Cong leader Manish Tewari files nomination from Chandigarh

CHANDIGARH: Congress candidate from the Chandigarh parliamentary constituency Manish Tewari on Tuesday filed his nomination papers. He was accompanied by the party's Chandigarh unit president HS Lucky and other leaders. Tewari is pitted against BJP candidate Sanjay Tandon from the lone Lok Sabha seat in the Union Territory.

3 SFJ men linked to Pannu arrested

CHANDIGARH: In a significant breakthrough, the counter-intelligence unit and police in Bathinda have arrested three Sikh for Justice (SFJ) operatives connected to GS Pannu for writing pro-Khalistan slogans at various public places in Bathinda, Punjab and Delhi among others. The New York based separatist mastermind Gurbatwant Singh Pannu is one of the main leaders of the Khalistan movement which advocates for a religion-based separate state. Punjab DGP Gaurav Yadav said on Tuesday that on April 27, pro-Khalistani slogans were found written on walls of the District Administrative Complex and Court Complex, Bathinda.

3 killed in firing and teargas shelling by security forces in PoK

ISLAMABAD: At least three people were killed and six others injured when security forces opened fire on protesters who attacked paramilitary Rangers in Pakistan-occupied Kashmir, which has been rocked by protests against high prices of wheat flour and inflated electricity bills, media reports said on Tuesday. The paramilitary Rangers, which were called in to maintain law and order in the disputed region, came under attack in the regional capital Muzaffarabad while moving out of the town, the Dawn newspaper reported. Instead of exiting via Brarkot, the village bordering Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the 19-vehicle convoy, including five trucks, chose to exit the region from Kohala, it said.

AAP's Karamjit Singh Anmol, BJP's Subhash Sharma file papers on last day of nomination

CHANDIGARH: AAP candidate and Punjabi actor Karamjit Singh Anmol and BJP nominee Subhash Sharma on Tuesday filed their nomination papers for their respective Lok Sabha seats in Punjab. Tuesday is the last day for filing nominations in Punjab, where voting is to be held in the last phase of the seven-phase national elections on June 1. Scrutiny of papers will take place on May 15 and the last date for the withdrawal of nominations is May 17.

PM Modi files nomination from Varanasi, eyes third term

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday filed his nomination papers from the Varanasi Lok Sabha seat in Uttar Pradesh. The Prime Minister is seeking a third consecutive term from the constituency and hoping to win with a record margin. PM Modi, the sitting MP and BJP's candidate, filed his nomination papers at the district magistrate's office. Varanasi will go in for polling in the seventh and last phase of the Lok Sabha polls on June 1. The counting of the votes will be held on June 4.

PM Modi arrived at the DM office in Varanasi clad in a full-sleeved white Kurta with white churidar and Blue jacket. The PM was received by Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Uttar Pradesh outside the Kal Bhairav temple. The Prime Minister was given a rousing welcome from people who showered flower petals and chanted slogans of 'Modi, Modi' and 'Har Har Mahadev' outside the temple. Ahead of filing his nomination, he offered

prayers at Dashashwamedh Ghat on the banks of the Ganges in the temple town and boarded a cruise to the Namoh Ghat.

He offered prayers at the Kaal Bhairav Temple in Varanasi and was seen performing Aarti at the Temple.



PM Modi also performed Ganga Aarti, offering prayers to the River Ganga on the auspicious occasion of Ganga Saptami today. A total of 25 NDA leaders attended the nomination of the Prime Minister including Union Home Minister Amit Shah, BJP National President JP Nadda, Defence

Minister Rajnath Singh and Union Minister Hardeep Singh Puri.

AAP to be made accused in money-laundering case, ED tells Delhi HC

"AAP is going to be made a co-accused in the next prosecution complaint (charge sheet) to be filed in the case," the ED's counsel contended before Justice Swarana Kant Sharma, who is hearing arguments on Sisodia's bail

BJP scared of me : Kejriwal

Officials said that they had received calls from the GTB Hospital, Dada Dev Hospital, Hedgewar Hospital, and Deep Chandra Bandhu Hospital reporting bomb threat emails. On Sunday, 20 hospitals, the IGI Airport and the Northern Railways' CPRO office in Delhi received bomb threats through emails.

Patanjali ads: SC reserves order on contempt case against Ramdev, Balakrishna

The Supreme Court on Tuesday reserved its order in a contempt of court case against Patanjali Ayurved Ltd., yoga guru Baba Ramdev and Acharya Balakrishna over the company's misleading advertisements.

A bench of Justices Hima Kohli and Ahsanuddin Amanullah also dispensed with the personal appearance of Patanjali Ayurved's founders, Ramdev and Balakrishna. Ramdev and Balakrishna were present before the top court pursuant to its earlier direction. The bench also granted Patanjali three weeks to file affidavits indicating the steps taken to recall misleading ads for Patanjali products, for which licences have been suspended. After reserving orders in the contempt case, the bench said, "Public is cognisant, if they have choices they make well informed choices... Baba Ramdev has a lot of influence, use it in the right way."

"What has been done for yoga is good, but Patanjali products is another matter," Justice Kohli replied when Solicitor General Tushar Mehta said that Ramdev has done a lot of good for yoga.

HD Revanna released from jail on conditional bail

BENGALURU: JD(S) MLA from Holenarasipura HD Revanna, who was arrested on charges of kidnapping case linked to the 'obscene video' case, was released from Parappana Agrahara Jail on Tuesday after he was granted conditional bail by a special court of people's representatives.

On Monday, HD Revanna, who was arrested in connection with the kidnapping case linked to the 'obscene video' case, was granted conditional bail by a special court of people's representatives. The judge granted conditional bail to Revanna, on a Rs 5 lakh bond.

He was arrested on May 4 by SIT officials in a kidnapping case registered against him at KR Nagar police station in the city.

HD Revanna had been sent to judicial custody till May 14 in connection with the 'obscene video' kidnapping case on May 8. He was arrested by the Special Investigation Team on May 4 in connection with an alleged kidnapping case registered against him at KR Nagar police station in Bengaluru. HD Revanna and his son, Prajwal Revanna, are facing a probe by an SIT, constituted by the Karnataka government over allegations of sexual harassment and criminal intimidation against the duo following a complaint by a woman who worked in their household.

HD Revanna, who is a JD(S) MLA from Holenarasipura, along with his associate were booked under Sections 364A (kidnapping for ransom), 365 (kidnapping with intent to cause harm), and 34 (common intention) of the IPC.

Ghatkopar hoarding collapse: Death toll rises to 14

A massive Ghatkopar hoarding collapse in Mumbai has resulted in 14 deaths on Tuesday, prompting the National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) to conduct overnight rescue operations.

According to reports, a large hoarding for advertisements, erected by a private party, crashed in the gusty winds on several houses and a petrol pump in Pant Nagar, Ghatkopar East suburb, around 4.15 pm on Monday.

On Monday, at least 63 people were left



injured, and another over 50 are still feared trapped under the hoarding when many vehicles had queued up to refill petrol and diesel.

Anurag Agarwal said that the total number of voters in Haryana in the Lok Sabha elections to be held on May 25 is 2 crore 1 lakh 87 thousand 911, including 1 crore 6 lakh 52 thousand 345 men, and 94 lakh 23 thousand 956 women voters. In addition to this, there are 467 transgender voters who will use their franchise.

Giving information, the Chief Electoral Officer said that every vote is paramount in a democracy. Therefore, every voter must exercise their vote. Democracy remains incomplete without voters. The Election Commission's task is



to complete the election process in a fair and transparent manner. He said that 19,812 permanent polling stations have been set up in the state.

In addition, 219 temporary polling stations have also been set up. Extra arrangements will be made at all polling stations keeping in mind

the heat wave. The voters will be welcomed outside the polling booths by the BLO on the day of polling.

He said that by taking a unique initiative during the Lok Sabha elections 2024, Haryana Chief Electoral Officer informed that invitation letters are being sent to the voters through BLOs in order to increase voters turnout. He further informed that there are five phases in the voting process. First, one has to stand in line for voting, then the polling officer will take information about the voter's name and identification documents from the voter list. In the third phase, the polling officer will apply blue ink on the finger. In the fourth phase, the polling officer will take the slip and confirm the presence of blue ink on the finger. After that, the voter will go to the EVM and cast his vote.

Record wheat arrival in Bhikhi mkt committee: Manmohan Singh

During the ensuing season, there has been record arrival of wheat in the purchase centres covered under Bhikhi market committee of district Mansa. 1.97 Crore tablets of Alprazolam seized from Biogenetic Drugs



SHANTI GAUTA M BADDI : In a significant development concerning the production and illicit supply of psychotropic drugs, the Punjab Police's Special Task Force (STF) has seized 1.97 crore tablets of Alprazolam from Biogenetic Drugs in Baddi. Additionally, the State Drug Control Administration has intensified its investigation by seizing 432 kilograms of codeine. According to sources, Biogenetic Drugs Company has manufactured 21.66 crore tablets of Alprazolam 0.5 under various brand names since May 6, 2023. The company had purchased 139 kilograms of raw Alprazolam in May 2023, of which only 40 kilograms remain unused. The STF has taken possession of this remaining stock under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act. Despite significant sales of psychotropic drugs over the past year, Biogenetic Drugs Private Limited and Smilex Management have failed to disclose information regarding compliance with licensing conditions. The operation of this pharmaceutical unit, operational since 2005 and producing millions of tablets annually, has come under scrutiny. Manish Kapoor, the State Drug Controller, stated that action is being taken against both pharmaceutical companies by the STF in addition to ongoing investigations into their operations.

In case of any irregularities, they should immediately inform the General Election Observer.

Conflict erupts as NH-3 construction company officers face ire from locals for alleged misconduct

During the construction of NH-3, a national highway connecting Hamirpur and Mandi, allegations of misconduct by the construction company have sparked outrage among the affected locals. On Tuesday, a team of officers from National Highway Construction Company was surrounded by agitated individuals for nearly half an hour during an inspection.

Under the leadership of Reena Devi, the chairperson of the women's wing of the affected forum, officers were compelled to provide answers to questions raised regarding various issues including water seepage, compensations, substandard construction, dumping sites, survey discrepancies, and



deviations from the Detailed Project Report (DPR). Most of the affected individuals reside in areas like Darakoti, Bari Mandir, Jhanikkar, Barada, Panjot, and Tikari.

The construction of the NH from Hamirpur to Mandi, including the double-lane stretch, has reached Kot to Padhar. Initially, there was public outcry over road alignments in Thana Darogan under Touni Devi tehsil. Subsequently, questions were raised regarding the establishment

of toll plazas on the double-lane NH. Recently, tensions escalated as locals protested against the cutting of trees on land acquired by the construction company. According to Reena Devi and Ramesh Chand, the construction company has been causing distress to the locals for almost two years. Several incidents have occurred where explosives laid by the construction company during the first monsoon were prematurely detonated.

India's wholesale inflation rises to 1.26 pc in April

Primarily driven by high food and vegetable prices, India's wholesale price index (WPI) based inflation rose to 1.26% year-on-year in April 2024 from 0.53% in the previous month, data released by Ministry of Commerce and Industry showed on Tuesday.

The data showed that the rate of inflation based on WPI Food Index increased from 4.65% in March, 2024 to 5.52% in April, 2024.

"Positive rate of inflation in April, 2024 is primarily due to increase in prices of food articles, electricity, crude petroleum & natural gas, manufacture of food products, other manufacturing etc," said an



official release. As per data released by Ministry of Statistics & Programme Implementation (MoSPI) on Monday this week, India's retail inflation measured by consumer price index (CPI) eased to 4.83% in April this year even as food inflation remained elevated primarily on account of pulses and vegetable prices staying firm. The headline retail inflation has remained below the upper tolerance band of the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for several months now. Mother of two commits suicide with her lover by swallowing poison

RAMPURA PHUL: This afternoon, a mother of two children living near Bathinda-Barnala National Highway committed suicide by swallowing something poisonous along with her lover. That lost melody

A diamond style placed against the rotating cylinder made tiny dents in the tin foil as someone spoke into a mouthpiece attached nearby. These dents represented the original sound waves. The entire process was run manually, that is, without electricity. Thomas Edison’s phonograph record was cylindrical. It consisted of a small metal cylinder wrapped in tin foil and mounted on an axle that could be rotated. When Thomas Alva Edison recited “Mary Had a Little Lamb” into his first phonograph in 1877, little did he realise that the concept of sound reproduction would dominate the entertainment industry worldwide. Lal Chand Boral’s “Kader kuler bou go tumi” was a super hit and fetched the Gramophone Company high revenues.

The first Indian recording made commercially in Calcutta took place on November 8, 1902. The singers were two nautch girls, Sashi Mukhi and Feni Bala, from Amarendra Nath Dutta’s Classic Theatre. These kids, aged 14 and 16, probably knew nothing about sound recording and had a “miserable voice” (as F.W. Gaisberg described in his autobiography, The Music Goes Round). Initial recordings were taken from nautch girls and kothawalis. Amala Das was the first woman from a ‘respectable family’ to have her voice recorded. Popularly known as ‘Miss Das’ in the then music world, Amala was the sister of Deshbandhu Chit-taranjan Das.

It has been precisely 96 years since the gramophone arrived commercially in India — 96 years since the Gramophone Company factory was opened at 33 Jessore Road. After undertaking the first recording expedition, the Gramophone Company tasted almost instant success. The master discs of the recordings made in India had to be taken to Germany for final pressing and labelling. As the country’s record industry grew, the Gramophone Company found it feasible to establish a record-pressing plant in India to cut costs and time. The site chosen for the purpose was Beliaghata, near Seal-dah. The factory became popularly known as ‘Baja Khanna’.

In the early days of the music industry in India, Hemendra Mohan Bose saw an opportunity to use the phonograph for commercial purposes. Initially, he collaborated with Pathé Freres to sell Pathé phonographs. The venture was successful. Encouraged by this, Bose launched his own cylinders named ‘H. Bose’s Records’. H. Bose’s Records claimed to be the first company to manufacture complete records in Calcutta. Its records were cylindrical, allowing them to be produced in small numbers and sold immediately, unlike discs that required pressing in pressing factories. This claim enabled Bose to assert that his records were made in India, although he had to import the blank cylinders from Europe.

Sleep is a basic requirement, much like food and drink

A group of academics from the arts and sciences came up with a theory that may account for the complexity of the brain as well as the importance of sleep.

In order to demonstrate that the brain must periodically reset its operating system, researchers recently recorded the brain activity of sleeping rats for publication in the journal Nature Neuroscience.

Sleep is a basic requirement, much like food and drink. "You'll die without it," warned Keith Hengen, an assistant professor of biology at Washington University in St. Louis.

But what does sleep accomplish? For years, academics could only state that sleep reduces tiredness, which is hardly a satisfactory explanation for a core human need.

"The brain is like a biological computer," Hengen said. "Memory and experience during waking change the code bit by bit, slowly pulling the larger system away from an ideal state. The central purpose of sleep is to restore an optimal computational state."

Co-authors of the paper include Ralf Wessel, a professor of physics; Yifan Xu, a graduate student in biology studying neuroscience; and Aidan Schneider, a graduate student in the Computational & Systems Biology program, all in Arts & Sciences.

Wessel said physicists have been thinking about criticality for more than 30 years, but they never dreamed the work would have implications for sleep. In the world of physics, criticality describes a complex system that exists at the tipping point between order and chaos. "At one extreme, everything is completely regular. At the other extreme, everything is random," Wessel said.

Criticality maximizes the encoding and processing of information, making it an attractive candidate for a general principle of neurobiology. In a 2019 study, Hengen and



Wessel established that the brain actively works to maintain criticality.

In the new paper, the team provides the first direct evidence that sleep restores the computational power of the brain. It's a radical departure from the long-held assumption that sleep must somehow replenish mysterious and unknown chemicals depleted during waking hours.

After their 2019 paper, Hengen and Wessel theorized that learning, thinking and being awake must push the brain away from criticality and that sleep is perfectly positioned to reset the system. "We realized this would be a really cool and intuitive explanation for the core purpose of sleep," Hengen said. "Sleep is a systems-level solution to a systems-level problem."

To test their theory on the role of criticality in sleep, the researchers tracked the spiking of many neurons in the brains of young rats as they went about their normal sleeping and waking routines.

"You can follow these little cascades of activity through the neural network," Hengen said. These cascades, also called neural avalanches, reflect how information flows through the brain, he said.

"At criticality, avalanches of all sizes and durations can occur. Away from criticality, the system becomes biased toward only small avalanches or only large avalanches. This is analogous to writing a book and only being able to use short or long words." As predicted, avalanches of all sizes occurred in the rats that had just woken up from restorative sleep.

Across the course of waking, the cascades started to shift toward smaller and smaller sizes.

The researchers found they could predict when rats were about to go to sleep or wake up by tracking the distribution of avalanches. When cascade sizes were reduced to a certain point, sleep wasn't far away. "The results suggest that every waking moment pushes relevant brain circuits away from criticality, and sleep helps the brain reset," Hengen said.

When physicists first developed the concept of criticality in the late 1980s, they were looking at piles of sand on a checkerboard-like grid, a scenario seemingly far removed from brains. But those sand piles provided an important insight, Wessel said.

If thousands of grains are dropped on the grid following simple rules, the piles quickly reach a critical state where interesting things start happening.

Avalanches both large and small can start without warning, and piles in one square start spilling into the others. "The whole system organizes itself into something extremely complex," he said.

The neural avalanches taking place in the brain are much like the avalanches of sand on a grid, Wessel said. In each case, the cascades are the hallmark of a system that has reached its most complex state.

According to Hengen, every neuron is like an individual grain of sand following very basic rules. Neurons are essentially on/off switches that decide whether or not to fire based on straightforward inputs.

If billions of neurons can reach criticality - the sweet spot between too much order and too much chaos - they can work together to form something complex and wondrous. "Criticality maximizes a bunch of features that sound very desirable for a brain," Hengen said.

My last day of work at the foundation will be June 7th," Melinda French Gates said in a post shared on X. She further emphasised that she is taking this step with full confidence that the Gates Foundation is in strong shape.

India sends 2nd tranche of humanitarian aid to flood-hit Kenya

In a bid to support the people affected by the massive floods in the East African country, India on Tuesday sent a second tranche of humanitarian aid to Kenya comprising relief and medical supplies.

The humanitarian aid sent to the country included Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief containing 40 tonnes of medicines, medical supplies and other equipment to assist flood victims.

Aid was sent through an Indian Air Force aircraft from Hindon Airport of Ghaziabad to Kenya.

EAM Jaishankar also shared details of the aid sent to Kenya on X saying, "The second tranche of HADR material containing 40 tonnes of medicines, medical supplies and other equipment to assist the flood victims leaves for Kenya. 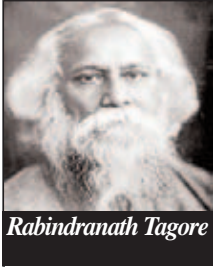
the Government of Kenya," Indian High Commission in Kenya posted on X.

Torrential rains have caused devastating floods in Kenya, where more than 200 people have died, thousands have been displaced and nearly 2,000 schools have been destroyed. How yoga linked with symptom improvement in patients with heart failure

According to a study, yoga that focuses on breathing, meditation, and relaxation is connected to symptom improvement in people with heart failure.

Study presented at Heart Failure 2024, a scientific meeting of the European Society of Cardiology (ESC).

"Patients who practised yoga on top of taking their medications felt better, were able to do more, and had stronger hearts than those who only took drugs for their heart failure," said study author Dr. Ajit Singh of the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Manipal Academy of Higher Education, India. "The findings suggest that yoga can be a beneficial complementary therapy in patients with heart failure."

Heart Failure affects vast numbers of people - more than 64 million globally and can have devastating impacts on quality of life, with patients feeling tired and breathless, and being unable to participate in their usual activities. While previous



studies have shown the short-term benefits of yoga in patients with heart failure, this study provides new information about the long-term effects.

The study enrolled patients aged

30 to 70 years with heart failure from the cardiology outpatient department of Kasturba Hospital in Manipal, India. All participants had undergone a cardiac procedure within the past six months to one year and

The study included 85 patients. The average age was 49 years and 70 (82%) were men. In a non-randomised fashion, 40 patients were assigned to the yoga group and 45 patients were allocated to the control group. All participants continued taking guideline-recommended heart failure medications throughout the study.

were taking guideline-recommended heart failure medications. Patients with severe symptoms were excluded.

The study included 85 patients. The average age was 49 years and 70

(82%) were men. In a non-randomised fashion, 40 patients were assigned to the yoga group and 45 patients were allocated to the control group. All participants continued taking guideline-recommended heart failure medications throughout the study.

Experienced faculty in the hospital's Department of Yoga demonstrated pranayama (yogic breathwork), meditation, and relaxation techniques to patients in the yoga group. Participants were supervised for one week and then advised to continue self-administered yoga at home once a week for 50 minutes. Patients spoke to an instructor after each home session to check progress.

At baseline, six months, and one year, the researchers assessed heart structure and function in the yoga and control groups using echocardiography. The measurements included the ability of the heart to pump blood (left ventricular ejection fraction), and assessment of right ventricular

function. The researchers also examined blood pressure, heart rate, body weight, and body mass index. Symptom burden and the ability to do ordinary activities such as walking and climbing stairs were assessed using the New York Heart Association classification system.

Compared to the control group, the yoga group demonstrated significantly greater improvements in all measurements at six months and one year relative to baseline.

Dr. Singh said: "Patients who did yoga had healthier hearts and were more able to carry out ordinary activities such as walking and climbing stairs than those who only took medications. Patients with heart failure should speak to their doctor before starting yoga and should then receive training from an experienced instructor. Prescribed medications should be continued as before. Yoga may be unsuitable for heart failure patients with severe symptoms, who were excluded from our study."

The men's Test series between India and Australia will kick off on November 22, promising an exhilarating five-match showdown. "Fans are encouraged to secure their seats in the Indian fan zones, embracing the vibrant atmosphere by donning blue attire and traditional instruments like the Dhol for a family-friendly experience," the statement further added. Further details on the India Fan Zone will be provided soon.

The action-packed five-Test Border-Gavaskar trophy will see India take on Australia in Perth on November 22, followed by a thrilling Day-Night Test in Adelaide on December 6.

Both teams will then battle it out at the Gabba on December 14, with the famous Boxing Day Test scheduled for the MCG and SCG hosting both nations on January 3.

It will be the first time since the summer of 1991/92 that Australia and India have played a five-match series as part of the Border-Gavaskar Trophy, which will provide both teams with a good opportunity to further cement their place in next year's ICC World Test Championship final.

Australia claimed bragging rights when winning the most recent World Test Championship final at The Oval last year, but India has held the coveted Border-Gavaskar trophy since 2017 on the back of consecutive series triumphs away from home.

Cricket South Africa criticised for failure in meeting transformation targets during T20 WC squad selection

Johannesburg: South African ICC T20 World Cup has failed to meet the transformation targets, resulting in the board admitting that "various initiatives that have been pursued over the years have not yielded the desired results, especially in terms of producing Black African cricketers at the highest levels".

But this will not lead to any sort of interference in selection, as per a board spokesperson, as per ESPNcricinfo.

The 15-player provisional squad for the 2024 edition of the tournament, consists of six players of colour out of which just one, pacer Kagiso Rabada, is a black African. The current targets of CSA needs the national side to field over the course of the season, six players of colour in playing XI out of which two must be black Africans.

CSA will have a chance to improve on this average during the 2024-25 summer season. But even if Reeza Hendricks, Bjorn Fortuin, Keshav Maharaj, Tabraiz Shamsi, Rabada and Ottienel Baartman play all games in the T20 WC, South Africa will be missing the target of two black African players in the tournament. Speaking on the national broadcaster SABC, the former CSA and International Cricket Council (ICC) president criticised the sport for going "backwards" and "betraying the people who asked us to negotiate unity".

Also, the former sports minister of South Africa, Fikile Mbalula, the secretary general of the ruling African National Congress, called it a "reversal of the gains of transformation".

Series sweep helps India women players rise in latest rankings



DUBAI, MAY 14 (UNI) A big boost for a group of women players from India and England following some impressive performances in T20I contests over the past week.

India's best performers have been rewarded for their recent T20I series sweepover Bangladesh by making giant strides on the latest ICC Women's T20I Player Rankings.

India looked in good touch just months out from this year's ICC Women's T20 World Cup as they registered a hard-fought white-

wash of Bangladesh in the five-match series and skipper Harmanpreet Kaur rose three places to 13th on the updated list for T20I batters following her 105 runs for the series.

Teammate Richa Ghosh shot up two places to 23rd following her unbeaten 28 not out in the final match of the series, while Radha Yadav (up seven spots to 23rd) and Titas Sadhu (up 18 runs to 60th) made ground on the updated T20I rankings for bowlers following a string of good efforts in Bangladesh.

A group of players from England have also made a jump up the rankings following the opening game of their series at home against Pakistan, with skipper Heather Knight rising four places to 18th on the list for T20I batters after her innings of 49 in Birmingham.

Experienced keeper Amy Jones was adjudged Player of the Match in England's 53-run triumph for her quickfire 37 and four catches behind the stumps and the 30-year-old improves three places to

26th on the updated T20I rankings for batters.

Sarah Glenn took four wickets in that contest to help dismiss Pakistan for just 110 in reply to England's total of 163/6 and the leg-spinner rose two places to fourth behind teammate Sophie Ecclestone on the updated list for T20I bowlers.

There are four bowlers from England inside the top 10, with Charlotte Dean in fifth place and pacer Lauren Bell jumping four spots to seventh and a new career-high rating following her

spell of 3/22 against Pakistan.

There was also some joy for Sri Lanka's players following their success at the ICC Women's T20 World Cup Qualifier event they won, with inspirational skipper Chamari Athapaththu among the stars from the island nation to be rewarded.

Athapaththu was the leading run-scorer at the tournament and contributed a brilliant century in the final against Scotland as Sri Lanka ensured their place at this year's T20 World Cup and the veteran rose two places to equal seventh on the list for T20I batters as a result.

The left-hander also jumped one place to fifth on the list for T20I all-rounders, given she contributed seven wickets at the tournament.

Teammates Inoshi Fernando (up five spots to 19th) and Udesika Prabodhani (up five places to 30th) also left their mark on the Abu Dhabi event to make ground on the updated T20I rankings for bowlers.

IPL 2024: RCB's "Batting Maestros" achieve unique tournament feat as they chase playoff spot



NEW DELHI : Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) has bounced back really hard in the second half of the Indian Premier League (IPL) by winning five successive matches to keep their playoffs hopes alive and one of the key reasons behind their resurgence is the attacking intent shown by batters.

RCB batting unit, consisting of stars like skipper Faf Du Plessis, Virat Kohli, Will Jacks, Rajat Patidar and Dinesh Karthik have collectively accomplished something that no other team has been able to do this season. All of these five batters are striking at a strike rate over 150-plus and made 200-plus runs, making RCB the only team with so much firepower delivering at such huge strike rates.

Virat is leading the pack in all aspects. In the ongoing season, Virat is the Orange Cap holder for most runs, making 661 runs at an average of 66.10 and a strike rate of 155.16, with a century and five fifties. His best score is 113*.

RCB, who has made a remarkable comeback in the tournament with five successive wins after a horrid win-loss record of 1-6 in the first half, will need Virat to be at his best against Chennai Super Kings (CSK) in their final league game at Bengaluru on May 18 for a chance at playoffs.

After Virat, is the skipper Faf Du Plessis. After looking off-colour in

the first half, Faf has found form and sixes in the second half of the tournament, having made 367 runs in 13 innings at an average of 28.23 and a strike rate of 168.34. He has smashed three fifties this season, with the best score of 64.

Patidar also experienced a second-half surge this season and is unstoppable against spin bowling. The stylish right-handed batter has scored 320 runs in 11 innings this year at an average of 29.09 and a strike rate of 179.77, with five half-centuries. His best score is 55.

Moreover, Patidar's strike rate against spin this season has been 224.69. He has smashed 182 runs in just 81 balls, with five fours and 20 sixes. He averages 91 against spin and has played only 18 dot balls against spinners this season. He has been dismissed only twice by spin this season. He has smashed 20 sixes against spin this season, the most by any batter.

The finisher Dinesh Karthik has also delivered in his final IPL season. In 13 matches and 11 innings, he has scored 301 runs at an average of 43.00 and a strike rate of over 194.19. He has scored two half-centuries, with the best score of 83.

In eight matches for RCB, Jacks scored 230 runs at an average of 32.85 and a strike rate of over 175, with a century and fifty. His best score is 100*.

"It has made big difference": Ravi Shastri backs Impact Player rule

NEW DELHI: Former India coach Ravi Shastri supported the Impact Player rule in the Indian Premier League (IPL), citing how it has led to exciting endings. However, several current players and coaches disagree.

The Impact Player rule has been a hot topic of debate during the IPL 2024 and Shastri said the rule has contributed to many compelling finishes in the ongoing IPL edition.

"The Impact Player [rule] is good. You have to evolve with the times. You know, it happens in other sports as well. It's got tighter finishes. You have to evolve with the times and I think it's a good rule."

You saw the number of tight finishes we had in last year's IPL. So, you know, it has made a big difference," Shastri told Ravichandran Ashwin on his YouTube channel.

The rule allows a particular team to introduce a 12th player to the team from a list in which the five names are given at the time of a toss. A team can bring in a player for the playing XI by replacing any player the team wants, depending on the situation.

"You know when any new rule comes in, there

will be...people will try and justify why that's not right. But in time when you see the scores - 200 and 190 - and then like you mentioned individuals grabbing that opportunity and making the most of it, people will start re-looking at how they think about it," Shastri said.

Meanwhile, Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) secretary Jay Shah refused to commit to the continuation of the Impact Player rule in the Indian Premier League (IPL), saying it would be decided after consulting with captains and coaches.

However, he emphasised the importance of the rule, which permits two additional Indian players to be included in an IPL team's XI. The Impact Player rule has been a hot topic of debate during the IPL 2024 and the BCCI Secretary said that the rule is not "permanent."

"Impact Player is like a test case. We have implemented it slowly. The biggest advantage of it is that two Indian players are getting a chance [in each game], which is the most important. We will consult with the players, franchises, broadcasters [and take a call.
