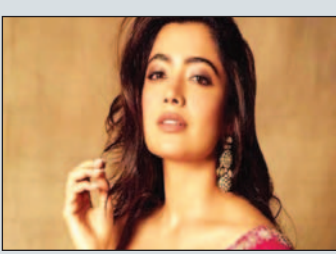

Country's progress is impossible without cybersecurity: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI: Terming cybersecurity an integral part of national security, Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said that the country's progress is not possible without ensuring cybersecurity. Addressing at the 1st Foundation Day celebration of the Indian Cyber-crime Coordination Centre (I4C), the Union Home Minister in Delhi said that cybercrime has no boundary, hence all stakeholders should come together to deal with this menace. "Without cybersecurity, the development of the nation is impossible at this point. Technology is a blessing to humanity. Technology is being used to a great extent to boost the economy... but at the same time, we are also seeing many threats because of technology..."

India, Philippines call for further strengthening of ties

NEW DELHI: India and the Philippines held the bilateral Policy Consultation Talks and Strategic Dialogue in New Delhi, during which both sides called for further strengthening of ties as they celebrate 75 years of diplomatic relationship. The talks on Monday were co-chaired by Jaideep Mazumder, Secretary East in the MEA, and Theresa P. Lazaro, Undersecretary for Bilateral Relations and ASEAN Affairs at the Department of Foreign Affairs, Philippines. Atishi directs PWD to not carry out demolition at Madras Camp

NEW DELHI: Delhi PWD minister Atishi on Tuesday directed the department against carrying out any demolition in southeast Delhi's Madras Camp slum cluster and threatened to take action if it was done. The Public Works Department (PWD) pasted eviction notices in the Old Barapullah Bridge area last week, asking the locals to vacate their homes within five days. The residents, however, have refused to leave unless they are given an alternative site.

The Bharatiya Janata Party on Tuesday released its second list of 21 candidates for the upcoming Haryana Assembly elections. With this, the party has now declared the names of 88 candidates for the 90-member assembly, with Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini contesting from Ladwa constituency following its first list of 67 candidates released on September 4.

According to the second list of the BJP, the party has fielded Captain Yogesh Bairagi against Congress candidate Vinesh Poghat from the Juliana Assembly seat.

The party has decided to field Pawan Saini from Naraingarh, Jai Bhagwan Sharma from Pehowa, Satpal Jamba from Pundri, Yogendra Rana from Asansandh, Devender Kaushik from Ganaur, Krishna Gahlawat from Rai, Pradeep Sangwan Baroda, Captain Yogesh Bairagi from Juliana, Krishna Kumar Bedi from Narwana (SC).

The list also includes the names of Sardar Baldev Singh from Dabwali, Amir Chand Mehta from Ellenabad, Manish Grover from Rohtak, Om Prakash Yadav from Narnaul, Krishna Kumar from Bawal (SC), Bimla Chaudhary from Pataudi (SC), Sanjay Singh from Nuh, Naseem Ahmad from Feroze-

AAP announces nine more candidates

NEW DELHI: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) released the second list of nine candidates on Tuesday for the 90-member Haryana assembly elections on October 5. Uttarakhand landslide: Death toll rises to 5

Bodies of four more persons, including three women, were recovered on Tuesday from the debris of a landslide that trapped pilgrims on the Kedarnath Dham Yatra route in Rudrapur district of Uttarakhand, taking the death toll in last evening's incident to five, officials said.

The pilgrims killed in the incident are mostly from Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat. One of the victims is also from Nepal.

An official said the death toll has risen to five while three others were injured.

Those killed are: Gopal, son of Bhaktram; Durgabai Khapari, wife of Sanghan Lal; Bharat Bhai, Nirajal son of Nirajal Patel; and Samanbai, wife

of Shalak Ram. They are all aged 50. A 70-year-old woman, Rajendra Mandal, from village Vaidehi, District Dhanuwa, Nepal, was also among the deceased.

Additional District Magistrate of Rudrapur Shyam Singh Rana said around 7.30 pm on Monday information was received that some pilgrims coming from Gaurikund to Sonprayag were trapped under the debris after landslide area towards Gaurikund, about 1 km from Sonprayag, under Kotwali Sonprayag area.

On receiving the information, a joint rescue operation was carried out by the police, administration, SDRF, NDRF, and DDRF.

During the operation, three individuals were rescued in injured condition late at night.

Manipur: Curfew imposed in parts of Imphal

In view of the recent situation pertaining to the law and order in the capital of Manipur, the District Magistrates of Imphal West and Imphal East have imposed curfew in both districts starting from 11:00 am Tuesday, September 10.

In two separate orders released on Monday, the DMs from Imphal East and Imphal West stated that they had lifted the previous order of curfew relaxation from 5 am to 10 pm and imposed a total curfew in both districts



from immediate effect until further notice.

Centre appoints six new ASGs for Supreme Court

The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved the proposal for the appointment of six senior advocates as Additional Solicitor General (ASG) in the Supreme Court of India.

Senior Advocates S. Dwarakanath, Ms. Archana Pathak Dave, Satya Darshi Sanjay, Brijender Chahar, Raghavendra P. Shankar, and Rajkumar Bhaskar Thakare (Raja Thakare) have been appointed as Additional Solicitor General (ASG) for the Apex Court.

According to the notification, these appointments have been made for a period of three years with effect from the date of assumption of charge of the office.

These senior advocates with a distinguished career are involved in various high-profile cases in the Supreme Court.

Their expertise spans a range of legal areas, including constitutional law, Commercial Laws and corporate law.

These appointments are made by the Union Government to strengthen the legal team representing the government's interests in the Supreme Court.

Rahul Gandhi trying to set dangerous narrative, his remarks about Sikhs sinister: Puri

The BJP came down heavily on Rahul Gandhi over his remarks in the US about the Sikh community, saying the Congress leader is trying to create a "dangerous narrative" by speaking on "sensitive issues" abroad.

Union minister Hardeep Singh Puri told a press conference at the BJP headquarters here that Gandhi's remarks were "sinister" in nature as he tried to spread falsehood among the members of the Sikh community living abroad to "eke out a living" and do not have much connection with India.

"I condemn in the strongest terms the statement he has made about Sikhs not being able to wear turbans and kadas," the BJP leader from the Sikh community said.

Referring to the 1984 anti-Sikh riots that happened during the Congress's rule, Puri said, "If there has been one time in our history when as a community we have felt anxiety, a sense of insecurity and existential threat, it has been the times when Rahul Gandhi's fam-



ily has been in the seats of power."

"In 1984, a pogrom was carried out against Sikh community. As many as 3,000 innocent people were killed. People were dragged out of their homes, tyres were put around them and burnt alive," he said.

Addressing a gathering of several hundred Indian Americans in Herndon, a Virginia suburb of Washington DC, on Monday, Gandhi accused the RSS of considering some religions, languages and communities of being inferior to others and said the fight in India is about this and not about politics.

Gold rallies Rs 600 to Rs 74,100

Gold prices rallied by Rs 600 to Rs 74,100 per 10 grams in the national capital on Tuesday on the back of fresh buying from jewellers.

In the previous session, the precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had closed at Rs 73,500 per 10 grams on Monday.

Silver prices, too, jumped Rs 700 to Rs 84,500 per kilogram from Rs 83,800 per kg in the previous close, according to the All India Sarafa Association.

Meanwhile, in a series of highly successful joint operations, the Indian Army, Assam Rifles, and other security forces conducted relentless search and recovery efforts across various districts of Manipur, resulting in the recovery of substantial quantities of arms and ammunition, according to an official release.

Kolkata : Doctors continue protest over rape-murder case

Doctors at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital on Tuesday continued their protest over the RG Kar rape and murder incident.

On Monday, the Supreme Court reminded that no action should be taken against doctors once they return to work by September 10. The court noted that if they fail to do so, the court will not be able to restrain the state government, and further absence from work might lead to disciplinary action against them.

Doctor Aniket Mandal, President RDA, RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, said that doctors will not resume work until their demands are

accepted.

"We also want normalcy, but our demand is legitimate, so the state should accept this demand and if it is accepted, then only we will resume work. Our demand is the arrest of all culprits, a disciplinary action committee formed by the health ministry, and suspension of Sandip Ghosh," Mandal told a news agency.

The protesting doctors are seeking feedback from the CBI regarding the motive behind the RG Kar rape and murder incident, disciplinary action against Sandip Ghosh, resignation of Kolkata police commissioner Vineet Goyal, and assurance about the safety and security of doctors and health staff in West Bengal and across India, among other things.

Priyanka Gandhi slams BJP for playing 'double game' with youth

Congress general secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra on Tuesday slammed the BJP over the teachers recruitment case, alleging that it was playing a "double game" with the youth from both reserved and unreserved categories and harming them socially, economically and mentally.

Her remarks come a day after the Supreme Court stayed the Allahabad High Court order asking the Uttar Pradesh government to prepare a fresh selection list for the appointment of 69,000 assistant teachers in the state.

The top court also stayed the High



Court verdict setting aside the selection lists of the assistant teachers issued by the state authorities in June 2020 and January 2022, which included 6,800 candidates.

"The anti-youth and anti-social justice attitude adopted by the BJP in the matter of recruitment of 69,000 teachers in UP is shocking. By playing a double game, the youth from both reserved and unreserved categories are being harmed socially, economically and mentally," she said in a post in Hindi on X.

"First, the reservation scam in the recruitment process took away the rights of hundreds of Dalit and backward candidates. And even now the BJP's intention is to delay and misdi-

rect social justice. This injustice must stop," she said.

While putting on hold the high court's verdict, a bench comprising Chief Justice D Y Chandrachud and Justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra also issued notices to the state government and others, including the secretary of the UP Basic Education Board, on a plea filed by Ravi Kumar Saxena and 51 others.

The top court said it will accord a final hearing in the matter and asked the counsel for the parties involved to file short written notes not exceeding seven pages.

The bench said it will fix the plea for hearing in the week commencing September 23.

Hry Police sets National benchmark in Cybercrime Control, honored for cyber helpline management

Haryana Police has set a new benchmark in cybercrime control, representing the nation with its exceptional performance. Union Home Minister Amit Shah honoured Haryana's Director General of Police (DGP) Shatrueet Kapur for the outstanding and efficient management of Cyber Helpline 1930 at a ceremony held at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Cyber, Mamta Singh, was also present during the event. This recognition highlights Haryana Police's leadership in combating cybercrime across the country, solidifying its reputation for excellence in this field. DGP Kapur extended his congratulations to the entire Cyber Helpline 1930 team, urging them to continue their dedicated efforts in the fight against cybercrime.

The event, which marked the first anniversary of the Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) and the launch of several initiatives to prevent cybercrime, was attended by senior officers from various states. Haryana Police received the award based on three key parameters: effective management of Cyber Helpline 1930, swift intervention in cybercrimes against women and children, and significant contributions to the I4C's cybercrime control modules. The Ministry of Home Affairs lauded Haryana Police's efforts in these areas. DGP Shatrueet Kapur noted that in the digital age, cybercrime has emerged as a major challenge across the country. Haryana Police prioritized this issue by enhancing its cybercrime control systems. The number of personnel on the Cyber Helpline was increased by 3 to 4 times, and strategies

were developed to counter cybercriminals' methods. Collaborations with banks and the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) were established to curb cyber fraud. Additionally, telecom companies were involved in efforts to block fraudulent SIM cards. Awareness campaigns were launched across social media, print, and electronic media to educate the public about cybercrime tactics. The results of these efforts have been significant. The rate of blocked cyber fraud funds increased from 8% in September 2023 to 36% by August 2024—the highest in the country. Moreover, if a complaint is filed within six hours of the fraud, up to 70% of the defrauded amount can be blocked, a rate unmatched across the nation. Haryana Police, which ranked 25th in terms of blocking cyber fraud amounts in September 2023, now holds the top position in the country.

Four buffaloes, calf killed by lightning in village Chhalore

Dhaliwal meets Ravneet Bittu, urges to link Ajnala-Ballaharwal to rail network

Punjab NRI Minister S. Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal today called upon Union Minister of State for Railways Mr. Ravneet Singh Bittu to raised the issue of lack of rail connectivity in the Ajnala-Ballaharwal border area. He urged to consider integrating this region with the broader Indian railway network for the greater public benefit.

S. Dhaliwal also advocated for renaming the Ramdas/RDS railway station after Baba Budha Sahib Ji, the first revered Head Priest of Golden Temple, Amritsar. He urged the Union Minister to reconstruct elevated permanent platform at the Ramdas/RDS railway station in Amritsar district, with essential amenities such as potable water, passenger shelters, lights and fans etc.

The NRIs Minister also sought an increase in train frequency at this station from 4 pairs to at least 6 pairs to address the unmet public demand of Amritsar district, besides extending trains currently terminating at Verka to Amritsar or beyond. In his demand



letter to the Union Minister, S. Dhaliwal stressed that the Ramdas/RDS railway station predates the partition of India and Pakistan. And, this station currently lacks a platform and has only a single rail connectivity towards this town as well as Kartarpur Sahib Corridor i.e. Dera Baba Nanak from Amritsar and this railway station. Regarding Ajnala connectivity, S. Dhaliwal said that this border area is underdeveloped due to its isolated location and poor road infrastructure. He stressed that local residents

rely heavily on Amritsar city for daily necessities and official matters, facing significant hardships due to limited transportation options. The NRIs Minister said that train service is available between Amritsar to Dera Baba Nanak. Thus, for facilitating the public of Ajnala area, the train service should be extended via Balharwal (the then major trading hub connected by rail before the Indo-Pak partition) to benefit the Ajnala area residents. Highlighting Amritsar's significance as a major urban center catering to

medical, employment and educational needs, S. Dhaliwal asserted that enhanced rail connectivity would serve a broad spectrum of the population, including patients, industrial workers, students and the general public. "The proposed rail link will not only benefit local residents but also boost religious tourism," said S. Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal, noting area's religious importance, citing the Joti-Jot place of Baba Budha Sahib Ji and the historical Gurdwara Baba Gamchuk Ji in Balharwal.

Advanced arrangments in place to manage paddy straw ahead of harvesting, says Khudian

Ahead of the paddy harvesting season, the Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department has made advanced arrangements to further curtail paddy straw burning incidents in the state. The department has proactively issued 6,377 sanction letters for 11,052 Crop Residue Management (CRM) machines so far to help the farmers for managing paddy straw effectively.

Disclosing this here today in a press communiqué, Punjab Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister S. Gurmeet Singh Khudian said that 5,534 CRM machines have already been acquired so far by farmers to efficiently manage the paddy straw. Of these, 4,640 machines were purchased by



individual farmers, 745 by registered farmer groups, 119 by cooperative societies and 30 by farmer producer organisations.

He further informed that the Super Seeder machine leads the pack among CRM machines, with 4,945 sanction letters issued for this equipment. Additionally, 1,164 sanction letters have been granted for the Zero Till Drill,

637 for the Hydraulic Reversible MB Plough, 630 for the Straw Rake, 607 for the Bailing Machine and 591 for the Paddy Straw Chopper.

Chief Minister S. Bhagwant Singh Mann-led Punjab Government devised a Rs 500 crore action plan to equip farmers with machinery and implement strategies to curb stubble burning in the state, said the Agriculture Minister while adding that the Agriculture department has received 21,830 applications from farmers, cooperative societies and panchayats seeking subsidies for different crop residue management (CRM) machinery during the Kharif season 2024-25. S. Gurmeet Singh Khudian also mentioned that 163 Customer Hiring Centres (CHCs) have been established across the state so far to facilitate small.

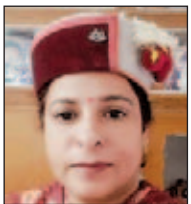

Mohali admn to conduct security audit of health facilities

Taking preventive measures as per the directions of the Punjab Health and Family Welfare Minister Dr Balbir Singh working on the guidelines issued by the Supreme Court of India to safeguard the interests of healthcare professionals and paramedic staff during duty hours, the district administration in Mohali has taken the lead in the formation of a District Health Board led by the Deputy Commissioner as Chairperson while SSP, Civil Surgeon, Principal/ Medical Superintendent, Nursing Sister as representative of paramedic staff, District President of IMA and District Attorney.

Briefing the media after conducting the maiden meeting of the District Health Board along with SSP Deepak Pareek, the Deputy Commissioner Mrs Aashika Jain said that a security audit has been ordered at the District Hospital, Sub Division Hospital, Community Health Centres and Primary Health Centres that work as 24x7 health facility. The safety audit will be



done by the Hospital Security and Violence Prevention Committee headed by a Senior Medical Officer, being formed at the local level, added the Deputy Commissioner Mrs Jain. Sub Divisional Magistrates have been asked to visit all these health facilities personally to complete the security audit by the next 10 days. Similarly, all the CCTVs already installed at these health facilities would be ensured to be functional and the dark corners would be taken care of well by arranging additional lights. Apart from that it has been decided that a single pass would be issued to the attendants of the IPD patients in their health facilities with heavy footfall, only one person

would be allowed to enter the IPD area and the remaining attendants can wait outside the IPD area as preventive measures.

Abiding by the instructions of The Punjab Protection of Medicare Service Persons and Medicare Service Institutions (Prevention of Violence and Damage to Property) Act, 2008, a Display Board both in English and Punjabi language of the Act to be installed in all health facilities displaying the Contact numbers of the nearest Police Stations, she directed the Civil Surgeon. She further said that provision for the safe movement of doctors/nurses within different areas of the hospital during night duties would be

made besides routine Security patrolling in all the hospitals with heavy footfall during night time. In case of emergency, Health care staff should contact or Dial 112' helpline. Photo ID cards are to be issued to all the staff members of the Hospitals to rule out the movement of any suspicious persons. Each staff should mandatorily wear an ID card during working hours. The District Health Board will meet monthly, said DC Jain. SSP Deepak Pareek said that the district police had already checked on the private health facilities in the previous days and issued the necessary guidelines for the safety of Doctors and other paramedic staff.

The sloths

A sedentary lifestyle is a feature of modern living. So it is not surprising that a national survey — the first of its kind — has found that over 20 crore Indians are physically inactive. The study conducted jointly by Dalberg Advisors and Sports and Society Accelerator, a think tank and a non-profit organisation, respectively, revealed other problematic trends as well: 48% of older adults believe that they are too old to engage in physical activity like playing while 45% are of the opinion that the pursuit of sports is not safe for girls. Several misconceptions discourage women from participating in physical activities. Physical exertion is considered detrimental to menstruating women; bodily injuries suffered in the course of exercising may dent their marriage prospects, or so goes the regressive line of thinking. Such misconceptions are responsible for the wide gender gap in physical engagements: the study found abstention from physical activity is most acute among urban citizens, especially women. This is unsurprising given that 75% of Indian women's active time is spent in doing a myriad household chores, leaving them with little time for exercise. The lack of open spaces, such as parks and fields, in urban settings is another factor that can be attributed to the sedentary lives of men and women. Little wonder then that the level of physical inactivity in cities, the study found, was twice that of the rural areas. Global data are consistent with these revelations. A recent Lancet study stated that about one-third of the human population did not meet the World Health Organization's recommended levels of activity: India ranked 12th among 195 countries with the highest prevalence of physical inactivity. Socio-cultural factors can also serve as impediments to a healthy lifestyle. One in five Indian parents, for instance, believes that children will not achieve good grades if they indulge in sports.

The deleterious consequences of immobility are well known. A physically inactive population is more vulnerable to serious physiological as well as mental health afflictions. Fitness also has an economic incentive. A physically active population can boost India's GDP by over Rs 15 trillion annually by 2047. The government must come up with policy interventions to encourage citizens to become active. The provision of open spaces and public — subsidised — gymnasiums for adults and a sport-friendly curriculum for children can be looked into. An annual yoga day is hardly enough to whip Indian couch potatoes into shape.

India-Central Asia air connectivity on upswing

With more Indians opting to travel to the Central Asian countries for tourism, newer flights are being introduced between India and Uzbekistan and India and Kazakhstan. Similarly, several tourists from the Central Asian countries are coming to India to explore.

IndiGo, India's largest airline, has doubled its flights from Delhi to Almaty and Tbilisi starting August 16, 2024, and to Tashkent starting August 17, 2024. The airline will shift to daily flights on these routes, an increase from the previous schedule of four weekly flights to Tashkent and three weekly flights to Almaty.

There is also a plan to increase flights to Kyrgyzstan.

This capacity expansion in Central Asia aligns with the region's growing popularity among Indian travellers. IndiGo had initially launched flights to Tashkent, Almaty, and Tbilisi in 2023 as part of its global growth strategy.

Vinay Malhotra, IndiGo's Head of Global Sales, stated, "These additional flights are in response to rising demand for outbound leisure travel. With this expansion, IndiGo now offers daily flights to all four of our Central Asian destinations: Tashkent, Almaty, Tbilisi, and Baku."

Social media platforms like Instagram and YouTube are flooded with posts from Indians exploring Silk Road countries like Azerbaijan, Uzbekistan, and Kazakhstan.

Prior to the pandemic, these destinations mainly appealed to more selective Indian travelers. However, thanks to improved direct flight options, easy and quick visa processes, and more budget-friendly prices compared to traditional tourist hotspots, these countries are now attracting a large number of cost-conscious Indian tourists.



In a significant move to boost tourism and strengthen cultural connections, Uzbekistan Airways will begin direct flights between Tashkent and Goa starting October 27, 2024. The route will operate twice a week, using the modern Airbus A320 Neo to connect Tashkent with Goa's Manohar International Airport (Mopa). This new air link is expected to create fresh opportunities for tourism and foster cultural exchange between Uzbekistan and India, especially with the scenic state of Goa.

The launch of this route follows the concerted efforts of key players, including the Indian and Uzbek embassies, as well as tour operators. The Goa Department of Tourism played a pivotal role in these discussions, reflecting its dedication to expanding the state's global outreach. Goa's participation in the upcoming Tashkent International Tourism

Fair (TITF) will further showcase the state's potential as a leading tourist destination. Tourism Minister Rohan A Khaunte celebrated the launch, calling it a "milestone" for Goa. He noted, "This new connection will not only enhance tourism but also deepen our cultural ties with Uzbekistan. We are dedicated to making Goa a more accessible destination for global travellers."

Suneel Anchipaka, Director of Tourism and Managing Director of Goa Tourism Development Corporation (GTDC), highlighted the broader significance of this development. "Uzbekistan Airways' decision to start flights to Goa signals growing international interest in our state as a premier tourist spot," he said. The improved connectivity is expected to enhance the experience for visitors from Uzbekistan and help position Goa as a year-round destination.

Uzbekistan Airways has launched direct flights between Mumbai and Tashkent, operating twice a week, enhancing air connectivity between India and Uzbekistan. As the national airline of Uzbekistan, Uzbekistan Airways JSC now provides Mumbai travelers with the convenience of bi-weekly direct flights to Tashkent, the capital of Uzbekistan. The airline has maintained a strong presence in India, offering regular services to New Delhi for over 20 years. Currently, it operates daily flights from New Delhi to Tashkent, with connections to destinations in Europe, the USA, the Middle East, and Central Asia.

IndiGo, a private low-cost airline based in Gurgaon, India, increased the frequency of its passenger flights on the Delhi-Tashkent-Delhi route from August 17, 2024. The airline will expand from four weekly flights to daily service, using Airbus 320 aircraft.

IndiGo began operating regular flights to Uzbekistan on September 22, 2023, initially offering four flights per week on this route.

The shift to daily flights will enhance connectivity between Delhi and Tashkent, offering more options for passengers. This change is expected to benefit both business and leisure travelers by providing greater flexibility in their travel plans.

Uzbekistan is rapidly emerging as a popular destination for Indian tourists, due to its shared cultural heritage, stunning art and architecture, and strong bilateral relations. US to monitor China-Russia military drills

The White House national security spokesman John Kirby said at a press briefing on Monday local time that the United States will watch the naval and air exercises like any other drills.

He noted that China and Russia do not have a long history of working closely together militarily. "We've been watching this defence relationship grow and deepen over the last couple of years to include the - the exercise of their militaries in both the air, at sea, and even on the ground," Kirby said "We'll watch it like we watch all exercises, but look, these are two nations that don't have a long history of working well together, certainly not militarily. These are two nations that don't necessarily fully trust one another in the region or around the world," Kirby added in a press briefing. "I see no reason for us to change our own military posture or deterrent posture as a result of



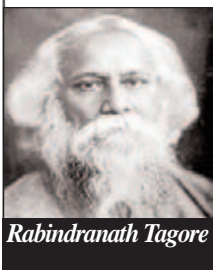

So, we'll watch it and - and monitor, but - but there's no - you know, there's no dramatic, imminent concern about it, the US National Security Communications Advisor said. Aam Aadmi Clinics achieve landmark as 2-cr people avail treatment in 2 years

Furthermore, 11.20% of visits are by Children and Adolescents (0-12 age group), while a substantial 68.86% are by Adults (13-60 age group). Chetna opens up about her character's and the upcoming journey.

Can you tell us about your character Aastha Khanna in Badall Pe Paon Hai and what drew you to this role?

Aastha is a multifaceted character. She's deeply devoted to her family and at the same time a hardworking and resourceful individual. Despite being quiet at times, she's incredibly dynamic and runs her own beauty parlor at

home successfully. She's happy and content with her life, earning a steady income from her 5-6 regular customers. When I first learned about Aastha, I was struck by how different she is from the characters I've played before which were always simple, sober, and emotional. Aastha's vibrant and unique personality, along with the Khanna family's quirks, really intrigued me.

In the show, Baani is ambitious and wants a better life for her and her family, but is labeled as 'selfish'. What is your take on the central theme of the show?

Baani's perspective on earning a living, as portrayed in the show, is spot on. She understands that in today's world, everything else takes a back seat if you don't have money. Without money, there's no respect, or even basic necessities like food.

I think this portrayal is very accurate because there are many people like her. I've personally seen a few individuals in my life struggling in the same way. Being a bit selfish in this context isn't wrong at all, especially if you're doing it to meet your fami-



ly's needs. Wanting to grow and improve your life is important and having good sources of income is even better.

Did you face any challenges in bringing Aastha to life, how did you prepare for this role?

In the beginning, I was unsure

how to approach this role, especially since Aastha is very outspoken and expressive. But over time, I adapted and grew into the role. She is a full package with complex characteristics, and I gradually discovered the depth of Aastha's character. The creative team has allowed us the freedom to add our own touches to our characters. Now, I even find myself speaking like Aastha in real life sometimes.

Your role is going to be integral in the upcoming storyline as the only person in the family opposing Baani. What is your take?

Initially, when the storyline was unfolding, Baani faced opposition from several family members like Biji, Shilpa Bhabhi, and Ginni. So, I thought Aastha would just be another character who is not supporting her. But now, with the sudden shift where the entire family is backing Baani, Aastha has become the one constantly taunting her and being a roadblock. Person-

ally, it feels a bit strange to portray this negative side because I haven't done that before. However, I wouldn't say Aastha is entirely negative, but her husband has brainwashed her and hence her reactions. As the upcoming track unfolds, I believe viewers will get to see the complexities of Aastha's character and how she impacts Baani's journey in the stock market.

Are there any behind-the-scenes stories on the set that you would like to share?

We share small moments, like eating meals together and spending time like a family does on holidays. We stand by each other in times of need. For example, Akash Bhai rescued two puppies that were abandoned, and he very kindly adopted them. We support each other and since we're all far from home, we've become like a family away from family.

How do you think the backdrop of Punjab adds to the authenticity and richness of the show's narrative? How has the experience been shooting there?

I grew up in Punjab, and I'm proud to be Punjabi. And yes, shooting in Punjab does add authenticity to the story as we are portraying a family that is based in Chandigarh.
