Security Forces neutralise a

JAMMU: Security forces have neutralised one terrorist in an ongoing encounter on Sunday in Billawar tehsil of Kathua district in Jammu and Kashmir. A police spokesman said that in continuation to dealing with the encounter in village Kog (Mandli) in Billawar, one terrorist has been killed in the opera-

On Saturday evening, one Head Constable of J&K Police namely Bashir Ahmed, made a supreme sacrifice in killing the terrorist. He fired at the terrorist and received fatal injuries in exchange for firing, said the Spokesman. The other injured police personnel Sukhbir, Dy SP Operations, and ASI Niaz Ahmed are stable and are being treated.

Kumbh Mela: Railways plans to run 992 special trains

NEW DELHI: The Railway Ministry has been working on making elaborate ar-Kumbh Mela and has plans to run 992 special trains for the mega religious congregation to be held in Prayagraj in January, a senior railway official said. According to officials, besides running special trains, the ministry has earmarked Rs 933 crore to create and upgrade various infrastructure and amenities for passengers. Also doubling of railway tracks at a cost of Rs 3,700 crore in the Prayagraj Division and adjoining areas is being done at a fast pace for smooth movement of trains

The deceased had been identified as 30 years old Sandeep who was survived by his mother, wife and 5 year old son. Centre mulls three bills to implement 'one nation, one election' plan

NEW DELHI, SEPT 29

The government is likely to bring three bills, including two to amend the Constitution, to put in place its plan to hold simultaneous elections.

One of the proposed Constitution amendment bills, that deals with aligning the local bodies elections to that of the Lok Sabha and the Assemblies, will require an endorsement from at least 50 per cent of the states.

Moving ahead with its 'one nation, one election' plan, the government earlier this month accepted the recommendations of the high-level committee for holding simultaneous polls for the Lok Sabha, state assemblies and local bodies in a phased manner after a countrywide consensus-building exercise.

The proposed first constitutional amendment bill would deal with making provisions for holding Lok Sabha and state legislative assembly elections together. Citing recommendations of the high-level committee, sources said the proposed bill would seek to amend Article 82A by adding sub-clause (1) relating to the 'appointed date'. It will also seek to insert sub-clause (2) to Arti cle 82A relating to the end of terms of the

It also proposes to amend Article 83(2) and insert new sub-clauses (3) and (4) relating to the duration and dissolution of the Lok Sabha. It also has provisions related to the dissolution of the



legislative assemblies and amending Article 327 to insert the term "simultaneous elections". This bill will not require ratification by at least 50 per cent of the states, the recommendation said. The proposed second Constitutional amendment bill will require ratification by at least 50 per cent of the state assemblies as it will deal with matters relating to state

provisions relating to the preparation of electoral rolls by the Election Commission (EC) in consultation with State Election Commissions (SECs) for elections to local bodies. Constitutionally, the EC and SECs are separate bodies. The EC holds elec-

tions to the post of the President, the Vice President, Lok Sabha, Ra jya Sabha, state assemblies and state legislative councils while the SECs are mandated to conduct polls to local bodies such as municipalities and panchayats. The pro posed second Constitution amendment bill will also create provisions to hold simultaneous elections to municipalities and panchayats, along with elections to Lok Sabha and state legislative assemblies by inserting a new Arti-

The third bill will be an ordinary one to amend provisions in three laws dealing with Union territories having legislative assemblies -- Puducherry, Delhi and

Jammu and Kashmir -- to align the terms of these Houses with other legislative assemblies and the Lok Sabha as proposed in the first constitutional amendment bill. The statutes it proposes to amend are the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi Act-1991, the Government of Union Territories Act-1963 and the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act-2019

Punjab police busts crossborder smuggling racket

CHARANJIT ARORA AMRITSAR, SEPT 29

In a major breakthrough amidst the ongoing drive to eradicate drugs from the state, Punjab Police's Counter Intelligence (CI) Amritsar has dealt major blow to the cross-border heroin smuggling after seizing 6kg heroin, 67 live cartridges of .30 bore and two magazines, despite the accused managed to flee, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yaday here on Sunday.

Apart from recovering substantial quantity of heroin and ammunition, police teams have also recovered six mobile phones including Ap-



ple iPhone 11 Pro and one jio dongle from the bag thrown by the accused person.

DGP Gaurav Yadav said that the CI Amritsar team has received a reliable input about the involvement of Gurdaspur's Jaffarpur village-based person in smuggling of drugs/weapons and the latter has recently received a consignment of herowith the help of drones from the area of Indo-Pak border in District Batala-Gurdaspur, and he is going to further deliver the same to some other

20,632 Polling Stations Set Up for Assembly **Elections in state**

CHANDIGARH: - Haryana

Chief Electoral Officer, Sh. Pankaj Agarwal, informed that the home voting pro-cess for voters aged 85 years and above, as well as for disabled voters, will be completed today, September 30, in preparation for the Haryana Assembly elections scheduled for Oc tober 5, 2024. Voters aged above 85 years and Persons with Disabilities (PwD) had submitted applications to the concerned Returning Officer. Upon approval by the Returning Officers, home voting facilities are being provided to 9,596 voters over the age of 85 and 2,600 PwD voters. He further informed that a total of 20,632 polling stalished across the state. Among them, 144 are designated as model polling stations. Apart from this. 115 polling stations will be entirely managed by women staff, 114 by youth employees, and 87 by PwD employees. Webcasting will be conducted at all polling stations on election day. Agarwal stated that including reserved units, a total of 27,866 Electronic Voting Machines (ballot units) will be used in these election. Along with this, 24,719 control units and 26,774 VVPAT machines will be used during the election


'Nasha Mukt Himachal Abhiyan' to be launched soon to combat drug menace: CM

One of the key features is the priority purchase of natural farming products with the highest support prices for wheat and maize at Rs. 40 and Rs. 30 per kilogram respectively, the

market access for natural farming products, the government is forming 10 Farmer-Producers Associations this year. Editorial Larger fears

Sceptics may raise doubts about the brain structures of politicians but after some research there is no denying their claim to the human brain. Not that the researchers ever suspected otherwise; they were initially comparing brain structures of people in countries with a two-party system. They found that — the University College, London did it first in 2011 — people with a conservative ideology had a larger amygdala than liberals and progressives. The amygdala is a structure located deep in the brain's still mysterious recesses and is known as the brain's alarm system. It controls the responses to fear and uncertainty. The same result was found recently by researchers in the Netherlands, which has more than two parties. The researchers emphasise that this is just an association, not a decisive equation, because political ideology is formed by a complicated interrelationship of factors, not just the size of a little almond-shaped structure in the brain. But the discovery is rather delightful. Conservative-minded persons — especially politicians — may not love being told that they have a keener fight-or-flight response than others, which means flight is exceedingly tempting; at best, self-respect may impel them to dig their heels in and fight rather than flee.

What the researchers cannot say is whether the chicken came before the egg or the egg before the chicken. (This is, after all, one of the greatest questions of the human race.) Do people with a larger amygdala incline towards a conservative ideology or do conservatives develop it with growing alarm? Is it nature or nurture? It would not be surprising if they developed it, because conservatives are not fond of uncertainties and tend to resist change. And as change is inevitable, whether willed or not, the conservatives' alarm system can be imagined to go off constantly. The psychologist who led the research in the Netherlands did say that the findings suggest that certain political ideologies might be supported by distinct neural pathways that decide how a person may perceive threats and uncertainties. Would this not mean that the subject must have already identified something as a threat?

Elated by the new field of multiple parties where the research confirmed the earlier results of two-party investigations, the lead researcher expressed an interest to see how the investigation would fare in India with its multiple political parties and diverse socio-economic strata. The results would no doubt be exciting: liberalism, conservatism and progressive politics are not only a bit of a mish-mash here but people and politicians also tend to oscillate according to personal preference

Floods in Nepal leave heavy devastation

he devastating series of floods, landslides and inundations has pushed the death toll to 112 in Nepal so far in the last 24 hours, as per data received from the Armed Police Force (APF) and the Nepal Police on Sunday.

In addition to that, 68 people still remain missing, with 100 more sustaining injuries in the disaster.

As per APF and Nepal Police, till Sunday morning, a total of 34 people were found dead in Kavrepalanchowk, with 20 in Lalitpur, 15 in Dhading, 12 in Kathmandu, seven in Makwanpur, four in Sindhupalchowk, three in Dolakha and five each in Panchthar and Bhaktapur districts.

Additionally, two people each have been found dead in Dhankuta and Solukhumbu, one each in the Ramchhap, Mahottari and Sunsari

According to Nepal Home Minister Ramesh Lekhak, the recent rainfall had caused severe damage to the Kathmandu Valley and the Nepal Army, Armed Police Force and Nepal Police have been conducting search and rescue operations all across the Himalayan nation. "Due to the heavy rainfall all across the nation, we are



collecting information about induced damages; a meeting of the (disaster) command post also has been conveyed. A huge amount of damage to life and properties has been recorded all across the nation. The recent rainfall has also affected the Kathmandu Valley severely. The Nepal Army, Armed Police Force and Nepal Police are conducting the search and rescue operations all across the nation," Lekhak told reporters on Saturday. On Saturday, Kathmandu recorded a record-breaking rainfall in its 54 years with 323 millimetres of rainfall, recorded within 24 hours on that day. Nepal since Thursday evening had been experiencing heavy rains influenced by water vapour from the Bay of Bengal and a low-pressure system in the region, which eventually sparked a humanitarian crisis all across the nation. The National Disaster Risk Reduction Management Authority (NDRRMA) also issued a warning for 56 out of 77 districts

about possible disasters due to the rains, advising people to adopt caution.

Home to nine of the ten highest peaks in the world, Nepal has already estimated more rain than average this year, with a total of 1.8 million people getting affected by it.

The NDRRMA had also estimated that 412 thousand households would be affected by monsoon-related disas-

The monsoon season in the Himalayan nation generally begins around June 13 and usually ends around September end but now it is expected to extend till late October.

This year, the clouds from the south entered Nepal from the western region on June 10, three days ahead of the usual onset date. Last year, the weather phenomenon started on June 14, a day after the normal onset day.

The monsoon period, which delivers around 80 per cent of the country's total annual rainfall, generally lasts 105 days. But, in recent years, it has been taking more time to end.

According to data from the Meteorological Office, the country received 1,586.3 millimetres of rainfall as of Friday morning since the monsoon entered on June 10.

US applauds Taiwan's self-defence reforms to counter Chinese agression

The United States has appreciated the initiatives taken by the Taiwan administration to enhance Taiwan's self-defence through various reforms and investments and encouraged Taipei to further bolster its self-defence. Taipei Times reported. The US "strongly encourages and ap-

plauds" the initiatives taken by President William Lai's administration to enhance Taiwan's self-defence through various remanaging director of the American Institute in Taiwan's (AIT) Washington Office, said. The US "strongly encourages and applauds the Lai administration's early efforts to continue to bolster Taiwan's self-defence through reforms and resource investments," highlighting the proposal to raise Taiwan's defence budget by nearly 6 per cent next year to approximately USD 20 billion. Larson said that the US also appreciates Taiwan's Minister of National Defence. Wellington Koo's backing for significant defence reforms, which include the creation of a new organisation within the defence ministry modelled after the US Defence Innovation Unit, reported Taipei Times.

Geneva: Kashmiri activist raises concern over persecution of religious minorities in Pakistan

aved Beigh, a political activist from Jammu and Kashmir, raised concerns about the ongoing persecution of religious and ethnic minorities in Pakistan during an event at the Geneva Press Club.

In his speech, Beigh shed light on the systematic oppression and violent mistreatment of minority communities, including Hindus, Sikhs, and Christians, many of

Beigh also provided historical context to these abuses, noting that since Pakistan's inception in 1947, the country has witnessed widespread and institutionalised discrimination against its minority popula-

"These communities continue to face atrocities at the hands of religious extremist groups, and the Pakistani state remains either silent or complicit in these viola tions," Beigh stated.

The activist detailed the range of human rights violations faced by minorities in Pakistan. Hindus and Sikhs, in particular, endure forced conversions, abductions, and targeted killings. Young girls from these



communities are often forcibly married and converted to Islam, while their families face immense pressure to migrate, often seeking refuge in India.

Beigh also highlighted the desecration of Hindu temples, pointing out that thousands have been destroyed since 1947, with no accountability for those responsible.


Expressing deep concern, Beigh emphasised the dramatic decline in Pakistan's Hindu population, which has shrunk from over 15 per cent at the time of partition to less than 2 per cent today.

Surrogacy linked with higher risk of severe pregnancy results

ccording to new research, individuals who are gestational carriers (also known as "surrogates") may be more susceptible to severe complications during pregnancy and the early postpartum period, hypertension during pregnancy, and postpartum hemorrhage than those who conceive naturally or through IVF.

New research from ICES and Queen's

Those who are not otherwise able to carry a pregnancy are assisted in becoming pregnant by gestational carriers, who also give birth to their offspring. It is unclear if there is a greater chance of serious health consequences for newborns and gestational carriers, both throughout pregnancy and after deliv-



One of the first significant population-based studies comparing health outcomes for three distinct methods of conception--unassisted, in vitro fertilization (IVF), and gestational carriage--has examined connected health databases.

"The study was prompted by an increased in the use of gestational carriers worldwide and a lack of information about the impact of this reproductive modality on pregnancy outcomes, for the gestational carrier and the offspring," says lead author Dr. Maria Velez, an adjunct scientist at ICES and at the time of this study, an associate professor in the department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology at Queen's University. Velez is currently an associate professor and a clinician scientist at McGill University and the Research Institute of the McGill University Health Centre (RI-MUHC) The study, published in the journal Annals of Internal Medicine, included 863,017 singleton births at more than 20 weeks' gestation in Ontario, Canada, between 2012 and 2021. The groups included 846,124 (97.6%) who were conceived without assistance, 16,087 (1.8%)

by IVF, and 806 (0.1%) using gestational carriers. The researchers analyzed severe maternal morbidity (SMM) and severe neonatal morbidity (SNM), which combine many different health indicators for both birthing people and babies. They also assessed hypertensive disorders (such as pre-eclampsia), cesarean delivery, preterm birth, and postpartum hemorrhage.

One limitation of the study was that there was a lack of information about why gestational carriage was chosen by the intended parents, egg and sperm donor sources, the type of IVF used, and reasons why people chose to become gestational carriers. Future research could help to assess whether any of these factors would impact the health outcomes of the pregnant person or the baby.

former Chairman of Harvana Confed. Bajrang Garg, after talking to rice millers, commission agents and farmers, said that farmers are rushing to the mandis to sell their paddy, which has more than 95 thousand tonnes of paddy.



It is lying in the markets. There is a lot of anger among the farmers towards the government due to lack of government procurement of paddy. Whereas for the last four seasons, the outstanding amount of rice millers towards the government is more than Rs 100 crore. The government provides paddy to the rice millers and has made a rule to take 67.5 kg of rice in exchange of 100 kg of paddy, which is completely wrong whereas only 60 kg of rice is produced in 100 kg of paddy. The government should make a rule to take 60 kg rice from millers. Bajrang Garg said that for 30 years, only the government has been paying Rs 10 per quintal to the rice millers for milling the paddy and extracting rice, whereas the cost of milling the paddy comes to around Rs 120 per quintal. Today, labor expenses have increased without any reason. Rice millers do not even have to pay the bank interest income. IPL Teams to finalise retentions by October 31

NEW DELHI: Teams have until October 31 to finalise their player retentions ahead of the IPL 2025 auc-

According to the rules announced by the governing council on

Saturday, franchises can retain a maximum of six players using a combination of direct retentions and the right-to-match (RTM) option. This includes up to five capped players (both Indian and overseas) and no more than two uncapped Indian players, as reported bу ESPNcricinfo.

For retention purposes, any player who makes their international debut before October 31 will be classified as capped. However, if such a player is retained as an uncapped player and then

debuts internationally

before the auction, they will still be considered uncapped, with only INR 4 crore deducted from the team's auction purse. The purse for the mega auction has been increased by INR 20 crore, giving each fran-



chise a budget of INR 120 crore (approximately USD

As with the mega auction before IPL 2022, the price for retaining uncapped players remains set at INR 4 crore.

Additionally, the IPL has reinstated a rule discarded in 2021, allowing Indian players who retired from international cricket at least five years prior to the relevant season to enter the auction as uncapped play-

ers. This change enables Chennai Super Kings to retain their former captain MS Dhoni, who last played an international match at the 2019 ODI World Cup, as an uncapped player.

The IPL has decided to keep the Impact Player rule. which has been in place since the 2023 season. This rule allows teams to sub-

stitute a first-XI player with a specialist batter or bowler based on match conditions. and it has generated considerable debate about its influence on Indian cricket and the development of allrounders.

IPL implements two-year ban for players declaring unavailability after auction

NEW DELHI: In a significant move that could reshape the dynamics of the Indian Premier League (IPL), the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI) has introduced a new rule imposing a two-year ban on players who declare their unavailability after being picked in the auction.

This development has been well-received by the cricketing fraternity, with former Indian cricketer Irfan Pathan expressing his

The implementation of this rule aims to address concerns about players withdrawing from the tournament after the auction, which often leaves teams scrambling to find suitable replacements. This step is mitment of players towards the franchises that invest in them and ensure a more reliable and competitive tournament.

For the upcoming mega auction, the auction purse has been raised to INR 120 crore (approximately US\$ 14.33 million), an increase of INR 20 crore from the previous vear.

According to ESPNcricinfo, the finalized retention rules will be shared with the ten franchises soon. Notably, of the six players that franchises can retain, at least one must

Rohit said that he is close to playing 500 matches for India in international cricket and it is something that not a lot of players have accomplished. and to have such longevity, how one has fitness routine in life plays a key role. "To play for 17 years and to

play nearly. I am close to 500 games now for India internationally," Rohit said. "Five hundred games, not a lot of cricketers globally have played. To have that longev ity, there has to be something about your routine. How you manage your fitness, how you manage your mind, and how you train yourself. And how do you get ready for the game. most importantly. At the end of the day, our job is to be 100 percent ready for the game



and perform to win games. And then, if you go backwards then, in that preparation

comes fitness,"Rohit said. Rohit revealed that he retired from T20Is following the T20 WC title win in June because he just felt it was the right time to do so, as he had a trophy in his hands and younger players were also coming upfor India.

"The only reason I retired from T20Is is because I've had my time. I enjoyed playing the and did well. Having won the World Cup, this was the best time for me to decide that this now time for me to move on and then look after the other things. There are lot of good

players who are there, who can do well for India. I just felt it was the right time," said Rohit retired as a double T20 World Cup champion, winning the title back in 2007 as a

igy. In 151 T20I matches, Rohit has scored 4,231 runs at an average of 32.05 with a strike rate of over 140. He scored five centuries and 32 fifties in his career, with the best score of 121*. Rohit is also the leading run-scorer in the for-Rohit also ended the tour-


nament with a career-best performance with the bat, with 257 runs in eight games at an average of 36.71 and a strike rate of over 156. His

best score was 92 and scored three half-centuries in the competition to become the second-highest run-getter.

Reflecting on his cricketing journey, Rohit said that he started playing with kids in his society as a nine-year-old and eventually started playing it in school.

"We played in our building, in the society. There is a shortage of space in Bombay. You just have to manage with whatever you have. I started playing with all my friends, school friends at times. Building friends are with who I played for fun. I never knew it would become like this. When I was nine vears old, I started, 28-29 years have gone by with me playing cricket," he added.

The skipper admitted that the demands of the game were such that it took over his studies at times. He reflected on his struggles. mental and physical tiredness, and long travelling hours and how they all helped him become the star he is today.
