12 Naxals killed in encounter on Maha-Chhattisgarh border

GADCHIROLI:) At least 12 Naxalites were killed and two security personnel injured in an encounter with police and commandos in Gadchiroli district of Maharashtra near the Chhattisgarh border on Wednesday, officials said. The heavy exchange of fire broke out in the afternoon between C60 commandos and Naxals in Wandoli village and continued for six hours, Gadchiroli Superintendent of Police Nilotpal said.

Ex FS Vinay Kwatra appointed as US Ambassador

NEW DELHI: The government has nominated retired diplomat Vinay Kwatra as its next ambassador to the US, months before the country heads to a pivotal election, according to people familiar with the matter. Vinay Kwatra, who retired as India's foreign secretary earlier this month, will look to bring certainty to the India-US relationship as countries brace for a possible change in administration after November's US elections. An immediate priority of Mr Kwatra's will be to reach out to officials who could play an important role in India-related policy in the next administration, the people said asking not to be identified because the discussions are private.

Guv to remain Chancellor of University in Pb

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab University Laws Amendment Bill 2023 has been sent back to the government by President Droupadi Murmu without assent. The bill was passed unanimously in the Punjab Assembly on June 21 last year. Under the bill, the power of the Vice Chancellor of 12 state universities of the state was given from the Governor to the Chief Minister. However, due to the withdrawal of the said bill, the Governor will now be the chancellor of all the universities of the state. But, since then, the politics of the state has heated up again. The government had fought a long battle regarding this bill. However, the government's opinion has not been revealed in this matter yet.

Haryana announces 10 pc reservation for Agniveers in Police, forest guard jobs

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 17

Months ahead of the assembly polls, Haryana's BJP government announced Wednesday a 10 per cent reservation for Agniveers in the recruitment of constables, forest guards and jail wardens, along with quotas in other posts.

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini also said that the government will provide interest-free loans of up to Rs 5 lakh if any Agniveer wishes to set up their own business.

"In direct recruitment to posts of constable, mining guard, forest guard, jail warden and special police officer made by the state government, there will be a 10 per cent horizontal reservation for Agniveers," He said at a press conference here.

Launched in 2022, Agnipath scheme provides for short-term induction of personnel into the armed forces. Those in the 17.5-21 years age group are inducted for a four-year period. There is a provision to retain 25 per cent of these recruits for 15 more years. The remaining will be given a financial package as their service comes to an end. Those recruited under the scheme are called Agniveers.



The Chief Minister said that the Congress is spreading propaganda regarding the scheme, adding this is a very good plan of Prime Minister Narendra Modi as it leads to skilled youth.

Mr Saini said that in Group C and D posts, an age relaxation of three years will also be made.

"However, in the first batch of Agniveers, this age relaxation will be five years," Mr Saini said.

If a private company pays a salary of 30,000 to an Agniveer, then the government will give an annual subsidy of 60,000 to that company, the Chief Minister said.

Victims of hit-and-run accidents to get cashless treatment in state

CHANDIGARH: With the aim of providing assistance to the victims of road accidents in Haryana, a new scheme has now been started in the state on the lines of the Central Government. Announcing this here today, Chief Minister, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini said under this scheme, such victims will be provided free cashless treatment facility as well as compensation in hit-and-run accident cases. The time limit for the process of application of compensation and payment to the victims has also been fixed. The Chief Minister made this announcement while addressing a press conference here today. He said under this scheme, the expenditure will be borne from the Haryana Road Safety Fund. Apart from this, a district-level committee will also be formed to properly implement this scheme at the district level.

HC reserves order on Kejriwal's pleas challenging arrest by CBI

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JULY 17

The Delhi High Court reserved on Wednesday its order on Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's pleas challenging his arrest by the CBI in the excise policy case and seeking interim bail.

Kejriwal's senior counsel not only assailed his arrest by the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) but also sought his release on bail in the case.

Justice Neena Bansal Krishna, who conducted the proceedings on a holiday on account of Muharram, heard the arguments advanced by the lawyers of Kejriwal and the CBI and reserved its order on the petitions.

The high court has listed his regular bail plea for further



arguments on July 29.

During the hearing, senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, representing the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) national convenor, termed his arrest by the CBI an "insurance arrest" to stop him from walking out of jail.

"It is unfortunately an insurance arrest. I have effectively three release orders in my

favour (in the ED case) under very stringent provisions... These orders show that the man is entitled to be released. He would have been released but for this insurance arrest," he contended.

Asserting that Kejriwal was "not a terrorist" but the chief minister of Delhi, Singhvi said his arrest was not as per the mandate of the law and being the chief minister, he was entitled to bail. On behalf of the CBI, advocate D P Singh opposed the two pleas of Kejriwal and said terming the arrest an "insurance arrest" was unjustified. Kejriwal was arrested by the CBI on June 26 from Tihar Jail, where he is still lodged in judicial custody in a connected money laundering case filed by the Enforcement Directorate (ED).

Security forces exchange fire with terrorists in Doda

AGENCY JAMMU, JULY 17

A day after four army personnel, including a Captain ,were killed in the line of duty, security forces exchanged fire with terrorists in the hilly belt of Doda district of Jammu and Kashmir.

Official sources said that the terrorists fired at the search party of security forces on Tuesday night in Desa for-



est area of Doda district.

"The action was retaliated following which a brief exchange of fire took place," they

said. They also added that the Village Defence Guards (VDGs) also opened fire on observing a suspicious movement outside their village in Kalaan Bhata area and near Panchan Bhata during the ongoing anti-terrorist operation in the Desa forest area.

Meanwhile a joint team of security forces have launched a search operation to track down the terrorists.

Oil Tanker with 13 Indians on board sinks off Oman coast



AGENCY MUSCAT, JULY 17

A Comoros-flagged oil tanker with 13 Indians and 3 Sri Lankans as crew members has capsized off the coast of Oman, the country's Maritime Security Centre said on Tuesday.

The oil tanker, Prestige Falcon capsized 25 nautical miles southeast of Ras Madrakah. This is near the Omani port of Duqm.

The Maritime Security Centre said in a post on X, "A Comoros-flagged oil tanker capsized 25 NM southeast of Ras Madrakah. SAR Ops initiated with the relevant authorities. #MaritimeSecurityCentre" Updates regarding the re-

cent capsizing incident of the Comoros flagged oil tanker southeast of Ras. The tanker was heading to the Yemeni port of Aden, according to shipping data by LSEG. The vessel is a 117-metre-long oil products tanker built in 2007, LSEG's shipping data showed. Such small tankers are generally deployed for short voyages. Earlier, on November 27, a cargo ship carrying 14 crew members, sank off the coast of Lesbos island in Greece due to high-speed winds. The Comoros-flagged ship Raptor, which was travelling from Dekheila, Egypt to Istanbul carrying a load of salt, sank 4.5 nautical miles (8.3 km) southwest of Lesbos.

Three operatives of Lawrence Bishnoi gang arrested

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 17

In a major breakthrough against organised crime amidst the ongoing drive to make Punjab a safe and secure state as per the vision of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh, Anti Gangster Task Force (AGTF) Punjab in a joint operation with Rajasthan Police and Bathinda Police arrested three associates of Lawrence Bishnoi and USA-based Goldy Brar Gang, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Wednesday.

Those arrested have been identified as Gurpreet Singh of Bhikhi in Mansa, Maninder Singh alias Munshi of Talwandi Sabo in Bathinda and Harcharanjit Singh of village Bir

Khurd in Mansa. All the accused persons have a criminal history with cases pertaining to murder, attempt to murder, Arms Act and NDPS act registered against them.

Police teams have also recovered two .32 calibre Pistols along with six cartridges from the possession of arrested accused persons.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that acting on the reliable inputs, AGTF teams under the overall supervision of ADGP Promod Ban along with Police teams from Bathinda apprehended accused Harcharanjit Singh, who was also wanted in attempt to murder case by the Mansa Police, with cooperation



of Rajasthan Police. Police teams were headed by AIG Sandeep Goel and led by DSP Rajan Parminder. He said that during interrogation, accused Harcharanjit revealed that he is working on directions of notori-

ous gangster Manpreet Singh alias Manna, who tasked him to help accused Gurpreet and Maninder Munshi to eliminate a rival gang member. Gangster Manna, who is currently lodged in Ropar Jail, is a close associate of Lawrence Bishnoi.

The DGP said that following the disclosure of accused Harcharanjit, Police teams launched a big man hunt to nab both the accused persons and managed to arrest them from Mansa Road in Bathinda. Further investigations are on to establish forward and backward linkages in this case, he added.

SC to hear pleas relating to NEET-UG exam today

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JULY 17

The Supreme Court on Thursday will hear a batch of petitions alleging paper leakage and malpractices in the NEET-UG 2024 exam, held on May 5 this year.

A bench of Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra will hear the case on July 18.

On July 15, the apex court adjourned the hearing for Thursday to enable the petitioners to file their responses to the affidavits filed by the Centre and the National Testing Agency

(NTA). It was noted in the order that some of the parties in the case haven't received the affidavits filed by the Centre and NTA and they need to prepare their responses before arguments.

On July 11, the Central government filed an affidavit in the case denying any mass malpractice in the NEET-UG 2024 exam.

In the affidavit, the Centre said the data analytics done by the Indian Institute of Technology Madras shows that there is neither any indication of mass malpractice nor a localised set of candidates being benefitted leading to abnormal scores.

Newly elected AAP MLA Mohinder Bhagat administered oath



CHANDIGARH: Mohinder Bhagat, the newly elected AAP MLA from Jalandhar West, was administered oath as a legislator by Punjab Assembly Speaker Kultar Singh Sandhwan on Wednesday here.

Punjab Chief Minister

Bhagwant Mann was also present on the occasion. Bhagat defeated the Bharatiya Janata Party's Sheetal Angural by a margin of 37,325 votes to win the assembly seat in the bypoll, which was held on July 10. The result for the by-election was announced on July 13.

Farmer activist Navdeep Singh released on bail

AMBALA: Farmer activist Navdeep Singh walked out of Ambala Central Jail after the Punjab and Haryana High Court granted him bail in a case registered in connection with farmers' February 13 'Delhi Chalo' march. He was arrested by Haryana Police from Mohali on March 28 on various charges, including rioting and attempt to murder. He walked out of jail after almost four months on Tuesday evening. Earlier, farmer leaders had said that they would gherao the office of the Ambala superintendent of police on Wednesday and Thursday to protest against Navdeep Singh's arrest.

More trouble for Khedkar family as ACB Pune initiates inquiry on unaccounted wealth

AGENCY PUNE, JULY 17

The Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) Pune has initiated an inquiry against Dilip Khedkar today, father of probationary IAS Puja Khedkar, to investigate the unaccounted wealth owned by the family.

IAS Puja Khedkar, who secured an All India rank of 821 in the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) exams, has been allegedly abused for abusing her authority.

The complaint against her father, Dilip Khedkar, was made a

few months ago.

After Puja Khedkar's issue has come to the fore, the complainant has approached Pune ACB again. Action has been initiated on the complaint.

ACB SP Atul Tambe said that a detailed report of the investigation has been drafted and has been sent to the HQ for further action. He said that the name of the complainant cannot be disclosed as it is confidential.

"There was a complaint against Dilip Khedkar with ACB a few months ago. We have drafted a detailed report of our investigation and complaint. It has



been sent to the HQ for further action. The name of the com-

plainant cannot be disclosed as it is confidential," Tambe said.

Earlier, Pune RTI activist Vijay Kumbhar raised questions about Khedkar's appointment, alleging that she did not fall under the OBC non-creamy layer as her father had assets worth Rs 40 crore.

"As per the rules, only those who come under the OBC non-creme layer category whose parents are under Rs 8 lakh per annum of income, but their income shows that it is Rs 40 crore. Her parents contested the recent Lok Sabha polls and all the property details are there in the affidavit,"

he said.

Kumbhar also claimed that based on the election affidavits filed by Dilip Khedkar in the Lok Sabha elections, the total assets amount to Rs 40 crore. "Her father, Dilip Khedkar, in his Lok Sabha polls affidavit showed a conservative estimated wealth of Rs 40 crores and an annual income of Rs 49 lakh. The information is in the public domain. Based on the election affidavit filed by her father in the recently concluded Lok Sabha elections, the total assets of Khedkar's father amount to Rs. 40 crore," he claimed.

Three-day forensic training program for public prosecutors launched

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 17

Haryana Chief Secretary, Sh. T.V.S.N. Prasad, virtually inaugurated the first-of-its-kind three-day training program for the state's public prosecutors (District Attorneys and Additional District Attorneys) today. The program focuses on forensic analysis and other aspects of criminal justice delivery.

On June 29, an agreement was signed between the Haryana Government and the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU), Gandhinagar, to enhance, facilitate, and strengthen collaborative activities in forensic and prosecutorial training, research, and forensic sample testing. As part of this initiative, the training course was launched today at HIPA, Gurugram. Initially, 26 District Attorneys and Additional District Attorneys are participating.



Chief Secretary, Sh. TVSN Prasad addressed the government lawyers undergoing training at the Haryana Institute of Public Administration (HIPA), Gurugram. He directed the Director General, HIPA to collaborate with the National Forensic Sciences University (NFSU) to develop a standardised curriculum. The training should have three

components: the first at HIPA, the second at the Lok Nayak Jayprakash Narayan National Institute of Criminology and Forensic Sciences (LN-JN-NICFS) at Rohini, New Delhi and the third at the National Forensic Sciences University in Gandhinagar, Gujarat.

Sh. Prasad emphasised the crucial role of forensic science in securing convictions in seri-

ous crimes. This course is therefore being made mandatory for all public prosecutors to enhance their expertise in forensic sciences. He also highlighted the increased responsibility of public prosecutors to ensure justice for the underprivileged, noting the challenges of access to justice for the poor.

Chief Secretary, Sh. Prasad further stressed the importance of government lawyers handling criminal cases in addition to their existing responsibilities.

Director General, HIPA, Smt. Chandralekh Mukherjee stated that the three-day training will cover several critical topics, including biological evidence in crime detection, recent trends in cybercrime and forensics, crime scene management, crimes involving firearms, road accident investigation, document examination and admissibility, and the role of forensic psychology.

Road infrastructure in State will be further strengthened : CM

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, JULY 17

To accelerate the development of highway infrastructure in Haryana, several road projects related to the National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) will now be expedited. A review meeting was held under the chairmanship of Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways, Sh. Nitin Gadkari late evening on July 16 in New Delhi regarding road projects related to Haryana. Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini and Union Minister of State for Road Transport and Highways, Sh. Harsh Malhotra along with senior officers from the central and state governments attended this meeting.

In the meeting, meaningful discussions were held on issues related to removing the Kherki Daula Toll Plaza, preparing a new ring road for Kurukshetra, and connecting Jewar International Airport to Faridabad-Ballabgarh Bypass from Mohna. The Central Minister after listening to the various demands put forth by Haryana assured prompt action on them. In the meeting, the Central Minister said plans to explore the possibilities of creating bird parks near the National Highways. Approximately four acres of land will be required for this. These bird parks will be established on a large scale, and NHAI will be responsible for their development. He said that the plans to establish multimodal logistic parks along the highways. The Chief Minister, Sh. Nayab Singh Saini suggested that garbage waste and fly ash from electricity plants could be more effectively utilised for road construction.

tion. He said that applications can be made on the portal of the Haryana government for soil-related works in National Highway projects, and efforts will be made to fulfill the availability of soil.

The Chief Minister informed that in this meeting, the current status of construction of ongoing road projects like Rohtak-Jind four-lane highway, Jind-Gohana four-lane highway, Delhi-Amritsar Expressway, Ambala-Kala Amb highway, Jagadhri-Tajewala highway, Jalbehara-Shahabad highway, Bhiwani-Hansi highway, and under Bharatmala project six-lane Ambala-Shamli highway of Bareilly-Ludhiana Corridor, Ambala and Karnal ring roads, four-lane Smailabad-Ambala highway in Ambala-Kotputli corridor, Pinjore bypass, etc., was reviewed. Construction



of projects that are more than 90 complete will be completed in the next three to four months. The Chief Minister said that constructing a bypass in Kurukshetra is needed, and it will reduce traffic pressure in the city. Currently, there is more traffic on local roads due to the absence of a bypass. Union Minister, Sh. Nitin Gadkari directed NHAI officers to provide a report on this immediately.

Police busts smuggling racket; two held with 7kg heroin, five pistols

AMRITSAR, JULY 17

In a major blow to the trans-border smuggling amidst the ongoing drive to make Punjab a safe and secure state as per vision of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Punjab Police has busted Pak-backed drug smuggling racket with the arrest of two persons and recovered 7kg heroin and five pistols — including four 9MM Glock pistols and one .32 bore pistol — from their possession, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Wednesday.

Those arrested have been identified as Gurmukh Singh, a resident of Bhura Kona in Tarn Taran and Jagwant Singh of Mehdiapur in Tarn Taran. Apart from recovering heroin and weapons, police teams have also recovered five live cartridges and five magazines from their possession, besides, impounding their Swift Dzire car (PB 38 D 1759). DGP Gaurav Yadav said that acting on secret information about two smugglers on their Swift Dzire car



are going to deliver a weapon consignment, Police teams from Amritsar Rural conducted a special Naka near village Muhawa in the area of Gharinda and arrested the accused persons after recovering five pistols and ammunition from their possession. He said that during questioning,

the arrested accused persons disclosed that along with weapons they had also retrieved heroin, which they kept concealed near their house. Following their disclosure, Police teams conducted a raid at a location pinpointed by the accused persons and recovered 7Kg heroin.

The DGP said that as per preliminary investigations, both the arrested accused persons were directly in touch with Pakistan-based smugglers and were supplying consignments of weapons and drugs across the state after smuggling from Pakistan via Drones. Sharing more details, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Amritsar Rural Satinder Singh said that investigations are on to establish backward and forward linkages in this case and identify the Pakistan based smuggler and persons to whom the arrested persons were to deliver the weapon consignment.

The Police teams will also initiate the procedure to forfeit the illegally acquired property of the arrested smugglers under section 68F of the NDPS Act, he added.

In this regard, a case FIR no. 170 dated 16/7/2024 has been registered under section 25 of the Arms Act and sections 21, 25 and 29 of the NDPS Act at Police Station Gharinda in Amritsar Rural.

Waste dumping in HP: NGT issues notice to pollution control boards



SHIMLA: The National Green Tribunal (NGT) in New Delhi has issued notices to Central and Himachal Pradesh pollution control boards seeking response to a petition alleging illegal dumping of solid waste at Koksar in Lahaul and Spiti district of the hill state, a lawyer said on Wednesday. The order was passed by a three-member bench headed by Justice Prakash Shrivastava, Chairperson of the NGT, on July 12 and its copy was issued in Shimla. The Green tribunal has sought responses from the pollution boards within four weeks. The petition filed by Friends, an environmental advocacy group, highlighted the improper disposal of solid waste in Koksar. The petitioner attached photographs of littering with its petition, prompting the NGT to issue notices to government agencies. Given the severity of the situation, the NGT issued notices to the Central and State Pollution Control Boards, the State of Himachal Pradesh, the Deputy Commissioner of Lahaul & Spiti, and the Village Panchayat of Koksar, demanding responses within a stipulated four-week timeframe. The tribunal mandated that these responses should include detailed reports on remedial action taken on the problem, ensuring compliance with the relevant rules. Senior counsel Akash Vashistha, representing the petitioner, told the Bench, which also included Justice Anun Kumar Tyagi, Judicial Member Dr. A. Senthil Vel, Expert Member, that Rule 20 of the Solid Waste Management Rules, 2016, had not been complied with in the area. Rule 20 outlines specific criteria for solid waste management in hilly areas, including the avoidance of landfill construction and the establishment of transfer stations for waste collection. The tribunal took note of the applicant's grievances, which included a lack of compliance by the local authorities and Panchayats, as well as the inadequate actions of the State Pollution Control Board (HSPSCB) and other relevant bodies.

CM Sukhu urges Nitin Gadkari to declare Ranital-Kotla, Ghumarwin-Sarkaghat roads as NH

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu urged Union Minister for Road Transport and National Highways Nitin Gadkari to declare 39.20 km Ranital-Kotla and 41.50 km Ghumarwin-Jahu-Sarkaghat roads as National Highways. The Chief Minister said that these roads have already been constructed to National Highway standards and stand declared 'in-principle National Highway'. He said that roads were the major mode of transport in the hill state. He added that no new National Highway has been declared for Himachal in the last 8 years. The Chief Minister was speaking in the review meeting of National



Highway Projects chaired by the Union Minister at New Delhi last evening. Sukhu requested to release Rs. 172.97 crore for restoration of various state roads adjoining National Highways that got damaged due to flash floods and landslides during the monsoon season last year. He said that these roads include Kullu-Manali, Mandi-Kamand-Katola-Bajaura road and Chail-Gohar-Pandoh road. The Chief Minister informed that announcement was made by the Union Minister, during his visit to the state after the monsoon-led disaster caused heavy losses in the state, that centre shall provide adequate funds for the repair and restoration of damaged state roads within a distance of one km from the National

Highways. He said that these roads were of significance as they ease traffic congestions on the National Highways and also proved vital during previous monsoon season wherein many road stretches were damaged on Kullu-Manali Highway. The Chief Minister said that Shimla-Mataur National Highway is an important highway of the state providing connectivity to eight districts with the state capital and adjoining states. He said that the development of highway corridor in different configurations is not advisable from road safety point of view and requested to issue directions to authorities for uniform upgradation of the highways to four lane standards instead of two lane standards.

Naresh Chauhan thanks voters for Congress victory in by-polls

CM seeks Rs. 9,042 cr assistance under post disaster assessment done by Central team

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu called on Union Home Minister Amit Shah at New Delhi today and apprised him about the vulnerability of state to natural disasters and urged for speedy release of funds pending with the ministry for effective management of disasters. He requested for releasing Rs. 9,042 crore as financial assistance under post disaster assessment done by the central team after the state witnessed one of its worst natural disasters during last year's monsoon, triggered due to excessive rain resulting in flash floods and landslides. He said that the matter was still pending with the ministry and added that the state requires the fund urgently given that the monsoon has already started

Wet spell likely in Himachal for 5 days

SHIMLA: The South West Monsoon, which has been less active over Himachal Pradesh over the past 10 days, may pick up from Thursday, the India Meteorological Department on Wednesday said, forecasting a wet spell for the next five days.

The IMD said since Tuesday the state has experienced light to moderate rain in several areas, with heavy rainfall reported in Bilaspur. Temperatures remained stable, with the lowest recorded at 12.1°C in Kukumseri and the highest at 37.4°C in Bhuntar.

The weatherman has forecast continuous rainfall over the next five days, especially in the low and middle hills, with heavy rain and thunderstorms likely in isolated places. For the high hills, rain is expected at fewer places but still present throughout the week.

Sukhu pushes for state's power project rights

Himachal Pradesh Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu on Wednesday met with Union Minister for MPP and Power, Manohar Lal Khattar, in New Delhi to address several longstanding issues affecting in the state. The Chief Minister emphasised the urgent need to restore the rights of the Shanan Power Project to the state, highlighting that the lease period had expired. He called for a swift and amicable resolution to this matter. Additionally, CM Sukhu pressed for the release of the pending share from the Bhakra Beas Management Board (BBMB), which has been delayed for many years, causing significant financial losses to Himachal Pradesh.

Slow construction on Attari-Leh NH plagues residents with troubles

The construction of the Attari-Leh National Highway No. 03, spanning from the Pakistan border to the China border via Hamirpur, Samirpur, Sarkaghat, and Dharmapur, is still incomplete and is set to cause problems for residents during the monsoon season once again. Despite last year's severe difficulties due to the unfinished highway, the construction company has failed to learn from the past. The sluggish pace of construction and the government's and administration's negative attitude towards the project mean that people will have to face hardships once more. Local residents, including Sanjeev Kumar, Praveen Kumar, Indra Bandhu, Chholthara Panchayat Pradhan Mehar Singh, Up-Pradhan Vijay Baniyal, Rakesh Baniyal, Kamlesh Kumar, Sandeep Kumar, Meena Kumari, Kaushalya, Sheela Devi, Meera, and Sarita, have expressed their concerns. They noted that the construction work is progressing at a snail's pace. In many areas, the land has been cut for the road, but protective walls are still incomplete. In some places, excavation work is ongoing, and there



are piles of debris everywhere, which could wreak havoc during the monsoon. Last year, residents faced significant issues during the monsoon due to incomplete work. The current unfinished state of the construction suggests that the monsoon will bring similar troubles this year. They urged that the construction company be directed to complete the work as soon as possible to avoid further inconvenience. Dharmapur MLA Chandrashekhar mentioned that the company has been warned multiple times. If the construction company does not perform the work correctly, legal action will be taken against it.

Congress criticizes Central Govt while public endorses PM Modi's leadership: Bihari Lal

BJP State General Secretary Bihari Lal Sharma remarked that the BJP achieved a significant victory in the Lok Sabha elections in the state, increasing its seats from three to four. The BJP managed to defeat Congress in the Mandi parliamentary seat, securing all four Lok Sabha seats in the state. He highlighted that while the Congress continued to criticize the central government, the public endorsed PM Modi's leadership. He pointed out that several prominent state leaders, including the Chief Minister and Deputy Chief Minister, hail from the Hamirpur parliamentary constituency. Despite Congress fielding its preferred candidate and the intensive campaigning by its



leaders, the party faced defeat in Hamirpur. This defeat raises significant questions about the Congress leadership, as even the Chief Minister could not secure an advantage for the party in his own assembly seat. This indicates that a BJP wave swept through Hamirpur, overpowering the Congress leadership. Sharma also mentioned that in the recent by-elections, the Congress lost two out of three seats in Hamirpur district. Ashish received the public's blessings in Hamirpur, and

Inder Dutt Lakhnupal won in Barsar. Despite the false propaganda by the government, they could not secure a win. The people of Barsar are still searching for the claimed 25 lakh rupees that the Chief Minister himself promised. Despite repeated queries from the BJP, the government has yet to respond to this question. He emphasized that even though the Congress managed some wins, it ultimately failed because its leadership could not protect its own strongholds. The BJP increased its presence in the Lok Sabha to four seats and reached 28 in the assembly, while the Congress, barely visible in the Lok Sabha, saw its assembly seats drop from 43 to 40. Sharma concluded by saying, "It is clear who won – the BJP. And who lost? Only the Congress."

High alert in Chamba district after terrorist attack in Jammu Kashmir

This is for the second time, after 2019, that the census will be conducted digitally, using tablet computers for data collection of animals, according to their breed and other characteristics. "According to the statistics provided by the Government of India, the census will be conducted of over 64.75 lakh livestock and poultry in the state", he added. Khudian said that this would be the first time that pet dogs and cats will also be counted by their breeds and cattle at Gaushalas and cattle being reared by Nomadic tribes will be counted sepa-



rately. He said that there will be a one state nodal officer, five zonal nodal officers, 23 district nodal officers, 392 supervisors and 1962 enumerators to accomplish this extensive field survey.

Enumerators will visit each household to record the number of animals according to their breeds and other characteristics, he added. During the meeting, Khudian also reviewed the functioning of vet-

erinary health facilities, OPD, vaccination and artificial insemination. He directed the department officials that livestock farmers should not face any problem and their welfare should be the priority of the department. Joint Secretary of Animal Husbandry, Dairy Development and Fisheries department, Mr. Bikramjit Singh Shergill while apprising the cabinet minister said that all the concerned officers are

undergoing training to conduct this census and their training will be completed and all arrangements have been made for smooth and impeccable census. Director Animal Husbandry, Dr. Gursharanjit Singh Bedi said that the department will get the literature printed on different diseases of animals and their preventions and will assure its distribution in the villages of Punjab.

Dr. Puneet Sachdeva, Consultant, Transfusion Medicine and Blood Centre said, "Nowadays, blood centers are not only limited to collection, processing and issue of blood but these have been upgraded to Departments of Transfusion Medicine."

Editorial

Terminal decline

It has only been three weeks since a section of a roof of Terminal 1 at the Delhi airport collapsed. But after the initial shock, coverage of the story has almost entirely disappeared from the news. One could substitute the Delhi airport collapse with the Rajkot airport canopy crash or the fire in an amusement park, also in Rajkot, or another fire that killed seven babies at a neonatal hospital in Delhi, all of which happened in the last two months. In each case, it would be the same story. Or, the same non-story. Public building collapses and fires happen as a matter of routine — an inquiry is ordered, the dead and the injured are given compensation 'ex gratia', a Latin phrase that very few understand, but which is trotted out when such incidents happen and, then, kaput. No one hears anything meaningful about the incident till it appears as a bullet point the next time there is such a collapse. The tragedy goes on.

But must it? Is the price of human life so cheap and the public so forgiving that unnecessary deaths, like that of the driver of the taxi at the Delhi airport, must continue? Admittedly, there is no magic bullet solution to the problem of unsafe public infrastructure. But equally, there are a few well-established factors that create a culture of safety. First, we must have the right set of rules and standards. Building approvals are based on the design of buildings, their construction quality, their fire-safety precautions, with periodic approvals needed if major changes are made. Some of these rules do exist in India, though not all. Our fire-safety standards, for example, are some of the most lax in the world. But even when they do exist, they are scarcely observed. Take the Delhi airport example — it appears that the approval for the airport did not factor in what would happen to the structure if the level of rain crossed a certain threshold. Since the total rainfall crossed the threshold, the canopy collapsed leading to the beam smashing into the cars which were waiting in the forecourt.

Now anyone who has witnessed the rains in Delhi this monsoon will know that it is a fraction of the rainfall in many other parts of the country. The fact that even a relatively small amount of rain could cause this damage points to a possible problem in the standards themselves — they are simply not robust enough to guarantee safety. The regulator that sets the standards for quality of airport buildings must bear responsibility for this omission. But even if the standard were sound, the accident might still have happened. As Indians, we pride ourselves on jugaad, often extolling its virtues.

India-Indonesia-Australia
Trilateral dialogue

The India-Indonesia-Australia Trilateral Focal Points meeting was held on Tuesday, during which the three sides held discussions to explore opportunities for collaboration under the framework of the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA).

The Indian side was led by Paramita Tripathi, Joint Secretary (Oceania and Indo-Pacific), while the Indonesian side was led by Adi Dzulfaat, Director for Pacific and Oceanic Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Australian side by Sarah Storey, First Assistant Secretary, South and Central Asia Division, Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade.

"The three sides held discussions to explore opportunities for collaboration, including under the framework of the Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and the Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA) mechanisms, maritime domain awareness, marine pollution and blue economy cooperation," the MEA said in a statement.

The three sides also noted convergence between India's Indo-Pacific Oceans Initiative (IPOI) and ASEAN Outlook on the Indo-Pacific (AOIP).

India, Indonesia and Australia reaffirmed their commitment to advancing their shared values and working together towards a free, open, inclusive, peace-



ful, prosperous and rules-based Indo-Pacific. Earlier in May, the 2nd edition of the India-Australia-Indonesia Trilateral Maritime Security Workshop (TMSW) was conducted from May 15 to 17 at INS Dronacharya, Kochi. The theme of the

workshop was 'Indian Ocean Region: Collaborative Efforts to Enhance Regional Maritime Security', which was selected to discuss ongoing maritime security challenges and opportunities for collaboration between the three mar-

itime neighbours in the region.

The workshop was conducted under the aegis of Headquarters Southern Naval Command and witnessed the participation of delegates from the three participating navies.

Storms claim 35 lives in Afghanistan's Nangarhar, leave 230 people injured

Torrential rains and hailstorms in Jalalabad city and nearby areas of Nangarhar province have claimed at least 35 lives, leaving 230 people injured, as reported by Khaama Press.

Nangarhar's Department of Information and Culture confirmed the loss of lives that took place on Monday in several districts of Nangarhar.

According to the department's report, the deceased and injured were transported to Nangarhar Central Hospital and Nangarhar Provincial Hospital for treatment.

The initial reports indicated that approximately 400 houses were destroyed, causing substantial financial losses to residents and businesses. However, the local authorities said that the figures could rise further, Khaama Press reported.

Following the natural disaster, actions are being taken to lessen the immediate effects on the impacted communi-



ties and to offer the assistance required for their rehabilitation.

The destruction brought about by the intense rain and hail highlights the pressing need for concerted relief measures to lessen impacted people's suffering and restore infrastructure that has been harmed.

Authorities are concentrating on making sure that everyone in need receives the aid they require as rescue and recovery efforts continue, placing a strong emphasis on unity and support for the impacted families and communities, according to Khaama Press.

India successfully concludes 4th periodic review by Human Rights Committee

India successfully concluded its 4th periodic review by the Human Rights Committee under the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (ICCPR) in Geneva on Tuesday, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) said.

The Indian delegation was spearheaded by Ld. Attorney General for India, R. Venkataramani and Ld. Solicitor General of India, Tushar Mehta. It also included Secretary (West) Pavan Kapoor and comprised senior officials from the Ministries of Women and Child Development, Social Justice and Empowerment, Electronics and Information Technology, Minority Affairs, External Affairs, Tribal Affairs, Home Affairs, and the Offices of Ld. Attorney General and Ld. Solicitor General.

"The Human Rights Committee, comprising 18 independent experts serving in their individual capacities, monitors the implementation of ICCPR and reviews reports of all States Parties (countries) by conducting periodic reviews and then making observations and recommendations," the MEA said in an official press release.



The rights and freedoms provided in ICCPR are guaranteed under the Constitution of India as well as our legislative and judicial framework. India became a State Party to ICCPR in 1979.

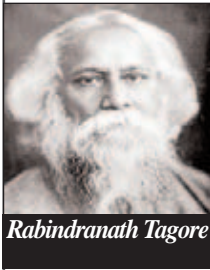
India has undergone three ICCPR reviews in the past, the last being in 1997.

The 4th periodic review of India, which took place on July 15-16, 2024, saw the Indian delegation engaging in constructive dialogue with the members of the Human Rights Committee on a wide range of issues related to civil and political rights and showcase India's commitment, actions and achievements in these areas.

Pre-existing conditions such as asthma or anxiety can make it worse. In those couple minutes of deep breathing, try to shift your focus from all stressors to breathing. A good rule of thumb is to breathe in for a count of four, hold for 1 or 2 and then release for 8.

2. Another Some Gum Chewing Some way to instantly feel less stressed. A 2008 study out of Swinburne University found that people who chew gum while multitasking under stress had lower cortisol levels, reduced levels

of stress and anxiety, and increased levels of alertness and performance. Another 2009 study at NICM Collaborative Centre for the Study of Natural Medicines and Neurocognition, Australia, found that chewing gum can improve a negative mood, and increase levels of peace and calm. Chewing gum causes brain waves similar to those of relaxed people. Chewing gum promotes blood flow to your brain as well.

3. Organise If your stress is coming from a feeling of overwhelm, pause

for a second to make for yourself a sustainable plan of action to follow. Relieve yourself for the stress that comes from not knowing how to go about something or not being able to find what you need when you need it. It is always good to start a long day with timed to-do lists and even better to ensure that you work in a clean environment, on a desk, for example, where everything is in place, your food would be ready when it is time to eat, etc.

4. Exercise It may not be what you wanted to hear, but regular

exercise (defined as at least 30 minutes of semi-rigorous movement 5 times a week) is directly linked to better moods and coping abilities. Exercise also regulates the hormones of the body, while it reduces levels of the body's stress hormones, such as adrenaline and cortisol, it also stimulates the production of endorphins, chemicals in the brain that are the body's natural painkillers and mood elevators, having both short- and long-term bearings on reduction of stress.
