182 people killed, over 700 injured in Lebanon by Israeli attacks

BEIRUT : At least 182 people were killed and more than 700 others were injured in Israeli attacks across Lebanon since this morning, Al Jazeera reported, citing Lebanon's Health Ministry. It further said that children, women and paramedics were among those who were killed in the attacks, according to Al Jazeera report. Earlier, the Israeli army announced it struck about 300 targets across Lebanon today. The Israel Defence Forces (IDF) on Monday announced that it launched "widespread" waves of airstrikes against Hezbollah targets in Lebanon. It warned people to swiftly move away from homes used by the Iran-backed terror group to store weapons. The Times of Israel reported.

Sebi imposes Rs 1 cr fine on Anmol Ambani in Reliance Home Finance case

NEW DELHI: Markets regulator Sebi on Monday imposed a penalty of Rs 1 crore on Anmol Ambani, son of industrialist Anil Ambani, for his failure to exercise due diligence while approving general-purpose corporate loans in Reliance Home Finance matter. Additionally, the regulator levied a fine of Rs 15 lakh on Krishnan Gopalakrishnan, who was the Chief Risk Officer of Reliance Housing Finance. Both have been directed to pay the amount within 45 days, the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) said in its order.

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday inducted five new Cabinet ministers in the government. Aam Aadmi Party MLAs- Hardeep Singh Mundian, Barinder Kumar Goyal, Tarunpreet Singh Sond, Mahinder Bhagat and Ravjot Singh took oath as Cabinet ministers. Punjab Governor Gulab Chand Kataria administered oath to all five MLAs during a swearing-in ceremony at Raj Bhawan. This comes hours after Mann removed his Officer on Special Duty (OSD) Onkar Singh from the post. Earlier, four ministers - Chetan Singh Jouramajra (public relations, defence services and horticulture), Anmol Gagan Maan (tourism and investment promotion), Balkar Singh (local government and parliamentary affairs) and Bram Shanker Jimpa (revenue) - were dropped from the Mann Cabinet. Currently, the strength of the Mann-led Cabinet is 15, including the chief minister. There can be a maximum of 18 ministers in the Cabinet. With the induction of five ministers and dropping of four, the strength of the Cabinet is 16.

CM removes OSD Onkar Singh

CHANDIGARH: Punjab chief minister Bhagwant Mann on Monday removed his Officer on Special Duty (OSD) Onkar Singh, a day after he dropped four of his ministers, with sources saying he may axe more ministerial colleagues as part of a major cabinet reshuffle. The reasons for Singh's removal, a close friend who was with Mann for over two years, is unclear. The OSD's role in critical as the official handles the chief minister's day-to-day affairs while offering counsel on important matters. Jalandhar by-poll. The timing of this overhaul, ahead of the Haryana assembly elections on October 5 and ahead of the panchayat polls in the state, has caught many by surprise.



Atishi takes charge as eighth chief minister of Delhi

AAP leader Atishi, who took the oath of office on Saturday, took charge as the eighth chief minister of Delhi on Monday.

The Delhi Assembly's session will be held on September 26 and 27. Atishi has retained the 13 portfolios she held in the Kejriwal government, including those of education, revenue, finance, power and PWD.

"I will work for four months as the chief minister of Delhi like Bharat did by keeping Lord Ram's Khadaun on the throne. Arvind Kejriwal has set an example of dignity in politics by stepping down. The BJP left no stone unturned to tarnish his image," she said after taking charge.

Atishi sat on a different chair as used by Kejriwal. "Hope people will bring back Kejriwal in February polls, his chair will remain in the CM office till then," she said.



Saurabh Bharadwaj has eight departments under him, the highest after Atishi, including those of health, tourism, art and culture.

New entrant Mukesh Ahlawat has got the portfolio of labour, SC and ST, employment and land and building departments. Gopal Rai has been given the portfolio of development, general administration department, environment and forest - the portfolios he held in the Kejriwal government.

Storing child pornographic material an offence: SC

In a landmark judgment, the Supreme Court on Monday held that mere storage of child pornographic material is an offence under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO Act), reversing Madras High Court's "egregious" verdict which had decriminalised watching and downloading such videos.

The top court also suggested that Parliament issue an ordinance to replace the term "child pornography" with "Child Sexual Exploitative and Abuse Material".

It has also directed all courts not to use the

term "child pornography" anymore. The bench comprising Chief Justice of India D Y Chandrachud and Justice J B Pardiwala set aside a recent decision of the Madras High Court in which it declared that mere downloading and viewing child pornography, without any intention to transmit, is not an offence. The Apex Court set aside the High Court judgment and said the court had committed an "egregious error" in quashing the criminal proceedings against a 28-year-old man and restored the criminal prosecution. The Court's order came while hearing a plea filed by Just Rights for Children Alliance, a coalition of NGOs that raised concerns over the potential impact of High Court ruling on child welfare.

Laapataa Ladies' picked for India's official entry for the 97th Oscars

India has officially selected 'Laapataa Ladies' as its entry for the Best Foreign Film category at the 97th Academy Awards.

The film, directed by Kiran Rao and produced by Aamir Khan, aims to spotlight significant social issues while representing Indian cinema on the global stage.

The announcement has been confirmed by Kiran Rao's team.

'Laapataa Ladies' explores themes of gender equality and women's empowerment in rural India. The film follows the story of two brides who are inadvertently switched during a train journey in 2001.

Starring Pratibha Ranta, Sparsh



Srivastava, and Nitanshi Goel in lead roles, the film combines a poignant narrative with a strong social message.

Recently, 'Laapataa Ladies' was showcased at a special event held at the Supreme Court of India, attended by

judges, their families, and officials.

At that event, Rao expressed her gratitude for the Chief Justice's initiative in screening the film, which she noted has helped reach a wider audience.

Haryana polls: 'Congress anti-Dalit, insulted Kumari Selja' charges Amit Shah

Union Minister Amit Shah on Monday launched a scathing attack on the Congress, calling it an "anti-Dalit" party and said it "insulted" Dalit leaders like Kumari Selja and Ashok Tanwar. Shah was addressing a poll rally at Tohana for the October 5 Haryana Assembly elections.

Shah also lashed out at Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for his remarks on reservation and asserted that if there is anybody who can protect the quota, it is only Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

"The Congress party is an anti-Dalit party," alleged Shah in his address. "The Congress always insulted Dalit leaders, be it Ashok Tanwar or sister Kumari Selja. The Congress insulted everyone," he further alleged. The ruling BJP has been targeting the Congress over Dalit leader Selja staying away from the poll campaign.

Recently, Union Minister Manohar Lal Khattar had invited Selja to join the BJP amid reports that she was staying away from



the campaign for the assembly polls.

Referring to Gandhi's remarks on reservation, Shah said, "Rahul Gandhi spoke in America that there was no need for reservation after development. They (Congress) will remove reservation after development. "Our Haryana is a fully developed state. Do you want reservation or not?" Shah asked the gathering. "If there is anybody who can protest the SC and OBC reservation, it is only (Prime Minister Narendra Modi)," he further said.

Kharge cancels Haryana rallies due to poor health

If any vehicle has an amount of more than Rs 50000, gift items and gold-silver worth more than Rs 10000 and the team officials have doubts about said amount and gift items, then seize it. Amount and other items seized during checking should be deposited in treasury office. Ensure that report of checking done at checkpoints is sent to DEO's office every day. Video surveillance teams will ensure to videograph election campaigning done by candidates during Assembly Elections, so that publicity activities of election process can be included in election expenses of candidates.

Bhagwant Singh Mann said that these clinics have witnessed a significant response, with a total footfall of over 2.07 cr patients recorded till date. The Chief Minister said that over 72 lakh diagnostics tests



have been conducted free of cost. He said that these clinics have contributed in reducing the out of pocket expenditure on health care of people of State by whopping amount of Rs 1050 crore. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that the state government has also launched a special campaign to ensure the availability of all prescribed drugs at Secondary Health facilities. The Chief Minister said that CMOs/SMOs have been authorized to procure drugs at local level. Simultaneously, he said

tha centralized procurement of both drugs and supply chain are being strengthened. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that this initiative has led to an estimated total savings of approximately Rs 102.98 crore in out-of-pocket expenses for patients.

The Chief Minister also said that free X-ray and Ultrasound facilities are being provided at all the Secondary Health care facilities. He said that 512 Private X-Ray and Ultrasound Centers have been empaneled to provide services

at nominal government fixed rates, in addition to strengthening the existing government Facilities. Bhagwant Singh Mann said that a large number of patients are taking advantage of this as number of ultrasounds performed daily has risen from 650 to 1,350, while daily X-rays have increased from 3,000 to 4,200 in the state adding that till date, a total of 7.52 lakh patients (5.67 lakh availed X-Ray services and 1.85 lakh availed USG services) have utilized these services.

VB arrests absconding PUNSUP Manager in multi-crore paddy scam

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau (VB) has arrested Jagandeep Singh Dhillon, the former District Manager (DM) of PUNSUP in Ludhiana, who had been absconding in connection with a multi-crore paddy scam involving the grain markets of Ludhiana district. Dhillon surrendered before the Ludhiana court today and was subsequently arrested by the VB. He has been remanded to one-day police custody for further investigation.

A spokesperson for the state Vigilance Bureau disclosed that Dhillon was wanted in connection with a scam related to paddy transportation tenders within the Food and Civil Supplies Department, Punjab.

In this regard, a FIR No. 11 dated 16.08.2022 was registered under sections 409, 467, 420, and other relevant sections of the IPC, along with sections 7 and 8 of the Prevention of Corruption Act, at the VB Police Station, Ludhiana Range against former Minister Bharat Bhushan Ashu and other accused. He further informed

that Dhillon had previously obtained anticipatory bail from the High Court on 18.09.2023. However, the Supreme Court set aside the bail order on 16.07.2024. Since then, Dhillon had been absent from duty and was placed under suspension by his department. The VB had been making continuous efforts to apprehend him.

The spokesperson further revealed that Dhillon, as a member of the District Tender Committee, during the 2020-21 period, failed to verify the tenders of certain contractors involved in the scam.

He allegedly colluded with these contractors, facilitating the allotment of tenders in exchange for bribes. Additionally, Dhillon violated clause 12(j) of the State Custom Milling Policy by transferring food grains from the shops of commission agents Krishan Lal and Anil Jain to the rice shellers of their relatives, in contravention of established procedures. It was further revealed that Krishan Lal, one of the accused, had recovered over 2,000 jute bags from other states, which were used to transport the paddy. Dhillon, in criminal

conspiracy with co-accused Surinder Berry, the then District Manager of PUNGRAIN, allegedly used the influence of former minister Bharat Bhushan Ashu, to divert the paddy from the Anaj Mandis of villages Lalton and Dhandran in Ludhiana district to the Ludhiana Central markets instead of the Killa Raipur center. This manipulation was reportedly done to extract large bribes from rice millers.

As part of the investigation, it was found that Dhillon collected bribes ranging from Rs. 3 to Rs. 10 per paddy bag from rice millers in exchange for favorable allotments. Furthermore, he overlooked discrepancies in gate pass registrations, which listed scooter and motorcycle numbers instead of truck numbers, allowing for the misappropriation of paddy stored in the godowns in collusion with contractors.

He further informed that following continuous raids and mounting pressure from the VB, Dhillon, seeing no other alternative, surrendered to the Ludhiana court today. Further investigation into this case was under progress.

Youth leader Yadav meets officials regarding complaints of contract employees

Dispute over Hydropower Project: HP moves SC for rejection of Punjab's suit

The Himachal Pradesh government on Monday sought the dismissal of the Punjab government's suit in the Supreme Court by which it has sought to restrain the hill state from taking over the control of the Shanan Hydropower Project upon expiry of the 99-year lease agreement.

A bench of Justices Abhay S Oka and Pankaj Mithal said it will first hear on November 8 the Himachal Pradesh government's application challenging the maintainability of the suit of the Punjab government under Order 7 Rule 11 of the Civil Procedure Code (CPC). "We will have to first hear the preliminary objections raised against the suit," the bench said and adjourned the matter.

Earlier, the Punjab government moved the apex court against the Himachal Pradesh government's attempt to take control of the 110-MW Shanan



Hydropower Project from the Punjab government on the expiry of the 99-year lease that expired on March 2.

The dispute between the neighbouring states is related to the British-era Shanan Hydropower Project at Jogindernagar of Mandi district in Himachal Pradesh.

It was constructed in 1925 under the lease agreement executed between Raja Joginder Sen, the ruler of the then Mandi state, and Col BC Batty, who

represented the British government and served as the chief engineer of the undivided Punjab. Under the agreement, the water for the project was to be utilised from Uhl River, a tributary of Beas River for generating power for undivided Punjab, Lahore, and Delhi before independence.

In its application filed through advocate Sugandha Anand, the Himachal Pradesh government said the suit of the Punjab government was barred by law,

does not disclose any cause of action, and is not at all maintainable. The Himachal Pradesh government said the 1925 agreement was the basis for the construction of the project, the grant of lands and the recognition of rights between the parties.

"Since the agreement in question has a force of law as per Section 2 (f) of the 1970 Act (Himachal Pradesh Act), therefore by operation of law the suit property is vested in the state of Himachal Pradesh/Defendant No.1. "Hence, plaintiff has no cause of action to maintain the present suit against the true owner and therefore, the plaint is liable to be rejected as the same is barred by law as well as discloses no cause of action," it said.

The application said the Punjab government was never the signatory of the land lease agreement, hence the present suit seeking a prohibitory injunction is not maintainable against the true owner of the land.

New conflict between BJP and Congress govt on Kangana Ranaut's statement

A new conflict has erupted in the government on Kangana Ranaut's statement that the aid received by Himachal Pradesh from the Center is being given to Sonia Gandhi. Vikramaditya Singh said that there can be no statement more foolish than this. The budget received from the Center is spent on the basis of line of credit. He challenged Kangana to prove the

misappropriation of even one rupee. He said that this is the same MP whom the BJP high command has reprimanded for not making such statements on sensitive issues. Sukhu government has pushed the state back decades due to disasters and the Congress government. If we give disaster fund, it should go to the Chief Minister's Relief Fund, but everyone knows that it goes to the Sonia Relief Fund.

Accused arrested in illegal liquor factory case from Rajasthan

In connection with the illegal liquor factory uncovered in Amarali, Haroli, an accused has been arrested from Rajasthan. The illegal liquor manufacturing at the factory had come to light following a complaint by the Excise Department, leading to a case being registered at the Haroli police station on March 26, 2024. The main businessman behind the factory, Anil Kumar, had already been arrested earlier, but after his arrest, his accomplices went into hiding. The police had been searching for them for some time. Acting on a tip-off, a team led by Sub-Inspector Chetan Singh



traveled to Rajasthan, where another accused, identified as Krishna Kumar, was arrested and brought back to Haroli. Today, he was presented before the court and remanded into police custody for three days.

The accused, Krishna Kumar (44), is the son of

Fusa Ram and hails from village Bhagwan, post office Bhagwan, Tehsil Nohar, District Hanumangarh, Rajasthan. Investigations are ongoing to uncover how fake liquor was being produced at the factory and identify the others involved in the operation.

Govt is doing scam in the name of Green Energy Project: Bikram Thakur

Former Industry Minister and BJP MLA Bikram Thakur said in a press conference in Dharamshala that now a big scam has come to the fore in the name of Green Energy Project in the state. He said that the Chief Minister of the state Sukhwinder Singh Sukhu often makes big claims about green energy on the platforms, but there has been a big mess regarding the 32 MW Green Energy Project installed in Pekhuvela of Solan district of the state.

Giving information, he said that the commissioning of this project was done on



15 April 2024 and its budget is 220 crores. He claimed that a similar project of 35 MW is also installed in Gujarat, but its cost is 144 crores.

The company constructing this project in Gujarat will also be responsible for the repair and maintenance of this project for 10 years under O&M, whereas the O&M

period of the only project installed in Himachal is only 8 years. In such a situation, the biggest question is how the cost was so high. He said that the Pekhuvela plant had suffered a lot of damage during the rainy season.

It is working with 50 percent production. He said that according to this, if electricity is supplied at the

rate of Rs 2.90 per unit then the cost of this project cannot be recovered even in 25 years. Such projects are only for 20 or 25 years. He said that the state government took a loan of Rs 500 crore in the name of this green energy project. Four plants could have been installed in it, but the surprising thing is that only one plant was installed.

Travelers to operate on multiple routes in Bangana Subdivision, permit proposals sent to Shimla

In a meeting chaired by SDM Bangana Sonu Goyal, discussions were held regarding the operation of mini-buses or tempo travelers on small routes in the Bangana subdivision. The meeting, attended by around two dozen panchayat heads, along with Una district RTO Ashok Kumar and Una Transport RM, focused on improving transportation in areas with limited bus services.

Routes such as Bangana to Khadoul, Arlu, Bhyambi, Peepalu, Barsar to Lathiani, Kohdara, Bhakra Dam, Raipur Maidan, Androli, Sohari, Talmehra, and Baduhi were identified as potential routes to better serve the local population.

A proposal for over a dozen small routes was prepared and sent to the



Shimla Transport Department for approval. Sonu Goyal, SDM Bangana, explained that while the state government runs large buses on major routes, these cannot be operated on narrow roads or are too costly to maintain. In response to public feedback, a proposal has been submitted to the government to operate smaller vehicles on these routes.

Once the approval is received, the SDM office in Bangana will issue route permits to interested transporters, ensuring the

quick commencement of these services for the public's benefit. Goyal highlighted that some villages currently lack any form of public transportation, forcing residents to travel on foot. This issue was discussed with Kuthlaehar MLA Vivek Sharma, who agreed that many villages in the Kuthlaehar assembly constituency have roads but no public or private bus services. After discussions, the route permit proposals were sent to Shimla for approval.

Exposed electric wires pose threat for public

MORINDA: Several local leaders, including Vijay Kumar Tinku, former President of the Nagar Council and in-charge of Kharar constituency, have raised serious concerns over the negligence of Punjab State Electricity Board (PSEB) officials in addressing the issue of loose and exposed electrical wires in various parts of the city. Joining him in this appeal are councillor Rakesh Kumar Bagga, Senior Akali leader former councillor Jagpal Singh Jolly,Amritpal Singh Khattara, youth leader Parminder Singh Bittu Kang, and BJP leaders Rajesh Bhatia and Jatinder Gumber. The leaders highlighted that electrical wires installed by the PSEB to supply power to homes and businesses in different city markets are hanging dangerously low, with exposed joints in multiple areas. These loose wires pose a significant safety risk to residents, shop owners, and pedestrians. In particular, they pointed out the alarming situation in Kainour Chowk, where the joints of wires passing over a local furniture shop are completely exposed. The shop owner and others submitted a complaint to the electricity board nearly five months ago, yet no action has been taken. Local leaders warned that during the rainy season, the situation worsens, and there is a constant fear that the entire shop could become electrified, endangering lives. They also noted similar issues near Khalsa College and Arya School, where low-hanging electricity meters could lead to accidents at any time. The leaders recalled a tragic incident near Hindu Dharamshala, where both a dog and a cow were electrocuted due to exposed electrical currents from a meter.

Person killed in Dhakoli area, body thrown into drain

ZIRAKPUR: Panic spread in Dhakoli area when people living there saw a dead body in a drain this morning. They immediately called the police and the police came and sealed off the area of 200 meters which was opened after three hours after the complete investigation. The police took possession of the body and started searching for the killers. The police chief said that the search is on for the killers and the killers will be caught soon. According to the information received from the spot, a person was killed and the body was thrown into the drain in Basant Vihar Phase-3 of Dhakoli, Zirakpur at around 12:30 Midnight on Sunday. The deceased has been identified as Mukesh (45), who worked as a painter and was living in Basant Vihar for the last 15 years. A blood-stained brick and a stick were also found at the spot of murder. Around 6 am today, people walking saw the dead body and informed the police. The police who came to the spot sealed off the area of about 200 meters from the incident site. At around 9:45 in the morning, the team of the forensic department arrived and collected the samples. There are about 300 slum huts at a short distance from the place where this incident took place, but even after this big incident, no one was hurt. Blood stains were found at a short distance from the place where the body was found. It seems that after the murder, the body was thrown into the drain. Nothing is visible in the CCTV due to darkness, but a slight scuffle is seen.

Editorial

Hot topic

No sirens are blaring, nobody even looks frightened, but one should be. Last week, the world moved into uncharted territory. The ‘aspirational’ goal of never allowing the average global temperature to rise more than 1.5 degrees Celsius higher than the pre-industrial norm (+1.5°C) has been breached for a whole year — and probably forever.

‘Never’ is a long time, so the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, when it set that target in 2018, actually said that it should remain achievable until at least 2050. You may have noticed that the year is only 2024, and we are already there. Something has gone wrong, and there is a scramble to cover it up. This takes two forms. One was that it’s just a temporary effect related to the recent El Niño, a cyclical oceanic event that occasionally raises the average global temperature a bit for nine to twelve months, then subsides again. The trouble with that explanation is that the ‘anomaly’, as climate scientists are calling the unexpected warming, was as big as any El Niño event has ever been. It also began months before this El Niño got going — and it did not go away when the El Niño died out, in April. The ‘anomaly’ is still there.

So much for explaining the ‘anomaly’ away, but there’s another. What if a whole year above +1.5°C doesn’t count as ‘breaching the limit’? It doesn’t, according to the IPCC rules. Those rules say it won’t be reached until the average global temperature has been +1.5°C for 20 years — so about 10 years from now, in practice. Calculating long-term averages for global temperature made sense when the climate was stable and just jiggled around a bit from year to year, but those days are long gone. The trend in average global temperature has been relentlessly upward for decades now. To insist on mixing in cooler temperatures from 20 years ago to come up with a number that understates the reality of the present would be self-deception at best.

What would it be at worst? I wouldn’t use the phrase, ‘deliberate misrepresentation’, but something complicated and largely invisible happens at the conclusion of each Assessment Report, the scientific document on which the IPCC’s annual conferences are based. The data and conclusions in the hundreds of pages of the reports are valid and unbiased, but the ‘executive summary’ (the only part most journalists will ever read) is a political document negotiated between the scientists and the governments that are paying for the whole IPCC enterprise. The scientists are hampered by their own professional reluctance to discuss their private and tentative conclusions in public.

MAITRI maritime initiative in Indo-Pacific

India will host the inaugural symposium of the new regional maritime initiative for Training in the Indo-Pacific (MAITRI), to train Quad partners “to monitor and secure their waters, enforce their laws, and deter unlawful behaviour.”

The first MAITRI workshop will be hosted by India in 2025, said Nancy Izzo Jackson, Deputy Assistant Secretary for South and Central Asian Affairs.

“We are also proud to announce a new regional maritime initiative for training in the Indo-Pacific or MAITRI with an inaugural symposium in 2025 that will be hosted by India,” she said in a post on X, unveiling a key component of the Quad’s maritime strategy.

The MAITRI initiative was among the major outcomes of the sixth summit level meeting of the Quad group of countries, Prime Minister Narendra Modi, US President Joe Biden, Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese and Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida in Delaware.

The initiative highlights the Quad’s commitment to regional security and capacity building, particularly in the maritime domain.

It also builds on the Indo-Pacific Partnership for Maritime Domain Awareness (IPMDA), a previous initiative designed to deliver maritime domain awareness information to partners. With MAITRI, countries in the Indo-Pacific can better enforce their maritime laws and deter unlawful activities.

The Quad leaders expressed their deep concern over recent “dangerous and aggressive actions in the maritime domain,” according to the Wilmington Declaration. They condemned illicit missile launches and affirmed their collective opposition to unilateral actions that threaten peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific.



They emphasised the need for international cooperation and adherence to the rule of law, democratic values, and the peaceful settlement of disputes. Their commitment reflects the Quad’s broader strategic alignment in the region, where they have become a force for maintaining global security.

Among the key initiatives announced was the Quad-at-Sea Ship Observer Mission, scheduled to launch in 2025.

This initiative aims to improve interoperability and maritime safety, advancing cooperation among member countries.

Additionally, the Quad introduced the Indo-Pacific Logistics Network pilot project to bolster disaster response capabilities through shared airlift capacity and logistics resources.

These initiatives complement previous Quad efforts in the Indo-Pacific, including underwater cable connectivity and disaster resilience projects. The Quad has invested over USD 140 million in underwater cable development to strengthen telecommunication networks in the Pacific. Such initiatives demonstrate the Quad’s ongoing commitment to ensuring long-term peace, stability, and development in the Indo-Pacific region while helping partners manage maritime challenges effectively.

The Quad leaders also welcomed the launch of a Quad maritime legal dialogue to support efforts to uphold the rules-based maritime order in the Indo-Pacific.

Former Indian Ambassador to the United States Meera Shankar said that the devel-

opment is significant from India’s point of view as earlier Chinese incursions have been on rise in the Indian Ocean close to the Indian territory.

“They (Quad leaders) have taken the decision to expand the maritime domain awareness programs to the Indian Ocean. Hitherto it was confined to the Pacific and the South China Sea and so on, but now it is being expanded to the Indian Ocean, and India will be making its own contributions in this process,” Shankar told.

“So that’s very important from India’s point of view because we’ve had concerns that Chinese military presence has not just been limited to the East China Sea or South China Sea. Increasingly, they have been making forays into the Indian Ocean in areas very close to India, including Sri Lanka. And this is obviously something of concern to us. So we are happy that the maritime domain awareness program is being extended to the Indian Ocean,” Shankar said.

As per the Wilmington Declaration issued after the Quad Leaders’ Summit in the Indo-Pacific Partnership for Maritime Domain Awareness (IPMDA) was announced in 2022 to offer near-real-time, integrated, and cost-effective maritime domain awareness information to partners in the region.

Since then, in consultation with partners, the US have successfully scaled the program across the Indo-Pacific region—through the Pacific Islands Forum Fisheries Agency, with partners in Southeast Asia, to the Information Fusion Center-Indian Ocean Region, Gurugram.

In doing so, the Quad has helped over two dozen countries access dark vessel maritime domain awareness data, so they can better monitor the activities in their exclusive economic zones—including unlawful activity.

Tourism industry in PoGB is hindered due to poor infrastructure

The tourism industry of Pakistan-occupied Gilgit Baltistan (PoGB), which is the only source of income for the majority of residents of the Astor Valley, suffers due to severe road connectivity issues and infrastructural underdevelopment. As a result, tourists are refraining from travelling to the location, leaving the locals vulnerable to unemployment and income generation issues.

Locals of Rama Valley in PoGB are facing severe livelihood problems in the valley due to poor infrastructure. The local administration has notably taken no steps to improve the condition of the area, Pamir Times, a local news organisation from PoGB, reported.

The Rama Valley, despite having a significant local population, currently witnesses zero internet connectivity and roads that are almost obliterated.

A resident of the valley stated, “The tourists that somehow reach our village feel most frustrated because our area witnesses zero network coverage. Additionally, we have repeatedly requested



the local government for the maintenance of these roads, as they are the lifeline of our village. But no change is witnessed.”

The Pamir Times report claimed that both locals and tourists are often forced to use patches of walking tracks to reach from one place to another due to the absence of roads. 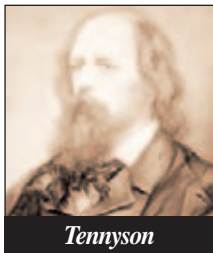

China's private tuition ban backfires; fuels underground market, rising costs

China’s decision to impose a ban on private tuition to reduce the cost of raising children, has backfired, as it not only forayed the activity into black market, but has also left kids, parents, and teachers related to the industry vulnerable to punishment as the demand for private tutors never declined.

This ban had declared private tuition outlawed on school subjects. However, parents point out that instead of achieving its goal, higher costs due to a shortage of private teachers have raised concerns over the quality of education given to the students in the underground market, which has left fear of being discovered by the authorities, the Straits Times reported.

The report cited an example of Finance Executive Zoe Pan, who used to spend 300 yuan (around USD 43) for each hour of her only son’s tuition classes earlier but now has to spend 150 yuan (around USD 22) extra post-ban.

Pan, aged 43 and currently living in Beijing, said, “Before the ban, we could rely on group classes by big tutoring brands or have access to a wider selection of tutors. But we can now rely only on word-of-mouth communication—mainly



from other parents—to find out about tutors or sign up for tuition classes that have been repackaged to avoid the authorities’ detection.”

Chinese parents are also demanding one-on-one tuition, which has been deemed unlawful, resulting in a further shortage of teachers.

The ban in July 2021 by Beijing, reportedly, as a surprise to ease parents’ child-rearing concerns and to reduce students’ workload. This move toppled the USD 120 billion industry in the country.

According to the Strait Times report, spotless educational qualifications in China are seen as a way for Chinese children to stand out in an extremely competitive job market. Amid the tense situation, the slowing economy raises further concerns among parents about the livelihood prospects of their children, which may be the only one most Chinese parents would have in their entire lifetime.

Several media reports in China noted that tuition classes were currently being conducted illegally in shady buildings. Authorities in Guangzhou city, in southern Guangdong province, China, released a report in August showing how tuition classes were still taking place illegally, as well as the punishments meted out to offenders. They warned offenders not to contravene the ban.

In an incident from January 2024, a junior high school student in central Hubei province

had gone to the local police to report on the illegal tuition classes that he was attending. He filed a complaint, claiming that his workload was too heavy.

A parent in Beijing, named Cheng, informed that tuition classes had to be conducted on the fly just after the ban had kicked in to avoid detection by the police or neighbours, Strait Times reported.

Reportedly, Cheng, who is in her 40s now, said that her daughter is in junior high now and had to attend classes at secret venues that were announced only on the day of the class to avoid detection.

“Sometimes classes would be held in a classmate’s home, or a commercial space. Once, we had to travel out to the suburbs to attend a two-hour mathematics class and come back to the city where we live. It was so late when we got back, and my daughter still had school the next day,” she said.

Cheng also claimed that as the cost of a teacher has increased in China, she remains even more tense over the quality of education imparted to her child.

P olycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS) is a hormonal condition that affects an estimated 8-13% of women of reproductive age. The hormonal imbalance can increase androgen levels, leading to the formation of small fluid-filled sacs in the ovaries and causing thickening of the outer shell of the ovaries, or raise insulin levels in the blood. All of these factors can interfere with the monthly ovulation cycle, which is generally identified by irregular or missed periods. The condition affects every woman differently; however, ovulation issues are the most common cause of infertility. In such a case, an increase in testosterone production or the failure of follicles on the ovaries to mature can prevent ovulation, making it difficult to conceive. Dr. Shilpa Singhal, IVF Specialist of Birla Fertility and IVF, Dwarka said, "PCOS is a hormonal disorder affecting one in eight women worldwide. It impacts women across all ages and can present as irregular or delayed periods, acne, increased hair growth on face or chin and increased hair loss. Underlying problem in most cases is Insulin Resistance which causes hormonal disbalance. This further impacts the maturation of the egg. As a result, egg release is either delayed or not released at all." Even when ovulation does occur, hormonal imbalances may prevent the uterine lining from thickening, which is necessary for the implantation of a mature egg. Additionally, irregular ovulation and menstruation can make it difficult to track fertility cycles. Sedentary lifestyle and obesity continue to add to the problem. Elaborating on the same, Dr. Shilpa added, "The problem is often exacerbated by lack of exercise, faulty eating habits and increased daily stress levels. Key to the solution lies in correcting lifestyle and consulting a gynecologist for further advice." Although PCOS does not directly lead to infertility, it is a common cause of infertility in women. While the condition cannot be cured, it can be effectively managed with medication and lifestyle changes. Women battling PCOS can achieve pregnancy by balancing their hormone levels or opting for IVF. "We all know about his variations, his thinking - one of the sharpest thinking fast bowlers. We saw a certain amount of meanness as well in the way he bowled to Taskin.

But the one thing that came through today was that he is a bowler without a weakness - whatever the opposition, pitch conditions and that's actually the best way to judge greatness.

Afghanistan shocks cricket world with historic series win over South Africa in UAE

SHARJAH : Afghanistan has showcased impressive

form and securing what is arguably their most significant series victory to date on Sunday. On the road to the Champions Trophy 2025, Afghanistan has captured the cricket world's attention by achieving their first-ever series win against a top-five ICC-ranked side, defeating South Africa in the UAE.

According to ICC, the Blue Tigers (Afghanistan) claimed matches one and two in convincing fashion to take the Sharjah series bragging rights, winning the matches by six wickets (and with 144 balls to spare) and 177 runs respectively, bowling out the Proteas for scores of 106 and 134. South Africa would go on to claim the third match in consolation, chasing down a target of just

170. South Africa (ranked third) are Afghanistan's biggest catch in ODIs, with their 13 bilateral ODI series previously coming against Zimbabwe (5), Ireland (4), Scotland (2), Bangladesh and The Netherlands (one each).

It was again young batter Rahmanullah Gurbaz, who stood up for Afghanistan, whose early career start has record-keepers checking their books.

The 22-year-old made 105 and 89 in matches two and three, ending the series as the most prolific batter even with a duck in the first match. The century, his seventh in ODIs, puts him level with Virat Kohli for equal third-most hundreds in the format scored before turning 23, and only bettered by Sachin Tendulkar and Quinton de Kock (eight apiece).
