India thump South Africa by 10 wickets in one-off Women's Test



CHENNAI: India inflicted a crushing 10-wicket defeat on South Africa in the one-off Women's Test here on Monday with opener Shafali Verma's fastest-ever double-century and Sneh Rana's amazing first-innings figures of 8/77 playing a key role in the outcome of the match, where several records were broken. Chasing a mammoth Indian first innings total 603/6 declared, built largely on Shafali's 197-ball 205 and Smriti Mandhana's 149, South Africa were made to bite the dust by off-spinner Rana, who returned career-best figures to dismiss the visitors for 266. India enforced a follow-on with SA still requiring 337 runs to erase the deficit. South Africa captain Laura Wolvaardt (122) and former skipper Sune Luus (109) fought with determination in the second innings. Middle-order batter Nadine de Klerk's 61 took the visitors to 373, setting the hosts a 37-run target.

Sensex, Nifty hit fresh record

MUMBAI: Benchmark Sensex rose by 443 points to close at a new record high while Nifty settled above the 24,100 mark on Monday on buying in banking and IT shares in line with gains in Asian and European markets. The 30-share BSE Sensex settled higher by 443.46 points or 0.56 per cent at an all-time high of 79,476.19. During the day, the barometer soared 528.27 points or 0.66 per cent to 79,561. The broader Nifty rose by 131.35 points or 0.55 per cent to close at a fresh lifetime high of 24,141.95. Intra-day, the index hit a high of 24,164, just 10 points short of its lifetime high of 24,174 hit on Friday.

India's manufacturing PMI rises to 58.3 in June

NEW DELHI: India's manufacturing sector grew at faster pace in June this year compared to the previous month on the back of increased new orders and output, said a private survey released on Monday, reflecting strong growth momentum in the economy. The HSBC India manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI), compiled by S&P Global, accelerated to 58.3 in June this year from 57.5 in the previous month. A PMI print below 50 means contraction while above it shows expansion in activities. The HSBC India Manufacturing PMI is compiled by S&P Global from responses to questionnaires sent to purchasing managers in a panel of around 400 manufacturers. It is one of the closely-watched high-frequency data by economists, markets and policy-makers. "The Indian manufacturing sector ended the June quarter on a stronger footing.

PM Modi slams Rahul Gandhi's remarks on Hindu community

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday hit out at Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi's remarks over Hindu community, saying "calling the entire Hindu community violent is very serious."

Prime Minister Modi criticised Gandhi by interrupting his speech during discussion on Motion of Thanks on President's Address.

Earlier, Gandhi said, "Those who call themselves Hindu only talk about violence, hatred, untruth."

After some sharp exchanges between the treasury and Opposition benches, Union Home Minister Amit Shah demanded an apology from Gandhi.

"The Leader of Opposition has categorically said that those who call themselves Hindu talk of violence and do violence. He doesn't know that crores of people proudly call themselves Hindu. Connecting violence with any religion is wrong. He should apologise," he said.

During the speech, Gandhi also raised the issue of Agniveer scheme and said "One Agniveer lost his life in a landmine blast but he is not called a 'martyr'... 'Agniveer' is a use & throw labourer."

Making an intervention on his remarks, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, "Rahul Gandhi should not try to mislead the House by making wrong statements. Financial assistance of Rs one crore is given to the family of the Agniveer who sacrifices his life while protecting our borders or during war."



Oppn walkout in LS ahead of discussion on Prez's address

NEW DELHI: As the discussion on Motion of Thanks on President's Address began in Parliament on Monday, the Opposition members staged a walkout in Lok Sabha over the issue of the alleged NEET paper leak.

Making an initial remark, Leader of Opposition Rahul Gandhi said, "A message is disseminated to the country, from Parliament. We want to give a message to students that the NEET issue is important for the Parliament. So, to send this message we want the Parliament to discuss this."

As the Lok Sabha session reconvened on Monday, Speaker Om Birla and Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju informed Opposition members that they could address the matter during the Motion of Thanks on the President's address to both Houses of Parliament. The Lok Sabha Speaker, who did not accept adjournment motions by Opposition MPs on NEET, also refused to entertain LoP Rahul Gandhi's suggestion of a one-day discussion on the paper leak issue.

Haryana CM approves free renal and liver transplants up to Rs. 3 lakh under MMMIY

In a significant move set to transform healthcare accessibility in Haryana, Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh has approved a landmark initiative that will provide free renal and liver transplantation services up to Rs. 3 lakh for eligible patients under the Mukhya Mantri Muft Ilaj Yojana (MMMIY). In addition to this transformative step, the Chief Minister has also sanctioned the creation of a specialized fixed Renal and Liver Transplant Package of Rs 3 lakh under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana - Ayushman Bharat (PM-JAY-AB) scheme.

While giving this information here today, Health, Medical Education, and Research Minister, Dr Kamal Gupta said that the current government is committed to healthcare reform and patient welfare. With this new initiative, identified patients will be able to receive critical renal and liver transplants at the Post Graduate Institute of Medical Sciences (PGIMS) in Rohtak without worrying about the prohibitive costs. These pivotal decisions aims to offer life-saving medical treatments to those in dire need, ensuring no one is denied essential healthcare due to financial constraints.



He said that by alleviating the financial burden associated with complex medical procedures, the government is paving the way for a future where healthcare is a fundamental right accessible to all, regardless of economic status.

The Minister said that previously, there was no provision under MMMIY to cover the expenses related to renal or liver transplants.

Many patients faced insurmountable barriers to receiving the treatments they desperately needed. The introduction of this facility, for the first time in a government healthcare institute, marks a significant stride towards bridging this gap and providing comprehensive care to the most vulnerable sections of society.

Dr. Gupta emphasized the State Government's unwavering commitment to enhancing healthcare services across Haryana. "This initiative reflects our priority to provide affordable and accessible treatment to all patients, especially those in need. By continuously improving health facilities and expanding the scope of services, we aim to ensure that every citizen has access to high-quality medical care," he said.

India, Pakistan exchange lists of civilian prisoners in each other's custody

India and Pakistan on Monday exchanged, through diplomatic channels simultaneously at New Delhi and Islamabad, the lists of civilian prisoners and fishermen in each other's custody.

Under the provisions of the bilateral Agreement on Consular Access 2008, such lists are exchanged every year on 1st January and on 1st July, a statement said.

India has shared the names of 366 civilian prisoners and 86 fishermen in its custody, who are Pakistani or are believed-to-be-Pakistani. Similarly, Pakistan has shared names of 43 civilian prisoners and 211 fishermen in its custody, who are Indian or are believed-to-be-Indian.

The Government of India has called for early release and repatriation of civilian prisoners, fishermen along with their boats, and missing Indian defence personnel from Pakistan's custody.

Pakistan has been asked

to expedite the release and repatriation of 185 Indian fishermen and civilian prisoners, who have completed their sentence. In addition, Pakistan has been asked to provide immediate consular access to the 47 civilian prisoners and fishermen in Pakistan's custody, who are believed-to-be-Indian and have not been provided consular access so far. Pakistan has been requested to ensure the safety, security and welfare of all Indian and believed-to-be-Indian civilian prisoners and fishermen, pending their release and repatriation to India.



India remains committed to addressing, on priority, all humanitarian matters, including those pertaining to prisoners and fishermen in each other's country.

NTA announces re-test results, revised rank list of 1563 candidates of NEET exam

The National Testing Agency (NTA) on Monday announced the results of the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET-UG) retest held on June 23, for 1563 candidates.

The NTA in a public notice June 30 also declared the revision of the rank of all candidates who appeared in the exam. The retest was held on June 23 after a controversy erupted regarding the awarding of grace marks to certain students.

The notice further stated that the revised scorecards of all the candidates of the NEET UG 2024 exam, including the 1563 candidates who appeared for the retest on June 23 would be hosted on the website.

Earlier, amid the ongoing row over the NEET-UG exam, Bhartiya Janata Party (BJP) leader Shazia Ilmi on June 30 said that the Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan has taken moral responsibility for the issue and that an investigation is being carried out.

"Investigation is being carried out in this matter and we need to hold serious deliberations instead of political stunts or playing a blame game. This is a serious issue and we see that the student community and their parents are affected because of this," she said.

The NEET UG examination was conducted by the National Testing Agency on May 5, 2024 at 4,750 centres in 571 cities in the country, 14 cities abroad and with 23 lakh candidates



appearing for the examination.

The results was declared on June 4, which immediately caused a hue and cry with aspirants raising multiple issues. An unprecedented 67 candidates had achieved a perfect score of 720 marks out of 720 led to widespread protests in the country. The Supreme

Court ruled that the "grace marks" awarded to some students should be scrapped and provided the affected candidates with the option to either take a re-test or retain their original scores, excluding the grace marks. The Central Government announced a high-level committee, headed by former ISRO chairman Dr K Radhakrishnan, to look into the functioning and fair conduct of examinations by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The seven-member committee will submit its report in two months. The CBI took over the investigation of NEET-UG following the discovery of evidence of a paper leak by investigators in Bihar and on June 23 registered a criminal case on the alleged irregularities in the conduct of the exam. The probe agency has formed special teams to look into the matter.

First case under new criminal laws registered for motorcycle theft in Gwalior: Amit Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Monday stated that the first case filed under new criminal justice laws was about a motorcycle theft registered in Gwalior in Madhya Pradesh at 10 minutes past midnight.

"...The first case (under the new laws) was registered at a Police station in Gwalior. It was a case of theft, someone's motorcycle was stolen. The case was registered at 12.10 am...As far as the case against a vendor (registered at a Police Station in Delhi) is

concerned, there were provisions for the same earlier too and it is not a new provision. Police used the provision to review it and dismissed that case," Shah said while addressing a press conference here.

Shah's clarification came in response to a media query about the first first case lodged under the new laws that have come into force beginning from today.

Delhi Police had registered a case at Kamla Market Police Station in the national capital against a street vendor under the new laws.

"If the date of crime is before July



1, 2024, then it will be tried under old laws, if it is later, it will be tried under

new laws," Shah said at the press conference today.

The three new criminal laws- the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam (BSA), came into effect today. Under this the Indian Penal Code (IPC) has been replaced with the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, the CrPC with Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita and the Indian Evidence Act has been replaced with the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam. These laws had received the assent by President Droupadi Murmu on December 25, 2023.

CM announces 8 percent salary hike for employees under HKRNL

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 1

Haryana Chief Minister, Nayab Singh has announced a significant gift for the 1,19,861 employees of level 1, 2, and 3 categories engaged through the Haryana Kaushal Rozgar Nigam (HKRNL). As per the announcement of the Chief Minister, the salaries of these employees would be hiked by 8 percent with effect from July 1, 2024.

The Chief Minister made this announcement today during a meeting with various labor unions and HKRNL employees, accompanied by Bhartiya Mazdoor Sangh. MLAs Sh. Mohan Lal Badoli, Sh. Sitaram Yadav, and Sh. Laxman Singh Yadav also present on this occasion.

The Chief Minister said that employees have been en-



gaged transparently under HKRNL. There are 71,012 employees in Level 1, 26,915 in Level 2, and 21,934 in Level 3. He mentioned that reservation benefits have been given to Scheduled Caste and Backward Class youth among the employees hired under the Nigam. Employees are appointed under the Deployment of Contractual Policy.

Sh. Nayab Singh said that during the Congress government's tenure, contractual em-

ployees hired under outsourcing policies part-1 and part-2 were exploited. Contractors neither provided EPF benefits nor ESI benefits to the employees. Additionally, employees did not receive any benefits under labour fund schemes, and contractors could terminate these employees at will.

The Chief Minister said that to protect employees from exploitation, the state government created a system and formed the HKRNL. Today, employees are receiving timely salaries along with EPF and ESI benefits. Now, the required skilled manpower for any department or private establishment is supplied through the Nigam, he said.

Sh. Nayab Singh said that during the previous government's tenure if an employee met with an accident, they did not receive any financial aid,

while the present state government has created a Nigam and stands firmly with the employees to assist in any unfortunate incident.

In the meeting, it was informed that from July 1, 2024, level-1 employees employed in category-1 districts will receive an increased salary from Rs. 18,400 to Rs. 19,872, level-2 employees from Rs. 21,650 to Rs. 23,382, and level-3 employees from Rs. 22,300 to Rs. 24,084.

In category-2 districts, level-1 employees will receive an increased salary from Rs. 16,250 to Rs. 17,550, level-2 employees from Rs. 19,450 to Rs. 21,600, and level-3 employees from Rs. 20,100 to Rs. 21,708.

Similarly, in category-3 districts, level-1 employees will receive an increased salary from Rs. 15,050 to Rs. 16,254, level-2 employees from Rs. 18,300 to Rs. 19,764.

Central govt should immediately lift the ban on rice export: Rattan Mann

To complete these projects in the year 2023-24, a total of Rs 17.24 crore was sanctioned, enabling the completion of both district-level and state-level projects. Dr. Kaur explained that the sanctioned Rs 17.24 crore had been drawing limit fixed during 2023-24. She elaborated that out of the



sanctioned Rs 17.24 crore, Rs 1.69 crore was allocated for development projects in Bathinda. Of this amount, Rs 0.84 crore was spent during the last financial year, with the remaining Rs 0.85 crore now approved to incur in the current year 2024-25.

Minister explained that for the ongoing development projects in Faridkot district, Rs 0.61 crore was sanctioned. Out of this, Rs 0.16 crore was spent during the last financial year and the balance of Rs 0.45 crore is now approved to incur in the current financial year. Similarly, Rs 1.29 crore was allocated for Kapurthala district, with Rs 0.20 crore spent last year, and the remaining Rs 1.09 crore now

sanctioned for this year. She stated that in Ludhiana district, Rs 2.30 crore was sanctioned, of which Rs 0.66 crore was spent last year. The remaining Rs 1.64 crore is now available for the current financial year. For Moga district, Rs 1.32 crore was allocated, with Rs 0.34 crore spent last year and the remaining Rs 0.98 crore now sanctioned for expenditure this year. Dr. Kaur further mentioned that out of Rs 8.28 crore allocated for state-level projects, Rs 5.59 crore has been spent, and Rs 2.69 crore is now available for the current financial year. The progress of the projects and details of the beneficiaries will be uploaded by the district-level implementing agencies on the web portal pmajay.dosje.gov.in.

The Minister emphasized that the Punjab government has issued the necessary letter regarding the expenditure limits for the completion of both state-level and district-level projects. She said that concerned authorities have been instructed to ensure the completion of these projects within the stipulated time-frame.

These biofertilizers are available with the Punjab Agricultural University, Ludhiana Seed Shop at Gate No. 1 and Krishi Vigyan Kendra/Farm Advisory Service Centres in different districts.

Dr. Keshani, Extension Scientist (Microbiology), Department of Microbiology, PAU, Ludhiana discussed in

detail about the use of paddy and maize biofertilizer. She said that for paddy seedling inoculation, mix half kg packet of Azospirillum biofertilizer with 100 litres of water. Dip the rice nursery seedlings for one acre in this solution for 45 minutes and transplant immediately. For maize, mix half kg packet of recommended consortium bio-fertilizer with one litre of water and then thoroughly mix it with maize seed on clean pucca floor.

Those arrested have been identified as Shivani (28) of Amar Avenue in Khandwala Chheharta and her fiancé Gurtek Singh (23) of Ajnala, and their accomplices including Gurpreet Singh (34) of Majitha road Amritsar, Sandeep Singh (29) of Jandiala, Deepak Kumar (30) of village Mahal, Hardev Singh (53) of Ajnala

and Harpal Singh (52) of Rajasani in Amritsar. Accused Shivani is a daughter of Narinder Mohan Mehta, who is working as a Driver with victim Jiya Lal Behal, and was acquainted with the affluence of the latter. As per the information, four armed men with their faces covered decamped with Rs 90 lakh and 3kg jewellery after barging into the house of victim Jiya Lal on Wednesday early morning.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that three accused persons—Gurpreet, Sandeep and Deepak were arrested from district Dhule in Maharashtra in an inter-state operation with the assistance of Maharashtra Police and Central Agencies, while, remaining four persons were arrested from Amritsar. Police teams have also recovered Rs 41.40 lakhs cash and 800 grams gold from their possession. He added. The DGP said that Police teams have adopted a pro-

fessional and scientific approach to solve this sensational robbery case. Further investigations are on in this case, he said. Sharing more details, Commissioner of Police (CP) Amritsar Ranjit Singh Dhillon said that following the incident, Police teams from Civil Lines Police Station, CIA-1 and CIA-2 under the supervision of ADCP CITY-2 Abhimanyu Rana and ACP North Vijay Kumar immediately started investigations in this case.

He said that Police teams had managed to trace the case in less than 12 hours and made arrests of three accused persons from Maharashtra within 24 hours. While, the remaining four accused persons were arrested on Friday and Saturday, he added. CP Ranjit Singh Dhillon said that two more accomplices involved in this case have been identified and raids are being conducted to apprehend them.

'Accused tampered trust records to appoint Dahiya as Secretary for financial embezzlement'

A case of fraud and conspiracy has been registered against MGN Education Trust Chairman Charanjit Singh Rai, Vice Chairman Daljit Singh Anand, and Secretary Mukhtiar Singh Dahiya at Jalandhar's commissionerate Police Station 2. This case was registered following on complaint by MGN life trustee Rannik Singh to the police, accusing the current management of embezzling the government grant and public funds received by trust. As well to appoint Mukhtiar Singh Dahiya as Secretary, the resignation of present Secretary Sudarshan Singh Bains was also backdated and records tampered by the accused. The investigation regarding the public funds and grant embezzlement is ongoing. The police will soon issue notices summoning the accused for investigation. On



October 30, 2023, life trustee Rannik Singh, a resident of Hamilton Tower, filed the complaint.

The Commissioner of Police assigned the investigation to the Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP). According to the ACP's investigation, the society operates three public schools, two B.Ed and M.Ed colleges, and three aided schools under its management. Government grants and public funds are provided for the B.Ed, M.Ed colleges, and aided schools. A trust was formed for the management, consisting of two types of trustees: lifetime trustees and ordinary trustees. As Per the trust's constitution, the seven lifetime trustees are Jarnail Singh Pachrisa, Gurinder

Singh Narula, Sudarshan Singh Bains, Daljit Singh Anand, Mukhtiar Singh Dahiya, Rannik Singh, and four ordinary trustees. The investigation revealed that in 2018, Charanjit Rai was appointed Chairman, Daljit Singh Anand as Vice Chairman, and Sudarshan Singh Bains as Secretary. There has been a dispute among them over the misuse of trust funds which has gone from the lower courts to the High Court.

The ACP's investigation mentioned that Sudarshan Singh Bains, a resident of New Isharpuri Colony, needed to go to Canada for personal reasons in 2018. Therefore, he requested ex-India leave. On September 11, 2018, Daljit Singh Anand proposed that there was no provision for ex-India leave in the constitution. Hence, on September 12, 2018, Bains typed his resignation and sent it to Chairman Charanjit Rai.

Protect them

Light has been spotted at the end of a dark tunnel. A recent study has identified 16,825 “Conservation Imperative” spots, which, if protected, could ensure the survival of the most threatened and rare species and stop the sixth mass extinction event that is already underway. In theory, these spots amount to just 1.2% of the land surface of the Earth and should not be difficult to protect. What is more, the study also found that many of the hotspots that have been identified already lie adjacent to or near existing protected areas.

Why, then, is the protection of these sites likely to be an uphill climb? The report makes an important point in this regard. Governments committed to a faulty idea of development engage in token protectionism, notifying areas that are not really rich in biodiversity as protected spheres while actual hotspots continue to be exploited. Take India, for example, which is home to 437 of the spots identified in the study. Around 15% of these areas lie within 2.5 kilometres of the boundaries of existing protected areas or those that were once protected areas and have been denotified or encroached upon. Among the hotspots under India’s geographical boundaries — the

country accounts for a whopping 16.86% of global biodiversity hotspots — the Western Ghats are home to around 64.95% of such zones, Indo-Burma 5.13%, Himalaya 44.37% and Sundaland 1.28%. But the protected area in most of them is less than a measly 17%. There have not been studies on the ecological attributes of these spots and neither are there any estimates of the anthropogenic drivers of forest degradation in them. The recent study has plugged this gap in information. It is now time to remap the protected sites in light of this new data.

Another challenge to conserving all the sites around the world is that it would cost \$263 billion. The figure does not take into account the profits that businesses and governments would have to forego by vacating such hotspots. That is not all. Merely protecting identified zones will not be enough. Species are also threatened by radical changes in the biosphere, the altered chemical content of oceans, the devastation of forests and ecologies, the contamination of land by chemicals, extreme weather events and other man-made factors. So the mediation has to be multifold and across sites. While these are significant hurdles, the outcome of not overcoming them could be more dire than anything the world has ever witnessed.

Declining national resilience is damaging Israel's social fabric

Israel's national resilience has markedly decreased, with the potential to lead to a severe crisis in public confidence in state institutions, a study unveiled on Sunday found. While personal resilience and morale appear to be stabilising, national perseverance has not as the conflict approaches its ninth month, the report warned.

The study, conducted by researchers from Tel Aviv University and Tel Hai Academic College in the Upper Galilee, tracked various resilience metrics since Hamas's October 7 attack with subsequent surveys following at approximately six-week intervals. The final survey was completed in April 2024, immediately after Iran's missile and drone attack.

"The war and its costs, as well as disappointment with its achievements so far, can account for the significant decline in Israel's national resilience, the sharp drop in the public's sense of unity, and the moderate decrease in hope - so critical for generating and preserving resilience," the researchers said.

The findings are stark. National resilience scores dropped from 4.1 at the outset to 3.75 six months later, on a scale of 1 to 6. In contrast, personal resilience showed a slight increase from 3.65 to 3.69 on a 1 to 5 scale. This dichotomy indicates that while individuals are adapting to the ongoing conflict, their confidence in national unity and the effectiveness of the state is waning.

Morale improved from 2.78 to 3.46, suggesting that individuals are finding ways to cope with the new reality. However, hope slightly declined from 3.74 to 3.65, indicating lingering uncertainties about the future. Negative parameters showed a decline in the sense of danger from 2.77 to 2.57 and a reduction in stress symptoms from 2.68 to 2.26, signaling that people are becoming somewhat desensitized to the conflict.



The researchers also observed a concerning decline in social cohesion, which fell from 3.95 to 2.93. This drop underscores a significant erosion of communal solidarity, a critical component of national resilience.

The study suggested several factors contributing to this decline. The prolonged duration of the conflict, coupled with statements from political and military leaders about the potential for an extended war, have worn down public morale. Additionally, the threat of the conflict escalating into a broader war with Hezbollah and the expected displacement of more communities in northern Israel has exacerbated public anxiety. "The fact that people are getting somewhat used to the new situation, combined with a feeling that this is a 'no choice war' forced upon Israel, and requiring common efforts, can explain the rise in morale and

decline in stress symptoms on the personal level," the researchers said.

"However, a continued decline in resilience might damage the country's social fabric and sense of unity and cohesion. If Israeli society is to overcome the hardships and challenges that still lie ahead, both state institutions and civil society must act now, to strengthen solidarity, and enhance common denominators shared by all parts of the nation," they warned.

The internal rift within Israeli society has also deepened, particularly regarding trust in political leadership and calls for new elections. If left unaddressed, the trends could lead to a reduction in public volunteerism, military service, and civic engagement. The diminishing "credit" given to Israeli leaders navigating the conflict could result in widespread disenchantment and a po-

tential crisis of confidence in the state's ability to manage the situation. The study urged both state institutions and civil society to take immediate steps to strengthen solidarity and reinforce common bonds.

On Thursday, Bar-Ilan University released a study that found that 72 per cent of Israelis believe that social divisions over judicial reform raised the likelihood of the October 7 attack. Although the judicial overhaul is off the agenda, Israeli society's wartime cohesion will be tested after the High Court of Justice on Tuesday ordered the government to begin conscripting yeshiva students. At least 1,200 people were killed, and 252 Israelis and foreigners were taken hostage in Hamas's attacks on Israeli communities near the Gaza border on October 7. Of the 116 remaining hostages, more than 30 are believed dead.

India expected to mandate USB-C connectors for smartphones, laptops by 2026

India is poised to enforce a new regulation mandating USB-C connectors on all smartphones and laptops by 2026, aligning with global efforts to standardize charging solutions and reduce electronic waste.

According to a report obtained by GSM Arena, smartphone manufacturers must comply with the USB-C standard by June 2025, while laptops must adopt USB-C ports for charging by the end of 2026.

The decision by Indian policymakers follows similar measures introduced by the European Union, which recently implemented regulations mandating USB-C connectivity starting this year.

According to GSM Arena, the move aims to simplify the user experience by ensuring that all compatible devices use a universal charging cable, thereby reducing the proliferation of proprietary chargers and cables.

This transition is expected to encompass a wide range of devices beyond smartphones, including tablets, Win-



dows laptops, and MacBooks, fostering interoperability across different platforms.

Notably, the mandate does not extend to smaller accessories such as fitness bands, smartwatches, earbuds, or basic feature phones, emphasizing a focus on larger electronic devices like smartphones and laptops, as per GSM Arena.

While the Indian Union IT ministry has not issued an official statement yet, reports indicate that discussions with industry leaders have already taken place, receiving favourable responses towards the upcoming regulation.

Chinese President Xi Jinping to attend SCO summit from July 2 to 6

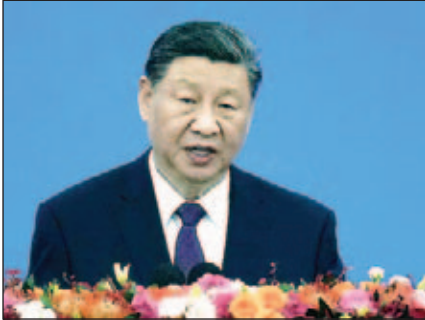
Chinese President Xi Jinping will attend the 24th summit of the Council of Heads of State of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization in Kazakhstan's capital Astana from July 2 to 6, the Chinese Foreign Ministry announced on Sunday.

Xi will also pay state visits to Kazakhstan and Tajikistan at the invitation of President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev of Kazakhstan and President Emomali Rahmon of Tajikistan, spokesperson Hua Chunying said.

Meanwhile, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar will lead the Indian delegation at the SCO summit, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) announced on June 28.

The SCO summit will take place from July 3-4 in Astana, the capital city of Kazakhstan.

Kazakhstan took over the SCO presidency from India, which was the president last year. India hosted the SCO summit virtually in July 2023. This year's host is Kazakhstan President Kassym-Jomart Tokayev, who has proposed, among other initiatives, the establishment of a joint investment



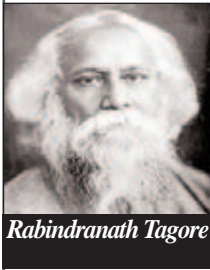
fund. During the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020-2021, the SCO summits were held virtually. The Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) is a political, economic, and security group that was established in 2001.

The current members of the SCO are China, Russia, India, Pakistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan. Iran became a full member in 2023, under the Indian Presidency of the grouping. Belarus is an observer state and is next in line to gain full membership.

Tooth loss and chronic renal disease may be related in postmenopausal women: Study

The kidneys are essential for maintaining general health because they filter waste from the circulation. A number of grave, sometimes fatal medical disorders may arise if they are unable to effectively filter out foreign substances. According to a recent study, tooth loss and chronic renal disease may be related.

The findings of the survey are published online in Menopause, the journal of The Menopause Society. The glomerular filtration rate of a female indicates the state of her kidneys. Following menopause, kidney function declines over time and is correlated with lower levels of reproductive hormones. These hormone shifts



that occur during menopause also frequently result in abdominal obe-

sity, which is associated with an increased risk of tooth loss and is a

separate risk factor for the development of chronic kidney disease. The consequences of kidney disease are numerous, including an increased probability of experiencing problems with bone and cardiovascular health. Tooth loss, which reflects oral health status, is also associated with systemic diseases, such as diabetes, thyroid disease, and osteoporosis, and is independently associated with an increased risk of stroke. Excessive tooth loss can also impair chewing and speech.

Previous studies have identified an association between kidney function and tooth count. This newest study involving nearly 65,000 participants, however, is the

first known to evaluate the association between chronic kidney disease and tooth loss in postmenopausal women across the ages. It concluded that the glomerular filtration rate, a measure of kidney function, is significantly associated with having at least 20 (of a total of 28) adult teeth, suggesting that chronic kidney disease and tooth loss are significantly associated, especially in postmenopausal women aged 66 to 79 years.

These findings suggest that preventing and managing mineral and bone metabolism disorders in postmenopausal women with chronic kidney disease are crucial to prevent tooth loss. It is also important

to address kidney disease progression, as the consequences affect multiple body systems beyond just oral health.

Survey results are published in the article "Chronic kidney disease in postmenopausal women is associated with tooth loss."

"This study highlights the known link between chronic kidney disease and bone metabolism. Increased attention to oral and bone health is warranted in postmenopausal women with chronic kidney disease, in addition to meticulous efforts aimed at preserving kidney function. Conversely, oral health is a window to overall health, and good oral hygiene is important for women of all ages,"

1. Uttanasana (Standing Forward Bend) Start with arms raised overhead and come into a forward fold by gliding your arms down. This is commonly referred to as a Swan Dive. Next, ensure your fingers clasp your heels. Bend the knees without locking them or injuring yourself. The more you contract and draw up your quadriceps muscles, the more your hamstrings will open. 2. Halasana (Plow Pose) Start by lying flat on your back and stretching your feet in the opposite direction

Hold the position for 45-60 seconds. Roll your spine back to the surface and elevate your legs to a 90-degree angle to release. Return your legs

3. Balasana (Child Pose) Kneel on your hands and knees on the floor. Spread your knees out, keeping the tops of your toes on the floor and your big toes touching. Rest your forehead on the mat and lay your undersurface between your thighs. Relax every muscle in your body. Stretch your arms out in front of you.

CM approves Rs. 44.1 crore annually to enhance pediatric HDU units in Hospitals

In a significant move to enhance pediatric care, Haryana Chief Minister Sh. Nayab Singh has approved an allocation of Rs. 44.1 crore per annum to further strengthen the 12-bedded Pediatric HDU/ICU units already established in various district hospitals across the state.

While disclosing this here today, Health Minister Dr. Kamal Gupta said that these 12-bedded Pediatric HDU/ICU units were initially set up under the Emergency COVID Response Package Phase-II (ECRP-II). He highlighted that out of the Rs. 44.1 crore, Rs. 38.8 crore would be utilized annually for the engagement of essential medical personnel, including 21 Intensivists, 105 Duty Medical Officers (trained in ICU), 420 ICU-trained Staff Nurses/Nursing Sisters, 105 OT/Anesthesia Technicians, and 21 Counselors to ensure the smooth

operationalization of these Pediatric HDU/ICU units.

He said that the recruitment of this critical workforce would be conducted



through walk-in interviews, advertised on the Directorate General Health Services (DGHS) website and the National Health Mission (NHM) portal. A commit-

tee headed by the DGHS would oversee the recruitment process. In addition, support staff would be engaged through the Haryana Kaushal Rozgar Nigam Limited (HKRNL) with an estimated yearly expenditure of Rs. 5.3 crore.

To streamline operations, a separate cell would be created within the DGHS office to maintain records and manage other service-related matters concerning the engaged manpower for the operationalization of ICUs.

Dr. Gupta emphasized the government's commitment to providing quality healthcare facilities, ensuring that there would be no shortage of funds for providing world class healthcare facilities in government hospitals across the state. He also reiterated the continuous efforts to upgrade the infrastructure of state government health facilities, ensuring adequate manpower to deliver optimal healthcare services to the public.

The General Secretary of the All India Congress Committee, former State President of Haryana Congress, in-charge of Uttarakhand, former Union Minister and Member of Congress Working Committee, and newly elected MP from Sirsa Lok Sabha seat of Congress (India Alliance), Kumari Selja said that after the political and moral setback in the election, PM Narendra Modi and the BJP are pretending to respect the Constitution. However, the truth is that the three criminal justice system laws being implemented from today were forcibly passed by suspending 146 MPs. This bulldozer will not run on the parliamentary system of justice. Kumari Selja said that this bill should be

From today, three new laws, the Indian Justice Code, the Indian Civil Protection Code, and the Indian Evidence Exchange, are being implemented in place of IPC, CRPC, and the Indian Evidence Act. She said that these three laws should be stopped immediately. Kumari Selja said that these laws lay the foundation for a police state. The new criminal laws will lay the foundation for turning India from a welfare state into a police state. She said that there should be a re-discussion in Parliament on these laws before any decision is taken.



Kumari Selja said that for law enforcement agencies, judicial officers, and legal professionals, there will be significant challenges ahead. She said that these laws will affect a large number of citizens at some point. The haste with which the government brought these laws to Parliament and implemented them is undesirable in a democracy. There was neither adequate discussion in the Parliamentary Committee nor extensive discussion in the House, and

there was no consultation with stakeholders.

Kumari Selja said that the state government has completely failed to protect the lives and property of the people, even though the Home Ministry is under the Chief Minister. Being the Home Minister of Haryana, the Chief Minister should solve this problem. The state is under jungle raj instead of law and order. Incidents of shootings, extortion, and ransom are increasing in various places. The government is busy making false declarations and promises instead of catching criminals. A state where crime increases can never develop. Due to the increase in crime, traders and industrialists are continuously migrating from Haryana, which is increasing unemployment more than before.

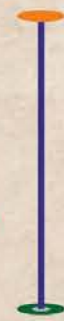
