

Chief Secretary directs prompt crop damage survey and speedy lifting of grain stocks from Mandis

BUREAU **CHANDIGARH, APRIL 20**

Hayana, Chief Secretary Sh. T.V.S.N Prasad today directed the Deputy Commissioners to promptly survey crops damaged by hailstorms to ensure timely compensation for affected farmers. He emphasised that farmer satisfaction is paramount.

The Chief Secretary was reviewing the ongoing procurement activities during the Rabi Marketing season in Haryana with the Deputy Commissioners, officers from the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department, representatives from the Food Corporation of India, and various other agencies. Deputy Commissioners participated in the meeting via video conference.

Sh. Prasad stressed the need to expedite the lifting of stocks from the Mandis, insisting that at least 50 percent of the stocks be promptly transferred to godowns by tomorrow evening. He directed Deputy Commissioners to facilitate dialogue between commission agents and farmers, urging farmers



to refrain from bringing their crops to the Mandis to clear space for wheat arrivals. Consequently, there will be no purchase tomorrow, i.e. on April 21.

The Chief Secretary also underscored that the Food, Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department has also authorised district authorities to utilize vehicles owned by

commission agents (Arhatis) for transporting crops from Mandis to warehouses. They will be paid rates already approved by the department for hiring such vehicles. This initiative aims to bolster the availability of transportation resources and expedite the uptake process, he added. The Chief Secretary asked Administrative Secretaries and Deputy Commissioners, along with officers involved in Rabi crop procurement, to make the payment to farmers within 72 hours of issuing the J-Form. He also directed the administrative secretaries to visit the allotted Mandis to ensure a seamless procurement process of grains

Sh. Prasad gave clear directions to the officers that farmers should not face any problem in selling their crops, and payment for the crops should be ensured within the stipulated period under all circumstances. The Chief Secretary mentioned that for the convenience of the farmers, silos have also been made procurement centers where the farmers can direct

Liver diseases in kids up due to junk food, sugar consumption


Medical experts have found that one in three children have nonalcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD), primarily caused by excess sugar consumption.

It has become a significant concern even among children aged 5-16 years. Previously, children were thought to be The number of children with NAFLD has risen alarmingly from 10-33 per cent in just a decade. Paediatric hepatologist at Ram Manohar Lohia Institute of Medical Sciences (RMLIMS), Piyush Upadhyay said the consumption of processed meals high in sugar and unhealthy fats is a major contributing factor to NAFLD in children Warning against the dangers of sug-ary drinks and junk food, he explained that triglycerides, a type of fat, accumulate in liver cells when there is an imbalance between the amount of fat the body takes in or produces and the liver's ability to process and eliminate it. The liver normally processes and removes fats from the body. "This imbalance can be caused by several factors, including genetics, a

"However, non-alcoholic fatty liver disease is becoming increasingly common. I see around 60-70 children with NAFLD every month, which is more than double the number I saw a decade ago," he said. Another gastroenterologist, Punit Mehrotra said, "Many studies have shown that NAFLD can be reversed in children as well as adults by making lifestyle changes, such as reducing sugar and junk food intake and exercising regularly for at least 30 minutes." trol inflammation in the body. They are released by the body's immune cells to fight against cancer and improve treatment effectiveness.

The team from Virginia Tech's College of Engineering developed the new technique which ensures that immune cell boosts cytokines which curbs tumour spread to other tissues or organs. It also preserved the cytokine's structure and reactivity levels to not expose toxicity to the rest of the body.

"Cytokines are potent and highly effective at stimulating the immune cells to eliminate cancer cells," said Rong Tong, associate professor in

chemical engineering at Virginia Tech. "The problem is they're so potent that if they roam freely throughout the body, they'll activate every immune cell they encounter, which can cause an overactive immune response and potentially fatal side effects," he added. In contrast, current cancer

treatments such as chemotherapy cannot differentiate between healthy cells and cancer cells, resulting in side effects like hair loss and fatigue, as it affects all cells in the body.

"Stimulating the body's immune system to attack tumours is a promising alternative to treat cancer. The delivery of cytokines can jumpstart immune cells in the tumour, but overstimulating healthy cells can cause severe side effects," the researchers noted in the paper published in the journal Science Advances. break in the chain of light and one of the stars has been lost.' The University of Edinburgh is planning to spend £800,000 on revising (read "censoring") the works of Robert Louis Stevenson. This includes his universal classic Treasure Island. What criteria will this revision use? One can surmise from the recent history of such goings-over of litera-



ture that it will adopt an agenda of "protecting" the sensibilities of groups

who might feel insulted.

The new shibboleth going round universities in the United States and Britain is "unsafe". Material, speakers and some expressed opinions make these frail blossoms, individuals and groups, feel "unsafe". And so censorship and cancellation ensue.

I suppose the presence and thieving character of Long John Silver, with his one leg missing, a black patch covering one eye and a parrot on his shoulder may come in for expurgation as his presence and activity in Treasure Island may make people with any disability, from missing limbs to visual "challenges", feel picked upon or even "unsafe". I can't imagine what this classic adventure novel will read like with Long John Silver expunged. Or perhaps his twenty-twenty vision in both eyes will have been restored, he won't have a leg missing and his parrot will have been liberated into the forest where nature intended birds to belong. I might buy the new revised edition just to compare it to the original -- which of course I shall refuse to burn.

This may, now that Hamza Yusuf and the Scottish Parliament have passed a law against "hate crime", make me guilty of the misdemeanour of harbouring hateful material. Obviously not as bad as being caught spending money that belongs to Hamza's Party on a camper van, but still risky.

The same treatment has been meted out to Enid Blyton's works from which characters and stories or statements deemed to be racially insulting have been purged.

I recently attended a lecture at Selwyn College, Cambridge, by renowned writer and critic Pankaj Mishra on the work of V.S. Naipaul. In answer to questions and in conversations after, it was mentioned that Sir Vidia Naipaul's work had been "cancelled" from some educational institutions. The "cancel-cultists" were not at the lecture so one couldn't challenge them as to the reason for their hostility to one of the most brilliant writers of the twentieth century. I have of course encountered critics of Vidia's work, but have never heard a coherent or insightful criticism of any of the words, fiction or world-exploratory work that he penned or published. The criticisms all centre around his supposed attitudes and his deliberately provocative, mischievous statements in interviews.

Permit me to make one sweeping, though distinct, point. I first encountered Vidia's work when I was in my late teens in college in Poona (now Pune). I read his essays in a magazine called Encounter and then his exploration and voyage of discovery in India: An Area of Darkness.

The book caused a critical storm. Vidia was abused and accused of every manner of anti-Indian attitude possible by prominent writers, politicians and by the professors who taught me. My reading of Area of Darkness was diametrically opposed to these journalistic and published diatribes.

seats. The names endorsed by the Himachal Pradesh Congress Committee Screening, and Coordination Committee are now under consideration. In the Hamirpur parliamentary constituency Satpal Raizada was recommended for a ticket, but in the previous meeting, former Congress National President Sonia Gandhi did not give him the green signal Instead, she suggested considering other names. Now, the proposed names for Hamirpur include Deputy Chief Minister Mukesh Agnihotri, Astha Agnihotri, and Satpal Raizada.

In the Chintpurni (Aj)-41 constituency, the first rehearsal for PRO and APRO will take place on 25th April and the second rehearsal on 22nd May at Maharana Pratap Government College.
