UP: Criminal with Rs 1 lakh bounty on head killed in encounter

SHAHJAHANPUR : A criminal carrying a reward of Rs 1 lakh on his head was killed in an encounter with the Special Task Force (STF) of Uttar Pradesh police in Tilhar area of Shahjahanpur district, a senior officer said here on Thursday. Superintendent of Police (SP) Ashok Kumar Meena said that on Wednesday night the Bareilly unit of the STF received an input that notorious criminal Shahnoor alias Shanu, a resident of Sambhal district, was present in Shahjahanpur. "The STF team chased the criminal who opened fire near Pitthapur village," he said.

PM Narendra Modi chaired a meeting of the Cabinet Committee on Security, which also includes Home Minister Amit Shah and Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, on Thursday afternoon.

The meeting took place amid a rush of terror attacks in Jammu and Kashmir; hours before the meet two soldiers were injured in an encounter in J&K's Doda district, where forces have been engaged in a prolonged operation to flush out terrorists linked to the killing of four Army personnel this week.

Last month Mr Modi chaired a review meeting to assess the security



situation in J&K.

He spoke to Mr Shah, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, and Lt Governor Manoj Sinha, and was given an



overview of the security-related situation, including armed forces' counter-terrorism operations.

Sources told the PM directed full

deployment of armed forces' counter-terror capabilities. J&K Police have launched a major operation against increased terror activity in the region, which has seen 48 Army personnel, including officers, killed in action over the past 32 months. Police sources said multiple individuals suspected of aiding terrorists had been arrested, and large numbers of paramilitary and army troops were conducting search ops based on intelligence reports. Four Army personnel, including an officer, were killed in action in Doda beginning late Monday. That was the second major encounter in Jammu in a week; five soldiers were killed in Kathua in a coordinated terror strike, which included use of armour-piercing bullets.

Publish NEET-UG results city-wise and centre-wise by Saturday: SC

NEET-UG exam results are to be published in their entirety - cross-referenced by city and centre - by noon Saturday, the Supreme Court told the National Testing Agency - which is under fire over allegations of leaked question papers and violation of marking protocol - on Thursday afternoon.

The identities of the students will, however, remain masked, the court instructed the NTA.

The court's order followed a day of intense arguments over a clutch of petitions seeking a repeat, or cancellation, of

the qualifying examination for undergraduate medical courses in the country. The original exam - attended by nearly 24 lakh aspiring medical professionals - was held on May 5. The results were published last month but students



could only access their individual scores. The order to publish followed a plea by the petitioners. They argued that making the scores public would increase public confidence

in the NTA. Solicitor General Tushar Mehta, appearing for the exam agency, opposed the request on grounds the test results were students' private property.

Two passenger die as 12 coaches of Chd-Dibrugarh express derail in UP

Two passengers have died and 20 are injured after several coaches of the Chandigarh-Dibrugarh express train derailed in Uttar Pradesh's Gonda today. The incident took place in Pikaura which is located between Gonda and Jhila in Uttar Pradesh.

A rescue team has been sent to the site for relief operations. Some people are reportedly injured and visuals show passengers standing on the sides of the track with their luggage. Train number 15904 was heading to Dibrugarh in Assam from Chandigarh. A 40-member medical

team with 15 ambulances are at the spot and more ambulances are on their way to the accident site. Out of the 12 coaches, four coaches of the AC compartment derailed a few kilometres before the Jhulahi railway station. Several trains have been impacted on the route and a few trains have been diverted. Pankaj Singh, CPRO, North Eastern Railways said. "I had a close shave, glad to be safe. Don't worry I am fine," a passenger who was onboard the train said. Videos from the accident site showed people taking out their luggage from the derailed coaches. One of the coaches flipped and turned to its left, with some passengers standing on top of it.

Naxal attack: 2 STF cops killed, 4 injured in IED blast in Bijapur

Two personnel of the Special Task Force (STF) were killed and four others injured after Naxalites detonated an improvised explosive device (IED) in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district, police said on Thursday. Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai expressed grief over the incident and said the sacrifice of the jawans will not go in vain and the fight against Naxalism will continue till the menace is eradicated. The incident took place on Wednesday night in Tarrem area when a joint team of security personnel was returning after an anti-Naxalite operation in forests on the tri-junction of Bijapur-Sukma-Dantewada districts, a police official here said.

Personnel of the STF, District Reserve Guard - both state police units, Central Reserve Police Force and its elite Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) were involved in the operation, launched on Tuesday based on inputs about the presence of Naxalites belonging to their Darbha and west Bastar divisions and military company no.2, he said.

"Two STF constables - Bharat Sahu, resident of Raipur, and Satyer Singh Kange, of Narayanpur district - were killed in the blast triggered by Naxalites while four other personnel sustained injuries," the official said.

AAP to go solo in upcoming Haryana assembly elections

Police avert possible target killings with arrest of operative of BKI

sides impounding his Royal Enfield Motorcycle. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that State Special Operation Cell (SSOC) Amritsar had received an intel input that Happy Passian along with his associate Resham Singh is planning a major criminal activity in Punjab and for this purpose, they have tasked their foot soldier Vikramjit Singh, who was

travelling towards Chamrang Road, Amritsar on his Royal Enfield motorcycle.

Acting swiftly, the team of SSOC Amritsar cordoned off the specified area and apprehended accused Vikramjit Singh, he said, while adding that during search, police teams have recovered a pistol along with ammunition from his possession. The DGP said

that preliminary investigations have revealed that the accused was carrying out illegal activities on the directions of his foreign-based handlers. Further investigations are on to establish forward and backward linkages in this case, he added. Sharing more details, AIG SSOC Amritsar Sukhminder Singh Mann said that it was discovered that accused Vikramjit was in touch with Resham Singh for the last 5-6 years and a few months ago, Resham Singh has introduced him to Happy Passian to work as his foot soldier. Happy Passian has also been arranging delivery of weapons and ammunition to his gang-members and in this series, accused Vikramjit Singh recently procured a consignment to carry out Happy Passian's nefarious plans, he said. In this regard, a case FIR No. 43 dated 16.07.2024 has been registered under section 25 of the Arms Act and 61 (2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) Act at Police Station State Special Operation Cell Amritsar.

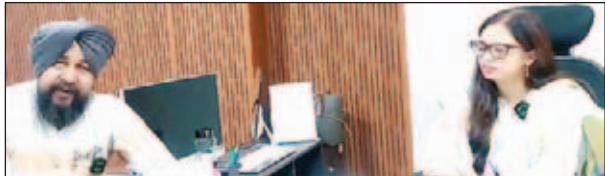

The SDPO said that Akshay is a painter by profession and the other two are unemployed. He said the three arrested youths will be produced before the Magistrate on Thursday.

Patwari and Kanungo Union Submits**Memorandum Opposing State Cadre Declaration**

DAULAT CHAUHAN JAWALI: The Patwari and Kanungo Union of the Jauli unit has strongly opposed the state government's decision to abolish the district cadre for Patwaris and Kanungos and declare a state cadre instead. The SDPO said acting on a tip police stopped a bus at Gaggal just outside the police station and nabbed a youth identified as Masoor (24), a resident of Brindaban Palampur, and recovered 14 grams of heroin from his possession. Sharma said during the checking inside the bus Masoor, traveling with his four-year-old daughter was caught with heroin. SDPO said during interrogation Masoor revealed that he had bought the contraband from Amritsar and was about to sell the same to various consumers in the Brindaban region of Palampur.

DC directs officials to check outbreaks of Diarrhoea and Cholera

MOHALI, JULY 18

Deputy Commissioner Aashika Jain has cautioned the district officials of the outbreak of Diarrhoea and Cholera as reported in some of the districts and directed them to keep sampling drinking water besides ensuring chlorine treatment to prevent its spread in the SAS Nagar district.

Taking a review meeting of the various departments including Rural Development and Panchayats, Urban Local Bodies, Health, Education, Water Supply and Sanitation departments, the Deputy Commissioner asked them to remain on alert mode to check the outbreak as well as take preventive measures in rural and urban areas. The Civil Surgeon was instructed to ensure the sampling of drinking water and if any sample of drinking water fails in the urban/rural area, then the concerned department should be informed about it and the action taken report should also be sent to the DC office. She further emphasised that the action taken report must contain the



measures taken to prevent the spread of the disease like ensuring the supply of chlorinated drinking water or disconnection of water connection (line in case of cases reported from a particular locality) besides ensuring water supply by alternate way (tanker etc.). Apart from this, medicines and other necessary arrangements should be completed for cholera-related cases in the hospital, said the Deputy Commissioner adding If such cases of cholera are reported in any city/village area, appropriate

action should be taken by taking immediate action. The health department should ensure an advance action plan for the use of chlorine tablets as per requirement. The Deputy Commissioner instructed the Municipal Corporation, Municipal Councils, Executive Engineer Water Supply Division No. 2 and 3 and Block Development and Panchayat Offices that the supply of clean and hygienic chlorinated water should be ensured in all urban/rural areas. It is also said It will be the collective responsibility of the Executive Engineer Water Supply and Sanitation, Division No. 3 and the concerned Block Development and Panchayat Officer to supply clean drinking water in the rural areas. She said that all government departments and agencies should ensure 100 per cent testing of samples at their own level. Regular checking should be made by the departments in their respective areas, where there is

leakage reported in the sewer line, it should be repaired immediately. In those areas where cases of cholera come to the fore due to contaminated water, immediately stop the water supply in that area arrange for alternative chlorinated water supply and ensure re-sampling of the water in collaboration with the Health Department after super chlorination. The District Education Officers (Secondary and Elementary) were instructed to ensure the water tanks constructed in all the schools in the district were cleaned in time to prevent such outbreaks. Along with this, all the departments were asked to run an awareness campaign to sensitise the people to the use of safe and hygienic (preferably boiled) drinking water. Khudian thanks union agriculture minister for giving go ahead to SASA

While expressing deep concern over pest attacks especially Pink Bollworm and whitefly attack on cotton crop, Punjab agriculture and farmers welfare minister, Gurmeet Singh Khudian today, sought union agriculture minister, Shivraj Singh Chouhan's personal intervention in speeding research and approval to the Next Generation BG-3 cotton seeds. The Punjab Minister, who called on the Mr. Shivraj Singh Chouhan at Krishi Bhawan, New Delhi, apprised that current generation BG-2 cotton need to be changed by an advanced seed to make this crop resistant to pest attacks. Meanwhile, Mr. Khudian thanked Mr. Chouhan for granting approval to the State Agricultural Statistics Authority (SASA) as this Authority would be a boon to strengthen the planning, monitoring, evaluating, research and development in the field of agriculture in the state. The Punjab Minister also apprised the Union Minister about the agrarian concerns of the state including implementation of Crop Residue Management (CRM) scheme, release of funds under Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana (RKVY), incentives to manage paddy straw and consoling & continuous supply of fertilisers and subsidy on wheat seed replacement scheme. While raising the major concern of the state regarding the CRM scheme, Mr. Khudian said that the central government has changed the funding pattern of the CRM scheme to 60:40 (Centre:State) in FY 2023-24, which was earlier 100 per cent centrally sponsored. He urged the union agriculture minister to reinstate the 100% central funding for the CRM scheme keeping in view the contribution of Punjab to national food security. He also sought incentive on per acre basis as compensation to farmers in lieu of the additional cost to be incurred on management of paddy straw. He also brought into the notice of Mr. Chouhan, shortage of phosphatic fertilisers generally occurs during the Rabi season and appealed to him to direct the concerned authorities to ensure the continuous supply of phosphatic fertilisers in this season. While adding further, Khudian said that about Rs 20 Crore are being invested annually under the National Food Security Mission (NFSM) and RKVY scheme as per the ICAR policy to replace 33% seed every year. "However, the Gol has stopped this assistance on wheat seed, which needs to be continued for the larger interest of feeding the ever-increasing population of the country" said Mr. Khudian. Besides others, Special Chief Secretary Agriculture, Mr. KAP Sinha; Director Agriculture, Jaswant Singh & other senior officials of the department and ministry were also present in the meeting.

Two new judges in SC take oath; top court gets first judge from Manipur

Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud administered the oath to Justices Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh and R Mahadevan as Supreme Court judges on Thursday. The appointment has restored the top court's full strength of 34 judges, including Chief Justice DY Chandrachud.

The Supreme Court Collegium had recommended Chief Justice of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Nongmeikapam Kotiswar Singh and Acting Chief of Madras High Court R Mahadevan for elevation to the top court.

The Collegium highlighted the importance of diversity on the bench when recommending both judges.

Their appointments were approved by the President on July 16. Justice Singh,



originally from Manipur, has become the first judge from the state of Manipur to be appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court.

"His appointment as a judge of the Supreme Court will provide representation to the North-East, and in particular, he will be the first judge from the state of Manipur to be appointed as a

judge of the Supreme Court," stated the resolution of the Collegium.

Justice Singh will serve as a judge at the Supreme Court until February 28, 2028, where the mandatory retirement age is 65.

The Collegium consisted of Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud and Justices Sanjiv Khanna, BR Gavai,

Surya Kant, and Hrishikesh Roy. Recommending the elevation of Justice Mahadevan, the resolution stated that he belongs to a backward community from the state of Tamil Nadu and his appointment will bring diversity to the bench.

The Collegium had taken due note of the fact that Justice Mahadevan ranked third in the order of presently serving judges of the Madras High Court, including the judges who have been posted as Chief Justices outside the Madras High Court, the resolution stated.

"At this stage, the Collegium has given precedence to the candidature of Justice Mahadevan in order to give representation to the backward community. For the above reasons, the Collegium is of the view that he is suitable and fit for being appointed as a judge of the Supreme Court," it added.

A cold war next door

The anarchy in Myanmar since the February 2021 military coup is showing no respite. A violent resistance against the junta by the People's Defence Force of the Bamar people has become a potent challenger, having found ready allies in many of the country's ethnic insurgent groups fighting their own wars against the Union of Myanmar since the country became independent in 1948. But the battle lines are not as clear as they seem. What complicates matters is the fact that none of the country's ethnic insurgencies has a common goal: they are only united in their resistance to a common enemy — the junta. The PDF, too, remains a conglomeration of local uprisings with no tangible, centralised command structure.

What is even more disturbing, as the International Crisis Group pointed out, is the emergence of pro-junta civil militias, the Pyusawhti, who are "resisting the resistance". The resultant tit-for-tat killings are making this conflict uglier and bitter. Many think that the junta, though stressed, does not really have to go all out to win but simply wait for the resistance to drain its energy. For Myanmar's neighbours, including India and Bangladesh, the concern is that the anarchy in Myanmar could spill over into their territories. India's current trouble in Manipur and that of Bangladesh in the Chittagong hill tracts bear evidence of the legitimacy of their apprehension.

There are other concerns. China has a deep interest in Myanmar and is ready to go to any length to have whoever is in power in the country on its side. China's game is to ensure that it remains relevant to the powers that be in Myanmar. For China, Myanmar is the most convenient land route to the Indian Ocean and, from there, to its resource centres in Africa and the Arabian Peninsula. It also has strategic interests in this part of the globe. India's recent decisions to suspend the Free Movement Regime agreement along the 1,643 kilometre India-Myanmar border and to fence it were surely influenced by its anxiety regarding China even though the decisions were attributed to the trouble in Manipur.

China's presence has also led to speculation that its rival, the United States of America, is looking for a base in the region. The much-publicised claim of the Bangladesh prime minister, Sheikh Hasina Wajed, that she had been approached by a "white" foreigner before the country's January elections promising smooth sailing for her party if she allowed his country to set up an air base in Bangladesh, fuelled this speculation further. Even if Wajed's claim was meant to garner political legitimacy after an election victory that was tarnished by a boycott by the main Opposition, the Bangladesh Nationalist Party, and a poor voter turnout, several geopolitical analysts do believe that the US has a deep, China-induced, strategic interest in the region.

New sleep study

Alzheimer's disease, the most common type of dementia, currently affects twice as many women as men, with minority populations predicted to witness the most significant increase in cases in the coming years, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Sleep disturbances are well-known in dementia, although they were previously interpreted as an effect of the disease rather than the cause. However, increasing evidence links sleep disorders to the development of dementia.

In a bid to better understand the relationship between sleep and cognitive outcomes in women, scientists at the Scripps Research Digital Trials Center have launched the Research Framework for Sleep Health - Neurocognitive Outcomes in Women Study. The study aims to assess the impact of sleep duration and sleep irregularity on neurocognition in women who are 55 years of age or older through data collected via activity trackers and a smartphone application.

Led by Stuti Jaiswal, MD, PhD, a physician-scientist specializing in sleep research, REFRESH-NOW will use wrist-worn activity trackers and smartwatches to gather longitudinal sleep data over a three year period.

"Wearables have the potential to revolutionize sleep research. While polysomnography is generally regarded as the gold standard for gathering sleep measurements, it only provides a snapshot of a person's sleep characteristics based on data collected during a night spent in a sleep laboratory," Jaiswal says.

"That tool requires a person be hooked up to many different wires and sensors in a sleep laboratory, which is



not a person's natural sleep environment. On the other hand, commercially available activity trackers collect data passively making it very simple for people to participate in sleep research from the comfort of their own home and to share real-world data with researchers

over months or even years." Scientists will also gather information related to sleep habits, sleep apnea risk and decision-making through surveys available via the app. At multiple intervals, participants will be invited to take part in an at-home cognitive battery

assessment designed to allow the study team to gain a better understanding of the participant's cognitive state and function. By identifying sleep-related risk factors for cognitive decline, researchers hope to design interventions to improve cognitive outcomes in women.

Chinese graduates face toughest job market in years as unemployment soars

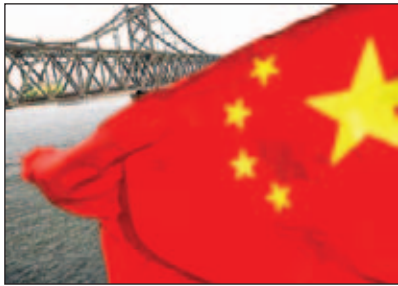
Newly graduated college graduates in China are facing a very tough challenge in the job market, as less than half of them have secured informal jobs by mid-April this year, reported Nikkei Asia, citing human resources company Zhaopin.

The report stated that only 48 per cent of prospective graduates received job offers, marking a 2.4 percentage point decline from the previous year.

With only two months left of graduation, more than half of the job-seeking college graduate students are yet to secure employment.

The situation marks a significant decline from previous years.

Until 2019, around 75 per cent of new graduates received informal job offers. However, this rate fell below 50 per cent in spring 2022 due to the government lockdown in Shanghai, which aimed to control the spread of the coronavirus, according to Nikkei Asia. As per the report, private-sector companies, especially in the tech, real estate, and cram school industries, have



reduced their hiring. These sectors, which were once major sources of employment for young graduates, have been hit by government crackdowns intended to curb oligopolistic behaviour and diffuse market bubbles. As profits in these industries declined, companies cut back on hiring. Moreover, other industries are also experiencing downsizing. SAIC Motor, in partnership with Volkswagen and General Motors, reduced its workforce by approximately 9,000 people between 2019 and 2023.

14,000 Hamas terrorists killed or apprehended

Nine months into the ground operation in Gaza, half of Hamas's military leadership has been eliminated, along with approximately 14,000 terrorists killed or apprehended, the Israel Defense Forces said in figures released on Tuesday.

Among the senior figures whose deaths have been confirmed are six brigade commanders, over 20 battalion commanders, and approximately 150 company commanders, leaving the remaining Hamas leadership fragmented and beset with internal discord.

With the majority of Hamas's military council killed in airstrikes, the terror group has begun appointing new leaders and making succession plans to replace other figures viewed as at risk.

The army is reportedly highly confident that Mohammed Deif, the overall commander of Hamas forces was killed in an airstrike on Saturday. He would be the highest-ranking Hamas figure killed, and if his death is confirmed, Mohammed Sinwar, brother of Yahya Sinwar, is poised to replace Deif.

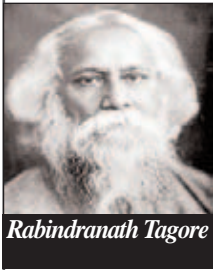


Furthermore, Arab sources report that Ruhi Mushtaha, a close associate of Yahya Sinwar from their time in Israeli prison, is likely to succeed Sinwar as Hamas's Gaza strongman. Among the senior Hamas leaders eliminated so far include Marwan Issa (Hamas's No. 3 man) and Salah Arouri (key strategist who directed terror operations in Judea and Samaria), Ahmed Ehandor (commander of the Northern Division), Iman Nofal (commander of Central Gaza Brigade) among others, and most recently, Rafa'a Salameh (commander of the Khan Yunis Brigade).

Influenza viruses can use two ways to infect cells: Study

Most influenza viruses enter human or animal cells via specialised routes on their surfaces. Researchers at the University of Zurich have revealed that certain human and avian influenza viruses may infect cells via a second entrance mechanism, an immune system protein complex.

This ability helps the viruses infect different species - and potentially jump between animals and humans.

The majority of type A influenza viruses found in birds and pigs do not pose a health concern to people. However, the viruses might represent a problem if there is an outbreak, such as the one presently occurring in dairy cattle in the United States, or during seasonal epidemics. In rare situations, a virus can spread from animals to people, potentially causing a worldwide pandemic.

Most influenza viruses enter



host cells by using their envelope proteins, which stand up from the surface like spikes. The so-called hemagglutinin binds to sialic acid,

a chemical group on the surface of human cells and the cells of various animal species. An international research team led by Professor

Silke Stertz from the Institute of Medical Virology at the University of Zurich (UZH) has now shown that flu viruses also have a second

method to infect host cells. "Human influenza A viruses of subtype H2N2 and related H2N2 avian influenza viruses can enter cells through a second receptor. They use an alternative entry pathway," says Stertz.

The researchers found that hemagglutinin also binds to MHC class II protein complexes. These complexes on the surface of certain immune and respiratory cells are responsible for differentiating between the body's own cells and foreign cells. "We found that MHC class II complexes in humans, pigs, ducks, swans and chickens allow viruses to enter cells, but not those in bats," says Stertz.

This dual ability to infect cells was observed in lab-grown cell lines and human airway cultures. How well the viral receptor fits onto the cell surface structures plays a crucial part in determining which host species and tissues are

infected and ultimately how severe the infection will be. Receptor specificity also influences whether a virus is able to infect different animal species or even humans (zoonosis). "Our finding shows that influenza viruses can adapt to use different entry pathways. This might influence their ability to infect different species and potentially jump between animals and humans," emphasizes the UZH virologist.

The risk that avian, swine and other animal influenza viruses could trigger a flu pandemic in humans may thus be greater than previously assumed. The ability to use MHC class II proteins for cell entry could have been one of the reasons why H2N2 influenza viruses emerged as a pandemic virus in Asia back in 1957. This is another good reason to step up global influenza surveillance in both animals and humans.

There should be management of testing facility. If they succeed in doing so, then MHU will be the first university in the

entire country to do so.

The state government has been rapidly fulfilling the needs of MHU, so now it was their responsibility to fulfill the objectives for which Haryana's first horticulture university has been established. Every employee, officer and staff member should work together to make MHU in achieving the objectives of the project. He said that a monitoring meeting would be held every 15 days in which a report would be taken on the progress of the work and the shortcomings that remained can be removed. Research Director And Dean of Garden College Prof. Ramesh Goyal informed in detail about the activities of MHU.

Rs. 17 crores allocated for renovation of Anganwadi Centres: Aseem Goel

In the first phase, Rs. 17 crore have been released for the repair and renovation of 1000 Anganwadi buildings.

He mentioned that in the future, while the existing infrastructure of Anganwadis will be strengthened, new buildings for Anganwadis and the establishment of Panjiri plants will also be undertaken. Besides this, a multi-purpose departmental building will be constructed in Ambala.

conducive environment for the development of children in Anganwadis. Here, children not only receive supplementary nutrition but also preschool education. Every possible effort will be made to provide basic facilities in all the Anganwadis of the state.

Reiterating his commitment to the department's progress, Sh. Aseem Goel stated that the children and women-centered schemes and pro-

grams of the Women and Child Development Department are being implemented through a well-organized network of 25,450 Anganwadis across the state. These Anganwadis provide supplementary nutrition, preschool education, immunization, health education, health check-ups, and referral services to approximately 12 lakh beneficiaries.

He informed that around

9,900 Anganwadis are operating in department-owned buildings, while the other Anganwadis are either in school premises or other departmental buildings.

The Women and Child Development Minister explained that some Anganwadi buildings were constructed quite some time ago, and some of these buildings now require repairs. Therefore, in the first phase, an amount of Rs. 17 crore has been released for the repair and renovation of 1000 Anganwadis. This amount has been issued to the Development and Panchayats Department, which, through the Chief Executive Officers of the District Councils, will act as the nodal agency for the construction, repair, and renovation of Anganwadis. He has urged the Development and Panchayats Department to start the work immediately and complete it within the stipulated timeframe.

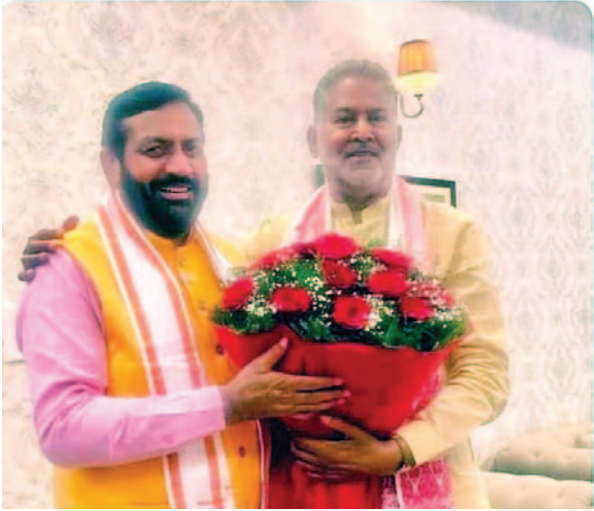
Hry NCB Unit Karnal nabs 2 drug smugglers along with 400 narcotic capsules
