Six officials suspended post-Jammu accident

JAMMU: A day after 22 people were killed and 65 injured, the Jammu and Kashmir Transport Department on Friday suspended six officials from UP towards Shiv Khori Shrine in Reasi district fell into a deep gorge near Tungi Morh in the Chowki Chora area of Akhnoor.

As per the order issued by the Transport Department, six officials deployed in Lakhampur including a motor vehicle inspector and a Junior Assistant at the check post have been suspended and attached to the office of the Transport Commissioner till a pending inquiry into dereliction of duty by allowing overcrowded bus into the Union Territory.

Srinagar-bound Vistara flight gets hoax bomb threat call

SRINAGAR: A Vistara flight bound for Srinagar, carrying 177 passengers and one infant, received a bomb threat on Friday, prompting swift action by the airline and security forces. Flight no-UK-611, which departed from Delhi, landed safely at Srinagar Airport at approximately 12:10 AM. In this regard, the Vistara spokesperson, while confirming the incident, said that concerned authorities were immediately informed as per the established protocol. "Following the protocol, we immediately informed the relevant authorities, and the aircraft was taken to the isolation bay after safely landing at the Srinagar International Airport, where all customers were disembarked. We fully cooperated with the concerned authorities to clear the mandatory security checks.

10 poll personnel among 14 dead in Bihar due to heatstroke

PATNA: Fourteen people, including 10 polling personnel, have died due to heatstroke in Bihar in the last 24 hours, officials said on Friday afternoon. In a statement issued by the Disaster Management Department, most of the fatalities were reported from Bhojpur, where five officials on election duty died of heatstroke. Three election officials died in Rohtas, and one each died in Kaimur and Aurangabad districts, it said.

Key infra sectors growth rises to 6.2 pc in April

NEW DELHI: Eight key infrastructure sectors' growth rose to 6.2 per cent in April on healthy expansion in the production of natural gas, refinery products and electricity, according to official data released on Friday. The production of eight sectors grew by 6 per cent in March. The growth of these core sectors - coal, crude oil, natural gas, refinery products, fertiliser, steel, cement and electricity - was 4.6 per cent.

Stage set for polling on 57 seats in final phase Fate of PM Modi, Harsimrat, Kangana to be sealed today

After high-voltage campaigning just short of two months, all eyes are now on the final phase of Lok Sabha elections on Saturday when 57 seats, including that of Varanasi, from where PM Narendra Modi is seeking a re-election to a third term, go to vote. All seats of Himachal Pradesh and Punjab will be voting on June 1, including that of Union Territory of Chandigarh. Voting will also be held in eight seats in Bihar, Jharkhand (3), Odisha (6), Uttar Pradesh (13), and West Bengal (9).

Of these 57, BJP won 25 in 2019, while the Congress bagged eight and TMC nine.

The longest election process of the country after the 1951-52 polls - spanning 75-day of campaigning for the seven-phased polls - ended Thursday with the ruling BJP-led NDA seeking a record third term under Modi and the Opposition INDIA bloc a reversal of fortune after a decade led by Congress.

According to the Election Commission, a total of 904 candidates will be in the fray, including 328 from Punjab, 144 from Uttar Pradesh, 134 from Bihar, 66 from Odisha, 52 from Jharkhand, 37 from Himachal Pradesh, and four from Chandigarh.

Prime Minister Modi's constituency - Varanasi will also vote in the final phase bringing the curtains down on a seven-phase election that began April 19.



Modi won from the Varanasi seat in 2014 and 2019, and is now eyeing his third

term. Ajay Rai previously a BJP man, but joined Congress in 2012 is his opponent.

Besides this, other prominent faces in the fray are actor Kangana Ranaut from Mandi, Union Minister Anurag Thakur from Hamirpur as he seeks his fifth term.

SAD's Harsimrat Kaur Badal is fielded from Punjab's Bhatinda Lok Sabha constituency as it witnesses a four-way battle with Congress candidate Jeet Mohinder Singh Sidhu, AAP's Gurmeet Singh Khudian and BJP's Parampal Kaur Sidhu.

Actor Ravi Kishan is also contesting from Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh, while RJD Lalu Prasad Yadav's eldest daughter Misa Bharti is contesting from Bihar's Patliputra Lok Sabha constituency in this phase.

Odisha goes to polls to elect 6 LS & 42 Assembly candidates

BHUBANESWAR: The fate of 460 candidates will be sealed as Odisha goes to the polls in the final phase on Saturday to elect six Lok Sabha members and 42 legislators. The electoral fortunes of 15 Lok Sabha members and 105 MLAs have already been sealed in the EVMS during the polling in the last three phases held in the state on May 13, 20, and 25. A total of 99,55,556 voters from eight districts, mostly from Coastal Odisha, including 48,69,331 females, will exercise their franchise in 10,882 polling booths. Twenty percent of these booths are declared critical, and another 20 percent are model booths, all amidst tight security cover, with the deployment of 126 companies of Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF).

PM Modi performs 'Surya Arghya' at Vivekananda Rock Memorial

Prime Minister Narendra Modi, as part of his meditation exercise, on Friday performed 'Surya Arghya' during sunrise at the Vivekananda Rock Memorial here.

Modi carried out 'Surya Arghya,' a ritual associated with spiritual practice involving salutations to the Almighty, manifested in the form of sun and offered prayers with folded hands.

A short video clip, 'Sunrise, Surya Arghya, Spirituality,' posted by the BJP on its 'X' handle showed the PM pouring little water from a traditional, beaker-like small vessel into the sea as

an offering (Arghya) and prayed using his prayer beads (Japa mala).

The BJP also posted photographs of the Prime Minister, clad in saffron shirt, shawl and dhoti, engrossed in meditation at the Dhyana Mandapam, where incense sticks, in front of him, could be spotted burning slowly. Modi also walked around the mandapam with his japa mala in his hands. Photographs of Modi in meditating posture have been apparently clicked during different times and similar is the case of video clips.

Kanyakumari is famous for its sunrise and sunset and the memorial is located on a tiny islet near the shoreline.

ED arrests Uttarakhand resident in major crypto-drug trafficking case

The Enforcement Directorate has arrested one Uttarakhand resident on charges of operating an international drug trafficking group to sell drugs in the US, the UK, and other European countries and receiving at least 8,088 Bitcoins as proceeds of crime, the agency said on Friday.

ED's Dehradun unit arrested Banmeet Singh, a resident of Haldwani in Uttarakhand, under the provisions of the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002, on May 29.

Banmeet was produced before a special court in Dehradun, which



granted ED custody of the accused for seven days considering the socio-economic ramifications of the proceeds of drug money and the involvement of large-scale cryptocurrency.

The ED's investigation was prompted by a Mutual Legal Assistance (MLA) request from US authorities, invoking a unique provision under Section 2(ra) of PMLA, 2002, indicating cross-border offences. The scheduled offences correspond to violations under the NDPS Act.

The brothers, namely Banmeet Singh and Parvinder Singh, along with others, were operating an international drug trafficking group named the Singh DTO (Drug Trafficking Organization), said the ED in a statement.

"They used vendor marketing sites on the dark web, numerous free advertisements on clear web websites,

and a network of narcotics and controlled-substance distributors and distribution cells to sell drugs in USA, UK, and other European countries," stated the federal agency.

The Singh Organisation received the drug trafficking proceeds through sales on dark web markets, then laundered those proceeds through cryptocurrency transactions, it further said. Both brothers, the ED said, used monikers "Liston" on a variety of dark web markets, including Silk Road 1, Alpha Bay, and Hansa. As per the information, ED mentioned, the Singh brothers received at least 8,088 Bitcoins associated with the 'Liston' monikers, which is nothing.

Woman loses Rs 28 lakh to get gold at discounted price

THANE, MAHARASHTRA, MAY 31

The Navi Mumbai police have arrested two persons on the charge of dacoity after a woman was robbed of nearly 28 lakh on the promising of gold at "cheap and discounted" rate, an official said today.

In her complaint, the 36-year-old Nerul resident said one of the arrested persons had got in touch with her claiming he could get her half a kilo of gold for 27.81 lakh, much lesser than the market price.

The man took the complainant to San-

pada station in a car for the deal on May 18 but some people arrived there, threatened the woman and snatched her bag containing the money.

The man and another person who had accompanied them in the car fled the scene, she said.

Working on various leads, the police arrested Thane residents Rakesh Shivaji Shingte (39), who was in touch with the woman, and Roopesh Subash Sapkal (42). Efforts are on to nab the others, he added.

They will torture me more, but I will not bow down: Kejriwal

Ahead of his surrender before Tihar jail authorities, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Convener and Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Friday took a jibe at BJP stating these people would torture him more than before this time, but he would not bow down.

In a video message, Kejriwal said, "I will surrender the day after tomorrow, I will leave my house at around 3:00 PM to surrender. It is possible that this time they will torture me more, but I will not bow down."

"They tried to break me in many ways, tried to bow

me down, tried to silence me. But they did not succeed," Kejriwal alleged.

"In jail, they stopped my insulin injections for many days, my sugar reached 300, 325 (mg/dL). If the sugar remains so high for so many days, then the kidney and liver get damaged. I don't know what these people wanted, why did they do this," Kejriwal added. "When I went to jail, my weight was 70 kg. Today it is 64 kg. Even after being released from jail, my weight is not increasing. Doctors are saying that this can also be a sign of some major disease in the body. Many tests need to be done, ketone level in my urine has also increased a lot," he said.

Candidates contesting the Lok Sabha General Elections-2024 and Karnal Assembly by-elections in Haryana will have to submit the details of their election expenditure to the office of the District Election Officer within one month after the results are declared on June 4, 2024. According to the Election Commission of India, candidates who do not submit the details of election expenditure within the stipulated time period may be declared ineligible to contest elections in the future.

Haryana Chief Electoral Officer Mr. Anurag Agarwal informed that this time the maximum limit of election expenditure for the Lok Sabha general elections was fixed at Rs 95 lakh



per candidate, whereas for the assembly elections, this limit was Rs 40 lakh. He stated that as per the rules, the calculation of election expenditure starts as soon as the candidate files the nomination form. For this purpose, the candidate has to keep a separate account of their dai-

ly election expenditure in a diary and also has to open a separate bank account. The calculation of expenditure continues until the election process is completed. During this period, no candidate can spend more money than the prescribed limit.

Mr. Agarwal emphasized that as soon as the results of the Lok Sabha general elections and Karnal Assembly by-elections are declared on June 4, 2024, it is mandatory for the candidates to submit details of their election expenses within one month from that date.

Hry govt directs IAS and HCS Officers to Verify Family Details for Comprehensive Cashless Health Facility (CCHF) Cards

The Haryana Government has instructed all IAS and HCS officers to fill their family details on Intra Haryana Portal at the earliest for Comprehensive Cashless Health Facility Scheme (CCHF) card generation.

A letter addressed by the Chief Secretary to the officers stated that the Comprehensive Cashless Health Facility was launched by the Chief Minister on January 1, 2024 to extend health benefits to State Government employees, dependents of only Fisheries and Horticulture employees, all IAS, IPS and IFOs officers

and their dependents. The letter further stated that for generation of CCHF card, it is a mandatory requirement that State Government employees need to have PPP ID and Aadhaar card generated. Besides, the employees should have already updated their family details (dependents) on Intra Haryana portal, including self-details which should further have been approved by their respective Checker on HRMS portal. Also, the PPP ID of employees and dependents should be duly mapped on the Intra Haryana Portal by the employees himself/herself and not by anyone else.

In the letter, all IAS/HCS officers have been asked to fill his or her family details on Intra Haryana Portal carefully, after which, checker of office of Chief Secretary will verify or approve only the family details on HRMS portal as filled by the concerned officers on their Intra Haryana Portal.

The concerned officer will be fully responsible for filling their family details on Intra Haryana Portal. After verification/approval of family details by the checker, the officers can map their family details on Intra Haryana Portal with PPP at their own level, the letter further stated.

Apart from active smoking which is called first hand smoke

Third hand smoke means damage to health due to the smoke particles that have come on our wall or surface. While giving information to the children, he appealed to stay away from tobacco. LS Polls: 70000 security personnel deployed in state

CHANDIGARH, MAY 31

Around 70,000 security personnel, including central forces, have been deployed in the wake of polling in 13 Lok Sabha seats on June 1, Punjab Chief Electoral Officer Sibin C said here on Friday.

Besides, 1.20 lakh polling staff have been deployed for the voting in the state, he said. Polling for 13 Lok Sabha seats in Punjab will take place from 7 am till 6 pm on Saturday.

Addressing the media here, the Punjab CEO said the total number of voters in Punjab is 2,14,61,739 comprising 1,12,86,726 male voters and 1,01,74,240 female voters and 773 transgender voters.

In comparison to the total number of voters during the 2019 Lok Sabha polls in Punjab, there was an increase of around seven lakh in number of voters, said the Punjab CEO, accompanied by nodal officer and IPS officer M F Farooqui. The CEO said 5,38,715 voters belong to the 18-19 age group, who are eligible for casting their votes for the first time. He further said that a target of achieving more than 70 per cent voter turnout has been fixed for the June 1 elections. Punjab had seen a voter



turnout of 65.96 per cent during the 2019 Lok Sabha polls, which was below the national average. On the deployment of security personnel in view of polling, he said around 70,000 security personnel comprising state police force, central armed police force and home guards have been deployed. The Punjab CEO said a total of 24,451 polling stations have been set up and out of which 5,694 have been identified as critical.

"There will be 100 per cent webcasting of polling stations," he said, adding that around 6,600 micro observers will also be deployed. There will be 1,076 model polling stations in the state, besides 115 green, 165 pink, 99 youth

managed and 101 PwDs (persons with disabilities) managed polling stations, he said. In the wake of the heatwave, the Punjab CEO said drinking water, shades, 'chabeel' (sweetened water), and medical kits have been arranged at polling stations.

There will be minimum assured facilities, including electricity, furniture, ramp and toilets, at the polling station, he said. Replying to a question on the facility of home voting for people above 85 years and PwDs, he said that 12,843 such voters have already cast their votes by availing this facility. He said there were around 1.90 lakh 85-plus voters and 1.50 lakh PwD voters in the state.

Over 2.14 crore voters to cast votes at 24,451 polling stations

The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Punjab, Sibin C, announced that the CEO office is fully prepared to ensure free, fair, and transparent elections for the Lok Sabha Elections 2024 in the state. He emphasized that comprehensive arrangements have been made to provide all necessary facilities to voters and maintain a secure and peaceful voting environment in the state.

Addressing a Press Conference ahead of the elections, Sibin C informed that there are a total of 2,14,61,741 voters in the state. These include 1,12,86,727 males, 1,01,74,241 females, 773 transgenders, 1,58,718 PwD (Persons with Disabilities) voters, and 1614 NRI (Non-Resident Indian) voters. The number of first-time voters in the state is 5,38,715, while the number of voters aged 85 and above is 1,89,855. He added that 24,451 polling stations (PS) have been established in the state, out of which 5694 PS have been declared critical. There are 1076 Model PS, 165 Pink



Booths managed exclusively by women, 115 Green PS, 99 Youth Managed PS, and 101 PS managed by Divyans. All polling stations will be monitored by CCTV cameras, and there will be 100% live webcasting to allow real-time monitoring by election officials and observers. The counting of votes would take place at 117 Counting centres, at 24 Locations, he added.

Regarding Home Voting, Sibin C stated that the consent for home voting was received from 9239 85+ age voters, and 4530 PwD voters, both totalling 13,769. Out of these

12,843 voters casted their vote till 30 May, including 8640 85+ voters and 4203 PwD voters.

Divulging the details about personnel involved, Sibin C stated that the total number of staff engaged in the elections in the state is 2,60,000. This includes 1,20,114 polling staff, 70,724 security personnel (state police and central armed paramilitary forces), 50,000 supporting staff, and 25,150 persons working in the CEO (Chief Electoral Officer) and DEO (District Election Officer) offices. The CEO emphasized that polling staff have been trained to manage emer-

gencies effectively. ASHA workers will be deputed at polling stations to handle emergency medical situations. Polling stations will be equipped with first aid kits, oral rehydration solution (ORS), sugar candies, medicines, ointments, and bandages. Additionally, to combat the heat wave, 'Chabeel' facility is also being provided at the polling stations. He added that, the 85+ and PwD Voters, who did not opt for Home Voting can get the 'Pick and Drop Facility' along with wheelchairs, by registering on the Saksham application.

CEO Sibin C detailed that 24 Central and State enforcement agencies along with Flying Squads and Static Surveillance Teams are actively conducting checks to seize cash, liquor, and other items intended for voter inducement. Since the enforcement of the Model Code of Conduct until May 30, seizures worth 801.47 crore have been made in the state including Rs 26.89 crore in cash, liquor worth Rs 26.75 crore, narcotics valued at Rs 716.78 crore, freebies worth Rs 7.17 crore.

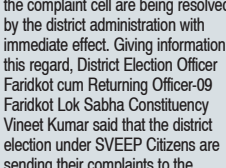
Farewell party of BSC Medical Lab Science graduates organised at Bela college

All arrangements have been completed to conduct the entire process of the Lok Sabha elections (LSE) on June 1 in a peaceful, transparent and secure environment.

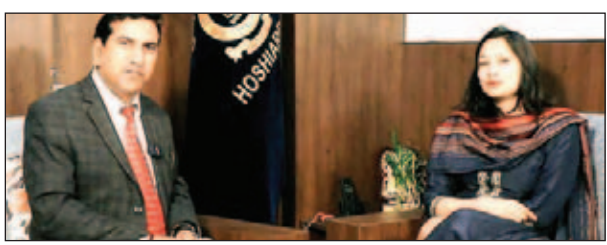

Pradesh have been placed in the critical category for the June 1 elections, officials said on Thursday.

The highest number of critical polling stations numbering 118 are in district Kangra followed by 58 in Sirmour while there are 51 such critical polling stations in Una, the officials said.

Apart from this 45 critical polling stations have been identified in Solan and 20 such polling stations are in Chamba. In Hamirpur there are 17 while Bilaspur, Mandi and Shimla have 16 critical polling booths each.

In Kinnaur seven such booths have been identified as critical while Kullu has three and Lahaul-Spiti has only two such polling stations.

223.49 Crore budget approved for Nagrota Suriyan Canal Project

The ambitious Sukhaahar Canal project in the Nagrota Suriyan belt of the Jawali constituency is set to commence soon. A team from the Central Water Commission will provide the Investment Clearance Certificate in June, allowing the project to begin immediately afterward. A budget of 223.49 crores has already been approved for this initiative.

The Sukhaahar Canal will benefit 7804 farmers across 22 panchayats in areas including Nagrota Suriyan, Shahpur, Pragad, Harchakiyan, and Dehra. Originally, the former Congress government prepared a 153.06 crore proposal for irrigation in 2015 and sent it to the Central Water Commission for approval. However, the project

remained stagnant for over nine years. The 10.680-kilometer-long canal will facilitate the construction of lift irrigation schemes in areas like Spell, Harsar, Baldoa, Ghadrot, Bantungli, and Harchakiyan, ensuring water reaches the farmers' fields. This development is expected to bring greenery and improve irrigation for the farmers.

Executive Engineer Ajay Sharma stated that a budget of 223.49 crores has been approved for the construction of the Sukhaahar Canal. He mentioned that the Central Water Commission's team will inspect the site in June, and work will commence once the Investment Clearance Certificate is obtained. This project will significantly benefit farmers by providing much-needed irrigation to their fields, bringing about agricultural prosperity.

Power cuts disrupt industrial production in Baddi

BADDI: Industrialists in Baddi Barotiwala Nalagarh (BBN) are facing unprecedented power cuts, with 25 interruptions in a single day severely impacting production. For the first time in 20 years, these power cuts are causing production slowdowns and damaging materials worth millions due to frequent on-off cycles of machinery. Industrialists warn that if the electricity board cannot provide uninterrupted power, they might be forced to shut down operations. Currently, the temperature in the industrial area is around 45 degrees Celsius, exacerbating the power shortage. The electricity board is facing a shortfall of approximately 16 MVA, resulting in frequent power trips.

Baddi, a major pharmaceutical hub supplying the entire country, is particularly affected. During these months, the demand for medicines is high, putting pressure on industries to increase production capacity. However, facing up to 25 power cuts a day, pharmaceutical companies struggle to maintain smooth production processes. Large machinery makes it impossible to run the entire operation on generators, emphasizing the need for a stable power supply. Sanjay Sharma, spokesperson for the Himachal Drug Manufacturers Association, highlighted the growing demand for cardboard, especially with the apple season approaching. Cardboard production is under pressure, but frequent power cuts disrupt the heating machines, causing production lines to spoil. The losses are being borne by the industry owners, despite the issue lying with the electricity board's reliability.

and Shashi Kant educated people about the harmful effects of tobacco and emphasized that everyone has the right to a healthy life. They highlighted that men are most commonly affected by oral cancer, with 90% of cases resulting from chewing tobacco products. Initially, symptoms like sores or small ulcers in the mouth are often ignored, leading to late-stage diagnoses for 70-80% of patients. The consumption of cigarettes, alcohol, and gutkha significantly increases the risk of developing this cancer. Tobacco also weakens the lungs, further increasing the risk to patients' lives. Project Officer Baljinder Singh pointed out that substance abuse not only ruins individuals' lives but also plunges their families into darkness.

Voting day: Paid leave mandatory for employees, non-compliance will lead to action

BADDI: On Saturday, June 1, Himachal Pradesh will observe voting for the Lok Sabha elections and Assembly by-elections. To ensure maximum voter participation, the Election Commission of India has mandated paid leave for employees on the day of the election. Voting will take place in the final phase for four Lok Sabha and six Assembly by-elections in Himachal Pradesh. The Election Commission has issued necessary guidelines to ensure maximum voter turnout.

According to these directives, all offices, boards, corporations, educational institutions, and industrial establishments in the state must grant their employees paid leave on June 1, the day of voting. Labor Officer Surendra Bisht of Baddi emphasized that the Factory Inspectorate has highlighted the provision under Section 135-B of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, which mandates paid leave for employees on the day of voting. He stressed that every employee, particularly daily wage workers or laborers in the unorganized sector, should be granted paid leave on voting day. He reiterated that any individual entitled to vote in the Lok Sabha or Assembly elections and employed in any business, trade, industrial undertaking, or other establishment must be given paid leave on the voting day. No deductions or reductions should be made in their wages due to this leave.

Steel-cutting ceremony for first next-generation Offshore Patrol Vessel of ICG held at Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited, Mumbai

VERMA GURDASPUR: The steel-cutting ceremony for the first Next-Generation Offshore Patrol Vessel (NGOPV) took place at the Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Limited (MDL) in Mumbai in the presence of Indian Coast Guard (ICG) officials on May 31, 2024. The Ministry of Defence had, in December 2023, signed a contract with MDL for the procurement of six NGOPVs for the ICG at a total cost of Rs 1,614.89 crore. The project aims to bolster the capabilities in coastal and offshore patrol, safeguard maritime zones, and enhance operational efficiency. The NGOPVs are equipped with state-of-the-art machinery and equipment. The vessel is powered by two diesel engines which are capable of achieving a maximum continuous speed of 23 knots and cover a distance of up to 5,000 nautical miles. Furthermore, they boast integral twin-engine helicopter facilities and staging for heavy helicopters, enabling swift and effective aerial surveillance and response capabilities.

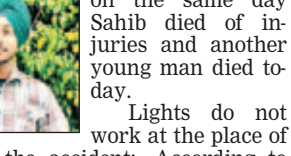

In 2009, Sushant Rajan of BJP won this seat with 48.69 per cent vote share, in 2014, Shanta Kumar (BJP) won the seat with 57.69 per cent vote share and in 2019 Kishan Kapoor of BJP won this seat with 72.2 per cent vote share. It is pertinent to note that since 2009 the BJP has been increasing its vote bank compared to the Congress. The constituency has a population of over 15 lakh and comprises 17 assembly segments. It has also maximum number of ex-servicemen and wanted a strong man at the top who could deliver words into actions.

Kejriwal appeals for Centre's help on Water crisis, citizens face brunt of water scarcity

As Delhi battles a severe water crisis amid rising temperatures in the National Capitol, Delhi CM Arvind Kejriwal on Friday made an appeal to the centre and the BJP to urge the governments of Uttar Pradesh and Haryana to help Delhi meet its water demand.

If the BJP talks to its governments in Haryana and UP and gets some water for Delhi for a month, then the people of Delhi will greatly appreciate this step of the BJP. Such scorching heat is

not in anyone's control. But if we all work together, can we provide relief to the people from this?" he added.

Meanwhile, Delhi's residents have complained of acute water shortage, even as the government set up a "war room" and promised "Har Ghar Jal". Several areas in Delhi including Chanakyapuri's

Despite submitting applications to the government regarding water shortage, the residents complain that their pleas go unnoticed. Residents of Geeta Colony in East Delhi have expressed their dissatisfaction with the insufficient water supply provided by the government.

Rudal, a resident of the Geeta colony complained, "It has become a very big problem, only one tanker comes and the colony is so big. We have written two applications to the government but who listens to the poor? We have to buy the water to drink it. One bottle costs us 20 rupees".

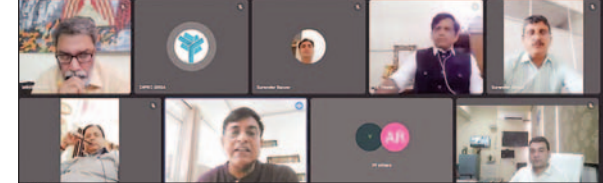
Naresh Garg becomes additional session judge

Unlearn the lessons

As Indians, we must be deeply disturbed by Mr Narendra Modi's (the Prime Minister!) language and low level of political discourse. Social media has been as bad or worse. If we feel this is par for the course, then there is something very rotten within us. I posted this note a few days ago on my social media handles and, as expected, there was abuse, whataboutery and selective reading. Kee-p-ing all that aside, what was evident was that those who took offence either have no problem with Modi's words or are willing to excuse all these excesses because of their blind belief in him. This only makes his unrefined comments much more problematic. A friend who saw the comments under my post wrote to me asking if there was any sanity left. What my friend was referring to is actually a lack of emotional coherence and independence. And this leads to a loss of humanity. The impunity with which Modi attacks minorities in his speeches is deeply disturbing. Not only is this unbecoming of a person who holds the highest elected office in our nation but it is also irresponsible. Each time Modi makes outlandish and provocative comments about Muslims, it is not only a Hindu consolidation strategy. He reconfirms biases that are closely held by hardcore Hindutva supporters and Islamophobes. It plays up their already simmering, unreasonable anger and even provides justification for those who want to target Muslims. It is evident from Modi's tone, the way in which he delivers those lines, and the audience's response that this cannot be written off as just high-decibel electioneering. They are also not one-time mistakes. Right through these elections, Modi has repeatedly made such statements. He has curated his own personality as a strong, undefeatable, nearly-mythical Hindu saviour. Every word he utters is influential; therefore, it is disappointing that he does not seem to care about the larger repercussions of his utterances. This is not just about one election; it is about what such statements coming from the top do to our already teetering social fabric. Modi cannot ignore the fact that there are people who hold on to every word that he utters as the word of god! As much as we find his recent claim that his existence was divinely ordained ridiculous, there are many who actually believe it. I have heard people speak of the 'tejas' on his face. He is definitely aware of his impact on his followers. Yet, he ignores the dangers involved in speaking with such insensitivity and callousness.

Donald Trump convicted: Can he still run for president?

Following a New York jury's verdict, former President Donald Trump stands convicted on all 34 felony charges of falsifying business records, raising pertinent questions about his future political endeavours and voting rights, CNN reported. As the verdict reverberates across political circles, one of the most pressing inquiries emerges: Can a convicted felon run for president? The answer, unequivocally, is yes. The US Constitution outlines three prerequisites for presidential candidates: natural-born citizenship, a minimum age of 35, and at least 14 years of US residency - criteria that Trump satisfies. Although the 14th Amendment imposes restrictions on individuals engaged in insurrection, a special law invocation by Congress remains necessary, an unlikely scenario in the current political landscape, according to the CNN report. Judge Juan Merchan has slated Trump's sentencing for July 11, strategically coinciding with the Republican National Convention's commencement in Milwaukee, just four days later. Speculation looms over the possibility of a prison sentence for Trump, despite the likelihood of a non-incarceration outcome for most Class E felony convictions in New York, according to CNN senior legal analyst Elie Honig. Notably, Trump's status as a former president entitles him to lifetime Secret Service protection, ensuring security regardless of his legal predicament. However, the prospect of a presidential campaign from a prison cell is not unprecedented. Eugene Debs, the socialist leader, mounted a presidential bid from a federal prison in Atlanta during his 10-year sentence for sedition in 1920. While Trump's eligibility to run for president remains intact, questions regarding his voting rights post-conviction linger. State regulations dictate felons' voting privileges, with Vermont and Maine permitting voting from prison. Trump's residency in Florida introduces additional complexities, as the state's referendum to re-enfranchise convicted felons in 2018 was accompanied by stipulations mandating the payment of fines and fees associated with sentences. Neil Volz, deputy director of the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition, predicts minimal obstacles for Trump's voting rights



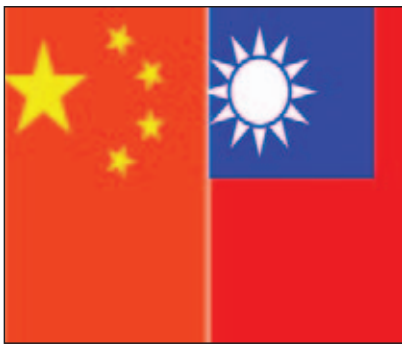

China initiates series of influence campaign against Taiwan

China has initiated a series of influence campaigns against Taiwan ahead of the Island's inauguration of president-elect Lai Ching-te scheduled on May 20, reported Voice of America (VOA). Beijing has increased the scale and frequency of military activities across Taiwan while partially relaxing travel and import restrictions. According to some analysts, Beijing is trying to test how the incoming Taiwanese government will respond to the increased pressure from Beijing while further destroying the longstanding status quo across the Taiwan Strait at a time when Taiwan is preparing for a transition of power. Chen Fang-yu, a political scientist at Soochow University in Taiwan, said, "In the short term, Beijing is trying to see how the new Taiwanese government under Lai may respond to its pressure campaign." "At the same time, the Chinese government is attempting to change the status quo across the Taiwan Strait when



Taipei is focusing on the inauguration," he added. Taiwan's defence ministry detected 26 Chinese military aircraft and five Chinese naval vessels near the island between May 2 and May 3, including 17 Chinese military aircraft crossing the median line of the Taiwan Strait. Moreover, some Chinese aircraft got as near as about 76 kilometers from Taiwan's northern port city of Keelung, which hosts an important naval base, reported VOA.

Hamas accepts Qatar-mediated proposal on hostage release



Hamas has accepted a proposal mediated by Qatar and Egypt, marking a potential breakthrough in the ongoing conflict in Gaza, CNN reported. The proposal, outlined in a document obtained by CNN from a reliable source in the region, lays out a comprehensive plan aimed at de-escalating tensions and paving the way for sustainable peace. According to the document, the agreement will be implemented in three phases, each lasting 42 days. The first phase entails the release of 33 Israeli hostages, including women, children, the elderly, and the sick, over the course of six weeks. In exchange, Israeli forces will gradually withdraw from parts of Gaza, reconnaissance flights will be halted for 10 hours daily, and disarmed Palestinians will be allowed free movement throughout the Gaza Strip. Additionally, hundreds of Palestinian prisoners are set to be released, with specific criteria outlined for the exchange process, as reported by CNN. Notably, the agreement stipulates that for every Israeli hostage released by Hamas, 30 Palestinian women and children will be released, along with 30 Palestinian prisoners over the age of 50 for each Israeli hostage in the same age group.

Researchers find how better sleep is linked to lower levels of loneliness



A recent study discovered that greater sleep health was linked to lower levels of loneliness, with the association being stronger among younger persons. The findings of the study were presented at the SLEEP 2024 annual meeting. The findings show that higher sleep health is related with significantly lower total loneliness, emotional loneliness, and social loneliness. Better sleep health was associated with lower total and emotional loneliness across all ages, however this association was higher in younger persons. However, age did not influence the relationship between sleep health and social loneliness. "Loneliness is an urgent public health crisis, and there is a pressing need for providers to better understand and treat it," said lead author and principal investigator Joseph Dzierzewski, who has a doctorate in clinical psychology and is vice president of research at the National Sleep Foundation in Washington, D.C. "Our results high-

light the important role that sleep plays in understanding loneliness across the adult lifespan. Perhaps efforts to improve sleep health could have a beneficial effect on loneliness, especially for young people." According to the American Academy of Sleep Medicine, sleep is essential to health. The AASM and the Sleep Research Society recommend that adults should sleep seven hours per night on a regular basis to promote optimal health, productivity and daytime alert-

ness. The study involved 2,297 adults with a mean age of 44 years; 51 per cent were male. Participants completed an online sleep health questionnaire and loneliness scale. The researchers analyzed the results using correlation and linear regression analyses along with moderation analyses. In 2023 an advisory from the U.S. surgeon general warned about a public health crisis of loneliness, isolation, and lack of connection. It noted that even before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, approximately half of U.S. adults reported experiencing measurable levels of loneliness. According to the authors, efforts and programs that aim to reduce loneliness should include an emphasis on promoting sleep health, especially in younger adults. "Why younger adults might experience more sleep-related benefits to loneliness than older adults is unknown and intriguing - certainly worth further investigation," Dzierzewski said.

AGENCY NEW YORK: Marvelling at the newly-constructed Nassau County International Cricket Stadium here, India skipper Rohit Sharma underlined the need for his team to get acclimatised to the pitch and conditions quickly ahead of their T20 World Cup opener against Ireland on June 5.

The challenge for the Indians will be to adapt to the drop-in turf here, something they don't come across very often in international cricket. "It's just about getting into

that rhythm of getting the feel of the ground, pitch and stuff like that," he said. Rohit was part of the first batch of India cricketers to arrive here on May 26, along with Jasprit Bumrah, Mohammed Siraj, Suryakumar Yadav, Rishabh Pant, Shivam Dube, Ravindra Jadeja, Kuldeep Yadav and Axar Patel.

Moving beyond the matches, Rohit also found time to take in the beauty of the venue. "It looks beautiful. It's quite an open ground. When we come here and play our first game, I just can't wait to feel the atmosphere in the stadium," he said. "It's a decent capacity as well. Hopefully it's gonna be a good one."
