## NEWS BRIEFS

### Naxalite killed in encounter with security personnel in Sukma

RAIPUR: A Naxalite was killed in an encounter with security personnel in Chhattisgarh's Sukma district on Monday morning, police said. The gunfight took place in a forest under Kistaram police station area when separate teams of the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA- an elite unit of CRPF) were out on an anti-Naxal operation, Sukma Superintendent of Police Kiran G Chavan told a news agency.

### Rajnath Singh files nomination from Lucknow seat

LUCKNOW: Senior BJP leader Rajnath Singh on Monday filed nomination from the Lucknow Lok Sabha seat.

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath and his Uttarakhanda counterpart Pushkar Singh Dhami accompanied the Union Defence minister to the collectorate for filing the nomination paper. Singh, who is seeking election from Lucknow for a third term, and other senior party leaders reached the collectorate from the BJP headquarters here in a procession. Former prime minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee had in the past represented the prestigious Lucknow constituency.

### NEET aspirant from Hry hangs self in Kota

KOTA (RAJASTHAN): A 20-year-old NEET aspirant was found hanging from the ceiling fan of his hostel room in this city's Kunharia area, with his parents suspecting he was murdered, police said on Monday. This is the seventh case of suspected suicide by a NEET or JEE aspirant in this coaching hub so far this year, according to the police. The deceased, Sumit Panchal, hailed from Haryana's Rohtak and had been preparing for NEET at a coaching institute here for over a year, the police said.

### Cong announces names of 4 more candidates from Punjab

JALANDHAR: The Congress party on Monday released another list of 4 candidates from Punjab for the Lok Sabha election scheduled to be held on June 1. The list released by AICC General Secretary KC Venugopal includes the names of State Congress President Amarinder Singh Raja Warring from Ludhiana, Former Cabinet Minister Sukhjinder Singh Randhawa from Gurdaspur, Vijay Inder Singla from Anandpur Sahib and Kulbir Singh Zira from Khadoor Sahib. Raja Warring will face Former Ludhiana MP Ravneet Singh Bittu who had recently joined the BJP and has been fielded by the party to contest from Ludhiana. With the third list of candidates released today, the party has so far announced candidates for 12 of the 13 Lok Sabha seats in Punjab.

## PUNJAB POLICE BUSTS INTERNATIONAL DRUG SYNDICATE

# 48 kg heroin seized in Jalandhar, 3 held

BUREAU JALANDHAR, APRIL 29:

Making the biggest heroin seizure of 2024, Commissionerate Police Jalandhar has busted an international drug syndicate with the arrest of its three members after recovering 48kg heroin and Rs 21 lakh drug money from their possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Monday.

Those arrested have been identified as Satnam Singh alias Babbi, a native of village Dhandiyan in Nawanshahr and currently residing at Subhash Nagar in Hoshiarpur; his daughter Aman Rozi and his son-in-law Hardeep Singh. Apart from seizing heroin and drug money, Police teams have also impounded their three high-end cars including Toyota Innova, Mahindra XUV and Hyundai Verna, besides recovering one Cash Counting Machine from their possession.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that this drug syndicate, spread across five countries— Iran, Afghanistan, Turkey, Pakistan and Canada, was actively involved in trans-border and inter-state drug smuggling using their domestic network spanning two states— Gujarat and Jammu and Kashmir.

He said that preliminary investigation has suggested that Gujarat's sea



route and J&K's land route were used to push this heroin consignment into the territory of India.

The DGP said that a Turkey-based

heroin smuggler identified as Navpreet Singh alias Nav is the mastermind of this syndicate. Pertinently, Navpreet Nav was also involved in a 350 kg Heroin seizure by the Delhi Police Special Cell in 2021.

"Further investigations are ongoing to uncover the forward and backward linkages in this case," he said. Sharing more details, Commissioner of Police (CP) Jalandhar Swapan Sharma said that acting swiftly on a tip-off, a special naka was conducted near Y-Point Bhagat Singh Colony Bypass and during checking, a Toyota Innova car bearing registration number PB08-DS-2958 was signalled to stop. The driver identified as Satnam Singh alias Babbi attempted to flee from the spot but the police teams managed to apprehend him and upon search of his vehicle 8kg heroin concealed in a bag kept inside the vehicle was recovered, he added.

The CP said that during questioning accused Satnam revealed the role of his daughter Aman Rozi in maintaining financial records and his son-in-law Hardeep Singh, who was handling the distribution of heroin across various districts, often using multiple vehicles for transportation.

## Sandeshkhali: SC rebuke for Bengal on opposing CBI probe against pvt person

The Supreme Court Monday asked the West Bengal government their reason for opposing a CBI investigation into the Sandeshkhali incident and questioned the state government's move approaching the top court to protect an individual's interest.

A Bench comprising Justice BR Gavai and Justice Sandeep adjourned till July 2024, a Special Leave Petition, filed by the State of West Bengal against the Calcutta High Court's order, directing the Central Bureau of Investigation to probe the allegations of land-grabbing and sexual assaults in Sandeshkhali.

Justice Gavai asked, "Why should the State come as a petitioner for protecting

the interest of some private (individual)?" The Bench was hearing a plea by the West Bengal Government opposing the CBI probe into allegations of sexual assault and forcible land grabbing by Trinamool Congress leader Shahjahan Sheikh, a now-suspended member of the TMC and the main accused in the case. The Bench adjourned the matter after Senior Advocate Abhishek Manu Singhvi appearing for the state, requested the court to take up the matter after a couple of weeks. He submitted that there is some very important information that could not be collected to be filed with the present SLP. The Court while acceding to his request directed that his statement that "the pendency of this petition will not be used as a ground for any purposes".

## Sunita Kejriwal, Atishi meet Delhi CM in Tihar jail

AGENCY NEW DELHI, APRIL 29

Sunita Kejriwal and Delhi Minister Atishi met Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the Tihar Jail and shared details of their meeting with the Chief Minister inside the prison. Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is scheduled to meet Mr Kejriwal tomorrow.

Atishi, who holds six departments in the Delhi Cabinet, said, "Just now, I came to meet the Chief Minister. I asked him how are you, but he said, don't ask about my condition, tell me how the work is going on in Delhi." "He said, are the children getting books? Are medicines available in Mohalla Clinic?" Atishi added.

"The Chief Minister said that the summer season is coming, there should be no problem with water in Delhi...He gave a message to the women of Delhi that he is making plans to give 1000 to the women of Delhi," the minister said.

The Aam Aadmi Party earlier alleged that Mr Kejriwal's wife, Sunita Kejriwal, was not permitted to meet him, but Delhi minister Atishi in an update, said Sunita Kejriwal will be meeting her husband later in the day, adding, "Permission was given to two people but Sunita ji's was cancelled. New laws are made every day, permission was not given to her, but when our lawyers fought this battle, she



was allowed to meet Mr Kejriwal."

Meanwhile, the party has announced that Mrs Kejriwal will be leading AAP's Lok Sabha campaign in the national capital and other states which started with a roadshow to

back AAP's East Delhi candidate Kuldeep Kumar. It is the first time Mr Kejriwal's wife has forayed into active politics.

Last week, AAP MP Sanjay Singh claimed, "Atishi's name was added after Delhi Health Minister Saurabh Bharadwaj's name on the list of visitors for Mr Kejriwal."

Mr Singh said that Mr Bharadwaj and Atishi were supposed to meet the chief minister in Tihar.

"Atishi's meeting was not confirmed. Delhi Education Minister Atishi applied for the meeting and at the last moment, her meeting was cancelled," Mr Singh said.

## BJP nominee Rao Inderjit Singh files nomination from Gurugram

Accompanied by Haryana Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, state Waqf Board Chairman Zakir Hussain, and daughter Aarti Rao, BJP nominee from Gurugram, Rao Inderjit Singh, filed his nomination on Monday.

After submitting his affidavit, Singh held a public meeting at the Old Club Ground where he urged the people to elect him to the Lok Sabha for the sixth time. The 74-year-old Ahirwal leader, who in the past did not shy away from criticising the state government, said that all the leaders in the BJP are united to bring back Narendra Modi as the

Prime Minister for the third time. Singh also urged the public to give him a chance for the next five years so that he can do more development work for the region. Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini said that Singh will win by a huge margin because Congress has no candidate to pose a challenge to the BJP nominee. Saini also urged people to respond to the slogan "Rao Sahab is baar 8 lakh par", and ensure a thumping victory for Singh. While highlighting BJP's development work in the constituency, the Chief Minister said it was due to the efforts of Singh that the southern part of the state managed to get an AIIMS along with the inauguration of the Delhi-Mumbai Expressway till Dausa in Rajasthan.

The decision has been taken by the Election Commission of India to provide the option of voting from home to 40 percent or more differently-abled individuals and elderly persons aged 85 and above. The Election Commission of India has decided to provide alternative facility of voting from home to disabled persons having 40 percent or more percentage as per disability and senior citizens above 85 years of age. He said that persons with 40 percent disability and senior citizens above 85 years of age will have to apply to the Returning Officer within five days of the issuance of the notification giving their consent to vote from home.

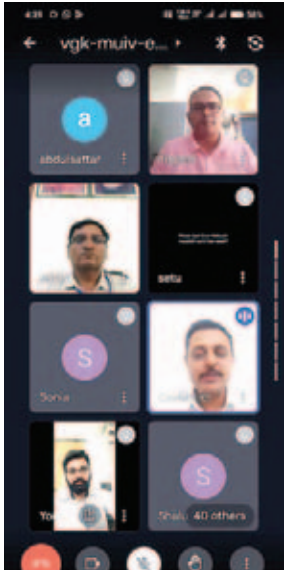

# Ensure special measures for polling staff welfare amid heat wave: CEO

In anticipation of the scorching summer temperatures as predicted by IMD, during polling day ( ie June 1st ) of the Lok Sabha elections 2024 in Punjab, Chief Electoral Officer, Sib-in C had issued advisory to all Deputy Commissioners-cum-District Election Officers to ensure special measures for polling staffs welfare.

Giving further information in this regard, CEO Sibin C said that following the various guidelines of the Election Commission of India (ECI), DCs of Punjab have been reiterated to ensure various arrangements for the welfare and convenience of the polling staff during the electoral process.

The CEO said that as the polling is scheduled on June 1, 2024, which is in the peak of summer season, all DCs have been categorically directed to take adequate measures to mitigate the heat stroke to the polling staff through various measures at the training venue, dispersal centres, polling stations and collection centres. Apart from this, directions



were issued for provision of shade, drinking water, waiting area, good quality toilets for both Men and Women at the training venue, dispersal centres, polling stations and collection centres, the CEO said.

He further added that in a letter issued to all DCs, officers asked for adequate Medicines (ORS etc) and para medical staff to be deployed at all the training venue, dispersal centres, polling stations and collection centres. Likewise, the arrangements at the training venue, dispersal centres, and collection centres should be systematic with sufficient

number of counters, adequate staff, signage, coolers, refreshments, public address system, proper tentage sufficient to mitigate the effect of heat and transport facilities for poling staff to return to home once the Polling party reaches the collection centres and hand over the polling materials. The CEO asked the DCs that clear instructions for depositing election material should be issued in writing in advance at the time of delivery. The arrangements at the Polling station should also be adequate with proper facilities of bedding, refreshments, toilets and mobile

medical facilities for polling staff, micro observers as well as security staff (Both State Police and CAPF).

In the letter, the officers were asked to ensure suitable arrangement for food of polling parties where the polling station is located other than schools. The CEO stressed that due to heat wave warning by IMD, during polling day, the voters may turn up late in the polling stations, with possibility of long queue after 6.00 pm, all DCs must also make adequate electricity arrangements for lighting at the Polling stations. The officers have also been asked for distribution of the honorarium to Polling staff, micro observer as well as Security staff (Both State Police and CAPF) timely with no complaints of late distribution. Similarly, immediate relief to any person engaged in election met with any accidents should be given free medical treatment (which may be reimbursed later) and ex-gratia as per the guidelines of the ECI. While deployment of polling staff, the officials should make sure the exempted categories of staff as per the guidelines of ECI.

He said that 85,777 candidates had appeared for the examination, out of which 63,092 candidates passed. The big thing is that the result has been declared in 25 days. Of these, there are 41 toppers in three streams. This includes 30 girls and 11 boys. After the release of the examination results by the board, the certificates of the students will be made available online within a week by providing them with the facility of Digilocker. Himachal Pradesh School Education Board will declare the examination results of all three streams of Dharamshala.

**Modern roads to be constructed in Bhoranj using world-class technology: Suresh Kumar**

**HAMIRPUR:** The main roads of the Bhoranj assembly constituency will be constructed using world-class FRP technology. Among these, the roads of Bassi Bharadi, Tatahar, and Vadar Keharvi are prominent. Bhoranj MLA Suresh Kumar stated in a press release that the expansion work of roads is underway in Bhoranj, which includes widening old roads and constructing new ones. He mentioned that construction is underway for 43 rural roads and ambulance routes in Bhoranj. Additionally, old roads are being widened. Suresh Kumar informed that the work to double-lane the Keharvi Bassi, Sulgawan, and Patta Tarkawadi Avahadevi roads has been initiated. The two main roads of the assembly constituency are being constructed using world-class modern technology. In this technology, modern machines are used to recycle the material extracted from the roads for reuse. These are the first roads in Hamirpur district to be constructed using this technology. Suresh Kumar mentioned that the work of expanding roads in Bhoranj is underway, and the road infrastructure in rural areas is being strengthened. He stated that roads are being constructed in Bhoranj assembly constituencies based on demand. This means that wherever there is demand for roads, including land documents, road construction will be immediately initiated. Suresh Kumar further revealed that the construction of ring roads in Bassi Bazar and Avahadevi is among his priorities. Similarly, the construction of a new road from Chandruhi to Jahur will also be prioritized based on demand.

**Allegations leveled against election commission for hindering development work: Jagat Singh Negi**

He highlighted that the government had also requested an estimate of appointments from various departments, the process of which has already been completed.

## SDMA organises workshop on disaster risk management on health care facilities

In light of the growing necessity for readiness in the face of natural disasters and emergencies, a comprehensive workshop focusing on Disaster Risk Management (DRM) in health care facilities is being organised here by the HP State Disaster Management Authority (SDMA) in partnership with the State Institute of Health and Family Welfare (SIH&FW). The workshop aims to equip health care professionals with essential skills and knowledge to mitigate risks and ensure the continuity of health care services during crisis. The five day long workshop kicked off with an inaugural session chaired by Dr. Gopal Beri, Director of Health Services. He emphasized the need to



bolster hospital's resilience in the face of disasters and stressed the importance of implementing Disaster Management plans and preparedness. He directed all participating health officials to propagate a culture of safety following the completion of the training programme. He also emphasized integrating disaster management into hospital operations and curricula in collaboration with the HP State Disaster Management Authority. Participants comprised faculty members and officials from the State

Institute of Health & Family Welfare and the Regional Health & Family Welfare Training Centre, along with nodal officers for disaster management from Shimla, Solan, and Bilaspur districts. During the workshop, attendees will delve into critical topics such as Healthcare Facility Preparedness Plan (HDFPP), the role of health care administrators in disaster management, preparation of disaster management plans (DMP), supply chain and logistics management, and triage at health facilities during disasters. A field visit

to healthcare facilities will provide firsthand insights into preparedness measures, followed by a simulation exercise involving earthquake, flood, or fire scenarios facilitated by experts from Fire and HP State Disaster Response Force (SDRF). Sessions will also spotlight the use of technology for disaster preparedness, including remote sensing and GIS technology for disease surveillance. Moreover, discussions on maternal and newborn health during emergencies and child health will be led by experts from various organizations. The workshop will conclude with sessions on nutrition and Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) in disaster and emergency situations, followed by an After-Action Review and Lessons Learned.

The counsel for the petitioner advocate Sunil Mallan said the court acquitted all the four who were

languishing in jail for six to eight years from all charges. Defense counsel Mallan said no iota of evidence was established against the acquitted person named in the chargesheet filed against them in the session court in 2018. "The FSL expert also submitted that it couldn't established that anyone entered the premises and crime scene," he informed FIR was lodged in Police Station Indora by the complaint that out of four members of a family, three members were found murdered and gold jewelry and cash were missing after the crime.

## Ensure full compliance with disaster management regulations regarding fire safety in industries: DC

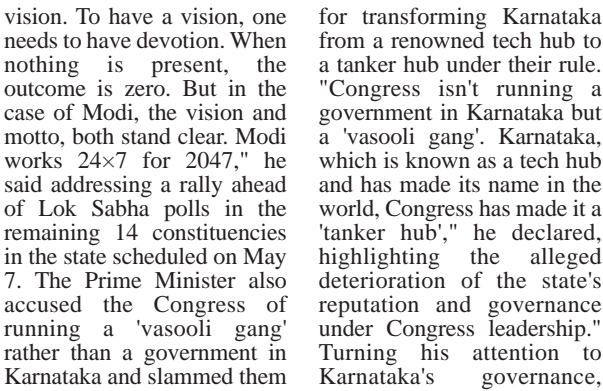
### Students learn to make home decor items from waste material at Apeejay College

### Excellent yield of mustard in model farms prepared with help of Ricela Foundation Dhuri

DHURI: The rapidly falling underground water level in Punjab has become a matter of concern and if the falling underground water level is not stopped in time, then the day is not far when the people of Punjab will crave every drop of water and the rapidly falling underground water level. To save the level, it is necessary to grow such crops in Punjab which consume less water as compared to paddy and wheat cultivation. Mustard cultivation requires less than half the water as compared to wheat, hence it is very important to promote mustard cultivation instead of wheat in Punjab, considering it as its social responsibility, Ricela Foundation Dhuri, like last year, this year Mustard model form was also prepared and on October 7, 2023, certified seeds of Pioneer 45-46 mustard were distributed free of cost to 91 farmer brothers from different villages for a one-acre demo plant. Raised bed planter machines were also provided free of cost to these farmers for sowing at the Damo plant. Apart from this, yellow sticky cards and Neem oil were also given to the farmers free of cost for pest control, good agricultural practices were implemented by the field officers of Ricela Foundation and from time to time, farmers were given guidance for good production of mustard. Trustee of Ricela Foundation, Dr. A.R. Sharma said that with the support of Ricela Foundation, these demo plants have resulted in good production of mustard. He told that about 1060 quintals of mustard were produced in the 91-Acre Damo plant, which is about 11.5 quintals per acre and out of these, the 43-Acre model farm produced 12-13 quintals of mustard per acre.



### AGENCY KARNATAKA, APRIL 29

Prime Minister Narendra Modi delivered a fiery speech at a rally in Bagalakote, launching a veiled attack on prominent Congress leader Rahul Gandhi while accusing the grand old party of operating a 'vasooli' (extortion) gang. In a pointed statement, Modi asserted that those who indulge in leisure vacations cannot contribute to India's progress, indirectly referencing Rahul Gandhi's recent leisure activities. Modi works 24x7 for 2047," he said addressing a rally ahead of Lok Sabha polls in the remaining 14 constituencies in the state scheduled on May 7. The Prime Minister also accused the Congress of running a 'vasooli gang' rather than a government in Karnataka and slammed them

for transforming Karnataka from a renowned tech hub to a tanker hub under their rule. "Congress isn't running a government in Karnataka but a 'vasooli gang'. Karnataka, which is known as a tech hub and has made its name in the world, Congress has made it a 'tanker hub'," he declared, highlighting the alleged deterioration of the state's reputation and governance under Congress leadership." Editorial

False dawn

This year is the year of elections; more than half the population of the planet will decide who they would be governed by. Some of them have already exercised their franchise while the citizens of the world's two biggest democracies — India and the United States of America — will cast their votes in the coming days. Elections in regular intervals are one of the defining features of democracy; however, holding a record number of national elections does not mean we are riding a new wave of democracy.

Many of the national elections held this year were neither free nor fair. Pakistan — where political opponents were harassed and dissenters jailed — was a case in point. In other nations, such as those ruled by autocratic leaders, an election is merely a ritual for legitimising the incumbent's hold on power. Many democracies have taken an illiberal turn in the hands of popular strongmen: Gideon Rachman's book, *The Age of the Strongman*, has shown how the cult of strongmen poses a threat to global democracies.

However, at present, autocrats or dictators are not the only ones threatening democracy. There is another danger: that of disinformation.

Information plays a critical role in a democracy. For people to take part in the democratic process and make an informed decision, it is essential that they have access to correct information. The American statesman, James Madison, had once written that "A popular Government, without popular information, or the means of acquiring it, is but a Prologue to a Farce or a Tragedy..." Today, the tragedy is not the scarcity of information; rather the farce is that the deluge of information leads to the blurring between fact and fiction.

The Global Risks Report 2024 of the World Economic Forum enumerates manipulated and falsified information as the most severe short-term risk and warns of its adverse impact on the electoral process. It is thus important to understand the causes and the consequences of the threat posed by disinformation. We must concede that misinformation, falsification and propaganda are not new; they have been part of every society. But democracy's relationship with information in the 21st century has experienced a disruptive change on account of technological innovations. In the age prior to the advent of Artificial Intelligence and the internet, the accuracy of information was shaped by its form and source. Now, things have changed radically. Neither form nor source is sacrosanct because, today, we can read about what did not happen, see what does not exist, and hear what has not even been uttered due to technology's ability to generate disinformation — textual and visual.

Anti-Israeli protest at Harvard University

Amid the campus demonstrations in the US, anti-Israeli protesters at Harvard University raised the Palestinian flag at the Ivy League school in a spot usually reserved for the American flag, New York Post reported.

The incident happened as the students continued to occupy campus with a video surfacing online showing three students raising the Palestinian flag over the iconic statue of John Harvard, where the Stars & Stripes is intended to fly.

The flag-raising incident happened shortly after 6:30 pm (local time) on Saturday, according to The Harvard Crimson, the student newspaper of the university. A total of three flags were hoisted at the campus, the report said.

The university spokesperson have said that the actions of students have violated Harvard's policy, according to New York Post report.

In a statement to New York Post, Harvard University spokesperson said, "The flags raised by protesters over University Hall were removed by Harvard facilities staff." The spokesperson added, "The actions are a violation of University policy and the individuals involved will be subject to disciplinary action."

According to The Harvard Crimson, university staff pulled down the Palestinian flag shortly after it was raised at the flagpole on Saturday.

The Crimson said the flag pole at the Harvard statue normally flies the US flag. However, it also had the flags of visiting foreign dignitaries displayed when they visited the campus, the report said.

At the time of the incident on Saturday, there was no US flag flying at the spot, New



York Post reported. It said that the Stars and Stripes is normally hoisted at 7 am from Monday through Friday and lowered at 4 pm "for proper storage."

The Palestinian flag was raised as anti-Israeli students encamped on the school grounds shouted slogans like, "Free, free Palestine," and "We flay for Palestine."

Similar scenes were witnessed at college campuses across the US, including Columbia University in the Big Apple and other Ivy League universities.

Protests erupted in the US universities against Israel's counteroffensive in response to Hamas attack on the Jewish state on Octo-

ber 7. In a series of tense confrontations, more than 200 individuals found themselves in handcuffs following protests at Northeastern University, Arizona State University, Indiana University, and Washington University in St Louis, The New York Times (NYT) reported. These events, unfolding against the backdrop of heightened tensions in the ongoing Israeli-Palestinian conflict, underscore the challenges faced by universities nationwide as they grapple with the increasingly visible demonstrations and encampments on their campuses. Since April 18th, when Columbia University in New York City saw the New York Police Department

dismantle a protest encampment, over 700 protesters have been arrested across US campuses.

Among the recent wave of arrests, one notable figure stands out: Jill Stein, the Green Party's 2024 presidential candidate, alongside her campaign manager and another staff member, were apprehended at Washington University in St Louis, according to NYT. At Northeastern University in Boston, the scene unfolded early Saturday morning as Massachusetts State Police officers moved in to dismantle an encampment on the campus's Centennial Common.

The encampment, which had drawn over 100 supporters, faced repeated requests from the university administration to vacate the area. Despite these calls, many students remained steadfast.

As tensions escalated, the arrests began, with more than 100 protesters detained. While the exact number of students among those arrested remains unclear, the university assured that students presenting their university IDs were being released.

Alina Caudle, a sophomore at Northeastern University, reiterated the protesters' demands for transparency regarding the university's investments and urged divestment from companies allegedly supporting Israel's actions in Gaza.

She emphasized the diverse composition of the encampment, noting significant participation from Northeastern students, as well as support from Jewish students and faculty. Similar scenes unfolded across the country. In Boston, Boston Police officers arrested 118 people at Emerson College, while at Arizona State University, 69 individuals were detained for setting up an unauthorised encampment.

23.7 million people need humanitarian assistance in Afghanistan: UNICEF



As many as 23.7 million people including 12.3 million children in Afghanistan require humanitarian assistance in 2024, the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) said, Afghanistan-based Khaama Press reported.

According to UNICEF, only 35 per cent of the required USD 1.4 billion in aid for children in Afghanistan has been secured. The UNICEF released its latest report on the humanitarian situation in the country in March.

The report has attributed the rise in poverty in Afghanistan to long-standing conflicts, climate change, economic recession, and rising unemployment, Khaama Press reported.

From the beginning of 2024 to date, 14,570 suspected cases and 71 deaths from measles have been recorded in Afghanistan, the report said. According to UNICEF, over 11,000 of these patients are children under

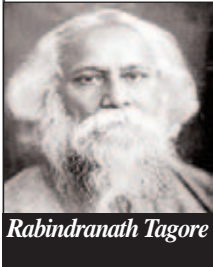
five years old, and more than 6,000 measles patients are women. The UNICEF urged its humanitarian partners to prioritize the safety of female staff in Afghanistan.

The UN report comes at a time when 'Save the Children' voiced concerns about the situation of children in Afghanistan. The international non-governmental organisation stated that 2,50,000 Afghan children returning from Pakistan face food and shelter shortages. On April 27, the World Food Programme said it has been distributing food and cash to six million people every month there, according to Khaama Press. About 15.8 million people in Afghanistan would experience food insecurity crises and emergency levels, according to UN estimates. Significantly, to meet the basic needs of people in Afghanistan, the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs has sought a budget of USD 3.6 billion.

Study gives more insight into how obesity affects fecal incontinence



For millions of adults in the United States, involuntary loss of bowel control, or fecal incontinence (FI), has a major negative influence on their quality of life and mental health. Although it is believed that obesity has an impact on bowel function, it is still unknown how body mass index (BMI), the usual measure of obesity, and FI are related.

Investigating more accurate indicators of obesity, like as body composition and fat distribution, as opposed to BMI alone, may provide more insight

into how obesity affects FI.

In a cross-sectional examination of the U.S. population, researchers from Brigham and Women's Hospital, a founding member of the Mass General Brigham healthcare system, showed that waist circumference-to-height ratio (WtHr), a marker of central obesity, was a greater predictor of FI than BMI.

Using data collected between 2005-2010 by the National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey, the researchers calculated WtHr and BMI for

more than 7500 participants and assessed them for prevalence and risk of FI. They found that FI occurred in just over 9% of the study cohort and that higher prevalence was linked to higher WtHr, but only weakly associated with higher BMI.

After adjusting for potentially confounding factors like sociodemographics, metabolic comorbidities, diet and physical activity, the research team observed that higher WtHr, but not BMI, remained consistently correlated with FI. Sex-specific analyses also revealed

more significant associations between WtHr and FI in men.

"We know that central adipose tissue distribution tends to be more prevalent in men than women," said first author Brent Hiramoto, MD, a senior fellow in the Division of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Endoscopy. "These sex-based differences could indicate the importance of central obesity in the pathogenesis of FI." "Our findings suggest that risk of bowel continence may depend on how body mass is distributed," said senior au-

thor Walter Chan, MD, MPH, of the Division of Gastroenterology, Hepatology and Endoscopy. "BMI is a pragmatic measure for obesity but does not distinguish between fat and muscle mass or assess distribution of adiposity. WtHr may contribute to FI through increased intra-abdominal pressure affecting the pelvic floor or anal sphincter, or through higher visceral fat with the associated inflammatory and oxidative stress. Further research is needed to better understand why FI occurs."
