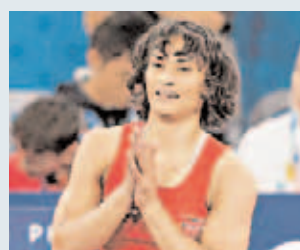

Ex EAM Natwar Singh passes away at 93

AGENCY NEW DELHI: Former External Affairs Minister K Natwar Singh passed away in Gurgaon after a prolonged illness on Saturday at the age of 93. Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Congress President Mallikarjun Kharge condoled the demise of the late leader. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on his microblogging site X, said, "Pained by the passing away of Shri Natwar Singh Ji, he made rich contributions to the world of diplomacy and foreign policy. He was also known for his intellect as well as prolific writing. My thoughts are with his family and admirers in this hour of grief. Om Shanti". Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge said, "Our deepest condolences on the passing away of former Union Minister Shri K. Natwar Singh ji. An acclaimed intellectual and a Padma Bhushan recipient, he made a profound contribution to India's diplomacy and external affairs. Our thoughts are with his family, friends, and followers." Natwar Singh served as the External Affairs Minister from May 2004 to December 2005 during Prime Minister Manmohan Singh-led UPA government.

Four killed in gunfight in Manipur's Tengenoupal

AGENCY IMPHAL: Four armed men were killed in a fratricidal shoot-out between militants and village volunteers of the same community in Manipur's Tengenoupal district, police said. A militant belonging to the United Kuki Liberation Front (UKLF) and three village volunteers of the same community were killed in the gunfight in Molnom area on Friday. In retaliation to the killings, village volunteers set ablaze the residence of UKLF self-styled chairman S S Hakiop.

12 passengers jump out of train in panic as men operate fire extinguisher

AGENCY NEW DELHI: Twelve passengers were injured when they jumped out of a slow-moving train in panic after some men operated a fire extinguisher and its fumes filled a coach near Uttar Pradesh's Bilpur on Sunday. The incident took place in a general coach of the Howrah-Amritsar Mail in the morning near Bilpur station, which falls under the Moradabad division, an official of the Northern Railway said. Passengers pulled the alarm chain for an emergency stop and jumped out of the train in panic, while it was still moving, the official said and added that "12 passengers were injured". "Panic fire, it looks like some miscreants or unruly passenger operated a fire extinguisher which created an impression that a fire had broken out in the general coach of the moving Howrah-Amritsar Mail", he said. The official added that the Railway Protection Force is investigating the case.

NDA eyes majority in Rajya Sabha after bypolls

AGENCY NEW DELHI: The BJP-led NDA is expected to achieve a clear majority in Rajya Sabha after bye-elections for 12 seats scheduled next month, which would help the party get the nod for key legislations such as the Waqf (Amendment) Bill. In the upper house with the current effective strength of 229, the BJP has 87 MPs and with its allies the number is 105. Six nominated members, who usually cast their vote with the government, take the strength of the NDA to 111, four short of the half-way mark of 115. The Congress has 26 members in the Upper House and its allies add another 58, taking the opposition alliance numbers to 84. Among the key fence-sitters are the YSR Congress Party with 11 members and BJD with eight members.

Rain lashes Haryana, Pb and Delhi; brings respite from humid weather Around 300 roads blocked in Himachal

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, AUG 11

Rains lashed many parts of Punjab and Haryana on Sunday, bringing respite from humid weather conditions.

Mohali, Ludhiana, Amritsar, Rupnagar and Ambala, Kurukshetra, Karnal were among the places that received rainfall.

Pathankot received 82 mm of rainfall, Gurdaspur 68.8 mm and Amritsar 57.6 mm in the last 24 hours which ended at 8:30 am, a meteorological department report said. In Himachal travel on National Highway 5 (NH-5) in Nigulsari, Kinnaur, has become perilous due to frequent landslides. The region's strategic NH-5, a crucial route connecting Kinnaur with other parts of Himachal Pradesh, was recently obstructed by landslides caused by heavy rainfall.

Thousands of commuters, including residents, army personnel, and tourists, faced severe delays and safety risks as they navigated the treacherous



conditions. A significant landslide occurred late Friday evening, causing large boulders to tumble down the hill, bringing traffic to a standstill. Vehicles lined up on both sides of the highway, and passengers, including many patients in urgent need of medical care, were left stranded. As per reports around 300 roads were blocked due to incessant rains across state.

After a spell of incessant rainfall in the capital city of Delhi, several areas of the city faced

waterlogging on Sunday.

Visuals from the Najafgarh area from West Delhi show severe waterlogging on the road, aggravating the situation for the commuters.

Meanwhile, visuals from the Rohini Sector 23 show that people are playing and working out amid a downpour as rain lashed parts of the national capital. Earlier in the day, it was reported that heavy rainfall lashed several parts of Ambala city on Sunday, disrupting normal life and causing

water logging in the city. Commuters were seen wading through water-logged roads as heavy rainfall hit several parts of the city. India Meteorological Department had predicted thunderstorms and lightning with Moderate Rain over parts of Kurukshetra, Ambala, Yamunanagar, and Panchkula.

"Thunderstorm/Lightning with Moderate Rain very likely over parts of Kurukshetra, Ambala, Yamunanagar, Panchkula," IMD Chandigarh posted on X. IMD Regional Centre New Delhi also predicted moderate to heavy rainfall accompanied by moderate thunderstorms and lightning across several parts of Haryana.

"Moderate to heavy rainfall accompanied by moderate thunderstorms and lightning is very likely to occur at Rajaund, Assandh, Jind, Gohana, Rohtak, Jhajjar, Farukhnagar (Haryana) Kotputli, Alwar, Viratnagar (Rajasthan)" Regional Meteorological Centre, New Delhi posted on X.

Manish Sisodia to lead AAP's poll campaign in Haryana

AGENCY NEW DELHI, AUG 11

With Delhi Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) supremo Arvind Kejriwal still in jail, his close confidante and former deputy Manish Sisodia has taken charge of the party's campaign for the assembly polls in the national capital and Haryana.

Mr Sisodia, who has been granted bail by the Supreme Court in corruption and money laundering cases linked to the Delhi liquor policy case, will today hold a meeting of the senior party members. The 52-year-old walked out of Tihar jail on Friday after spending 17 months behind bars, giving a shot to the AAP in its arm, which is still trying to fight the setback it received after its chief, Mr Kejriwal, was sent to jail in a case related to the alleged liquor policy scam.

The meeting of the AAP leaders is scheduled to be held at 6 pm at Mr Sisodia's residence. Assembly elections in Haryana, where the AAP has announced to contest all 90 assembly seats, are due later this year, while polls in 70 constituencies of



Delhi are expected to take place in the beginning of 2025. Manish Sisodia, the former deputy chief minister of Delhi, has been the key face behind the rise of the AAP since its inception after the 2011 anti-corruption movement. The AAP credits Mr Sisodia for "underscoring his pivotal role in shaping the multi-faceted governance landscape (of Delhi)" and "revolutionalising" the education system of Delhi government schools.

Before signing off his cabinet responsibilities, he held 18 crucial portfolios, including education, finance, planning land and building, vigilance services, women and child development, as well as art, culture, and languages, among others.

Bangladesh Hindus protest against violence, Muhammad Yunus responds

Lakhs of Hindus have taken to the streets in Bangladesh to protest against the ongoing attacks on the community after Sheikh Hasina resigned as prime minister and fled to India.

Bangladesh's capital Dhaka and Chittagong, the second-largest city in the country, witnessed lakhs of people attending the massive rallies on Saturday.

Members of minority communities in violence-hit Bangladesh have faced more



than 205 incidents of attacks across 52 districts since the fall of the Ms Hasina-led government on August 5.

Hundreds of Hindus are believed to have been injured in attacks on their homes and businesses.

Rajasthan: 2 dead, 3 injured after house collapse in Karauli

AGENCY KARAUULI, AUG 11

Two people including a child died and another three were injured after a house collapsed in the Nadi Darwaza area of Karauli district following heavy rains on Sunday morning.

The deceased were identified as Zakir Khan (35) and Jiya Khan (12). Ramkesh, the Principal Medical Officer (PMO) of



Government Hospital, Karauli gave information on the incident and said, "Around 7.15 am we

received information in the hospital that a house collapse incident has taken place and many people have been feared dead in the debris at the site."

"Initially, two bodies were sent to the hospital, of Jiah Khan and her father Zakir Khan. Additionally, three people came in with minor injuries. Two of them were given first aid and the third person was sent after an OPD.

SEBI chief dismisses Hindenburg report as 'character assassination'

Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch has vehemently denied allegations made by US-based short-seller Hindenburg Research, terming it as 'character assassination' bid. Citing whistleblower documents, the short-seller has claimed that SEBI chairperson Buch had a stake in obscure offshore entities used in alleged Adani money laundering case.

"Despite the existence of thousands of mainstream, reputable onshore Indian mutual fund products, an industry she now is responsible for regulating, documents show SEBI chairperson Madhabi Buch and her husband had stakes in a multi-layered offshore fund structure with minuscule assets, traversing known high-risk jurisdictions, overseen by a company with reported ties to the Wirecard scandal, in the same entity run by an Adani director and significantly used by Vinod Adani in the alleged Adani cash siphoning scandal," Hindenburg report released on August 10 claimed. The SEBI



chairperson has strongly denied the allegations, terming it "baseless and insinuation".

"Our life and finances are an open book. All disclosures, as required, have already been furnished to SEBI over the years. We have no hesitation in disclosing any and all financial documents, including those that relate to the period when we were strictly private citizens, to any and every authority that may seek them. Further, in the interest of complete transparency, we would be issuing a detailed statement in due course," Buch said.

She further added, "It is unfortunate that Hindenburg Research, against whom SEBI has taken an Enforcement action and issued a show cause notice, has chosen to attempt character assassination in response to the same."

8 members of family from HP, driver die after SUV swept away in swollen rivulet

AGENCY HOSHIARPUR, AUG 11

Eight members of a family and driver lost their lives, after the vehicle they were traveling in was swept away by the strong current of the flooded Jaijon Choe, a seasonal rivulet about 34 km from here on Sunday.

The rivulet was swollen due to heavy rainfall, according to police reports. Hoshiarpur Deputy Superintendent of Police (Cyber Crime and NSPS Act) Jagir Singh said 10 members of a family, along with the driver, were traveling from Dehra, near Mehatpur in Himachal Pradesh, to attend a wedding in Mehrowal village in SBS Nagar (Nawanshahar) district in a rented car. On the way, their car was swept away in the Jaijon Choe, which was in spate after heavy rain.

Seven people lost their lives, while three others were missing after the vehicle they were traveling in was swept away by the flooded Jaijon Choe.

Villagers from Jaijon, who witnessed the incident, managed to rescue one occupant, Deepak Bhatia of Dehra, from the floodwaters. He was taken to the Government Dispensary in Jaijon for first aid.

DSP Jagir Singh confirmed



that seven bodies, including those of two women, had been recovered from the shoe. Efforts are ongoing to locate the three people who remain missing.

The HP Chief Minister said that the state government stands in solidarity with the affected families during this time of distress. He assured that all possible assistance will be provided to them by the state government and district administration of Una has been directed in this regard.

According to reports, twelve people were travelling in an Innova vehicle to attend a wedding ceremony when the vehicle was swept away by rising water in a ravine. Nine bodies have been recovered so far, one person has been injured, and the search for the remaining two individuals is ongoing.

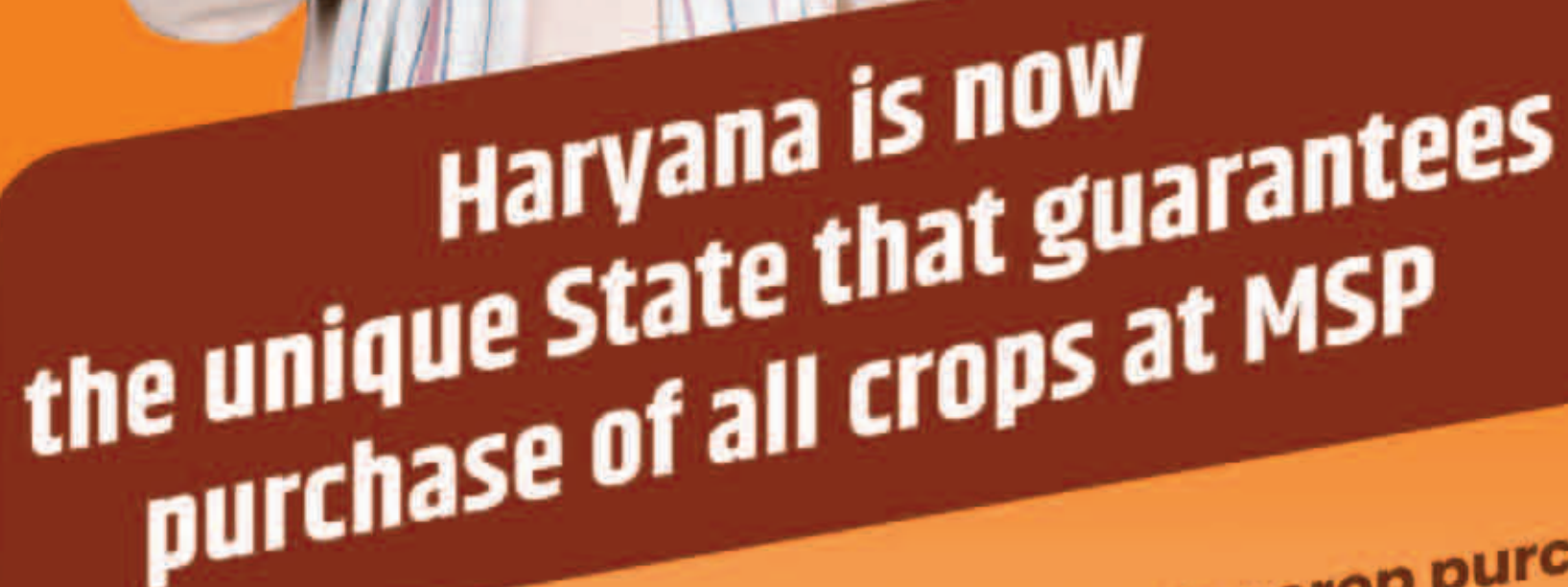

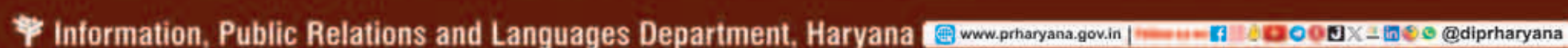

Heavy rains lash state, landslides reported at many places

Travel on National Highway 5 (NH-5) in Nigulsari, Kinnaur, has become perilous due to frequent landslides.

The region's strategic NH-5, a crucial route connecting Kinnaur with other parts of Himachal Pradesh, was recently obstructed by landslides caused by heavy rainfall.

Thousands of commuters, including residents, army personnel, and tourists, faced severe delays and safety risks as they navigated the treacherous conditions.

A significant landslide occurred late Friday evening, causing large boulders to tumble down the hill, bringing traffic to a standstill. Vehicles lined up on both



sides of the highway, and passengers, including many patients in urgent need of medical care, were left stranded.

Amid the chaos, people struggled with hunger and thirst while waiting for the road to be cleared. The National Highway Authority worked tirelessly to restore the road, which was finally reopened around 3:30 p.m.

on Saturday after approximately 18 hours of intense efforts.

The ongoing landslides in Nigulsari have been exacerbated by persistent heavy rainfall across the state. In addition to the NH-5 disruptions, 288 roads and five national highways have been affected.

The heavy rain has also impacted 458 distribution

transformers and 48 water supply schemes. The District Emergency Response Centre in Kinnaur has reported flash floods on NH-05 between Pooh and Kaurik Tehsil, causing blockages between kilometres 435 and 444.

Recent rainfall data highlights the severity of the situation: Nahar recorded 196.6 mm, Nangal Dam 165.0 mm, Naina Devi 142.2 mm, Una 135 mm, Malraon 120.0 mm, Dhaulakuan 117.0 mm, and Sandhole 94.2 mm. In light of these conditions, an orange alert for heavy to very heavy rain in isolated places has been issued across the state.

The authorities continue to monitor the situation closely, and efforts are underway to mitigate the impact of ongoing weather disruptions.

adequate resources and facilities to the players is the priority of the state government, and work is being done towards further enhancing the skills of emerging players and achieving excellence in sports.

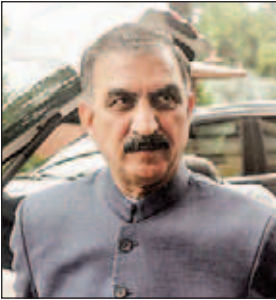

The Himachal Pradesh government will establish a State-Level Model Drug De-Addiction and Rehabilitation Center at Kotla Barog, in the Pachhad sub-division of Sirmour district. This proposed center will assist individuals battling substance addiction and help them to overcome their dependence on drugs and reintegrate into society with self-sufficiency.

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu emphasized the government's commitment to combating drug abuse. "The state government has implemented various initiatives to raise awareness about substance abuse among the youth, aiming to prevent them from falling prey to this menace. In today's context, keeping our



youth away from drugs is one of our greatest challenges. However, we must also support those who are already struggling with addiction and are determined to break free. To this end, the state government is establishing the State-Level Model Drug De-Addiction and Rehabilitation Center," the Chief Minister stated.

The facility would be a part of a broader strategy to address the escalating drug abuse crisis in the state, particularly the widespread

use of synthetic substances in both rural and urban areas. The center would tackle the severe health and social issues resulting from this crisis by offering a wide range of services within a single complex.

The proposed center would feature accommodations, including rooms and dormitories, toilets, and dining areas, as well as recreational spaces, a library, a mini gymnasium, and facilities for sports, meditation, and yoga. Additionally, it would provide skill development and vocational training, in-house treatment, and essential services such as food, clothing and laundry facilities. This holistic approach is intended to standardize treatment and rehabilitation services while offering crucial support and recovery pathways for those affected by addiction.

Govt's fisheries initiatives yield over 21,000 metric tonnes of fish and 682 new jobs

The state government was making significant strides in bolstering the livelihoods of fishermen and expanding opportunities for self-employment in the fisheries sector. Through a combination of natural and artificial aquatic resources viz: reservoirs, rivers, streams and ponds, vigorous efforts were underway to enhance the economy of nearly 20,000 families whose primary source of income was associated with this sector. From January 2023 to June 2024, the state's fisheries sector witnessed the production of approximately 21,022.62 metric tonnes of fish. This achievement underscores the success of ongoing

initiatives to tap the vast potential of the state's aquatic resources. The fisheries department has been playing a significant role in providing self-employment opportunities to as many as 682 youths ensuring that their future remains bright.

With an investment of Rs. 22.66 crore, several projects aimed at modernizing and expanding the fisheries sector was being implemented. Among these was the establishment of 258 new trout units, 20 fishery kiosks, six fish feed plants (both large and small), 47 biofloc units, two cold storage facilities, two ice factories, four re-circulating aquaculture systems, two ornamental fish units and four working trout hatcheries in the private sector. These developments signify a broadening



scope for fish production and related businesses in the state.

In line with Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu's budget announcements, new ponds were being constructed over an area of 25

hectares. These new water bodies were expected to further augment the state's fisheries activities, paving the way for increased output and greater economic returns.

Support for local fishermen was

also a priority, with 428 fishermen receiving subsidies for purchasing boats and nets. Additionally, the state has provided air-conditioned vehicles, motorcycles equipped with ice boxes and three-wheelers with ice boxes to fishermen and entrepreneurs.

These efforts were designed to enhance the efficiency and profitability of fishing operations.

Various welfare schemes have been initiated to uplift the economic status of those engaged in reservoir fishing. The Life Safety Fund scheme has been introduced, offering rupees five lakh to the families of fishermen in the unfortunate event of death or permanent disability due to natural disasters. Under the Disaster Risk Fund Scheme, the government would compensate for equipment losses by

providing 50 percent of the total cost. As of now Rs. 3.43 lakh has been disbursed to 94 fishermen under this scheme. Further support has come during the period while there remains complete ban on fishing with the government providing Rs. 4,500 to fishermen. Financial assistance exceeding Rs. 1.20 crore was also disbursed under the Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana in the fiscal year 2023-24, aiding socio-economically backward traditional fishermen. The government has also prioritized the conservation of aquatic biodiversity. Through the Nadi (River) Matsya Palan Karyakram, Rs. 44 lakh was allocated to collect over 15.43 lakh indigenous fish species of advanced quality from 32 different river basins.

Dr. Bindal expressed concern over the hike in fares by the Himachal Road Transport Corporation (HRTC), where the minimum fare has increased from Rs. 5 to Rs. 12, along with increased luggage charges. He criticized the removal of various reliefs that were previously provided to different categories of passengers. Additionally, the increase in electricity cess and tariffs for domestic, commercial, and non-commercial use has added to the financial burden on the public. He also condemned the government for ending the free water supply in rural areas by imposing a Rs. 100 per connection fee,

questioning the government's claim that households earning less than Rs. 50,000 annually would be exempt, noting that obtaining such income certificates from patwaris is challenging.

Bindal accused the Congress government of betraying the public by increasing taxes and failing to deliver on their promises. He claimed that development in Himachal Pradesh has come to a halt, with the government focused on taking loans and benefiting a select few at the expense of the general public. He concluded that the current administration has no regard for the welfare of the state's people.

Editorial

Across the barrage

Sheikh Hasina Wazed's forced flight from Dhaka and her arrival in Delhi made Bangladesh news again in India. For most Indians outside West Bengal, Bangladesh is a series of noises off. This is a useful moment to unpack what those noises have traditionally signified.

As a child in the Sixties, Bangladesh, or East Pakistan as it was then, figured in our consciousness as a place aggrieved by the Farakka Barrage. I didn't know what a barrage was then; I later learnt that the barrage was built to divert Ganga's water into the Hooghly to sluice Calcutta's port. Otherwise, East Pakistan didn't figure in our imaginations at all; it was just the junior wing of the eccentric enemy state called Pakistan.

As a boy, the only public figure I could have named from there, apart from Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, was Maulana Bhashani. I suspect the reason why Maulana Abdul Hamid Khan Bhashani (to give him his proper name) got lodged in my head was that Indian newspapers cast him as a belligerently anti-Indian figure, a reputation consolidated by his storied long march against the aforementioned Farakka Barrage.

By the time Bangladesh happened, East Pakistan had become a byword for catastrophe: flooding, a devastating cyclone, and near famine conditions consolidated its basket case image in the Indian mind. The fact that India in the Sixties was something of a hell hole itself, plagued by two wars and food crises in Bihar in 1966-67 and Maharashtra in the early Seventies, didn't detain us. Famine and poverty in India were challenges to be overcome; in East Pakistan/Bangladesh, on the other hand, these were permanent, constitutive conditions.

Sitting in Delhi, the way in which we understood the liberation of Bangladesh had very little to do with the aspirations of the people of that ravaged country. For Indians, the rout of Pakistan and the birth of Bangladesh represented a historic rejection of the Two-Nation theory. I remember a Muslim colleague of mine in Jamia Millia Islamia telling me that it had been an enormous relief because it laid the ghost that had haunted Indian Muslims since Partition, the notion that a single nation state could claim to represent all of the subcontinent's Muslims. More generally, the birth of Bangladesh was read as a vindication of the Indian state's version of history.

I think it's fair to say that we saw Indira Gandhi as the midwife who had delivered Bangladesh, and our attitude towards the infant state was proprietorial. India had sheltered ten million refugees from the carnage of Yahya Khan's army and its razakars, it had nurtured the Mukti Bahini, and created the necessary context for independence by routing Pakistan. Mujibur Rahman, or Bangabandhu, was both enormously popular in India and regarded as something of a political protégé.

Protest erupts outside White House over violence against Hindus in Bangladesh

A large number of people protested outside the White House in Washington on Friday against alleged violence targeting minority Hindus and others in Bangladesh since former Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's resignation and departure earlier this week. Protesters carried American and Bangladeshi flags and held posters demanding that Bangladeshi minorities be "saved." They chanted slogans of "We want justice" and called for peace amid the recent surge in violence.

The crowd, which included activists from various human rights organizations, members of the Bangladeshi diaspora and Indian-American Hindu allies, came from Washington, Maryland, Virginia, and New York. Protesters sought the intervention of Muhammad Yunus, the Nobel Peace Prize-winning economist who assumed leadership of a caretaker administration on Thursday.

Shubho Roy, a Bangladeshi Hindu with family in Bangladesh, expressed anxiety over the situation and called for a permanent solution to ensure the dignity and safety of minorities in Bangladesh. "We need a permanent solution so that Hindus and other minorities can live with dignity in Bangladesh," Roy told ANI.

He highlighted the plight of Hindus in Bangladesh who had fled their homeland after enduring years of systematic violence, discrimination, and repression. Now, they stood before the symbol of



American power, demanding that the world take notice of the atrocities they had left behind. "We were pushed away from Mahabharat (India), Akhil Bharat, Akhand Bharat. We were never a part of Pakistan. We were framed and pushed away from India," Roy added.

Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi also called for the "safety and protection" of Hindus and other minorities in Bangladesh in a message on X on Thursday.

My best wishes to Professor Muhammad Yunus on the assumption of his new responsibilities. We hope for an early return to normalcy, ensuring the safety and protection of Hindus and all other minority

communities. India remains committed to working with Bangladesh to fulfill the... "My best wishes to Professor Muhammad Yunus on the assumption of his new responsibilities. We hope for an early return to normalcy, ensuring the safety and protection of Hindus and all other minority communities. India remains committed to working with Bangladesh to fulfill the shared aspirations of both our peoples for peace, security and development," PM Modi said in a post on X.

Protesters described their demonstration as a desperate appeal from people persecuted thousands of miles away.

Priyadarshani Saha, one of the pro-

testers, urged US lawmakers to advocate for Bangladeshi minorities, including Hindus, Buddhists, Christians, and other indigenous groups. "The Biden administration had the ability to make a difference, to influence the Bangladeshi interim government, and to pressure the international community to take action," Saha said.

Signs at the protest included messages such as "End Religious Persecution in Bangladesh" and "Protect Minority Rights," with chants demanding justice and international intervention.

Mahendra Sapa from Vishwa Hindu Parishad America stood in solidarity with the Bangladeshi diaspora, urging the State Department and White House to learn from the 1971 genocide and prevent a repeat of such atrocities. "We strongly urge the State Department and White House to have lessons learned from the 1971 genocide and make sure that those mistakes are not repeated," Sapa told ANI.

"The office of the United Nations Secretary-General has said the violence in Bangladesh should be "tamped down", adding it stands against any "racially based attacks" or "racially based incitement to violence," he added.

Thousands of Bangladeshi Hindus have been fleeing to neighbouring India to escape the violence.

Hindus, who make up about 8 per cent of Bangladesh's 170 million population, have traditionally supported Hasina's Awami League party, which has faced backlash following violent clashes between anti-quota protesters and security forces last month.

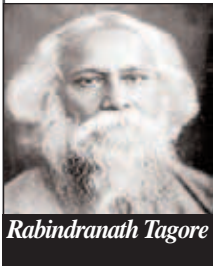

74 pc Pakistanis unable to meet expenses

Amid economic distress, the financial difficulties faced by urban Pakistani households have soared by 14 per cent over the past year. As a result, a staggering 74 per cent of the urban population in the country being unable to meet their monthly expenses with their current income, ARY News reported.

This represents a significant increase from May 2023, when 60 per cent of households reported financial struggles, according to the latest study by Pulse Consultant.

Of those currently struggling to make ends meet, 60 per cent have had to cut back on essential expenses, including groceries, while 40 per cent have resorted to borrowing money from their acquaintances.

Furthermore, 10 per cent of people have taken on part-time jobs to supplement their income,



as per ARY News. The survey of Pakistan, a country with roughly 240 million population, also high-

lighted that more than half, 56 per cent, of those who are just managing to cover their expenses, are

unable to save any money after meeting their basic needs.

The findings are based on a

telephonic poll conducted by Pulse Consultant from July to August, involving over 1,110 respondents from the 11 largest cities in Pakistan, as reported by ARY News.

Pakistan continues to face economic challenges Pulse Consultant plans to launch a second round of detailed urban-based studies later this month.

This upcoming survey will gauge the impact of inflation on purchasing and consumption habits, highlighted the CEO, with a larger sample of over 1,800 respondents across 17 major cities in Pakistan.

Last month, the Shehbaz Sharif-led Pakistan government unveiled a three-year economic plan, which aims to increase the share of provinces in the federal budget from 39.4 per cent to 48.7 per cent by 2027, ARY News re-

ported.

The plan also highlights the country's debt burden, with total debts expected to reach PKR 79,731 billion by the end of the current fiscal year. Local loans are expected to increase by approximately PKR 7,671 billion, while foreign loans will rise by PKR 818 billion.

The Pakistani government has claimed it is working to reduce the debt burden, including re-financing and interest rate risk management.

Earlier, Pakistan and the International Monetary Fund reached a three-year, USD 7 billion aid package deal.

A report, last month revealed that the Pakistani government's borrowings in the first 11 months of the outgoing fiscal year have exceeded the combined figure of the two preceding fiscal years,

Ola Electric Shares Surge on Debut as Investors Bet on Increasing EV Adoption

Ola Electric Mobility's shares surged 20% on their trading debut in Mumbai on Friday, valuing the company at \$4.8 billion, as investors bet on increasing adoption of electric vehicles in the world's largest market for two-wheelers.

The stock had listed flat to its initial public offering (IPO) price of 76 rupees before rising to 91.20 rupees in a broader market that was up 1%.

Ola Electric's \$734 million IPO is India's biggest so far in 2024. The company is the leading player in a country where adoption of EVs is still low, but rising, as Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government promotes clean energy.

Improving sentiment in the stock market also helped drive gains, analysts said. The Nifty 50 has rebounded about 1.3% in four sessions after plunging 2.7% on Monday amid U.S. recession worries.

"Despite receiving demand well below street expectation, Ola listed well above street expectations, which can be attributed to market mood," said Prashanth Tape, senior vice president of research at Mehta Equities.

With a 39% market share as of July, Ola Electric dominates sales of electric scooters in India, having launched its first model just three years ago.
