Arora will have to resign from the Rajya Sabha if he wins the by-poll, the date for which is yet to be announced.

The passing of AAP's Gurpreet Bassi Gogi, who died of a gunshot injury after his licensed weapon accidentally discharged last month, led to the Lud-

hiana West seat falling vacant. Amid speculations of Aam Admi party national convenor Arvind Kejriwal seeking a Rajya Sabha seat, Union



Minister of State for Railways Ravneet Singh Bittu said that Kejriwal "can't

live without power" The speculation began after the Aam Aadmi Party's nomination of Rajya Sabha MP Sanjiv Arora as the candidate for the Ludhiana West assembly by-election. It was speculated that the RS seat held by Sanjiv Arora would go to the AAP convenor.

"We were repeatedly saying that this man (Arvind Kejriwal) cannot live without power... If Sanjeev Arora wins the MLA seat, he cannot hold both the posts of MP and MLA. If he loses, they will tell him that you lost the MLA seat, why should we give you the MP seat now,

both heads and tails are Arvind Kejriwal's...," Bittu told a news agency. 'The election has not even been announced yet, yet it is possible that Sanjeev Arora's resignation (from Rajva Sabha) may be taken beforehand so that Arvind Kejriwal becomes an MP...," he added.

Punjabi not just language but cultural symbol too : Bains

SUMER GARG CHANDIGARH, FEB 26

In a bold move to counter the "wellplanned conspiracy" of the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) to marginalise regional languages by bringing out the new Exam pattern, Punjab government, today, took a lead by issuing a notification making Punjabi a mandatory main subject in all schools across the state, regardless of their educational board affiliation. The notification states that education certificates will be considered as null and void without Punjabi as a main subject.

Notably, the CBSE was quick to issue a clarification after the Punjab Cabinet Minister, Harjot Singh Bains lashed out the new exam pattern for its marginalisation of the Punjabi language. While addressing a press conference here at Punjab Bhawan, today evening, Mr Bains asserted that Punjabi is spoken and read in multiple states, extending its significance beyond Punjab's borders. "Punjabi is not just a language, but it is a symbol of our rich cultural heritage, spoken and cherished by millions across the country, but



the current situation was an attempt to erase Punjabi from the educational landscape". Demanding the action for ignoring Punjabi in a draft education policy, Bains said that he would write a letter to Union Education Minister, Mr Dharmendra Pradhan to fix a responsibility of concerned officials, who had committed this grave injustice to the state. He said that the CBSE must understand that this is not a matter of choice, but a matter of national importance. This is a blatant disregard for the rights of states & federal structure, and a direct assault on our nation's linguistic diversity.

"We can't tolerate this blatant attempt to impose a singular narrative on our nation," the Education Minister as-serted, while adding, "We demand that the CBSE respect the federal structure of India and ensure that all languages, including Punjabi, are given the promi-nence they deserve." Underscoring the Punjab government's firm stance of ensuring Punjabi remains an integral part of the state's educational framework, Harjot Singh Bains shared that the Punjab Government imposed a fine of Rs 50,000 on a Mohali-based Private School. Amity International School, for failing to comply with the Punjab Learning of Punjabi and Other Languages Act, 2008.

According to a report of the District Education Officer (Secondary), the school was found to be in violation of the Act which mandates the teaching of Punjabi as a compulsory subject. Two Jalandhar based schools were also penalised for vi-

Naib Tehsildar dismissed for involvement in shamlat land scam

Reaffirming the commitment of Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government on 'Zero Tolerance Against Corruption', Punjab Additional Chief Secretary (ACS) cum Financial Commissioner Revenue (FCR) Anurag Verma has ordered the dismissal of Naib Tehsildar Varinderpal Singh Dhoot for illegally sanctioning the mutation of shamlat (common village land) at village Seonk in Kharar in favour of private individuals.

The action against Naib Tehsildar Dhoot follows a detailed inquiry that found him guilty of violating the Punjab Village Common Lands Act, The detailed inquiry revealed that Naib Tehsildar Dhoot, while posted as Naib Tehsildar in Majri, SAS Nagar, had sanctioned Mutation 1767 on September 28, 2016, transferring ownership of 10,365 kanals and 19 mar-las of shamlat land in Village Seonk, Tehsil Kharar, to pri-



The inquiry further revealed that this was done despite clear cut instructions issued by Revenue Department of the Punjab Government and a Supreme Court judgment in the Jagpal Singh vs. State of Punjab case (2011), which prohibits the transfer or mutation of shamlat land to private parties.

The inquiry report, submitted by retired Additional District and Sessions Judge BR Bansal, highlighted that Dhoot had not only sanctioned the mutation illegally but also manipulated the pants by increasing or decreasing their shares without proper verification. In some cases, individuals with no rightful claim to the land were included as sharehold-

"Government has zero tolerance policy towards such actions. Hence Considering the above facts and situation, I, as the competent authority, hereby decide and order to dismiss Varinderpal Singh Dhoot, Naib Tehsildar (suspended), from government service under Rule 5 of the Punjab Civil Services (Punishment and Appeal) Rules, 1970," reads the dismissal orders signed by FCR Anurag while Dhoot's actions as "malafide"

The development came close on the heels of ACS cum FCR Anurag Verma issuing a stern warning to all Deputy Commissioners (DCs) in Punjab against corruption and delays in the registration of plots without No Objection Certificates (NOCs) in the The warning

prompted by reports of corruption and delay from various parts of the state in the registration of plots without NOCs, despite the government notification issued in November 2024.

Pertinently, ACS cum FCR Anurag Verma had, earlier, also suspended Tehsildar Ranjit Singh for fraudulently registering property deeds in Jagraon while sitting at Ludhiana East tehsil office. The report showed that Ranjit Singh registered documents in Jagraon at 5.12 PM and, within four minutes, registered another in Ludhiana East at 5.16 PM, which is humanly not possible.

While reiterating the Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann led Punjab Government's commitment to rooting out corruption and ensuring strict adherence to legal and administrative protocols, FCR Anurag Verma categorically said that any officer found involved in corruption or any other malpractices will face stern conse-

Punjab's traders are suffering massive economic losses due to the border blockade; AAP

SC refuses to quash criminal proceedings against Union Minister Kumaraswamy

NEW DELHI, FEB 26

The Supreme Court refused to quash criminal proceedings against Union Minister for Heavy Industries quash and Steel, HD Kumaraswamy, in a land denotification case dating back to his tenure as Chief Minister of Karnataka.

A bench comprising Justices Dipankar Datta and Rajesh Bindal on Tuesday dismissed Kumaraswamy's plea seeking immunity under the 2018 amendment to the Prevention of Corruption Act, ruling that the amendment could not be applied retrospectively.

The decision paves the way for the trial to proceed in

connection with the denotification of 2 acres and 24 guntas of land Banashankari, which had been acquired by the Bangalore Development Authority (BDA) in 1997. The land was later sold to

private parties for ?4.14 crore

in 2010, despite objections from the BDA.

The case originated from a private complaint that led to an investigation by the Lokayukta Police under various provisions of the Indian Penal Code, the Prevention of Corruption

(Restriction of Transfer) Act. The Union Minister had earlier challenged the First Information Report (FIR) in the Karnataka High Court, but his plea was dismissed in 2015. A subsequent appeal to the Supreme Court in 2016 also failed to halt the investigation.

2019, In Kumaraswamy was serving his second term as Chief Minister, a closure report was filed in the case. However, the Special Judge (MPs & MLAs) rejected the report and summoned him for trial, citing sufficient grounds for prosecution. The Karnataka High Court later upheld the summoning affirming

allegations. Senior Advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for the former Chief Minister, contended before the Supreme Court that trial proceedings could not continue without prior sanction from government, citing Section 19 of the Prevention of Corruption Act as amended in 2018. However, Senior Advocate Harin Rawal and Additional Advocate General Aman Panwar, representing the Karnataka government, argued that sanction was unnecessary since Kumaraswamy no longer held public office and that the amendment could not be applied to past offences.

Alarm ringing

First, Donald Trump said that he might invade Greenland and then declared that he would annex Canada (but no threat of physical violence so far, just extreme economic pressure). Then he spoke about turning the devastated Gaza Strip into the "Riviera of the Middle East", with the United States of America taking a "long-term ownership position." Once a real-estate shill, always a real-estate shill.

Trump does understand how the media works, and making fantastic and outrageous claims that have to be rebutted is the best way to keep the media from talking about what he's really doing (such as removing all legal, constitutional and customary restraints on the presidency).

Most journalists know what he's up to but still feel obliged to bat away each fantasy that he throws out. I was going to write about Trump's vile and preposterous plans for the Gaza Strip — until I checked the 'Copernicus' website (as I have taken to doing at the start of each month) and saw that the 'anomaly' is now +1.75'Celsius. 'Copernicus' monitors the Earth System for the European Union, and its website is very quick at drawing together observations from all over the planet to estimate each month's average global temperature. The 'anomaly' is how much higher that temperature is than it would have been without the greenhouse gases emitted by humans.

Two years ago, after about a century-and-a-half of industrialisation and carbon dioxide and methane emissions, the anomaly was just reaching +1.2°C higher than the average global temperature. At the current rate of emissions, we would have reached +1.3°C around 2028, and +1.4°C around 2033. Bad, but at least predictable. Then, in June 2023, the whole Earth System took off, and in just one month, the average global temperature was +1.5°C higher. It has never dropped back down since, and the anomaly for the whole of last year was +1.55°C. In the last three months of 2024, it was always above +1.6°C and last month it was +1.75°C. Two years ago, conventional predictions put us at +1.75°C around 2040.

Yet the 'mainstream' climate scientists, rather than running through the streets screaming that disaster is nigh, have tried to downplay the seriousness of what is happening. You can't be sure this is the trend until you have 10 or 20 years of data, they say. (So you think we should wait that long before we declare an emergency?)

The media and most of its customers are ignoring this terrifying trend because the Tangerine Toddler is having a tantrum.

slinging mud at each other.



Discovering the genetics of climate adaptation

A s climate change accelerates, plants are under increasing pressure to adapt to changing habitats and environmental conditions.

This challenge is especially urgent for crops, as drought and heatresistant plants are critical to ensuring food security in an unpredictable future. Fortunately, plants can adapt astonishingly well to a variety of settings and temperatures: Arabidopsis thaliana, for example, thrives in climates as disparate as Sweden and Italy.

The study, by the labs of Liam Dolan and Frederic Berger at the Gregor Mendel Institute (GMI) of Molecular Plant Biology, as well as Kelly Swarts, former GMI group leader and now at the Umea Plant Science Centre, and Masaki Shimamura at Hiroshima University.

Understanding how plants naturally adapt to different local conditions is key to predicting their response to climate change, and can



help produce more resilient crops. A recent study provides new insight into the genetic underpinnings of plant climate adaptation. By combining population genetics and global climate data, the researchers identified genetic variants underlying climate adaptation in Marchantia polymorpha. Genetic variants underlying certain traits, like enhanced heat resistance or different seed sizes, are often selected in environments where they provide a survival or reproductive edge. However, which genetic variants are responsible for climate adaptation is mostly unknown.

To uncover these variants, the researchers compared the genetics of different regional subpopulations of Marchantia polymorpha collected across Europe, America and Japan, creating a population genomics database. By integrating this database with a worldwide climate dataset, the scientists correlated each subpopulation's genetic profile

with its local climate.

"Comparing populations in Europe and Japan, we found genetic variants associated with warmer and colder summer temperatures, as well as with the amount of summer precipitation," explains Liam Dolan. "These adaptations could be crucial for optimizing reproduction in different conditions."

The study also revealed that genetic variability differs notably between populations of Marchantia polymorpha. Populations collected from different areas in Europe were similar to each other but presented high genetic variability among their individuals.

In contrast, geographically isolated Japanese populations exhibited more uniform genetic profiles, distinct from those in Europe. These patterns suggest that climate adaptation may favor different reproductive strategies in Europe and Japan, as Marchantia and other bryophytes can famously reproduce

KAITHAL: Deputy Commissioner (DC) Preeti has taken strict cognizance of the Haryana Roadways bus accident that occurred on February 24 on the Jakhauli-Kichchana Road. Notably, another bus accident had taken place on the same route just 20 days earlier. In response, the DC has directed the Public Works Department (PWD) to take immediate measures to improve road conditions. A committee, led by the Sub-Divisional Officer (Civil) Kaithal, and including PWD officials, was formed to investigate the incident. The inquiry found that the accident occurred when the bus tire slipped from the paved road onto an unstable roadside berm. To prevent such incidents in the future, the DC has instructed PWD to repair all damaged berms on main roads and link roads in Kaithal district without delay. Additionally, all ongoing road construction projects must be completed promptly. The department has been directed to submit a compliance report to the DC's office within 15 days.

Any attempt to bribe, threaten, or unduly influence voters will result in strict legal action by the district administration and the State Election Commission. The DC also directed that political gatherings be held only at designated locations and urged candidates and their supporters to main tain harmony throughout the election process.




