





UN revises India's 2024 economic growth projection upwards from 6.2 to 6.9%

UNITED NATIONS: The United Nations has revised upwards India's growth projections for 2024, with the country's economy now forecast to expand by close to seven per cent this year, mainly driven by strong public investment and resilient private consumption. The World Economic Situation and Prospects as of mid-2024, released Thursday, said, "India's economy is forecast to expand by 6.9 per cent in 2024 and 6.6 per cent in 2025, mainly driven by strong public investment and resilient private consumption."

PM Modi to address rally in Ambala today

AMBALA: BJP leaders are busy to give a final touch to all arrangements related to PM Modi's rally in city on Saturday. Deputy commissioner Shaleen on Thursday declared a no-fly zone and red zone, besides imposing other restrictions under Section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure in Ambala, ahead of Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit on May 18. This will be Modi's first visit to Haryana during the ongoing elections and he will address a poll rally at police lines.

No interim relief to Hemant Soren

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Friday adjourned hearing on former Jharkhand Chief Minister Hemant Soren's interim bail for election campaigning till May 21. A bench of justices Sanjiv Khanna and Dipankar Datta listed the matter for further hearing on May 21. When the hearing began, the Enforcement Directorate sought time to file a reply to the petition. The court asked the ED to file a reply by the next date of the hearing. Additional Solicitor General SV Raju, for ED, said that Soren was arrested long before the elections. Senior Advocate Kapil Sibal for Soren stressed interim bail and appraised the court that one phase of the Lok Sabha poll is over, the fifth phase is on May 20 and the third phase is scheduled for May 25.

PoK people will demand merger with India: Rajnath

BASTI (UP): Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Friday said that the situation in Pakistan Occupied Kashmir (PoK) is becoming such that people there will demand that they want to merge with India. While addressing a public meeting in support of BJP candidate Shashank Mani Tripathi in Gauri Bazar, the Defence Minister said that India will never give up its claim on PoK but there will be no need to occupy it by force because its people will themselves want to merge after seeing the development in Kashmir. He said there has been a lot of improvement in Jammu and Kashmir as a lot of economic progress is taking place in the region and peace has returned there than before. "All this is the result of the efficient leadership of the country's Prime Minister Narendra Modi," he said.

ED files chargesheet against Kejriwal, names AAP as accused

The Enforcement Directorate on Friday filed a chargesheet against Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in a money-laundering case linked to the alleged excise policy scam, and also named his Aam Aadmi Party as accused.

The prosecution complaint has been filed before a special court here and the accused have been sought to be charged under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), sources said.

The federal agency had arrested 55-year-old Kejriwal, also the national convenor of the Aam Aadmi Party, from his official residence here on March 21. He is currently out of jail on interim bail.

Overall this is the eighth charge sheet filed by the ED in this case in which it has arrested 18 people so far. Last week, a similar complaint was filed by the agency against BRS leader and former Telangana chief minister Chandrashekar Rao's daughter K Kavitha and four others.

The CM has earlier been called the "kingpin and key conspirator" of the Delhi excise "scam" by the ED. It is alleged he acted in collusion with ministers of Delhi government, AAP leaders and other persons.

"We have direct evidence that Kejri-



wal stayed in a seven-star hotel, whose bills were partly paid by an accused in the case," Additional Solicitor General S V Raju told the Supreme Court on Thurs-

Slapped, brutally dragged, kicked in chest: Swati Maliwal in FIR

NEW DELHI: Details of the FIR filed by Delhi Police following the complaint filed by Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Rajya Sabha MP Swati Maliwal against the aide of Delhi Chief minister Arvind Kejriwal has revealed shocking details. Meanwhile a police team, accompanied by forensic analysts, visited the Aam Aadmi Party leader's residence, where the alleged assault took place. Maliwal has alleged that Kejriwal's Personal Secretary Bibhav Kumar "slapped" her "atleast seven to eight times" while she "continued screaming" and "brutally dragged" her while "kicking" her in her "chest, stomach and pelvis area." Maliwal also recorded her statement before the magistrate in the the national capital's Tis Hazari court under Section 164 of the Code of Criminal Procedure. According to the Delhi Police FIR, Maliwal describes the events of May 13 when she had gone to the Civil Lines residence of Chief Minister Kejriwal. "I went inside the camp office and called CM's PS Bibhav Kumar but I could not go in. I then sent a message on his mobile number (through WhatsApp). However, there was no response.

INDI alliance in electoral fray to create instability: PM Modi

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday targeted the opposition INDIA bloc, saying they are in the fray to create instability while the BJP-NDA alliance is dedicated to national interest. Asserting that his government is going to score a hat-trick, Modi said in the new government, he has to take many big decisions for the poor, youth, women and farmers, and for that he has come here to seek the blessings of the people of Barabanki



and Mohanlalganj. Addressing an election rally, Modi said, "June 4 is not far. Today, the whole country and the world knows that the Modi government is going to score a hat-trick". "Today, on one side there is the BJP-NDA alliance dedicated to the national interest and on the other side, the INDI Alliance is in the field to create instability in the country. As the elections progress, these INDI alliance people have started collapsing like a pack of cards," Modi said.

Dhami appeals to devotees not to initiate Yatra without registration

UTTARKASHI : Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami on Friday inspected Char Dham Yatra arrangements at the Dobata and Palighat routes heading towards Uttarkashi and appealed to the devotees not to come without registration. Addressing the media, CM Dhami noted, "This year, the number of tourists coming for the Char Dham Yatra has significantly increased compared to the past few years. Due to this surge, we had to pause the pilgrimage at certain points. However, the yatra has now resumed, and I have personally met with some devotees who are happily completing their journey without any troubles or hardships."

He further emphasised, "We are ensuring that every devotee can complete their worship. We appeal to all devotees not to come without registration, as it creates difficulties for both them and the system."

Dr Vishakha Ashok Bhadane, SP Rudraprayag, added, "Devotees are arriving for the Char Dham Yatra daily. We have noticed that many are coming without registration. All devotees wishing to visit Shri Kedarnath Dham should register themselves. Only then will they be allowed to visit the temple."

SC upholds ICAI rules limiting CA's to undertake limited audits per year

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court Friday upheld the Institute of Chartered Accountants Of India (ICAI) rule which had barred the chartered accountants from accepting more than the "specified number of tax audit assignments".

A Bench comprising Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice Augustine George Masih upheld the rule issued by the ICAI barring Chartered Accountants from accepting more than the "specified number of tax audit assignments" (at present, the upper limit is set at 60) in a financial year.

The Bench held that the rule (para 6.0 of Chapter VI of the Council Guidelines No. 1-CA(7)/02/2008 issued on August 8, 2008, and the subsequent amendments) are not violative of the fundamental right to practise profession guaranteed under Article 19(1)(g) of the Constitution. The Court also held that the clause will be effective from April 1, 2024. It quashed the disciplinary proceedings initiated against the petitioners based on the doctrine of legal uncertainty, the bench said.

Heatwave likely in several states in next 5 days

India Meteorological Department on Friday warned of a likely heatwave in Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana and Uttar Pradesh for the next five days. It also forecasted a heatwave in states like Madhya Pradesh and Bihar for the next four days.

The weather agency also said that mercury had soared as high as 45 degrees Celsius in many places across the country in May.

Speaking to a news agency, Senior IMD scientist Dr Naresh Kumar said, ".

From April till the last few days, continuous western disturbances were influencing Northwest India, due to which parts of Jammu and



Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, and Uttarakhand experienced isolated rain-

fall. Due to this, the temperatures were not very high. In May, the temperature reached 45 degrees Celsius in many places. Even today, the temperature has already reached 45 degrees Celsius in Rajasthan," he said.

"In Punjab and Haryana, the temperature is also near 44 degrees Celsius and the conditions of the heatwave are similar to those in Uttar Pradesh...A heatwave is likely in Rajasthan, Punjab, Haryana, and Uttar Pradesh for the next

5 days and in Madhya Pradesh and Bihar for 4 days, after which there may be mild

thunderstorms, due to which the temperature may drop slightly..." Kumar added. Similarly, for the southern states, he said, "Heavy to very heavy rains are likely in Tamil Nadu, Kerala, and South Karnataka in the next 5 days..." The Met department in its weather advisory has said that heat to severe heat wave conditions are likely over the plains of Northwest India and Bihar during the next 5 days and Heat wave conditions are very likely to commence over East and Central India from May 18. The Met department further said that a wet spell with isolated heavy to very heavy rainfall is very likely to continue over south Peninsular India till May 23.

Ghatkopar tragedy: Prime accused arrested

MUMBAI: The Crime Branch of Mumbai Police arrested the owner of Ego Media, Bhavesh Bhide, the prime accused in the Ghatkopar hoarding collapse case that left 16 dead and scores injured, police said on Friday. Bhide was nabbed on Thursday from Udaipur, Rajasthan.

He has been brought to Mumbai on transfer remand and will be produced in court later Friday, officials said here. Bhide is the owner of the company that put up the giant billboard, whose collapse in a sudden monster dust storm on Monday devastated families of those who couldn't make it alive

from under the debris. Bhinde was picked up from a hotel in the Govardhan Vilas area of Udaipur, where he had been hiding since the collapse of the billboard on May 13 evening. The search and rescue operation at the site of the collapse was called off on Thursday morning.

Mandatory to give information about criminal background

SHIV KUMAR SHARMA CHANDIGARH, : Chief Electoral Officer of Haryana, Anurag Aggarwal said that it is mandatory for the candidates and political parties contesting the Lok Sabha 2024 general elections in the state to publish and broadcast in print and electronic media thrice about the criminal background of their candidate. Is. Apart from this, the concerned political party will also have to post the information about the criminal case of its candidate on the official website of its party. If the political parties do not do so and any complaint is received by the Election Commission, action will be taken against the candidate. He said that the process of filing nomination papers has been completed on May 6.

Political parties must make criminal records of their candidates' public : CEO

AGENCY CHANDIGARH, MAY 17

Haryana Chief Election Officer, Sh. Anurag Agarwal, stated that candidates contesting elections must disclose their criminal records, if any, publicly. For this, candidates must provide complete information about their criminal cases along with an affidavit in Form-26. Apart from it, the relevant political party must also publish information about the candidate's criminal cases on its official website. He said that the process of filing nominations was complete on May 6, and after filing nominations, it is mandatory for candidates and political parties to disclose information about criminal cases at least three times in newspapers and TV channels. The Chief Election Officer announced that special arrangements will be made at polling stations on May 25, considering the summer season.



Basic facilities such as tents, fans, and cold drinking water will be ensured to protect voters from the heatwave. Apart from it, voters will receive information from BLO through the queue management app about the number of people in queue, preventing overcrowding at polling stations and reducing wait times for voters to cast their votes with convenience. He emphasized that voters should not bring mobile phones, electronic gadgets, electronic watches, spy cameras, etc., inside polling stations as this could compromise the confidentiality of voting. Only

the presiding officer is permitted to carry a mobile phone. Voters should only bring identification documents with them. The Chief Election Officer reported that the Election Commission has developed the C-Vigil app for voters to report violations of the Model Code of Conduct. In this digital age, IT-savvy voters immediately report any code violations they come across to the commission through this app. In Haryana, voters have sent 7,512 complaints through the C-Vigil app, of which 6,655 have been verified by Assistant Returning Officers. He further informed that Faridabad reported the highest number of Model Code of Conduct violations, with 2,297 complaints. Rohtak followed with 1,016 complaints. Other districts reported violations as follows: Ambala with 768 complaints, Bhiwani with 131 complaints, Fatehabad with 157 complaints, Gurgaon (619), Hisar (406).

Police busts two fake call centres duping people living in US; 155 held

The Cyber Crime Division of the Punjab Police has busted two fake Call Centres running in Mohali and arrested 155 employees of these centres for making fraudulent calls to people living in US and duping them, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Friday.

The first fake Call centre was located at Plot #F88 in Sector 74 in SAS Nagar, while, the other fake Call Centre established at A-one Tower at Sector 74 of SAS Nagar. Both the call centres seemed to be run by Gujarat based king-pins.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that preliminary investigations have revealed that the fake Call Centres were operating during the night and callers were using three different modus operandi to dupe foreign nationals by making them to purchase gift cards of Target, Apple, Amazon, etc. These gift cards are shared by a team manager and redeemed by the king-



pin/owner, he added. ADGP Cyber Crime V Neeraja, while addressing a press conference, said that intelligence inputs about fake Call Centres operating in Mohali targeting foreigners living abroad was developed by Inspector Gaganpreet Singh and Inspector Daljit Singh along with their team with technical assistance from digital investigation training and analysis centre (DITAC) Lab of Cybercrime. She said that after zeroing in on the locations, Police teams

under the supervision of SP Cybercrime Jashandeep Singh, led by DSP Prabhjot Kaur raided both the fake Call centres on the intervening night of Tuesday and Wednesday, and arrested all the 155 employees who were working as Diallers, Closers, Bankers and Floor Managers.

However, both the king-pins are absconding and police teams are working to nab them, she added. She said that police teams have also recovered 79 desktop computer

units, 204 laptops, mobile phones, and other accessories etc, besides scripts for training to talk to the customers.

ADGP V Neeraja said that out of the total 155 arrested, 18 employees were taken on police remand, while, rest all the arrested persons were sent on Judicial remand.

Further investigation to ascertain the total fraud committed is in progress, she said, while adding that more arrests are expected in the coming days.

Carry documents for cash above Rs. 50,000 while travelling: CEO

With the Model Code of Conduct in force in Punjab for the Lok Sabha elections 2024, Punjab Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Sibin C advised citizens on Friday not to carry cash more than Rs. 50,000 without supporting documents, such as bank withdrawal receipts and receipt books for traders, while travelling in the state.

During a second Facebook live session, 'Talk to your CEO Punjab', Sibin C addressed various queries from voters and urged them to report any violations through the C-vigil app, the 1950 toll-free number and the National Grievance Service Portal (NGSP) of the ECI to ensure smooth and fair elections. Replying to a query on carrying mobiles to polling



booths, the CEO said that the Election Commission of India explicitly prohibits voters from carrying mobile phones and other communication gadgets inside polling booths on election days.

On another question about publicity by political parties, the CEO said that flex boards and hoardings can only be placed at designated locations after seeking permission from the DEOs or the CEO's office till the MCC is in force. The Chief Electoral Of-

ficer further said that no political party or candidate can seek votes based on religion, as this is a clear violation of the MCC. He urged people to report such violations immediately via the C-vigil app, assuring that the CEO's office will take action against violators within 100 minutes. A resident also thanked the CEO for deploying female staff on polling duty near their residences. The CEO said that, following the directions of the ECI, special attention has been given this time to appoint female staff at the nearest polling booths.

In response to a query regarding whether government employees can canvass for any political party or leader, the CEO unequivocally said that no government employee can campaign for political parties.

Known notes

Amid the warp and weft of electioneering for the Lok Sabha elections in the country, there is an oasis of calm in the northeastern states, which witnessed polls in the first three phases. In the long wait for the results, there is a zephyr-induced cadence in states like Meghalaya, where music came to the fore last week for two reasons. On May 8, Shillong witnessed spontaneous musical tributes on the 163rd birth anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore. The Nobel laureate had visited the town thrice and his literary outpourings bear evidence of the impressions he imbibed from the abode of clouds.

Last week, Meghalaya's director of arts and culture, D.D. Shira, and the zonal director of ICCR, N. Mu-nish Singh, were present at a function offering homage to Tagore. Tributes were paid at Brookside, the bungalow where Tagore had stayed in 1919, and a cultural programme was organised in the afternoon, where the Shillong Tagore Choir rendered Ra-bindrasangeet.

The next day, in New Delhi, another icon from the state's music fraternity, the septuagenarian, Silbi Passah, received the Padma Shri in arts from President Droupadi Murmu at the Rashtrapati Bhavan in the presence of the chief minister of Meghalaya, Conrad Sangma. Passah had received the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award for 2021 from the president on February 24 last year. A well-known folk musician, Passah, a resident of Shillong, teaches students traditional music and dance at home. Having returned from Delhi on Saturday, she said the recognition would be instrumental in taking her mission to promote traditional music forward. She had opted to don traditional attire at the investiture ceremony and hopes that the younger generation will learn to value and reignite interest in traditional music.

"I will continue to promote traditional music by collaborating with art and culture. The fact that my efforts are being recognised and appreciated by the government of India gives me hope that it will provide more schemes to help me in promoting our culture," says Passah, who plays the drums and duitara (a traditional Khasi two-stringed instrument). Interestingly, among traditional instruments of the state, the drums are categorised as male and female. Thus, while ka ksing kynthei is the female drum, ka ksing shynrang is the male counterpart. The duitara that Passah plays looks like a guitar covered in animal hide. The gongmina or Jew's harp, is made of a thin sliver of bamboo, while the tangmuri is a wind instrument and the besli a flute.

Kurdish leader jailed by Turkey court for 42 years

A Turkish Court has sentenced over 20 Kurdish politicians, including former presidential candidate Selahattin Demirtas, on bogus charges of crimes against the state and for their role in the 2014 deadly riots that erupted as Islamic State group overran the Syrian town of Kobane, reported Human Rights Watch.

The core accusation centres on four social media postings on October 6, 2014, from the Twitter account of the Peoples' Democratic Party (HDP) alongside the politicians' political speeches.

The indictment takes these tweets as grounds to hold the accused politicians directly responsible for the ensuing protests in 32 cities across Turkey from October 6 to 8, 2014, which resulted in at least 37 deaths, the circumstances of which have never been fully elucidated.

The trial of the politicians has been dubbed the "Kobane trial" in the media because of the reference to the Kobane protests, Human Rights Watch reported.

The protests were rallied by leaders of Turkey's pro-Kurdish People's Democratic Party, or HDP, who were frustrated by what they considered to be Turkish authorities' support for IS militants.

The Turkey court in the Ankara 22nd Assize Court hearing, sentenced Selahattin Demirtas to 42 years in prison, co-chair of the HDP Figen Yuksekdog to 30 years, and Gultan Kisanak, the former mayor of Diyarbakir, to 12 years, reported Human Rights Watch.

Additionally, Ahmet Turk, the serv-



Meanwhile, the court has acquitted 12 other politicians who had been on trial with them, reported Human Rights Watch. The ruling confirms that the Turkish authorities instrumentalized the criminal justice system to secure the politicians' prolonged arbitrary detention on baseless charges and remove them from political life as elected representatives.

their party's social media posts and political speeches.

The indictment charged the politicians with up to 30 offences, including the main crime of attempting to "destroy the unity and integrity of the state," as well as "murder," "damage to property," and "theft" in relation to the deaths and violence during the protests for which it held them liable.

Meanwhile, the ongoing criminal case files against the politicians in different courts charging them with crimes such as "membership of a terrorist organization" and "spreading terrorist propaganda" were then merged with the "Kobane trial" case file, as reported by Human Rights Watch.

The crackdown on the politicians followed the breakdown in 2015 of intensive efforts by the party and the government to bring an end to the decades-long conflict between the armed PKK and the Turkish state.

In May 2016, the government led a controversial move to lift the parliamentarians' parliamentary immunity through a temporary constitutional amendment.

Later in November 2016, leading HDP members of parliament, and on separate dates elected mayors from a sister party, were arrested and jailed on terrorism charges, Human Rights Watch reported.

Demirtas and Yuksekdog, the HDP's former co-chairs, have remained in prison ever since. The party itself is fighting a case seeking its closure before Türkiye's Constitutional Court.

US sanctions Russian entities

The United States has imposed sanctions on five Russian individuals and entities for facilitating the trade of ballistic missiles and other weapon transfers between North Korea and Russia for the latter's use against Ukraine.

The US Treasury Department announced the sanctions on Thursday.

"The United States will continue to take action to hold accountable those who seek to facilitate the shipment of weapons and other material to enable Russia's war," Under Secretary of the US Treasury for Terrorism and Financial Intelligence Brian Nelson said in a statement.

According to the statement released by the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC), at a time when the United States and its allies are increasingly concerned about Russia's deepening ties with North Korea, as well as China.

Russia and North Korea have boosted their military cooperation over the past year, the department said, with Pyongyang providing

ballistic missiles and munitions for Russian forces to attack Ukraine. It also said North Korea is seeking military assistance from Russia in return.

The department identified the individuals as Rafael Anatolyevich Gazaryan and Aleksey Budnev, and the three entities as Trans Kapital Limited Liability Company, Rafort Limited Liability Company and Tekhnologiya.

US State Department spokesman Matthew Miller in a statement said that the sanctions were imposed on the five Russia-based individuals and entities as they violated the UN arms embargo on North Korea.

The sanctions, he said, builds on several sanctions designations over the past year targeting the Russia-North Korea military relationship and highlights US opposition to continued arms transfers and the deepening of defence cooperation between Moscow and Pyongyang.

America also claimed that Russia has relied upon North Korea to wage its war

Study reveals how infertility treatment can double risk of postpartum heart disease

Infertility treatment patients were twice as likely to be hospitalised with heart disease in the year following delivery as spontaneously conceived patients, according to a study conducted by Rutgers Health experts using more than 31 million hospital records.

Infertility patients were 2.16 times more likely to be hospitalised for hypertension, or dangerously elevated blood pressure than normally conceived patients.

"Postpartum checkups are necessary for all patients, but this study indicates they are particularly important for patients who undergo infertility treatment to achieve a conception," said Rei Yamada, an obstetrics and gynecology resident at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School and lead author of the study.

The study authors say their results support stan-



dards of care that now call for an initial postpartum checkup three weeks after delivery, standards that some health systems have yet to adopt. Much of the elevated risk came in the first month after delivery, particularly

for patients who developed dangerously high blood pressure.

"And these results aren't the only ones to indicate that follow-up should occur early," said Cande Ananth, chief

of the Division of Epidemiology and Biostatistics in the Department of Obstetrics, Gynecology, and Reproductive Sciences at Rutgers Robert Wood Johnson Medical School and senior author of

the study.

"We have been involved in a series of studies over the past few years that have found serious risks of heart disease and stroke to various high-risk patient populations within those initial 30 days after delivery - risks that could be mitigated with earlier follow-up care."

The study analyzed the Nationwide Readmissions Database, which contains nationally representative data on about 31 million hospital discharges and readmissions per year. The database contains diagnosis codes, which let researchers find specific populations and identify reasons for readmission. The researchers used data from more than 31 million patients who were discharged following delivery from 2010 to 2018, including 287,813 patients who had undergone any infertility treatment.

Although infertility treatment predicted a sharply elevated risk of heart disease, the study authors said the relative youth of infertility treatment patients kept their overall risk fairly low. Just 550 of every 100,000 women who received infertility treatment and 355 of every 100,000 who conceived naturally were hospitalized with cardiovascular disease in the year after delivery. The cause of the elevated risk of heart disease as-

sociated with infertility treatment remains unclear. The increase in heart disease could stem from the infertility treatments themselves, the underlying medical issues that made patients infertile or some other cause.

"Looking forward, I'd like to see if different types of infertility treatment and, importantly, medications are associated with different risk levels," said Yamada. "Our data gave no information about which patients had undergone which treatment. More detailed information might also provide insight into how infertility treatment impacts cardiovascular outcomes."

BENGALURU: Royal Challengers Bengaluru's fairytale resurgent run will be up against the might of five-time champions Chennai Super Kings and the weather gods when the two sides clash in an epic do-or-die match to decide the fourth and final team for the IPL play-offs, here on Saturday.

Thursday's washout in Hyderabad meant that Sunrisers Hyderabad joined Kolkata Knight Riders and Rajasthan Royals as the three confirmed teams for the play-offs and the race is now for only one spot with two teams in fray -- CSK and RCB.

Boasting of a better net run-rate and more points, defending champions CSK (13 points, NRR 0.528) start favourites at a venue where they have lost to the home side only once in eight matches. RCB has 12 points and a net run-rate of 0.387.

However, what has heightened the drama surrounding the game is the forecast of rain. A washout will take CSK through to the playoffs, while RCB will need to win by at least 18 runs or chase the target with about 11 balls to spare.



The odds are therefore stacked against the home side, which is the most in-form unit in the tournament's final stretch.

They've staged a spectacular comeback, securing five straight wins after enduring a six-match losing streak.

Orange Cap holder Kohli has been in phenomenal form with three fifties in last five innings as he is poised to ignite the field with yet another stellar show.

They will hope that skipper Faf du Plessis is back among runs, having capped a single digit scores in his last two outings.

In the middle order, Rajat Patidar and Cameron Green

have both showcased compelling form.

Mahipal Lomror and Dinesh Karthik would be looking to make the most out of the Chinnaswamy track, which is typically a good batting wicket.

As for RCB's bowling, Yash Dayal has been their star, bagging the most wickets this season.

Lockie Ferguson, Mohammed Siraj, Green, and Swapnil Singh face a formidable task ahead.

Will Jacks, who has impressed with the bat, is a part-time spin bowling option. But it will be interesting to see if he is utilised on this track.

For CSK, Ruturaj Gaikwad has been the team's top run-scorer this season and is expected to give them a fine start.

Fellow opener Rachin Ravindra is also back among runs and he along with Daryl Mitchell will be expected to lift the top order.

They will hope that Shivam Dube gets back into his rhythm. He has failed to score in his last four outings.

In bowling, pacer Simarjeet Singh and Tushar Deshpande have done a neat job after they missed their premier trio of Mustafizur Rahman, Matheesha Pathirana and Deepak Chahar.

The inspiring presence of Mahendra Singh Dhoni will continue to be a factor for the side but it remains to be seen how big a role he is able to play given some nagging injury concerns.

BCCI approaches Gambhir to replace Rahul Dravid as India's head coach: Report

NEW DELHI : The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) approached former cricketer Gautam Gambhir to replace Rahul Dravid as India's head coach, according to a report from ESPNcricinfo.

The report said Gambhir is BCCI's top pick to become India's next head coach as Dravid's tenure comes to an end after the T20 World Cup 2024. ESPNcricinfo also learned that BCCI will talk to Gambhir after the end of the Indian Premier League (IPL) 2024 since the former left-handed batter is currently serving as the mentor of the Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR). Gambhir was also a part of Men in Blue's victory in the T20 World Cup and ODI World Cup triumph in 2011.

After India could not lift the ICC Cricket World Cup at home last year in November after reaching the finals, the current head coach Rahul Dravid was given an extension till June, which also marks the month when the ICC T20 World Cup in West Indies

and USA will take place from June 1 to 29.

Earlier on Monday, BCCI invited applications for the position of men's national team head coach, with the tenure starting from July 1 this year and concluding on December 31, 2027, which will be the year when the next 50-over Cricket World Cup will take place.

The deadline for application will be till May 27, 6 PM.

The selection process will include a thorough review of applications, followed by personal interviews and assessments of shortlisted candidates.

Meanwhile, under Gambhir's mentorship, KKR displayed a stupendous performance in IPL 2024. They won 9 of 13 matches, and stand at the top of the IPL 2024 standings with 19 points and have a net run rate of +1.428. The Kolkata-based franchise only lost three matches in the 17th season which came against Chennai Super Kings (CSK), Rajasthan Royals (RR), and Punjab Kings (PBKS).

The number of service voters in Haryana is more than 1.11 lakh - Chief Electoral Officer

Chief Electoral Officer, Haryana, Sh Anurag Agarwal said that the total number of service voters in the state is 1,11,058. He said that as the counting of postal ballots received from service voters is to be done before the EVM, availability of the required number of scanners should be ensured at the counting centres in advance and added that a separate ARO should be appointed for this work.

He said that postal ballots are an important document in counting of votes. Under this, voters and other employees de-

played on service voter counting duty and absentee voters are counted. In view of this, a separate nodal officer should be appointed, he said.

The Chief Electoral Officer said that those who are eligible to enrol as service voters as defined under Section 20 (8) of the Representation of the People Act 1950 include personnel of Indian Army, Navy and Air Force and in the Central Para Military Forces-employees of General Reserve Engineer Force, Border Road Organization, Border Security Force, ITBP, Assam Rifles, NSG, CRPF, CISF and SSB. Apart from this, the employees of State Armed Forces and Police Forces who are outside their state

and Central Government employees who are outside the country on Indian Mission. The number of polling stations including temporary polling stations in the state is 20,031.

Sh Agarwal said that the number of polling stations including temporary polling stations at 10,523 places in the state is 20,031. He directed that adequate arrangement of chairs and shed for sun protection be made in the waiting area at polling stations for divyans and elderly voters. Apart from this, he directed to apprise the people about the ambulance parking location and also sent a report regarding the area and villages to be covered by the ambulance.



Randomization of EVM takes place : DEO

SANGRUR: According to the instructions of the Election Commission, under the supervision of District Election Officer (DEO), Jitendra Jorwal, the first supplementary randomisation of the machines used in the Lok Sabha Elections-2024 was done through the software of the Election Commission at the district administrative complex here today. On the occasion, the DEO said that there are 1006 polling stations in the district and therefore, allocation of voting machines has been made to the Assistant Returning Officers (ARO) of all the assembly segments through randomisation. DEO further said that since the number of candidates for the Lok Sabha elections is 23, this randomization has been done because a voting machine has the facility of 15 candidates and one NOTA button. Through today's randomisation, each constituency has been allotted 20 percent more ballot units (BUs) than the number of polling booths, so that they have a reserve quota available in case of failure of the machine. Besides others, Additional Deputy Commissioner (G) Akash Bansal; Additional Deputy Commissioner (D) Varjit Walia; Assistant Commissioner (UT), Dr. Aditya; Tehsildar Election, Paramjit Kaur and representatives of political parties were present on the occasion.
