Bihar CM Nitish Kumar meets PM Modi

NEW DELHI: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar met Prime Minister Narendra Modi here on Monday, a day before the Lok Sabha poll results will be out. There was no official word on the details of the meeting. Kumar's JD(U) is part of the BJP-led NDA and is seen as a declining, though still significant, force in the state amid strong efforts by the RJD to challenge the ruling combine.

Daughter of an IAS couple commits suicide

MUMBAI: A 27-year-old daughter of an IAS officers couple committed suicide by jumping off a Mumbai high-rise in the early hours of Monday, Police said. Lipi Rastogi, the daughter of Maharashtra cadre IAS officers Radhika and Vikas Rastogi, was taken to hospital but died during treatment.

According to reports Lipi, a law student, jumped from the 10th floor of a building near Mantralaya, the state secretariat in south Mumbai at around 4 AM. According to police, Lipi was studying law in Sonapat, Haryana and was believed to be anxious about her exams. A note was found in her room. While Vikas Rastogi is the Principal Secretary of the Education Department, Radhika Rastogi is the Principal Secretary of the state's Home Department.

2 terrorists killed in Pulwama encounter

SRINAGAR: Two militants were killed in an encounter with security forces in Jammu and Kashmir's Pulwama district on Monday, police said. Security forces launched a cordon and search operation in the Nihama area of the south Kashmir district after receiving specific input about the presence of terrorists there, a police official said. The search operation turned into an encounter after the militants fired on a search party of the forces, who then fired back, the official said.

Former BrahMos engineer sentenced to life imprisonment

NAGPUR: Nagpur District Court sentenced Nishant Agarwal, former engineer of BrahMos Aerospace Pvt Ltd, arrested in 2018 for spying for Pakistan's intelligence agency ISI, to life imprisonment under sections 3 and 5 of the Official Secrets Act (OSA) and imposed a fine of Rs 3000. Additional sessions court judge MV Deshpande specified that Agarwal was found guilty under section 235 of the Criminal Procedure Code. On Monday, the court ruled that Agarwal will serve a life sentence for offences under Section 66F of the IT Act. Additionally, he was sentenced to fourteen years of rigorous imprisonment under Section 31(1)(c) of the Official Secrets Act and three years of rigorous imprisonment along with a fine of Rs 3,000.

CEC rejects allegations by opposition

The counting of votes for the General Election and the State Legislative Assemblies of Andhra Pradesh and Odisha and bye-elections to Assembly Constituencies shall be held on June 4 starting at 8 am, the Election Commission said.

Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar along with Election Commissioners Gyanesh Kumar and Sukhbir Singh Sandhu had reviewed the counting day preparations with all Chief Electoral Officers (CEO) and Returning Officers (RO).

The counting trends and results, as per data entered by RO/ARO for AC/PC will be available on the ECI Website as well as on the Voter Helpline App, both iOS and Android Mobile Apps, the poll body said.

The Voter Helpline App can be downloaded from the Google Play Store or Apple Play Store. Users can use the available filter to find out the winning/leading or trailing candidate details, along with the constituency-wise or State-wise results from the Voter Helpline App.

The poll body has also issued a handbook for Returning Officers and Counting agents available on the ECI website. The comprehensive instructions of the Commission for counting arrangements, procedure of counting of votes and storage of EVMS/VVPATs are already available on the ECI website, it said.

The local display of the trends and

results by the CEOs/ROs/DEOs may also be done through the Digital Display Panels, it said.

Meanwhile in a sharp outright rejection of allegations made by Congress leader Jairam Ramesh that Union Home Minister Amit Shah had called up district magistrates after voting for the Lok

Sabha elections were completed, Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Rajiv Kumar on Monday said that it was not right to spread "rumour" and "doubt everyone."

"Can someone influence them all? (district magistrates/returning officers) all? Can anyone influence 500-600 people? Tell us who did this. We will punish the person who did it. They should tell the details before counting the votes. It is not right that you spread a rumour and doubt everyone," Rajiv Kumar said at a press conference a day before the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha elections. He further accepted the demands flagged by multi-party delegations ahead of the counting of the votes.



"World Record": Over 64 crore people voted in LS polls

NEW DELHI: India created a world record with 64.2 crore voters, including 31.2 crore women, participating in the Lok Sabha elections this year, Chief Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar said on Monday. Addressing a press briefing, he said over 68,000 monitoring teams and 1.5 crore polling and security personnel were involved in the world's largest electoral exercise. "India created a world record with 64.2 crore voters, including 31.2 crore women, participating in the Lok Sabha elections this year," said Kumar. On social media memes calling election commissioners 'Laapataa Gentlemen', Mr Kumar said, "We were always here, never went missing." "Now memes can say the 'Laapataa Gentlemen' are back," he said.

Rs 2,000 notes worth Rs 7,755 crore still with public: RBI

The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on Monday said 97.82 per cent of the Rs.2000 denomination banknotes have returned to the banking system, and only Rs.7,755 crore worth of the withdrawn notes are still with the public.

On May 19, 2023, the RBI announced the withdrawal of Rs. 2000 denomination banknotes from circulation.

The total value of Rs. 2000 banknotes in circulation, which was Rs.3.56 lakh crore at the close of business on May 19, 2023, has declined to Rs.7,755 crore at

the close of business on May 31, 2024. "Thus, 97.82 per cent of the Rs.2000 banknotes in circulation as on May 19, 2023, has since been returned," the central bank said in a statement. The facility for deposit and/or exchange of the Rs. 2000 banknotes was available at all bank branches in the country till October 7, 2023. The facility for the exchange of the Rs. 2000 banknotes has been available at the 19 issue offices of the Reserve Bank since May 19, 2023. From October 9, 2023, RBI issue offices are also accepting 2000 banknotes from individuals and entities for deposit into their bank accounts.

Badrinath pollution NGT seeks fresh report from UKPCB

The National Green Tribunal has sought a fresh report from the Uttarakhand Pollution Control Board (UKPCB) regarding solid and liquid waste management in the pilgrim city of Badrinath, including the complete sewage network and its carrying capacity.

The NGT was hearing a matter regarding the improper functioning of the sewage treatment plant (STP) in Badrinath and the discharge of untreated sewage in the Alaknanda river.

It had earlier directed the board to file a report.

Noting the details of the report, a bench of NGT Chairperson Justice Prakash Shrivastava said, "We have not got a satisfactory response on sitting and location of the STP which ap-



pears to be just on the bank of the river and (is) thereby discharging effluent directly (in)to the river along with other drains."

Delhi water crisis: SC asks Upper Yamuna River Board to call for emergency meeting on June 5

The Supreme Court on Monday asked the Upper Yamuna River Board to call for an emergency meeting of all stakeholder states on June 5 to resolve the water crisis being faced by the residents of Delhi and submit the status report by June 6. The Vacation Bench of Justices Prashant Kumar Mishra and KV Viswanathan were hearing a writ petition filed by the Delhi government seeking directions to the State of Haryana for the immediate release of water to the crisis-hit national capital.

The Court asked the Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, to

facilitate the Board's meeting on June 5 so that the crisis can be resolved. The case pertains to a petition filed by the Delhi Government in the Supreme Court stating that the capital was facing an acute shortage of water due to the severe heatwave conditions prevailing in North India. The Delhi government had requested the Apex Court to intervene in directing the neighbouring states to cooperate with Delhi as it is an emergent situation. The Delhi government admitted before the Top Court that Himachal Pradesh had agreed to share its surplus water with Delhi, but cooperation was required from the State of Haryana to avert the crisis.

LS polls witnessed polarisation on caste, religious lines : Experts

As India waits with bated breath for the Lok Sabha poll results, political analysts say this year's election was "one of the most polarised" with parties using caste and religion to garner votes.

While the BJP focused on integrating various backward castes under the Hindutva fold, the INDIA bloc tried to win over Other Backward Caste (OBC) voters by promising to conduct a caste survey if it is voted to power, they said.

Jagdeep Chokar, the



co-founder of the poll rights body Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR), said this election was "one of the most

polarised" he has ever witnessed.

"There was polarisation along the lines of caste, reli-

gion and region. It was not like this before. Caste has always been one of the most important mobilising factors in elections, but here, both caste and religion-based politics were at play," he told.

Dr Iftekhar Ahmad Ansari, an associate professor at Aligarh Muslim University, pointed out that the realignment of castes has presented a challenge to the BJP.

Bread-and-butter issues like unemployment and inflation raised by the INDIA bloc and its promise to conduct a caste survey if it is voted to power has cut into the careful-

ly crafted OBC vote bank of the BJP, he said. Social engineering by the BJP focused on integrating various backward castes under the Hindutva fold but this strategy is now under threat as the traditional vote banks realign, he added. In Uttar Pradesh, Ansari said, the Samajwadi Party has undertaken social engineering by forming the 'PDA' (Pichda, Dalit, and Alpsankhyak) coalition. In Bihar, the political landscape is shaped by the 'MY BAAP' (Muslim, Yadav, Bahujan, Agra, Adhi Abadi and Poor) alliance.

The counting of votes for the Haryana Lok Sabha general elections-2024 and the Karnal Assembly by-election will begin today at 8 AM. A total of 91 counting centres have been set up across the state. The counting of postal ballots at the Returning Officer's counting centre will begin before the EVM counting. Slips from five randomly selected VVPATs will be matched in the presence of counting agents.

Chief Electoral Officer, Sh. Anurag Agarwal gave this information, stating that media centres have been set up at each counting centre for the convenience of media persons. Apart from it, a separate media centre has been established at the Chief Electoral



Officer's office in Chandigarh. He mentioned that despite the heat wave, people actively exercised their franchise.

The voter turnout in Haryana was recorded at 64.80 percent. He expressed gratitude to the voters of the state for this.

Sh. Agarwal stated that all necessary preparations have been completed to ensure the counting process is carried out efficiently and peacefully. The Election Commission of India has appoint-

ed counting observers at all counting centres to monitor the counting process. He informed that for any information or complaints related to the counting, one can contact the toll-free number 0172-1950, the control room telephone 0172-2701362, or email at hry_elect@yahoo.com.

Sh. Agarwal emphasized that every official, clerk, agent, or other persons involved in recording or counting votes must maintain the confidentiality of voting.

Violating this is considered a crime under Section 128 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, which can result in imprisonment for up to 3 months, a fine, or both.

He said that no official connected with the conduct of

elections shall perform any act (other than voting) that furthers the prospects of any candidate's election. Violations are punishable under Section 129 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, with imprisonment for up to 6 months, a fine, or both. Any person who, without reasonable cause, breaches their official duty in connection with an election will be liable for a fine of up to Rs. 500 under Section 134 of the Representation of the People Act, 1951. Sh. Anurag Agarwal further stated that any person in the service of the Government acting as an election agent, polling agent, or counting agent of a candidate is subject to penalties under Section 134A of the Representation of the People Act, 1951, including imprisonment for up to 3 months, a fine, or both.

Himachal bus burns after tyre burst



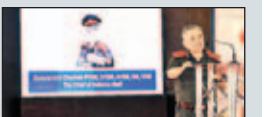

Counting to take place at 117 Centres across State: Sibir C

GAURAV GOEL CHANDIGARH, JUNE 3

The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) of Punjab, Sibir C, has informed that the counting of votes for the Lok Sabha Elections will commence at 8:00 AM on 4 June, 2024. A total of 64 counting observers, drawn from all India Services and Civil Services cadre of various states, will oversee the counting process. These experienced officials have been tasked with ensuring that the counting of votes is conducted transparently, efficiently, and in strict adherence to the guidelines of the Election Commission of India.

Divulging the details about counting centres, Sibir C said that a total of 117 counting centres have been established in the state, in 48 buildings and at 27 locations. While most of these locations are situated in district headquarters, 7 locations are outside district headquarters, including Ajnala, Baba Bakala, Abohar,



Malout, Dhuri, Chhokra Rahon-Nawan Shahr and Khooni Majra (Kharar), he added. He further informed that the counting will not be conducted at the district headquarters in Sangrur and Nawan Shahr.

The CEO stated that the security of Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs) in the strong rooms at these counting centres has been given utmost priority. These strong rooms are secured with a double lock system and are under continuous CCTV surveillance. Representatives of political parties and

authorized personnel can monitor the security through LED screens placed outside each strong room, displaying live footage of the surroundings. Additionally, a visitor register is maintained by on-duty personnel to record all visits and an official conducts daily inspections to ensure compliance with all protocols. Regarding the security of the counting centres, Sibir C apprised that a comprehensive three-tier security system has been implemented around the counting centres. Access to the counting centres has been strictly restricted, with only accredited individuals allowed entry. The counting centres are equipped with CCTV cameras for extensive monitoring. Additionally, Quick response teams are in place to manage any incidents promptly, ensuring the integrity of the electoral process. Among the prominent faces, BJP nominee and four-time MP Preet Kaur is seeking re-election from the Patiala parliamen-

tary constituency. Harsimrat Kaur Badal, a three-time MP, and the BJP's Parampal Kaur Sidhu, a former IAS officer, are trying their luck from Bathinda. Congress' Channi and BJP nominee Sushil Rinku were in the fray from the Jalandhar reserved constituency. Punjab Congress chief Warring contested against Bitu from Ludhiana. Randhawa was in the fray from Gurdaspur. Former diplomat and BJP nominee Taranjit Singh Sandhu contested from Amritsar against sitting MP and Congress candidate Gurjeet Singh Aujla. INDIA bloc allies Congress and AAP contested the Lok Sabha polls in Punjab separately while the BJP and the Shiromani Akali Dal (SAD) fought on their own for the first time since 1996. The Sukhbir Badal-led SAD walked out of the National Democratic Alliance (NDA) in 2020 over the now-repealed three farm laws.

Votes counting will start at 8 AM under strict security: RO

The counting of votes cast on June 1 in Lok Sabha Constituency 12 Sangrur will take place on June 4 and for this task, all arrangements have been completed under the guidelines of the Election Commission of India (ECI).

While giving this information, Returning Officer (RO), Sangrur, Jitendra Jorwal said that the counting of votes of 5 assembly constituencies of district Sangrur and one assembly constituency Malerkotla of district Malerkotla will be done at various counting centers set up at Desh Bhagat College, Barwal, while counting of votes of Barnala, votes cast at Mahal Kalan and Bhadwar will be held at the counting centers established at S.D.College Barnala. The RO



said that 14 tables have been set up in each counting center and identity cards have been issued to all polling staff to be posted at the counting centers and no unauthorized person will be able to enter the counting centers without the identity cards.

He said that videography of the entire counting process will be done, the candidates and authorized election agents have also been informed about the instructions of the Election Commission regarding the counting process. He further said that the entire process of counting of votes will be carried out in a transparent, peaceful and secure environment. He added that for the convenience of journalists, who have been issued authority cards by the Election Commission of India, a media center has been set up where the results obtained from all counting centers will be shared with the media simultaneously.

VB registers case against assistant sub inspector for accepting Rs 4,500 bribe

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB), during its ongoing campaign against corruption in the state, has registered a corruption case against Piar Singh, Assistant Sub Inspector (ASI), posted at Police Post Madi Ladhuka, under Police Station Fazilka Sadar for demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs 4,500.

Disclosing this here today, an official spokesperson of the state VB said this case has been registered against the aforementioned police official (Now retired) based on an online complaint lodged by Viru Singh, a resident of

Mandi Ladhuka, Fazilka district on the Chief Minister's Anti-Corruption Action Line portal.

He further added that the complainant has informed in his complaint that he had got registered a police case against another person in the Fazilka Sadar police station and the said police personnel was the investigation officer in this case. He further alleged that the said ASI had already taken Rs 2,500 and Rs 2,000 on different days in the month of February this from him in lieu of presenting supplementary chargesheet to the court pertaining to this case. The complainant had

recorded the conversation with the ASI while he was demanding the bribe from him in this regard and he had submitted it to the VB as an evidence. The spokesperson informed that during the investigation of this complaint, it was proved that the said ASI had demanded bribe two times from the complainant for the aforementioned motive. Subsequently, a case under the Prevention of Corruption Act has been registered against the accused at the VB police station, Ferozepur range. The VB has been conducting raids to arrest the accused who would be arrested soon.

In a first-of-its-kind initiative, the 80th Staff Course also introduced a specially curated curriculum for a select group of student officers from the Indian Army, Navy, Air Force, and friendly foreign countries.

Six institutions reserved as counting centers

AGENCY SHIMLA:- District Election Officer Anupam Kashyap has ordered the closure of six institutions in the district, including Government Girls Senior Secondary School Portmore, Government Senior Secondary School Chota Shimla, Government Degree College Sanjauli, Govt ITI Theog, Govt Senior Secondary School Jubbal, and Rampur, for two days. A notification issued on Monday by RO directed the officials to keep these six institutions close on June 3 and 4.

Jairam Thakur criticizes Speaker over independent MLAs' resignations

DINESH AGARWAL SHIMLA:- Opposition Leader Jairam Thakur expressed strong disapproval of the actions taken by the Assembly Speaker regarding the resignations of three independent MLAs. Thakur questioned the timing of the Speaker's decision, suggesting that if such actions were necessary, they should have been taken earlier. Thakur accused the Speaker of compromising the constitutional integrity of his position by acting as a puppet of the government. He argued that the resignations of the independent MLAs could have coincided with the Lok Sabha elections, thereby saving considerable time and resources. Reading sharply to a recent statement by Assembly Speaker Kuldeep Singh Pathania, Thakur condemned the Speaker's use of violent metaphors, describing it as unfortunate. Thakur referred to Pathania's remarks about metaphorically beheading six MLAs and having three MLAs under a metaphorical saw as highly inappropriate.

Rajendra Rana or Capt Ranjit, who will triumph in Sujanpur?

RAJNISH SHARMA HAMIRPUR:- As the Sujanpur Assembly election heats up, all eyes are on whether Rajendra Rana will secure his fourth consecutive victory with the support of the BJP, or if Captain Ranjit, who strategically shifted from BJP to Congress, will unseat him. The stakes are high, and speculations abound. Supporters have already placed bets on the outcome, with calculations and strategies being meticulously analyzed. As the vote counting begins on June 4 at 8 AM at the school premises adjacent to Sujanpur Chauhan, workers are busy with both-wise calculations. Captain Ranjit is anticipated to benefit from internal BJP dissent, while Rajendra Rana relies on his political acumen and experience to fight till the last moment. Despite his efforts, Rajendra Rana has been unable to reconcile with many disgruntled individuals up until the final moments of the campaign. Areas considered his strongholds, such as Siswan, Sikander, Chhatraoul, Patnaun, Jhanjara, Uhal, Utpur, Jandru, Khiah, Kangri, Jhanikkar, Bhatar, Sujanpur Nagar, Kakkar, Lambr, and Nalahi, witnessed defections. Several former heads of these regions, including Sarwan Kumar of Bari Panchayat, Satpal Sharma of Sikander Panchayat, and transporter Subhash of Patnaun, have switched allegiance to Captain Ranjit.

CM directs immediate action to prevent, control forest fires

DINESH AGARWAL SHIMLA, JUNE 3 Presiding over a meeting of the Forest Department here today, Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu expressed serious concern over the forest fire incidents and directed the department to take concerted efforts to address the issue. He instructed them to initiate long term measures along with the immediate initiatives to curb the problem. He stressed on the people's participation in these efforts and said that the numbers of forest fire incidents are gradually decreasing. The Chief Minister said that 1318 fire incidents have been recorded so far this year, affecting 12718 hectares of land including



2789 hectares plantation area causing the preliminary financial loss of Rs. 4.61 crore. He said that to mitigate these losses, the State Government is contemplating to form a dedicated battalion of NDRF specially equipped and trained for fire fighting to reduce the losses to the forest area. In addition to this, he said that 374 forest beats are highly sensitive for forest fires and called for strengthening the fire tackling services in these areas. Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu emphasized on

diversifying the conifer plants regions with specific plant species of the area to help retain the moisture and reduce the numbers of fire incidents. He also directed the forest department to conduct a study from the government agency to look into the causes of fire incidents and recommend necessary actions. Industries Minister Harshwardhan Chauhan, Chief Secretary Prabodh Saxena, Additional Chief Secretary Onkar Chand Sharma, Principal Secretary Forests Dr. Amandeep Garg, Secretary to the Chief Minister Rakesh Kanwar, Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, Rajiv Kumar and senior officers of the department attended the meeting.

Mountains heating up: Temperature in Bangana surpasses 42 degrees

JOGINDER DEV ARYA BANGANA: The mountains are heating up, and humidity is on the rise. Over the past ten days, the afternoon temperatures in Bangana have consistently surpassed 42 degrees Celsius. If this trend continues, residents may suffer severe heat exposure. Currently, they are already facing scorching hot winds. The maximum temperature has climbed to 42.7 degrees Celsius, while the minimum

temperature has risen from 22.7 to 25.1 degrees Celsius in just one day. Last Tuesday, the maximum temperature was recorded at 41.4 degrees, gradually increasing over time. Three days ago, on Sunday, the maximum temperature was 41.2 degrees Celsius. This data clearly indicates the rapid increase in heat in the district. If this situation persists for the next few days, people could suffer severely from the heat, and they are already experiencing hot winds.

Himachal Assembly speaker accepts resignations of 3 Independent MLAs

AGENCY SHIMLA, JUNE 3 Himachal Pradesh Assembly Speaker Kuldeep Singh Pathania has accepted the resignation of the three independent legislators. Speaker Pathania told an news agency that all other cases and petitions in the matter will remain infrutious. "They gave their resignations on March 22, 2024. I have accepted those. Now they seize to be the members of the 14th Assembly. That will be notified and published in the gazette and the information will be sent to the Election Commission of India. The matter under anti-defection law on the petition of parallel proceedings on the petition of Jagat Singh is listed but the result of both would be



the same if I accept their resignation or take action under violation of anti-defection Law," Pathania said. "I have not taken any harsh decisions and have decided to accept their resignations as per their wish. The Chief Justice of the high court had said that they couldn't interfere in the jurisdiction of the speaker and another judge had the opinion that the court can't intervene but can restrict time so there was a difference

of opinion and the matter was referred to the third judge. The acceptance of non-acceptance of the resignation is my domain and I have accepted it. And the other matters in this would remain infrutious," Pathania added. The former independent MLA and BJP leader KL Thakur said, "They wanted the speaker to accept their resignations immediately". "We wanted them to have accepted it either on March 22 or 23 but they did it today. It is the prerogative of the speaker. We did not want any burden on the state, so we wanted no additional burden of model code of conduct on the people. It doesn't fall under anti-defection law as we had resigned on March 22 and joined the BJP on the next day," Thakur said.

Women outdo men in Lok Sabha election: ECI

AGENCY SHIMLA, JUNE 3 Himachal Pradesh Lok Sabha and assembly bye election highlights have revealed that turnout of women voters was more than their male counterparts. According to data released by the Election Commission of India, women registered average turnout of 72.62 per cent compared to 69.31 by men in the Lok Sabha election. Similarly in assembly bye elections, women voters outshone men at these six polls, where they registered 77.43 percent compared to 70.42 pc of men. In Hamirpur Parliamentary constituency

out of total turnout of 71.56 per cent, the women registered 75.16 pc polling compared to 67.95 pc of men. In Mandi Parliamentary where Bollywood actress Kangana Ranaut was in fray registered 73.15 pc polling including female turnout of 74.19 pc and 72.13 pc of men. Kangra LS registered 67.89 pc polling including 74.18 pc female and 64.64 male. Shimla reserved seat having total turnout of 71.26 pc was the only one where female turnout (69.92 pc) was less than male (72.54 pc). Kotkailhur assembly bye election registered 76.89 per cent polling having highest female turnout of 80.89 pc and 72.83 pc of male followed by Gagret assembly (75.14 pc) total turnout, 77.95 pc women and 72.40 pc men. Lahaul Spiti district where number of female voters are more than male registered 75.09 pc polling having a female candidate of Congress Anuradha Rana in fray and recorded 77.39 pc female and 72.77 pc male voters. Sujanpur assembly elections registered 73.76 pc polling with 78.78 pc female and 68.46 pc male. Badsar assembly bye election registered 71.69 pc polling including 77.03 pc female and 66.18 pc male. In Mandi Parliamentary constituency, Badsar and Kotlehair also registered 100 percent polling by the others.

NGT imposes fine on MMC for not managing waste

AGENCY SHIMLA, JUNE 3 The National Green Tribunal slapped a fine of Rs 4.6 crore on Manali Municipal Council to pay environmental compensation for not managing waste properly in Rangri village. According to a report published in Down to Earth Environment Magazine on May 31, 2024, the National Green Tribunal (NGT) reportedly imposed a Rs 4.6 crore fine on MC Manali for not managing waste properly in a dumping site of civic bidy at Rangri near tourist resort Manali. In an order passed on May 29, 2024, the tribunal

said that proper management of solid waste at the waste facility located in Rangri village of Manali was not being done. The tribunal was directed to pay this compensation within three months and deposit this amount of fine with the Himachal Pradesh State Pollution Control Board. The entire amount would be charged to the civic body under the Solid Waste Management Act of 2016. The NGT said that this compensation would be used to compensate for the damage caused to the environment as well as for its rejuvenation and restoration. The order also held that any previous or anticipated

payment made in this matter by the respondent after receiving the notice on January 24, 2024, would also be used for the restoration of the environment. NGT has also directed the state to form a joint committee of the District Magistrate of Kullu, Member Secretary of the Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB), and Member Secretary of the HPSPCB to ensure proper segregation and management of garbage. This panel would prepare an environmental rejuvenation plan within the next six months. On a written complaint submitted by a petitioner, it was found that two schools and a local

village were facing pollution due to unscientific dumping. The court has also warned that if the Municipal Council continues to mismanage, process, or misuse solid waste, then the Pollution Control Board should determine environmental compensation on a monthly basis. It is worth noting that on May 25, 2022, the head of Gram Panchayat Shalen in Manali, Paldan Phunchog, complained about the illegal dumping of solid waste in his letter petition area. Phunchog stated that the local residents are suffering from the garbage scattered in a two-kilometer area and the foul smell emanating from it.

Kaza - Gramphu Road reopens

AGENCY SHIMLA, JUNE 3 District Administration and District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA) of Lahaul-Spiti announced Monday the reopening of NH-505 (Kaza - Gramphu Road) following extensive snow clearance efforts. The NH-505 road, specifically the Sumdo-Kaza-Gramphu stretch, is now open to the general public. This reopening comes after a period of heavy snowfall that had previously obstructed the route. Traffic on the Lossar - Gramphu stretch is permitted for 4x4, 4x2, HMV vehicles, and bikes from both directions. Vehicles are allowed to travel between 5 am and 2 pm only. The Police Department will oversee traffic management to ensure safe and regulated movement. In a press release



issued here both the authorities disclosed that after improved road conditions, commuters should abide by the travel advisory to ensure the safety and smooth passage. Travellers should be aware that the Gramphu to Lossar road is prone to rock falls and avalanches, and it is crucial to exercise extreme caution, it said. Vehicle movement will depend on current weather and road conditions, which can change rapidly in this region. It is

essential for vehicles to meet all specifications and requirements as mentioned in the advisory, it said. Travelers should ensure their vehicles are well-prepared, with sufficient fuel, proper machinery, and appropriate tire conditions. Non-skid chains and a shovel should be part of the travel gear. Stoppages on the Gramphu to Lossar route should be minimised to prevent traffic build-up and ensure continuous flow.

Mismanagement pushed Electricity Board to brink of bankruptcy: Kuldeep Singh

SANJEEV MAHAJAN NURPUR, JUNE 3 Kuldeep Singh Kharwara, President of the Hamirpur District Himachal Pradesh Electricity Board Pensioners' Association, criticized the board's management during a conference in Bharmaad. The event saw participation from retirees across Jawali, Nurpur, Fatehpur, and Indora. Kharwara claimed the board's mismanagement has led it to the verge of bankruptcy and urged Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu to intervene. Addressing the conference, Kharwara highlighted the plight of retirees who have not received their gratuity and leave encashment benefits for over a year. He pointed out that employees who retired post-January 1, 2016,



have yet to receive their revised pay arrears and 20% of their revised gratuity. Despite recent government orders to clear these dues and an additional 4% dearness allowance, payments remain pending. Kharwara also noted that employees who retired before 2015 have not benefited from the notional pay fixation for revised pensions. Repeated requests for additional staff to address these issues have gone

unheeded. He called for the Chief Minister's urgent intervention and announced that the pensioners' forum would soon meet with Sukhu to discuss these unresolved matters and mitigate the growing discontent among pensioners. The conference honored Ram Lubhaya, President of the Jawali unit of the Electricity Board Pensioners' Association, on reaching the age of 75.

24-hour water supply soon in every ward of Jawali Nagar Panchayat

DAULAT CHAUHAN JAWALI, JUNE 3 The Jal Shakti Department has approved a scheme worth Rs. 14.89 crores to provide a 24-hour water supply to every ward in the Jawali Nagar Panchayat. This scheme will ensure direct water supply to every household in the nine wards under the Nagar Panchayat Jawali, offering round-the-clock water availability. Under this scheme, four new tube wells will be installed, and overhead tanks will be constructed in each ward. Through these tanks, pipelines will be laid to provide tap connections to every household. Previously, five tube wells and six overhead tanks were installed to supply sufficient water to the residents of the Nagar Panchayat. Now, with the addition of four more tube wells and new overhead tanks, water will be supplied to the public of the Nagar Panchayat. This will eliminate any water shortage in Jawali Nagar Panchayat. Executive Engineer Ajay Sharma from the Jal Shakti Department, Jawali, stated that the approval for the scheme has been received from the government. Once the budget is allocated, the work will commence on a priority basis.

Once the land is selected, the central government will allocate a lump sum of ₹50 crores, with an additional ₹30 crores earmarked for building construction. The construction funds will be released in installments based on the progress of the project. This initiative aims to address the current shortfall of police personnel and provide new employment opportunities for hundreds of job seekers. The new IRBN will open up recruitment for 1007 positions, including police officers and ministerial staff. This development is expected to ease the shortage of personnel and provide substantial employment opportunities in the region. The selection of a site in police district Baddi is underway, marking a significant step forward in enhancing the security infrastructure of Himachal Pradesh.

To complete the final process of counting of Lok Sabha Elections-2024, all the arrangements are in place to carry out smooth and transparent counting of votes at Government Polytechnic, Khooni Majra, tomorrow, said the District Election Officer, SAS Nagar, Mrs Aashika Jain, here, today.

The Deputy Commissioner while reviewing the arrangements with the officials deputised for the preparations of counting, said that there should be proper sitting arrangements for the counting teams, counting agents of the Candidates, Candidates / counting agents, Room for Counting Observer, Media Centre, Public Communication Room.

The Counting for the 278 polling booths of Kharar and 251 Polling booths of SAS Nagar will be taken place at the Government Polytechnic Khooni Majra, added the Deputy Commissioner. A total of 14 counting tables for each constituency have been



set up, where a lot of 14 EVMs would be displayed for showing the count of vote number to the candidates.

The Deputy Commissioner said that we have a total of 19 counting teams against each counting hall including 5 reserved teams.

The teams have been asked to report at 5:00 AM to their AROs to assign them the number of Counting Tables to be completed by 6:00 AM. She said that the counting

would be monitored by the Counting Supervisor as a representative of ECI to maintain transparency and efficiency.

He will randomly recheck the result of any two EVMs after each round of counting. Apart from that reconciliation of the number of voting slips of five VVPATs that would be selected by draw of lots in the end, would also be done with the result of that particular EVMs. She said that ADCs Viraj S Tidke and

Damanjit Singh Mann have been monitoring all the arrangements being made by the AROs Depankar Garg and Gurmandar Singh. Tomorrow would also be a dry day across the district, she further said. SSP Dr Sandip Garg said that the counting would be carried out under strict security protocols as directed by the ECI.

No person without the valid authority issued by the ECI and District Election Office would be allowed at the counting centre premises. Only those persons would be allowed inside the counting hall that has been categorically issued authority letters for entering the counting hall, he added.

SSP Dr Garg clarified that mobiles or other electronic devices would not be allowed in the counting hall and media persons can also deposit their mobiles with the media centre to enter the counting halls with handheld cameras.

No one would be allowed to record the display of results on EVM through any recording device of a still camera, he further clarified.

BSF, Punjab police recover China-made drone in Tarn Taran

In Kharar Vidhan Sabha Constituency under Sri Anandpur Sahib Lok Sabha Constituency, low trend of voters was seen and 1 lakh 59 thousand 386 voters exercised their right to vote. Thus, only 56.80 percent of the total voters cast their votes. Out of these, 87 thousand 17 men and 72 thousand 365 women voted. According to the information re-

ceived in this regard, 79.14 percent of votes were cast at Government Elementary School Salempur Khurd, 78.82 percent at Government Elementary School Kartarpur, 78.16 percent at Government Elementary School Takipur. Similarly, only 5 votes were cast at Government Elementary School Kasauli which is .41 percent. Similarly, 9.98 percent votes were cast at Government Elementary School Tanda, 21.13 percent at Gov-

ernment Elementary School Majaria. Even in the areas under Kharar Nagar Council, the polling situation has not been very good. 33.64 percent at Honey Deo Smart School 39.24 percent at Government Elementary School Chhajju majra, 44.79 percent at Government Elementary School Santemajra exercised their right. Generally it was observed that there was not much enthusiasm among the voters.

With increase in humidity level, incidence of skin-related problems also increases

With fee humidity level rising beyond the comfort level region is witnessing increased incidence of skin-related problems especially among children. The queues at skin OPDs in hospitals are lengthening by the day with more people falling victims to such skin diseases as miliaria rubra; fungal infection; scabies and pediculosis; impetigo; furunculosis and chicken pox.

About 200 to 250 patients suffering from various skin diseases, are visiting the government multi-speciality hospital (GMSH), Chandigarh daily. A doctor there said that he was attending about 30 to 40 patients of miliaria rubra; 50-60 of scabies; 50-60 of fungal infection; 40-50 of impetigo and furunculosis every day. And, should there be no more tains, the cases of skin diseases may

go up further as the bacteria feeds on humidity, says he. Humidity is the primary causative factor for the rapid growth of bacteria spreading skin diseases. Furunculosis (boils) is another type of skin disease that causes painful boils and pus-filled lumps on the skin. Fungal infection (daad) is a group of diseases caused by 'fungi' affected groins; armpits; nails; toes; feet or other parts of the body where the sweating generally occurs. It commonly affects feet, groins and scalp of children. The hot and humid environment allows the fungus to cultivate. Retention of sweat promotes the growth of fungus causing peeling, scaling and sometimes every blistering, said a skin specialist of Sector 32, Chandigarh. Impetigo is a common skin disease among children and infants caused by the bacteria growing in hot and humid weather.

No registration work till June 4

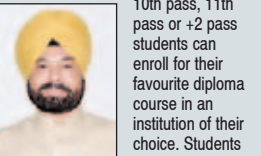

Punjab's cotton cultivation plummets, water conservation efforts dampened

Punjab government had targeted to take cotton sowing to 2 lakh hectares from 1.73 lakh hectares in 2023-24 seasons. According to data procured from Punjab agriculture department, cotton was sown on 92,454 hectares till May 29. Cotton is a traditional crop of Punjab and is limited to a specific area, but is still seen as a main alternative when it comes to staying away from under water guzzling crops. Spurious seed and pesticides were named as reasons for failure to contain the pest attacks. Farmers said not much was done to revive their faith as the crop was getting damaged year after year and they failed to get attractive compensation, and there was no crop insurance scheme in place.

After this, if any person has registered on the site then it was fine, otherwise click on the New Registration button and enter your details on it. After this, login with your registered mobile number and go to the search field and type property ID to search for. Then click on the property details to check it. Both Yes and No options will be available next to each detail. After reading it carefully, if all the data appears correct then click Yes. After confirming all the information, finally submit by entering the family identity card or Aadhaar number, after that the property ID will become self-certified.

Editorial

History for the young

Why should young people flock to our museums? In an age driven by technology and the internet, what would they seek to find in those big, forbidding spaces where homeless but rehabilitated objects of ten live out their lives without meaning and without context? On paper, the answer is simple. They may come to the museums to get a sense of history, as conveyed through a meaningful arrangement of a diverse range of objects.

This is the job that good curators get done. The past is not on candid camera but it keeps creating a never-ending assembly line of artefacts through which we try to have a stab at the palpable visuality of history, though at several removes. This is where the tactile, object-centric experience of a real museum comes in handy.

The great, so-called 'encyclopedic' or 'universal', museums of the world were, of course, products of the European Enlightenment, buttressed by the power of Empire to loot and reassemble (as in the British Museum, the Louvre, or the Hermitage) or the power of money to buy and dazzle (as in the Metropolitan Museum). Museums in India never had these global pretensions, so the leading ones have called themselves the 'Indian' Museum or the 'National' Museum, with all the complexities about their claims to represent 'India' or the 'nation' built into those nomenclatures. With unitary, fundamentalist definitions of India being aggressively propagated by the ruling regime, and with the lines between mythology and history getting increasingly blurred, museums in India face a vexing problem today. How do we make our museums inclusive and adequately reflective of our social diversity and historical complexities without being gobbled up by narrowly-defined, unilinear, homogenising, often State-sponsored official narratives of nationalism? What are the best curatorial strategies to deal with this?

At the very outset, it's necessary to remember that museum collections often grow by means of war, conquest, loot, accident, and unexpected twists and turns of history and, as a result, they are unable to consistently reflect the linear continuity of historical time. The museum space, too, is a finite one, shaping curatorial strategies and the modalities of storytelling. In short, they are complicated spaces in which the visualisation of a textbook narrative of history is impossible. They should, therefore, adopt a different approach to the task of curating artefacts to allow visitors a proper engagement with the subject of history.

I think the best curatorial practice in this regard should focus on the provenance of museum artefacts. Generally, museums in India are woefully short of in-house research skills and experience in curation, an inadequacy especially visible in provenance research.

Claudia Sheinbaum likely to win Mexican Presidential elections

Claudia Sheinbaum, is likely to win the Presidential elections of Mexico, and create history when she becomes the violence-plagued nation's first female President, showed El Financiero exit poll on Sunday.

Alejandro Moreno, head of Surveys and Opinion Studies at El Financiero, announced the first findings following the closure of polling stations across the nation.

"What this exit poll projects, here we can project Claudia Sheinbaum as the winner in the presidential race. There is no difference that makes us doubt the margin of error," she explained.

El Financiero is a Mexican national daily newspaper covering business and the financial markets.

Sheinbaum, a former mayor of Mexico City "will be the first female president in our history!", Morena Party chief Mario Delgado said, referring to exit polls, reported CNN.

Mexico's ruling Morena party and the opposition alliance are claiming early victories in the country's elections, despite the fact that the National Electoral Institute (INE) has yet to declare official results.

However, Xochitl Galvez, the opposition alliance's presidential candidate, stated that her coalition won the elections and urged President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador to respect Mexi-



can voters.

Both announcements took place right after National Electoral Institute (INE) chief Guadalupe Taddei Zavala urged political parties to "respect the rules of the game and accept the results with maturity and responsibility."

Mexicans voted for both national and local candidates in a massive and historic election on Sunday. The elec-

tion was said to be the largest in the country's history, with over 98 million eligible voters, and over 20,000 public offices being contested, according to CNN. The leading presidential race is noted to be between Claudia Sheinbaum of the leftist Morena party and Xochitl Galvez of the opposition coalition.

The third candidate is Jorge Al-

Rise in temperature increases death rate in cardiovascular patients

Amid intense heatwave conditions in the country, long exposure to the sun can lead to an increase in the death rate in cardiovascular patients.

Interventional Cardiology Fortis Escorts Heart Institute, Executive Director Dr Atul Mathur said, "Our country is facing aggressive temperatures. Due to this, people can face issues related to the cardiovascular system. If you are not drinking enough water, then your body will be dehydrated. For those who have pre-existing heart issues, their BP becomes high... The main concern is dehydration. So, everyone should regularly drink water to keep themselves hydrated. Senior citizens should avoid going out during peak hours."

Mathur further said, "There is a slight increase in heart attack cases. Among them, most of the patients are coming with low BP... you cannot attribute the heart attacks that are coming only to heat, but we are seeing heart attack patients also coming into the hospital, which is slightly more than normal. Generally, heart attack cases



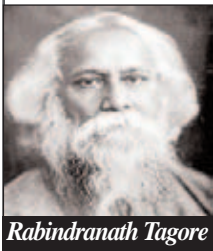
increase in winter but currently due to heat waves people are coming to the hospital with low BP problems."

Maldives announces ban on entry of individuals holding Israeli passports

Maldives on Sunday announced its decision to impose a ban on the entry of individuals holding Israeli passports into the country. Maldives Minister of Homeland Security and Technology, Ali Ihsaan, announced the decision while addressing a news conference at Maldives President's Office on Sunday.

In a press release, the Maldives President's Office stated, "President Dr Mohamed Muizzu, following a recommendation from the Cabinet, has resolved to impose a ban on Israeli passports."

The press release reads, "The Cabinet decision includes amending necessary laws to prevent Israeli passport holders from entering the Maldives and establishing a Cabinet subcommittee to oversee these efforts."

Furthermore, Maldives President Mohamed Muizzu has decided to appoint a special envoy to assess the needs of Palestinians. He has also decided to start a fundraising campaign to provide assistance to the people of Palestine, with the help of United Nations Relief

The decision by the Maldives government comes amid the ongoing war between Israel and Hamas in Gaza. The war began when Hamas launched a surprise attack on Hamas on October 7, with terrorists entering Israel and attacking civilian communities. In response to the October 7 attacks, Israel has vowed to destroy Hamas.

At least 36,439 people have been killed and 82,627 injured in Gaza since the war between Israel and Hamas began in October, according to the Gaza Health Ministry, which does not distinguish between civilians and combatants. However, most of the victims are women and children, The Washington Post reported.

Earlier on Friday, US President Joe Biden announced that Israel has proposed a "comprehensive new proposal" that provides a roadmap to a ceasefire in the ongoing war with Hamas in Gaza

and securing the release of all hostages held by the terrorist group, CNN reported.

According to Biden, the proposal, transmitted by Qatar to Hamas, outlines a "roadmap" towards a ceasefire. The initial phase, spanning six weeks, involves a "full and complete ceasefire with the withdrawal of Israeli forces from all populated areas of Gaza" and "release of a number of hostages including women, the elderly, the wounded in exchange for the release of hundreds of Palestinian prisoners." This announcement follows Israel's presentation of new ideas regarding hostage and ceasefire negotiations earlier in the week, a diplomatic source familiar with the negotiations told CNN on Tuesday without divulging details regarding these new ideas.

Direct talks between Israel and Hamas regarding the release of hostages were paused three weeks ago due to disagreements over certain terms. Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu has maintained that the conflict will persist until Hamas is eradicated entirely.

Rare Blood Disorder Successfully Treated at American Oncology Institute, Gurugram

Gurugram, American Oncology Institute (AOI) in Gurugram has achieved a significant milestone by successfully diagnosing and treating Myeloproliferative Neoplasia-Essential Thrombocytosis, a rare blood disorder, in a 65-year-old female patient. Fortis doctors perform robotic-assisted surgery on transplanted kidney

MOHALI, (RAJENDRA KHATHRY) A team of doctors at Fortis Hospital, led by Dr. Dharmender Aggarwal, saved a 56-year-old man from complicated cancer on his transplanted kidney, by performing a complex robotic-assisted surgery. The surgery was performed by using the da Vinci robotic-assisted surgical system to remove the tumour from the upper pole of his transplanted kidney and preserve the renal function of the same. The patient had lost both kidneys due to renal failure caused by chronic conditions like diabetes and hypertension, and had undergone a kidney transplant in 2018. His sister donated the kidney, and he had regularly visited the hospital for check-ups after that. However, the COVID-19 pandemic posed challenges to visiting the hospital for regular follow-ups. On evaluation at Fortis Hospital, three years later, it was found that he had developed a tumour on his transplanted kidney. Commenting on the complexity of

the case, Dr. Dharmender Aggarwal, Consultant Uro-oncology and Robotic Surgeon at Fortis Mohali, stated, "After reviewing the MRI scan and ultrasound, our team concluded that the tumour was likely to be malignant. While we discussed the possibilities of doing a kidney biopsy, it was not a feasible option due to the complex position of the tumour. Patients who have undergone kidney transplants are at a higher risk of developing malignant tumours due to the immunosuppressant required to maintain kidney function. These immunosuppressives weaken the patient's immune system, increasing their susceptibility to malignancies. Removing this kidney would have left the patient in a challenging situation, as finding another donor would be difficult, and he would have to return to dialysis. Therefore, it was crucial to remove the tumour before the malignancy spread to other parts and save the only functioning kidney that was donated by his sister."

Hry plans to prepare Rs. 10,000 cr clean air project for sustainable development: CS

Haryana Chief Secretary, TVSN Prasad said that the State Government is preparing a rupees 10,000 crore Haryana Clean Air Project for Sustainable Development which will be implemented in the State in a phased manner. In the first phase, the project will be implemented in NCR districts of the State and later, it will be replicated in the entire State.

TVSN Prasad stated this in the Governing Committee meeting of Haryana Clean Air Project for Sustainable Development held under his Chairmanship, here today. He said that this ten-year comprehensive project would be funded by the World Bank. However, assistance of NABARD and HUDCO would also be taken for effective implementation of



the project. While underlining the significance of Haryana Clean Air Project for Sustainable Development, Sh TVSN Prasad emphasised the need of collective efforts by all stakeholders to eliminate the problem of air pollution. He maintained that the State has taken significant strides in strengthening its institutions for air quality measurement and monitoring. Four state sample-testing laboratories have been established in the State. Apart from this, 29 Continuous Ambient Air

Quality Monitoring Stations (CAAQM) stations and 39 Manual Ambient Air Quality Monitoring (MAAQM) stations are operational in different districts. The State will build on its current infrastructure by expanding the AQ monitoring network, setting-up a command control centre, increasing resource capacity and citizen engagement, he added.

It was informed in the meeting that the project has three focus areas aimed at addressing air pollution comprehensively. The initial phase involves substantial enhancements to Haryana's air quality monitoring infrastructure. This encompasses the establishment of a cutting-edge laboratory and the modernization of four existing ones. Additionally, a dedicated program management unit will be

established to oversee project implementation. To ensure sustained success, the initiative includes comprehensive training programs for stakeholders engaged in air quality management.

Recognizing the multifaceted sources of air pollution, the project allocates the bulk of its resources to directly address the issues of transportation, industry, construction and road dust, biomass burning and Household Pollution through sectoral interventions.

Transportation: The project targets promoting cleaner vehicles on the roads by electrifying public transportation fleets for intra-city and inter-city travel. It aims to incentivize the adoption of electric vehicles (EVs) for private use, especially three-wheelers and four-wheeler taxis.

Illegal liquor, cash and drugs worth Rs 77.93 crore seized in Haryana during Lok Sabha elections

Haryana Chief Electoral Officer, Anurag Agarwal, said that during the 2024 general elections, enforcement agencies carried out continuous actions, resulting in the seizure of Rs. 19.91 crores in cash only, however, during the 2019 general elections, a total of Rs.18.36 crores in cash, illegal liquor, narcotics, and valuable items were seized.

He said that this time till June 3, 2024, a total of Rs 77.93 crore in cash, illicit liquor, drugs and valuables have been seized in the state, which is much more than the previous Lok Sabha elections.

Divulging more details in this regard, Sh Anurag Agarwal shared that the



Police, Income Tax Department, Excise and Taxation Department, and Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) are continuously taking action in the state. Thus far, the police have seized cash amounting to Rs 7.25 crore, the Income Tax Department Rs 9.76 crore, and the DRI Rs 2.78 crore. Additionally, cash has been seized by other agencies as well.

He shared that more than 4.13 lakh liters of illicit

liquor worth a total of Rs 13.63 crore have been confiscated by various agencies. This includes the police seizing 303666 liters of illicit liquor worth Rs 9.63 crore and the Excise Department seizing 109,747 liters worth Rs 4.09 crore.

Sh Anurag Agarwal further reported that drugs worth a total of Rs 14.68 crore have been seized by the agencies, with the police confiscating narcotics worth Rs 14.61 crore.

Haryana Police ensure security arrangements for peaceful counting process

CHANDIGARH: In preparation for the vote counting process on June 4 for the Lok Sabha elections, Haryana Police have implemented stringent security measures across the state. A three-tier security system will be in place around 91 counting centers. The first tier will be manned by Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF), the second by Haryana Armed Police (HAP) or Indian Reserve Battalion (IRB) personnel, and the third by district police officers. Over 10,000 police personnel have been deployed to ensure smooth operations at the counting centers.



Director General of Police (DGP) Shatruejeet Kapur stated that at least 70 police personnel will be stationed at each counting center. Additionally, 15 companies of CAPF along with other police officers have been assigned to the counting centers. Security checkpoints will be established within a 100-meter radius of these centers. CCTV cameras have been installed in all 91 strong rooms to monitor every activity closely. Unauthorized individuals are strictly prohibited from entering these areas. Police commissioners and superintendents have been instructed to adhere to guidelines issued by the Election Commission of India to maintain law and order during the counting process. Unauthorized individuals will not be allowed to enter the counting centers.

NDC process simplified for convenience of public: Kwatra

SHAHABAD MARKANDA: Municipality head Gulshan Kawatra said that soon the government will simplify process of NDC. This will eliminate problems faced by public. Gulshan Kawatra said that a record amount of Rs 19 crore will be spent on development work in all 19 wards of the city and on eliminating the problems of the wards and making them problem-free. Fancy lights will be installed on Shahabad Barada and Shahabad Ladwa Road. ICC announces record-breaking prize money for T20 WC 2024 winners

AGENCY DUBAI : The winner of the ninth edition of men's ICC T20 World Cup will get at least USD 2.45 million, the highest-ever prize money in the history of the tournament, along with the trophy that they will lift at Kensington Oval in Barbados on June 29.

The runners-up will receive at least USD 1.28 million, while the losing semi-finalists walk away with 787,500 USD each from the total, historic prize pot of 11.25 million USD, as per ICC.

The four teams that fail to make it out of the Super 8s will earn 382,500 USD each, while the teams placed ninth, 10th, 11th and 12th receive 247,500 USD each. Participants who finish 13th to 20th place will return 225,000 USD.

And every team receives an additional 31,154 USD for each match they win barring the semi-finals and final.

The 55-match event will be played over 28 days, across



nine venues in the West Indies and USA, making this the biggest ICC T20 World Cup ever. The format of this year's tournament will see 40 first round matches played before the top eight progress to the Super 8s. Four teams will then qualify for the semi-finals, which will be staged in Trinidad and Tobago and

Guyana, ending with the final in Barbados where the 2024 men's champions will be crowned. ICC Chief Executive Geoff Allardice said: "This event is historic in so many ways so it is fitting that the prize money for players reflects that. Hundreds of millions of fans around the world will be entertained by

the players in what we're hoping to be an Out of This World event." India will start their T20 World Cup campaign on June 5 against Ireland at the newly constructed Nassau County International Cricket Stadium in New York.

Meanwhile, the most-awaited blockbuster clash between India and Pakistan

will take place on June 9. They will later play tournament co-hosts USA (June 12) and Canada (June 15) to wrap up their Group A matches.

In the tournament, India will be aiming to end their ICC trophy drought, having last won the ICC Champions Trophy in 2013. Since then, India has reached the 50-over World Cup final in 2023, semi-final in 2015 and 2019, the title clash of the ICC World Test Championship in 2021 and 2023, T20 WC final in 2014, semifinals in 2016 and 2022 but failed to secure a big ICC trophy. Rashid Khan banks on Afghanistan chasing 200-run target in T20 WC

GUYANA : Afghanistan captain Rashid Khan backed the batting strength of his team and believes that they have a set-up that has the potential to chase down a 200-run target.

Afghanistan have had their batting woes which reflected during their T20I series against Ireland. They managed to win the T20I

series by 2-1 but managed to string up scores of 111, 142/8 and 155/7.

They managed to go past the 150-run mark once in three matches. Ahead of their T20 World Cup opening game against Uganda at the Providence Stadium, Rashid banked on the potential of their batting set-up.

"In the past, we were struggling a little bit in the batting area. Earlier, our bowlers would do a lot more and help us win the games. Later, we got those young batters, especially from the Under-19 cricket, and the way they came up to the national

side, and the way they have worked hard, they got the opportunity to play for Afghanistan at a very young age and then start exploring all around the world, playing leagues where they got better and better," Rashid said as quoted from ESPNcricinfo.

Rashid feels that the mindset that the players opt to go out with will determine whether they can chase a target of 200. The 25-year-old also believes that overall, the team has improved their skills and has gone better over time.

"I think we have that kind of batting line-up where we can say it's fine if there is a target of 200 as well on a wicket. We have that kind of ability and skills and talent that we can express on the ground and chase that. T20 cricket is all about the mindset. As long as you have the right mindset.
