India's response to Pahalgam attack PM gives full freedom to forces to decide mode, time and target

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has given the armed forces 'complete freedom to decide on the mode, targets, and timing' of India's military response to the Pahalgam terror attack, sources told NDTV Tuesday night. The message was delivered as the PM met Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval, and Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan.

Sources said the Prime Minister 're-affirmed that it is our national resolve to deal a crushing blow to terrorism' and that he has 'complete faith and confidence' in the Indian military.

Shortly after the meeting concluded Home Minister Amit Shah reached the PM's residence.

The PM's message, sources have said, effectively greenlights military action against terrorists who attacked and killed 26 people, mostly civilians, in Pahalgam, in the worst such incident in the country since February 2019, when 40 soldiers were killed in J&K's Pulwama district.

Modi has vowed to pursue the terrorists behind the attack and their patrons, a clear reference to Pakistan which has a history of sponsoring terror strikes in India, to the 'ends of earth' and inflict the harshest punishment on them "beyond their imagination".



RSS chief Bhagwat meets PM

NEW DELHI: Rashtriya Swayam-sevak Sangh (RSS) chief Mohan Bhagwat met Prime Minister Narendra Modi at the latter's residence Tuesday evening, sources told. The meeting took place shortly after PM Modi chaired a high-level meeting with top officials from the defence establishment to discuss India's response to the recent terror attack in Pahalgam, which left 26 civilians dead.

Terrorists had gunned down tourists, who were from different parts of the country, in the popular destination of Pahalgam in Kashmir exactly a week ago on April 22. This most brutal attack on civil-

ians in a long spell of time in the region has sparked a wave of outrage across the country and a demand for retaliatory action against the perpetrators and their handlers.

The prime minister's tough assertions coupled with his government's avowed muscular stand on the issues of national security have heightened expectations of a stringent counteraction from India.

In the past, the Modi government carried out surgical strikes inside Pakistan after the terror attack on army soldiers in Uri in 2016 and the Balakot air strike after the killings of CRPF personnel in Pulwama.

Following the terror strike in Pahalgam, India has taken a series of measures targeting Pakistan, including putting in abeyance the Indus Waters Treaty with the neighbouring country.

J&K closes 48 tourist destinations following Pahalgam attack

Authorities in Jammu and Kashmir have shut down nearly 50 resorts and tourist destinations across the Valley amid security concerns, officials said on Tuesday.

The decision comes in the wake of a comprehensive security audit conducted across 87 tourist locations in all districts, following last week's deadly terror attack in Pahalgam that claimed the lives of 25 tourists and a local resident. The audit was aimed at identifying security vulnerabilities and bolstering safety measures at major tourist destinations.

Among the prominent destinations now off-limits to tourists is Gurez, a valley on the Line of Control (LoC) in Bandipora district that attracted thousands of tourists over the last decade.

The other top destinations closed include Yousmarg and Doodhpathri in Budgam; Aharbal, Kounsarnag, and Verinag in south Kashmir; Kaman Post on LoC in Baramulla; and the picturesque Bangus Valley in Kupwara.

In Srinagar city, the government has decided not to allow the tourists from visiting Jamia Masjid, the grand mosque located in the old city.

The famous resorts like Pahalgam, Gul-



marg and Sonamarg would remain open for tourists.

Authorities emphasized that the tourist spots which remain open have been provided with enhanced security arrangements to ensure safety of visitors.

The Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department has also closed all its trekking routes for tourists. Over the past four years both locals and non-local visitors had increasingly flocked to Kashmir's meadows and alpine trails, especially during the summer trekking season. While the Valley had witnessed a rise in tourist arrivals in recent years, the Pahalgam attack has dealt a severe blow to the tourism industry. Over the last six days, several tourists have left Kashmir while many others have cancelled their coming travel plans to Kashmir.

NEET aspirant hangs self; 13th suicide this year

KOTA: A 16-year-old medical aspirant hanged himself from a ceiling fan in his hostel room in Kota, just 20 days after joining a coaching centre here to prepare for NEET, police said on Tuesday. This is the 13th case of suspected suicide by a coaching student in the country's coaching hub since January and the third in April alone. A native of Bihar's Katihar, Tameem Iqbal was found hanging from a ceiling fan in his hostel room in Talwandi area on Monday evening, the police said.

Eight CRPF personnel injured in road accident in Budgam

SRINAGAR: At least eight Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel were injured on Tuesday after their vehicle met with an accident in central Kashmir's Budgam district. The incident took place in the Tangnar area of Doodhpathri Khanshab when the CRPF vehicle skidded off the road and plunged into a deep gorge, officials said. "At least eight CRPF men were injured in the accident," they said, adding the injured personnel were immediately shifted to a nearby hospital for treatment.

AAP appoints Ankush Narang Leader of Opposition in MCD

NEW DELHI: The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has appointed Ranjeet Nagar councillor Ankush Narang the Leader of Opposition in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD). In a letter to the MCD Secretary on Tuesday, AAP's Delhi unit chief Saurabh Bharadwaj wrote, "I am pleased to inform you that Ankush Narang, Municipal Councillor from Ward No 87 (Ranjeet Nagar), has been chosen to be appointed as Leader of Opposition in Municipal Corporation of Delhi." The development comes days after the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) returned to the helm of the civic body, with its candidate Raja Iqbal Singh elected mayor.

22 people killed in restaurant fire in China

BEIJING: Twenty-two people were killed in a restaurant fire in Liaoning province on Tuesday. The fire broke out at 12:25 p.m., killing 22 people and injuring three others, the State-run Xinhua news agency reported. There are no details about the incident, including the cause of the fire.

Family of Indian student seeks Centre's help to bring her body back from Canada



BUREAU CHANDIGARH: The shocked family of a 21-year-old Indian student, who was found dead in Canada's Ottawa, on Tuesday urged the Centre for assistance in bringing back her body to Punjab.

Vanshika Saini was found dead three days after she went missing. She is the daughter of Aam Aadmi Party leader Davinder Saini in Punjab's Mohali district.

Vanshika had gone to Canada two years ago to pursue higher studies after completing her senior secondary in Dera Bassi. Her father said she had always been a topper in her school and wanted to do something big in her life. Vanshika Saini, the daughter of AAP leader Davinder Saini, was from Dera Bassi in Punjab. She had gone missing since April 25. Her body was found on the beach near her college.

The Indian High Commission in Ottawa said on X that the matter is under investigation.

"We are deeply saddened to be informed of the death of Ms. Vanshika, student from India in Ottawa.

"The matter has been taken up with concerned authorities and the cause is under investigation as per local police. "We are in close contact with the bereaved kin and local community associations to provide all possible assistance.

PM Modi hopes to strengthen ties with new Canada PM Carney

Prime Minister Narendra Modi congratulated Mark J. Carney on his election as the Prime Minister of Canada, extending warm wishes to the Liberal Party for their electoral victory.

Posting on X (formerly Twitter), PM Modi wrote, "Congratulations Mark J Carney on your election as the Prime Minister of Canada and to the Liberal Party on their victory. India and Canada are bound by shared democratic values, a steadfast commitment to the rule of law, and vibrant people-to-people ties. I look forward to working with you to strengthen our partnership and unlock greater opportunities for our people."



Canadian news outlet CTV News has projected that Carney and the Liberal Party will retain power, winning enough seats in the 45th federal election to form the government. Carney had taken over the leadership from

Pro-Khalistan leader Jagmeet Singh loses seat

OTTAWA: Pro-Khalistani, Canadian politician and New Democratic Party (NDP) chief Jagmeet Singh has announced that he will be stepping down after support for his party collapsed in Canada's federal election and he conceded his seat, CTV news reported. Singh lost his seat in the House of Commons, one he's held since 2019, coming in third. His seat of Burnaby Central in British Columbia was affected by redistribution ahead of this election. The NDP has also lost its official status, failing to secure the 12 seats necessary.

Justin Trudeau, who resigned towards the end of his term after losing the confidence of his party. The election was marked as one of the most unpredictable in Canadian history, with Carney, Conservative Leader

Pierre Poilievre, NDP Leader Jagmeet Singh, Bloc Quebecois Leader Yves-Francois Blanchet, and Green Party co-Leader Jonathan Pedneault leading their respective parties in a highly competitive race.

India, US hold talks on multi-sector Bilateral Trade Agreement

Representatives from the Commerce Ministry and the Office of the US Trade Representative met in Washington and discussed the pathway for concluding the first tranche of multi-sector Bilateral Trade Agreement by Fall of 2025.

A statement by the Union Commerce and Industry Ministry said that the impending deal would include opportunities for early mutual wins.

"The team discussed the pathway for concluding the first tranche of the mutually bene-

ficial, multi-sector Bilateral Trade Agreement by Fall of 2025, including through opportunities for early mutual wins. While productive Sectoral expert level engagements have taken place through the virtual format, in-person Sectoral engagements are planned from end of May," the statement said.

This follows earlier bilateral discussions last month in the national capital.

As per the statement, both sides had fruitful discussions on wide-ranging subjects covering tariff and non-tariff matters as a part of the India-US Bilateral Trade Agreement.

Subsequent to these meetings, the second phase Nasha Mukti Yatra will be launched on the ground from May 7 onwards and in this yatra, a meeting of all the people in each village/ward will be held. This meeting will be attended by the VDC/WDC, Sarpanch and other officers. Each village/ward in Punjab shall be covered as per the schedule prepared by the state government.

The Chief Minister envisioned that this campaign will transform war against drugs into a mass movement. He solicited fulsome support and cooperation of everyone in the Society to ensure that no drug is sold in their area and to take all drug victims out of drugs.

Gearing up for final and decisive assault on the menace of drugs in the state, the Punjab government led by the Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann has decided to embark anti-drug awareness and action campaign- "Nasha Mukti Yatra", which will be touching every village and wards of state in the months of May and June 2025.

Divulging the details a spokesperson of the Chief Minister's Office said that the drive will be organized by closely involving the Village Defence Committees (VDCs) to organize district-wise meetings across the state

Two migrant workers die after consuming energy drink in Baddi's Barotiwala

BADDI: A tragic incident in the industrial township of Jharmajri's Shivalik Nagar, Himachal Pradesh, has sent shockwaves through the region. Two cousins, 18-year-old Girish Kumar and 21-year-old Arvind—both migrant workers from Nand village in Budaun district, Uttar Pradesh—were found dead under mysterious circumstances after reportedly consuming an energy drink and snacks. According to family members, the young men had returned to their rented accommodation after work and were resting when they drank an energy beverage and ate some snacks. Soon after, their health began to deteriorate rapidly. Girish's elder brother, Lalta, stated that both experienced a sudden rise in body temperature and profuse sweating. Despite attempts to cool them with cold compresses, their condition worsened, and they eventually lost consciousness. They were rushed to Baddi Hospital, where doctors declared them dead on arrival. A bottle of energy drink and a packet of snacks were found near their cot. Family members suspect that these consumables may have triggered the fatal reaction. However, Baddi's Senior Medical Officer (SMO) Dr. M.S. Chauhan dismissed the notion that such products alone could lead to death. Dr. Chauhan noted that both victims' bodies had turned blue, suggesting the possible ingestion of a toxic substance. He emphasized that the exact cause of death can only be confirmed after the post-mortem report.

The increasing number of petrol and diesel vehicles in the state is becoming a major cause of pollution, which has become a matter of serious concern. Keeping this in mind, our government has decided to increase the use of e-vehicles. He said that this measure of the government was proving to be helpful in protection and conservation of environmental recourses besides minimizing air pollution. The Chief Minister said that the government has launched Rs 680 crore Rajiv Gandhi Swarojgar Start-up Yojana wherein 50 percent subsidy was being provided for the purchase of e-taxis to the youth.

Editorial

Bandung 2.0

In April 1955, the leaders of 29 countries — many of them newly independent, some still colonies on the cusp of achieving freedom — gathered in Bandung, Indonesia, for what would become a seminal moment in the construction of a non-aligned identity amid the Cold War. Led by India and Indonesia, the participants — all of them from nations in Asia or Africa — debated the pitfalls of jumping into either the Western camp or the Soviet-led bloc and dreamt of a world where they, the developing nations, could forge a solidarity of their own. For India, under the then prime minister, Jawaharlal Nehru, the Bandung Conference was also reflective of a commitment to Africa. Seventy years later, that commitment remains an integral part of India's foreign policy vision. In 2018, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had said that India's priority was not just Africa, but Africans. Yet it is also impossible to ignore the reality that the India-Africa relationship has fallen short of the promise it held in the hope-filled years of the 1950s. This is not to suggest that the successes have been scarce. India's bilateral trade with Africa has grown steadily, and it is now the third-largest trading partner of the continent after China and the European Union. New Delhi today has diplomatic outposts in almost all African countries. India has also doled out tens of millions of dollars in soft loans to African nations, helped build schools and hospitals, and in 2023, used its presidency of the G20 to secure a seat for the African Union on the body. Still, despite India's deep cultural and historic ties with the continent, the relationship is clearly not a priority for either side. In his 11 years in office, Mr Modi has visited nine African countries. By contrast, he has visited the United States of America alone 10 times. The India-Africa Forum Summit, a conclave started in 2008 by the Manmohan Singh government with the aim of demonstrating India's commitment to the continent through aid promises, has not been held in a decade. Indian officials cite scheduling challenges as the reason but China, the US, Turkey, Japan, Russia and the EU have all held summits with African leaders in this period. As the US withdraws even more from Africa under President Donald Trump, the scramble for influence in Africa will grow. China, to cite one example, is already attempting to expand its influence in Africa and is in search of securing vital resources from that continent. India, therefore, must pivot sharply to focus more than it has on the continent. It is time for India to renew the Bandung spirit for the 21st century.

Social media and our sleep pattern

Concerns regarding the influence of social media platforms on youth mental health led the US Surgeon General to suggest a warning label for them. The Surgeon General's Advisory on Social Media and Youth Mental Health highlighted potential links between social media use and poor sleep quality in youth. Given these issues, what particular measures should teenagers and parents take to enhance sleep?

A new national study, published in the Journal of Adolescent Health, offers insights into screen habits linked with better sleep.

"Ensuring adolescents get enough sleep is vital, as it supports their physical and mental growth and development," says lead author Jason Nagata, MD, associate professor of pediatrics at the University of California, San Francisco. "Our research found that leaving notifications on, even in silent mode, leads to less sleep compared to turning the phone off completely or keeping it outside the bedroom."

Tips include: Keep screens outside of the bedroom. Having a TV set or internet-connected device in the bedroom was associated with shorter sleep duration. Turn off the phone. Leaving the phone ringer on or turning notifications to silent or vibrate was associated with less sleep compared to turning the phone off entirely. Leaving the phone ringer on was



associated with a 25% higher risk of sleep disturbance compared to turning it off. 16.2% of adolescents reported having a phone call, text message, or e-mail wake them up after trying to go to sleep in the past week.

Don't use social media or other electronic devices before going to sleep. Using social media, chatting on the internet, playing video games, browsing the internet, and watching or streaming movies, videos, or TV shows while in bed before sleeping were all associated with less sleep.

If you wake up during the night, don't use your phone or engage with social media. One fifth of adolescents reported that they used their phone or other device after waking up during the night in the past week. This was

associated with less sleep overnight.

The researchers analyzed data from 9,398 preteens aged 11-12 who are part of the Adolescent Brain Cognitive Development Study, the largest long-term study of brain development and child health in the United States. Data were collected from 2018-2021.

The adolescents and their parents answered questions about their sleep habits and youth were asked about their screen and social media use at bedtime. A quarter of preteens had sleep disturbance. 16.2% reported being woken up by phone calls, text messages, or emails while sleeping at least once in the past week. Furthermore, 19.3% reported using their phone or another device if they woke up overnight.

"Adolescents can be extremely sensitive to phone notifications, often waking up instantly when they hear their phone," said Nagata. "Even if a phone is on silent or vibrate, adolescents may still check it overnight. Once they start reading or responding to messages, they can become more alert and activated."

"Adolescent development is a challenging time for many given the social pressures and physical, psychological, and emotional changes that occur," said co-author, Kyle T. Ganson, PhD, assistant professor at the University of Toronto's Factor-Inwentash Faculty of Social Work. "Understanding this process and being present to support youth in their social media use is crucial."

The Alternate Standpoint

Was the demand deliberately designed to ensure the failure of diplomacy—a lesson in itself? The conspiracy theory suggests that the five villages requested by the Pandavas—Indraprastha (Delhi), Swamprastha (Sonapat), Panprastha (Panipat), Vyaghrprastha (Baghpat), and Tilprastha (Tilpat)—were strategically indispensable to the Kauravas. Ceding them would have severely weakened their kingdom by granting the Pandavas control over key access points and vital trade routes across the region.

The outcome remained the same —whether diplomacy

failed on its own or was destined to fail by design. The inevitable result was war—a conflict that forged legends, created heroes for an entire race, and gave rise to one of the greatest scriptures of all time.

The Lesson : The modern world often misunderstands the role of diplomacy, assuming it must always succeed merely to avoid war. However, diplomacy is not an alternative to war but an integral subset of it. As the Mahabharata teaches, diplomacy should not necessarily precede war but is inherently a part of it. There is no concrete data to quantify the number of wars averted by diplomacy, yet history provides ample evidence of instances where diplomacy was deliberately allowed to fail—paving the way for a just, necessary, and ultimately justified war.

NASA's Curiosity rover finds large carbon deposits on Mars

Research from NASA's Curiosity rover has found evidence of a carbon cycle on ancient Mars, bringing scientists closer to an answer on whether the Red Planet was ever capable of supporting life.

Lead author Dr. Ben Tutolo, PhD, an associate professor with the Department of Earth, Energy and Environment in the Faculty of Science at the University of Calgary, is a participating scientist on the NASA Mars Science Laboratory Curiosity Rover team.

The team is working to understand climate transitions and habitability on ancient Mars as Curiosity explores Gale Crater.

The paper, published this week in the journal Science, reveals that data from three of Curiosity's drill sites had siderite, an iron carbonate material, within sulfate-rich layers of Mount Sharp in Gale Crater.

"The discovery of large carbon deposits in Gale Crater represents both a surprising and important breakthrough in our understanding of the geologic and atmospheric evolution of Mars," says Tutolo.

Reaching the strata, he says, was a long-term goal of the Mars Science Laboratory mission.

"The abundance of highly soluble salts in these rocks and similar deposits mapped over much of Mars has been used as evidence of the



'great drying' of Mars during its dramatic shift from a warm and wet early Mars to its current, cold and dry state," says Tutolo.

Sedimentary carbonate has long been predicted to have formed under the CO2-rich ancient Martian atmosphere, but Tutolo says iden-

tifications had previously been sparse. NASA's Curiosity rover landed on Mars on August 5, 2012, and has travelled more than 34 kilometres

on the Martian surface.

The discovery of carbonate suggests that the atmosphere contained enough carbon dioxide to support liquid water existing on the planet's surface. As the atmosphere thinned, the carbon dioxide transformed into rock form.

NASA says future missions and analysis of other sulfate-rich areas on Mars could confirm the findings and help to better understand the planet's early history and how it transformed as its atmosphere was lost.

Tutolo says scientists are ultimately trying to determine whether Mars was ever capable of supporting life – and the latest paper brings them closer to an answer.

"It tells us that the planet was habitable and that the models for habitability are correct," he says. "The broader implications are the planet was habitable up until this time, but then, as the CO2 that had been warming the planet started to precipitate as siderite, it likely impacted Mars' ability to stay warm."

The question looking forward is how much of this CO2 from the atmosphere was actually sequestered? Was that potentially a reason we began to lose habitability?" added Tutolo.

Tutolo says it's clear that small changes in atmospheric CO2 can lead to huge changes in the ability of the planet to harbour life.

Son of Haryana: Narender Kumar Hoists Tricolor on Mount Annapurna, Creates New History

CHANDIGARH: Mountaineer Narender Kumar, a resident of Mingni Khara village in Hisar district of Haryana, has achieved a major milestone by becoming the first mountaineer from Haryana to hoist the Indian tricolor on Mount Annapurna — one of the world's most dangerous peaks, standing at 8,091 meters. Narender Kumar began his mountaineering journey in 2019 with a basic course at the Atal Bihari Institute, Manali, and pursued an advanced course in 2021 at the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute, Darjeeling. His father, Subhash Chander, a retired Exsistive Taxation Officer, has been his journey. Narender Kumar embarked on his daring expedition to Mount Annapurna — known for its perilous conditions — on March 25, 2025. He successfully hoisted the tricolor at the summit at 10:30 a.m. on April 7, setting a new record. He completed the entire expedition in just 12 days, facing numerous challenges. Mount Annapurna, located in Nepal and part of the Himalayan mountain range, poses a constant avalanche threat every 1–2 hours, making it extremely life-threatening for climbers. Additionally, frequent adverse weather conditions make the ascent even more difficult. Narender Kumar has previously achieved several national and international milestones in mountaineering, including setting a world record by summiting Mount Kilimanjaro twice within five days.
