SC tells states to use of digital eye for road discipline

NEW DELHI: Stressing on the need for cashless treatment of road accident victims, the Supreme Court on Monday directed all state governments to take immediate steps to implement Section 136 A of the Motor Vehicle Act, 1988, which pertains to the electronic monitoring and enforcement of road safety. A bench comprising Justice Abhay Oka and Justice Augustine George Masih said that Section 136A was an innovative provision designed to help state governments enforce discipline on national and state highways and urban cities.

CBI gets 8-day custody of Sandip Ghosh in Kolkata hospital financial scam

KOLKATA: A Special Court in Kolkata on Tuesday remanded RG Kar Hospital's former principal Sandip Ghosh to Central Bureau of Investigation custody for eight days in connection with alleged financial scam in the institute since 2021, court sources said. Ghosh and three other arrested accused, including former principal's private security man Afsar Ali Khan and two vendors, were presented before the Special CBI court in Alipore, which remanded the four accused to 8 days' CBI custody.

10 capital acquisition proposals worth Rs 1.45 lakh crore approved for armed forces

NEW DELHI: To enhance the capability of the armed forces and their modernisation, the Defence Acquisition Council (DAC), under the Chairmanship of Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Tuesday accorded Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) for 10 capital acquisition proposals amounting to Rs 1,44,716 crore. Of the total cost of AoNs, 99 percent is from indigenous sources under Buy (Indian) and Buy (Indian-Indigenously Designed Developed and Manufactured) categories, an official statement said. For modernisation of the tank fleet of the Indian Army, the proposal for procurement of Future Ready Combat Vehicles (FRCVs) has been cleared. The FRCV will be a futuristic main battle tank with superior mobility, all terrain ability, multilayered protections, precision & lethal fires over and real-time situational awareness.

No NOC required for land deeds in Punjab

In a major relief to the common man the Punjab Vidhan Sabha led by Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Tuesday unanimously passed historic Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation (Amendment) Act, 2024 to do away with the practice of No Objection Certificate (NOC) for registration of land deeds.

Winding up the discussion on the Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation (Amendment) Act, 2024 at the floor of Punjab Vidhan Sabha, the Chief Minister said that this amendment aims to ensure stringent control over the illegal colonies besides giving relief to the small plot holders. He said that this is a major reprieve for the common man as this amendment aims to overcome the problem being faced by the general public in registration of their plots and to put a check on development of unauthorized colonies. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that this amendment stipulates provisions of penalty and punishment to offenders adding that it is a historic decision aimed at ensuring the well being of common man.

The Chief Minister said that as per the amendment any person who upto July 31, 2024, for an area upto five hundred square yard situated in an unauthorized colony, has entered into a power of attorney, agreement to sell on stamp paper, or any other such document will not require any No Objection Certificate for registration of land. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that such property owners will be entitled to get registration of such an area executed before a Registrar or Sub-Registrar or



Joint Sub-Registrar and this exemption of getting such an area registered shall be available upto such date as may be notified by the State Government in this behalf. He said that intimation of each such document of sale shall be given by the Registrar or Sub-Registrar or Joint Sub-Registrar to the concerned development authority provided that he shall register subsequent sale deeds in respect of such property, if it has not been divided, even after the date of exemption.

The Chief Minister said that any person or promoter or his agent registered under this Act, and any other promoter, who, without reasonable cause, fails to comply with or contravenes the provisions of Section 5 shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a minimum term of five years which may extend to ten years and with minimum fine of rupees twenty-five lac, which may extend to rupees

five crores.

He said that the illegal colonisers dupe the people by showing them green pastures and sell their unapproved colonies to them, san basic civic amenities in form of street lights, sewerage and others. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the hapless people have to then run pillar to post for getting the basic civic amenities in these colonies. The Chief Minister said that the colonisers mint the money illegally but people have to bear the hardships due to their misdeeds. He said that the previous governments had regularized the illegal colonies thrice despite the fact that every time it had a clause that it won't be repeated again. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that being one of the most experienced Chief Ministers of the country he had taken this decision to legalize the plots of common man and not the illegal colonies.

Nine Naxalites killed in Chhattisgarh encounter

Nine Naxalites were killed in an encounter with security personnel in Bastar region of Chhattisgarh on Tuesday, a senior police official said.

The gunfight broke out around 10.30 am in the forest along the border of Dantewada and Bijapur districts when a joint team of security forces was out on an anti-Naxal operation. Inspector General of Police, Bastar Range Sundarraj P told a news agency. Personnel belonging to the District Reserve Guard (DRG) and the Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) were

involved in the operation, which was launched based on inputs about the presence of Naxalites belonging to its west Bastar division unit, he said.

Besides, a huge cache of weapons was also seized from the encounter site, he said.

Security personnel were reported to be safe and the search operation was still underway in the area, he added.

Bastar region comprises seven districts, including Dantewada and Bijapur. With this incident, 154 Naxalites have been gunned down by the security forces in different encounters in Chhattisgarh so far this year, the police said.

Student chased, shot dead in Faridabad over suspicion of cow smuggling, 5 held

A 12-grade student was shot and killed by cow vigilantes on the suspicion of cow smuggling in Haryana's Faridabad on Tuesday.

The deceased was identified as Aryan Mishra, a student of class 12. The police have arrested five persons in connection with the matter.

According to the police, the incident happened on August 23. The police said that the accused mistook the car in which the victim was travelling with his friends for one involved in cow smuggling. The accused chased the victim's car for about 25 kms.

The police said that multiple shots were fired by the accused and Aryan was shot



on his chest. The victim was rushed to a local hospital but succumbed to his injuries the next day.

Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) Crime, Faridabad, Aman Yadav said that an FIR was lodged in the matter and five individuals have been arrested. The arrested accused have

been identified as Anil Kaushik, Varun, Krishna, Adesh, and Saurav.

"A boy named Aryan Mishra was shot dead. An FIR was lodged in the matter under relevant sections. Five days after the incident, the crime branch's team arrested five accused," ACP Yadav said.

AAP, Congress alliance likely in Haryana; seat sharing being discussed

The Congress and the Aam Aadmi Party have reached an 'in-principal understanding' to fight next month's Haryana Assembly election together, sources told Tuesday evening. The next step is divvying up the Assembly's 90 seats - a potentially tricky topic.

Sources said that in the early exchanges the AAP has demanded 10 seats, while the Congress is willing to give between five and seven only. The Congress is reportedly also willing to give one seat to the Samajwadi Party of ex Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Akhilesh Yadav.

There is no word on this alliance, should it hold through the Haryana election, extending into 2025 and the Delhi Assembly election, in which the AAP has triumphed every time since 2013 but faces a stern test this time, with Chief Minister and party boss Arvind Kejriwal still in jail in the liquor policy case.

All of this comes hours after it emerged that Rahul Gandhi, the Leader of the Opposition, suggested the INDIA bloc members continue the

partnership formed before the April-June general election.

Sources said Mr Gandhi wanted to retain the alliance to guard against division of votes.

In the 2024 Haryana Lok Sabha election, the Congress and AAP contested the state's 10 seats 9:1.

The Congress won five from its share. The AAP lost the one seat it was contesting - Kurukshetra - to the BJP's Naveen Jindal by around 29,000 votes. The two parties got 21.19 per cent and 1.11 per cent of the votes, respectively. Combined, this was well below the 36.5 per cent amassed by the BJP.

Also, the Congress' vote share was lower than it managed in the 2019 Lok Sabha (in which the BJP got over 58 per cent of the votes) and Assembly elections (the BJP got 36.49 per cent). Nevertheless, the consolidation of the Congress and AAP voter bases was seen as helping the INDIA bloc win its five seats and stop the BJP from a second straight clean sweep in the heartland state. A similarly united showing, Mr Gandhi believes, is needed to vote out the state's BJP government.

CM Saini slams Cong's 'Haryana Maange Hisab' campaign

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Tuesday took a dig at the Congress over its 'Haryana Maange Hisab' campaign, saying the BJP government regularly gives an account of its works to the people and asked the opposition party to make known what it did while in power.

At a "Jan Ashirwad" rally in Karnal's Nilokheri, he alleged that during the Lok Sabha polls, the Congress took to "lying" and spreading "disinformation" that the Constitution would be changed if Prime Minister Narendra



Modi becomes prime minister for the third time in a row.

"Securing votes by taking support of lies and later exploiting the public is in their DNA," Saini said.

Stepping up the attack on the Congress ahead of the October 5 Assembly polls, the chief minister said, "They have been seeking account (of works done) from us... In the past 10

8 devotees, including 3 women die in road accident near Narwana

DR. RACHANA GUPTA (Senior Journalist and Writer) SHIMLA : There's a lot of commotion across the country about the financial condition of small hill states like Himachal. In a state with a population of about 70 lakhs, the quarter million employees and their financial benefits have become so dominant that it's natural for development in the state to be halted. Across the country, media channels are considering the Old Pension Scheme (OPS) as the reason for Himachal's crisis. Meanwhile, the BJP has

found an opportunity to criticize Congress nationwide in view of the elections happening in Haryana and Jammu & Kashmir.

In fact, the issue of Himachal's financial condition isn't very complicated. Neither is any government, single party, or individual politician responsible for the situation. Year after year, efforts were not made to

Now after losing in the assembly elections and by-elections, BJP will obviously not let the assembly run to fail Congress's 'free benefits' formula.

BJP has given most farmer-friendly govt in Hry: Anil Vij

Calling the Congress as an anti-farmer party, former Haryana Home Minister Anil Vij said on Tuesday that the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) government is giving Minimum Support Price (MSP) on the highest number of 24 crops, a record not matched by any other state.

He criticised Congress leader Bhupinder Singh Hooda saying that even when he was the Chief Minister he did nothing for farmers.

In response to Dushyant Chautala's allegation that the BJP was struggling to identify a safe seat for Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini, Vij said the Jannayak Janata Party (JJP) leader should focus on his party's list and infighting rather than worrying about the ruling party.

Responding to Rahul Gandhi's statement regarding mob lynching of Muslims under BJP's rule, Vij said that peace under Narendra Modi's governance across the country was unmatched.

On the contrary, the entire country was engulfed in riots during the Congress era, he said.




The BJP leader also dismissed allegations on attempts to change the Constitution under PM Modi. "Actually, it was Rahul Gandhi's grandmother who attempted to change the Constitution, not the BJP. She used Article 356 to dissolve state assemblies, whereas Narendra Modi has not done so," he said.

Ruling out any challenge from the Aam Aadmi Party in the October 5 Assembly election, Vij said it is an outfit that makes false promises.

On AAP's claim that it will provide similar facilities in Haryana as its governments do in Delhi and Punjab, Vij said, "People of Delhi threw the AAP out from all seven Lok Sabha seats and, similarly, the AAP faced a severe setback in Punjab. The party has lost its credibility."

Voting to elect 90 new legislators in the Haryana will be held on October 5. The results will be declared on October 8.

Finance Minister Cheema said that this is a major decision in the history of Punjab, and it would bring relief to those who were struggling to register their plots besides boosting the state's economy through revenue collection.

Due to the presence of an international cricket stadium in Dharamshala and the residence of Tibetan religious leader Dalai Lama in McLeodganj, the number of foreign tourists at Kangra Airport is also increasing continuously.

INRAE and Nauni University scientists collaborate on Global ACROPICS project

Scientists from the French Research Institute for Agriculture, Food and Environment (INRAE) and Dr. YS Parmar University of Horticulture and Forestry (UHF), Nauni, recently convened a workshop focused on evaluating the social impacts of natural farming initiatives. This event is part of the European Union-funded Agroecological Protection towards International Co-Innovation Dynamics and Evidence of Sustainability (ACROPICS) project.

The workshop featured INRAE scientists, including Prof. Allison Loconto, Prof. Mireille Matt, Dr. Evelynne Lhost, and Dr. Renne Van Dis. They joined hands with UHF's ACROPICS team and local farmers practicing natural farming to conduct a



Programme for the Analysis of Social Impact (ASIRPA). The ACROPICS consortium includes 15 members from 12 countries and 12 academic institutions, including UHF. The project is studying Sustainable Agroecosystems (SAS) from each member country. Specifically, the project is examining two SAS from UHF: Gram Disha Trust and Chaupal Natural Farmers Producers Company.

The situation of Himachal sinking into debt

But if we look at the state's financial situation over the past few years, it becomes clear that not just the previous Congress, but also BJP governments have kept the state standing on crutches of debt instead of making it self-reliant. Now when Sukhvinder Sukhu has started stopping 'free' benefits, there's an outcry. Whether Himachal's former chief ministers - Virbhadrar, Dhumal, Jairam and now Sukhu, all were aware of Himachal's dire situation. But the blindfold of 'Dhritarashtra' has brought Himachal to this point. Now, if we assess the financial facts, the picture is clear. In fact, when Jairam Thakur

presented the BJP's first budget in 2018-19, it was 41,440 crores. Sukhu gave the 2022-23 budget of 53,413 crores. Even then, 50 percent of the budget went to salaries, pensions, arrears, allowances, and it still goes there. As for the debt situation - in 2007, Himachal's debt was 1977 (all in crores of rupees), then in 2012 it was 27,598, in 2017 it was 46,386, in 2022 it became 69,122 crores, and in 2024 it reached 86,589 crores. When Jairam took over, the government was paying just 3500 crores annually in interest. Since the OPS pension was discontinued, the share of pension in the budget decreased, and so did the interest. But the debt continued at the same

percentage. Now two more aspects have been added to Himachal's poor financial condition. While various party governments at the Center have been indifferent to Himachal, politicians in the state have lured voters with promises of government jobs and benefits. Whether Congress hired PTA type employees through the back door, then BJP made them permanent, and now such employees, demanding DA, arrears, pension, have sensed the weakness of leaders. The first blow to Himachal came during the NDA's time when the development share in the state's plan (Center and State) was made half-half. That is, a 50-50 percent share. Which was made 90-10 percent during (2015-2018). But by

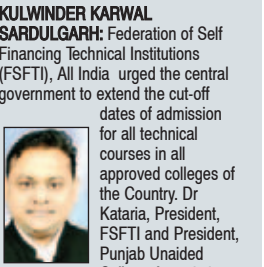
then the debt had reached 47 thousand crores. (All figures are from Himachal budget accounts in financial years.) But when Jairam Thakur was the Chief Minister, a lot of funds from NABARD and centrally sponsored schemes kept coming to the state, but salary and debt remained a headache. In the last term of his election year (2022-2023), he increased the budget proposal from 41 to 51 thousand crores. That is, the budget was directly increased by 11 thousand crores in five years. Now in the year 2022-2023, Sukhu's Congress government's budget came. The government's deficit kept increasing. Meanwhile, there was a pay revision and the promise of OPS had to be

fulfilled. Just on these two issues, the cart started to derail. When Sukhu became the Chief Minister and presented the budget for the year 2023-24, the BJP government had left a liability of just 10 thousand crores of pension and arrears. Then the average debt per person in the state had become 92,833 rupees in 2022-23. Here, the Congress government got another shock that in 2022-23, the deficit estimate to be received from the Center decreased even further. It decreased to about nine thousand crores, which will further decrease to only 3 thousand crores next year. Secondly, the crisis was that as soon as it came to power, Congress had to give pension to five thousand

government employees who had retired since (2003). While pension was given to so many employees, the eight thousand crore of the old pension scheme - NPS - was to be returned by the central government, which Himachal did not get. The hassle of changing from NPS to OPS fell on their neck, and the revised pay scale and arrears put Sukhu in trouble. The CAG report of March 2022 has made it clear that Himachal was to receive (4,412) crore rupees of GST compensation during Jairam's tenure as Chief Minister, which was not received. At the same time, during the previous BJP government, about 2 thousand crore rupees of various schemes were not spent. In recent years, state

governments have not been able to manage their purse, and now the uproar of employees is being heard across the country. Himachal is paying the price for having different party governments at the Center and State. For the first time, employees did not receive salary and pension on the first date. The coming time - for a few years - could be terrible. Especially when the Center does not bring Himachal out of this cycle of coins. But that won't happen. Because the Congress formula of OPS will never be allowed to succeed by opposition parties and Himachal will continue to be presented as a 'failure model'. This will be the irony of a hilly and beautiful state like Himachal!

FSFTI demands extension in cut-off dates for admissions

Punjab's amendment in PAPRA Act, CM's gift to people : Arora

Describing the Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation (Amendment) Bill, 2024 as a significant relief for individuals, who have purchased plots in illegal colonies, Punjab Cabinet Minister Mr. Aman Arora attributed this big step to Chief Minister, Bhagwant Singh Mann's commitment towards the public at large by initiating the effort to regulate the real estate sector in the state.

He further mentioned that it took two and a half years to the state Government to bring this legislation to address the issues being faced by buyers of plots in illegal colonies and to serve as a deterrent for the future. He slammed the previous governments for supporting illegal colonisers, resulting in the



emergence of urban slums. Two amendments were introduced in the PAPRA Act, 1995 in 2014, 2016 and 2018, but these changes primarily favoured illegal colonisers rather than addressing the issues faced by the general public. Currently, approximately 14,000 illegal colonies have sprung up across the state. Aman Arora said that indi-

viduals who have written sale agreement, possess a power of attorney and have bank transactions dated before July 31, 2024, for the acquisition of plots up to 500 yards, can proceed with the registration until November 2 of this year without requiring any No Objection Certificate (NOC). While allaying the concerns of opposition, Mr. Aman Arora said that this legislation does not aim to legalise illegal colonies; instead, it focuses on registration of plots of up to 500 yards within unauthorised colonies.

This strategy aims to deter illegal colonisation, unlike past administrations that inadvertently encouraged such practices. Plots lacking a sale agreement or bank transactions before July 31 will not fall under the purview of this Act.

Property dealers question Mann government's NOC decision: Gulshan Arora

ZIRAKPUR (VICKY BHABAT): For the last two years, the general public in Punjab has been unhappy with the wrong policies of the government. Every family is directly related to the social fabric. Every person is dependent on the policies of the state government for social and economic well-being. That is why elections are held after 5 years. The people of Punjab elected the AAP government because they thought that their economic condition would improve. But the first thing the AAP government did as soon as it came to power was to worsen the economic condition of the people. The Mann government took decisions for property purchase and sale in Punjab which were not in the public interest.

The order of mandatory NOC was a Tughlaqi decree for the real estate business of the entire Punjab. The dreams of home have been shattered in the cities of Punjab which are in the category of unplanned cities. For two years, people could neither sell nor buy their property at the time of need. The benefit of this went to those officers and people of the revenue department who take bribes. This was said by Gulshan Arora, President of Property Dealer Association, Zirakpur. He said that now the Mann government has announced to end the requirement for property up to 500 yards. But people are not really believing it. Till the time registration without NOC starts in every tehsil of Punjab, we too cannot believe it. 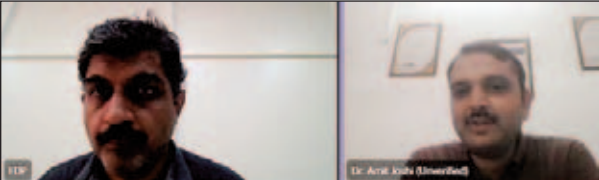

"This is the first time India has conducted Exercise Tarang Shakti, with 11 participating nations and 18 observer nations attending," the statement read.

Chief of Air Force, Air Marshal Stephen Chappell said Australia's participation in Exercise Tarang Shakti demonstrated a commitment to supporting regional partners and fostering international cooperation to address shared security chal- lenges.

"India is a top-tier security part- ner for Australia, and through the



Comprehensive Strategic Partner- ship between Australia and India, the Government is continuing to priori- tise practical and tangible coopera- tion that directly contributes to Indo- Pacific stability," Air Marshal Chap- pell said.

Australia and India have enjoyed increased air defence cooperation in recent years, including hosting Indi- an Air Force Flankers at Exercise Pitch Black in 2018, 2022, and 2024, the Australian Defence Department said.

Air Force also conducts a number of training and engagement activities with Indian Navy P-8I Neptune sur- veillance aircraft.

Australia will continue to support India's key role in the region by in- creasing the depth and complexity of our defence cooperation, the state- ment added.

The first phase of Exercise Tarang Shakti concluded in Tamil Nadu in August.

The first phase of India's largest multilateral air exercise 'Tarang Shakti' involved the air forces of Ger- many, France, Spain, and the UK.

Brazil's Supreme Court upholds ban on Elon Musk's X

All five judges in Brazil's Supreme Court have unanimously voted to uphold a ban imposed on Elon Musk's social media platform 'X' by one of its justices last week, Al Jazeera reported.

The ban, which went into effect on Saturday, was ordered by Justice Alexan- dre de Moraes after Musk's company missed a court-imposed deadline to name a legal representative in the South Ameri- can country.

On Monday, five of the court's justices were asked to consider Friday's decision to banish X from Brazil.

"It is not possible for a company to op- erate in the territory of a country and in- tend to impose its vision on which rules should be valid or applied," Justice Flavio Dino said as he joined Justice Cristiano Zanin in siding with Moraes.

"A party that intentionally fails to comply with court decisions appears to consider itself above the rule of law. And so it can turn into an outlaw," he said.

Justices Carmen Lucia and Luiz Fux



also backed Moraes, making the decision unanimous, as per Al Jazeera.

However, some of the judges said that the suspension could be reversed if X com- plies with previous court rulings.

Moraes's original order, which was released on Friday, had called Musk an "outlaw" who intended to "allow the mas- sive spread of disinformation, hate speech and attacks on the democratic rule of law, violating the free choice of the electorate, by keeping voters away from real and ac- curate information."

Taiwan accuses China of launching satellite over its territory

Taiwan's Ministry of Defence has al- leged that China launched a satellite over Taiwan with its flight path pass- ing over the southwestern Air Defence Identification Zone (ADIZ) of the island nation.

Taiwan's Ministry of National Defence said that the satellite launched from Xi- chang Satellite Launch Center (XSLC) posed "no threat" to the nation, adding that Taiwan Armed Forces monitored the whole process and are ready to respond if the need arises.

"At 09:20 a.m.(UTC+8), #PLA launched a satellite from #XSLC, with its flight path passing over our southwestern ADIZ. Poses no threat to us, the flight path flew toward the West Pacific Ocean. #RO- CArmedForces monitored the whole process and are ready to respond if nec- essary," Taiwan's MND stated in a post on X.

Earlier in the day, Taiwan detected 19 Chinese aircraft, eight Chinese naval ves- sels and one 'official ship' operating around its territory in the last 24 hours.



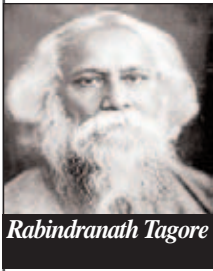
Taiwan's Ministry of National Defence said that 16 of the People's Liberation Army's (PLA) aircraft crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's northern, southwestern and eastern Air Defence Identification Zone (ADIZ).

"19 PLA aircraft, 8 PLAN vessels and 1 official ships operating around Taiwan were detected up until 6 a.m. (UTC+8) to- day. 16 of the aircraft crossed the median line and entered Taiwan's northern, southwestern and eastern ADIZ. We have monitored the situation and responded," Taiwan's MND stated in a post on X.

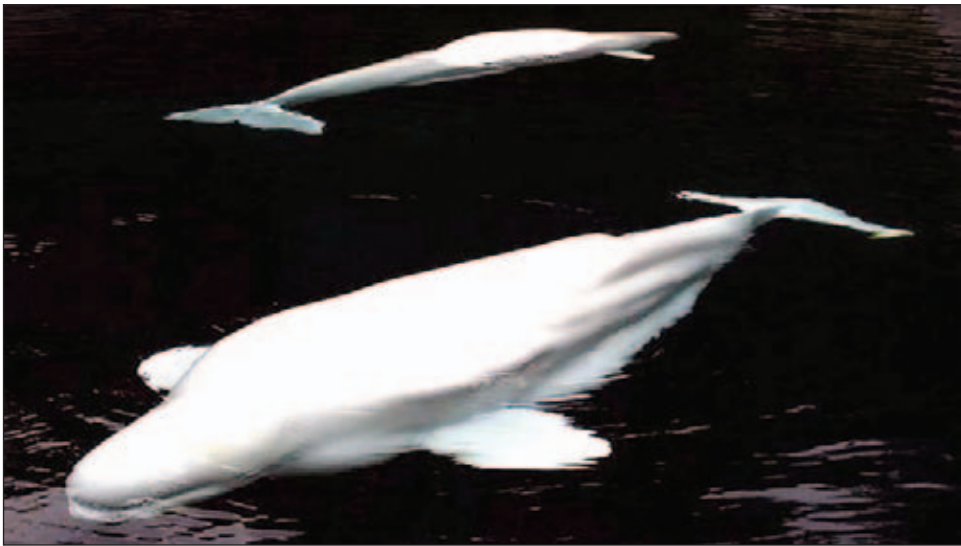
'Russian spy' whale nicknamed Hvaldimir found dead in Norway

A white beluga whale was discov- ered dead in the southwest of Norway. It was given the nick- name Hvaldimir because of unusual harness, which dubbed it as a Russian spy, CNN reported.

A father and son going fishing on Saturday saw the whale's carcass drift- ing off the southern Norwegian bay of Risavika, according to Norwegian state broadcaster NRK

"Hvaldimir was not just a beluga whale; he was a beacon of hope, a sym- bol of connection, and a reminder of the deep bond between humans and the natural world," Marine Mind, a nonprofit organisation that had been tracking the whale's movements, said on social media, according to CNN.

After the beluga whale was found



dead, its carcass was lifted out of the water with a crane and taken to a

nearby harbour for further examina- tion. The name Hvaldimir, which com-

bines the Norwegian term "hval" meaning whale with the first name of Russian President Vladimir Putin, was initially observed in 2019 off the coast of far northern Norway, reported CNN.

The whale's fabricated harness, re- sembling a camera mount bearing the words "Equipment St Petersburg" stamped on it, intensified rumours that he was a "spy whale." Hvaldimir appeared to be familiar to humans, leading Norwegian officials to specu- late that he may have escaped his con- finement and received training from the Russian navy.

"We've managed to retrieve his re- mains and put him in a cooled area, in preparation for a necropsy by the vet- erinary institute that can help deter-

mine what really happened to him," marine biologist Sebastian Strand told NRK, according to CNN.

Hvaldimir had been spotted in a number of coastal towns in Norway over the previous five years, and Nor- way-based NRK reported that the whale enjoyed playing with people. According to Norwegian media re- ports, Hvaldimir was a "therapy whale" of sorts rather than a "spy whale." The northern waters of Green- land, Norway, and Russia are home to beluga whales, who typically live to be between 40 and 60 years old, CNN re- ported.

Notably, Hvaldimir was 4.2 metres (14ft) long, weighed 1,225kg (2,700 pounds) and was thought to be be- tween 14 and 15 years old.

3 LPU's para athletes, Sumit Antil, Yogesh, and Nishad, clinched the 1 gold and 2 silver medals at Paris Paralympic 2024



PARAMJITS SINGH JALANDHAR: 3 students of the Lovely Professional University (LPU) had brought pride and glory to the university by winning 1 gold and 2 silver medals at the Paris Paralympics 2024. Sumit Antil, an MBA student, etched his name in sports history by clinching the gold medal in the men's javelin throw F64 category, while Yogesh Kathuniya (MA) excelled in the men's discus throw F56 and Nishad Kumar (MA) in high jump T47, both won the silver medal.

Sumit's remarkable feat of setting a new Paralympic record of 70.59m not only secured his victory but also established him as the first Indian man to defend his title with a gold medal, following his triumph at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympics. His outstanding performance surpassed the previous Paralympic record, which he himself had set. He is a two-time gold medal winner


in the world championships in Paris and Kobe, Japan. He also holds the world record of 73.29 in the F64 class.

Dr. Ashok Kumar Mittal, Member of Parliament (Rajya Sabha) and founder Chancellor of LPU, said after the great success of the Olympics, medals in the Paralympics are a proud moment for the country and university. Dr. Mittal lauded Paralympics players' commitment to overcoming challenges and achieving greatness on the global stage, serving as inspirations to aspiring athletes nationwide. He extended his warm wishes to all victorious and encouraged all the other players to continue striving for excellence in future competitions.

Yogesh Kathuniya (MA) in the men's discus throw F56 event gave his best with the 42.22 m throw and Nishad Kumar (MA) with 2.04 m in high jump T47. Both players

are the silver medallists of the Paralympics 2020 and 2024. Nishad secured a silver medal and set a new Asian record with a remarkable jump of 2.06 meters in the Tokyo Paralympics 2020. He also won 2 silvers in the World Para Athletics Championships 2023 in Paris, France, and 2024 in Kobe, Japan. Yogesh also won the silver in the category Discus Throw F56 at the 2023 World Para Athletics Championships in Paris, France, and 2024 in Kobe, Japan.

Sumit Antil began with a new Paralympic record of 69.11m in his first attempt, which eclipsed his own previous record of 68.55m. Then he bettered it with the eventual winner of 70.59m, making it yet another record. LPU 24 students also participated in the Paris Olympics and won medals in the hockey and javelin throw.
