Court sentences 17 people for stripping woman in Rajasthan

JAIPUR: Nearly a year after a 20-year-old pregnant woman was stripped and paraded naked in Rajasthan, a district court has sentenced 14 men, including her husband, to seven-year imprisonment while noting that it was a "heinous crime" similar to the one committed in Manipur. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Pratapgarh, Ramkanya Soni on Saturday also sentenced three women involved in the case to five-year imprisonment, Special Public Prosecutor in the case, Manish Nagar said.

Six killed as bus collides with car in UP

ETAWAH (UP): Six persons were killed and 45 others injured when a double decker bus fell in a ditch after colliding with a car in Usrahara area of Etawah district here in Uttar Pradesh, a police officer said here on Sunday. Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Sanjay Kumar said that the incident took place late on Saturday night. He said that three car passengers identified as Pradyumn (24), Monu (25) and Chanda Devi were killed on the spot. "Three bus passengers, including Om Prakash (50) were also killed in the incident. Efforts are being made to identify two others," he said.

One coach of passenger train derails in Saharanpur

SAHARANPUR : A coach of Delhi-Shamli passenger train derailed at the goods warehouse near Saharanpur railway station on Saturday, official sources said here. Inspector of Railway Protection Force (RPF) Mohit Tyagi said that the train was going for washing when one of its coaches derailed. After receiving the information the railway officials and employees reached the spot and started working to restore the derailed coach. Saharanpur Congress MP Imran Masood, who reached the spot, expressed anguish over the incident. He said that during the current session of Parliament, many railway accidents have taken place and Railway Minister Ashwani Vaishnav is busy patting his own back. He said that the manner in which trains are getting derailed every day, passengers have started fearing to board trains.

Olympics: India beat Britain, enter hockey semi-finals

Harmanpreet Singh-led Indian men's hockey team defeated Great Britain in a thrilling quarter-final match at the Paris Olympics and advanced into the semi-final on Sunday.

As the score scores were level 1-1 after the end of regulation time, India won the shoot-out 4-2 and made the semi-finals.

In the second quarter of the quarter-final match, India took a 1-0 lead after skipper Harmanpreet Singh converted a penalty corner. India had four penalty corner opportunities while Great Britain had five in the second quarter.

Earlier in the second quarter, India's Amit Rohidas was given a red card after he raised his stick and caught opponent William Calnan's head. India played the rest of the match one-man down.

Before half-time, Great Britain's Lee Morton scored the equaliser and gave his

side a moment to breathe. In the second half, Great Britain failed to score, despite multiple opportunities.

Meanwhile, in the shoot-out, India scored all four of their attempts. While Indian goalkeeper PR Sreejesh saved one helping India to move into the semis of the tournament.

Boxing run ends with Lovlina's loss in QFs

PARIS: In a hard-fought contest at the Paris Olympics on Sunday, India's Lovlina Borgohain exited the women's 75kg boxing competition after a narrow 4:1 defeat against Li Qian of the People's Republic of China. The bout saw Li Qian, a seasoned competitor, edging the first two rounds with precise strikes and tactical prowess. Lovlina, a bronze medalist at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics, showcased her skill and determination but struggled to overcome Li's defensive strategy. The Chinese boxer sealed her victory with a strong performance in the final round, securing her spot in the semi-finals. This result ends India's boxing campaign at the Paris 2024 Olympics. Despite the loss, Lovlina's performance remains a testament to her resilience and talent. She fought with heart and grit, leaving an indelible mark on the competition.

Sen loses Semis, to play bronze-medal playoff

PARIS: India's dream of a first-ever Olympic gold in badminton will remain unfulfilled after Lakshya Sen suffered a straight-game defeat to reigning champion Viktor Axelsen in the men's singles semi-finals at the Paris Games here on Sunday. The 22-year-old from Almora, a world championships bronze medalist, squandered a three-point advantage in the first game and a 7-0 lead in the second to surrender 20-22 14-21 to the two-time world champion Axelsen in a 54-minute semifinal clash. Sen will get another chance to become the first Indian male shuttler to win an Olympic medal when he meets Lee Zii Jia of Malaysia in the bronze medal playoff.

9 Killed after MP temple wall collapses during religious event

Nine children have died and several others injured after a wall collapsed at a temple in Madhya Pradesh's Sagar district this morning. The tragic incident took place during a religious ceremony at Hardaul Baba temple in Shahpur. The injured children have been rescued and hospitalised.

Rescue work after the incident was carried out by police with the help of local residents. Visuals showed an earthmover at work to

remove the rubble after the wall collapse. Top officials have now reached the spot. District officials have said the children were in the 10-15 years age group.

Chief Minister Mohan Yadav has said he is pained by the incident. "I hope those injured recover soon. My condolences with families who lost their children. The government will provide each family with an assistance of 4 lakh," he said.

The incident comes a day after four children died in a wall collapse in-

cident in the state's Rewa district. The children, in the 5-7 years age group, were returning from school when the wall collapsed. The owners of the house, the wall of which collapsed, have been arrested.

Incidents of wall collapse are being reported as Madhya Pradesh receives heavy rain. As many as 200 people have died in rain-related incidents in the state this year. About 206 houses have been completely damaged, and 2,403 have suffered partial damage.

Amarnath Yatra: 'Charri Mubarak' taken to Shankaracharya temple

'Charri Mubarak, the Silver mace of Swami Amarnath, was taken to historic Shankaracharya Temple Srinagar for prayers on the occasion of 'Haryali-Amavasya' (Sharavan Amavasya) on Sunday.

Led by Mahant Deepandra Giri, the custodian of the 'Charri Mubarak' the silver mace of the Swami Amarnath was taken to the historic Shankaracharya temple located at Gopadri hills on Sunday as per the age-old customs.

The 52-day-long Amarnath yatra began from the twin routes of Baltal Ganderbal and Nunwan in Pahalgam on June 29 and so far 4,90,540 devotees paid obeisance at the holy cave shrine

in the Kashmir Himalayas will culminate on August 19, coinciding with the Raksha Bandhan day.

The sound of conch shells charged the whole atmosphere at the Shankaracharya temple and Puja was performed chanting Vedic hymn. Sadhus who accompanied Holy Mace participated in the prayers that lasted for more than two hours. Collective prayers were also offered for peace and prosperity in Jammu & Kashmir. The summit of the hill is crowned with a picturesque edifice. This hill was called Jetha Larak and afterwards, it was named Gopadri Hill.

Mahant Giri said that historians believe the temple at the top was originally built by King Sandiman (2629-2564 BC).

NDA will form govt again in 2029 , says Amit Shah

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Sunday slammed the opposition parties for raising questions about the strength of the NDA government at the Centre, saying the alliance will not only complete its term, but also form the government in 2029.

Shah made the remarks addressing a gathering here after inaugurating the 24x7 Manimajra water supply project.

"I want to assure you that whatever the opposition wants to say, you do not worry. In 2029 also, the NDA will come (to power), (Narendra) Modi ji will come," Shah said.

"They (opposition) feel that with some success, they have won elections. They do not know that in three elec-

tions, the number of seats the Congress got, the BJP won more than that in this election (2024 Lok Sabha poll).

"They do not know it. NDA's only one member, the BJP, has more than the total number of seats which their whole alliance has.

"These people, who want to create uncertainty, say again and again that this government will not run," the home minister said.

"I want to assure the opposition friends that not only will this government complete its five-year term, the next term will also be of this government. Be ready to sit in the opposition and learn to work effectively in the opposition," he added. Lashing out at the Opposition, Amit Shah said that the INDIA bloc wants to create instability and they must learn the way of working



in the opposition.

"These people who want to spread instability, repeatedly say that this government is not going to last. I have come to assure them that not only will the

government complete its term but the next government will be of NDA and be ready to sit in the opposition and learn the way of working in the opposition properly," he said.

Further, speaking on the importance of the Nyay Setu project, the Union Home Minister said, "This is an important programme. Water is very important, we cannot exist without it. When it is not clear, we get a lot of diseases. For this whole area, 24/7 supply of filter-cleaned water will be provided through this for the people in the area. It will stand to the test of time."

"This project is spread over about 125 acres. Ever since Modi ji became the Prime Minister, the focus has been on smart cities and Chandigarh was first on this list.

72 killed as protesters and ruling party supporters clash in Bangladesh

Violent clashes between protesters and the ruling Awami League supporters in Bangladesh on Sunday left 72 people dead and hundreds injured on the first day of a non-cooperation movement announced by the students' movement demanding Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's resignation. The clashes broke out

this morning when protesters attending a non-cooperation programme to demand the government's resignation faced opposition from the supporters of the Awami League, Chhatra League, and Jubo League activists.

"So far, 32 people have been killed in clashes in 13 districts across Bangladesh," Prothom Alo newspaper reported.

Despite heavy rain avg water level in reservoirs remains less than last year

Despite heavy rain across the country, the average water level in India's 150 main reservoirs remains less than last year but more than the last decade's level, according to official data.

According to the Central Water Commission, significant variations in water storage levels across different regions of the country reflect both positive and concerning trends.

The total live storage capacity of the 150 monitored reservoirs is 178.784 billion cubic metres (BCM), which is about 69.35 per cent of the estimated 257.812 BCM created nationwide.



According to a CWC report, the live storage available in these reservoirs stands at 91.496 BCM, or 51 per cent of their total capacity. This is 94

per cent of the storage levels recorded during the same period last year and 107 per cent of the normal storage based on the last decade's average. In

comparison to the previous week, as per the July 25 bulletin, the live storage available in these reservoirs was 69.27 BCM, which was 39 per cent of the total live storage capacity.

Last year, the live storage during the same period was 83.987 BCM, and the normal storage was 72.411 BCM. Thus, the storage levels this week represent an increase from the previous week but remains lower than both the corresponding period last year and the normal storage. In the northern region, which includes Himachal Pradesh, Punjab, and Rajasthan, there are 10 reservoirs with a total capacity of 19.663 BCM.

Currently, they hold 6.532 BCM, which is 33 per cent of their capacity,

significantly lower than last year's 76 per cent and the normal storage of 53 per cent for this period.

This current level though marks an increase from the previous week's storage of 5.786 BCM (29 per cent of capacity).

The eastern region, comprising Assam, Jharkhand, Odisha, West Bengal, Tripura, Nagaland, and Bihar, has 23 reservoirs with a combined capacity of 20.430 BCM.

They are currently at 6.989 BCM, or 34 per cent of capacity, an improvement from last year's 31 per cent but below the normal storage of 39 per cent. This week's storage is an increase from the previous week's 5.630 BCM (28 per cent of capacity).

VB arrests 2 more for committing irregularities in nursing exams

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau has arrested accused Aruna Chhabra, former principal of K.D. College of Nursing Mahilpur, Hoshiarpur district from his residence at village Khudda Jassu, Chandigarh and accused Dr. Kuldeep Singh Mehrook, owner of Mehrook College of Nursing and Medical Sciences, Taipur, Tehsil Pataran, Patiala district from his private hospital - Tricity Clinic and Hospital, Dera Bassi, Mohali district. Both the accused have been involved in committing irregularities in admissions and examinations in nursing colleges in connivance with officials and employees of Punjab Nursing Registration Council Mohali (PNRC) and evading their arrest in this case.

In this case, Charanjit Kaur Cheema, former registrar of PNRC and principal (retired) of Nursing Training



School Gurdaspur and Dr Arvinderveer Singh Gill, resident of Basant Vihar, Hoshiarpur, have already taken arrested by the VB.

Giving detailed information in this regard, an official spokesperson of VB said during the investigation of a complaint about committing irregularities in admissions, examinations and results in private nursing colleges, it has come to light that with the connivance

of the managements of the said private nursing colleges, the PNRC officials had prepared fake records and tampered with the government records for conducting examinations of nursing students without the necessary admission forms, examination forms and requisite examination fees. He further informed that during the probe it was found that K.D. College of Nursing, Mahilpur, in Hoshiarpur district has got

recognition from Indian Nursing Council New Delhi on 25.09.2019 and from PNRC on 29.11.2012 whereas much before the recognition of this college, the admission forms and receipt numbers were found to be issued by the PNRC. He revealed that the admission forms pertaining to 5 roll numbers were received from this college but these admission forms/roll numbers were issued to Princeton Institute of Nursing Gurdaspur by the Nursing Council. The fake admission list of these 5 students was prepared in October 2012 much before the college was recognized and on the basis of this admission list, a cut list regarding these roll numbers was issued on the receipt of the examination forms and examination fees of these students.

Apart from this, an admission list of 27 students belonging to G.R.D. International Institute of Nursing Tanda Urmur, Hoshiarpur had been prepared.

Health supervisor educates villagers about taking precautions to escape diseases during rainy season

In the villages falling under Bareh sector of Budhlada block in dist Mansa, a health awareness camp was organised in which health supervisor Ashwani Kumar elaborated that how villagers can save themselves from the diseases that usually erupt during rainy season.

"so it is better to take precautions that water doesn't get accumulated and if so happens, any mosquitoes killed be sprinkled on that water", remarkable Ashwani Kumar. In village Rampur Mander of Budhlada block, health workers Gurinderjit Sharma and Navdeep Kath took samples from the houses where water had been kept stored.

Budhlada SMO Dr Gurchetan Parkash advised people to use ORS mixed water if they complain of diarrhoea or vomiting so that they don't become victims of dehydration.

Muktsar tops as Punjab witnesses 44 per cent rise in area under DSR

CHANDIGARH (GAGAN JAIN): Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister S. Gurmeet Singh Khudian stated that there has been a significant 44% increase in the area dedicated to Direct Seeding of Rice (DSR) compared to last year. The acreage sown using the water-conserving DSR technique has risen to over 2.48 lakh acres, up from 1.72 lakh acres during the Kharif season of 2023. Sri Muktsar Sahib district topped the state using the DSR method.

The Agriculture Minister further shared that a whopping 78,468 acres have been sown using this water-saving technique in Sri Muktsar Sahib district, leading the way, followed by Fazilka (75,824 acres), Amritsar (17,913 acres), Ferozepur (17,644 acres), and Bathinda (12,760 acres).

He said that Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government has been offering Rs. 1500 per acre as a financial assistance to motivate farmers to choose the DSR method over traditional paddy transplanting. A substantial amount of Rs. 20.33 crores was disbursed to 17,116 farmers to support the adoption of DSR during the FY 2023-24. The state government has earmarked Rs. 50 crores to incentivize farmers for embracing DSR during the FY 2024-25. S. Gurmeet Singh Khudian further said that 24,120 farmers have registered 2.48 lakh acres of land on the DSR portal till date. The Agriculture department's field officials are diligently verifying the farmers and their DSR-registered land. Once the verification is complete, the incentive amount will be directly credited to the farmers' accounts through DBT, making it a seamless process for the beneficiaries, he added.

Long wait for Sakhi Niwas Scheme for working women's hostel

LUDHIANA (SHARMA): In the ongoing session of Rajya Sabha, MP (Rajya Sabha) from Ludhiana Sanjeev Arora had asked about the number of working women hostels constructed in the last five years and whether the government is also planning to increase the number of Transit Hostels in Tier I and II cities.

Numbers are disappointing. In the last 5 years a total of only 19 hostels have been sanctioned in the whole of the country and a meagre 13 have been completed. An average of around 2.5 hostels per annum. On an average not even 1 hostel has been sanctioned for every state. Out of 28 States only 10 have been covered in this scheme, that also with scarce presence.

State of Punjab got only 1 hostel. It is sanctioned and not built yet. In a statement here today, Arora said the Minister provided details of Working Women Hostels sanctioned for construction and those whose construction was completed during the last five years' period. As per these details, one Working Women Hostel was sanctioned to Punjab during Financial Year 2019-20. The details indicate that this Working Women Hostel too has not been constructed so far. Thus, the sanction is lying in papers only, which is a matter of regret. Moreover, the name of the district or city has not been mentioned where this Working Women Hostel was to be set up in Punjab. He said the Centre should set up at least one such hostel in Ludhiana.

Our third demand was for compensation for the survivors of the incident. We have also demanded an immediate release of the draft of the Delhi Coaching Educational Centre Act



and Regulation Act so that we can read and rectify the bill."

Further, the student also said that a demand has been made regarding the rationalisation of the fees collected by the UPSC coaching centres, and the fees should include a legal life insurance certificate.

Also, the protesting students have demanded a fire marshal at all commercial and non-commercial UPSC institutions or any other institution, office, library or other entity for the safety and security of the students.

"We also demand a rationalisation of the fees collected

by the UPSC coaching centres, and the fees should include a legal life insurance certificate. We are also demanding that all commercial and non-commercial UPSC institutions or any other institution, office, library or other entity have a fire marshal if they accommodate 100 or more students. Regular mock drills should be held," the student said.

Additionally, the students have also made demands for a reduction in the rent of the libraries and the PGs, a desk for the rent commissioner and an offline and

online grievance redressal cell. "We need both an offline and an online grievance redressal cell. If an office for the grievance is not possible, a desk should be provided at the Common Service Centre.

All grievances addressed there should be taken care of. Access to public prosecutor on the online grievance cell should also be given and grievances related to women's safety should also be taken care of. We also demand an NOC for all the remaining libraries to ensure the safety of the students," the protestor continued.

Editorial

Diminished spectacle

There was a time when India’s Olympic medal dream lived only in the performance of its hockey team. The Sixties, which is when I began following the Games, was the decade when India lost its taken-for-granted ownership of the hockey gold. So when the Indian hockey team beat the Australians 3-2 in Paris, it was unsurprising that commentators cited the last time the Indians had beaten the Australians at the Games, more than half a century ago in Munich, 1972.

One of the incidental pleasures of the Games is the way geopolitical changes put sporting nationalism in perspective. Athletes feted as national heroes are subsequently assigned to nations that didn’t exist at the time. So Olga Korbut (picture), the gamine genius who lit up the Munich Games in 1972 and changed women’s gymnastics forever, was actually from Belarus which was n’t represented at the Olympics as a sovereign state till the 1990s.

Korbut’s life and career testify to the beauty and horror of competitive sport. No one did more to transform gymnastics from a sport led by older, more stately gymnasts like Ludmilla Tourischeva to one dominated by teenaged sprites like Nadia Comaneci, Nellie Kim and Korbut herself who performed risky, gasp-inducing routines with seeming effortlessness.

Korbut metaphorically begat the great and diminutive Simone Biles. Both performed risky, life-threatening routines. Korbut did the Korbut flip or the Dead Loop on the uneven bars (the routine was later banned as too dangerous) and Biles is legendary for being the only woman to successfully attempt the spectacular (and risky) Yurchenko double pike vault. Their routines offer couchbound slugs like us moments of second-hand transcendence.

But their careers also testify to the exploitative and predatory character of modern sport where the search for sporting glory gives older men unchecked power over young women. Long after Korbut migrated to the US, she testified to the sexual abuse she and other gymnasts were subjected to by her Soviet coach, Renald Knysh. He denied the allegations but when Korbut repeated them in 2018, contemporaries of hers, who had also been trained by Knysh, also spoke of being sexually abused by him. In much the same way, Biles bore witness to the way in which Larry Nassar, the US gymnastics team doctor, had systematically abused hundreds of young girls over several years in the full knowledge of the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee and even the FBI.

Amidst China's aggression, Philippines warships hold sea exercises with Japan, US

Amidst Chinese bullying of its rivals in the strategic South China Sea and aiming to counter Beijing's continuing violations of international treaty obligations, countries in the region are galvanising their defences.

Two warships from the Philippines and Japan each, for the first time ever, conducted a joint exercise in the contested waters.

This exercise followed a bilateral defence treaty, termed the Reciprocal Access Agreement (RAA), signed between Manila and Tokyo to facilitate joint exercises for closer security co-operation, amid China's growing assertion in the regional resource-rich waters.

The Philippine Navy's Jose Rizal frigate on August 2 sailed alongside Japan's Maritime Self-Defence Force's Sazanami destroyer and participated in tactical maneuvering, communication and photographic exercises in areas of the South China Sea that the Philippines claims jurisdiction over, the Armed Forces of the Philippines said in a statement.

"This activity was part of the ongoing efforts to strengthen regional and international cooperation towards realizing a free and open Indo-Pacific," the Armed Forces of the Philippines said.



The Philippines Army stated that during the joint sailing exercise two vessels -a Jiangdao-class corvette and a Jingkai class frigate- belonging to China's People's Liberation Army Navy (PLAN)- were observed tailing the formation.

The joint sailing activity formed part of recent similar activities undertaken by the Philippine Navy with the navies of allies like the US, Australia and France that aim to project the commitment of these countries to freedom of navigation and rule of law in the face of China's growing aggression in staking claims in the South China Sea.

Recently, the Filipino navy patrol ship BRP Ramon Alcaraz and the US Navy's littoral combat ship USS Mobile conducted a similar joint sailing exercise in South China Sea waters close to the Philippines.

Both the Philippines and Japan are long-time allies of the US, which has been bolstering ties in the region to counter Chinese aggression.

China increased its provocations against Philippine vessels in the South China Sea which has led to the

Philippines granting the US military access to more bases in the country.

Meanwhile, a Vietnamese Coast Guard vessel is on its way to the Philippines for a joint training exercise, in a first such exercise between the two countries as per a report in Vietnamese news agency VNA.

The Vietnamese vessel Vessel CSB 8002 will engage in joint training exercises focusing on search and rescue operations and maritime safety together with the Philippines Coast Guard.

Vietnam and Philippines along with other countries in the regions including Taiwan, Brunei, Malaysia and Indonesia have made territorial claims in the contested waters of the South China Sea. China claims nearly all of South China sea including the Paracel Islands and the Spratly Islands as its own.

Last week on the sidelines of the ASEAN Meeting in Laos, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken expressed concerns over Beijing's "destabilising actions" in the South China Sea during his meeting with his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi

The sources said that the woman taught at Emhoff's children's school. However, she was not teaching Emhoff's children at the



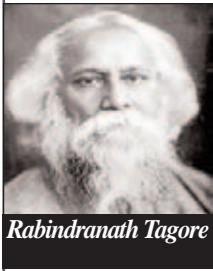

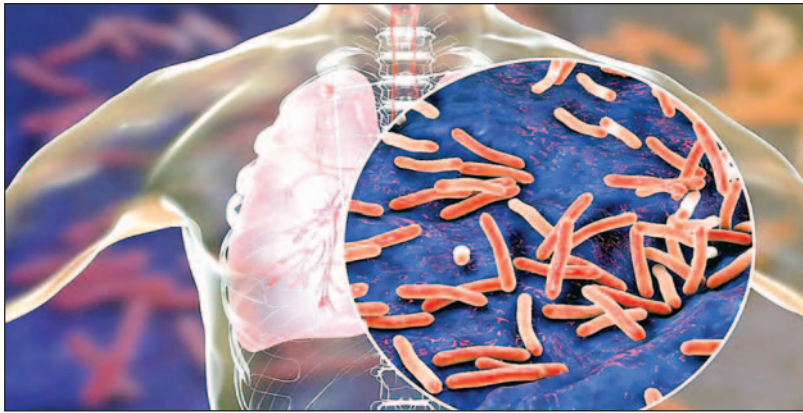
Study finds strains of tuberculosis that are most infectious

According to a recent study evaluating how various strains migrate across mixed populations in cosmopolitan cities, the chances of an exposed person becoming infected with TB vary depending on whether the human and the bacterium share a hometown.

The study, led by Harvard Medical School scientists provides evidence that pathogen, place, and human host interact in a unique way that affects infection risk and susceptibility.

The study strengthens the case for a long-standing hypothesis in the field that specific bacteria and their human hosts likely coevolved over hundreds or thousands of years, the researchers said.

The findings may also help inform new prevention and treatment approaches for tuberculosis, a wily pathogen that, each year, sickens more than 10 million people and causes more than a million deaths worldwide, according to the World Health Organization. In the current analysis, believed to



be the first controlled comparison of TB strains' infectivity in populations of mixed geographic origins, the researchers custom-built a study cohort by combining case files from patients with TB in New York City, Amsterdam, and Hamburg. Doing so gave them enough data to power their models.

The analysis showed that close household contacts of people diagnosed with a strain of TB from a geographically restricted lineage had a 14 per cent lower rate of infection and a 45 per cent lower rate of developing active TB disease compared with those exposed to a strain belonging to a widespread lineage.

age.

The study also showed that strains with narrow geographic ranges are much more likely to infect people with roots in the bacteria's native geographic region than people from outside the region.

The researchers found that the odds of infection dropped by 38 per cent when a contact is exposed to a restricted pathogen from a geographic region that doesn't match the person's background, compared with when a person is exposed to a geographically restricted microbe from a region that does match their home country. This was true for people who had lived in the region themselves and for people whose two parents could each trace their heritage to the region.

This pathogen-host affinity points to a shared evolution between humans and microbes with certain biological features rendering both more compatible and fueling the risk for infection, the researchers said.

searchers said.

"The size of the effect is surprisingly large," said Maha Farhat, Gilbert S. Omenn, MD '65, PhD Associate Professor of Biomedical Informatics in the Blavatnik Institute at HMS. "That's a good indicator that the impact on public health is substantial." Thanks to the growing use of genetic sequencing, researchers have observed not all circulating strains are created equal. Some lineages are widespread and responsible for much of the TB around the world, while others are prevalent only in a few restricted areas. Given the complex nature of TB transmission in high-incidence settings where people often have multiple exposures to different lineages, researchers have not been able to compare strains under similar conditions and have been left to speculate about possible explanations for the differences between strains.

Many factors increase the risk of contracting tuberculosis from close contact. One of the best predictors of whether a person will infect their close contacts is bacterial load, measured by a test called sputum smear microscopy, which shows how many bacteria a person carries in their respiratory system.

However the new study showed that for geographically restricted strains, whether a person has ancestors who lived where the strain is common was an even bigger predictor of infection risk than bacterial load in the sputum. In the cases analyzed in the study, this risk of common ancestry even outweighed the risk stemming from having diabetes and other chronic diseases previously shown to render people more susceptible to infection.

The findings add to a growing body of evidence of the importance of paying attention to the wide variation between different lineages of tuberculosis and to the details of how different lineages of tuberculosis interact with different host populations.

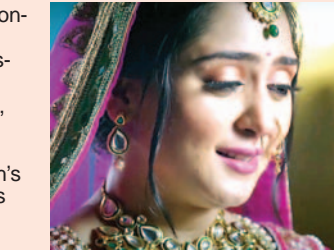
