**Jammu to Vaishno Devi helicopter service to resume from June 18**

**KATRA:** To facilitate pilgrims seeking special darshan quickly, the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board will start its Jammu to Sanjhi Chhat helicopter service from June 18, 2024. Chief Executive Officer of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board, Anshul Garg, said that the SMVDSB is starting the Jammu to Sanjhi Chhat helicopter service for pilgrims who want to have darshan at Bhawan in a day. The Shrine Board will introduce two types of packages: ‘Same Day Return’ (SDR) for Rs 35,000 and ‘Next Day Return’ (NDR) for Rs 50,000 per person. Sharing the details, officials said that in the SDR format, pilgrims will be provided battery car service to Bhawan upon reaching Panchhi Helipad, a special darshan slip, ‘prasad’, a priority ticket for the cable car to offer prayers at Bhairon Temple, battery car service on return to reach Panchhi Helipad, and a helicopter ride back to Jammu Airport.

**Gold rises Rs 150; silver plunges Rs 1,400**

**NEW DELHI:** Gold prices rose by Rs 150 to Rs 71,950 per 10 grams in the national capital on Tuesday in line with firm trends in the international markets, according to HDFC Securities. The precious metal had ended at Rs 71,800 per 10 grams on Monday. However, silver prices plunged Rs 1,400 to Rs 90,700 per kg. In the previous session, it had closed at Rs 92,100 per kg.

**PM Modi to travel to Italy this week for G7 summit**

**NEW DELHI:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi is set to travel to Italy this week to attend the annual summit of G7 advanced economies in his first trip abroad after assuming office for the third straight term. The G7 summit, to be held in the luxury resort of Borgo Egnazia in Italy’s Apulia region from June 13 to 15, is likely to be dominated by the raging war in Ukraine and the conflict in Gaza.

**Bajrang Dal to hold nationwide protest against J-K terror attack**

**NEW DELHI:** The Bajrang Dal will hold a nationwide protest on Wednesday against a terror attack in Jammu and Kashmir’s Reasi in which nine persons, including a two-year old, were killed and several others were left injured, a senior Vishva Hindu Parishad functionary said on Tuesday. Bajrang Dal is the youth wing of the Vishva Hindu Parishad (VHP), affiliated to the Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), the BJP’s ideological fountainhead. Condemning the incident, VHP general secretary (organisation) Milind Parande said, “It was a cowardly attack by Islamic terrorists backed by Pakistan.”

# Team Modi 3.0 takes charge, starts action

All the top ministers of NAD alliance took charge on Tuesday. Amit Shah on took charge as the Union Home Minister for the second consecutive term. Shah has been holding the portfolio since 2019.

Before taking charge of the ministry, Shah visited the National Police Memorial in the national capital’s Chanakyapuri area to pay homage to policemen who had laid down their lives while serving the nation.

The 59-year old Shah was elected from Gandhinagar constituency in Gujarat in the Lok Sabha election.

Shah has also retained his other portfolio in the Ministry of Cooperation. Senior BJP leader and four-time former Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh Shivraj Singh Chouhan took charge of the Union Agriculture Ministry on Tuesday.

He has also been allocated the Rural Development Ministry in Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s new Cabinet. BJP President J P Nadda assumed charge of Union Chemicals and Fertilizers Ministry. In the previous government, BJP leader Mansukh Mandaviya was the minister of chemicals and fertilizers. Manohar Lal Khattar took charge as Union Power Minister in addition to his other portfolio of Minister of Housing and Urban Affairs at Shram Shakti Bhawan today. The Union Minister was briefed by senior officials of the Minister of Power and after taking the charge, he also took a review meeting regarding the power supply position in the country.

## HryCM directs completion of flood prevention preparations by June 30

Haryana Chief Minister Sh Nayab Singh has instructed officials to complete flood prevention preparations by June 30, before the onset of monsoon season. Last year, Ambala and Kurukshetra districts suffered significant flood damage. He also emphasized to ensure the completion of works of short-term schemes.

The Chief Minister was presiding over a meeting of Irrigation and Water Resources Department on flood regarding preparations for flood prevention here today. Irrigation and Water Resources Minister Dr. Abhe Singh Yadav was also present in the meeting.

The Chief Minister said that the work of soil filling should be started immediately to strengthen the embankments of canals and drains. With paddy plantation scheduled to begin after June 15, waterlogged fields pose challenges for soil lifting. In addition,

landowners fields also does not remain vacant.

The Chief Minister issued a stern warning to officials, indicating that those responsible for any repeat of last year’s flood incidents will face consequences. The department should hire as many JCBs as necessary to remove the silt from the canal. He said that the villages of Har-da-Hardi, Shergarh, Chandpura, Shahpur, Hemamajra, Rampur Sasse-di of Ambala, Jhaansa, Jal-behra of Kurukshetra and Guhla Cheeka of Kaithal were badly affected. This time, if floods happen

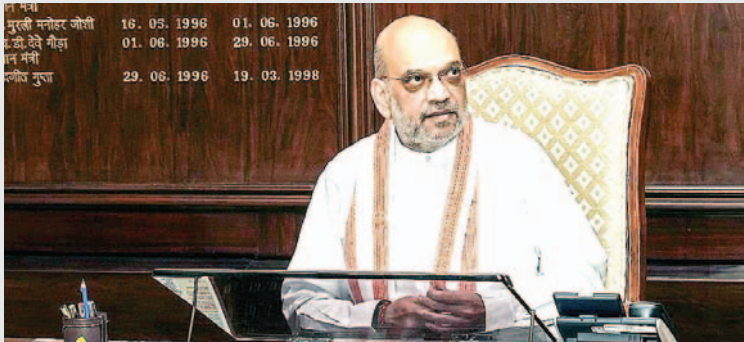
due to negligence in the preparations being done before the monsoon, then strict action will be taken against those responsible. During the meeting, it was informed that 320 flood-prone hotspots had been identified, and short-term schemes had been devised accordingly. To date, 44 schemes have been successfully completed, with work ongoing on 179 schemes.

### Focus will be to resolve remaining issues along border: EAM

**NEW DELHI:** India will focus on resolving the remaining issues along the frontier with China, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Tuesday, amid the over four-year-long border row in eastern Ladakh that significantly strained bilateral ties. Shortly after taking charge of the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), Jaishankar, referring to cross-border terrorism emanating from Pakistan, said efforts will be made to address the challenge. Jaishankar, 69, was among senior BJP leaders, including Rajnath Singh, Amit Shah, Nitin Gadkari and Nirmala Sitharaman, who retained the ministries that they handled in the previous government.

## Delhi govt to approach SC again amid water dispute with Haryana

Amid the water crisis in the national capital during heatwaves and rising temperatures, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader and Delhi Minister Atishi on Tuesday claimed that neighbouring Haryana is releasing less water into the canals of Delhi and the AAP government would approach the Supreme Court again in the matter.

Addressing the media here in the national capital, Atishi said, “As per the directions of the Upper Yamuna River Board, Haryana had to release 1,050 cusecs of water into the Munak canal. But for the past few days, there has been less supply of water into the Munak canal. Haryana was lying that it had released 1,050 cusecs of water. In its affidavit filed with the top court, they have pro-



vided data relating to the release of water into the Munak canal which is further diverged into two routes namely CLC (Carrier Line Channel) and DSB (Delhi Sub-Branch). Accordingly, from May 1 to 22, they only released 719 cu-

secs of water into the CLC and 320 cusecs into the DSB. This means that they had been releasing 1,049 cusecs of water from May 1 to 25.” “From May 23, it started decreasing. The Lok Sabha polls in Delhi were held on May 25. Before that, they decreased the water supply. But now, their lies have been busted. We will submit this data to the Supreme Court. We have also filed an additional affidavit with the apex court and told them how the Haryana government disobeyed it. We will reach the top court regarding the matter. We will also write to the Haryana Chief Minister”, she added. The Delhi minister further said that the “lies” of the Haryana government have been “busted” through its affidavit filed with the apex court.

“The water treatment plants present in Delhi are not able to work up to their full capacity. Whenever we write

to the Haryana government, they keep saying that they are releasing water towards Delhi. So where does the water go? But now their lies have been busted by their affidavit filed with the Supreme Court. The Delhi government knocked on the doors of the top court, it said that the national capital requires water. The Himachal Pradesh government agreed to supply water to Delhi; Haryana only had to give a pass-through. But it stood against that”, Atishi said. “Now, since the matter reached the Supreme Court, the water level of the Wazirabad barrage has been declining”, she further claimed. Meanwhile, the Supreme Court on Monday adjourned for June 12 the hearing of the Delhi government’s plea for the release of surplus water from Himachal Pradesh as the people of the national capital are facing a shortage of water.

## Man climbs atop mobile tower in Chd , demands meeting with Pb CM over land dispute

A fire brigade and an ambulance were deployed near the spot, he said.

The BJP won 78 of 147 seats in the Odisha assembly.

# Manohar Lal takes charge as Power Minister

Former Chief Minister of Haryana Manohar Lal Khattar assumed charge as Power Minister on Tuesday. ML Khattar has been given charge of two ministries in the Narendra Modi-led cabinet - Power and Housing and Urban Affairs Ministries. Khattar has replaced RK Singh who lost elections from Arrah in Bihar. In a post in Hindi on X, Manohar Lal Khattar wrote, "Took charge as Union Power Minister today. Under the successful leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Ministry of Energy will continuously work for 'Developed India'."

Manohar Lal Khattar



won from Karnal defeating Congress' Divyanshu Budhiraja by a margin of 232577 votes. Khattar was the Chief Minister till March this year when the Bharatiya Janata Party suddenly chose to drop him from the post and field

him for the Lok Sabha.

He was replaced by Nayab Singh Saini as the Chief Minister. Khattar, a former Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh pracharak has served as the

Chief Minister for two terms from October 2014 and has been representing Karnal Legislative Assembly since 2014.

In the 2019 Vidhan Sabha elections, he defeated Congress' Tarlochan Singh by a margin of 45,188 votes. In 2014, Khattar won against Independent Candidate Jai Parkash Gupta by a margin of 63,773 votes.

Khattar was the Organizational General Secretary of the BJP in Haryana during 2000-2014 and started the publication of Bhajpa Ki Baat magazine in October 2000. BJP-led National Democratic Alliance has won its third successive term in Lok Sabha polls. The NDA won 293 seats in the Lok Sabha polls with BJP getting 240 seats.

The commission member instructed the police to present the report in Form 15A and B to the child welfare committee in cases of POC-SO Act as per the Act so that the committee can take appropriate decision in the interest of the child.

## 2 accused arrested with 40 grams of heroin

The police spokesperson here said that the district police is continuously taking strict action against drug smugglers and to curb drug smuggling. Working in this series, the team of Hamida Police Chowki has succeeded in arresting a youth who was on bail in a drug smuggling case with 30 grams of heroin (smack). Similarly, the team of Anti Narcotics Cell has arrested an accused with 10 grams of heroin (smack). A case was registered against the accused under the NDPS Act and presented in the court. The police are investigating the matter.

Hamida Chowki Incharge Gurdalay Singh said that his team had received secret information that a youth was roaming with narcotics on

Garhi Road Atma Puri Mode. Based on this information, a team of Sub Inspector Rajiv Kumar, Head Constable Akhilesh, Suresh was formed. The team went to the spot and arrested the youth roaming



there. Duty Magistrate DSP Rajesh Kumar was called on the spot. When the youth was searched in front of him, 30 grams of heroin was recovered from him.

He was identified as Arif alias Pyala, a resident of Atma Puri Colony. A case was registered against

the accused. The accused will be presented in the court. The in-charge said that a case of drug smuggling is already registered against the accused and he is out on bail. As soon as he came, he started the drug business again. The accused used to bring drugs from Uttar Pradesh. Similarly, the team of Anti Narcotics Cell got secret information that a youth is roaming around with drugs. Based on this information, a team of Sub Inspector Satish Kumar, Rishipal, Jasbir Singh, Rajkumar was formed. The team took action and arrested Rohit alias Goldie, a resident of Hamida. When the search was conducted, 10 grams of heroin was recovered from him. A case was registered against the accused and presented in the court.

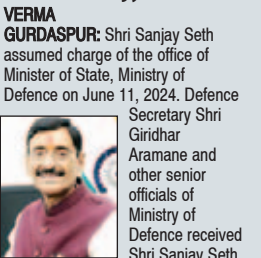

Police busts trans-border narcotic smuggling network; three held

Amidst the ongoing war against drugs waged on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Punjab Police has busted a trans-border narcotic smuggling network with the arrest of three drug smugglers and recovered 8kg heroin from their possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Tuesday.

Those arrested have been identified as Gursahib Singh, a resident of village Jhanjoti in Amritsar, Sajjan Singh of village Bhakna Kalan in Amritsar and Satnam Singh of Kot Khalsa in Amritsar. Apart from recovering heroin consignment, Police teams have also recovered one .30 bore pistol, 26 live cartridges of .30 bore from their possession and impounded their Maruti Swift Car and Splendor motorcycle.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that Counter Intelligence Amritsar has received intel inputs that some drug smugglers have retrieved the huge consignment of heroin dropped



via drone from Indo-Pak border falls near village Dharamkot Pattan and intends to further deliver this consignment to drug supplier Satnam Singh near Kot Khalsa opposite Khalsa College in Amritsar.

Acting swiftly, Police teams led by DSP CI Amritsar Balbir Singh laid special Naka at Adda Khurso Tahli and apprehended Gursahib and Sajjan, when they were travelling on their motorcycle and recovered 7.5 kg heroin and 16 live cartridges from their pos-

session, he said. He said that, later Police teams laid a trap and have also arrested drug supplier Satnam Singh from the area of Kot Khalsa and recovered 500grams heroin and one .30 bore pistol along with 10 live cartridges from his possession and impounded his Swift car.

The DGP said that as per preliminary investigations, the accused persons were directly in touch with the Pakistan-based drug smuggler and were supplying heroin across the state after import-



ing it from Pakistan. Probe has also revealed that the Pakistan-based drug smuggler has used drones to deliver this drug consignment from across the border, he said, while adding that further investigation is going on to find out backward and forward linkages to unveil the entire network. A case FIR No. 34 dated 10-06-2024 has been registered under sections 21, 25 and 29 of the NDPS Act and section 25 of the Arms Act at Police Station State Special Operation Cell Amritsar.

Dy Commissioner directs SDMs Sultanpur Lodhi, Bholath to establish control rooms at both sub divisions

In view of the ensuing monsoon season, the district administration has setup a district level control room to be fully functional by June 15 besides directing officials to establish such control rooms at Sub Division Sultanpur Lodhi & Bholath. Deputy Commissioner Amit Kumar Panchal has instructed the officials of various departments to ensure requisite coordination with line departments in advance so as to tackle any exigency in rainy season.

be ready with medical teams along with medicines besides asking Animal Husbandry officials to make the vaccination of milch-cattle and livestock especially in mand areas. The services of divers and social organization could also be taken, said Panchal adding the advance contact should be made by the officials concerned.

Deputy Commissioner urged the officials of drainage department to lay special focus at sensitive places by keeping regular check of river banks. Panchal directed the officials of Municipal Corporation for timely completion of cleanliness of drainage system to ensure smooth drainage of rain water during the rainy season.

Most of the male workers were at work at the time, leaving women and children in the shanties. Hearing the cries, everyone rushed out and attempted to save whatever belongings they could, but their efforts were in vain. A worker mentioned that an electric pole with a wire had fallen on a grocery and daily essentials shop within the shanties. The spark from the electric wire ignited the shanties.

Additionally, it is reported that a spark from burning garbage nearby may have caused the fire. The shop where the fire started had been filling small gas cylinders for a long time. The shopkeeper managed to escape, but the cylinders began to explode one after another. This incident highlights the precarious living conditions of migrant workers and the potential hazards they face. The loss of property and belongings is a severe blow to the already vulnerable community, emphasizing the need for better safety measures and support for these workers.

## CM reviews various schemes and ongoing projects of Social Justice and Empowerment Department

years. The Chief Minister said that the Public Works Department would design and construct Mukhya Mantri Adarsh Gram Sukhashrya Parisar at Sundernagar in district Mandi which would provide facilities to orphans, widows, single women and elderly persons. He directed to ensure quality construction work for both projects to offer world-class facilities to the beneficiaries. While reviewing the Mukhya Mantri Sukh Ashraya Scheme, the Chief Minister said that a provision up to Rs. 3000 per month would be made for orphans pursuing higher education in case of non-availability of hostel facilities. He instructed the department to focus on providing career counseling to orphaned children,

guiding them towards job-oriented courses and to formulate a Standard Operating Procedure (SoP) for this purpose. Additionally, the department would also offer coaching facilities for these children aspiring to pursue professional courses.

Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that under this scheme, every child of an eligible widow or Ekal Nari up to the age of 27 would be entitled to receive monthly stipend of Rs. 1000. Additionally, all eligible children aged 18 to 27 would be offered free education for higher studies. As a part of this scheme, all eligible women would receive free healthcare under the Himcare Scheme, with the State Government covering the premium costs.

According to the petitioner, since August 1, 2015, the electricity fee for large and medium industrial consumers was set at 11%. However, the notification issued on September 1, 2023, increased it to 17% and 19%, violating Section 11(2) of the Himachal Pradesh Electricity (Duty) Act, 2009. This act allows the state government to increase the already set electricity fee by only up to 50% through notification.

When we were young, we used to tire of the stories by 'old people' that invariably began, "In our times..." and we youngsters groaned, "There they go again!" Nevertheless, we listened politely to the same story for the umpteenth time. Such stories were always about how their world was superior to ours. But I remember that the examples they gave of the wonderful times they had did not impress us much.

The shoe is now on the other foot. And I often hear people much younger than me beginning their observations with exactly the same words, "In our times...", implying the deterioration of society over the years. I certainly do believe that progression in time does not always result in civilisational progress — we lose some and we gain some. Innumerable things have seen a sea change for the better over the last five decades. But I will dwell on some aspects of urban school education that have not improved. For instance, I do not think that the student-teacher relationship in the senior classes has changed much. Perhaps children are less formal with their teachers today but they are still wary of arguing with them or even asking them complicated or existential questions. Priority areas for Jaishankar

External Affairs Minister, S Jaishankar on Tuesday outlined distinct approaches to handling relations with China and Pakistan, asserting that India's foreign policy under the third term of Prime Minister Narendra Modi will focus on finding solutions to "border issues" with Beijing and the "years-old cross-border terrorism" with Islamabad.

Ahead of assuming charge on Tuesday after being sworn in as the country's foreign minister for the second time on Sunday, the career diplomat-politician noted that both the neighbouring countries present unique challenges and India's relations with them are different.

"Our focus with regard to China will be on finding a solution for the border issues," Jaishankar said today, signalling India's commitment to resolving territorial disputes through dialogue and diplomatic channels.

India has time and again faced border issues with China and the situation escalated in 2020, when Indian and Chinese troops clashed at Galwan, the same year the pandemic started. India, in January this year, while reiterating its long-standing position on China, said the two countries continue to engage on the diplomatic and military sides for some sort of resolution.

Meanwhile, addressing the issue of cross-border terrorism emanating from Pakistan, the 69-year-old minister emphasised India's determination to seek a resolution. "With Pakistan, we would want to find a solution to the issue of years-old cross-border terrorism," Jaishankar said.



India has repeatedly emphasised that it will not tolerate cross-border terrorism and it cannot keep aside terrorism to improve ties with Pakistan. New Delhi has also said the onus is on Islamabad to create a conducive atmosphere in which there is no terror, hostility or violence.

Jaishankar, a prominent BJP figure who navigated India's diplomatic strategies during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's second term, reassumed his responsibilities as External Affairs Minister at the Ministry of External Affairs located in South Block today.

Jaishankar also expressed optimism under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership on fulfilling India's aspirations for a seat on the United Nations Security Council (UNSC) within the next five years.

Further he emphasised the multifaceted growth of India's influence on the global stage.

"It has different aspects and I am fully confident that under PM Modi's leadership, the foreign policy of Modi 3.0 will be very successful... For us, the influence of India has been steadily growing, not just in terms of our own perception but also what the other countries think," Jaishankar, who is a Rajya Sabha MP said.

Highlighting India's role as a steadfast ally to the Global South, Jaishankar underscored the country's commitment during times of crisis and its increasing responsibilities on the international

platform. "They feel that India is truly their friend and they have seen that in times of crisis, if there is one country that stands with the Global South, it is India," the country's foreign minister said.

"They have seen that when we put forward the African Union membership during the presidency of G20, the world trusted us and our responsibilities are also increasing, so we also believe that under the leadership of PM Modi, India's identity in the world will definitely increase," Jaishankar said.

After assuming charge today, the External Affairs Minister thanked PM Modi for entrusting him with the responsibility.

"Assumed charge as the Minister of External Affairs. Thank PM Narendra Modi for assigning me this responsibility," said Jaishankar in a post on social media platform X.

Foreign Secretary Vinay Kwatra and Secretary (West) Pawan Kapoor welcomed Jaishankar with a bouquet of flowers on his first day in office in the new PM Modi led National Democratic Alliance (NDA) government.

The stalwart BJP MP in Rajya Sabha from Gujarat since 2019, Jaishankar who has made headlines for his witty replies and oratory skills is at the centre stage in PM Modi's team shaping India's foreign policy for the past decade.

Prior to being the External Affairs Minister in 2019, Jaishankar also served as India's Foreign Secretary from 2015 to 2018. Notably, he also became the first Foreign Secretary to assume the role of External Affairs Minister.

UN Security Council approves US-drafted proposal supporting Gaza ceasefire

Amid rising tensions in West Asia due to the Israel-Hamas war, which is in its eighth month now, the United Nations Security Council passed a resolution vote on the US proposal for a permanent ceasefire and release of the hostages in Gaza on Monday (local time).

The US-drafted text calls for Hamas to accept a ceasefire proposal announced on May 31 by President Joe Biden that has already been accepted by Israel.

The resolution was notably adopted with 14 votes in favor, zero against, and one abstention by Russia, as the country chose not to exercise its veto power.

The resolution that is adopted aims at reaching a comprehensive ceasefire deal in three phases, according to UN News.

The first phase calls for an "immediate, full, and complete ceasefire with the release of hostages, including women, the elderly and the wounded, the return of the remains of some hostages who have been killed, and the exchange of Palestinian prisoners." It demands that Israeli soldiers leave Gaza's "populated



areas," that Palestinians be allowed to return to their homes and communities anywhere in the territory, including the north, and that humanitarian aid be distributed widely and safely.

Whereas Phase Two would see a permanent end to hostilities "in exchange for the release of all other hostages still in Gaza, and a full withdrawal of Israeli forces from Gaza," according to UN News. Phase three, on the other hand, would have a "major multi-year reconstruction plan for Gaza" and the remains of any deceased hostages still in the Strip would be returned to Israel.

Four US college instructors on visit to China stabbed in Jilin public park

Four American instructors from Iowa College who were on a visit to their partner university in China, sustained injuries after being attacked in a stabbing incident in a public park, CNN reported citing a school spokesperson.

The instructors from Cornell College in Mount Vernon, Iowa, were at a public park on Monday (local time) with a faculty member of their partner institution when they were injured "in a serious incident," school President Jonathan Brand said in a statement to the college community.

"We have been in contact with all four instructors and are assisting them during this time," Brand said.

School spokesperson Jen Visser told CNN the stabbing incident happened in Jilin City and the partner school is Beihua University. The US State Department is aware of reports of a stabbing incident in China and is monitoring the situation, according to a spokesperson.

No students were participating in the program, according to the school. Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds said he is in touch with Iowa's federal delegation and the state de-



partment. "I am in touch with Iowa's federal delegation and the state department in response to this horrifying attack. Please pray for their full recovery, safe return, and their families here at home," he said.

Iowa Senator Joni Ernst also said her team is "closely following reports that personnel from Cornell College in Mt. Vernon were stabbed in China."

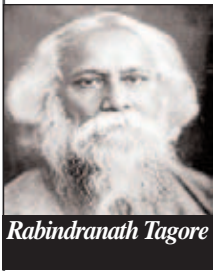
"We are in touch with the college and the State Department and stand ready to further assist these Iowans. Praying for a speedy recovery for all," she said on X.

New York Times cited a video posted on Chinese social media, purportedly taken after the attack, which showed three people lying on the ground, surrounded by onlookers.

BRICS calls for enhanced use of local currencies in trade between member countries

The BRICS ministers of Foreign Affairs met in Russia's Nizhny Novgorod on Monday and held a plethora of discussions, including an important one on the enhanced use of local currencies in trade and financial transactions between the BRICS countries.

At the meeting, the ministers recognized the need for a comprehensive reform of the global financial architecture.

"They recalled the paragraph 45 of the Johannesburg II Declaration tasking the Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors of the BRICS countries to consider the issue of local currencies, payment instruments and platforms and to report back to the BRICS Leaders," according to the Joint Statement.

Further, the foreign ministers reiterated the demand made at COP27 to guarantee that international financial institution reform will prioritise expanding the scope of financing and facilitating easier access to resources.



They anticipated that the 2025 International Bank for Reconstruction and Development shareholder review would be a great success.

As per the Joint statement released by MEA, the leaders also "supported a robust Global Financial Safety Net with a strong quota-based and adequately resourced International Monetary Fund (IMF) at its centre, and also called on

"continuing the process of IMF governance reform including creating a new quota formula reflecting the economic size of its membership" during the overall review of quotas.

In accordance with the Sharm El-Sheikh Action Plan of the COP27, which Egypt hosted in November 2022, the Ministers emphasised the necessity of reforming the policies and practices

of multilateral development banks (MDBs) in order to increase their lending capacities, to be able to better assist developing countries in financing their needs for development and enhancing their climate action. India participated in the BRICS Foreign Ministers' Meeting which began in Russia's Nizhny Novgorod on Monday, the first assignment for India's foreign policy under

the historic third consecutive term of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Dammu Ravi, Secretary (Economic Relations), at the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), led the Indian side at the BRICS Foreign Ministers' Meeting.

"The Ministers encouraged the New Development Bank to follow the member-led and demand-driven principle, employ innovative financing mechanisms to mobilise financing from diversified sources, enhance capacity building and knowledge exchange, including with knowledge sources from developing countries, assist member countries in achieving the SDGs and further improve efficiency and effectiveness to fulfil its mandate, aiming to be a premier multilateral development institution for EMDCs," the Joint Statement read.

They agreed to jointly develop the New Development Bank into a new type of Multilateral Development Bank of the 21st century and urged the Bank to execute its purpose and functions in accordance with the Agreement on the

New Development Bank in a fair manner.

"The Ministers expressed their support to the further expansion of the NDB membership and early consideration of applications of BRICS Member countries as per the NDB approved policies," the statment added.

Moreover, the Ministers also expressed the intention to promote energy cooperation among the BRICS countries.

They urged for resilient global supply chains to ensure universal access to affordable, accessible, reliable, sustainable, and modern energy sources.

The Ministers recalled their national positions concerning the situation in and around Ukraine as expressed in the appropriate fora, including the UN Security Council and UN General Assembly.

"They noted with appreciation relevant proposals of mediation and good offices aimed at peaceful resolution of the conflict through dialogue and diplomacy," the statement read.

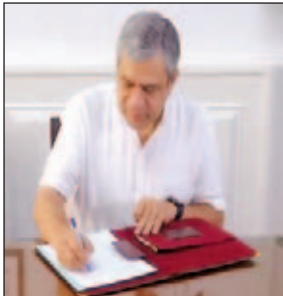

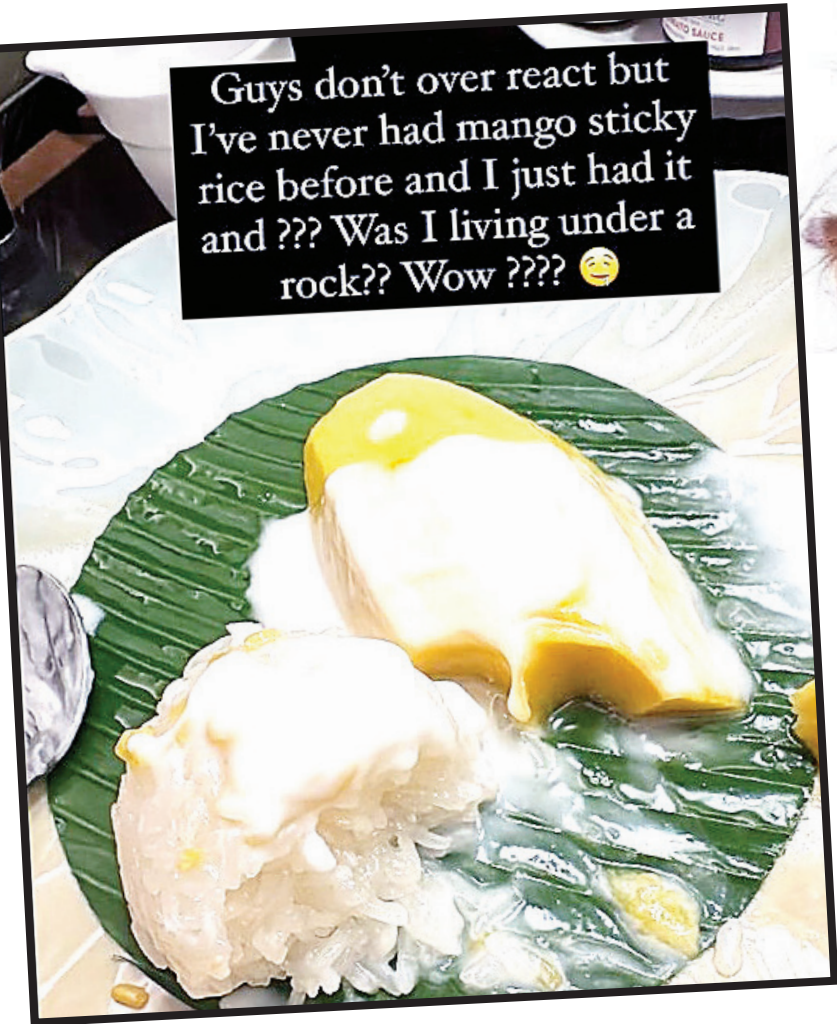
