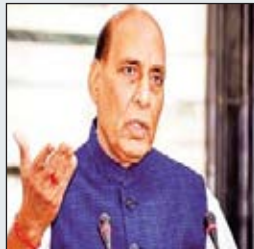

Former BJD MP Sujeet Kumar joins BJP

NEW DELHI: Former BJD Rajya Sabha MP Sujeet Kumar joined the BJP in the presence of senior party leaders on Friday. The move came after the BJD expelled Kumar for anti-party activities earlier in the day. He subsequently resigned his Rajya Sabha membership. Kumar joined the BJP in the presence of Union minister Dharmendra Pradhan, BJP national general secretary Arun Singh, the party's Odisha in-charge Vijaypal Singh Tomar, MP Bhartruhari Mahtab and other leaders.

Kangana disappointed over delay in Emergency release

MUMBAI: Kangana Ranaut, Bollywood actress and filmmaker, has expressed her disappointment over the delay in release of her much-hyped 'Emergency' as the film is awaiting the censor board's certificate. The makers of the movie moved to Bombay High Court against the Central Board of Film Certification for delaying the issuance of certificate, delaying the release by two weeks. The court directed the Central Board of Film Certification to make a decision on the certification of the movie 'Emergency' by September 18. The film was originally scheduled to be released on September 6. The film, produced by Zee studio's and Manikamika films, is based on emergency imposed in country in 1975. In the film, Kangana portrays the role of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. The film also features Anupam Kher, Mahima Choudhary.

Sensex, Nifty tumble over 1 pc on weak global cues

MUMBAI: Benchmark equity indices Sensex and Nifty slumped over 1 per cent on Friday, tracking a weak trend in global markets and fresh foreign fund outflows. Falling for the third day running, the 30-share BSE Sensex tumbled 1,017.23 points or 1.24 per cent to settle at 81,183.93. During the day, it plunged 1,219.23 points or 1.48 per cent to 80,981.93. The NSE Nifty dropped 292.95 points or 1.17 per cent to 24,852.15, its third day of decline.

Article 370 is history, will never come back: Amit Shah in J&K

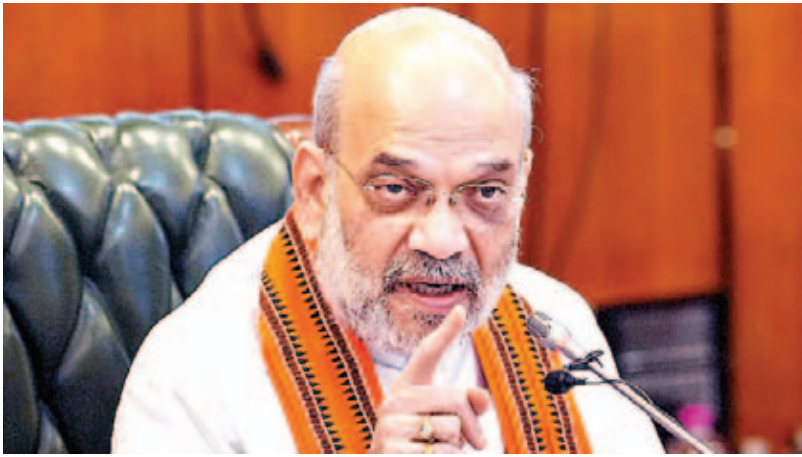

Unveiling the manifesto for the upcoming Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, Home Minister Amit Shah has ruled out the restoration of Article 370, which granted special status to the erstwhile state, and said the provision has now "become history".

The restoration of Article 370, which was abrogated in 2019, has been promised in the manifesto released by the National Conference, which is contesting the elections in an alliance with the Congress. The Assembly polls will be the first since 2014 and are also being keenly watched to gauge how the people of Jammu and Kashmir feel about the removal of the provision. Jammu and Kashmir was also bifurcated into two Union Territories, including Ladakh, in 2019 and the government has assured that J&K will be given statehood soon.

In Jammu and Kashmir on a two-day visit, Mr Shah said the former state has been very important to the BJP since Independence and the party has made efforts since then to keep it connected with India.

"Till 2014, the shadow of separatism and terrorism hung over Jammu and Kashmir. Various state and non-state actors tried to destabilise it and governments adopted a policy of appeasement. But, whenever the history of India and Jammu and Kashmir is written, the



years between 2014 and 2024 will be written in golden letters for J&K," the minister said in Hindi.

"There was a time when, under the shadow of Article 370, we saw governments bowing down to the demands of separatists and organisations like the Hurriyat. In these 10 years, Article 370 and 35-A (which gave the J&K legislature the right to define permanent residents and give them special privileges) have become part of the past. They are not part of the Constitution," he added.

Mr Shah asserted that the removal of Article 370 under PM Narendra Modi on August 5, 2019, spurred development in

the state and said he had read the National Conference's manifesto as well as noted the Congress' "silent support" for it.

"But I want to make it clear to the country: Article 370 has become history. It can never come back and we will never allow it to come back. Because Article 370 was what led to the youth being handed guns and stones in Kashmir," he said.

On the Assembly polls, the minister said that the BJP's manifesto for Jammu and Kashmir is aimed at a "peaceful, safe, developed and prosperous" J&K. Post a comment Jammu and Kashmir will vote in three phases between September 18 and October 1.

Farmers end protest after Punjab CM's assurance on agriculture policy

Farmers protesting against the alleged delay in implementation of Punjab's new agriculture policy ended their strike on Friday, a day after Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann assured them that a draft of the policy would be shared with them by September 30.

Mann also assured them that their suggestions would be incorporated before the policy's implementation.

Mann on Thursday held an over two-hour meeting with leaders of the Bharti Kisan Union (Ugrahan) and Punjab Khet Mazdoor Union, which led the protesting farmers, to discuss their demands.

Farmers under the banner of the Bharti Kisan Union (Ugrahan) and the Punjab Khet Mazdoor Union began a five-day protest on Sunday to press for their demands, including the agriculture policy's implementation.

Speaking to reporters at the protest site, Bharti Kisan Union (Ugrahan) president Joginder Singh Ugrahan said they had urged the state government to make the agriculture policy public.

"They (the government) said it was being finalised... They said by September 30, they would finalise it and hand over a copy," he said.

"We will wait till September 30. After we get a copy of the policy, we will go through it and hold a big meeting and decide the next course of action," he added.

In the interim, "we have decided to end the

protest in Chandigarh at 2 pm", Ugrahan said.

On Thursday, when asked about the farmers' future course of action following the meeting with Mann, the farmer leader said they would take a call after a meeting.

Mann assured the farmers that the state government was committed to safeguarding their interests and that the new agriculture policy would be a step forward in this direction. The draft of the policy is ready but it will be finalised only after due deliberations with



the farmers, the chief minister had said. The draft will be shared with the farmers by September 30 and their suggestions sought, he had added. The farmers' suggestions will be incorporated in the policy as the state government does not want to impose anything on the growers. Mann had said and added that his dispensation was committed to consulting them for making agriculture a profitable venture. Ugrahan said after the meeting that they were informed a 1,600-page draft of the policy would be shared with them by September 30. The farmers' other demands included the promotion of chemical-free crops, compensation to the families of farmers.

Ex-Delhi minister, AAP leader Rajendra Pal Gautam joins Congress

Aam Aadmi leader (AAP) leader and former Delhi minister Rajendra Pal Gautam on Friday joined the Congress here, claiming he wants to accelerate the struggle for social justice.

Gautam had quit the Delhi Cabinet in 2022 following his alleged remarks against Hindu gods and goddesses.

Gautam joined the Congress in the presence of Congress general secretary K C Venugopal, spokesperson Pawan Khara and Delhi Congress chief Devender Yadav.

Welcoming Gautam into the party fold Venugopal said, "It's a proud moment for us as Shri Rajendra Pal Gautam joins the Congress party. The Bharat Jodo Yatra and Bharat Jodo Nyay Yatra have given a

new narrative to the country, and now the country is also accepting it with full might. Attracted by the Congress programs under the leadership of Shri Mallikarjun Kharge and Shri Rahul Gandhi, he has decided to join the INC".

After joining the party, Gautam thanked Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge and Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi.

"At a time when incidents of hatred on the basis of religion and caste are on the rise, Dalits, backward castes and minorities are being targeted, Rahul Gandhi during the Bharat Jodo Yatra gave a slogan and that slogan really inspired me and touched my heart," Gautam said. He further said that the present time demands saving of the Constitution and Rahul Gandhi has started a movement to save the Constitution.

SC says no to Sandip Ghosh plea

The Supreme Court on Friday refused to entertain former principal of Kolkata's RG Kar Medical College Sandip Ghosh plea against Calcutta High Court decision ordering CBI probe into graft case whereby he raised objection on the adverse remarks made against him.

A bench of Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud and justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra rejected Sandip Ghosh plea.

The top court said that Sandip Ghosh don't have locus to intervene in public interest litigation alleging financial irregularities. Meanwhile Ghosh counsel told the court that he is not against investigation by the CBI but raised

an objection on the observation made against him by the Calcutta High Court. Ghosh lawyer said that connecting him with the RG Kar rape incident is injustice.

But the top court said that Ghosh was a principal of the RG Kar college when the incidents took place. The court also said that it is a matter of the investigation and for this it has already sought a status report from the CBI on the suo motu petition initiated by it on the incident. The Calcutta High Court while ordering CBI probe and asked the probe agency to submit a progress report on the investigation. On August 24, following the orders of the Calcutta High Court, an official FIR was registered by the CBI against Ghosh on the alleged corruption case.

Praveen Kumar wins India's sixth gold at Paris Paralympics

India's Praveen Kumar won the gold medal in the men's high jump T64 event at the 2024 Paris Paralympics, clearing 2.08 meters to claim his second consecutive Paralympic medal. Praveen had previously secured silver at the 2021 Tokyo Paralympics with a personal best of 2.07 meters, marking a remarkable continuation of his success on the international stage.

The 21-year-old athlete from Noida, Uttar Pradesh, became only the second Indian, after Mariyappan Thangavelu, to win gold in Paralympic high jump competitions. The 21-year-old

athlete from Noida, born with a shorter leg, delivered a season-best jump of 2.08m in a six-competer field to secure the top spot on the podium.

USA's Derek Loccident took silver with the best jump of 2.06m, while Uzbekistan's Temurbek Glyazov, achieving a personal best of 2.03m, finished third. Praveen competes under the T44 classification, designated for athletes with lower leg movement affected to a low or moderate degree, whereas the T64 category is for athletes with moderate movement impairment in one lower leg or those missing one or both legs below the knee.

India now world's 2nd largest 5G mobile market, surges past US

India has overtaken the US to become the world's second-biggest 5G handset market for the first time, behind China, a report has mentioned.

Global 5G handset shipments grew 20 per cent (year-on-year) in the first half of 2024, according to the Counterpoint Research. Apple led the 5G handset shipments, accounting for more than 25 per cent share.

Apple led the 5G handset shipments globally, accounting for more than 25 per cent share, driven by strong shipments of the iPhone 15 series and 14 series, reported news



agency a news agency. 5G handset shipments have been growing steadily and with the

increased availability of 5G handsets in the budget segment, the emerging markets have witnessed

high growth in this segment.

"India became the second-biggest 5G handset market during the first half, overtaking the US. The strong shipments from Xiaomi, Vivo, Samsung and other brands in the budget segment were the main reason for this trend," said senior analyst Prachir Singh.

Samsung followed in the second position, capturing more than 21 per cent share, driven by the Galaxy A series and S24 series. Apple and Samsung took five spots each in the top-10 list for 5G models in the first half of 2024, with Apple taking the top four spots.

Other emerging markets also

witnessed high growth in 5G handsets. Consumers in emerging markets are looking at 5G handsets as an upgrade to their devices, even in the lower price segments.

Asia-Pacific accounted for 63 per cent of the overall global net adds and commanded a 58 per cent 5G shipment share. In Europe and the Middle East and Africa (MEA) regions also, 5G handset shipments witnessed double-digit growth.

Research Director Tarun Pathak said that as the democratisation of 5G handsets increases with increasing 5G penetration in lower price segments as well as increasing expansion of 5G networks, this trend will further grow.

Drug smuggler held with 580 grams of opium

He was arrested along with Activa at the turn of HUDA Sector 30 outside Manpur Nanak Chand village and on searching in the presence of gazetted officer Praveen Kumar Drug Control Officer, 580 grams of opium was recovered .

Fuming over ticket denial, Kamboj called to Delhi by BJP

Govt to install 20k agri-solar pumps; 5k reserved for SC farmers, panchayats

Woman murdered with sharp weapon in Baddi, police investigating

The body was found on the third floor, flat number 29, of the S-block in Housing Board Colony, Bhatoli Kalan, on Tuesday afternoon, causing a sensation in the area. The woman had visible injuries on her neck from a sharp weapon. She was found wearing a factory uniform and worked at a nearby unit. Preliminary findings indicate that a migrant laborer discovered the body around 1 p.m. and alerted the watchman, who then informed the police. According to local residents, the woman had come to the flat with a young man to rent a room, and factory employees lived in the building. When the police arrived, her clothes were soaked in blood. SP Baddi stated that the police are thoroughly investigating the case.

SC asks collegium to reconsider names of two judicial officers for elevation as HC judges

The Supreme Court on Friday asked the collegium of the Himachal Pradesh High Court to reconsider the names of two senior-most district and sessions judges for elevation as judges of the high court. The apex court observed that the high court chief justice could not individually reconsider a recommendation and it could only be done by a high court collegium, acting collectively.

A bench of Justice Hrishikesh Roy and Justice Prashant Kumar Mishra delivered its verdict on a plea filed by the two senior-most district and sessions judges, alleging that their merit and seniority were not considered by the high court collegium in the selection of names for high court judgements.

"There was no collective



consultation and deliberation by the members of the high court collegium," the bench said while pronouncing its judgment.

"In light of the above, the high court collegium should now reconsider the names of Chirag Bhanu Singh and Arvind Malhotra for elevation as judges of the high court, following the Supreme Court collegium decision dated January 4, 2024..." it said.

During the hearing on May 13, the counsel

appearing for the two judicial officers referred to a Supreme Court collegium resolution of January 4 and the subsequent communication of the Union Ministry of Law and Justice to the Himachal Pradesh High Court and said that, according to these, the names of the petitioners should have been considered by the high court collegium.

While pronouncing its verdict, the top court bench said, "The decision of the chief justice of the high court

on the suitability of the two petitioners, as conveyed in his letter dated March 6, 2024, appears to be an individual decision. The same stands vitiated, both procedurally and substantially."

It said the writ petition filed by the petitioners was maintainable as it questioned the lack of effective consultation. "The chief justice of the high court cannot individually reconsider a recommendation and it can only be done by a high court collegium, acting collectively," the bench said. On May 13, the apex court sought a response from the registrar general of the Himachal Pradesh High Court on the plea. The petition was filed by the two judicial officers, alleging non-consideration of their names for judgeship by the high court collegium.

CITU condemns government for job losses of mid-day meal workers

HAMIRPUR: The labor organization CITU has taken a firm stand against the government's decision, which has resulted in the loss of jobs for mid-day meal workers. Ranjan Sharma, district in-charge of CITU's Mid-Day Meal Workers

Union, criticized the government's "dictatorial order" to merge schools with low enrollment. While teachers and peons were adjusted, the mid-day meal workers were left unemployed. District President of the Mid-Day Meal Workers Union, Ratna Chand, strongly

condemned the government's decision, calling it discriminatory and harmful to the workers' livelihoods. He highlighted that the irregular payment of Rs. 3,100 in some months and Rs. 3,500 in others has made it difficult for the workers to survive.

Pathania also informed the students about the second Legislative Assembly building located in Tapovan, Dharamshala, where the Winter Session will be held in December.

district headquarters were flooded with water within a short time. The rain has also exposed the arrangements of the Public Works Department and the Municipal Council. Water is flowing on the main road (MDR) of the district from Gandhinagar to Ramshila. At the same time, the footpaths of all the 11 wards of the Municipal Council also became ponds, due to which the pedestrians had to face difficulties in movement. The footpath leading from Lalchand Prathi Kala Kendra to the hospital gate is also waterlogged. Water has accumulated at many places on the hospital road from Dhalpur to College Chowk. Traffic movement on 40 roads and three bridges in the state remained disrupted on Friday. 32 electricity transformers are also affected. The Mandi-Kullu

main road has been closed due to landslides near 6, 7 and 9 miles between Mandi-Pandoh. The state capital Shimla is also cloudy today with light sunshine. On the other hand, there is a possibility of mild flooding in some catchment areas and neighbourhoods of Shimla, Sirmour, Solan, Mandi and Bilaspur districts of Himachal Pradesh during the next 24 hours. Due to rain, a drop in temperature has also been recorded in the state. 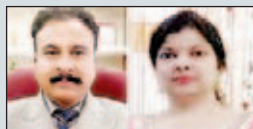

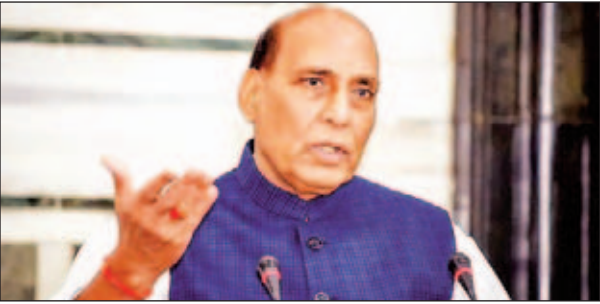

Editorial

Closed mind

Speaking at a book launch last week, the external affairs minister, Subrahmanyam Jaishankar, said that the era of uninterrupted dialogue with Pakistan was over. He also added that even as many parts of the world had concerns about their relationship with Beijing, India had a special China problem. Mr Jaishankar might have intended to deliver a dose of the hard-nosed realpolitik that he is known for. Yet those comments also serve to underscore the rising precarity of India's position in its neighbourhood. Pakistan is hosting the Shanghai Cooperation Organisation's heads of government summit in October and had invited Prime Minister Narendra Modi for the meeting last week. Given the state of affairs and Mr Jaishankar's latest comments, it appears unlikely that Mr Modi will travel to Islamabad. India and China have had a series of diplomatic engagements in recent weeks, including two meetings between Mr Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart, Wang Yi. The Indian minister's reference to China as a unique problem suggests that any expectation of a thaw with Beijing is naïve. A recent uptick in terrorist violence in Jammu and the continuing border tensions with China affirm the difficulties Mr Jaishankar referred to. But problems can also become self-fulfilling prophecies in the absence of careful strategising.

As Mr Jaishankar said in his comments at the book release, actions have consequences. He was speaking in the context of Pakistan and its decades of support for terrorism, especially in Jammu and Kashmir. Yet ultimately, that principle holds true for all nations. India must be clear-eyed in its approach to Pakistan and China and have realistic expectations and red lines. But it must be careful to not spurn opportunities to shift the momentum in ties just because such efforts have failed in the past. Even if Mr Modi does not travel to Islamabad for the SCO summit, it would be prudent for India to depute someone senior enough to represent him to try and understand how far Pakistan is willing to step forward for any resumption of talks. That is also important so that India does not appear to be sabotaging its role in the SCO because of its bilateral tensions with Pakistan. New Delhi must likewise note how a stream of European leaders and American officials has been visiting China despite their deep apprehensions about Beijing. India's neighbourhood challenges might be special, but it must not end up isolated either.

Freedom of navigation and overflight above South China Sea

India and Singapore have called for peaceful resolution of disputes in the South China Sea, emphasising the importance of maintaining peace, security, and 'freedom of navigation' in and overflight above the South China Sea in accordance with international law, UNCLOS.

The joint statement was issued during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to Singapore.

According to the India-Singapore Joint Statement, "Underlining the link between prosperity and security, the leaders reaffirmed the importance of maintaining and promoting peace, security, stability, safety and freedom of navigation in and overflight above the South China Sea, while pursuing the peaceful resolution of disputes in accordance with international law, particularly the 1982 United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS), without resorting to the threat or use of force."

"Both sides also called on all parties to resolve disputes through peaceful means without threat or use of force and exercise self-restraint in the conduct of actions that could escalate tensions in the region," the statement added.

Further, PM Modi and his Singaporean counterpart PM Lawrence Wong emphasised the legal framework set out by the UNCLOS within which all activities in the oceans and seas must be carried out, and that UNCLOS is the basis for determining maritime entitlements, sovereign rights, jurisdiction and legitimate interests over maritime zones.

Both leaders expressed hope for the early conclusion of a substantive and effective



Code of Conduct in the South China Sea (COC) in accordance with international law, especially UNCLOS, that does not prejudice the legitimate rights and interests of all nations, including those not party to these negotiations. During their meeting, they also condemned terrorism as the most

pressing threat to global peace and stability, reaffirming their commitment to combat it in all its forms and manifestations. They also emphasised that there can be no justification for acts of terror.

Recognising that terrorism continues to remain the single most significant threat to

peace and stability, the Prime Ministers of both countries reiterated their strong commitment to combating terrorism in all its forms. Notably, PM Modi paid an official visit to Singapore on September 4-5, 2024. The current visit is the fifth visit of PM Modi to Singapore.

Chinese envoy recalls Xi Jinping's Ahmedabad visit, praises India-China ties

The Chinese Ambassador to India, Xu Feihong, on Thursday remembered Chinese President Xi Jinping's visit to Gujarat's Ahmedabad and praised the relationship between India and China.

Sharing a post on X, Feihong wrote, "Ten years ago, President Xi Jinping and PM Modi walked along the Sabarmati Riverfront in Ahmedabad, beautiful park and pleasant China-India relationship."

Telegram's founder Pavel Durov says arrest "misguided"

In his first statement following his arrest in France, Telegram co-founder Pavel Durov on Friday stated that it was a "misguided approach" to hold him personally responsible for the spread of illicit content on the social media platform. The Russian-born Durov was arrested in France last week and was charged for allegedly allowing criminal activity on the messaging app.

On Friday, Durov took to his Telegram channel to post that "he is still trying to understand what happened in France." Durov said that the French authorities should have first approached his companies with their complaints instead of arresting him over the matter. The 39-year-old billionaire has been charged with crimes on Telegram included the spread of child sexual abuse material, fraud and drug sales, according to French prosecutors. "No innovator will ever build new tools if they know they can be personally held re-



sponsible for potential abuse of those tools," Durov wrote on the messaging app as reported by the New York Times. Durov said "growing pains" on Telegram, which has 950 million users, had made it easy for criminals to abuse the platform. "That's why I made it my personal goal to ensure we significantly improve things in this regard," the Telegram co-founder said as per the NYT report.

Gian Chand - A coloring man

The year was 1957 and month April. Much to the joy of my parents, I was born - a son after three daughters. In those days, the birth of a son was source of immense pride. My father who worked as an accountant in a commission agent's shop in Kurali decided to start his own business soon after my birth. When I was just two months old, the family shifted to a nearby small town of Kharar, near Chandigarh which like me too was a newly born city. At Kharar, a small accommodation comprising of a big room with brick paved floor, a kachcha store, open kitchen by the side of a kachcha courtyard was rented at Rs.11/-per month. The street had ten such houses, five on each side. All were half pucca and half kachcha and occupied by the owners. We were the only tenants and were treated differently as were considered not permanent part of that street. A well at corner of the street catered to the water needs of the residents. There was no elec-



tricity and lanterns gave us light at night. We often sat outside in darkness watching the magical twinkling stars. My younger brother was born in that house. I grew up playing in that lively street. There were few kids around but it had a lot more activity.

At the end of the street near the well, lived an issueless couple, Gian Chand and his beautiful wife Prema. Though a loving couple, my mother was always wary of the wife, suspecting her of practicing black magic to conceive a child. I still remember that whenever she used to come to our house with her hair wet, my mother would get anxious fearing she might cast an evil eye upon us.

Gian Chand, however was very gentle. His house was sparsely furnished. There were few rugs, cots for sleeping and a writing table with a small chair in a small room used by him to sketch and draw on sheets of white paper. And at times reject and crumple a sheet. As a child, I often inched around his table silently observing as he worked. I was permitted to observe as long as he was not disturbed. I was no trouble to him. One day, I saw him coloring a black and white photograph transforming it into a vibrant image. The photo which had two colors was turned into a colorful picture by a brush in his hands. I rushed back to my

house and took out a few family photographs and placed the same on his table, requesting him to fill colors in the same. He silently obliged. I felt greatly honored and tremendously moved. It meant a lot for me. I felt the photos then were full of life. I learnt the art of coloring black & White photographs by just observing what he had been doing. I always watched him quietly while using the brush and colors.

I then was only seven years old. Years passed. Seven years became seventeen and seventeen years became twenty seven. We long back moved to a better street and eventually, to a spacious new house, my father had built away from the town. Life changed in too a short time. After completion of my studies, I was appointed as a Magistrate in the State and was posted in the 'City Beautiful'. When one day, I was holding the court, an old man was produced before me by the police who was accused of theft. The police sought his custody for affecting recoveries labeling him a hardcore criminal with his-

tory of thefts. After having perused the papers, when I raised my head, I saw the man with timeworn and wrinkled face. He appeared tired bearing a grim look on his face. He took me back into my memory lane. I was back in my childhood crawling around his small table used by him to sketch and draw. The evenings in his room, sketching and coloring table which remained frozen in my memory started melting. He was the man who brought colors in my family album. I could not believe what the police said about him. I did not believe them either. Refused his custody to them. The coloring man was not knowing why was he not handed over to police. Even I was also not knowing if I rightly refused his custody. But for a short while this man besides making me revisit those golden nurturing moments of my childhood also made me realize that each & every action of ours howsoever tiny it is, generates some results. These results affect and influence the course of our future life.

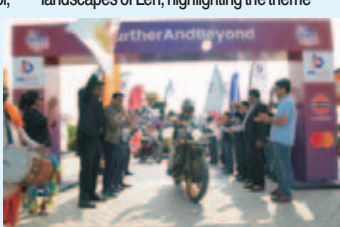
