MUMBAI: Amid the ongo-Beed sarpanch murder case in Maharashtra, state food and civil supplies minister Dhananjay Munde resigned on Tuesday from Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis's ministry. Munde has submitted his resignation to me. I have accepted his resignation and sent it to the governor for further action," said Fadnavis. Woman's body found near KMP expressway near Jhajjar

CHANDIGARH: The body of an unidentified woman was found near the KMP expressway in Daboda Kalan village in Jhajjar district, police said on Tues-

The deceased is believed to be aged around 30-32 years, police said. Her body was found wrapped in a blanket on Monday evening.

"She was stabbed to death as her body bore multiple knife injuries," SHO Sadar, Bahadurgarh, Inspector Bijender Singh said.

Doors always open for talks with farmers: Punjab CM

CHANDIGARH, MAR 4

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann categorically said that his doors are always open for talks with the farmers but inconvenience and harassment of the general public on the name of agitation should be avoided.

Interacting with the farmers during a meeting at Punjab Bhawan on Monday, he said that the government is always ready to resolve the issues pertaining to various sections of society through negotiations so that the trouble to the common man through rail or road blockades must be

He said that such action causes problems to the general people due to which they turn against the agitators thereby creating discord in the society. Mann said that unfortunately the common man has to suffer a lot due to such protests which is totally unwarranted and undesirable.

The Chief Minister said that though protest is democratic right of the farmers but they should also think that it is bringing huge loss to the state. He said that the traders and industrialists have been ruing that due to frequent road and rail blocks their businesses have been ruined.


Mann made fervent appeal to the farmers to avoid such tactics that create discord amongst the society.

Delhi HC grants bail to wrestler Sushil Kumar in Sagar Dhankar murder case

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday granted regular bail to wrestler Sushil Kumar in the Sagar Dhankar Murder case. He was arrested in the Sagar Dhankar Murder case. Dhankar

was murdered on the night of 4 May 2021. Justice Sanjeev Narula granted regular bail to Sushil Kumar on furnishing a bail bond of Rs 50000 and two sureties of the like amount. The detailed order is yet to be uploaded.

He was earlier granted 7 days interim bail for Knee surgery in July 2023. Sushil Kumar, along with other accused persons, is facing trial in junior wrestler Sagar Dhankar's mur-

The accused, Sushil Kumar, was represented by advocates R S Malik and Sumeet Shokeen. Counsel for the accused argued that he has been in custody for more than three and a half years.

Around 30 out of 186 Prosecution witnesses have been examined in the last three years, the counsel argued.

Sagar, along with other victims, was allegedly beaten by the accused person at the Chhatrasal Stadium on the night of May 4, 2021. He was injured and later succumbed to SAS NAGAR, MAR 4



To break the nexus between police officers and drug traffickers, 10,000 police personnel have been transferred.

He also revealed that the current government has seized ?612 crore worth of drug traffickers' property, compared to just ?142 crore confiscated by previous governments. Additionally, 1,128 kg of heroin has been recovered so far, whereas the previous government had seized only 197 kg. Two women Chitta smugglers arrested while trying to flee to Canada

DHARAMSHALA: The Dharamshala Police team has foiled the attempt of Chitta smugglers to flee abroad. Giving information, Kangra District SSP Shalini Agnihotri said that the police has arrested two women from Delhi Airport while trying to flee to Canada. The police has brought both of them to Kangra. SSP Shalini Agnihotri said that on the night of 21 January 2025, the team of Police Station Dharamshala was on patrol, during this, on the basis of secret information, the vehicle number HP39B 9902 was stopped and searched, then 30 grams of Chitta was recovered from the three youths Shashank Bisht resident of Dehradun, Ayush and Savatang Shahi resident of Dharamshala. In this regard, a case was registered under the Narcotics Act in Police Station Dharamshala. In order to identify the main suppliers in the case, the three accused were interrogated intensively. During interrogation, it was revealed that the youths had bought this drug from two women of Punjab, Kulwant Kaur and Germanpreet Kaur. Apart from this, investigation also revealed that the three youths had made transactions of about Rs 4.50 lakh through UPI in the bank accounts of these two women, which clearly shows the financial activity related to drug smuggling. After this, on technical analysis of the mobile phones of both the women, their location was found to be around Delhi Airport. SSP Shalini Agnihotri said that on the basis of location, a special police team was sent to Delhi from Police Station Dharamshala on 28.02.2025.

New shield

ndia and the European Union have long viewed each other as attractive partners with personality flaws that have hobbled efforts to realise the promise of their relationship. Last week, New Delhi and Brussels appeared to set aside those misgivings and give their ties a full-throated thrust at a summit with the EU, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi hosted the bloc's boss, Ursula von der Leyen, and other senior leaders. The two sides set a year-end deadline to finalise their free trade agreement, which has been under negotiation for almost two decades. The reason for this urgency is not hidden: its name is Donald Trump. The persistent threats of tariffs from the president of the United States of America have spooked not just stock markets but the world's other major economies. So far, India and Europe have escaped the worst of Mr Trump's tariff wrath but both have been placed on notice by the US president and it might be only a matter of time before they are targeted. Amid that global economic uncertainty, a strong, transparent and mutually beneficial trade agreement between New Delhi and Brussels will help ensure that a disruption in trade with the US does not dismantle India-EU economic ties. Such a deal would also send a powerful signal to the rest of the world: not everyone is giving up on free trade and globalisation.

But in many ways, the announcement that the two sides are looking to strengthen their strategic ties is as important as the plan to finally bring the FTA to life. Both India and the EU count the US as a critical partner and have long viewed it as an anchor of the post-Cold War global system. With Mr Trump shredding America's past approach to allies and rivals alike almost daily, neither New Delhi nor Brussels can make any assumptions about how much they can count on the US as a friend any longer. Strengthening strategic ties, including in defence and security, will broaden India's options in these arenas. Yet, the history of India-EU ties shows that plans that look good on paper often do not materialise as priorities change or tensions erupt between New Delhi and Brussels. If it is to be different this time, both sides need to focus not on promises but on delivering results that can actually make their relationship a shield against global uncertainties. For time and Mr Trump wait for no one.

Govt on track to meet fiscal deficit target

he central government is on course to meet its fiscal deficit target of 4.8 per cent of GDP for the financial year 2024-25 (FY25), according to a report by Bank of Baroda.

The report attributed this to factors such as a higher-than-expected nominal GDP growth rate, steady revenue receipts, and controlled expenditure growth.

It said, "We believe that government remains on track to meet its fiscal deficit target of 4.8 per cent for

The report highlighted three major reasons why the government is likely to achieve its fiscal deficit goal. Firstly, the nominal GDP growth rate is expected to be 9.9 per cent, slightly higher than the 9.7 per cent projected in the Union Budget. A higher GDP growth rate typically supports better revenue collections and helps manage fiscal deficit targets.

Secondly, government spending had started slowly in the first half of the fiscal year due to the general elections. However, the pace picked up in the latter half (H2), ensuring that overall expenditure remained in line with targets. The latest numbers show that spending remains on track with no major deviations. Thirdly, a steady momentum in revenue receipts has also



helped in keeping the fiscal deficit under control. Despite some slowdown in corporate tax collections, indirect tax revenues, particularly customs duties and Central Goods and Services Tax (CGST), have improved. Income tax collections have remained stable, further supporting overall revenue growth.

As of January 2025, the central government has utilized 75.7 per cent of its revised expenditure estimate, compared to 74.7 per cent in the same period last year.

Several key ministries, including Railways, Consumer Affairs, Rural Development, Defence, Home Affairs, Education, and Health, have spent more than last year as a percentage of their revised estimates.

However, as ministries approach their revised spending targets, the pace of expenditure is expected to moderate in the coming months.

Given these trends, Bank of Baroda expects the government to successfully meet its fiscal deficit target of 4.8 per cent for FY25.

The report suggests that with continued revenue collection and controlled spending, fiscal discipline will be maintained in the remainder of the financial year.



The Need for legal guarantee on MSP

he issue of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) has once again taken center stage in national discourse, with recent farmer protests and government policy changes bringing it to the forefront. While MSP was designed to provide farmers with a safety net against market fluctuations, its effectiveness remains a contentious topic due to inconsistent implementation and limited crop coverage.

Despite the government's decision to increase the MSP for wheat by 6.6% and its efforts to support domestic farmers through potential import tax hikes on vegetable oils, these measures fall short of addressing the core demand—a legally guaranteed MSP for all crops.

Farmers argue that without legal backing, MSP remains merely an assurance on paper,



leaving them vulnerable to fluctuating market conditions and middlemen. The recent clashes between farmers and police at the Shambhu border highlight the growing frustration and urgency of the issue.MSP has long been a critical mechanism for supporting agricultural sustainability in India. However, the Farmers argue that without legal backing, MSP remains merely an assurance on paper, leaving them vulnerable to fluctuating market conditions and middlemen. The recent clashes between farmers and police at the Shambhu border highlight the growing frustration and urgency of the issue.

lack of a comprehensive and legally binding framework has led to significant disparities in its benefits. Farmers cultivating non-MSP crops often face severe financial distress, as they lack the same level of protection as those growing staple crops like wheat and rice. This selective benefit distribution has created an uneven playing field, exacerbating rural distress and ecoinequality. Moreover, while government procurement through MSP remains limited to select states with robust infrastructure, many farmers in other regions struggle to sell their produce at fair prices.

The absence of well-established procurement mechanisms nationwide results in distress sales, forcing farmers to sell below the MSP due to a lack of alternative buyers. Addressing this issue requires a stronger commitment from the government to expand procurement facilities and improve market accessibility for farmers across all states. Another pressing concern is the volatility of global markets and its impact on domestic agricultural prices.

The government's move to consider a second hike in vegetable oil import taxes aims to support local oilseed farmers amid declining prices. While this is a step in the right direction, such short-term measures cannot replace a sustainable, long-term policy that guarantees farmers fair compensation irrespective of global price fluctuations.

The ongoing protests underscore the deep-seated dissatisfaction among farmers, who continue to demand a legal guarantee for MSP. Policymakers must recognize that agricultural stability is essential not just for farmers but for the entire nation's food security and economic well-being. Without a fair and enforceable MSP framework, India risks further alienating its agrarian community and worsening the rural distress crisis.

In addition to policy reforms, awareness programs should be conducted to educate farmers about government schemes, procurement policies, and market

Many farmers lack the necessary knowledge to navigate the complexities of the agricultural market, making them vulnerable to exploitation by middlemen and private traders. Agriculture remains the backbone of our economy, and ensuring fair compensation for farmers should be a national pri-

The government must act decisively to bridge the policy gap, engage in meaningful discussions with farmer representatives, and establish a legally enforceable MSP framework that benefits all farmers equally.



To create the perfect chilling effect, the team built a storage set, a fog machine and Lohan to generate dense fog. They also had to keep the AC switched off to keep the fog in place. Though the temperature was regulated, spending nearly six to seven hours in the heat, foggy environment was a true test of endurance Aishwarya remained focused throughout, ensuring every frame felt authentic despite the challenging conditions. The crew took all necessary safety measures, including regular breaks and medical supervision. However, delivering dialogues and maintaining expressions in such an intense setting required immense con-

centration and dedication. Aishwarya said, "Shooting this sequence was one of the most challenging yet exciting experiences of my career. To maintain the foggy effect in the room, we had to switch off the AC and the room was very hot, making it a little difficult to shoot. Maintaining expressions, delivering dialogues, and staying in that environ-ment for long stretches required a lot of focus and en-

However, as actors, we embrace such challenges to bring authenticity to our performances. I'm truly grateful to my team for ensuring my comfort and safety throughout the shoot. These experiences push me to grow in my craft, and I love every bit of it. While Aishwarya's dedication made the scene more impactful, it will be interesting for the viewers to see if she will be able to get out of the cold storage on time or will Malishka's devious plan brings a tragic end to Rishi
