The Maha Kumbh will end on February 26 with the last major 'snan' on the occasion of Mahashivratri. In a statement, the state govern ment said that nearly 55 crore people are expected to visit Prayagraj by the end of the Maha Kumbh

Rupee ends 63 paise higher at 86.82 against US dollar

MUMBAI: The rupee on Tuesday rallied 63 paise, recording its steepest single-day recovery in nearly two years, to settle at 86.82 (provisional) against the US dollar, backed by dollar selling by banks. According to forex traders, Tuesday's sharp gain a day after sliding closer to the 88 level shows a highly volatile currency market amid concerns over the worldwide tariff war. At the interbank foreign exchange, the rupee opened at 87.45 against the greenback and touched the intraday high of 86.61 during the ses

set a Net Zero carbon emission target for 2030. Additionally, our goal is to produce 5 million metric tons of green hydrogen annually by 2030."

India has emerged as the third-largest solar power generating nation global-ly, with its non-fossil fuel energy capacity tripling over the years.

JAMMU: Two Army personnel, including a captain, were killed and another was injured when an improvised explosive device (IED), believed to have been planted by terrorists, exploded near the Line of Control (LoC) in the Akhnoor sector near here on Tuesday, officials said. The Army confirmed the fatalities in the blast and said "own troops are dominating the area and search operations are underway". The officials said the troops were on patrolling duty when they were hit by the powerful explosion near a forward post in the Bhattal area at around 3:50 pm.

The injured personnel were rushed to a hospital where two of them, including a captain, succumbed to their injuries, they said, adding that the condition of the other injured soldier is "out of danger". The Jammu-based White Knight Corps unit of the Army saluted the supreme sacrifice of the two soldiers. "Suspected Improvised Explosive Device blast reported in #Laleali in Akhnoor Sector during a fence patrol resulting in two fatalities



Police as illegal, citing the police's failure to inform the detainee of the grounds of arrest. The Court expressed shock over the inhuman treatment meted out to the appellant, who was handcuffed and chained to a hospital bed while in police custody. A bench compris-ing Justice Abhay S. Oka and Justice N. Kotiswar Singh set aside a Punjab & Haryana High Court decision that had upheld the appellant's arrest. The Supreme Court observed that such treatment blatantly violated the detainee's fundamental right to live with dignity under Article 21 of the Constitution.

Committee submits report to JP Nadda on vandalism of Ambedkar's statue in Puniab

PHAGWARA: Following the vandalism of Dr BR Ambedkar's statue on Republic Day in Amritsar, a six-member com-mittee, constituted to probe the incident, has submitted its report to BJP National President JP Nadda in New Delhi recently.

The incident had sparked widespread outrage across Punjab, leading to heightened tensions in the region. The panel, constituted by Nadda, was tasked with conducting an impartial investigation into the incident. The Committee comprises of former Union Minister Som Parkash, BJP Rajya Sabha MP Brij Lal, SC Morcha National President Lal Singh Arya, BJP spokesperson Guru Prakash Paswan, Uttar Pradesh Minister Aseem Arun, and BJP leader Banto Devi Kataria from Ambala.

Som Parkash, while sharing details of the committee's find-ings, stated that they have urged the Central government to involve National Investigative Agency (NIA) in identifying those responsible for the act.

Bloodbath in stock market over Trump tariff concerns

Domestic stock markets saw a bloodbath on Tuesday over Trump tariff concerns and continued outflow of foreign portfolio from India

US President Donald Trump's announcement of a 25 per cent tariff on steel and aluminium imports to the US rattled global investor sentiment, and India is not an exception. Investors anticipate potential disruptions to global trade during Trump presidency.

Šensex closed at 76,293.60 points, down 1,018.20 points or 1.32 per cent, while Nifty closed at 23,071.80 points, down 309.80 points or 1.32 per cent.

All sectoral indices were in deep red, NSE data showed.

Sensex is now about 10,000 points below its all-time high of 85,978 points. Sensex has so far slumped 3 per cent this New Year.

MP Arora moves bill to eradicate superstition

In a significant step towards eliminating harmful superstitions and ensuring public safety, MP Sanjeev Arora representing Punjab has introduced `The Prevention of Black Magic, Witch-Hunting, and Superstitious Practices Bill, 2024' in the Rajya Sabha. This bill seeks to prohibit black magic, human sacrifice, witch-hunting, and other exploitative rituals that continue to harm individuals, particularly women, children, and marginalized

communities. The need for such legislation has become even more urgent with the increasing instances of superstition-driven violence. Across India, numerous cases of witch-hunting, human sacrifice, and fraudulent healing practices continue to emerge, leading to severe physical and psychological



harm, social ostracization, and, in extreme cases, death.

Adding to the severity of the problem is the rapid spread of superstitious beliefs through social media and digital platforms. In today's digital age, misinformation and fearbased narratives are being propagated widely through YouTube videos, WhatsApp forwards, Facebook groups,

and other online forums. leading to mass hysteria and the normalization of such practices. Many selfproclaimed godmen, occult practitioners, and fraudsters exploit these platforms to claim supernatural abilities, promote rituals, and deceive people for financial or personal gain. The bill prohibits explicitly the advertisement and

propagation of supernatural claims, magical remedies, and black magic-related services across all forms of media, including print, electronic, and digital platforms. Those found guilty of such activities will face strict penalties. The bill proposes severe

punishments for offenders, with imprisonment of up to ten years for engaging in black magic, and life imprisonment or even the death penalty for those responsible for witchhunting that results in grievous harm or death. It also mandates the establishment of a Special Enforcement Task Force under the Ministry of Home Affairs to investigate and prosecute such cases. Additionally, Special Courts will be set up for speedy trials, and a National Register of Offenders will be maintained to track repeat offenders. A critical aspect of the

bill is its focus on victim protection and rehabilitation. The legislation mandates the creation of a Victim Compensation Fund, ensuring a minimum of ?5 lakh for affected individuals and ?10 lakh for families of deceased victims. It also provides legal, medical, and psychological support for survivors and guarantees legal protection for whistleblowers who report such crimes

To address the root causes of superstition, the bill prioritizes awareness and education. Schools and educational institutions will be required to include scientific reasoning and critical thinking in their curriculum to counter misinformation. Media including platforms, television, radio, and digital channels, will be required to broadcast educational content to dismantle myths surrounding supernatural powers and occult practices

He stated that workers are not receiving their wages on time, and the payments are repeatedly delayed. He further alleged that contractors are not depositing employees' provident fund (EPF), which is a blatant violation of labor regulations. Union president Naveen Kumar warned that if the company management fails to disburse wages by the 7th of the month, as per the agreement, and does not ensure EPF deposits for contract workers, the union will escalate its agitation. He asserted that any future unrest will be the sole responsibility of the company management.

efficiency and transparency. The third phase will involve organizing grievance redressal camps in all wards of the former municipal council and the 14 newly integrated panchayats. The second phase of the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana (Urban) survey has begun in Una. Eligible families will receive Rs. 2.5 lakh per household for constructing permanent homes. Unlike rural areas, where the financial assistance is Rs. 1.5 lakh. urban beneficiaries receive Rs. 2.5 lakh, with the income eligibility limit set at Rs. 3 lakh per annum compared to Rs. 1.8 lakh in rural areas. The newly added 14 panchayats under the municipal corporation will also benefit from this scheme. Harminder Singh Mavi, Convener, Aam Aadmi Ghar Bachao Morcha, Mohali Builder and Property Association President Om Prakash Thind, etc. They have written in their complaint that in Mohali district and all over Punjab, the sub-registrars (Naib Tehsildar and Tehsildar) have



closed the registrations plots/houses etc. located within the red line of villages and cities without any reason. The sub registrars are only doing those registrations for which the properties have already been regis tered and this condition is illegal and against the constitutional and fundamental rights of the people living here. They have written that according to the notification of the Punjab Government, registrations are being done in the tehsils according to any document made for pur-chase and sale before 31-07-2024, but for passing the maps in the Municipal Committees of the state, only the documents made

before 19-03-2018 are being done. They demanded that the maps be passed as per the notification of the Punjab Government.

It takes more than a year to pass the maps of the municipal committees and corporations To end the misery of the people orders should be issued to pass these maps within 15 days. They have written that construction of more than three floors is being banned in villages, while capi talists and big builders are build ing 25-25 floor buildings on the lands along with the villages, but why is injustice being done to the indigenous residents of the villages who have been living here for hundreds of years

MUMBAI: The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has issued an interim order against LS Industries Ltd (LSIL) and five associated entities, uncovering a case of stock manipulation and suspicious share transfers. A 12.12% stake in LSIL, valued at Rs 10.28 crore, was sold to NRI Jahangir Panikkaveettil Perum barambathu (JPP) for just US\$1. This transaction made JPP richer by US\$328.60 million (Rs 2,752 crore) when LSIL's market capitalisation peaked at 22,700 crore. SEBI has impounded Rs 1.14 crore in illegal gains from JPP and barred all six entities from the market. UK-India defence agreements boost Aatmanirbhar Bharat ambition

The UK-India strategic partnership has taken another major step forward with the formal launch of Defence Partnership- India (DP-I) and the signing of several defence agreements at Aero India 2025, a statement by the UK Embassy said.

Announcing DP-I, UK Defence Minister Lord Vernon Coaker opened the UK-India Defence Partnership Pavilion, establishing a dedicated programme office within the UK's Ministry of Defence that will serve as a one-stop shop for strengthening bilateral defence collaboration between the two countries.

The UK and India have today agreed to expand their collaboration on next-generation weapons with Thales and Bharat Dynamics Limited (BDL). Thales and BDL have signed a contract that will deliver Laser Beam Riding MANPADs (LBRM), with an initial supply of High Velocity Missiles (STARStreak) and launchers to be delivered this year. This contract represents an important next step for UK-Indian defence co-operation in the critical area of air defence, as per the statement.

Lord Vernon Coaker, UK Defence Minister, said, "It was a pleasure to visit India and continue to grow our already strong defence relationship. Our Defence Partnership and the UK-India Defence Partnership Pavilion will help strengthen our cooperation further,



supporting economic growth in both our countries and India's Atmanirbhar ambition."

"This event showcases our collaboration in next generation capability, and the massive potential the UK and India can unlock by working together," he added.

Following the signing of this initial LBRM contract, both Thales and BDL will further collaborate to produce Lightweight Multirole Missiles (LMM). This develops and expands the partnership between Indian and British industry, laying the foundation for BDL and Indian industry to form an integral part of Thales' global supply chain. It will address mutual security concerns, create jobs in both countries and enable interoperability by both armies.

Lindy Cameron, British High Commissioner to India, said: "India is taking significant steps in its journey to become Atmanirbhar in its defence capabilities. The UK is really looking forward to working with India as a partner of choice in supporting this ambition: collaborating on defence technologies lies at the heart of this. Quick cure for common cause of high blood pressure

Doctors at Queen Mary University of London, Barts Health NHS Trust, and University College London have led the development of Targeted Thermal Therapy (Triple T), a simple, minimally invasive procedure that has the potential to revolutionise medical management of a common but often overlooked cause of high blood pressure.

This breakthrough could with additional testing, benefit millions of people worldwide who are currently undiagnosed and untreated.

In the UK, Triple T, known scientifically as endoscopic ultrasound-guided radiofrequency ablation, was rigorously tested, in collaboration with researchers from University College London, University College Hospital NHS Trust, Cambridge University NHS Trust, and the University of Cambridge.

High blood pressure affects one in three adults, of whom a hormonal condition called primary aldosteronism accounts for one in twenty cases. However, fewer than one per cent of those affected are ever diagnosed.

The condition occurs when tiny be-



nign nodules in one or both adrenal glands produce excess aldosterone, a hormone that raises blood pressure by increasing salt levels in the body. Patients with primary aldosteronism often do not respond well to standard blood pressure medications and face higher risks of heart attacks, strokes, and kidney failure. Until now, the only effective cure for

primary aldosteronism has been surgical removal of the entire adrenal gland, requiring general anaesthesia, a two-to three-day hospital stay, and weeks of recovery. As a result, many patients go untreated. Triple T offers a faster, safer alternative to surgery, by selectively destroying the small adrenal nodule without removing the gland. This is made possible by recent advances in diagnostic scans, using molecular dyes that accurately identify and locate even the smallest adrenal nodules. Those in the left adrenal gland are seen to be immediately adjacent to the stomach, from where they can be directly targeted.

The new treatment harnesses the energy of waves, adapting two well-established medical techniques: radiofrequency or microwaves generate heat in a small needle placed into the malfunctioning tissue, causing a controlled burn; ultrasound uses reflected sound waves to create a real-time video of the procedure.

In Triple T, as in routine endoscopy, a tiny internal camera--in this case using ultrasound as well as light--is passed by mouth into the stomach. The endoscopist visualises the adrenal gland and guides a fine needle from the stomach precisely into the nodule. Short bursts of heat destroy the nodule but leave the surrounding healthy tissues unharmed. This minimally invasive approach takes only 20 minutes and eliminates the need for internal or external incisions.

The study is called FABULAS, the

name being an acronym for a Feasibility study of radiofrequency endoscopic ABlation, with ULtrasound guidance, as a non-surgical, adrenal-sparing treatment for aldosterone-producing adenomas. FABULAS tested Triple T in 28 patients with primary aldosteronism, whose molecular scan had pinpointed a hormoneproducing nodule in the left adrenal gland. The new procedure was found to be safe and effective, with most patients having normal hormone levels six months later. Many participants were able to stop all blood pressure medications, with no recurrence of the condition.

Professor Morris Brown, co-senior author of the FABULAS study and Professor of Endocrine Hypertension at Queen Mary University of London, said, "It is 70 years since the discovery in London of the hormone aldosterone, and, a year later, of the first patient in USA with severe hypertension due to an aldosterone-producing tumour.

This patient's doctor, Jerome Conn, predicted, with perhaps only minor exaggeration, that 10-20% of all hypertension might one day be traced to curable nodules in one or both glands. We are now able to realise this prospect, offering 21stcentury breakthroughs in diagnosis and treatment."

"Before the study, I suffered from debilitating headaches for years despite multiple GP visits. As a full-time worker and single parent, my daily life was severely affected.

This non-invasive treatment provided an immediate recovery--I was back to my normal routine straight away. I'm incredibly grateful to the team for giving me this choice."

The success of FABULAS has led to a larger randomised trial called 'WAVE', which is comparing Triple T with traditional adrenal surgery. The results are expected in 2027.

Professor Stephen Pereira, Chief Investigator of FABULAS and Professor of Hepatology & Gastroenterology at UCL Institute for Liver and Digestive Health, added, "With appropriate training, this less invasive technique could be widely offered in endoscopy units across the UK and internationally."

ICC bans Bangladesh offspinner Shohaly Akhter for five years on corruption charges

ubai: The International Cricket Council (ICC) on Tuesday banned Bangladesh offspinner Shohaly Akhter from all cricket for five years after she admitted breaching five provisions of the ICC Anti-Corruption Code.

According to the ICC media release Shohaly was found guilty of attempting to fix, seeking or offering a bribe and obstructing or lelaying the investigation being carried out by the ICC's Anti-Corruption Code (ACU).

The charges around her relate to corrupt approaches made in relation to matches in the ICC Women's T20 World Cup 2023 held in South Africa.

Shohaly has represented Bangladesh in 13 women's T20I's and 2 women's ODI's. According to ICC, the investigation revolved around the approach she made on February 14. 2023, prior to Bangladesh's match aga Australia in the Women's T20 World Cup 2023.

Akhter contacted her friend and teammate via Facebook Messenger, sending her voice notes in which she tried to persuade [PLAYER A] to agree to carry out fixes in future Bangladesh matches. The player who was approached by Akhter rejected the offer and reported it to the ACU. The player provided the ACU with copies of the voice notes Ms Akhter had sent her, which she had forwarded before they were deleted.

Shohaly admitted to being in breach of rovisions of the Code:

Article 2.1.1: Fixing or contriving in any way or otherwise influencing improperly or being a party to any agreement or effort to fix or contrive in any way or otherwise influence improperly, the result, progress, conduct or any other aspect of any International Match, including (without limitation) by deliberately erforming therein
