

9 dead, 50 injured as goods train rams into Kanchanjunga Express

Pilot, co-pilot of train also killed

At least 9 passengers died and 50 others were injured, after three rear coaches of the stationary Sealdah-bound Kanchanjunga Express derailed on Monday morning as a goods train collided with it in West Bengal's Darjeeling district, officials said.

The toll could rise, as multiple agencies of the state and Centre were simultaneously working on war footing along with locals to rescue passengers who could still be trapped inside, they said.

The deceased include the pilot and co-pilot of the goods train, a senior railway official said.

The injured are being taken to the North Bengal Medical College and Hospital, police

President, PM condole loss of lives

NEW DELHI: President Droupadi Murmu, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and other top leaders on Monday expressed their condolences over the accident in Darjeeling involving the Kanchenjunga Express train and a goods train in which at least 15 passengers were killed and over 60 people sustained injuries. "The news of the loss of lives due to a train accident in Darjeeling, West Bengal is deeply distressing. My thoughts and prayers are with the bereaved families. I pray for the speedy recovery of the injured and success of relief and rescue operations," Murmu posted on X.

said. The three rear compartments derailed under the impact of the collision from behind by the locomotive of the goods train near Rangapuri station, about 30 km from North Bengal's New Jalpaiguri station, the official said.

In a post on X, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said the "railway accident in West Bengal is saddening. Condolences to those who lost their loved ones".

"I pray that the injured recover at the earliest. Spoke to officials and took stock of the situation. Rescue operations are underway to assist the affected. The Railways Minister Shri @AshwiniVaishnav Ji is on the way to the site of the mishap as well," he said. The PM also announced that an ex-gratia of Rs 2 lakh would be given to the next of kin of each deceased, while the injured would be provided Rs 50,000.

800 MW Ultra Super Critical Thermal Power Unit to be set up in Haryana: CM

Haryana has taken another significant step towards self-reliance in the field of power generation. Haryana Chief Minister Sh Nayab Singh announced the establishment of an additional 800 MW Ultra Super Critical Thermal Power Unit at the Rajiv Gandhi Thermal Power Plant in Khedar, Hisar, at a cost of Rs 7,250 crore. This initiative will enable Haryana to achieve self-reliance in power generation in the near future.

The Chief Minister was addressing the gathering while launching the Additional Subsidy Scheme in Haryana under 'Pradhan Mantri Suryaghar Free Electricity Scheme' at a state-level function organized in Ambala today. He also distributed certificates to the beneficiaries of the scheme on this occasion. In another important announcement, the Chief Minister declared the abolition of the monthly minimum charge for electricity. From now on, residents of the state will receive bills based solely on the number of units of electricity consumed, providing much-needed relief to electricity consumers.

Amit Shah chairs high-level meeting in Delhi to review Manipur security situation

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday chaired a high-level meeting in the national capital to review the security situation in Manipur. Union Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla, Intelligence Bureau Chief Tapan Deka, Army Chief General Manoj Pande, Army Chief (Designate) Lt General Upendra Dwivedi, GoC Three Core HS Sahi, Security Advisor to Manipur Kuldeep Singh, Manipur Chief Secretary Vineet Joshi, Manipur DGP Rajiv Singh and Assam Rifles DG Pradeep Chandran Nair joined the meeting at the Ministry of Home Affairs in North Block, Delhi. The meeting comes a day after Manipur Governor Anusuiya Uike called on the Home Minister at his office and learned to be briefed about the situations in the north-eastern state. The meeting was held at the Ministry of Home Affairs as fresh violence was reported in the northern state. The northeastern state has been witnessing ethnic violence since May 3 last year following clashes during a rally organised by the All Tribals Students Union (ATSU) to protest against the demand for the inclusion of the Meitei community in the Scheduled Tribe category. In fresh violence, several houses belonging to both Meitei and Kuki communities were burned by unknown miscreants in Kotlen following the murder of a person earlier this month.

For Jharkhand, Union Minister and former Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Shivraj Singh Chauhan has been appointed as State election in-charge and Assam Chief Minister Dr Himanta Biswa Sarma has been appointed as State election co-in-charge.

When the social worker tried to explain to some people who were cutting leaves of trees from the forests, they attacked him with sticks, a complaint of which was given to Pratap Nagar police, on which Pratap Nagar police has registered a case under various sections nam-ing two people. Giving in-formation, Mahipal Rohi-la, a resident of Pratap Nagar, said that he goes out for a walk every morn-ing at 5:00 am and often explains to the people who bring leaves of trees in buggies or trolleys from Khijri, Baghpat, Khillwa-la, Bhangedi etc. from the forest that they should not harm small trees. If you have to cut the leaves of trees, then cut the leaves of big trees. This thing of-fended a person who was carrying leaves in a buggy and at 5 in the morning, he chased social worker Mahipal Rohilla and beat him with sticks.

On getting information of the attack on Mahipal hundreds of youth gathered at the chipper machine where it was found that both the youths were drug addicts and residents of Khillawala. After this, a complaint was given to the police for action against the said two youths. Giving information, Mahipal Rohilla said that he

had earlier also complained to the outgo-ing forest minister about the leaves of trees coming from the forests in buggy and other vehicles but no action was taken in this regard. He said that in this way, the forests are being damaged a lot due to the carrying of leaves of trees on chipper machines by tractor trol-leys and other vehicles and buggies and people living in the foothills of the forest. He also keeps making people aware that small trees should not be harmed. Let us tell you that doz-ens of chipper machines are installed il-legally in the Pratap Nagar area. Where peo-ple of dozens of villages located in the foothills of the forest cut leaves of small and big trees from the forests and sell them on chipper machines. This is not only causing damage to the forests but also the rules are being flouted by the chipper ma-chines which are running without any rules and regulations. The forest department should also take action against them.

In this regard, police station in-charge Pratap Nagar Satnam Singh said that a complaint has been received about Mahi-pal of Pratap Nagar attacking him with sticks, on which a case has been regis-tered against Sajid and Gafar resident Khilawala under section 323,34,341,506 IPC and further action is going on.

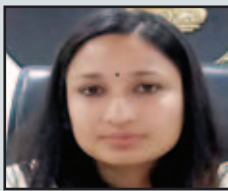

Sukhbir Badal demands independent probe over "EVM mismatch mystery"

Shiromani Akali Dal president Sukhbir Singh Badal today called for an independent and transparent probe at the highest judicial level into allegations of the nationwide fudging of figures and hacking of EVM machines to manipulate the people's mandate in the just concluded Lok Sabha elections.

Citing the huge mismatch in figures released by the Election Commission of India for polling across the country, and not just in Punjab, the Akali leader strongly emphasized that he was not referring to these mismatch mysteries in Punjab alone.

"Therefore, no one should think that I am offering it as an explanation for SAD's or Punjab results. I am talking about the entire country." In a statement here this after-



noon, Mr Badal said that he was "shocked beyond belief" by reports of mismatch in EVM figures in 539 out of 542 constituencies which went to polls. Lakshadweep, Daman & Diu and Amreli (Gujarat) are the only exceptions to this mismatch mystery.

He pointed out that there was a mysterious link between the size of the mismatch and the final result." The differences between the first and the final figures of EVM released by the ECI at

many places was over 12% percent - far more than the difference between the vote share of winners and losers. Higher the mismatch, higher the number of BJP seats. He said that the first and the final count showed a mysterious hike of 12.54% in ODISHA where the BJP got 20 out of 21 seats. Similarly, this hike was 12.54% in Andhra Pradesh where NDA won 21 out of 25. In Assam, the hike was 9.50% and NDA got 11 out of 14 seats."

Referring to Punjab, Mr Badal pointed out that there was a 6.94 % difference between EC's own first and final count in the EVM votes alone. Incidentally, the BJP vote share rose to 18.56% in the state. It may be pointed out that this gap refers to the difference between the first and final figures of the EVM votes alone.

The work on National Highway 03 is currently in full swing, and the excavation of the hillside has resulted in the closure of the road to the Tapre Panchayat office for nearly a week. Despite multiple appeals to the construction company's officials for a resolution, no effective measures have been taken. The Deputy Commissioner has assured the Panchayat head of prompt action to resolve the issue and has directed the relevant authorities to take necessary steps.



Govt to establish 'Centre of Excellence for Divyangjan Education' in Kandaghat: CM

To further refine the project, a visit to the Institute for Empowerment of Persons with Multiple Disabilities in Chennai is planned. This visit aims to study the institute's model and incorporate best practices into the Kandaghat centre," the Chief Minister added.

According to a post on social media X by the State Disaster Response Force: "An American tourist went missing near Kaza district, Lahaul and Spiti while paragliding on 11.06.2024. The body

was found by the district administration but could not be recovered due to harsh conditions." The SDRF later updated on X that a rescue team trekked about 4 km and reached the spot. "The team succeeded in reaching the body at 4 pm," it said on Sunday. The team was expected to reach any kind of motorable road by 9 pm. The victim took a flight from Gete village on June 11 but was hit by the steep side of a hill due strong winds.

CPM fumes over worst-ever water crisis in Shimla town

Communist Party of India (Marxist) expresses serious concern over the severe drinking water crisis in the state capital Shimla, and demanded that immediate and effective steps should be taken to deal with the drinking water crisis. In a statement issued here on Monday party district Secretary and former Mayor Sanjay Chauhan blamed the Shimla Jal Prabandhan Limited for its failure to augment the water supply scheme for the town despite having sufficient provision with the civic body. He alleged that the pick-and-choose policy was being adopted by the SJPNL in water supply. Less water supply was being made to public places and VIPs and Hotels were being served more amount of water. Chouhan demanded



equitable distribution of water so that the general public had an adequate amount of drinking water. The former Mayor urged the government to form a committee under the leadership of public representatives and responsible officials for monitoring at the lower level so that an adequate supply of drinking water could be available to the general public. He claimed that most parts of the town have water supply after a gap of 4 to 6 days, due to which the city dwellers are

facing problems. The CPI-M leader said the supply of water has been reduced drastically due to severe heat and drought conditions and the sudden rise in footfall of tourists. He said civic bodies must distribute around 35 MLD of water to everybody and not be involved in pick and choose policy. The CPM leader stated that even if 100 litres of water is supplied per person in the city, then about 3.5 lakh people could be provided water per day with the water available today.

No respite from scorching heat, PAU CMO asks residents to stay hydrated, avoid physical activity

LUDHIANA: Getting no respite from the blistering heat and in view of unrelenting heatwave taking a toll on residents' health, Punjab Agricultural University (PAU) has issued a communiqué, advising the citizens to take all the necessary precautionary measures to avoid getting sick and to stay hydrated.

Raising concern over the increased chances of the heat stroke in the extreme hot weather, Dr DS Pooni, Chief Medical Officer (I/C), PAU Health Centre, Ludhiana, has called upon the general public to stay hydrated, and consume ample amount of fluids such as cold water as well as homemade beverages like lassi (butter milk) and nimbu paani (lemon water).

He specifically stressed upon restricting the use of highly caffeinated beverages like excess tea and coffee as well as aerated beverage cold drinks with high sugar content. Besides, Dr Pooni advised eating small frequent meals.

About suitable clothing to counter sun blaze, he suggested wearing light-colored cotton clothes which are loose and light weight, and staying under shade using umbrella, caps or hats. Emphasizing on avoiding the strenuous physical activity at the peak sunlight hours from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm, Dr Pooni asked the citizens not to leave their water bottles, hand sanitizers, perfumes, and other canned objects in the parked cars.

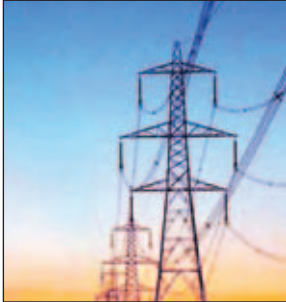


Resolution of electricity-related complaints for Panchkula zone consumers starts

until June 20. IMD has specifically warned of exceptionally heavy rainfall on June 18.

"Assam & Meghalaya is very likely to get isolated heavy (64.5-115.5 mm) to very heavy rainfall (115.5-204.4 mm) on 16th & 17th June and exceptionally heavy rainfall on 18th June whereas likely to get heavy (64.5-115.5 mm) to very heavy rainfall (115.5-204.4 mm) on 19 & 20th June," IMD said on its official Twitter account

on Sunday. Meanwhile, in response to the flooding, Chief Engineer Project Swastik and his team conducted an assessment of flood-affected areas in Sikkim. Singapore: Beaches on three islands shut after oil spill spread to several coastlines

The authorities on Sunday announced that the beaches on three Singapore islands will be shut until further notice after an oil spill on Friday spread to several coastlines, Channel News Asia (CNA) reported.

The beaches at St John's, Lazarus and Kusu islands will be closed after oil slicks were seen at the first two islands.

Staff from NParks, together with volunteers from Friends of Marine Park, visited St John's and Lazarus islands on Sunday to observe and document the effect of the oil spill in these areas.

The closure of the beaches at the islands is in addition to areas B to H of East Coast Park, as well as the jetty and rocky shore of Labrador Nature Reserve, which have been shut since Saturday, according to CNA report.

Sentosa's beaches remain open for people. However, sea activities and swimming are still not permitted at Tanjong, Palawan and Siloso beaches.

As of 1:30 pm on Sunday, there were no signs of oil slick within Sisters' Islands Marine Park. However, the oil sheen was witnessed in the surrounding waters.

The latest update was a joint statement released by the Maritime and Port Authority (MPA), the National Environment Agency (NEA), the National Parks Board (NParks) and Sentosa Development Corporation (SDC) on Sunday evening.

Oil washed up on some of the beaches of Singapore after dredger Vox Maxima hit stationary bunker vessel Marine Honour at Pasir Panjang Terminal on Friday at about 2:20 pm (local time). This causes some oil from a cargo tank on the bunker vessel to spill into the water.

Maritime and Port Authority (MPA) is working with British Marine, the insurer of the stationary tanker, to set up a contact for third-party claims by "affected parties who



have been impacted". In the joint statement, the authorities said the dredger had reported a sudden loss in engine and steering control before it hit the bunker vessel on Friday. This resulted in the rupture of the vessel's oil cargo tanks and its contents of low-sulphur fuel oil were released into the sea. MPA patrol craft were being used to spray dispersants on the spill. The authority's response contractor was activated and they mobilised an oil skimmer to reduce the impact of the spill. The craft skims and lifts the oil off the water surface into storage tanks. The authorities said, "Booms were also laid around the vessels thereafter as added precaution in case of fur-

ther leaks from the vessel." It further said, "Due to the tidal currents, parts of the oil spillage have landed along the southern shorelines including Sentosa, Labrador Nature Reserve, Southern Islands, Marina South Pier, and East Coast Park." MPA has been carrying out the investigation and the master of the vessel and its crew are assisting in the probe. Oil recovery efforts are being conducted at sea. Oil Spill Response Limited (OSRL), the largest international industry-funded cooperative providing oil spill response services, is helping in the clean-up efforts. It will deploy two floating containment and recovery devices and consists of a boom with a skirt that

extends below the water surface to corral and concentrate the oil on the water surface, CNA r As of 1:30 pm on Sunday, no oil slick has been reported in the Traffic Separation Scheme of the Singapore Strait, and navigation remains unimpacted. Port operations continue to remain normal. People have been advised to keep away from the impacted beaches as clean-up operations are being conducted. Close to 1,500m of containment booms have been deployed since Friday at various places, including the three beaches at Sentosa, the entrance of Keppel Marina, off Labrador Nature Reserve, East Coast Park and West Coast Park, according to CNA report.

Bandits in Pakistan using women's voices to lure victims

Bandits in the Kutcha regions of Sindh, spanning districts like Thatta, Kandhkot, and Kashmore, have adopted a new tactic to deceive and rob unsuspecting victims: they employ women's voices to lure and ensnare their prey, The Express Tribune reported.

Once infamous as no-go zones due to rampant highway robbery, these areas are now witnessing a new wave of trickery that has alarmed residents, particularly in Thatta.

In a recent incident, two labourers, Muhammad Rahim Jakhro and Wahid Bakhsh Jakhro from Chatto Chand in Thatta, fell victim to this ploy. They were enticed by what they believed to be female voices, beckoning them to meet in Ghouspur, Kandhkot, as reported by The Express Tribune.

Police stationed at the last checkpoint in the Kutcha area became suspicious and intercepted the men for questioning. The labourers confessed they were responding to an invitation they received. Upon investigating the phone numbers



provided by the victims, police discovered they belonged to the bandits orchestrating the deceitful scheme. These imposters posing as hosts even threatened the police, warning them against interference. Undeterred by the threats, law enforcement promptly escorted the labourers to the office of the Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP), ensuring their safe return to Thatta, The Express Tribune reported.

As temperatures soar, six Haj pilgrims die from heatstroke in Mecca

Six people lost their lives from heatstroke during the Haj pilgrimage to Mecca, CNN reported on Sunday.

The Jordanian foreign ministry confirmed Saturday that all six deceased were Jordanians and that the country was coordinating with Saudi officials in Jeddah on burial procedures and the probable return of their bodies to Jordan.

The news of the fatalities comes as pilgrims gathered atop Mount Arafat on Saturday, commemorating the pilgrimage's main event.

The Saudi General Authority for Statistics reported that over 1.8 million pilgrims will perform Haj this year.

The Haj is one of the world's largest religious gatherings and the major annual event in Saudi Arabia. It is considered one of the five pillars of Islam.

This year, Saudi Arabia is experiencing excessive heat throughout the five-day pilgrimage, with temperatures hitting 48 degrees Celsius in Mecca.

According to the state news agency SPA, Haj officials are advising pilgrims to



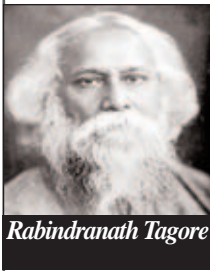
bring umbrellas and stay hydrated under extreme weather conditions. The Saudi army has also dispatched over 1,600 soldiers, including medical units specialised for heatstroke and 30 rapid response teams, according to CNN. Another 5,000 health and first aid volunteers are taking part.

Jordan had said that its official delegation this year consisted of over 4,000 pilgrims. However, the foreign ministry confirmed that the six who died were not members of the "official delegation," which meant they lacked proper Hajj licences to conduct the journey, according to CNN.

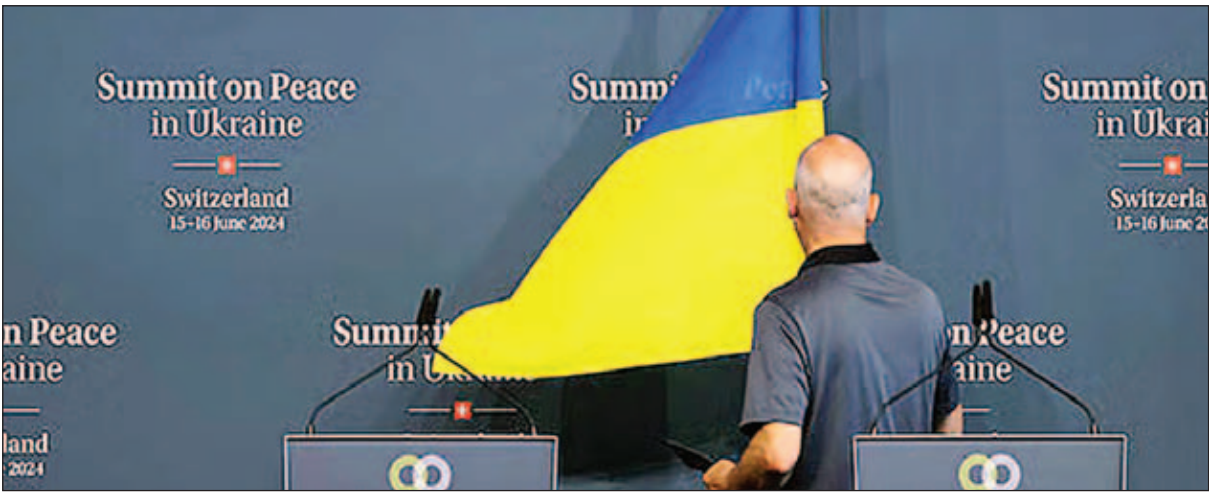

India shared its view on the Swiss summit on peace in Ukraine on Sunday and stated that it will continue to engage with everyone involved, including both sides of the conflict, to help achieve lasting peace in Ukraine.

"India shares the global concern over the situation in Ukraine and supports any collective desire to facilitate a peaceful resolution of the conflict. We will continue to engage with all stakeholders, as well as the two parties to the conflict, to contribute to all earnest efforts to achieve lasting peace in Ukraine," said Pavan Kapoor, Secretary (West) Ministry of External Affairs, who represented India at the Summit on Peace in Ukraine, hosted by Switzerland at Burgenstock.

The Indian delegation attended the opening and closing plenary sessions of the summit, which began on June 15 and concluded on June 16, bringing together representatives from 92 countries and organisations. Russia was not invit-



ed to the summit while China decided not to attend it.

In a brief address, the senior Indian diplomat said, "Our participation in this summit and continued engagement with

all stakeholders is with a view to understanding different perspectives, approaches and options to find a way forward for a sustainable resolution of the conflict."

Accordingly, New Delhi will continue to engage with all stakeholders as well as the two parties to the conflict to contribute to all earnest efforts to achieve lasting peace in Ukraine,

The Indian delegation attended the opening and closing plenary sessions of the summit, which began on June 15 and concluded on June 16, bringing together representatives from 92 countries and organisations. Russia was not invited to the summit while China decided not to attend it.

Kapoor said, according to the Ministry of External Affairs press release.

"In our view, only those options acceptable to both parties can lead to abiding peace. In line with this approach, we

have decided to avoid association with the Joint Communiqué or any other document emerging from this summit," Kapoor said.

The release also said that India continues to believe that such a resolution requires a sincere and practical engagement between the two parties to the conflict "India's participation in the Summit on Peace in Ukraine, as well as in the preceding NSA/Political-Director level meetings based on Ukraine's Peace Formula, is in line with our clear and consistent approach that enduring peace can be achieved only through dialogue and diplomacy," said MEA.

"We continue to believe that such a peace requires bringing together all stakeholders and a sincere and practical engagement between the two parties to the conflict," the MEA added.

According to MEA, "We deem it important to join this gathering that seeks to explore the way forward to a negotiated settlement of a very complex.

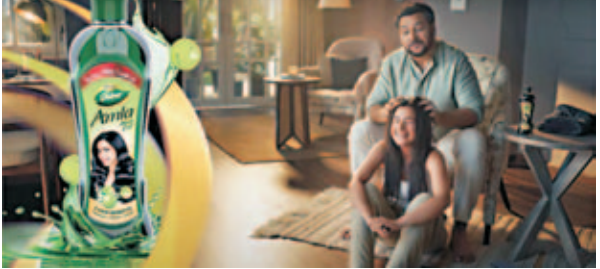

Delhi: Power outage at IGI airport due to voltage spike

NEW DELHI: A power outage was reported at Terminal 3 of the Indira Gandhi International Airport in Delhi on Monday. As a result of the same, check-in and boarding facilities were impacted for a while, said an official. "Around 2 p.m. today, Delhi Airport's Main Receiving Sub-station (MRSS) detected a significant voltage spike at the grid, reportedly due to the

tripping of a 765KV line. This voltage imbalance from the Delhi Transco Limited (DTL) Grid briefly impacted all IGI terminals, affecting baggage acceptance and e-gates", said a spokesperson of Delhi International Airport Limited (DIAL) while speaking to ANI.

"To maintain essential services, we proactively switched all terminals to DG load. The power backup system, installed by Delhi Inter-

national Airport Limited (DIAL), was operationalised within a few minutes, and all back-up procedures were initiated to facilitate passengers at all touchpoints", he added. The DIAL official further said that the grid voltage had stabilized and was accepted at the MRSS breaker and all services were smoothly transitioned back from DG load to DTL grid load by 3 p.m.

Accelerate construction of 'Azadi ki pehli ladai ka Shaheed Smarak' based on First War of Independence: Vij

Patna DM extends summer vacations in govt-run, private schools

The order is issued under section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

The District Magistrate of Patna, Shirsat Kapil Ashok, issued an order to prohibit all educational activities up to class 8 in all governmental and private education institutes of Patna district. However, the teaching and non-teaching staff are ordered to remain in the school and continue their services.

"Whereas, it has been made to appear to me that due to prevalent heat waves and high temperatures predicted by IMD in the district, the health and life of students are at risk," the order reads. "Therefore, I, Shirsat Kapil Ashok, IAS, District Magistrate, Patna, under section 144 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973, hereby prohibit the educational activities up to Class VIII in all government and private schools of Patna district. During the said period, the teachers and non-teaching staff of the school will remain present in the school/office and perform their duties.

Only after registration, the parents of the married girl will be given a grant under the Chief Minister's Marriage Shagun Scheme. If the name of the Scheduled Caste and Vimukta caste family is in the BPL list, then it will get the benefit of Rs 71 thousand under the Chief Minister's Marriage Shagun Scheme. Widow women, helpless women, orphan children of all categories are in the BPL list or their income is less than one lakh 80 thousand rupees, then they will be given a grant of Rs 51 thousand under this scheme. The general or backward class family in the BPL list will get a grant of Rs 31 thousand. Similarly, the Scheduled Caste or Vimukta caste family is not in the BPL list and whose annual income is less than one lakh 80 thousand rupees, they will be given a grant of Rs 31 thousand.

Teenager dies after falling into toilet pit

It is not known how he fell down the stairs and fell into the cemented pit of the toilet below, which was filled with water. Naresh told that Sumit died due to drowning and getting injured after falling in the pit. When Nirmal reached there in the afternoon, he found Sumit fallen in the pit and took him out and took him to MM Hospital Mullana.



"Will be long time, just as it was with Hadlee":
Ian Smith on challenge of replacing Trent Boult

New Delhi : Former New Zealand player and commentator Ian Smith believes it will be hard for the Kiwis to find Trent Boult's replacement.

New Zealand have already crashed out of the tournament. His last appearance for the Blackcaps in the marquee event will be against Papua New Guinea on Monday at Brian Lara Cricket Academy. After their convincing win over Uganda, Boult confirmed that the ongoing T20 World Cup would be his last appearance in the extravagant tournament for the Blackcaps.

"Speaking on behalf of myself, this will be my last T20 World Cup. That's all I have to say," Boult said, confirming his last appearance in T20 WC at the press conference.

Smith ruminated the left-arm pacer's decision and opined that finding a player to replace Boult would be a demanding challenge for the Kiwis.

"In New Zealand, when we'd think about replacing Trent Boult, we'll have to dig very deep. And right now, we can't. We haven't got a left-arm bowler of world-class ability in our ranks at the moment," Smith said as quoted from the ICC.

Smith compared Boult's impact with the iconic New Zealand pacer Sir Richard Hadlee. In the 1970s and 80s, Hadlee was considered one of that era's top all-rounders. He ended his career with 431 Test wickets which is still a record in New Zealand.

AGENCY KINGSTOWN : Tanzim Hasan Sakib's terrific four-wicket haul sealed Bangladesh's place in ICC T20 World Cup 2024 Super 8s after the Tigers registered a 21-run win over Nepal at the Arnos Vale Ground on Sunday (local time).

Bangladesh became the final team to make the T20 World Cup Super Eights. Nepal was bowled out for 85 and this is the lowest total ever defended by a team in Men's T20 World Cups. With Bangladesh sealing a place in the Super 8s, the Netherlands has been knocked out of the tournament.

Tanzim at the start and Mustafizur Rahman at the end were brilliant. Mustafizur bagged three wickets while Tanzim returned with the figure of 4-7.

Nepal's run chase of 107 runs was anything but smooth sailing in the early stages. A double-wicket maiden in the third over caused a spicy exchange involving bowler Tanzim Hasan Sakib, as the pressure gauge went up in St. Vincent.

Nepal stumbled to 24/4 through the Powerplay, leaving themselves a mountain of work to do at the six-over mark. Sundeeep Jora was out

next over, as Nepal fell to five-for and was in a world of trouble. But up stepped Kushal Malla and Dipendra Singh Airee, helping steady the ship and keep the run chase within the realms of achievability.

They scrapped their way to 42/5 at drinks and toiled towards a run-a-ball assignment, with a big 16th over placing the match firmly in the balance. Two boundaries by Kushal Malla took the part-

nership to up over 50 and with four overs to go, the required run rate was down to 7.5.

It came down to them needing 30 in 24. However, Mustafizur Rahman gave away just the 1 run in the 17th and got the wicket of Malla and in the 19th he then got Dipendra Singh Airee and bowled a maiden. Shakib Al Hasan then bowled the last two overs and picked two in two to seal the game.

Nepal bowlers unleashed their fury to floor Bangladesh batters for 106 in their Group D match.

Earlier, Sompal Kami with the new ball was the architect of Bangladesh's batting collapse on a pitch that had decent grass cover later it was the captain Rohit Paudel who bagged two important wickets, making use of the favourable bowling conditions on offer. Bangladesh posted 106

thanks to Mustafizur Rahman and Taskin Ahmed's 18-run last-wicket partnership.

Opting to bowl first, Nepal's Kami made the most out of the pitch as he removed Tanzid Hasan for a golden duck in the very first over of the game. Building on that early breakthrough, Dipendra Singh in the second over gave Bangladesh another blow, removing Najmul Hossain Shanto for 4.

Gambhir took to X on Monday to share a glimpse of his meeting with the Union Home Minister and stated that his leadership will strengthen the security and stability of India.

"Met with Hon'ble HM Shri @AmitShah Ji to congratulate him on recent electoral success. His leader-

ship as the Home Minister will further strengthen the security and stability of our nation!" Gambhir wrote on X.

Last week, Amit Shah took charge of India's Home Ministry for the second consecutive term under the Modi 3.0 Cabinet. He has been holding the portfolio since 2019.

In the 2024 Lok Sabha Election, Shah won Gujarat's Gandhinagar seat by a huge margin of 7,44,712 votes. He gathered 10,10,972

votes beating Congress' Sonal Patel who got 2,66,256.

In the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, Shah won with a margin of 5,57,014 votes. The seat was previously held by BJP veterans like LK Advani and Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

While Gambhir has been heavily linked to the head coach position of the Indian men's team. The Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) is evaluating the next head coach as the stint of Rahul Dravid is about to reach its conclusion following the end of the T20 World Cup 2024 in June.

Earlier in the month, he confirmed his interest in taking up the role and said, "I have not answered this question, although a lot of people have asked me. But I have to answer you now. I would love to coach the Indian team. There is no bigger honour than coaching your national team.

Neeraj Chopra to compete in Paavo Nurmi Games 2024



TURKU: Reigning Olympic and world champion Neeraj Chopra will be in action in the men's javelin throw competition at the Paavo Nurmi Games 2024 athletics meet in Turku, Finland on Tuesday.

All eyes will be on Neeraj, who will be competing in his third event of the season.

The reigning world champion finished second in the Doha Diamond League in his season opener with an 88.36m throw before bagging the gold medal at the Federation Cup in Bhubaneswar in May - his first competition in India since the Tokyo Olympics.

The 26-year-old Indian javelin thrower had pulled out of the Ostrava Golden Spike athletics meet in Czechia late last month as an injury precaution but is on the entry list for the Paavo Nurmi Games 2024.

The Tokyo 2020 gold medalist will have the opportunity to test himself against a star-studded field in Turku, which includes Germany's 19-year-old Max Dehning.

Dehning became the youngest javelin thrower to enter the 90m club when he recorded a

90.20m throw at the Winter Throwing Championships in Halle in February. Neeraj is yet to touch the 90m mark in his career. He has a personal best of 89.94m which is also the men's javelin throw national record in India.

Two-time world champion Anderson Peters of Grenada and 2012 Olympic champion Keshorn Walcott of Trinidad and Tobago will also be in action at Turku. Finland's Oliver Helander, who beat Neeraj to win the gold medal at the Paavo Nurmi Games in 2022, is also in the fray.

However, Olympic silver medalist Jakub Vadlejch of Czechia, who beat Neeraj in the Doha Diamond League last month, and World Championships silver medalist Arshad Nadeem of Pakistan have pulled out of this meet.

The Paavo Nurmi Games 2024 will be broadcast live on the Sports 18 TV channel in India. Live streaming of the Paavo Nurmi Games athletics meet will also be available for live streaming on Jio Cinema.

Neeraj Chopra is scheduled to take the field in the men's javelin throw event on Tuesday from 9:45 PM IST (Indian Standard Time) onwards.

T20 World Cup: A look at groups, venues, key clashes for Super Eights stage

NEW DELHI : As the initial group stage of the ICC Men's T20 World Cup 2024 comes to a close, the next chapter in the event, the Super Eights stage, will start from June 18 onwards with a clash between South Africa and co-hosts USA at Antigua and Barbuda.

India (Group A), USA (Group A), Australia (Group B), England (Group B), Afghanistan (Group C), West Indies (Group C), South Africa (Group D) and Bangladesh (Group D) are the eight teams who have qualified for the Super Eights.

India, Australia, Afghanistan, and Bangladesh will feature in Group 1 of the next round, whereas West Indies, South Africa, England, and the USA will feature in Group 2, as per ICC.

Teams will play three matches each during the Super Eight phase, with the



top two sides in each group qualifying for the semi-final stage of the event.

The same evening West Indies will take against old rivals, England in St Lucia. The two sides have a prolific cricketing history, with the Men in Maroon ensuring a dominant display at home

against England in the recent years.

The following day will see the unbeaten India and Afghanistan face off in Barbados in what looms as a crucial fixture prior to the knockout stages of the tournament. This will also be the first occasion on this tourna-

ment that India will play a contest in the Caribbean.

The rampant Afghans will look to make amends for their close loss to Australia at last year's ICC Men's Cricket World Cup when the two sides meet on June 22 in St Vincent.

Back-to-back games against formidable oppo-

nents can overwhelm most sides but Rashid Khan's team have shown an indomitable fighting spirit in the tournament thus far.

More crucial fixtures follow up in coming dates: with co-hosts West Indies taking on South Africa in their final Group 2 clash on June 23 in Antigua. The Proteas have historically dominated the West Indies, but the tables were turned last month when the Men in Maroon clean-swept the three-game T20I series between the two sides at home.

Another Men's Cricket World Cup-centric encounter takes place in St Lucia, where finalists India will clash against the 2023 WC winners Australia on June 24.

Antigua, Barbados, St Lucia, and St Vincent will host all 12 games in this round.
