Delhi: Heavy rain causes waterlogging

NEW DELHI: Overnight rains led to waterlogging in many parts of Delhi, affecting traffic movement on Thursday morning. The minimum temperature was recorded at 23 degrees Celsius, three notches below the season's average, according to the India Meteorological Department (IMD). The humidity level was 100 per cent at 8.30 am. The Safdarjung observatory, which provides representative data for the national capital, recorded 77.1 mm rainfall in the last 24 hours up to 8.30 am Thursday.

Centre to unveil new simplified pension application form for retiring employees

NEW DELHI: The Centre will unveil a new simplified pension application form for its retiring employees on Friday, according to an official statement. The Department of Pension & Pensioners' Welfare (DoPPW) had vide its notification dated July 16, 2024 released the simplified pension application "Form 6-A", it said. "This form will be available in Bhavishya/e-HRMS (online modules) to all the central government employees who are going to retire in December 2024 and onwards. The retiring officials, who are on e-HRMS, will fill Form 6-A through e-HRMS (only superannuation cases) and the retiring officials, who are not on e-HRMS, will fill Form 6-A in Bhavishya," the statement issued by the Personnel Ministry on Thursday said.

Simranjit Mann makes derogatory comments on Kangana

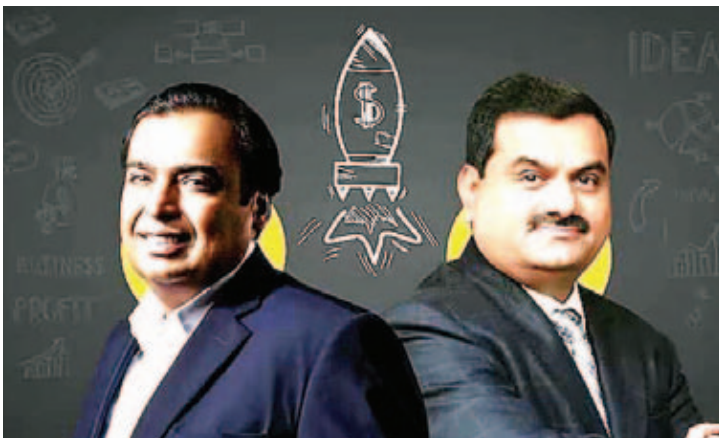
CHANDIGARH: Shiromani Akali Dal (Amritsar) president and former MP Simranjit Singh Mann on Thursday made derogatory remarks against BJP MP Kangana Ranaut, who had recently courted controversy with her comments on the farmers' protest. Mann, 79, made the disparaging remarks, mentioning "rape", when a reporter in Karnal asked him to comment on a recent interview given by the Mandi MP. The actor-politician recently posted a clip from the interview in which she suggested that a "Bangladesh-like situation" could have erupted in India but for the country's strong leadership.

Gautam Adani replaces Mukesh Ambani as India's richest person

AGENCY NEW DELHI, AUG 29

Gautam Adani and his family have secured the top spot in the 2024 Hurun India Rich List, with a wealth of 11.6 lakh crore, surpassing Mukesh Ambani. In 2020, Mr Adani was fourth on the list. Mr Adani's wealth has surged by 95 per cent in the last one year. His rise is marked by recovery following the Hindenburg report, which had raised significant scrutiny.

"Rising like a phoenix after the Hindenburg allegations, Gautam Adani (62) & family have secured the top spot in this year's rankings, with a 95% increase in wealth compared



to last year, bringing their total to INR 1,161,800 Cr. As a self-made entrepreneur, Adani has recorded the highest wealth growth within the top 10 over the past five years, adding INR 1,021,600 Cr, despite the challenges following the report," the Hurun Rich List says.

"All Adani Group companies saw a significant surge in share prices over the past year. For example, Adani Ports experienced a 98% increase, driven by improved utilization levels and the proposed acquisition of new ports and container terminals. Meanwhile, the energy-focused companies-Adani Energy, Adani Gas, Adani Transmission, and Adani Power-averaged a 76%

growth in share price. Additionally, MSCI's decision to lift restrictions on Adani Group securities in its August 2024 review indicates a return to normal operations, reflecting a stabilizing outlook for key stocks like Adani Enterprises, Adani Ports, and Ambuja Cements. This year, Hurun has attributed the wealth of the family trust and international companies within the promoter group to Gautam Adani and his family," the report adds.

Mr Ambani, with a wealth of 10.14 lakh crore, secured the second position on the list.

The wealth calculations presented are based on the snapshot taken on July 31, 2024.

Three militants killed in Kupwara encounter

AGENCY SRINAGAR, AUG 29

Security forces shot dead three suspected foreign infiltrators close to the Line of control in two separate operations in Jammu and Kashmir's Kupwara district on Thursday.

Police said these successful operations are a result of perfect synergy between them and the army.

They said a close vigil is being maintained and more thrust has been on developing human intelligence regarding infiltration attempts from LoC at Kupwara.

Giving details, a police spokesman said that specific inputs were developed on Tuesday about simultaneous infiltration attempts from the Karnah sector and Kumkadi in the Machil sector in Kupwara district and were shared with concerned army units and joint ambushes of Police and Army were deployed.

He said at Kumkadi, suspicious movement was detected around 7.30 PM on Wednesday shortly after which firing commenced which carried on till early this morning

As the operation in Kumkadi was going on, suspicious movement was detected in the Karnah sector around 9 PM on Wednesday shortly after which firing commenced there as well which continued into early morning hours.

"Upon search conducted in the morning at both locations - two dead bodies were sighted at Kumkadi while one body was sighted at the Karnah encounter site," the spokesman said.

Police said further search operations are ongoing.



Brief exchange of fire between SFs, terrorists in Rajouri

JAMMU: A brief exchange of fire took place between security forces and terrorists in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir. The operation is underway, said a police official on Thursday. Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Jammu Zone, Anand Jain posted on X, "on Aug 28 at 2130 hrs, a search operation was launched by Security Forces in the Kheri Mohra Lathi and Danthal areas of Budhal, in Rajouri district." He further said that at 2345 hrs, contact was established with Terrorists near Kheri Mohra, leading to an exchange of fire and further details awaited. The bordering Rajouri and Poonch districts will go to poll on September 25 in the second phase of Jammu and Kashmir Assembly Elections.

Three women Naxalites killed in Chhattisgarh

Narayanpur : Three women Naxalites have been eliminated in an ongoing encounter with the security forces in the dense forests of Abujhmad in Narayanpur district of Chhattisgarh. A large cache of weapons and Naxal-related materials have been seized from the site. "The encounter began around 8:00 AM and is still ongoing, with the joint team of the District Reserve Guard (DRG), Special Task Force (STF), and Border Security Force (BSF) engaged in the operation," stated IG Bastar P Sundarraj. The search mission was launched following intelligence reports about the presence of Maoists in the Abujhmad area, near the border of Narayanpur and Kanker districts. "So far, the bodies of three armed women Naxalites have been recovered, and a substantial amount of weapons and Naxal-related materials have been found at the site. All security personnel are reported to be safe," IG Bastar P Sundarraj said.

PM Modi formally invited by Pakistan for regional SCO meet in October

AGENCY ISLAMABAD, AUG 29

Pakistan today formally announced that Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been invited to the upcoming Shanghai Cooperation Organisation (SCO) meeting being held in Islamabad in mid-October.

Pakistan Foreign Office spokesperson Muntaz Zahra Baloch, at her weekly press briefing, said Islamabad had sent invitations to the heads of countries to participate in the meeting, Pakistani media reported.

"An invitation has also been sent to the Prime Minister of India, Narendra Modi," she said, adding that some countries had already confirmed their participation in the meeting.

"It will be informed in due



course which country has confirmed," Ms Baloch added. Pakistan is set to host the SCO heads of government meeting on October 15-16. The event will be preceded by a ministerial meeting and several rounds of senior officials' meetings focused on financial, economic, socio-cultural, and humanitarian cooperation among the SCO

member states. Analysts see the invitation as a "protocol" as PM Modi is unlikely to accept the invitation as relations between the two neighbouring countries have been tense. It is possible that PM Modi may depute a ministerial delegation to represent India as the SCO meeting does not require heads of state to participate.

Ayodhya temples to offer online Darshan this Diwali

This Diwali, devotees will be able to experience online Darshan of Ayodhya's temples through Metaverse technology.

A Mumbai-based company is working on this project, and within six months, 20 temples in Ayodhya will be accessible online, allowing devotees from around the

world to perform Darshan from the comfort of their homes. In an exclusive interview with ANI on the sidelines of the 5th edition of Global Fintech Fest, company's MD and CEO Rajesh Mirjankar said, "The Ayodhya Development Authority has issued an RFP to provide online Darshan for 20 temples in Ayodhya. The aim is to offer virtual Darshan and recreate some of the historic aspects of Ayodhya for devotees.

Haryana polls: BJP leaders meet to discuss names of candidates



AGENCY NEW DELHI, AUG 29

Senior BJP leaders, including Union minister Amit Shah, met at party president JP Nadda's residence here on Thursday to discuss the names of probable candidates for the upcoming Haryana assembly polls.

This came ahead of the BJP's central election committee (CEC) meeting in the evening, during which the panel could finalise the names of its nominees for the polls to be held on October 1. BJP chief Nadda, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, and Union ministers Shah and Rajnath Singh, among others, are part of the CEC. BJP MP Kangana Ranaut also met Union Minister JP Nadda at his residence for a

brief period. Earlier on Monday, Haryana CM Saini addressed the Nonstop Haryana Jan Ashirvad rally in Tosham, Bhiwani. He vouched for the effectiveness of the "double-engine" government, the CM also hit out at the Congress party, saying that the leaders had gone silent after they had heard the 2-month account of his government's tenure. The CM highlighted the various schemes for the citizens provided by the government in the area, saying the government provided water to everyone, brought grains at MSP prices and also provided government jobs to people. Ahead of the Haryana polls, Janayak Janta Party (JJP) and Chandra Shekar Azad's Azad Samaj Party (Kanshi Ram) have also announced their alliance on Tuesday.

No party symbols in Punjab panchayat elections

BUREAU CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 29-

In a significant move aimed at ensuring holistic development of villages, the Punjab Cabinet led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Thursday gave nod to amend Rule 12 of the Punjab Panchayat Election Rules 1994 thereby debarbing the candidates to contest elections of Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs) on party symbols.

A decision to this effect was taken in the meeting of the council of ministers held here at the Chief Minister's Office in Punjab Civil Secretariat I.

Disclosing this here today a spokesperson of the Chief Minister's Office said that the Cabinet observed that contesting elections on party symbols leads to many unwanted inci-

Three of family die as house roof collapses due to heavy rain in Mainpuri

AGENCY MAINPURI, AUG 29

Three women of a family died after the roof of their two-storey house collapsed due to heavy rain in Brahmipur village in Uttar Pradesh's Mainpuri district on Thursday, police said.

Mainpuri Deputy SP Satya Prakash Sharma said that the roof of the house collapsed under the weight of the heavy rain.

"Three women have died in the roof collapse incident. There are no other injuries. The house was 15-16 years old, and it's believed that the roof gave way due to the heavy rain," SP Sharma told agency. Ac-

cording to Mainpuri ADM Ramji Mishra, the incident occurred at 8 AM, and the house belonged to serviceman Kaushalendra Yadav.

"The deceased have been identified as Neelam, Anupama, and Preeti, aged between 30 and 35 years," he said.

ADM Mishra also confirmed that compensation will be provided to the next of kin. "Compensation of Rs 4 lakhs each will be given to their families," he said.

"Neelam, Anupama and Preeti, aged between 30 to 35 years of age died in the incident. They are being provided compensation of Rs 4 Lakhs each," ADM Mishra said.

HP CM's wife, 2 women MLAs set to join surrogacy board

The Himachal Pradesh Assembly on Thursday approved the nomination of three women legislators as ex-officio members of State Assisted Reproductive Technology and Surrogacy Board which regulates clinics and banks which offer services like In vitro fertilization (IVF) to childless couples.

The members of the House gave assent to the motion on nomination of board members with voice vote without any opposition and discussion. Now the Speaker may nominate the only three women members in the House.

The Board's new members

would be Chief Minister's wife and Dehra legislator Kamlesh Thakur, Pachhad legislator Reena Kashayap and Lahaul Spiti legislator Anuradha Rana. The nomination assent followed a motion moved by the Health Minister Dhani Ram Shandil in the House on Thursday. The Minister stated in the House that in the provisions contained in Section 26 and 27 of the Surrogacy (Regulation) Act, 2021 that the members of the Himachal Pradesh Legislative Assembly do proceed to elect, in such manner as the Speaker may direct, three women members from amongst themselves to be nominated as Ex-officio Members of the State Assisted Reproductive Technology.

aims to reduce the maximum amount of pre-deposit for filing appeal before the Appellate Authority from rupees twenty five crores to rupees twenty crores, to provide for a conditional waiver of interest and penalty in respect of demand notices issued under section 73 of the Act for the Financial Years 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2019-20 and to give retrospective effect to section 168A of the PGST Act from March 31, 2020.

The Cabinet also gave its consent for sending the case of three prisoners seeking the premature release of life con-

victs confined in the jails of the state. After the nod of the Cabinet under Article 163 of the Constitution of India, this special premature release case will be submitted to the Punjab Governor under Article 161 of the Indian Constitution for consideration.

The Cabinet also gave approval to extend the policy of the Health and Family Welfare department related to engagement of House Surgeons/ House Physicians for another year. The motive of this decision is to ensure unhindered and quality health care services to the residents of the state.

Pak-backed arms smuggling module busted ; two held with 4 glock pistols

"The operation leads to the recovery of four sophisticated Glock-19 pistols, including one pistol with 'MADE FOR NATO ARMY' imprinted on it, along with four magazines and seven live cartridges and Rs 4.8 lakhs hawala money," he said, while adding that the Police teams have also impounded the Maruti Swift car, in which accused persons



were travelling. Those arrested have been identified as Harpreet Singh alias Happy of Chappa Ram Singh in Jandiala Guru and Lovepreet Singh of Basarke in Khajra. Both the arrested accused have criminal history with cases pertaining to NDPS act registered against them. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that arrested accused Harpreet Singh has direct links with the Pakistan-based smuggler, who used to influx drugs and weapon consignments from across the border using

drones. Further investigations are on-going to establish backward and forward linkages in this case, he added. Sharing more details, Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Tarn Taran Gaurav Toora, while addressing a press conference, said that the police party was carrying out checking of suspected vehicles near Sheron in Tarn Taran, when a car Maruti Suzuki Swift being driven rashly was signalled to stop using torch light and the occupants.

No plan to privatise Atal residential schools: CM

The Himachal Pradesh government has no plans to bring the Atal Adarsh Vidyalayas (AAV) under private institutions, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said on Thursday amid heated exchanges between the ruling Congress and the Opposition BJP in the legislative Assembly. Sukhu responded to a query from Vinod Kumar, an MLA from Nachan, asserting that the BJP was spreading misinformation about the government's intentions by suggesting that institutions under the AAV residential school scheme were being auctioned off. He clarified that none of the AAV schools announced by the previous BJP government had been merged with the Rajiv Gandhi Day Boarding Schools,



which were introduced by the current government. The Chief Minister also accused the previous BJP government of being responsible for a significant decline in the state's educational standards, stating that the quality of education had dropped by eight notches during their tenure. The debate in the House became heated after Revenue Minister Jagat Singh Negi revealed that funds

allocated for an AAV school in Nachan had been diverted to Dharampur, adding that the government would proceed with the AAV scheme as soon as resources were available.

BJP MLA Vipen Parmar raised concerns about the government mixing the two different education schemes, with Negi clarifying that the Rajiv Gandhi Model School Scheme was intended for day

boarding students, while the AAV scheme was for fully residential schools. Leader of Opposition Jai Ram Thakur said that the decline in educational standards was due to the current government's closure of schools opened by the BJP and pointed to a newspaper advertisement as evidence of the government's plans to lease out AAV schools.

Funds crunch: HP CM, top officials to forgo salaries for 2 months

In a development reflecting Himachal Pradesh's worsening financial crisis, Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu announced on Thursday that he and his team of ministers, Chief Parliamentary Secretaries (CPS) and all Principal Secretaries will forego their salaries and allowances for the next two months.

In a statement on the state's financial situation, Sukhu, who also holds the finance portfolio, explained that while various initiatives have been undertaken to boost state revenue, the benefits of these measures will take time to materialize.

Sukhu appealed to all members of the ruling and Opposition benches to follow suit and defer taking their salaries to help mitigate the economic strain.

The Chief Minister pointed towards a significant



reduction in the Revenue Deficit Grant, which decreased from Rs 8,058 crore in 2023-24 to Rs 6,258 crore this year.

Projections indicate a further drop to Rs 3,257 crore by 2025-26. Additionally, the state is yet to receive any of the Rs 9,042 crore from the Central government allocated for the Post-Disaster Needs Assessment (PDNA).

There is also an outstanding of Rs 9,200 crore in National Pension System (NPS) contributions from the Pension Fund Regulatory and Development Authority (PFRDA).

The cessation of GST compensation payments since June 2022 has resulted in an annual revenue shortfall of approximately Rs 2,500-3,000 crore. The restoration of the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) has further strained the state's borrowing capacity by around Rs 2,000 crore, he said. To counter these financial difficulties, the government has been working to increase state income and reduce non-essential expenditures, though Sukhu emphasized that it will take time for these efforts to yield results.

During the legislative Assembly session, Sukhu earlier reported an additional Rs 150 crore in revenue from liquor vend auctions and dismissed allegations of corruption. BJP Member Randhir Sharma had accused the Congress government of mishandling the liquor vend auctions, potentially, resulting in a Rs 200 crore loss to the state government.

CM reviews progress of green hydrogen plant in Nalagarh

the emission of pollutants such as nitrogen oxides (NOx), sulfur oxides (SOx) and particulate matter, which improves air quality and protects ecosystems. The minister also raised concerns about the falling enrollment rate in government schools, as more and more parents preferred private institutions. "We are focused on recruiting more qualified teachers and upgrading school infrastructure to meet modern educational standards," he said, emphasising the government's determination to restore the reputation of Himachal Pradesh's government schools," he added.

Paviter Singh, Director, Animal Husbandry and Fisheries, Chandigarh revealed that the Gambusia released in the water bodies is being produced at Govt. Fish Seed Farm situated at Regulatory end of Sukhna Lake functioning under Animal Husbandry & Fisheries Department. The Department breeds this fish and releases it from August onwards as per requirement.

He further asserted that in the Northern region, Govt. Fish Seed Farm, Chandigarh is the only farm which breeds the rare fishes for stocking in stagnant water bodies to prevent mosquito breeding.

Editorial

Ride to salvation

What do we see when we encounter shared autos buzzing on the outskirts of the cities? Or factory buses leaving the premises in the evening? Or tempo-trucks ferrying between towns bearing baskets of vegetables? Or buses and trains with concessional fares during festivals and pilgrimages? We see countless labouring women; low-fare transportation accessed by women who step out to work, run errands, pick up their children from school, or just travel.

Roughly five years back, this writer had interviewed families in a resettlement colony in Sunkadakatte, Bengaluru. Two large neighbourhoods had been moved from the central parts of the city towards its periphery on account of the Metro rail construction. The resettlement package involved the provision of pukka houses to the residents. Long after their move to the resettlement colony, several women continued to face intense dislocation for the displacement had led to loss of livelihood for them. Living near the central Majestic bus stand, some of them had been working as cleaning staff in hospitals and departmental stores while many women worked as domestic help in households. But after moving to the resettlement colony, approximately nine kilometres away from their previous places of work, the women lost out on employment because they could not afford the bus fare. What would have happened to the capacity and the earning potential of these women if free transportation was available for them?

The scheme of free travel for women in select public buses has been working in Delhi, Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Kerala, Karnataka and Telangana. Even as the proverbial dust around freeloading and burdening the taxpayers settles, it is good to turn to the data provided by state road transportation bodies. Telangana, the most recent state to implement the scheme of free travel for women, reported that in the first four months since the scheme was rolled out, women utilised free travel worth Rs 1,177 crore. In Karnataka, where the scheme has been in operation for a year, the total traffic revenue from June 2023 to May 2024 was Rs 4,809 crore. Given that women's labour force participation is adversely affected by numerous structural factors, access to free/affordable transportation can be a useful corrective. The enthusiastic reception of the scheme by women tells us a simple truth: they are happy with it. This will hopefully lead to an increase in the number of buses as well as an increase in the shuttle services by private companies. Distance and cost of transportation often govern women's decisions in their everyday lives — where to go for higher education, whether or not to take up a job or enrol in an evening course and so on.

Biden, Jinping plan to hold talks soon

United States and China are planning a phone call between President Joe Biden and his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping "in the coming weeks", the White House said on Thursday.

The call, likely to be held prior to the US presidential elections this November, was discussed between Biden's national security adviser Jake Sullivan and China's Foreign Minister Wang Yi during their two-day meeting in Yanqi Lake, Beijing on August 27-28.

The White House also said the two countries will also aim to organize a phone conversation between military theatre commanders "in the near future."

The two leaders had met in California in November 2023 termed as the Woodside Summit.

During Sullivan and Wang's meeting, the two sides held candid, substantive, and constructive discussions on a range of bilateral, regional, and global issues.

Sullivan and Wang noted the importance of the strategic channel of communication over the past 18 months and committed to maintaining high-level diplomacy and working level consultations on an ongoing basis, the White House said.

The two also discussed progress and next steps on implementation of the Woodside Summit commitments, including counternarcotics, military-to-military communications, and Artificial Intelligence safety and risk.

The top US and Chinese diplomats discussed next steps to reduce the flow of illicit synthetic drugs, continue repatriation of undocumented migrants, and law enforcement cooperation.

They also underscored the importance of concrete steps to tackle the climate crisis and welcomed further discussions during Senior Advisor to the President for International Cli-



mate Policy John Podesta's upcoming travel to China.

Sullivan emphasized that the United States will continue to take necessary actions to prevent advanced US technologies from being used to undermine its national security, without unduly limiting trade or investment.

The US National Security Advisor in his meeting with the Chinese Foreign Minister also raised continued concerns about China's unfair trade policies and non-market economic practices.

Sullivan reiterated that it remains a top priority to resolve the cases of American citizens who are wrongfully detained or subject

to exit bans in China. He also underscored the long-standing US commitment to universal human rights and fundamental freedoms, the White House stated.

Sullivan's visit was the fifth time that the US NSA and Wang were holding strategic talks since May 2023 and the first time US National Security Advisor to visit China in eight years. Sullivan underscored the importance of maintaining peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait and emphasized concerns about Chinese support for Russia's defence industrial base and its impact on European and transatlantic security.

Sullivan reaffirmed the United States'

commitment to defending its Indo-Pacific allies and expressed concern about Chinese destabilizing actions against "lawful Philippine maritime operations in the South China Sea."

The two sides also discussed shared concerns about the North Korea, Myanmar and West Asia.

Meanwhile, Sullivan on August 29 met with General Zhang Youxia, Vice Chairman of the Central Military Commission in Beijing and stressed that both countries have a responsibility to prevent competition from veering into conflict or confrontation, according to a read out from White House.

Brazil's top court threatens to suspend X over lack of legal representative

Justice Alexandre de Moraes of the Federal Supreme Court (Supremo Tribunal Federal or STF) of Brazil has asked Elon Musk to appoint a legal representative for his social media platform X in Brazil within 24 hours or face the consequences of a nationwide suspension.

Sharing a post on its official X handle, the Federal Supreme Court said, "STF summons Elon Musk and X to appoint a legal representative within 24 hours, under penalty of suspension of activities in Brazil."

On its official site, the STF said, "Minister Alexandre de Moraes, of the Federal Supreme Court (STF), summoned on Wednesday night (28) businessman Elon Musk, owner of the social network X (formerly Twitter), to indicate, within 24 hours, the new legal representative of the company in Brazil."

It further said, "The summons was made through a post on the Court's official profile on the social network itself.



The lawyer appointed in the proceedings was also summoned, on 08/18/2024, to present the information."

The STF warned that the event of non-compliance would result in the suspension of the social network's operations in Brazil. "In case of non-compliance with the determination, the decision provides for the suspension of the social network's activities in Brazil," the STF said.

India hands over first payment for energy project to Sri Lanka



High Commissioner of India to Sri Lanka, Santosh Jha on Thursday handed over the first payment for Hybrid Power Projects aimed at addressing energy needs in Delft, Nainativu and Analaitivu islands, the Indian Embassy in Sri Lanka said in a statement.

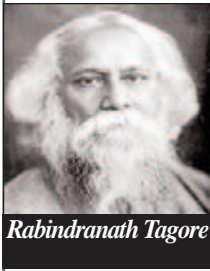
Jha handed over the payment to Sulakshana Jayawardena, the Secretary of Ministry of Power and Energy and Chairperson of Sri Lanka Sustainable Energy Authority (SLSEA), the statement said.

The project is aimed at catering to the needs of the people of the three islands, which are not connected to the national grid. India is granting an assistance of USD 11 million for this project, as per the statement. Earlier on August 23, Jha visited the island's Eastern Province, where he met Governor Senthil Thondaman and State Minister of Trade and Environment S Vivalendiran and discussed various planned and ongoing projects in the Province under India's assistance.

Michelin-starred Taiwanese restaurant closes stores in China

Din Tai Fung, a renowned Michelin-starred Taiwanese restaurant popular for its dumplings, is shuttering over a dozen locations in China. This move comes as the country's economy, the world's second-largest, experiences a slowdown, according to a report by Voice of America.

Beijing Hengtai Feng Catering Company, the company's subsidiary on Monday announced that it plans to close all its 14 restaurants in northern China, including one in Xiamen.

The brand's parent company in Taipei said that its 18 remaining restaurants across Eastern China, run by another Shanghai-based partner, will remain in normal operation, according to VOA.



In a statement, Din Tai Fung expressed apologies for the inconvenience and disappointment this closure may cause to their customers. "We deeply apologize for the inconvenience and disappointment this decision may cause to our many loyal Din Tai Fung customers," the subsidiary said on the Chinese social media app WeChat. It further said that the employees' severance and placement would be handled properly. Notably, some 800 employees will be affected by the decision.

Amid the shutdown, a Taiwan-based economist asserted that the consumption power in China is weak. Darson Chiu, a Taiwan-based economist and director general of the Confederation of Asia-Pacific Chambers

of Commerce and Industry said, "The current situation in China is that while there is still traffic, the consumption power is weak, including in the restaurant service industry. A high-end brand like Din Tai Fung may not be able to meet the consumers' needs as they downgrade their consumption in China's current economic environment," according to VOA. The company has its stores globally, with ones in the United States, Japan, South Korea, Singapore, China, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Malaysia, Australia, Europe, and Thailand. The Hong Kong branch has been awarded a Michelin Star five times. In June and July, Din Tai Fung had opened new branches in California and New York.

The erosion on the city side of the canal embankment poses a significant risk, including the potential collapse of a nearby railway wall. Consequently, efforts are being concentrated on this area with heightened urgency. Despite earlier assurances from irrigation department officials that there was no immediate danger, the deployment of such a large number of dumpers and laborers indicates a serious assessment of the situation.

Currently, black stones are being transported from the Panipat thermal plant to address the erosion. The canal embankment near the railway bridge is proving to be a major challenge for the irrigation department.

Preparations are underway to tackle erosion on the opposite side of the canal, where stone-filled sacks are being transported using tractor trailers, as dumpers cannot access the rough terrain. The administration is focused on repairing the erosion near the railway line and bridge. A long line of large dumpers, filled with black stones from Ashok Leyland and Tata, is stationed on the bypass. Due to the soft, wet soil, only one dumper can access the site at a time, often requiring cranes to pull the vehicles out.

The reconstruction of the Western Yamuna Canal, which cost approximately ₹202 crores during Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar's tenure in 2021, involved solidifying the embankment from Indri Block to Munk and laying slabs. Concerns about the quality of the work have been raised, though officials attribute the issue to the unpaved condition beneath the railway bridge, which led to the slab breakage and subsequent erosion. The rest of the embankment is reportedly in good condition with no further complaints.

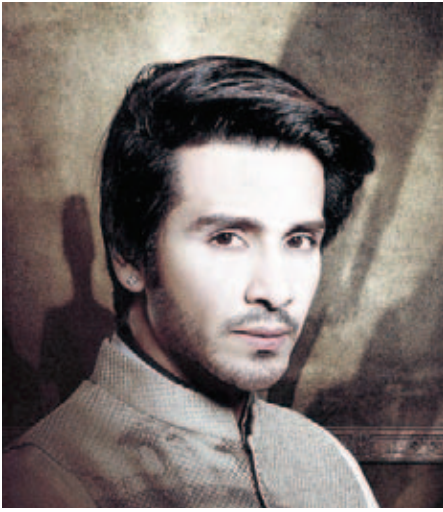

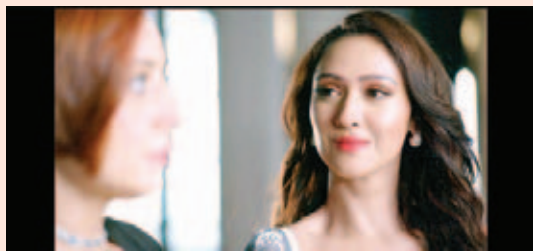

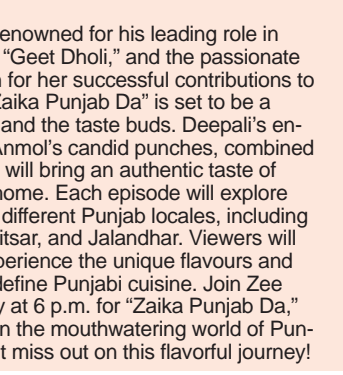
