabhpreet Singh Sidhu from IGI Airport in Delhi, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Friday.

In 2020, a secret information was received at SSOC Amritsar that KZF terrorist Jagdish Singh Bhura is planning to hit some high-profile targets in Punjab and to accomplish this task, he has provided weapons and financial support to his India based associates. Punjab Police took swift action and busted the module by arresting four operatives of this organization and recovered arms and ammunition from their possession. In this regard, a case FIR No. 18, dated 19.12.2020 was registered under sections 13, 17, 18-B and 20 of the Un-



lawful Activities (Prevention) Act (UAPA) and section 25 of the Arms Act at Police Station State Special Operation Cell, Amritsar.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that during investigations, the arrested accused persons had disclosed that they were working on the directions of wanted terrorist Jagdish Singh Bhura and his close-aside Prabhpreet Singh. The arrested persons had also revealed that they were plan-

ning to hit high profile targets, he added.

He said that since Prabhpreet was living in Germany, Punjab Police after nominating him in this case, got issued Look Out Circular (LOC) against him through the Bureau of Immigration, New Delhi to ensure his arrest.

"On Wednesday, immigration authorities at IGI Airport Delhi informed us about the detention of Prabhpreet Singh. Subsequently, a team of SSOC Amritsar rushed to

Delhi and arrested the accused," said the DGP. Sharing more details, AIG SSOC Amritsar Sukhminder Singh Mann said that preliminary investigations have revealed that accused Prabhpreet went to Poland on a valid visa in 2017, and crossed to Germany by road in 2020. To attain permanent residence in Germany, he applied for political asylum, he added.

While living in Germany, the accused came in touch with Belgium-based KZF terrorist Jagdish Singh Bhura and got involved in anti-national activities, said the AIG, while adding that the accused arranged funding and weapons to his Indian associate to carry out targeted killings and other disruptive activities. He said that further investigations are being conducted to unearth the whole network of Prabhpreet and the module he is working for.

Meanwhile, Police teams have procured remand of accused Prabhpreet till April 15, 2024 after producing him in the court.

Wheat crop damaged in 5000 hectares of land in Una dist, farmers upset

Farmers in Una district are upset about the damage to their Rabi crops, particularly wheat, which was sown over 35,000 hectares of land, according to Kulbhushan Dhimann, Deputy Director of the District Agriculture Department. The wheat crop has been severely damaged in various districts due to strong winds and heavy rain. The Agriculture Department's survey revealed that strong winds have caused wheat crop damage on 5000 hectares of land in the district, with most crops recovering better due to sunshine after rain. The wheat crop, grown on 35000 hectares in the district, showed impres-



sive growth this year, ready in six months. Even in non-irrigated areas, the wheat crop was prepared as expected after periodic rains, but due to sudden bad weather in the last days of March, the wheat crop was damaged. At present, the wheat crop has been grained, due to which the upper part of the plant has more weight. In such a situation, the crop falls due to strong winds along with rain.

According to agricultural experts, due to the bad weather crops have been affected in other areas of the district, including Haroli, Bangana, Chintpurni, and Gagret, due to which the yield may be affected. Currently, amidst the scorching sunshine, the color of the wheat crop has started turning golden. Among the farmers, Vinod Kumar, Amit Saini, Gurbaj Singh, Ravindra Kumar, and Lakhanpal say that wheat harvesting will start in the coming week. Normally, the harvesting of wheat crops starts around Baisakhi, which falls on April 14. The wheat crop has been damaged in some areas.

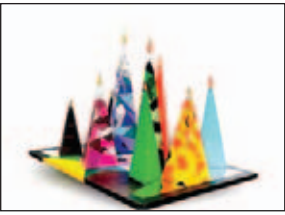

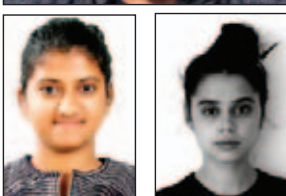


Time 11 am to 7 pm.

DR ASHOK KUMAR KARNAL : Deputy Commissioner and District Election Officer Uttam Singh said that for publishing campaign material during the Lok Sabha General Election-2024 and Karnal Assembly by-election, the name of the publisher, the person publishing it and the number of copies should be printed on the poster or pamphlet.He said that the details of election expenditure will be fully monitored by the Election Department of India, Haryana Election Commission and the district administration.



Therefore, by filing Annexure Form 1 and B, the printing press operators will clarify from which press the promotional material was printed and who is the one who got this material printed. The press operators will also have to give details of how many copies have been printed. DEO said that before publishing the election campaign material, press operators should check whether there are any objectionable words in the language and content of the campaign material. The language of publicity material should not be derogatory towards any person or party. If any complaint is found in this regard, action can be taken against both the publisher and the publisher under Section 127-A of the Representation of the People Act 1951. He said that the press operators will keep with themselves the complete details of printing handbills, pamphlets, posters, banners.

Editorial

For a fairer appraisal

The National Assessment and Accreditation Council, affiliated to the University Grants Commission, accredits higher education institutions and allots them grades as a measure of their performance. The HEIs are typically assessed on a range of criteria — curriculum, teaching-learning, infrastructure, student support and so on — and awarded a grade.

NAAC's current mechanism of grading HEIs has been scrapped in the recently announced spate of 'reforms'. Instead, there will be a new method wherein institutions will be assigned different levels (1 to 5) as a marker of their performance. It has been reasoned, not altogether incorrectly, that HEIs resort to "unhealthy practices" to secure a high grade from NAAC. Manipulation and fabrication of records and instances of corruption have been alleged. The race to secure a high grade not only pushes HEIs to adopt unfair means but also sparks unwarranted competition among them.

Thus far, HEIs had to apply themselves for an assessment by NAAC through a lengthy procedure and submit their track record for the past five years. They had to furnish copious details of academic and other activities undertaken by them. Many of them have specially dedicated internal quality assurance cells that collate all the required information and past records which they then submit for assessment. After this was done, it was time for a much-awaited visit from the NAAC team. The Council's officials visited the institutes undergoing assessment and interacted with faculty and students.

In the drawn-out process of assessment, there was enough scope for irregularities and misinformation at multiple levels. Different divisions and departments of the institutes undergoing assessment geared up to retrieve and, when not available, even created records of past events. The demands of creating safe, inclusive and accessible learning spaces suddenly acquired importance to meet NAAC's requirements. Attractive Power-Point presentations were made, often with the help of external consultants, and proudly displayed before NAAC officials. Mock drills and internal rehearsals were conducted in advance of the impending visit. Detailed lists of toppers and other high achievers were put together, hasty purchases made to ramp up the institute's existing infrastructure, and select students specially tutored to interact with the visiting team.

NAAC's visits to HEIs and the outcomes of the assessment process are enthusiastically covered by the local press. The high stakes involved create ample room for malpractices.

Sullivan to travel to India next week

US National Security Advisor Jake Sullivan will visit India next week, with plans to focus on reviewing progress under the Initiative for Critical and Emerging Technology (iCET) with his counterpart Ajit Doval, people familiar with the development told ANI.

President Biden's top national security aide will be in New Delhi on April 17 and is scheduled to have meetings on April 18. The top-level engagement will focus on the India-US relationship, "compare notes on the Indo-Pacific" and also talk about "next steps in technology cooperation," a senior White House official told reporters in Washington.

Sullivan was to travel to India earlier this year in February but because of the global crisis in Ukraine and West Asia, the annual review meeting on iCET was rescheduled.

In May 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and President Joe Biden launched iCET to facilitate outcome-oriented cooperation in new and emerging technologies. iCET is co-led by the NSCS in India and the US National Security Council (NSC).

"President (Joe Biden), one of the things that he's proudest of is his efforts to build a stronger relationship between the United States and India. And I do believe, both in the Indo-Pacific and the Indian Ocean, and on key issues like technology, the United States and India are working more closely together than ever before...." a White House official said during a press briefing on Japan Prime Minister Fumio Kishida's official visit to US.

The official acknowledged that "there perhaps had been some ambivalence or some uncertainty" between the two countries in the past. "I see very little of that now. I see leaders on both sides who are all in on



the promise and prospects of the other, recognize the potential of this relationship that is deeply supported by an activist diaspora community here, and technology and other firms who understand the potential of India."

"I would say, in many respects, engagement with India is some of the most- most desired kinds of engagements on the global stage, and we've seen this with a variety of key players," the official said. The White House official said that the US-India

relationship is "trending substantially in a positive direction and that our level of engagement across every possible vector -- security, intelligence, technology, people-to-people -- has excelled."

During a recent press briefing in the White House, Sullivan had said that the partnership between India and the United States has reached a new height with collaboration on technology and other fields.

"The partnership between the US and India -- a country in BRICS -- has gone to

new heights with an engagement across technology and security and so many other dimensions," Sullivan said. In February this year, Defence Secretary Girdhar Aramane, while speaking at the second edition of IN-DUS-X Summit in New Delhi, highlighted robust defence partnership between India and the US, rooted in mutual respect and strategic convergence. Aramane mentioned Initiatives on Critical and Emerging Technologies (iCET), launched jointly by PM Modi and President Joe Biden in the year 2022.

History of Ram Mandir: From Babri Masjid to the Rebuilding of the Ram Temple



According to historical records, Mughal ruler Babur's general Mir Baq was instrumental in the establishment of a mosque at the site believed to be the birthplace of Lord Rama in Ayodhya. The site is the former location of the Babri Masjid, which was Built in the 16th century.

The idols of Rama and Sita were placed in the mosque in 1949, before the mosque was attacked and demolished in 1992. The Ram Mandir holds immense cultural significance for Hindus worldwide. It marks the birthplace of Lord Ram. After 70year of hard struggles Again Ram Mandir buildy the chief architect of the temple was Chandrakant Sompura assisted by his two sons, Nikhil Sompura and Ashish Sompura. In 2019 in november a five judge bench of the supreme court ordered the disputed land to be handed over to a trust to build the Ram Janmabhoomi temple. The court also di-

rected the government to give the Sunni Waqf Board five acres of land in another location to build a mosque. In 2020 On august 5, the foundation stone for the construction of the Ram Temple. was laid by prime minister Narendra Modi. He performed Bhoomi poojan and laid the foundation stone of the grand Ram temple. In January 2024: preparations are in full swing for the ayodhya Ram temple 'pran patishtha' ceremony on january 22. Prime minister Narendra Modi will inaugurate the Ram temple in ayodhya and will also be the chief guest of the event. According to many media estimates, the consecration ceremony would be attended by more than lakh people gone to temple, including politicians, flims and other people. Hong Kong deports advocate planning to monitor Jimmy Lai trial

Hong Kong authorities have expelled an official of a media watchdog who arrived to cover the trial of pro-democracy publisher Jimmy Lai, Voice of America (VOA) has reported.

Reporters Without Borders (RSF) revealed that Aleksandra Bielakowska, a Taiwan-based advocacy officer for RSF, was detained for six hours at the airport before being deported. Bielakowska had travelled to Hong Kong to attend the trial and meet with journalists alongside RSF's Asia-Pacific Bureau Director Cedric Alviani.

However, upon arrival, airport authorities detained, searched, and interrogated Bielakowska, according to VOA.

A copy of the deportation documents obtained at Bielakowska's expulsion is to be "imminent and/or immediate."

Rebecca Vincent, RSF's director of campaigns, told VOA the vague reason provided by Hong Kong authorities, noting that Bielakowska had previously traveled there without any issues. She mentioned that Alviani had been admitted to Hong Kong but left for safety reasons after Bielakowska's deportation. Vincent confirmed that the team is now safely back in Taipei. RSF strongly condemned the treatment of Bielakowska and demanded that Hong Kong authorities provide an explanation and ensure the team's ability to return to cover Lai's trial. "We have never experienced such blatant efforts by authorities to evade scrutiny of court proceedings in any country, which further highlights the ludicrous nature of the case against Jimmy Lai,



and the dire erosion of press freedom and the rule of law in Hong Kong," Vincent stated. The Hong Kong government's Security Bureau did not immediately respond to VOA's request for comment.

Bielakowska and Alviani had intended to cover Lai's trial, which has lasted nearly 60 days. The 76-year-old publisher faces charges of sedition and collusion with foreign forces under Hong Kong's national security law, to which he has pleaded not guilty. If convicted, Lai could face life imprisonment. Earlier this year, the UN Special Rapporteur on Counterterrorism and Human Rights, Ben Saul, raised concerns about the trial, including allegations of evidence obtained through torture.

Procurement agencies purchase 810 metric tons of wheat and 622 metric tons of mustard in three markets of Panchkula

The work of procurement and lifting of mustard and wheat is going on smoothly in the district during the Rabi season 2024-25. So far, 810 metric tons of wheat and 622 metric tons of mustard have been purchased by government procurement agencies in the mandis of the district and 481 metric tons of mustard has been lifted so far. Giving information in this regard, the spokesperson of the Food and Supplies Department said that government procurement agencies HAFED and Haryana Warehousing Corporation

were purchasing wheat and mustard in the grain markets located in Panchkula, Barwala and Raipurani.

He said that out of 810 metric tons of wheat, 750 metric tons of wheat has been purchased from Raipurani grain market and 60 metric tons of wheat has been purchased from Panchkula grain market. Similarly, out of 622 metric tons of mustard, 386 metric tons of mustard was purchased by HAFED from Raipurani grain market, 24 metric tons of mustard was purchased by Haryana Warehousing Corporation from Barwala grain market and 212 metric tons of mustard was purchased by

HAFED. He said that 481 metric tonnes of mustard was lifted by HAFED, out of which 283 metric tonnes of mustard was from Raipurani grain market and 198 metric tonnes of mustard was from Barwala grain market.

Throughout the game, Liverpool lost their shape on various occasions. Across all three goals, the hosts lost their defensive shape which allowed Atalanta players to ease past the Liverpool players.

Amid struggling form, former India spinner Harbhajan Singh advises "tired" Siraj to take rest

New Delhi : Former India spinner Harbhajan Singh feels Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) struggling speedster Mohammed Siraj should be rested so that he can regain his form. Siraj has been chasing the shadow of his past in the ongoing Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024. In six matches the 30-year-old speedster has claimed just four wickets and conceded 229 runs in 22 overs. Harbhajan believes Siraj looks "tired" and needs to be rested for a couple of matches so that he can regain his form. "Siraj is struggling with the form. He needs to rest his body as well as his mind. He looks tired. He has been struggling for form for the past couple of matches. When a bowler is struggling for form the best thing to do is give him rest," Harbhajan said on his YouTube channel. During RCB's seven-wicket loss against Mumbai Indians at Wankhede Stadium on Thursday, Siraj bowled three overs, went wicket-less and gave away 37 runs. His struggle to find rhythm in the ongoing season has been one of the factors that has contributed to RCB's woeful season. In six games, RCB have just won one and lost five which has taken them to second-last spot. Despite putting a challenging 196/8 on board against MI, RCB bowlers leaked runs which led to their losing the match yet again.

"...They were slightly better than us": Rohit Sharma

New Delhi: India skipper Rohit Sharma opened up on the loss against Australia in the ODI World Cup 2023 final on Friday saying that though his side failed to win the cup, they still played some good cricket in the summit clash but Australia turned out to be "slightly better". Rohit is currently participating in the 17th edition of the Indian Premier League (IPL). The veteran batter has managed to score 156 runs in the five matches he has played so far in the IPL 2024 at an average of 31.20. The right-hand batter asserted that IPL has become competitive over the years and there is no weak team in the competitions as anyone can beat anyone. "IPL has grown to be so competitive over the years. There is no weak team. Anyone can beat anyone. It was not the case when it started. But there is so much technology available now. Franchises know what holes they have to fill and they do it during the auction,".

Haven't really thought about retirement, want to play 2027 ODI WC: Rohit Sharma



AGENCY NEW DELHI: India captain Rohit Sharma says he plans to "continue for a few more years" as he "really" wants to win the 2027 ODI World Cup after the trophy slipped through his grip thanks to just "one bad day" in the mega-event's 2023 edition.

The 36-year-old Rohit was part of India's 2007 T20 World Cup victory, but he counts the 50-over showpiece as the real stuff. He was left heartbroken when that opportunity was missed following the team's final loss to Australia last year in Ahmedabad.

"I haven't really thought about retirement. But, I don't know where life takes you. I am playing well at the moment and I am thinking of continuing for a few more years. I really want to win that World Cup," he said in a YouTube chat show 'Breakfast With Champions' that was also attended by British popsinger Ed Sheeran.

"The 50-over World Cup is the actual World Cup. We have grown up watching the 50-over World Cup. There is the World Test Championship final happening at Lord's in 2025. Hopefully, we will make it there," added Rohit, who will be leading the side in this year's T20 World Cup in June.

Six months have passed since India succumbed in the ODI World Cup final after remaining unbeaten through the tournament, but Rohit still finds it tough to come to terms with it.

"It was happening in India. We played well until that final. When we won the semifinal, I thought, we were just one step away from it (victory). I thought, what's that one thing that can make us lose that final, and honestly, nothing came to my mind," he said.

The Mumbaier eventu-

ally found his closure in a ready answer—one bad day on the field.

"We were all supposed to have one bad day and that I guess that was our bad day. We'd ticked all the boxes, we were playing good cricket, confidence was there. But that was one bad day and the Aussies had a very good day. I don't think we played bad cricket in that final," he noted.

However, Rohit found some solace in India's resounding 4-1 Test series win over England recently at home. The Indian captain

said the series was not a cakewalk as the eventual scoreline suggested.

"You might enter the field with a plan, but when you see things moving differently, you have to change it.

"When we played recently against England, we came across a different team, they were playing cricket differently. Each batter came and challenged us. So, we had to change our mindset," he said.

Rohit also rejected sug-

gestions that a home victory, even over a top side, is lesser when compared to an overseas triumph.

"It is difficult to win away from home. They make life difficult when you are away. It is the same for other countries as well because it is not easy when they come to India. You want to take advantage of that (home conditions)," he explained.

It brought the talk to his favourite moment in Test cricket, and the elegant right-hander picked his maiden hundred as the most cherished one.

Batting at No. 6, Rohit made a 301-ball 177 against the West Indies at Kolkata, which was also the farewell series of Sachin Tendulkar.

"India is all about scoring that hundred and then the crowd erupts. My first hundred was in a Test match at Kolkata. It was Sachin Tendulkar's 199th Test, so the stadium was packed, some 70,000 people in the stadium. Probably it was (the best moment)," he added.

'IPL has grown so much' Rohit, who has not missed a season of the Indian Premier League since its inception in 2008, said now there was no weak team in the league, a remarkable shape-shifting from its early years.

Mary Kom steps down as Chef-de-Mission of Indian contingent for Paris Olympics

NEW DELHI Legendary boxer MC Mary Kom has stepped down as Chef-de-Mission of the Indian contingent for the Paris 2024 Olympics Games citing personal reasons.

Confirming the development, Indian Olympic Association President PT Usha said a replacement would be named after appropriate consultations.

PT Usha acknowledged the receipt of a letter from Mary Kom asking to be relieved from her position. Olympic Games will take place from July 26 to August 11.

"We are sad that Olympic medal-winning boxer and Chairperson of the IOA Athletes Commission Mary Kom has stepped down citing personal reasons. We respect her decision and her privacy. I shall make the appropriate consultations and soon make an announcement about the



replacement for Mary Kom," Usha said in a statement released by IOA.

Usha said she had a conversation with Mary Kom upon receipt of the letter.

"I completely understand her request and respect her decision. I have also conveyed to her that she will always have my own support and that of IOA. I also request everyone to respect the legendary boxer's privacy," she said.

In her letter to the IOA

President, Mary Kom said she was grateful to the Indian Olympic Association for placing its faith in her to serve as Chef-de-Mission in Paris 2024.

"I consider it an honour to serve my country in every way possible, and I was mentally prepared for it. However, I regret that I will not be able to uphold the prestigious responsibility and would like to resign, owing to personal reasons. It is embarrassing to retreat from a commitment, which I seldom do, but I am left with no choice. I am there to cheer on my country and the athletes competing in this Olympic Games, with great expectations," she wrote.

Mary Kom was named as Chef-de-Mission last month and ace table tennis player Sharath Kamal as Indian team's flagbearer for the Paris 2024 Olympics.

NEW DELHI : Former India star spinner Harbhajan Singh hailed Mumbai Indians pacer Jasprit Bumrah following his match-winning performance against Royal Challengers Bengaluru in the ongoing Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024.

AGENCY MUMBAI: Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) opener Virat Kohli was disappointed with the Wankhede crowd as they continuously booed Mumbai Indians (MI) skipper Hardik Pandya during the 25th game of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024 on Thursday.

Not impressed by the crowd's response, Kohli asked them to stop being harsh and urged them to applaud the MI captain. The gesture quickly went viral on social media with fans praising him for his intervention.

The first time Hardik bowled during the RCB innings, the fans mocked him, but the least amount of support was shown when he walked out to bat following Rohit's removal. While the crowd enthusiastically applauded Rohit's every shot, Hardik struggled to get the same level of support.

In a video that went viral on social media, Kohli was seen reminding the fans that Hardik is a member of the Indian cricket team and intervening quickly to stop the boos.

The outcome was nearly immediate as the MI captain answered the cheers of "Hardik, Hardik" from a part of the crowd with a first-ball six off Will Jacks.

In November last year, the 30-year-old player moved back from Gujarat Titans (GT) to his former franchise as part of a trade between both franchises. The star all-rounder spent two momentous years with GT, spearheading their campaign in the cash-rich league with aplomb. In GT's debut season in 2022, Hardik got them off to a fairytale start, with the team lifting the coveted trophy.

In 31 matches for GT, the right-hand batter has scored 833 runs at an average of 37.86 and a strike rate of over 133, with six half-centuries and a best score of 87*.

He also took 11 wickets for the team, with the best figures of 3/17. Pandya also played 92 matches for MI from 2015-2021, scoring 1,476 runs at an average of 27.33 at a strike rate of over 153, with four half-centuries and best score of 91. He also took 42 wickets for the team, with the best bowling figures of 3/20. Pandya has won five IPL trophies, four with MI (2015, 2017, 2019, 2020) and GT (2022).
