Punjab Police arrests two associates of Lawrence Bishnoi gang

CHANDIGARH: Two associates of the Lawrence Bishnoi gang were held following an exchange of fire in Jalandhar, Punjab Police said on Wednesday. Both the criminals were facing many cases, including murder and extortion, they said, adding three weapons along with cartridges have been recovered from them. "Jalandhar Commissionerate Police (@CPJalandhar) apprehends two associates of the Lawrence Bishnoi Gang in #Jalandhar after a hot chase .

Ex-Bangladesh PM Zia acquitted in graft case

DHAKA: Bangladesh High Court on Wednesday acquitted former prime minister and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia in a corruption case in which she was sentenced to seven years in jail by a lower court, according to media reports. Zia, 79, was convicted in the Zia Charitable Trust corruption case in 2018 by a Dhaka court. It also sentenced her to seven years imprisonment under the former prime minister Sheikh Hasina's Awami League government and fined her Tk 1 million. A bench of Justices AKM Asaduzzaman and Syed Enayet Hossain overturned the decision based on an appeal by Zia, the bdnews24.com news portal reported. Two others

Bomb hoax at bank in Bengaluru sends cops into tizzy

BENGALURU: The police sprang into action on Wednesday afternoon after HSBC Bank received an email claiming a bomb had been planted at its MG Road branch in the city, police sources said. Officers from the Halasuru police station immediately rushed to the location and conducted a thorough search of the premises. Later, the threat was confirmed to be a hoax.

Vaishno Devi ropeway row: Two detained in fresh protest, FIR against eight

KATRA/JAMMU: Two representatives of labourers and shopkeepers in Jammu and Kashmir's Reasi district were on Wednesday detained after fresh



protests at the Katra base camp against a proposed ropeway project along the trek route to the Vaishno Devi shrine. Bhupinder Singh and Sohan Chand were released after an hour-long detention by the police. Jammu and Kashmir Congress members, who met the divisional commissioner in support of the protesting shopkeepers, reached out to them in Katra to extend their support.

Both houses adjourned amid uproar over Adani, Manipur

Proceedings in the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha were adjourned for the day on Wednesday amid protest by the opposition over alleged Adani bribery case and Manipur violence.

As the BJP MP Arun Govil was taking part in the Question Hour at 11 AM, the lower house was adjourned following the opposition's sloganeering.

After an hour, Lok Sabha proceedings resumed again at 12 am, when the protests did not subside. Presiding Officer Dilip Saikia adjourned the house for the day.

Since the Winter Session commenced, the leaders of the opposition are adamant over the Adani' bribery issue and demanding discussion on it.

Congress MPs Manickam Tagore, Randeep Singh Surjewala and Manish Tewari moved adjournment notices in this regard before the commencement of the session today.

Meanwhile, the Bills including Bharatiya Vayuyan Vidheyak and The Officials (Regulation and Development) Amendment Bill 2024 were listed for consideration and passing in Rajya Sabha on Wednesday.

The session concludes on December 20, with several bills scheduled for discussion. Among them is the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, which will be considered after the joint committee of both Houses submits its report to the Lok Sabha by the end of the first week.



Other key proposals include the Merchant Shipping Bill, aimed at ensuring India's compliance with international maritime treaties, along with the Coastal Shipping Bill and the Indian

Ports Bill.

The session will also cover the Boilers Bill, the Rashtriya Sahkari Vishwavidyalaya Bill, and the Punjab Courts (Amendment) Bill.

Rahul demands Adani's arrest, accuses govt of protecting him

NEW DELHI: Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday said businessman Gautam Adani should be arrested after his indictment in the US and accused the government of protecting him.

Speaking to reporters outside Parliament, Gandhi, the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, said when hundreds of people are arrested on "tiny" charges in the country, why is Adani not in jail?

The reiteration by Gandhi comes hours after the Adani Group said the billionaire and his nephew Sagar Adani have not been charged with any violations of the US Foreign Corrupt Practices Act (FCPA) in the indictment filed by US authorities in a court in a bribery case.

SC slams Christian convert for misusing Dalit quota benefits

The Supreme Court on Tuesday took a strong stance against a woman, identified as a Christian by the Tamil Nadu government, for allegedly claiming to practicing Hinduism solely to secure job benefits reserved for Scheduled Castes (SC).

A Bench comprising Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice R Mahadevan ruled that converting or reconverting to a religion merely to claim reservation benefits undermines the purpose of the reservation policy, which aims to uplift socially and economically backward communities.

"If the purpose of conversion is primarily to avail reservation benefits without genuine adherence to the religion, it cannot be permitted.

Extending such benefits to individuals with ulterior motives would defeat the social objectives of reservation and amount to fraud on the Constitution," the Bench observed.

The verdict came while dismissing an appeal by C. Selvarani, who challenged a January 2023 Madras High Court ruling.



Selvarani had claimed that she belonged to the Valuvan caste of Hindu religion and sought reservation benefits for a clerk position under the SC category. However, the Tamil Nadu government, after verification, rejected her claim.

The Supreme Court upheld the findings of the State, which revealed that Selvarani was born as a Christian, and her parent's marriage was registered under the Indian Christian Marriage Act. Her baptism and regular church attendance confirmed her Christian faith. There was no evidence of her reconversion to Hinduism through any ceremony, public declaration, or association with Hindu practices. "In India, a secular country, every citizen has the right to freely practice and profess a religion.

India welcomes ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon

India on Wednesday welcomed the ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon and hoped the developments would lead to peace and stability in the wider region.

In a statement, the Ministry of External Affairs said that India has always called for dialogue and diplomacy to resolve the conflict.

"We welcome the ceasefire between Israel and Lebanon that has been announced. We have always called for de-escalation, restraint and return to the path of dialogue and diplomacy. We hope these developments will lead to peace and stability in the wider region," the statement said.

India's statement came as US



President Joe Biden announced a ceasefire deal to end 13 months of fighting between Israel with Hezbollah, the Lebanese militia supported by

Iran. In a joint statement, the US and France said the agreement would cease fighting in Lebanon and "secure Israel from the threat of Hezbollah and other terrorist organisations". US President Joe Biden told reporters that the agreement was "designed to be a permanent ceasefire". Under the terms of the ceasefire, over a span of 60 days Hezbollah will remove its fighters and weapons from the area between the Blue Line - the unofficial border between Lebanon and Israel and the Litani river, about 30km (20 miles) to the north. Hezbollah fighters will be replaced by Lebanese army forces in that area, who will ensure that infrastructure or weaponry is removed and that it cannot be rebuilt, according to a senior US official.

Justice Lalit Batra assumes office as Chairperson of HHRC

Justice Lalit Batra today assumed office as the Chairperson of the Haryana Human Rights Commission, along with two newly appointed members, Sh Kuldip Jain and Sh Deep Bhatia. Haryana government has appointed Justice Lalit Batra (Retired) Punjab and Haryana High Court as the Chairperson of the Haryana Human Rights Commission alongwith Sh Kuldip Jain, a retired District and Sessions Judge and Sh Deep Bhatia as Members. Justice Lalit Batra is a former Judge of Punjab and Haryana High Court. Sh Kuldip Jain, a retired District and Sessions Judge, and Sh Deep Bhatia, a senior advocate. Sh. Deep Bhatia has also remained a member and acting Chairperson of the Human Rights Commission.



Kailash Gahlot resigns from membership of Delhi Legislative Assembly

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) turncoat Kailash Gahlot resigned from the Delhi Legislative Assembly on Wednesday after quitting the party and joining the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP).

Gahlot submitted his resignation to Assembly Speaker Ram Niwas Goel.

In his resignation letter, he stated, "As you may be aware, I resigned as a Minister in the Delhi government (GNCTD) on November 17. On the same day, I also resigned from the primary membership of the Aam Aadmi Party. The main reason was the fact that AAP had begun to deviate from its moral and ethical values, thereby making it difficult for me to continue."

"I hereby tender my resignation from the Legislative Assembly of Delhi," he added.

Kailash Gahlot resigned as Delhi Transport Minister and left AAP on November 17, joining the BJP the following day.

On November 23, he was appointed as a member of the Delhi Assembly Election Coordination Committee by Delhi BJP Chief Virendra Sachdeva, with

approval from the party's senior leadership. Gahlot also met Union Health Minister and BJP president JP Nadda on Friday to discuss preparations for the upcoming Delhi assembly elections, expected early next year. After joining the BJP, Gahlot explained his decision to leave



AAP, citing a gradual dilution of the party's values and principles. Speaking to a news agency, he said, "It doesn't happen overnight; it takes time to understand certain things. I've said repeatedly that we are connected to some values and principles. When I saw a dilution of those values, I mustered the courage to quit. There are several others like me who haven't found the courage yet.

Adequate measures for close monitoring of the election process by appointing observers shall be taken to ensure free and fair elections.

Accused Lala Benipal had earlier orchestrated two separate attacks in SAS Nagar, including one on a F1-racer in September 2023 and other on a rival gang member in December 2023, he added. The DGP said that preliminary investigations have revealed that they were tasked to carry out a series of crimes in the tricity region. 'Himachal onsale': Jairam Thakur slams Sukhu government

Leader of Opposition Jairam Thakur launched a scathing attack on the Sukhu-led Congress government during a press conference in Shimla, accusing it of mismanagement, corruption, and inefficiency over its two-year tenure. Thakur claimed the government has pushed Himachal Pradesh 20 years back and described it as the "most incompetent administration in history."

Jairam Thakur criticized the state government for celebrating two years of governance despite what he termed as "unprecedented failures." He questioned the rationale behind the



celebrations, pointing out a lack of coordination between the government and the Congress party's state organization. He highlighted how even during the first-anniversary celebrations, Congress's top leader Priyanka Gandhi chose not to participate, signaling her disapproval.

Thakur listed the government's failures, including losing a Rajya Sabha seat despite a

majority, suffering defeats in ministers' constituencies during the Lok Sabha elections, and BJP increasing its seat share in by-elections. He also criticized the government for backtracking on its guarantees, such as free electricity, financial assistance for women, and employment for youth, alleging that the Sukhu administration has only added to unemployment by abolishing 1.5 lakh posts.

The opposition leader accused the Sukhu government of compromising state assets, highlighting the case of mortgaging the Himachal Bhavan in Delhi for a ₹64 crore loan. Thakur alleged that the Congress government failed to act when the company was willing to forgo the interest. He also condemned the government's actions in the Adani case and raised concerns about the closure of 18 state-run hotels, which he claimed was part of a ploy to sell them. Thakur further accused the government of suppressing dissent by targeting employees and the media through notices and actions.

Water leakage on Mahade village road persists for six months, residents protest

Frustrated by months of negligence, residents of Mahade village took to the streets to protest against the continuous water leakage on the main road. The issue arose six months ago when a tipper truck involved in the construction of National Highway No. 3 damaged 4-5 water pipes, including a major pipeline. Despite temporary repairs, the leakage remains unresolved, causing waterlogging and muddy conditions on the road. The problem intensified when pipelines supplying water to neighboring Chahar and Baggi



villages were also damaged. Although these were reconnected after two months, frequent supply disruptions lead Jal Shakti Department workers to make ad hoc fixes, leaving the road perpetually messy and hazardous. Complaints lodged by villagers, including one on the 1100 helpline, have gone unanswered for over three

months, fueling anger against the NH construction company and the Jal Shakti Department. The stagnant water poses safety risks, especially for schoolchildren, elderly residents, and commuters, with incidents of injuries being reported. Villagers, including Asha Devi, Pyar Chand, Desh Raj, Prakash Chand, Nirmala Devi, Simro Devi, and Jai

Devi, voiced their concerns to the media today. They demanded immediate intervention from the authorities and warned the construction company to fix the pipes within two days or face protests, including blockades of company vehicles. When approached, Anay Singh, a supervisor from the NH construction company's water wing, assured the villagers that repairs would be carried out the next day. However, residents remain skeptical, citing previous delays and lack of action. If the issue is not resolved promptly, a more significant outburst of public anger seems inevitable.

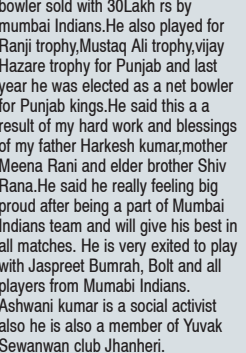
RBU organises Entrepreneurship Summit

It's a trick

Populism is the coveted mantra of Indian politics. It appears that the woman voter, in turn, is emerging as the pivot around which revolves populist politics. In Maharashtra, the Mahayuti's triumph is being attributed to its unveiling of the Mukhyamantri Majhi Ladki Bahin Yojana, a direct benefit transfer scheme for women voters. Data from a Lokniti-CSDS survey show that the Mahayuti alliance was preferred not only by a larger number of rural women but also by those who had applied for the Yojana. Jharkhand's Maiya Samman Yojana too helped Hemant Soren's party cross the finishing line with ease. Bengal, the ruling Trinamool Congress has been shouting itself hoarse, has shown the way in this matter with Lakshmir Bhandar emerging as a game-changer since its inception. The concern for women voters on the part of political parties is not altruistic. It is based on shrewd political calculations shaped by demographic transitions. The rise in the number of women voters, for instance, has been instrumental in parties being more responsive to women's needs and aspirations. Strikingly, the sums pledged as transfers — a pittance given the price rise and inflation — are seldom enough to help women make ends meet. Is this not indicative of a culture of embedded condescension? The beneficiaries — women — are expected to fall in line in exchange for economic largesse that is far from adequate. In fact, there is a case to view this kind of political populism as regressive since it is unconcerned with the meaningful emancipation — materially or otherwise — of women voters. The spike in electoral benefits targeting women voters has not been accompanied by measures to enhance women's representation in politics. Numbers tell the story. Only 13.6% of parliamentarians in the Lok Sabha are women. The rise in the number of women voters in elections has not been matched by a surge in women's candidacies in political parties. Perhaps the best example of the doublespeak is the fate of the women's reservation bill: although it has been passed in Parliament, it will have to wait for the completion of the next census as well as the delimitation exercise to come to fruition. Little wonder then that, as of April 2024, India ranked 144 in the 'Monthly ranking of women in national parliaments' published by the Inter-Parliamentary Union, a global organisation for national parliaments.

Violence in Pakistan

The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf party's protests, demanding the release of its leader Imran Khan, took a violent turn on Tuesday, resulting in the deaths of four security personnel and two PTI supporters. The PTI protestors were met with intense tear gas upon reaching Islamabad's D-Chowk following which the clash between protestors and security forces broke out. Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif condemned what he said was an "attack by protesters," while Interior Minister Mohsin Naqvi informed the deaths of at least four security personnel in the clash, Dawn reported. Meanwhile, PTI alleged that the security personnel fired live ammunition at the protestors, killing two and injuring four others. Condemning the attack on Rangers and police officers by Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf protesters in Islamabad, PM Sharif called for the immediate identification and accountability of those responsible for the incident. The Prime Minister emphasised the need to provide the highest level of medical care to the Rangers and police officers injured in the attack and stated that assaults on law enforcement personnel, masked as peaceful protests, are entirely unacceptable, ARY News reported. He said that the police and the Rangers are responsible for maintaining law and order in the city. Sharif described the group responsible for the attack as anarchistic, suggesting that their actions reflect a desire for violence rather than legitimate protest, and labelled it as extremism, ARY News reported. He stressed that Pakistan cannot tolerate any form of chaos or violence, condemning bloodshed fuelled by malicious political motives. Meanwhile, the Tehreek-e-Insaaf rally entered Islamabad today under the leader-



ship of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Chief Minister Ali Amin Gandapur marking the start of a significant 'do-or-die' protest for the release of PTI founder and the country's premier Imran Khan from prison, ARY News reported. The Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaaf on Wednesday described Pakistani forces' action against PTI protesters as a "massacre ... under the brutal, fascist military regime." Former Pakistani Prime Minister Imran Khan's party alleged that the government's security forces assaulted the peaceful protesters in Islamabad during their rally. In a post on X, the PTI said, "A massacre

has unfolded in Pakistan at the hands of security forces under the brutal, fascist military regime led by the establishment and PMLN's illegal government. The nation is drowning in blood." "Today, armed security forces launched a violent assault on peaceful PTI protesters in Islamabad, firing live rounds with the intent to kill as many people as possible. Snipers were also used in order to murder many civilians. With countless death and injured, the interior minister's threat to kill and then the declaration of "victory" over slaughtered innocents is enough evidence of the regime's inhumanity," it further said.

"The world must condemn this atrocity and the erosion of democracy and humanity in Pakistan. The international community must take a strong stand against this brutal crackdown," it added. India signs agreement to operationalise solar projects in Fiji, Comoros, Madagascar

The Ministry of External Affairs on Tuesday signed a Project Implementation Agreement with the International Solar Alliance to operationalize a solar project worth USD 2 million in Fiji, Comoros, Madagascar, and the Seychelles, according to an official release. This development comes after India committed to invest USD 2 million in new solar projects in these Indo-Pacific countries under Quad Climate Working Group initiative. Following the signing of the agreement, MEA Spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal took to social media platform X to highlight India's commitment to renewables and just energy transitions in island nations of the



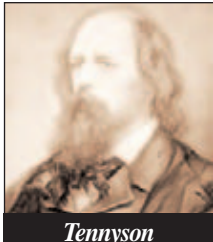

As per a study undertaken by the ISA, the countries under consideration for solar projects have energy issues related to the perishability of agriculture products, unreliable electricity supply in health centers, and irrigation purposes in remote areas where grid power supply or solar mini grids are not available yet, the release stated. health care facilities, and solar water pumping systems are under consideration, the release stated. The successful execution of these projects is expected to enhance energy access, create employment, and provide reliable and quality power supply in these Indo-Pacific countries, the release stated. WHO adopts 'Colombo Call to Action' to address growing diabetes burden

To address the growing burden of diabetes, health experts and officials adopted the 'Colombo Call to Action' to strengthen diabetes prevention and control measures in the World Health Organization (WHO) South-East Asia Region. The Call to Action underlines catalytic actions and collective commitments from member countries to accelerate efforts to unite, integrate, innovate, treat, track, and educate - the key pillars of WHO's Global Diabetes Compact which aims to reduce the risk of diabetes and ensure that those diagnosed with the disease have access to quality treatment and care. The Compact also supports the prevention of type 2 diabetes from obesity, unhealthy diet and physical inactivity, the press release noted. Every year, more than 4.82,000 diabetes-related deaths occur in the region. Diabetes and its complications such as blindness, kidney failure, heart attack, stroke, and lower limb amputation result in immense hardships and economic loss to people with diabetes, their families, health systems and national economies.



"Bridging the service gaps to ensure timely access to diabetes care can save lives. Care services need to be equitable, comprehensive, accessible, and affordable," said Saima Wazed, Regional Director, WHO South-East Asia, in her address to the two-day Regional Commemoration of World Diabetes Day 2024 under the theme 'Breaking Barriers, Bridging Gaps'. As per the press release, over 100 experts

and officials, including representatives from Ministries of Health across the WHO South-East Asia, Western Pacific and Africa Regions, as well as academic institutions, professional bodies, international experts, UN agencies, and development partners attended the event jointly organised by the Ministry of Health, Government of Sri Lanka, and WHO on November 21 and November 22 which culminated with the adoption of Colombo Call to Action. "As the Government of Sri Lanka, we are committed to fighting diabetes and other non-communicable diseases. We have already taken steps through initiatives like SEAHEARTS and in partnerships with many organizations. We know we can do more through advocacy, health promotion and continuous supply of quality medicines, and providing universal access to investigations and treatment," said Hansaka Wijemuni, Deputy Minister of Health and Media, Government of Sri Lanka, at the closing session. In a video message to the gathering, WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus said, "Over the last three decades, the

number of people living with diabetes has quadrupled, now surpassing 800 million globally. More than half of these individuals do not receive treatment. We must intensify efforts to meet global targets and ensure better prevention, diagnosis, and management of diabetes", the press release noted. The Call to Action outlines priority actions such as strengthening primary healthcare systems to scale up prevention and control of diabetes, improving access to essential medicines and diagnostics, particularly insulins, and integrating diabetes care into broader health programmes. It also emphasises the need to invest in policies and programmes to promote healthy lifestyle interventions and establish national targets for diabetes coverage to be achieved by 2030. Countries in the WHO South-East Asia Region have made significant progress in provisioning services for the management of diabetes. As of June 2024, over 60 million people have been placed on protocol-based management for diabetes and hypertension, with a target to reach 100 million by 2025. However, despite efforts challenges remain. More than 2,60,000 children and adoles-

cents with type 1 diabetes face limited access to insulin and monitoring. The incidence of type 2 diabetes is also increasing among young people in the Region. Equipping primary healthcare with standard treatment protocols, essential medicines, quality diagnostics, and skilled professionals is essential to meet the growing demand for diabetes prevention and care. The Regional Director said, "The path to overcome barriers and care gaps is long and challenging, but achievable. It is a shared responsibility of governments, healthcare providers, and communities to prevent diabetes and make healthier, longer, and more productive lives of people living with diabetes. Let us come together to ensure that no one is left behind and that equitable, affordable, and high-quality diabetes care becomes a reality for all", the press release observed. PG Mahipala, Secretary Health, Government of Sri Lanka; Guy Fones, Director of Non-Communicable Diseases, WHO Headquarters; and Alaka Singh, WHO Representative to Sri Lanka, also addressed the regional commemoration.

Gurugram- In a groundbreaking case, a 49-year-old male was successfully diagnosed and treated for a rare condition, Splenic Marginal Zone Lymphoma (SMZL), at American Oncology Institute (AOI) in Gurugram. The patient presented with fever, abdominal pain, and was clinically diagnosed as malaria. A swift and precise diagnosis by the expert team at AOI helped save his life. The patient was brought to AOI Gurugram in critical condition, with severe left-sided abdominal pain, low blood pressure and a rapid heart rate. Upon evaluation, the medical team suspected a ruptured spleen and performed an emergency laparotomy and splenectomy (surgical removal of the spleen). During the surgery, they discovered a massive hematoma and approximately 1.5 Liters of blood in the

abdominal cavity. Although the initially the spleen appeared normal, the medical team at AOI insisted on conducting further tests based on strong clinical suspicion. The results con-



firmed the diagnosis of Splenic Marginal Zone Lymphoma, a rare form of non-Hodgkin's lymphoma (NHL) that usually develops in the spleen. This type of rare

and slow growing cancer accounts for less than 1% of all cases of Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma worldwide. The patient was immediately started on targeted therapy treatment and is now recovering well.

"This case is a perfect example of precision-based medicine in action," said Dr (Brig.) A.K. Dhar, Senior Consultant Medical Oncology, AOI Gurugram. "Splenic Marginal Zone Lymphoma is extremely rare, and its spontaneous rupture is even rarer. Insisting on advanced diagnostic tests like Immunohistochemistry allowed us to pinpoint the exact diagnosis and initiate the right treatment. It underscores the importance of evidence-based medicine in complex cases."

November is World Lung Cancer Awareness Month

Lung cancers is one of the leading causes of cancer-related deaths worldwide, accounting for the highest mortality rates among both men and women. Dr Digambar Behera, Director, Pulmonary Medicine at Fortis Mohali, says both active and passive smokers are at the high-risk of acquiring lung cancer and they should get themselves screened annually. "One of the main causes of lung cancer is tobacco use which can harm the lung tissue and affect the person's ability to inhale oxygen. Tobacco smoke contains carbon monoxide, which can limit the oxygen intake in the blood, thereby decreasing its delivery to the organs. People above 50 years of age who smoke regularly should get a chest X-ray done every year. Passive smokers are also at risk. People who are exposed to high levels of radiation, arsenic, chromium, nickel, copper, asbestos also have high chances of developing lung cancer. Further, exposure to indoor and outdoor air pollution, particularly biomass fuel and kerosene, can damage the lungs. Some people also have a genetic predisposition for lung cancer." Symptoms include cough, blood in the sputum, chest pain, fever, weakness, fatigue, malaise, loss of appetite and weight loss. Lung cancer can be diagnosed through a lab test, PET/CT scan and endobronchial ultrasound (EBUS). A bronchoscopy is conducted when a biopsy is done, fine needle aspiration cytology and examination of the lung fluid also confirm the primary site of the cancer. Pathological tests helps diagnose the type of cancer and the line of treatment. Lung cancer therapy primarily comprises surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy, targeted therapy, and immunotherapy.

Real Estate and Offshore Betting Ads Dominate ASCI's Half-Yearly Complaints Report 2024-25

Chandigarh : The Advertising Standards Council of India (ASCI) has released its Half-Yearly Complaints Report 2024-25, revealing a significant presence of misleading and illegal advertisements in the real estate and offshore betting sectors. Between April and September 2024, ASCI reviewed 4016 complaints and investigated 3031 ads; 98% of these ads reviewed needed some modification. ASCI's continued vigil on digital platforms saw a total of 2830 ads being processed, representing 93% of the total ads taken up. Of the ads investigated, 2087 ads were in violation of the law. Of these, 1027 were reported to the Maharashtra Real Estate Regulatory Authority (MaharERA) under an MoU between ASCI and MahaRERA. A further 890 ads promoting illegal betting were reported to the Ministry of Information & Broadcasting (MIB), and 156 were escalated to the Ministry of Ayush in violation of the Drugs and Magic Remedies (DMR) Act; 10 ads directly promoting liquor and four other ads regarding deepakes were reported to MIB. Of the remaining cases 944 that were formally investigated, 53% of the ads were not contested by the advertiser on receipt of intimation of the complaint from ASCI. Really (34%), illegal betting (29%), healthcare (8%), personal care (7%), and food & beverage (6%) featured as the top five categories with the highest code violations. Manisha Kapoor, CEO of ASCI, remarked, "Our work in partnership with government regulators in sectors such as betting and realty is creating an impact. While there is a long way to go, such partnerships are able to create an impetus for better oversight. Greenwashing is another area where we released guidelines easier in 2024, as this will remain an area of focus for us. With constant progress in reducing our turnaround time for complaint management, ASCI's deep experience and tech-supported efforts are evolving to provide better protection to the consumers of India." For advertisers, the findings serve as a call to action to prioritize compliance and transparency. For consumers, this report underlines ASCI's role in providing a trusted mechanism to fight objectionable advertising.

Without religions, languages, culture India cannot exist: Thakur

JALANDHAR: Indian religion and languages form the foundation of Indian culture, and without them, India would cease to exist, said Thakur Dalip Singh. He emphasized that to preserve Indian culture, only religions originating in India—Sanatan Hinduism, Sikhism, Jainism, and Buddhism—should thrive, while Indian languages must remain sovereign and be used in all



government work instead of foreign languages like English. Singh explained that "religion" in this context refers to "cult," highlighting that without these four religions, India's unique cultural identity cannot survive. He warned against conversions to foreign religions like Islam and Christianity, arguing that such shifts threaten Indian culture and languages. Singh claimed Muslims historically imposed their culture and language, Urdu, on India rather than adopting Indian languages. Similarly, he said Christians, while occasionally adopting Indian languages, reject Indian cultural icons like Lord Ram, Lord Krishna, Lord Buddha, and Guru Nanak Dev Ji. He warned that conversions could lead to religious majorities altering India's identity, as seen with the partition creating Pakistan. Singh urged action to prevent further erosion of Indian culture, languages, and religions, asserting that their preservation is essential for India's survival.

New adoption regulations simplify process for prospective parents: DC

BILASPUR: Deputy Commissioner Aabid Hussain Sadiq announced the implementation of the Adoption Regulations 2022 by the Government of India, aimed at simplifying and streamlining the adoption process. Prospective adoptive parents can now apply online through the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA) website (cara.nic.in) or visit a Lokmitra Kendra or the District Child Protection Unit. Aadhaar, PAN, medical fitness certificates, and photographs are key requirements essential documents to uploading. Eligibility criteria mandate prospective parents to be physically, emotionally, and financially stable, with no criminal record or history of violating children's rights. A minimum age gap of 25 years between the child and parent is required, and additional rules apply for single and married individuals. The Deputy Commissioner highlighted a recent incident where the community faced challenges due to a lack of awareness about adoption laws. Efforts are underway to educate the public to prevent similar issues and ensure a smooth adoption process. Interested individuals can visit the CARA website or contact the District Child Protection Unit for guidance.

**'Trident prevents stubble burning from over 2000 acres of land'**

BARNALA: Each year, stubble burning releases high concentrations of particulate matter, pushing the Air Quality Index (AQI) in regions like Punjab, Haryana, and Delhi NCR to "severe" levels. These pollutants not only degrade air quality but also contribute to seasonal health crisis. As a transformative step, Trident Group has adopted the use of parali (paddy stubble) as a fuel source in its industrial boilers, preventing the burning of stubble from approximately 2000 acres of land. This practice, commonly used to clear fields post-harvest, is a primary contributor to the hazardous Air Quality Index (AQI) levels in Northern India, with cities like Delhi seeing AQI readings exceed 400 during peak season—levels deemed "severe" and dangerous for public health. Traditional stubble burning releases high concentrations of particulate matter contributing to respiratory issues, smog, and a significant rise in pollution across Punjab, Haryana, and Delhi NCR.

Skill India at crossroads: Experts call for revolutionary overhaul to secure workforce future

SADHAURA: India's Skill Development ecosystem faces a crucial moment as experts urge sweeping reforms to avert a potential crisis. The All India United Federation of Government I.T.I. Employees' Associations has called for dismantling the National Council for Vocational Education & Training (NCVET) and establishing a forward-looking regulatory body to revamp the sector. V.S. Shekhawat, National President of the Federation, has proposed the creation of a National Commission for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET), modeled after the University Grants Commission (UGC). According to Shekhawat, this body would align India's Skill Development framework with global benchmarks, ensuring its relevance in the era of Industry 4.0.

"Our Skill Development sector is on the verge of collapse," Shekhawat warned. "The current framework is archaic, unable to meet modern industry demands, and risks eroding India's global standing. Inaction will render the 'Skill India' mission a hollow dream." M.K. Agrawal, a retired Training Superintendent from Govt. I.T.I. Bhopal and a proponent of quality Skill Development in the country, echoed these concerns, stating, "The world's workforce is evolving rapidly, while India's rigid vocational systems lag behind. Without transformative action, we risk jeopardizing the aspirations of our youth and our economic strength." Er. Tajinder Singh Kamboj, National Finance Secretary of the Federation, proposed rebranding Industrial Training Institutes (ITIs) as Vocational Education Training Colleges.
