### **Punjab police nabs** drugs kingpin with **5kg heroin**

CHANDIGARH/TARN TARAN: In a major breakthrough amidst the ongoing war against drugs waged on the directions of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, Tarn Taran Police has busted a Pak backed drug trafficking cartel with the arrest of a kingpin and seized 5 kg heroin from his posses sion, said Director General of Police (DGP) Punjab Gaurav Yadav here on Wednesday. The arrested accused has been identified as Rashpal Singh, a resident of Village Bhai Ladhu, Tarn Taran. Apart from recovering heroin, police teams have also impounded his motorcycle. DGP Gaurav Yadav said that accused person was in direct contact with multiple Pakistan-based smugglers and had been receiv ing consignments of drugs from across the border.

#### India, UK looking to resume talks on proposed trade agreement in Feb

NEW DELHI: India and the UK are exploring convenient dates to resume the talks for the proposed free trade agreement in early February, according to the commerce ministry The talks for the proposed FTA began in January 2022. The 14th round of talks stalled as the two nations stepped into their general election cycles.



Wednesday announced to sit on fast unto death to support their leader Jag-jit Singh Dallewal. The farmers while sitting on fast criticized Modi led Union Government for ignoring farming community. They said that they will not eat even a single grain until their demands are met.

The protesting farmers have expressed concern over Dallewal's "deteriorating" health, saying the 70-yearold risks "multiple organ failure" be cause of the prolonged fasting.

Dallewal, who is the convener of the Samyukta Kisan Morcha (Non-Political), has been on the indefinite hunger strike at the Khanauri border point between Punjab and Haryana since November 26 last year

The farmers have been protesting over various demands including a legally guarantees minimum support price (MSP) for their crops.

Dallewal has refused any medical aid during his fasting, which has caused his health to worsen.

Farmers, under the banner of the SKM (Non-Political) and Kisan Mazdoor Morcha, have been camping at the Shambhu and Khanauri border points between Punjab and Haryana since February 13 last year, after security forces did not allow them to march to Delhi.

Farmer leader Abhimanyu Kohar, who has been associated with Dallewal for a long time, lashed out at the Union government on Wednesday for not paying a heed" to farmers' demands. "Today, Dallewal's fast-unto-death



entered day 51. The Centre is neither ready to listen to anything nor it is initiating talks nor fulfilling our demands," Kohar said.

The protesting farmers had earlier said if anything untoward happens to Dallewal, the Centre might not be able to handle what comes afterwards When asked about holding talks with the protesting farmers to end the logjam, Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan recently said the government would act in accordance with the Supreme Court's instructions.

On January 4, Punjab Cabinet Minister Gurmeet Singh Khuddian had sought Chouhan's personal intervention urging the Centre hold a dialogue with the protesting farmers at the earliest to break the impasse. On the status of Dallewal's health,

Kohar said it is "critical" because of the indefinite fast Doctors have said his body is not even accepting water and whenever he takes water, he throws up, according to Kohar

Doctors attending to Dallewal have already said his health is "deteriorating" every day. His ketone level is on a higher side and muscle mass has decreased, they have said.

The farmers earlier said Dallewal had not been eating anything since November 26 last year and was just surviving on water. The protesting farmers have now decided that a group of 111 farmers would start a fast-untodeath in solidarity with Dallewal from Wednesday.

"Farmers are emotional and they have said that they will also follow Dallewal and start an indefinite fast in a peaceful manner," said Kohar, On De cember 20 last year, the apex court put the onus on Punjab government offi-cials and doctors to decide on Dallewal's hospitalisation.


# PM Modi dedicates three frontline naval combatants to nation

This idea was expressed by Dr. Amrik Singh while interacting with the farmers after inspecting the wheat crop cultivated by farmer Sarabjit Singh in village Mehmuana using MB plow , mulcher and super seeder. 

# **Arora chairs 5th Governing Council meeting of C-PYTE**

In a path-breaking move to empower the state's young women, Punjab Government has trained as many as 265 girls for Army, CAPF and Punjab Police for the first time through Centre for Training and Employment of Punjab Youth (C-PYTE) camps across the state, informed Punjab employment generation, skill development and training minister, Mr. Aman Arora, who was chairing the 5th Governing Council meeting of the C-PYTE, here

at his office, on Wednesday. While highlighting another major decision, he said that the state would soon open a C-PYTE camp exclusively for girls aspiring to join the armed forces at village Theh Kanjla in Kapurthala district and the camp will be run en-tirely by the women staff. An

additional C-PYTE camp will be established in Pathankot district to enable the state's youth for employment into the Police, Armed



Forces and CAPF. Currently, Punjab has 14 C-PYTE camps across the state.

Aman Arora directed the concerned officials to complete the work of under-construction three new camps situated at village Asal Uttar (Tarn Taran), village Kheri (Sangrur) and Borewal (Mansa) within stipulated time.

Principal Secretary Employment Generation, Skill Development and Training Ms. Jaspreet Talwar apprised the Cabinet Minister that as many as 2,58,760 youth have been trained totally free of cost through these C-PYTE camps, of which, 1,15,649 have been employed. He said that three cases were already pending against Balraj whereas Pawan was already booked in two cases. 

# State to set up Special Task Force to combat drug abuse and organized crime: CM Sukhu

#### DINESH AGARWAL SHIMLA, JAN 15

The Himachal Pradesh Government has taken a significant decision towards combating drug abuse and dismantling organized crime networks by establishing a Special Task Force (STF) under the leadership of Additional Director General of Police or Inspector General of Police. This initiative aims to make the state drug-free and foster a healthy and civilized society. Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that drug abuse has become a global challenge requiring stringent measures. He said "The state government has enacted laws to curb this menace including provisions for confiscating the properties of offenders involved in drug trafficking." The STF will be equipped with a dedicated commando force, with personnel undergoing specialized training on anti-narcotics and organized crime in collaboration with the Narcotics Control Bureau. Half of the STF



recruited specifically for this purpose, while

the remaining staff will be drawn from the existing Police Department. The primary objectives of the STF include disrupting and dismantling drug trafficking networks, taking action against drug kingpins and organized gangs, and strengthening intelligence gathering through faster forensic protocols. The task force will conduct coordinated raids, seize illicit assets linked to the drug trade, and

implement preventive detention of habitual offenders.

Additionally, the Government aims to promote rehabilitation over punitive measures by expanding access to addiction treatment and compassionate rehabilitation programmes. "Community engagement will be enhanced through initiatives like the "Him Veer" program and "Him Dost," along with statewide awareness campaigns in schools and colleges. To ensure swift justice, the

Government plans to establish special courts for NDPS (Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances) cases and focus on fast-track investigations and prosecutions," the Chief Minister said. The STF will independently register and investigate cases through STF Police Stations or in collaboration with local police and special units at the range, district, or subdivision level. It will also monitor the activities of deaddiction centers to prevent their misuse. To strengthen its operations, the STF will operate across three zones headed by Superintendents of Police in Dharamshala, Parwanoo and Mandi, with its headquarters in Shimla. The task force will submit fortnightly progress reports to the Government, which will review its actions and strategies as needed. This comprehensive approach underscores the Government's commitment to eradicating drug abuse and creating a safer and healthier Himachal Pradesh, said the Chief Minister.

# Learn less

igher education in India is going through a sea change, not necessarily into something rich but certainly into something strange. The University Grants Commission draft regulations, 2025 aim to amend the minimum qualifications for the post of assistant professor required by the 2018 UGC regulations. According to the latter, a candidate should have completed a Master's degree in the relevant to, or concerned or allied subject with the one to be taught, and would have had to have passed the National Eligibility Test or the State Eligibility Test or received a PhD degree to be considered for the post. The 2025 draft regulations eliminate the need to study for an undergraduate and postgraduate degree in the relevant subject. All the candidate must do is pass the NET or achieve a PhD degree in that subject irrespective of Bachelor's or Master's training. That is, an assistant professor in chemistry may have studied history as a BA and MA student. Since it would be difficult to acquire a doctorate degree in a completely different discipline from the one studied earlier in depth, it can be assumed that passing the NET by answering multiple-choice questions would be adequate qualification for an assistant professor. This will certainly help the coaching industry to burgeon further. Other qualifications, publications and experience, valued in the 2018 regulations, will not matter.

This is a terrifying vision for higher education and suggests that the government is not indifferent to education but is actively engaged in lowering its standards beyond repair. The draft regulations are a major step if not to render specialisation in core disciplines irrelevant then at least to dilute utterly the levels of learning and research. The common courses glorified by the National Education Policy, 2020 may become dominant. The draft regulations openly show a resistance to serious learning and a desire to force students to stick to low standards. That is the best way to prevent independent thinking. The inner logic of the change becomes clearer when accompanied by the proposed change in the criteria for vice-chancellor appointments. Candidates need not be distinguished academics only but persons demonstrating leadership and scholarship in senior positions of industry, public administration and public policy. The suggested breakdown of the sanctity of the university space is truly ominous. The draft, though, need not be final.

# **US-India tax forum** proposes bold reforms

s India gears up for the Union Bud-get 2025-26, the US-India Tax Forum--a specialized Tax Policy Forum under the US-India Strategic Partnership Forum (USISPF)--has presented an ambitious set of recommendations aimed at bolstering the nation's global economic standing.

Comprising around 200 member companies, the Forum serves as a platform for dialogue on critical tax policy issues, connecting Government of India policymakers, global tax experts, and the business community to champion innovative and forward-thinking tax reforms.

In response to invitations from the Ministry of Finance, the Tax Forum conducted multiple consultations and presented its recommendations on three occasions. These proposals are designed to attract fresh investments, simplify tax structures, and position India as a global growth leader.

Tarun Bajaj, Chairperson of the US-India Tax Forum and former Revenue Secre-

tary, said, "The Union Budget 2025-26 comes at a critical juncture for India's economic trajectory. As global headwinds persist, it is imperative for India to prioritize reforms that foster investor confidence, simplify the tax regime, and provide targeted incentives for sectors with transformative potential."

He added, "Recommendations like rationalizing TDS structures, extending concessional tax rates for greenfield manufac-



turing, and supporting GIFT City as a global financial hub address systemic challenges while opening avenues for sustainable growth."

One of the central recommendations focuses on revolutionizing direct taxation. The Forum suggests simplifying the Tax Deduction at Source (TDS) structure to just two or three rates, reducing compliance burdens and enabling businesses to prioritize growth. To enhance India's competitiveness, it proposes aligning tax rates for foreign bank branches with domestic banks and introducing a concessional 10

per cent tax rate on dividend income for Foreign Portfolio Investors (FPIs) to attract capital inflows.

Furthermore, the Forum advocates for tax exemptions on dividends and financial transactions within GIFT City to transform it into a global financial hub.

The expansion of Safe Harbor Regulations (SHR) and a more efficient Advance Pricing Agreement (APA) process were also highlighted as critical measures for creating a predictable and transparent tax environment. Sectoral growth is another priority area. The recommendations in-

clude extending concessional tax rates for greenfield manufacturing projects beyond March 2024, targeting high-growth sectors like renewable energy, semiconductors, and electric vehicles.

To strengthen the industrial ecosystem, the Forum also proposes introducing a reduced 15 per cent tax rate for Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) firms.

In the healthcare sector, reducing tariffs on critical life-saving drugs and extending exemptions for certain medicines under Patient Assistance Programs (PAP) are emphasized to ensure equitable access to essential treatments.

Additionally, targeted incentives for renewable energy manufacturers and measures to facilitate electric vehicle adoption were recommended to drive sustainability and innovation.

The Forum also suggests overhauling indirect taxation by simplifying the customs tariff structure to a three-tier system with rates of 0 per cent, 5 per cent, and 10 per cent.

This alignment with international standards is expected to attract investments in key sectors such as electronics manufacturing. Recognizing the growing significance of digital economies, the Forum proposes introducing refund mechanisms for the Equalisation Levy (EL) in cases of revised tax liabilities and simplifying tax return forms for foreign companies without permanent establishments.

# World Uyghur Congress welcomes US sanctions on 37 companies linked to forced labour

he World Uyghur Congress welcomed the addition of 37 companies to the US Entity List under the Uyghur Forced Labor Prevention Act (UFLPA), intensifying efforts to curb the import of goods tied to forced labor in China's autonomous region

In a post on X, the World Uyghur Congress stated that this move includes major Lgy textiles, and mining, many of which are linked to the exploitation of Uyghur and other ethnic minority groups in East Turkistan. Among the newly sanctioned companies is Huafu Fashion Co, one of the world's largest textile manufacturers, alongside 25 of its subsidiaries. These com panies have been implicated in forced labour practices related to the cotton industry in China's autonomous region. The US has previously accused Chinese authorities of using forced labour in the production of goods, including apparel, solar pan els, and electronics, much of which is exported globally.

According to the Voice of America. the UFLPA, enacted in December 2021 under President Joe Biden, seeks to prevent the import of products produced with forced labor, a direct response to reports from human rights organizations and independent investigations documenting widespread abuses. In August 2022, United Nations expert Tamoya Obokata confirmed the exis-





# **Criticism vs. Reality: The True Value of Insurance**

nsurance—the industry that has safeguarded millions of citizens and many businesses, ofen faces situations that cast a shadow on its efforts. Recent media reports have once again opened a wave of criticism. This raises a pertinent question: Has sensationalism overtaken reason? While much has been said about these reports, it is time to dwell deeper into the issue and look at the ground reality.

The Unseen Good: A Silent Majority: As per the IRDAI annual report, last year, the General Insurance industry settled crores of claims worth? 1.72 lakh crore, out of which it paid more than? 80.000 crore towards health insurance. Yet those who benefit rarely make the news. On the flip side, isolated grievances and odd bad experiences become the face of the industry. Also, the claim settlement ratio in the industry is more than 80%. The 20% of claims that are rejected are on the account of fraud, or non-admissibility and yet there is an uproar about this. After all, insurance is public money, and insurers should be lauded for handling this money responsibly.

The Price of Safety: Let's say it is not making a difference, and we decide to shut down the industry but without it what would happen?

Some argue that individuals can self-insure by saving for medical expenses. However, consider this: out-of-pocket (OOP) health expenses in India currently stand at 60%, as per a report by NITI Aayog. Without insurance, this figure would soar to 100%, leaving households entirely at the mercy of skyrocketing medical costs. For families without significant savings, medical bills would push them below the poverty line. Currently, approximately 7% of India's population-already face this reality annually due to



healthcare costs. Without insurance, this num ber would worsen, and the government would face increased pressure to subsidise healthcare, diverting resources from other critical sectors. Such a scenario would derail our demographic dividend and exacerbate poverty. Are we ready with an alternate safety net for citizens if insurance shuts down?

The motor industry, thriving thanks to insurance-backed accident protection, will falter as claims payouts-approximately ? 55 thousand crore-cease to exist. The motor industry thrives partly due to insurance-backed accident protection. Without insurance, the financial burden of accidents would fall entirely on vehicle owners, leading to increased economic instability and decreased vehicle sales. Insurers also play a crucial role in covering Motor Third Party claims, which is a mandatory requirement in our country. As per the recent IRDAI annual report, in FY 23-24, the industry paid claims amounting to over ?

27.000 crore in Motor TP claims. If the insurance industry were to close, who will bear this cost of compensation? It will further burden the government treasury of a fast developing nation.

Nearly 36 crore beneficiaries have been verified under Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri-Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) as of November 30, 2024. Further, 8.39 crore hospital admissions worth over ? 1.16 lakh crore have been authorised under the scheme. This scheme of the government provides health coverage of ?5 lakh per family per year for secondary and tertiary care hospitalisation to approximately 55 crore beneficiaries, corresponding to 12.37 crore families constituting economically vulnerable bottom 40 percent of India's population. Without the insurance industry's support, the scheme would not be in place or effective in states adopting an insurance or hybrid model. The government would have to bear all this cost on its own. According to PIB, the health expenditure for 2023-24 is ? 5.85 lakh crores, which is 1.9% of the GDP. This is an increase from ? 2.43 lakh crores in 2017-18. A significant portion of this expenditure supports low-income families. Insurance-backed programs like Avushman Bharat alleviate this financial strain, covering citizens across states and UTs. Without insurance, this burden will only grow

Natural disasters like floods, cyclones, and earthquakes wreak havoc on nations, causing immense human and financial losses. Insurance serves as a critical recovery mechanism. The staggering more than 90% protection gap between insured and actual losses underscores the urgent need to bridge the gap; cyclones, floods, and earthquakes are sadly becoming yearly affairs. In 2023 alone, India witnessed 17 natural calamities. Without insurance, economies would struggle to recover. Take the United States as an example: its robust insurance framework ensures that post-disaster regions come back stronger, bigger, and more resilient. The infusion of insured capital post-Hurricane Katrina enabled infrastructure rebuilding and economic recovery. In India, a higher insurance penetration could similarly transform recovery processes, ensuring affected communities rebound swiftly rather than languishing in prolonged despair. Here, it is also worth noticing that the Central Government has allocated ?13.693 crore for the National Disaster Mitigation Fund (NDMF) and 32,030.60 crore for the State Disaster Mitigation Fund (SDMF) for the period 2021-22 to 2025-26. After each natural disaster, the government spends a huge amount as compensation. This money, which eventually goes from taxpayers, could be routed toward developmental projects and infrastructural development if a more robust insurance program is in place.

Agriculture, the backbone of India's economy, is vulnerable to the whims of nature. Thanks to the insurance industry, schemes like the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY) have disbursed claims worth ?1.64 lakh crore over the past eight years

These pay-outs have offered financial respite to farmers, reducing distress and contributing to a decline in farmer suicides. By mitigating risks associated with droughts, floods, and unseasonal rains, insurance ensures farmers can continue contributing to the nation's food security. Here, without insurance, there seems to be no effective safety net to ensure that the relief of loss reaches the last mile

Insurance: An Industry with Remarkably Low Grievance Ratios: Despite common misconceptions, the insurance industry boasts impressively low grievance ratios, underscoring its robust complaint resolution mechanisms. Talking about the recent numbers, with just 94,843 grievances in FY 23-24 against 2.96 billion policies, the industry achieved a mere 0.003% grievance ra tio-an achievement few industries can match.

Fighting Fraud: An Unsung Battle: Fraudu lent claims cost the industry billions annually but no one speaks much about it. Over the past five years, the insurance industry detected ap proximately 3.01 lakh potential fraud cases involving a sum assured of ?1.73 lakh crore. According to research, the Indian general insur ance industry loses approximately US\$6 billion to fraud annually, translating to roughly? 30,000 crore. Yet, the narrative focuses solely on claim rejections, ignoring the root causes. Should fraudulent claims go unchecked? Shouldn't there be stricter penalties for those exploiting the system? Allowing fraud to go unchecked under mines the trust and sustainability of the entire in surance framework

The Profit Myth: The general perception is that insurers are generating huge profits and only exist to make a profit. First of all, is profit such a bad thing for an insurer? Profit ensures that insurers can honour future claims and remain sustainable. Underwriting profits show case prudency.

Now, looking at the other side of the coin, the general insurance industry operates at an av erage claims ratio of more than 80% and a combined ratio of 115%, which means for every INR

100 earned in premiums, the industry pays out INR 115. Simply put, insurers lose money on claims payouts and operational expenses. Yet every small price hike triggers public outcry. If so, let's shut this "evil" industry! An Industry run by citizens: Employing over a million people directly and 5 million indirectly, insurance sup ports countless livelihoods. It's not about a prof it-mongering evil industry but about citizens working to impact lives positively. Entrepreneurs like brokers, TPAs, and Insurtechs further add value, making it a cornerstone of economic and employment growth.

Moving the Needle: India's insurance pene tration remains abysmally low at 1%. The industry works tirelessly to increase awareness and expand coverage. However, criticism with out constructive dialogue risks alienating stake holders, jeopardising future progress and reduc ing trust. We need to understand that as the insurance penetration increases, the nation will de velop faster; without it, we would probably go backwards!

Let's not forget what insurance represents a safety net, a fallback, and a protector of dreams Is there a scope for improvement? Yes, but the industry is constantly evolving. The insurance in dustry welcomes scrutiny but demands fairness. Highlight the good, address the bad, and focus or the way forward. If you still think insurance is evil, let's shut it down, provided we have an alternate safety net for our citizens. Till then, the choice is ours-criticise destructively or engage constructively.




