Sensex breaches 78k level for 1st time

MUMBAI: Benchmark Sensex breached the historic 78,000 level for the first time while Nifty settled at a new record high on Tuesday on buying in blue-chip bank stocks and Reliance Industries amid firm trends in Asian markets. The 30-share BSE Sensex jumped 712.44 points or 0.92 per cent to settle at a new closing peak of 78,053.52. During the day, the benchmark soared 823.63 points or 1 per cent to hit a fresh lifetime high of 78,164.71.

Jammu base camp gets 3-tier security ahead of annual Amarnath Yatra

JAMMU: A three-tier security system has been put in place in and around for the Amarnath base camp in Jammu under the charge of Jammu and Kashmir Police's security wing. Forces have carried out search and sanitisation operations to ensure a safe commencement of the annual yatra from June 28 in Jammu. The 52-day pilgrimage to the holy cave shrine of Amarnath, located at a height of 3,880 metres, will commence from the twin tracks -- the traditional 48-kilometre Nunwan-Pahalgam route in Anantnag and the 14-kilometre shorter but steeper Baltal route in Ganderbal -- on June 29.

Two HSSC members administered oath

CHANDIGARH: Haryana Staff Selection Commission Chairman, Sh. Himmat Singh administered the oath of office and secrecy to two new members of the commission, Sh. Subhash Chander and Sh. Sadhu Ram Jakhar, at the commission office today. Sh. Subhash Chander hails from Ganga village in Sirsa district, and Sh. Sadhu Ram Jakhar is from Barwala, Hissar. Notably, on June 8, 2024, Sh. Himmat Singh was sworn in as the chairman of the commission, and with the swearing-in of two more members today, the quorum of the commission is now complete. The commission will soon commence the recruitment process for over 50,000 new positions announced by the government.

Nagpur airport receives second bomb threat in 24 hour

NAGPUR:) The Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar International Airport here received a bomb threat early Tuesday morning, second in 24 hours, but nothing suspicious was found upon search, a senior official said. An email about a bomb in the toilet was received a little after midnight, the airport official said. A similar threatening email had been received by the Airports Authority of India on Monday morning too. Security agencies searched the airport but nothing suspicious was found, he said.

HC stays bail granted to Kejriwal in money laundering case

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JUNE 25

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday stayed the trial court order granting bail to Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the money laundering case stemming from the alleged excise scam.

A vacation bench of Justice Sudhir Kumar Jain said the trial court failed to appreciate the material placed before it by the Enforcement Directorate and did not apply its mind while deciding the AAP leader's bail plea.

The judge also said the trial court ought to have given adequate opportunity to the agency to argue its case.

This court is of the view that the trial court has not applied its mind and has not considered the material properly.

The bench had reserved the order on June 21 after the agency challenged the trial court's decision, which has been put on hold until the ruling. Meanwhile, the Court has already fixed the main matter for July, where ED challenged the trial court order granting Arvind Kejriwal regular bail in the case.

On Monday, ED filed written submissions before the Delhi High Court opposing any relief to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the Excise Policy money laundering case. ED opposed the trial court order granting bail to Kejriwal and called the order illegal and perverse.

ED submitted that the impugned order passed by the trial court deserves to be stayed and set aside as a vacation judge has returned perverse findings in almost every paragraph of its order on both the facts and the law after admittedly not examining the material placed on record by the prosecution, ED told Delhi High Court.



ED further stated that new material collected against Arvind Kejriwal post 2023 was not considered by the vacation judge.

Enforcement Directorate lists statements of 13 Angariyas, Goa AAP workers, and AAP office bearers as new statements. Denial of ample opportunity to the Enforcement Directorate is a violation of one of the conditions of Section 45, says ED to Delhi High Court.

The Supreme Court on Monday ad-

joined for June 26 the plea of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal challenging the order of the Delhi High Court granting an interim stay on bail to him in the Delhi excise policy case probed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED).

A vacation bench of Justices Manoj Misra and SVN Bhatti observed that the decision of the High Court to grant an interim stay on Kejriwal's bail without passing a final order in the matter was "unusual".

AAP to move Supreme Court

NEW DELHI: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) on Tuesday said it disagrees with the Delhi High Court order staying the bail granted to Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal by the trial court and will challenge it in the Supreme Court. The trial court had granted bail to Kejriwal on June 20 in the money laundering case stemming from the alleged Delhi excise policy scam and ordered his release on a personal bond of Rs 1 lakh. The high court stayed the trial court order on Tuesday.

Centre is stopping all funds of Punjab: AAP

The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Punjab vehemently attacked the BJP government of the centre for stopping Sarva Shiksha abhiyan (SSA) fund of Punjab. The party said that the Modi government is already withholding NHM (National Health Mission) and RDF (Rural Development Fund) of Punjab and now they stopped money which goes to the education of children in Primary schools, the BJP wants to stop the development and progress of Punjab. Addressing a press conference at the party office on Tuesday, AAP spokesperson Neel Garg cornered the BJP government for having step motherly attitude towards Punjab and urged the Punjab MPs and BJP leaders to raise this issue of pending funds with the central government. He was accompanied by AAP

spokespersons Babbi Badal and Jasman Gill for this press conference.

Neel Garg said that it is a matter of the education of young children and their future. The AAP leader said that the step motherly behaviour of the BJP towards Punjab is not new but what is more shameful is that this time they are putting the education of children at stake. Garg said that India has a federal structure and a constitution, through which central and state governments are supposed to work together for the development of the people but the Modi government is doing the opposite, they are creating obstacles and withholding funds of the state government to stop the progress.

The AAP leader said that the Modi government has stopped Rs. 380 crores of SSA, this money is for the education of young children in Primary schools.

Afghanistan book Semi final berth in T20 WC

Afghanistan qualified for the semi-final of the ongoing T20 World Cup 2024 after beating Bangladesh by eight runs in the Super Eights match at the Arnos Vale Ground on Tuesday.

Rashid Khan and Naveen-ul-Haq led the Afghan bowling attack and helped their side defend the given target of 115. The second inning of the match was reduced to 19 overs, and the target was 114 runs after Rain played a spoilsport in the second inning.

After the defeat, Mitchell Marsh-led Australia are also out of the tournament. The Aussies ended up in third place in the Group 1 table of the Super Eights with just two points.

Litton Das (54* runs from 49 balls, 5

fours, and 1 six) was the only stand-out batter for the Tigers after his unbeaten knock.

Soumya Sarkar (10 runs from 10 balls, 1 four) and Towhid Hridoy (14 runs from 9 balls, 2 fours) tried their best to form a partnership with Litton, but they struggled to face the Afghan bowlers, who were ferocious while defending the target.

Naveen-ul-Haq and Rashid Khan picked up four wickets each in their respective spells. Fazalhaq Farooqi and Gulbadin Naib also bagged one wicket each in their respective spells and helped the Afghan side win the match by eight runs.

Naveen removed Mustafizur Rahman from the crease in the fifth ball of the 18th over to end the match early.



Naveen-ul-Haq was named the 'Player of the Match' after he displayed a stupendous performance while defending the target given by Afghani-

stan. Recapping the first inning of the match, after winning the toss, Rashid Khan-led Afghanistan decided to bat first. However, their decision did not go in their favour as they struggled to add runs to the scoreboard. Afghanistan had a great start to the match after openers Rahmanullah Gurbaz (43 runs from 55 balls, 3 fours and 1 six) and Ibrahim Zadran (18 runs from 29 balls, 1 four) played a 59-run partnership. Rashid Hossain made the first breakthrough of the game after he removed Zadran in the 11th over. Azmatullah Omarzai (10 runs from 12 balls) tried his best to contribute to the game but failed to make a mark after Mustafizur Rahman dismissed him in the 16th over.

UK PM Sunak withdraws party support from 2 candidates

Adding to the turmoil for an embattled Rishi Sunak, the British Prime Minister on Tuesday decided to withdraw his party's backing from two of his Conservative colleagues embroiled in a betting scandal over the date of the general election. The move comes just over a week before the July 4 polls after days of the row dominating the campaign headlines, with the Opposition demanding the suspension of those accused. A Conservative Party spokesperson confirmed that Tory candidates Craig Williams and Laura



Saunders will no longer have the party's backing to contest as MPs from Montgomeryshire and Glyndwr in Wales and Bristol North West in England respectively.

Hry CM chairs HPWPC meeting, approves works worth Rs. 825 crore

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Nayab Singh chaired the High Powered Works Purchase Committee (HPWPC) held late last evening and gave approval for works worth about Rs. 825 crore . Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister, Sh. Kanwar Pal, Industry and Commerce Minister, Sh. Mool Chand Sharma, Energy Minister, Sh. Ranjit Singh, Minister of State for Development and Panchayats, Sh. Mahipal Dhanda, other senior officers also attended the meeting.

In this meeting, final approval was given for the tender of 96 houses to be built for police personnel in Ambala at a cost of about Rs. 19 crore. Apart from this, approval was given for construction work worth Rs. 9.47 crore in Regional Research Station of Maharana Pratap Horticulture University in village Kharkhari, Bhiwani district and Rs. 358 crore in Karnal of the same university.

Similarly, approval was granted to a proposal regarding spending of Rs. 111 crore for replacing high capacity conductor in electricity depart-



way line in Rewari district, Rs. 15.80 crore for making Panipat-Dahar road 4-lane in Panipat district and Rs. 41.50 crore for recharging Krishnawati river from Narnaul branch. Besides this, approval was also given to the, works worth Rs. 14.30 crore for construction of Government Women College in village Ladana Chakku of Kaithal district, Rs. 13.60 crore for construction of new building of Government College in Rajound.

PM reminds Congress of dark days of 1975's Emergency

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday took to social media to hit out at the Congress as he rake up the 15-month-long state of Emergency imposed in 1975 by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi.

A day after the Congress-led opposition's INDIA bloc raised slogans against the BJP for being the prime threat to the nation's Constitution, Modi slammed back with "those who imposed the Emergency have no right to

profess their love for our Constitution".

Recalling the Emergency that lasted from June 25, 1975 to March 21, 1977, as "Dark Days", PM Modi said, "The day will remind us of how the Congress Party subverted basic freedoms and trampled over the Constitution of India which every Indian respects greatly".

Modi in a series of posts on social media X, hit out at the Congress saying that the



mindset which led to the imposition of that Emergency is "very much still alive among

the same Party". He said: "Today is a day to pay homage to all those great men and women who resisted the Emergency."

The PM's remarks came as the country remembered June 25, 2024, the 49th anniversary of the imposition of Emergency.

Modi said: "Just to cling on to power, the then Congress Government disregarded every democratic principle and made the nation into a jail. Any person who disagreed

with the Congress was tortured and harassed. Socially regressive policies were unleashed to target the weakest sections."

Attacking the Congress party indirectly, the Prime Minister said, "Those who imposed the Emergency have no right to profess their love for our Constitution".

"These are the same people who have imposed Article 356 on innumerable occasions, got a Bill to destroy press freedom, destroyed federalism and violated every aspect of the Constitution," he continued.

Awareness programs on new Criminal Laws across all 378 police stations on July 1

Haryana Chief Secretary, Sh TVSN Prasad, announced today that comprehensive awareness programs will be conducted across all 378 police stations and prisons in the State on July 1, 2024. The initiative aims to educate the public about the three new Criminal Laws: Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, and Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam 2023. TVSN Prasad made this revelation during a meeting chaired by the Union Home Secretary through video conferencing, here today. The meeting reviewed the readiness of the States for the nationwide implementation of these new Criminal Laws starting from July 1. The Chief Secretary expressed pride in Haryana's



role in this significant reform of the criminal justice system and highlighted the steps taken for the smooth rollout of these laws. Approximately 40,000 police personnel, including Investigating Officers (IOs), have been trained at various State training centers. Furthermore, 300 Judicial Officers from Haryana have received training on the new Criminal Laws at the Chandigarh Judicial Academy. Recently, an online training program was conducted for IAS and HCS Officers by the Haryana Institute of Public Administration (HIPA), Gurugram, aimed at familiarizing officers with the intricacies of the new laws. Similar programs will also be conducted at the Divisional Level in offline mode, he added. Sh Prasad emphasized that all jails in the state are equipped with adequate

technical infrastructure, including around 300 desktops. In preparation for virtual court proceedings, 149 video conferencing systems have already been installed across jails and court complexes, with an additional 178 systems set to be procured. He said that all Jail Superintendents in the State have been instructed to launch a special awareness drive targeting prisoners, their relatives/visitors, and jail staff regarding the new Criminal Laws. Pocket booklets outlining the new sections and procedures under these laws have been printed for distribution among field staff. The meeting was attended by Director General of Police Shri Shatrughit Kapur, DGP Prisons Mohd. Akil, and other senior officers from the Home, Prisons, and Law and Legislative Departments.

HD will conduct DRC to stop diarrhea: CS

Under the guidelines of Deputy Commissioner(DC), Sangrur, Jitendra Jorwal, the health department(HD) will conduct a Dast Roko Campaign(DRC) in the entire district with an aim to prevent deaths due to diarrhea among children aged 0 to 5 years. While giving information about this campaign, civil surgeon(CS), Dr. Kirpal Singh said that a special campaign will be conducted from July 1 to August 31 under the slogan 'Prevent Diarrhea with cleanliness and Care with ORS' and for this all arrangements have been completed for the success of this campaign.

The CS said that due to diarrhea in children up to 5 years of age, prevention of diarrhea, full information will be given to the family about preparing the solution, giving ORS solution in case of diarrhea and giving zinc tablets to the child in case of diarrhea and cleanliness.

He said that due to the hot and rainy season, diarrhea can sometimes be life-threatening due to lack of water in children, so if the child is given an ORS solution immediately, the condition of the child can be saved from becoming seri-



ous. Meanwhile, District Vaccination Officer, Dr. Anju Singla said that during this campaign, ASHA workers will go door-to-door and give ORS packets to children between 0 and 5 years of age, so that ORS solution will be given immediately if the child is suffering from diarrhea. Along with this, ASHA/ ANM will provide ORS to the families. Information will also be given for the preparation of solution and the method of feeding the solution to the child when the child has diarrhea. Mothers should be given their own milk to the child for the first six months and can give complementary feeding after six months. Chil-

dren who suffer from diarrhea will be given zinc tablets to eat for 14 days, because taking zinc tablets while children recover from diarrhea quickly and also reduces the chances of children getting diarrhea again.

During this campaign, zinc and ORS, corners will also be created in all government health institutions, so that the child can be treated immediately if necessary. People will also be made aware about cleanliness, hand washing technique and importance, use of pure water and cleaning of water tanks, in health institutions, schools and Anganwadi centers.

SW Monsoon to reach Himachal by Thursday

Southwest Monsoon is likely to miss tentative date of June 24-25 in Himachal Pradesh as India Meteorological Department has predicted that it may now hit the state by June 27 and become active till June 28 and 29.

Yellow alert has been issued for June 29 and 30. On these two days, there may be heavy rain in many areas of Shimla, Sirmaur, Mandi, Chamba, Kullu and Kagada.

Director of Meteorological Center Shimla, Dr. Surendra Paul said that light rain may occur in most of the high and medium altitude areas of the state on Tuesday but people



have to wait at least two more days for Monsoon.

He said that SW monsoon may arrive in Himachal with a delay of three days till June 27.

Generally, monsoon enters the state between June 24 to 25. People are waiting the onset of monsoon anxiously as even pre-monsoon showers have been truant. The monsoon showers have

been confined to the eastern regions country.

Himachal is likely to witness sweltering heatwave at least for another two days as it would be sunny in the plains on Tuesday.

He said that the weather would be clear in most parts on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Paul said that monsoon rains are forecast in most parts of the state on

Thursday and Friday. It is expected that this time there will be good rains in monsoon.

Not only the people of the state but also the farmers of Punjab, Haryana, Delhi and Rajasthan are keeping an eye on the rains in Himachal, because farming in these states is done only with the water of Himachal.

Even at the end of remonsoon season, the state witnessed scorching heatwave till June 25. Himachal has received 57 percent less rainfall than normal as compared to normal rainfall in the first 24 days of June (premonsoon rain). While normal count is 66.7 mm, this time only 28.6 mm of rainfall has occurred.

Protest planned in Gondpur Jaychand if killers are not caught soon

In the village of Gondpur Jaychand, under the subdivision of Haroli, the family of 16-year-old Gurvinder Kumar, whose body was found hanging, has appealed to the Superintendent of Police for justice. On Monday, the family met with the Una Superintendent of Police for the second time, demanding justice for their son. The family insists that their son was murdered and has called for a murder investigation to be launched. Last Tuesday morning, Gurvinder Kumar's body was found hanging near his home. The family believes it was a murder, while the police have registered it as a suicide case.



The family has accused the police of not questioning the people they suspect and failing to retrieve mobile call details. They claim there were injury marks on Gurvinder's body and private parts, questioning how it could be considered a suicide. Additionally, the family alleges that instead of taking action, the police have been searching the victim's house.

The family has announced that if the police do not take prompt action, they will stage a protest in the village on Thursday, June 27. Superintendent of Police Una, Rakesh Singh, stated that the police are awaiting the post-mortem report, which will clarify whether Gurvinder's death was a suicide or murder. He assured the family of an impartial investigation.

Rohit Thakur accuses Jai Ram govt of neglecting farming community

Education Minister Rohit Thakur has accused the previous BJP State government, for neglecting the interests of the farmers and horticulturists in Himachal Pradesh. He said that the Jai Ram government failed to give relief to the fruit growers and even failed to reduce GST on cartons during its tenure.

Thakur highlighted the proactive and farmer-friendly initiatives introduced by the present State government under the visionary leadership of Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, which have brought substantial relief and support to the farm sector. He said



that the reduction in GST on cartons from 18 percent to 12 percent was a direct result of the consistent efforts of Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu and Industries Minister Harshwardhan Chauhan, who tirelessly advocated for the state's horticulturists. In contrast, the Jai Ram government which boasted

of the so-called double engine governments at the State and Centre failed to address this issue during its tenure.

He said the previous BJP government headed by Jai Ram Thakur government, the GST on cartons remained at 18 percent, resulting in a massive increase in prices of cartons and trays. The Jai Ram government failed miserably to address farmer's woes with the Central government. On the other hand, the present Congress government in the state has restored the insecticide and pesticide subsidy discontinued by the BJP government. This subsidy was crucial for horticulturists and its restoration was part of a broader strategy to

support the agricultural and horticultural sectors.

The Minister said the state government was also launching the Rs. 680 crore "Rajiv Gandhi Prakritik Kheta Start-up Yojana" to promote chemical-free farming and so far 36,000 farmers have adopted this farming. The e-udyan portal was benefiting 28,358 horticulturists and a processing plant costing over 100 crores had also been dedicated to the farmers, which reflect the commitment of the government to ensure welfare of the fruit growers. The BJP, as they say, "talks the talk but doesn't walk the walk," while the Congress delivers tangible results, he added.

3rd death in Shrikhand Kailash Yatra

Himachal Pradesh Police confirmed Tuesday that a 50-year-old pilgrim from Bulandshahr, Uttar Pradesh, died after slipping on snow during his Shrikhand Kailash Yatra.

This marks the third fatality in the Shrikhand Yatra this year. Despite the pilgrimage being officially scheduled from July 14 to 27, devotees have already begun their ascent, defying administration instructions and braving hazardous conditions. The deceased, Vinay Verma from Gulati village, embarked on the treacherous journey ahead of its official start date. DySP Ani Chandrashekar Kayth reported that Verma slipped near Shrikhand on June 19, falling approximately 200-250 meters down a snowy slope.

His brother, Sandeep Verma, confirmed the incident and mentioned that local residents were assisting in bringing the body to Jaon, after which it will be transported to Nirmand Hospital for further proceedings.

The Shrikhand Mahadev Yatra is renowned for its difficulty and thrilling challenges, making it one of the most arduous pilgrimages in North India. This year, the journey is particularly perilous due to excessive snow, contributing to the recent fatalities. The authorities continue to urge pilgrims to adhere to the official schedule and safety guidelines to prevent further tragedies. As the Yatra's start date approaches, the focus remains on ensuring the safety of the devotees undertaking this demanding spiritual journey.

Banks in Una District disbursed loans worth Rs. 2801.12 crore by March 2024: Jatin Lal

The District Level Bank Advisory and Review Meeting, chaired by Deputy Commissioner Jatin Lal, concluded today. During the meeting, which reviewed the achievements of banks against their targets for the fourth quarter, the Deputy Commissioner reported that the banks in the district had disbursed ₹2801.12 crore in loans by March 2024, surpassing the annual target of ₹2401.56 crore. Deposits in the banks have reached ₹13874.67 crore, reflecting an annual growth rate of 11.47%, while loans have grown by 11.59% to ₹4236.65 crore. The district's loan-to-deposit ratio for the year stands at 30.54%, which is below the national target of



60%. Lal emphasized the need for banks and government departments to make concerted efforts to improve this ratio.

The Deputy Commissioner highlighted that by March 31, 2024, banks in the district had distributed 67,407 agricultural cards to farmers, with 1,311 cards issued in the March quarter alone. Agricultural loans amount to ₹811.92 crore, representing 19.16% of the total loans.

While expressing satisfaction with the banks' achievements under the annual credit plan, he deemed the accomplishments in the priority sector insufficient. He urged all banks to take necessary steps to improve their performance and increase the loan-to-deposit ratio. Additionally, he provided directives to banks and government departments to adhere to the goals and policies set by the Government of India.

SANJEEV MAHAJAN NURPUR, JUNE 25

In Nurpur's Jasur town, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) marked the anniversary of the 1975 Emergency by targeting the Congress party. BJP members conducted a silent march with black bands on their mouths, expressing outrage at the Emergency declared by Congress on this day in 1975, a dark stain on India's great democracy. Present at the event were BJP state spokesperson Umesh Dutt, organizational district Nurpur president Ramesh Singh, general secretary Rajesh Kumar, along with other party workers from the district.

BJP state spokesperson Umesh Dutt said that the party is observing "Black Day" nationwide to remember the day on June 25, 1975, when



the then Congress government imposed the Emergency, pushing the country into dictatorship. At Jasur Chowk in Nurpur, BJP members demonstrated by wearing black bands and holding a silent march.

Dutt highlighted the suppression of democracy, the imprisonment of opposing leaders, and the exploitation of political figures by the Congress to retain power. He pointed out that constitutional amendments numbered 38,

39, 40, 41, and 42 were used to concentrate power, weaken states, and persecute political opponents.

Dutt criticized the Congress for making 75 amendments to the Constitution from 1947 to 2014, including 90 cases of state government dismissals under Article 356. He accused Congress of misleading the public about the Constitution in the 2024 elections, falsely claiming that the BJP planned to end reservations.

Two accused of firing incident sent to 14 days judicial custody

Both the accused were produced in the court after five days remand. In this, accused shooter Sunny Gill was sent on police remand till Sunday. Whereas, the other accused Anmol Sharma alias Gaurav Nadda was sent to 14 days judicial custody.

Let us tell you that Gaurav Nadda had kept Sunny Gill in his father's government residence Changan. At the same time, the police is searching for Purnanjan, the mastermind of the firing incident. Purnanjan has filed a petition in the High Court for anticipatory bail. Let us tell you that on June 20, firing was done on an accused outside the court premises in Bilaspur city. In this case, due to the alertness of the people, the police had caught the accused.

One bullet hit Saurabh of Ghumarvi who attacked former MLA Bamber Thakur, while the other bullet hit the glass of a car parked at the spot. When the police arrested the accused shooter, the whole case was revealed. Police investigation revealed that Purnanjan Thakur, the elder son of former MLA Bamber Thakur, had hired the shooter. Cases are also registered against the accused shooter in Punjab.

Sukhu govt restores OPS for retired HP employees, earns gratitude

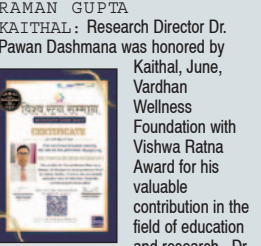

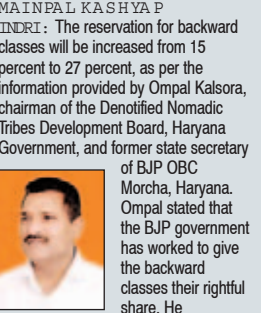

Financial aid of Rs 1850 per month being given to destitute children: DC

KARNAL: DC Uttam Singh said that a child up to the age of 21 years in the district who is deprived of the help or care of his parents due to their death, absence from his father's house for the last 2 years or due to long sentence of the parents which is not less than one year or due to mental and physical disability and whose parents, guardian's annual income from all sources does not exceed two lakhs. That child is eligible for the benefit of financial assistance given by the Social Justice and Cooperation Department of Haryana Government. He said that the above department is providing pension of Rs 1850 per month per child for up to two children in a family. The DC said that the person willing to avail the benefit of the above scheme must have a certificate of being destitute, birth certificate issued by the children's health department and a document of the applicant being a resident of Haryana state for a period of 5 years or more such as a family identity card along with a self-attested photo copy of voter card or ration card etc. He said that if the applicant does not have any of the above documents, he can give an affidavit of residence in Haryana for 5 years along with any other certificate. He said that if the child's parents or guardians are receiving family pension from any government, they will not be able to avail the benefit of the above scheme.

Pb govt forcing depot holders to conduct KYC of consumers: Sidhu

The Punjab government is requiring depot holders to conduct daily KYC (Know Your Customer) for beneficiaries, but this duty belongs to government departments, not depot holders, as they do not have the authority to perform KYC. In a press statement, Punjab State Depot Holders Union President, Engineer Gurjinder Singh Sidhu, said that 60% of blue cardholders are those who own cars and houses, while the truly needy have not been issued blue cards and are struggling. Additionally, blue



cardholders who are no longer eligible, such as married women or those with children abroad, continue to receive full wheat rations. If depot holders conduct KYC, it could lead to the cancellation of memberships, causing

backlash against depot holders, even though they are not responsible for this task. The government is pushing its problem onto them. Sidhu emphasized that depot holders are merely licensees, not government employees, and they receive only 50 rupees per quintal as commission, which amounts to about 2000 rupees per month. In contrast, government employees who earn thousands or lakhs of rupees in salaries are avoiding this work. He urged depot holders to refuse to conduct KYC and express their inability to do so. He warned that if the government continues to force them, they will be compelled to protest.

Over 5 lakh appeals remain unresolved with CIT(A): MP Arora

MP (Rajya Sabha) from Ludhiana Sanjeev Arora has written a letter to the Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, seeking an action to address the huge pendency of Appeals before the Commissioners of Income-Tax (Appeals) nationwide.

In his letter, Arora wrote that he would like to express his deep concern regarding the significant backlog of appeals pending before the CIT(A). He added the current situation is worrisome because as of April 2024, a staggering number of over 5 lakh appeals remain unresolved with CIT(A), with



a majority of these lodged within the recently implemented faceless appellate system. This immense backlog not only contradicts the commitment to timely decisions outlined in the Taxpayers' Charter but also raises fundamental questions about equity and fairness within the tax system. He suggested

enacting appropriate legislation to enforce stricter time limits on CIT(A) for appeal disposal for strengthening legal framework. The current advisory limit of 1 year should be made mandatory.

Arora suggested introducing measures to provide relief to taxpayers facing unreasonable delays. This could include waiving the requirement for 20% prepayment during appeals; refunding excess tax collected/ recovered during prolonged delays; and granting automatic stay on penalties and prosecution proceedings for appeals exceeding a specific time limit.

The sunset women

One of the most inviolable cultural taboos centres around a significant change in a woman's reproductive capability at a certain age. This atrophy not only triggers an emotional crisis in her life but, as recent research affirms, also has a deep bearing on the economy. In 2022, a massive survey conducted at the initiative of the American Association of Retired Persons explored every aspect of the menopausal aftermath, revealing startling facts. Many women, the survey found out, "consider leaving their jobs due to the severe and disruptive symptoms," pointing to an inimical work environment.

Apart from the fear of job loss, menopause triggers a traumatic sense of insecurity in women. When they go for treatments, not always recommended by doctors or covered by insurance, it only leads to mounting expenses. Costly hormonal interventions are nothing but a rip-off for many women who take this desperate step.

Even the sunset does not descend in uniform colours. Working women, particularly highly-engaged professionals, evidently are less traumatised by the wrenching experience of menopause than those who see their physical charms as their only assets.

But is this the whole truth?

The question set me on the path to unravel the entire spectrum of menopausal impact. I first chose a fairly large sample of women in the 45-65 age group. Surprisingly, the women aged 45 and above admitted that they formed their opinion about this crucial change in their lives on the basis of either inadequate or unverified information. A majority of the women — 64.1% — in the survey I conducted source relevant information from friends only. Consequently, their understanding of the issue is often layered with misconceptions. For instance, 46.2% believe menopausal women do not enjoy sex.

Responses to the survey across cities reveal that women's awareness level about menopause is disappointingly low. In the era of technology-induced openness and a communication revolution, menopause is still culturally stigmatised. Even 30 years after the publication of Germaine Greer's *The Change: Women, Aging and the Menopause*, the 'change' is shrouded in social inhibition. As if to corroborate Greer's argument, an astounding 71.8% of the women I quizzed admitted they had never discussed the issue with their partners.

Despite the anonymity of the poll, some respondents were uncomfortable with the questions about their children. Pointedly asked if they fear their children would defy them in the post-menopause phase of their lives, 75.5% went into denial mode.

Honour to Hansa Mehta

The introduction of a more inclusive language in UDHR was an important milestone in the fight for women's rights and gender equality.

In a ceremony marking the day, Francis underscored the significance of gender equality in diplomacy, noting that it reflects broader societal progress towards inclusivity and respect for the rights of women and girls. He emphasised the historic contributions of women diplomats who have shattered barriers and enriched multilateralism throughout history.

Speaking passionately about Hansa Mehta's influence, Francis posed a poignant question: "Would the Universal Declaration of Human



Rights be truly universal today if Hansa Mehta had not insisted its opening line be changed from "all men" to "all human beings" are born free and equal?"

The UNGA President also reiterated the UN's commitment to advancing gender equality and empowering women diplomats globally, recognising their indispensable contributions to shaping a more just and inclusive world.

Thai agricultural workers to return Israel after 8 months

For the first time since October 7, Thailand will resume sending agricultural workers to Israel on Sunday, the Thai Ministry of Labour said on Monday. The ministry aims to send 10,000 labourers by the end of the year.

Israeli agriculture is facing staggering losses in production and manpower. Before October 7, Israel had roughly 30,000 Thai labourers working in farms, orchards, greenhouses, and packing plants. Many opted to be repatriated after the war's outbreak, while others in safer areas of the country chose to stay. Israeli workers who might have filled labor gaps were called up for military reserve duty while Palestinian workers are currently banned as security risks.

"The government asked for the cooperation of the Israeli government to help emphasize to employers to take care of the safety of Thai workers," the ministry's statement said.

During Hamas's October 7 attacks, 39 Thai labourers working in agricultural communities near the Gaza border were



killed and another 32 were taken, hostage. Most were freed during a temporary ceasefire in November, but six are still captive in Gaza, and their fate remains uncertain.

Some Thai workers repatriated after the war's outbreak returned to Israel on their own, saying they could make more money than they would in Thailand.

On Tuesday, Israeli officials approved a quota to import 92,000 foreign workers to fill gaps in agriculture, industry, hotels and restaurants.

Xi continues his drive to purify the PLA and instill loyalty

The People's Liberation Army (PLA), paradoxically named since it is beholden to the party rather than the people, is still not politically pure, according to its head, Chairman Xi Jinping. Despite an anti-corruption campaign lasting more than a decade, Xi continues to call for greater loyalty within China's military.

During a Central Military Commission (CMC) Political Work Conference from June 17-19, Xi pinpointed "deep-seated problems" in the PLA, whose root causes "lie in the lack of ideals and beliefs.". The correct response, according to China's leader, is for personnel at all levels, especially senior cadres, to "introspect, engage in soul-searching reflections and make earnest rectifications".

As quoted by state broadcaster CCTV, Xi asserted, "The gun barrels should always be in the hands of those who are loyal and reliable to the party, and there must be no place for corrupt elements to hide in the military." Xi convened this meeting in Yan'an, an old revolutionary PLA base in



the northwest province of Shaanxi. Recalling past glories, Xi took CMC members and department heads to visit revolutionary relics at Wangjiaping, where the CMC's headquarters was stationed from August 1937 till March 1947.

According to PLA reports, "Xi emphasised the need to uphold the party's absolute leadership over the military and to build a high-quality cadre team that is loyal, clean, responsible, and capable of fulfilling the mission of strengthening the military."

Nepal's "Buddha Boy" convicted on charge of raping a minor


The Sarlahi District Court on Monday convicted "Buddha Boy," aka Ram Bahadur Bomjan, on charges of raping a minor, court officials confirmed.

Dubbed "Buddha Boy" in early 2005, the controversial spiritual leader was arrested by the Central Investigation Bureau of Nepal from the outskirts of the capital Kathmandu and taken to Sarlahi on January 10, earlier this year.

"The District Court, Sarlahi, has convicted him of sexual misconduct against a minor. The Court will deliver its verdict in the case on July 1," Court Official Sadan Adhikari confirmed to ANI over the phone.

The 34-year-old, originally named Ram Lal Bomjan, who since 2005 has been known as "Buddha Boy," or the reincarnation of Gautam Buddha, is charged with rape and forceful disappearance at various police stations in the Himalayan nation. Bomjan came to the attention of the public in 2005 after he claimed to have meditated for months without food, water, or sleep.

Soon after his meditation, he set up ashrams in Bara, Sarlahi, Sindhupalchowk, and Sindhuli Districts. Earlier in July 2020, the District



lance, and District Police Offices in Kavre, Sindhupalchowk, and Sarlahi conducted a raid at his ashram in Pairey, Sindhuli, but could not locate him.

The victim accused Bomjan of rape at night on August 4, 2016.

Worshipped and regarded as the reincarnation of Gautam Buddha, Bomjan had a significant number of disciples but was on the run since early 2020. Complaint was filed against him for sexual exploitation by female disciples.

A local news portal, Setopati.com, reported the incident in a series that unearthed the incidents that took place inside the ashrams of a claimed spiritual leader.
